We ask that these items be definite information, not guesses. As it has been said several times, this column can be valuable source of up to date information that will enable others to hear and report a station/s that might wise be missed.

We do not mean to preach or find fault too much but if the above is adhered to, it makes it so much more easier for your editors and will also keep the information contained in DX News in their proper sections. This would mean that if you are looking for station information on a US or Canadian station, you look in members musings or DX Down the Dial. If you with information on all other Foreign stations, look in International DX Digest.

However there is one exception to the above. That is those members living outside the U.S. and Canada should send their entire DX doings to Fred Van Voorhees

FOR WHP-\*--Latin on 805 Kcs. around 0603-0700 on 12/18 only. Some quiet music heard with Spanish ID "Radio ----" possibly mentioned Cuatemala. (TGTO off freq?)

Latin on 1195 around 0300 on both Christmas and New Years Day. Is this TIBAS?

Latin on 1443½ on 12/25 at 0320-30 with some music.

Latin on 1097 on 1/1 at 0307-0408 "Esta es Radio ---- Jota y Seis" of something like that.

Latin on 710 at 0500 almost daily, Porto Rico or Venezuela?

Latin on 1050 at 2233 with LA music on 2/17.

Latin on 1520 not TGWC 2/17 at 2250 under KOMA. Spanish announcements by man with good bass voice. Is this WWWW?

Latin closing on 960 at 2201 with music 2/17 under WSLT.

Weak signals on 730 and 660 at 0414 on 2/23. Alaskans?

Several Latins on 840 before 0558 s/on of WHAS including HJKC and something IDing as "Radio Carabaso" or something. Heard any good morning.

UNID Latin on 650 at 0452 under WSM on 2/26. LA never heard here, so early before.

Several LA's on 820 around 0455 on 2/26.

For JAC-\*--Station in Spanish on 840 noted closing sign-on announcement at 0503 on 2/23. Continued with music, time check after each record, using slogan "Radio Raberto" or "Raverto". Time is Eastern Standard, which would limit it to Cuba, Dominican Republic, Panama, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, possibly Haiti. Can find no similar slogan. I'm about 99% certain that HJW's 895 station on early IS "Radio El Sol" OBX4X, guy in Spanish speaks very softly and with weird Japanese type music, but Spanish vocals. Gives time one hour ahead of EST, so maybe on summer time. Says "La hora exacta en Radio El Sol" and much as I wanted to, I couldn't make either "Radio El Roble" or "Radio El Condor" out of slogan, hi. Has mentioned Lima several times. Report sent for 2/14 log, rechecked for "Radio El Sol" slogan 2/23 0531-0550.

From CMS-\*--PRB6 (1200) Sao Paulo, Brazil, is on by 0330 or earlier and at 0400 they have an Oriental program. But this is positively not the Chinese station heard last March. Chinese station used Peking's interval signal. PRB6 has no interval signal. Please check 1200 Kc. station, also noted a new LA all-nighter on 1560 Kcs. 73 for now-FV
