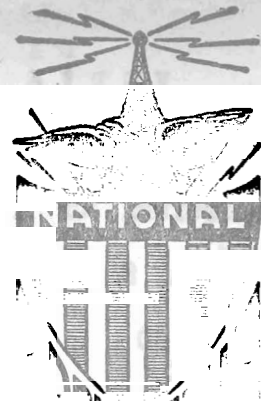

In using the 365 mfd. condenser to tune the frequencies, instead of 11 turns on the three-foot loop, he used only seven turns for 540 to 730 kc/s., six turns for 740 to 1200, and five turns from 1210 to the end of the dial. Possibly should have used even fewer turns from 1500 kc/s. Naturally the signal is not as strong as that received on the 75' vertical flat wire, but stations can be tuned in, and then tuend down by rotating the loop. What causes loud hum on tpaee recorder when a cable with phone plug at each end runs from the phone jack on the receiver to the input on the recorder? Hum is louder on the SX-43 than the SX-62-A, and on the Webcor Royal than on the Crescent. Want to tape while DXing, without waking Pauline, but that hum is too loud. How can it be stopped? How about Conventioneers taping a DX Special program, and running it on 590 WOW on Monday, 9/7 at 3 a.m. EST? Have fun, fellows. 73.

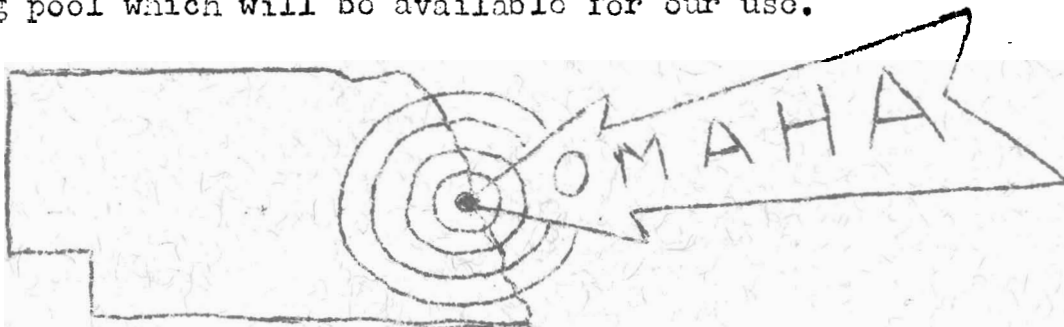
LAST CALL! FOR THE BIG 1959 ANNUAL NRC CONVENTION
