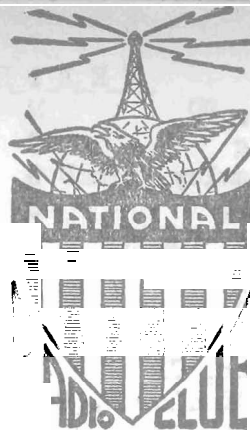

Also on 4/4 KCOR-1350 s/ on 6:00, and WKBW-1520 AN. 4/6- XEIQ-960 running piano marathon and KSCO-1080 on ET at 4:50. 4/9- KOTE-1250 r/c. 4/10- WCOMT-1410 r/c with marches. 4/29- KXEO-1340 on r/c-TT. 5/6- KIMB-1260 Kimball, Nebr. f/c s/off 2:28. KLOU-1580 new AN asking for reports. KXXI-1250 new calls for Golden, Colo. (ex-KHOK, ex-KGOL). ID as K-21. 5/7- WAKO-910, new station in Lawrenceville, Ill. mentioning report received from Jamestown, N.Y. Good catch, huh Pat? Veries from: KLTZ-1240, WYLD-940, KXLA-1110, KSIW-1450, KHEN-1590, KANN-dx-1590, WVIM-dx-1490, KFJI-1150, KOMB-1450, KPBA-1590, KCOR-1350, KTIJ-1450, WDSK-1410, KOTE-1250 and last but not least, CJBR-900. For those of you who have heard the French station on 900 and didn't ID it, it is CJBR. I had sent tentative to CHNO but they said no, so another to CJBR paid off. Verie total now 1,629. Good news here is that KTLN-1280 is now off their AN after nearly three years and s/off at midnight local time except Friday and Saturday nights when they are on until 2 a.m. Hope to see everyone in Omaha.

Checking Fran N's summary of GPC operations of past season, I am surprised to find I've verified only six of them! They were WPCF-1430 (on 10/20); KPRB-1240 and KPID-1450 (on 12/1); KANN-1590 (on 2/22); KVNUN-610 and WAMP-1320 (on 2/23). Not so hot! Oh yes, logged KIXX-1400 (on 3/16) not verified yet. April DX very slim, but here's score: April 4- KZUN-630 s/on 8:55 a.m. (ex-1270). April 6- KGNO-1370 s/on 3:30 a.m. April 9- KSET-1340 ID at 7:08 a.m., but soon covered by unID Mexican. April 12- KSVF-990 logged 3:58-6:05 a.m.; WLOL-1330 logged through KFAC from 5:06 a.m. on. April 17- During 11:30-12 noon Conelrad Test, I scanned band with nothing heard that was needed, although many Alberta and British Columbia stations were noted, as distant as Edmonton, 500 miles or so. Thought I might get one of the five Western Canadians that are unverified, i.e. CBXA-740, CJDV-910, CKSA-1150, CJDC-1350, or CFGR-1230, but no soap. April 19- KMOP-1330 s/on 7 a.m. through KFAC for #10 log on 1330m and bringing all regional (5 kw.) frequencies such as 550, 560, 1330, 1590, 1600, etc. up to at least ten logged. April 21- CJDV-910 taped from 4-4:08 a.m. s/off for new report (not heard on DX); KALL-910 s/on 7:30 a.m. for a new report to see if I can replace PP card verie from old "double call letter" contest season. April 27- KOVO-960 taped at 7:05 s/on for another try at verifying. Veries: 4VEC-1040 (the religious program I reported during WIVI's DX of 3/16/58, 400 watts, Haiti #2); KBLR-730; KKIS-990; KBYG-1400 (loc watts, 1,500 miles, so 15 MFW for my best domestic verie!); KANN-1590-dx; 3GI-830 (another 8,000 miles, plus "long distance" DX!); WGAP-1400 (graveyard-2,000 miles plus); KXGX-1270; CHUA-580 DX, KHAT-1480; KWTO-560; KSVF-990; KSET-1340 and KGNO-1370. Thanks, Mr. Mailman! So, with the '58-'59 season behind us, a look back. Just a few good DX catches to keep the "spice" in the game; enough "run-of-the-mill" stuff to keep reports flowing out regularly. Good foreign veries are few, Radio Peking-840; HJAJ, TIW, 3GI, 4VEC, AFPS-790, King Salmon just about cover. Domesticwise, above noted 100 watt KBYG tops, plus Eastern graveyarders WJET WKPT WGAP on 1400; and WBML on 1240. I would also add CJAD-800; WRBM-1480; WCOG-1320; WDMF-1460; and WWIL-1580 as worthy of mention. Most rewarding development was finally being able to add some good 1400 DX in the four above noted, as 1400 had been my only graveyard channel minus any East Coast veries, and for that matter, any veries over 1,500 miles, and any W veries. 73.

Anyone needed KYSN-1460, 1:45-2:01 s/off. 2:15-2:25 1450 WROX f/c-TT ID every two minutes. 5 Apr. 0 1460 WFGV ET/TT 1:45-2 a.m. Veries, nicely, in ten days I've gotten WALM KPBA, note on my verie signed by Bill Lewis, no title, I sent report to CE, quotes "Address all letters to me. If any of you boys had trouble with KPBA, there's your boy. KXAR KBRS XEGE WOND WKLM (980) KMBL KRVN KRIB KMCD CHUB WQML. On 31 December 1958 log read 2,064 veries, April 10th it reads WALM 2,212, so can't agree on poor DX season, they're there - all you gotta do is seek 'em out. Am getting good response to Spanish forms with stations using that language. Spring is three weeks behind up here still have five feet or more of snow in my drive. Whenshe does come, my DX will be curtailed heavily, as going to put in a full acre of garden, and that's a lot of work.

Hi gang! Well, here I am again with another report to "Musings." DX was not too good this month although I did log a new state, Colorado. Logged KYSN-1460 April 7/17 a.m. with fair signals but QRM from KENO. The new stations heard are: WDCR-1340 NRC DX, WNOS-1590, WHLN-1410, WWNY-790, WXLI-1440, WQOK-1440, WHIS-1440, WGBB-1240, WGIG-1440, FWES-1460, KYSN-1460, WKAM-1460, WFGV-1460, WNEF-1290, WSEV-930, WYRN-1480, WRAD-1460, WEZL-1590, WCBG-1590, WHBG-1360 and CKEN-1350. Received a real nice v/l from KTLO and also a large pictorial map of that area around Mountain Home, Arkansas. I guess DX will be dropping off more and more now but hope to still do a little dial turning during the summer months. In my last report in the April 25th issue I mentioned that I had over a dozen QSLs from Radio St. Pierre that I would give away. Only two dates devoted to domestic DXing during the past month. 4/13, the NRC program from WDCR was a real tough fight but they finally broke through just before 3:00. After logging this one, moved down the dial a little and bagged the f/c from KDJI-1270 Holbrook, Arizona. The daytime Conelrad Test on 4/17 of course netted nothing spectacular, two stations logged, both in Ontario. CKAR-590, Huntsville and GJBQ-800 Belleville. CKLW Windsor normally tops the latter channel but they were off so apparently part of the Detroit Conelrad system. Both GJBQ and CKAR sent v/l's by return mail. I have been fooling around with wave traps, as I have been doing for quite some time, for I have quite a bit of trouble with WFEM-1260, less than a mile from here, and WIBC-1070, about eight miles from here. With my newest wave traps, using a 175' antenna pointed toward WFEM, I can get them down to about S-2, which is far better than I have ever done before. I can get WIBC down to about S 1-2 and null any other station in town or anywhere. While WFEM 1260 is nulled to S-2, I can get WCAU-1210 at S-9, which proves that it tunes fairly sharp. Anybody else having trouble with nearby stations might find these wave traps of considerable help. I use a set of two traps, mounted on a plastic sheet which is mounted in an aluminum case, about 10" x 6" x 4". I use 2 15-365 mmf. condensers in parallel with two Miller #2001 antenna coils, which I believe are the best coils available, since they have the highest "Q". It is important to plate the coils in a "T" formation, the coils being as far apart as possible. The condensers should be mounted in the center of the plastic sheet, and controlled with long, insulated handles. This is vital to prevent body capacitance. These traps are very difficult to tune but with practice it can be done. Placing a 5-15 (approximate) mmf. condenser in parallel with the main capacitors provides much easier tuning. 73s.
