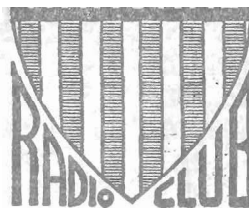
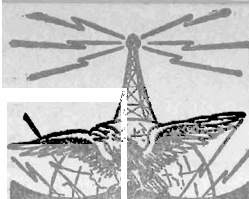

LETTER FROM "POPULAR ELECTRONICS" by TOM KNEITEL

Dear Lefty-

February 17, 1959

Thanks for your nice letter of the 4th. The registry is really catching on, and as an example today we received 55 applications.

By the way, I have been asked by several of the boys who are BCB fans about the wording "Short Wave Monitor" on the top of the certificate. They want to know who it says that, and if BCBers are eligible. Well I asked the POP'ronics gang the same question when they showed me the certificate and the answer is simple. First of all, the majority of world-wide DXers follow SW, and many of these who do DX on BCB also use SW bands. Secondly, the collective name for all DXers regardless of bands used has always been "SWL." So they decided to use "Short Wave Montitor" across the top, as a collective phrase. The actual text of the message on the certificate is universal, that is, it doesn't refer to any specific bands. Therefore it is hoped that everyone will be happy, as certainly all DXers are invited to register.

The radio clubs have been giving us some nice publicity, especially NNRC and your club. I received a very nice letter from an officer of the URDXC who says that they are considering having a drive to register their entire membership. Needless to say, the only way this thing will really be of use to DXers is if all are registered. What I would like to see develop from this is sort of an "ARRL" for DXers, looking out for their interests, etc.

You might remind NRCers that the official application form for registration appears in the March POP'ronics on page 85, and tell them not to be offended by the writing on the top of the page which says "ATTENTION SHORT WAVE LISTENERS!" We dearly love BCBers, and hope that they will understand.

Let me know if I can do anything to further the NRC. 73."

Not much the past week but I have a lot of letterhead so have to use them up before I die of old age! 2/6- KFRU-1400 RS, one of the few to get through on 1400. Organ music from 1:30-1:45. KWVY 1470 r/c-TT S-9 plus from 1:50-2:00, three reports to this one including a phone call but never a verie! Unknown on 1490 with piano from 2:25. KHAM 1580 f/c-TT 2:55. 2/7- WHGR 1290 f/c-ET/M 2:00-2:43, wants reports, verified promptly for me. WGHV 1370 f/c 2:50-3:00 through WSPD in good shape. 2/9- KCCB 1260 ET a brand new one of 500 watts, were to go on RS 2/15, in here like a local on a crowded channel, off 2:35. 2/11- WQUA 1230 ET 2:00 on. This is a sister station of WQUB here in Galesburg. Also heard 2/12 1:00-1:30. Tone on 1470 and 990 but no voice. 2/13- KOKX 1310 r/c, many reports but I guess they think I am too close. 2/14 KRNK 1460 ET 1:25-1:35. KMAN 1350 f/c and PoP 1:45-2:35. 2/15- KVDM 1150 r/c 1:30-1:45, one I have been after for a long time. 2/16- KSGM 980 r/c 1:25-1:30 heard and reported often but a non-verifier. KIKS 1310 f/c-TT 1:40- to 1:55 s/off. KABQ 1350 f/c-TT 2:25-2:31. KIRX 1450 DX, as usual some one decided to throw a nice fat signal on during the DX so badly heard now and then. 2/17- KJAN 1220 TT 1:30-1:55 through spillover of WCAU. WNRG 1250 f/c 1:55-2:00. How Grundy got through WREN and WEMP I'll never know! KFEL 970 ET 2:27, off 2:45 taking out KAKC, invites reports. WJPS 1330 r/c 2:50-3:00 through KFH who usually blanks anyone on 1330. 2/18- KGHM-1470 r/c 1:45-1:50. In this spot when the night is clear and cold, reception is terrible! I have to wait for a fog or dense cloud cover to be able to pull them in. A letter from KHIL says that the owner, Mr. Hill, sold out last fall and is now operating several dairy farms in the Denver area - what a switch - from an orchestra leader to a Radio Station to cows!

Another good catch thanks to Stan Morss' bang-up job on the 1490 spot, KTLO-dx heard faintly 3:15-3:45 making the first K station I've heard since October outside of KXIL-1540. WJBS-1490 heard testing prior to KTLO DX for a new one. Electrical noises hamper much of my DXing so for the time being I have to be patient. I like my six tube GE immensely. However it doesn't have the noise limiter that my S-53-A had. My best luck in DXing these small distant stations is between 2 and 3:30 EST. After that they just fade away. Can anyone help me on the one testing at 2:50 on 1500 2/16? Mentioned having daytime power of 10,000 watts and nighttime 2,000, owned by Taylor B.C. Also can anyone give me a recent v/s for XESM-1470? Have a report out since January. I sent a dime along. Is that sufficient or should I send an I.R.C.?

John Callaman - 300 West 6 Street - Hereford, Texas

Guess I eat humble pie on XEAX, XEAZ! I wasn't listening on the particular day in question, but have heard XEAZ regularly dominating on 1270, so I made a natural assumption! Wasn't trying to be picayunish! I heard this low tone and carrier on 1490 since August - it's 20 db over S-9 here, though KTOP tears it apart. When KTOP's off, the tone is dominant. 2/16- Batted 80% on DXes, KTLO KIRX CJDV and KOPR heard definitely, though CJDV considerably earlier than originally slated. I logged 3:00-3:30. KIRX tough, KTLO even with KTOP, KOPR even with KTSA and WSWA. KTOP stood by for WTTB and I got a few selections from an UNID extremely weak station well under the tone, but couldn't ID. WSIP-1490 f/c-TT 4:20-4:30 for bonus. WEAN-790 RS 4:30-4:40 when WTUG carrier went on, first Rhode Island here. Found TIRS-920 S-7, R-4 at 4:45-5:00 for report. Went "fishing" for a while, looking for foreign, but wound up on 550 for KOPR through 5:27, when QRM too much. Heard WFPB-910 at 5:30, but immediately squashed by KLCN s/on. WHOO and another audible on 990, then on 1060 5:45-6:00 s/on from WNOE, I had a station with many spots for merchants on Main Street in Monroe, so a tentative to 250 watt WMAP, almost a certainty, though no call heard. Took an afternoon log on KLYN-940, after I learned they would become KIXZ come 2/17 6 a.m., and report to NRC member John Tudenham. Veries: IYZ-800, IYC-880, both 2/16, and back in 14 days. Both extremely definite from my tentative items, so I'm quite pleased with them. 4YA-780 still out. Sincere best regards to all.

A couple of Monday mornings have come and gone since my last report so it is time to bring the members up to date. I started off 2/2 with reports to KIST KBMX and KWSO on their r/cs. Then added the DX from KFNF and finally the r/c for KRDU. 2/9 started with KROP-1300 to 3:06 s/off. Then KTEL-1490 running late to cover a bowling tournament. Then KBOW-1490 on f/c second Monday at 3:45 rather than first Monday as listed. Then KELY-1230 on f/c 4:30-4:45 as in old lists rather than 4:45 fourth Monday as in current list. KURA-1450 r/c as listed but I spent most of the time from 4:25 to 4:55 listening to 1440 where a Down Under station was mostly readable. I think they used the slogan "Radio Murwillumbah" as part of ID at 4:30. I sent the report to JMW. They held up until WQOK s/on at 4:55. I got copy on the latter and called it a day. I sent the details to Francis Nittler to handle as he sees fit. This afternoon I finally got decent copy on KDAC-1230 which is only about 100 miles away but over the mountains and tucked into a radio-proof pocket it seems. KWG rules the frequency here and the two stations are off opposite ends of my loop. Today between a six foot loop in the attic and a small Hi-Q loop in combination I got rid of KWG and left enough KDAC to copy. Now if they will only verify. Which brings us up to date and time to sign off. 73.

Am wondering who on 1460 ended a test at 4:00 after playing "Two Ladies in the Shade of de Banana Tree?" Couldn't raise a peep out of WTTB-dx. On? Copied WBLV 1600 RS 4:20-4:30. Copied what I think must have been WIVV-1370, a church program, but ID obliterated by 5 a.m. s/ons. 2/17, WOMA-1230 r/c; WGIG-1400 in very well at 6:30 p.m. WONA-1570 and WESY-1580 atop at their 6:40 and 6:45 (respectively) s/off. 2/18, WBAW-740, Barnwell, S.C. s/off 6:15 on top; WAAY-1550 easy on RS 6:30 p.m. 2/19, big day. WMCH-1260 r/c; KTSA-550 AN 2:15 on. WHHY-1440 has quit AN. WBAR 1460 r/c but not needed; KPRO-1440 coming in at 2, not needed. Observations will continue to determine if there is a United States Station under the jurisdiction of the Commission also involved in transmitting without an identifying announcement."

MEXICO-*Found XEWV (940) Mexicali, B. Cfa., beneath S-9 carrier, through KFRE and WINZ on 1/31 to 0310 with broadcast of basketball game between Chihuahua and Distrito Federal. (JAC) XEAX (1270) Oaxaca, Oaxaca, logged on Sunday AM 1/4 0215-0245 in the clear, but no verie received yet. (ERC) Took routine log on XECL 2/14 0104-0127 on 990 Kc, extremely strong here, but fought CBW with Northern Messenger. (JAC) XERF puts on a weak spurious signal on 662 Kcs. AN, nutz. (JAC) XETX reported as on 1470 Kcs, was apparently not the station heard, as they answered that they were not on 1470, but still on 1010 Kcs. Now, who kept mentioning Nueva Casas Grandes on 1470 Kcs., 1/18 and 1/10? It was surely XE-X. (HJW)(Hank, isn't 0660 the same as 0700, or was there a typo error?-FV) HJFE (1330) Emisora Pereira, 0410-0431, taken out by American stations then. Only Cuban tone from CMCB, no programming. (BS) HJAT (1080) heard 0145 "Radio Reloj", send 2nd report, bad QRM from KRLD at times. (HDH) HJAE (930) heard from 0001-0010 s/off. (JDH)

NETHERLANDS ANTILLES*-PJC-2 (865) Willemstad, has been heard every morning since 1/31 beginning from 0558 on. Usually good until 0630. (HJW)

TRINIDAD*-Verie letter in from "Radio Trinidad" (730), The Voice of the Caribbean", for a reception report of 1/26, 13 days round trip from posting here. Signed by Mr. E. M. Watson, Program Director. (HJW)

BRAZIL*-Sao Paulo day on 1/19. NETHERLANDS ANTILLES*-Verie letter received from PJC7-1 signed by H. E. Hoyer. (CMS) Logged strong Monday 1/5 at 0430 s/on, copied till 0515 on 1010 Kcs. (WR)

PERU*-Veire and pennant received from OAX6D (Note correct call) "Radio Nacional Estacion de Tacna", signed by the administrador. They are assigned 1165 Kcs., but when I heard them they were on 1160 Kcs. (CMS)

BELGIUM*-Brussels (926) which I reported on 11/29, sent a beautiful QSL card which I received on 12/21, signed by R. Allard. (RM)
