Hi fellows! I am really surprised at myself getting two reports in here two times in a row, but I have some information that may interest the fellow Club members. Lefty Cooper and I have corresponded with each other in regards to a DX program from WMJM here on 1490 kc/s. with 250 watts. The manager seems very interested in such a program, and would like it to come off about December or January. I will talk with him again when I hear from Lefty, and then we'll get together on a program. I am sorry to say I goofed this AM 8/30 in this way. I didn't know it in time, and neither did the manager, but WMJM is on a 24 hour sked this AM with a special program called "Operation Big Christmas" and they are using Rock 'n' Roll music. I just talked with the CE at the station, and he asked me to put this in DX NEWS. For those of you who heard WMJM and send reports, send them to Radio Station WMJM, 20th Avenue East, Cordele, Ga. He hopes that the Rock 'n' Roll will get out there. Right now every second Tuesday of the month WMJM holds their ET from 4:15 to 4:30 EST with a steady 1,000 cycle tone. They have a request in with the FCC to go to 1,000 watts, and possible frequency change and they should hear something around 9/9. DX here has been on the ups and downs. I am reporting stations somewhat easy to get that I've never reported yet. Last Monday 8/22 I heard the new WFCT Fountain City Tenn. at 3:30 a.m. EST on the air with program test, and asking for telephone calls or letters. Address is S/S Veronica, Postbus 218, Hilversum, Holland. (WRH) This is listed as a "Pirate" station by the EBU. (EBU)

## AFRICA

TSCHAD-\*-"Radio Tschad", Fort Lamy, is scheduled to operate on 1538 Kcs. from 0200-1600. (DW)

DAHOMEY-\*-"Radio Dahomey" operates on 1475 Kcs. with the following schedule. Sunday 0200-0700 and 1000-1700. Thurs. 0000-0130, 0615-0815, and 1200-1600. Sat. 0000-0130, 0700-0800, and 1000-1800. Other days 0000-0130, 0615-0715, and 1200-1600. (WRH)

MALGACHE REPUBLIC-\*-"Radio Madagascar", Tananarive, operates its 1st Program on 1394 Kcs with 1 Kw. from 2230-0030, 0400-0600, and 1000-1430 weekdays; 2230-0030, 0400-1430 Sat., and 2300-1400 Sunday. The 2nd Program in Malgache uses 1502 Kcs. with 1 Kw., and is on 2230-0000, 0400-0600, and 1000-1330 weekdays; 2230-0000, and 0400-1330 Sat., and 2300-1330 Sunday. (WRH)

LIBYA-\*-"Radio Tripoli" has been reported on 1052 Kcs. with poor signals in England around 1900 with QRM from Suhl DDR, operates in parallel with 1483 Kcs. after 1900. (NNRC)

SENEGAL-\*-"Radio Mauritanie" (1349) has been reported in press dispatches as operating from a truck. No schedule given, but believed to be on irregular transmissions. Base station in Saint Luis runs from 0015 with 1 Kw. (NNRC)

## ASIA (NEAR EAST)

IRAN-\*-"Radio Iran" operates as follows: EQL (1340) 1230-1545. EQA (895) 0500-1545. (DXG) Operating on 24 hour schedule with Home Service on 1340 Kcs. "Radio Tehran" on 895 Kcs. operates from 0130-1600. Both transmitters are 50 Kw. (WRH)

UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC-SYRIA-\*-"Radio Damascus" is operating 2300-0300, 0630-0900, and 1000-1800 on 665, 746, 584, and 1313 Kcs. in a home service in Arabic. Also in many languages from 0300-0600, and 0900-1000 on 602, 719, and 863 Kcs. (WRH)

SAUDI ARABIA-\*-"According to letter, the Saudi Arabian Broadcasting Station, Djeddah, is now using 725 Kcs. with 50 Kw. (DXG)

## ASIA (FAR EAST)

SOUTH KOREA-\*-"Voice of Free Korea" operates over 970 Kcs. in English from 0430-0500 and 0700-0800 to Japan. (DXG)

LAOS-\*-"Since the very first hours of the coup d'etat, Radio Vientiane, has been captured and used by the coup d'etat forces. However, a new station on 1460 Kcs. has now appeared with Laotian type music announcing as the "Evacuees Station" operating from 0100-, 0700-, and 1300-. Apparently using a low-powered military type transmitter. (DW)

NORTH KOREA-\*-"Radio Pyongyang" is now using 1050 Kcs. for its Japanese service, parallel with 820 and 1080 Kcs. (DXG) Home Service uses 785 Kcs. 1430-0930; Second Program 1430-1130 on 820 Kcs. (WRH)

RYUKYU ISLANDS-\*-"A new commercial station "Radio Okinawa" is now on the air on 1370 Kcs. KSDT with 3 Kw., from 1500-1030, probably in Japanese only. Address is Harbour Bldg., Naha City, Okinawa. (WRH)

THAILAND-\*-"Radio Thailand" home service operates on 830 Kcs. from 1900-2000 and 0700-1020. (DXG)

VIETNAM-\*-"VTVN Saigon, National Program, which is broadcast in Vietnamese only has changed frequency to 1082 Kcs. (NZ)

CAMBODIA-\*-"Radiodiffusion Nationale, Kmhmer, Phnom-Penh, has traded in the old 10 Kw. transmitter for a brand new Red Chinese 20 Kw. job. Now in operation on 1410 Kcs. (NZ)

JAPAN-\*-"NHK changes JORY & JOXB from 1600 to 1530 Kcs. NAB changes JOZO Nakamura from 1060 to 800; JOQN Kitami from 800 to 1060; JOBW 1060 relays JOBR; JOAR back to 1070 from 1030; JOHW Obihiro from 1460 to 1280; JOER Hiroshima from 1240 to 1370; JOYR Okayama from 1280 to 1420; JOQL Kushiro from 1280 to 1420; JOSF Nagoya 10 Kw., on 1490, Tokai Radio Brd. Co.; JOQM 3 Kw. from 1540 to 1450 Kcs.; JOXK from 780 to 1260 Kcs. The above changes from the NAB Pictorial Handbook. (NZ)



CHINA-\*-"Radio Peking's" Japanese Service now uses 1020 Kcs. only apparently. (DXG)

PHILIPPINES\*-DZFE (1030) Manila, 2 Kw., logged at 2100. (NNRC) Radio KSBW, 100,000 watts will soon begin operation in the Islands. Although complete details are not yet known, it is part of the Far East Broadcasting System. (NNRC) (This looks more like a RYUKYU call-FW)

## OCEANIA

AUSTRALIA\*-A few changes we apparently missed last time are 8DR from 5DR on 650 Kcs. 8DN Darwin (1240) not expected to start until December or January. 8AL from 5AL on 1530 Kcs. (NZ)

NEW ZEALAND\*-NZBS changes due within the next six months are:

1. Westport repeater station for 3YZ with transmitter at Cape Foulwind.
2. Other repeater stations at Kaikohe, Kaitiaki, and Central Otago.
3. 1ZD Tauranga on the air with 10 Kw. from 1YZ xmtr site at Paengaroa.
4. 2YA to have new 100 Kw. xmtr., which has not been completed. (NZ)

## FOREIGN CONTEST RULES

1960-61

1. Contest will be open to all members in good standing of NRC. It will be divided into three leagues. It will be known as the NRC FOREIGN DX CONTEST. It will be managed by Roger Anderson, 5700 Eighth Road North, Arlington 5, Virginia.
2. Each contestant shall submit an entry fee of 25¢ on or before the date of November 30, 1960, or in the case of new members, within 30 days of the date of their membership.
3. Contest will run from September 15, 1960, to April 15, 1961, inclusive. Loggings must be from one specific location except with the permission of the contest manager. Entries may be submitted until July 1, 1961.
4. All foreign stations located at least 500 miles from the listening post of the contestant are eligible. NO U. S. or CANADA stations are eligible except that entrants in states bordering the Gulf of Mexico and Mexico may enter one Canadian station from each province.
5. Scoring will be by means of a point system as follows:
  - a. Each country-----3 points.
  - b. Each NRC special----5 pts.
  - c. Each 1000 miles 1 point.
  - d. Each Continent--10 pts.(Maximum of 10 points for 10000 miles and over.)
6. The first distance category shall be from 500-2000, exclusive (1 point) and for all succeeding distance categories shall be 2000-2999 inclusive. (2 pts.)
7. As mentioned in Rule 1, there will be three Leagues as follows:  
WEST COAST LEAGUE: California, Oregon, Idaho, Washington, Utah, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico. CENTRAL LEAGUE: Alabama, Miss., La., Ark., Mo., Mich., Neb., N. D., Minn., Wis., Ohio, Ky., Ill., Mont., Wyo., Colo., Texas, Okla., Kans., Iowa, S. D., Ind., Tenn., EASTERN LEAGUE: Mo., N. H., Vt., N. Y., Mass., R. I., Conn., N. J., Penna., Del., Md., Va., N. C., S. C., Ga., Flo., W. Va., D. C.  
NOTE: for Canadian members, the provinces of B. C. and Yukon Terr. shall be in the WEST COAST LEAGUE. The provinces of Nfld, N. S., P. E. I., N. B., and Que., shall be in the Eastern League. All others shall be in the Central League with the exception of Ontario. All of Ontario west of a line drawn from Pittsburgh north through Erie and extended north will be in the Central League. All that part east of this line shall be in the Eastern League.
8. Prizes will be awarded to the top three contestants in each League. These will be printed certificates and groups of stamps, proportioned among the top three contestants according to the amount of the total entry fees.
9. A special bonus certificate shall be awarded to the person in the contest who verifies the most countries.
10. Contest standings will be published monthly in the first issue of DX NEWS each month. Final standings will be published in the July, 1961, issue.
11. Any member living outside the US and Canada who wants to participate in this contest is asked to apply to the Manager for a list of countries which are to be considered domestic (Ineligible) for him. If enough foreign members enter, a 4th League will be established.
12. NO STATION may be entered in the 1960-61 contest which was entered by that contestant in the 1959-60 contest.
13. Distances shall be calculated by the manager and there shall be no appeal from his decisions as to the proper distance brackets. ENTRY FEE and all ENTRIES are to be sent to Roger Anderson, whose address is above, not to your Editor in Lemoyne.

No doubt you will note that the address on the envelope looks a bit different, in fact a lot more plainer than before. The reason, a new addresser has been purchased. It is a hand Model 30 made by the Addressograph Company. Its metal constructed entirely which means that it will last for many years. It is not a bit complicated and can be used by anyone having a little common sense. Before making this purchase I investigated another make which was priced 50¢ less but in comparrison the Addressograph addresser was in my opinion a lot more and a lot better product for the money. This will take at least 2 hours off the job of addressing the bulletin envelopes for each issue. Thus with our new A B Dick Mimeograph and now this addresser, I can truthfully say at least 4 to 5 hours have been eliminated in the time required in getting out each issue of DX News.

However in order to save the Club a little money, it is requested that from now on, when sending in a change of address that you enclose 5 - 3¢ stamps or 15¢ to cover the cost of having the change made which will include the postage to and from Club HQ to Addressograph and back. I dont believe this is asking too much from those who in the future have address changes. All plates now made up are with your present QRAs and I have checked them with my up to date address list and find them to be correct with the exception of 5, which will be corrected by the Addressograph Company without charge.

Thus if and when in the future someone or some group will take over the publishing of DX News, they can be assured that it will not take the hours that is has in the past, thus making it more favorable instead of believing that it would take just too much time. Example, before today it took me aprox 3 hours to get the envelopes addresses by our former method. Today I did the same amount in 32 minutes, plus when they were finished, they were in order with no reason to have to recheck to see if all were there.

Now to the other item. All of you who attended the White Plains Convention were informed of the large amount of sample issues of DX-News that were requested and mailed out this past season with very poor results as to gaining new members from them. They were also informed that the majority of our new members came in without requesting anything, but just mailed in their dues saying they wish to join the NRC. This resulted in a fee of 25¢ to be charged for future requests for sample copies of DX News, which brings this NOTICE to those who write articles appearing in publications that plug or mention the NRC.

Anyone writing such, MUST STATE THAT A SAMPLE COPY OF THE CLUB'S BULLETIN MAY BE HAD BY WRITING THE NRC AND ENCLOSING 25¢ TO COVER THE COST AND MAILING. However I will not enforce this policy until November 1st 1960, but after that date, no 25¢, no sample bulletin.

This sheet will be received by every publication that is on our mailing list, namely (In the USA Only) Newark News Radio Club and a copy to Popular Electronics and Radio-TV Experimenter. Naturally a request coming from a foreign DXer, will be honored, except Canada, without the 25¢ fee. This exception has been made because I have found that when the NRC gets a request from a foreign DXer, it usually results in a new member. However, those required to remit a fee of 25¢ for a sample, will be credited with same, if they become an NRC member, thus their first years dues would then cost them \$3.75 instead of \$4.00, the 25¢ fee would have already been paid and so the club would not lose and the interested DXer wouldnt either.

In closing I wish to thank all of you for your cooperation and wish all of you plenty and good DX this season. Ray Edge-Exec Sec.
