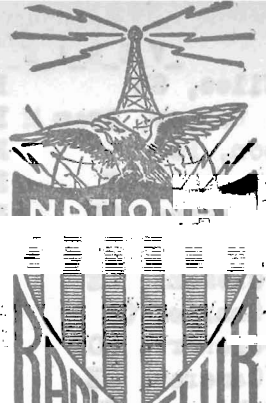

### FIRST DX SHOW FROM CJLX FOR NRC

Mr. Murray A. Shields, Chief Engineer of this new Radio Station, CJLX, tells us he would be only too happy to have a DX Test programme done by his station. Says Mr. Shields, in part, "We have, since going On-Air the 15th of December, received 13 requests for veries from as far South as Stillwater, Okla., and as far west as Bellevue, Washington. We're getting out there for you boys. The programme we will air for you will consist of recorded march music and organ music with Station ID between each selection." This program will be on the air on Monday morning, March 21st, from 4:00 to 4:30 a.m., E.S.T., or 3:00-3:30 C.S.T. The channel should be clear of CKW which runs all night other mornings of the week, and the only possible interference foreseen is the possibility of interference from IYZ in New Zealand, or from the new Surinam station on the 800 spot. However, mostly everyone ought have scant trouble in tuning in CJLX, and we wish you and Mr. Shields good reception, and don't forget to send in those DX reports with return (Canadian) postage or a U.S.A. 5¢ coin to pay the cost of same for CJLX, or an International Reply Coupon. On Feb. 23, I heard the final 15 minutes of the RS of Station KBYP-1580 Shamrock Texas, which changed calls from KEVA last October. A test program was heard on Feb. 29 from Station WGHQ-920, Saugerties, New York, from 4:20-4:30 a.m. beneath AN KELP; a most welcomed addition at this den. Then on March 5th, I heard an ET from the brand new station WJUD-180 in St. John's, Michigan from 3:30-3:45 a.m., tapping AN KLOU. Most recent verifications were a card from WBRX, and letters from CKPT WCRL KBYP.

Regarding the Original Colonies Plague - let's see - there were New Jersey, Virginia, Maryland, Brooklyn - and - well, I wasn't much of a history student, hi. Here's hbp-ing for a poker player's dream on 3/19 - a "full house!" The "sweet music" craze hasn't hit here yet - we still have lots of rock 'n' roll stations, like WJCA-570, WINS-1010, WJGM-1050, WADO-1280, and mixed popular music from ones like WNTA-970, WABC-770, WRCA-660, WNEW-1130, WGBB-1240, with light concert music coming from WVNJ-620, WOR-710, WPAT-930, WHLI-1100 and WBAB-1440, with classical from WNYC-830 and WQXR-1560 plus several FM stations in the latter two fields, and foreign from WBNX-1380, WHOM-1480, WWRL-1600, WEVD-1330, WPOW-1330, and at times WADO-1280, and Negro from WNJR-1430 and WBBI-1280. Not a hillbilly among the lot except WNJR from midnight to 2 a.m. except Mondays! Wonder why stations don't vary their programming like they used to and try to please all of the people some of the time? Well, now to the DX, and not a great deal of it either. Big snow here Thursday and into Friday AM, and Saturday twilight DX was very good from the Cape Cod - Eastern Massachusetts area, with seldom-heard-at-twilight stations WSRO and needed WBNP-1470 fighting it out, both with similar light concert musical fare to 5:45 p.m. March s/off, and WBNP a most welcome one. I hit on it acting on Joe Brauner's suggestion of looking for other area stations when one is coming through, like WPEP-1570 who was dominating 1570 here, an oddity, as it is usually WDEW and/or WBUX. 3/7- OC AM with OCs on 1470 1460 1420 990 960 1220 1380 1370 1360 550 and 260 around 2:30-3 a.m. Nothing new added, unless one of these was new, hi. 3/8 - Post-twilight reception at last of WHLO-640, new "hard-sell" Akron call at 6:45-7:15 p.m. No sign of CMLQ or CBN, but an SSB heard at 7:15, probably either WOI or WJAD signing off. Veries, WDKR, a QSL and a PP, and PP from WKEN-1600. PLEASE CHECK THE BOTTOM OF DOM CONTEST AND DX DOWN THE DIAL PAGES. \*\*\*

I get to the dials about an hour a week which is next to nothing. Still working six days a week, ten to 11 hours a day plus returning to plant on Tuesday and Thursday evenings for several more hours. Heard TGED "La Voz de la Capital" very clearly for a half hour on 2/24/60. He has definitely increased his power. Some fellows asked in a recent bulletin if anyone has verified HLKA on 970 kc/s. I have heard him many times. Verified him on 10/20/58. Received a verie from "Radio Guardian" 610 kc/s. Trinidad on a report of 12/21/59 from 3:57 to 4:25 a.m. EST. Signed by Peter T. Burton. Also, veries in for two stations in Jamaica. The station on 770 kc/s. is located in Spur Free and was heard from 4:55 to 5:19 a.m. EST on 11/23/59 and Montego Bay, on 550 kc/s. from 5:24 to 5:34 on same morning. Veries signed by H. E. Wong. The station on 580 kc/s. is located in Point Galina and Kingston is on 720 kc/s. Each of the above four stations have 5,000 watts.

DX CX seem to be on the upswing finally this season; should be increasingly rewarding DX on the BCB as we head toward the (65-'66 peak. I have particularly noticed that the distance of new loggings has improved greatly with a number in the 4-5,000 mile range, and a few in the 6-8,000 range. New loggings in February numbered only 14, but as I've said some good DX. Heard since my last report: Feb. 18- 2NR-700 Grafton, N.S.W. with ABC ID at 6:30 a.m., possibly best Aussie signal ever heard, although didn't stay in for long. Feb. 19- 2GL-820 Glen Innes, N.S.W. with ABC ID at 5:30 a.m., but not as strong as 2NR; unID LA s/on 820 at 6 a.m., am hopeful can ID as HI9Z, but nothing certain; tone followed by s/on, LA, 850 kc/s., 5:58 a.m. I suspect unneeded TGJ but again not at all certain. Feb. 20- UnID "Radio ----" noted again on 840 kc/s., this time at 5:30 a.m. Feb. 22- JOKR-950 Tokyo, Japan in spots from KIMN s/off at 4:02 until WSPA s/on at 4:58 a.m. UnID TTer under KEWB-910 from 4:39-4:45 a.m., followed by SSB. KISN had s/off at 4 a.m.; no sign of KYSS test as listed in DXDD for this date. KLCN did break atop KEWB at 5:44 a.m. with time and ID, so another report off to this long unverified station. Feb. 25- UnID LA on 886 logged 11:36 p.m. to 1 a.m., believe it is an HR call, Tegucigalpa; I suggest "Radio Pizares" listed in WRH as 890 kc/s. Feb. 26- 886 LA again coming in, but heavy WLS splatter tonight. In setting up on 1015 kc/s. I noted clear cut HFO signals on 1013 and 1015 kc/s. I still wonder about these, as my "Radio Kalamary" ID last season on 1013 was positive, and what I've heard so far this season on 1015 doesn't seem to be the same. Feb. 27- 1015 tape didn't prove much; apparent s/on at 5:58 a.m., logged intermittantly until 7:05 a.m., almost certain of an "SC" in call at 7:02 a.m., so likely YSC, but may not have been same station all the way. On 660 kc/s. with just a bit from KMEO (ex-KOWH) including WX at 6:58 a.m.; well under XERPM. Feb. 28- CMZ-1010 Havana, Cuba s/on 6 a.m.; loggable until after 7:00 with frequent IDs. Feb. 29- On this rare fifth Monday in February CHVC's DX-1600 Niagara Falls Ont. strongly QRM'd KLAQ for a few minutes immediately after 3:00 a.m.; WBLV-1600 Springfield, O. s/on partially copiable under KLAQ at 4 a.m. Veries: KOLS-1570 KCOY-1440 DX, CJLX-800 KARI-550 (Blaine, Wash.) CFOR-1570 KINT-1590 KXGO-790 VRH3-890, KURL-730 XEOY-1000 WJIV-900 2NR-700. 73.

DX remains a little better here with the following loggings since 2/10: 2/15- KSVN (Mighty 730) Ogden, Utah on with ET. KCOY-1440 with old Peter Putnam Bretz putting out a real good show for the NRC. Second Jamaican logging was the station of Radio Jamaica on 550 kc/s. Also have heard the new network on 700 and 750 but not reported. 2/21- CHEC-1090 Lethbridge, Alta. finally logged on their AN. XEDX-1010 El Sauzal, Baja Cal. on until 3:04 with special program. 2/22- WABG-960 Greenwood, Miss. testing with a couple of screwball DJs. WBCM-1440 Bay City Mich. s/on 4:50. Big news here is the verie received from Radio Guardian Trinidad for their DX for NNRC, minth country verified here. Other veries in past two weeks are EKOG-730 KSVN-730 CKOK-800 KSRO-1350 KAMP-1430 KPGA-650 KBOY-730 KPLX-dx-1460 KBWM-1380. Total now 1,697 so should hit 1,700 soon. Looks like the Top 40 craze is dying out all over the country as evidenced by Omaha members' comments. Latest to drop it in Denver is KOSI-1430 who began a "good music" format yesterday after six years of Top 40, the original in Denver. KICN-710 dropped it a few weeks ago. Only KIMN-950 and KLEN-1280 remain carrying it. Guess they are finally finding out teenagers can't afford new cars they advertise. Looking forward to DX from TIFC-995 next week as only report to Costa Rica went unanswered. 73.

A person must have equipment to DX so I'll describe mine. I own a Stromberg Carlson receiver built in 1939 (ripe). My antenna is a 152 foot triangular feeding through a home built wave trap. The West Coast is coming in much better now, as I have tried for most of the above before, but never a peep out of them under the closer dominant ANs. XERF probably has ~~xxxx~~ even more reduced their power, for they are weaker yet here. They are probably doing all they can just to keep their XR held together. I think it would be wise to watch them, as they might be going off again if they have more trouble. DX not too bad the past week, as CX good with cold weather and a good snow cover. Monday Feb. 29th heard: KHOB on new frequency of 1390 ET at 2:00 and on till 4:00 anyway; KTAR-620 s/off at 2:05; KERN-1410 2:45 to 3:05 s/off. Both DXes heard, hi!) KFBB with some CKOY QRM but plenty for report, and CHVC in beautifully. DXDD in general and Ev Johnson in particular responsible for numerous catches in West such as KTAR KERN KABL KENO etc. Happened to wake up at 5:15 Wednesday 3/2 in time to hear WDBM-550 with NX and WX 5:18-5:25. Believe I had WDEW, 1570, on RS at 6:15 but couldn't break through XERF for report. Heard mention of Massachusetts State Police and Westfield but no ID. Fred Schroyer - 19 Bonar Apartments - Waynesburg, Pennsylvania

Here's a tip for NRCers using Hallicrafters models SX-99 or S-85. Try yanking the 6SG7 RF amplifier out and replace it with a 6AC7. You don't even need an S-meter to notice the difference - you can hear it! Some Monday morning, tune in a weak Californian and try switching the two tubes back and forth and I'll bet you keep the 6AC7. Technically the 6SG7 is a "variable- $\mu$ " tube, used by Hallicrafters to compromise tube noise, sensitivity and good AVC action. But the 6AC7 is a "sharp cut-off" tube which gives about 20 db better gain and inserts no measurable noise into the set. Anyone who tunes the ham bands as well as BCB will find results even better. Got the idea from W9EGQ in "Poptronics", tried it, and it really works! Coincidentally I see Lafayette Radio is having a special on 6AC7s at a 59¢ apiece, so here's a chance to get something for almost nothing! To DX; was up for 15 minutes 2/29 to test the 6AC7; tuned around a little bit too and added CKNB-950 DX, CKNX9920 DX and KPMG-1560 s/off. Other recent catches have been WSIV-1140 KCHA-1580 WSMT-1050 via "Twilight Zone", WTEL-860 ET weak under KONO; WTAL-1270 WACK-1380 CKCW-1280 WADP-960 DX. Really sorry I couldn't get up for KCOY-1440's DX but the strong LA AN would probably have killed 'em anyway. Long-awaited KBVM-1380 v/1 finally got here; their directional rig puts out a cardioid aimed North. Also v/1s from KFAL-900-dx KOSY-790 WJWS-1370-dx and QSL from WBRX-1280 DX. Sent tentative to KBYR-1270; got 3x5 file card back with my 4¢ stamp slapped on it. "You probably heard us but we'd like more definite material. Try again." OK, Yogi - will do. 73 to you-all.
