Most of my DX is before midnight now, except for a few f/cs. How about 1,000 f/cs in the 1961 list? ~~I might be able to~~ Dig deep. I agree that we should have an NRC mailing list. I might be able to get some help on veries then. Joe Plonka, don't worry about KRKO - I received a real nice v/l for my 4/21 report a few days ago, second report after their power increase. Veries in are ZNS WKWF-QSL, WREM KREM form letter, CFNS in two days (they are a French station) and KQBY (now KQBY), also KXLY form; KQRS two page letter. Read in Saturday Evening Post where Guantanamo Base in Cuba has its own station WGBY, SS and English sked. Didn't know about CHIQ until I saw it in DX NEWS - that makes 17 Saskatchewan now. 1240 in Melfort is not yet, they don't want a station. I went up there and talked around. Oh yes, noticed CHAK in a 1954 log as CHAK Aklavik on 1490. Now it's on 800. I should have 'em right now I'm waiting for CHAB to sign off. Who on 580 kc/s. has a 5:30 s/on? Heard on August 6. Reports out to: 1480-KGCX Sidney, Mont., 1420-CKOM Saskatoon, Sask., 1500-KSTP St. Paul, Minn.; 1210-KBIC (AFRTS) Thule, Greenland at closing 10:21 EST (p.m.) Announced power as 250 watts only! 9/25: 1460-CJNB Saskatoon, Sask., 1460-KSO Des Moines, Iowa; 1290-CFAM Altona, Man., 1310-KNOX Grand Forks, N.D., ~~1380~~ 1380 WKJG Fort Wayne, Ind., 1360-KEYZ Williston, N.D. announcing as "Radio Keys" and 1520-KOMA Oklahoma City. It's been a long hot summer without much DX until lately. I did get a vacation up along the Oregon coast and around the Olympic peninsula of Washington. On my return I visited a few delinquent stations with the following results: KAST-1370 dug my 18-month old report out of the file in which I noted several other reports with stamps still attached, including some on NRC stationery. He promised to get a verie in the mail and he has done so. If you have a report there try a f/up to George Ristola, CE. Next KNPT-1310, CE was willing to scratch out a verie note on the back of a billing sheet but considers verifying normally beyond the call of duty. I recommend a PP-card. KFIR-1340 is under new management, has no back file of reports but promises to verify all new reports received. KINS-980 has prepared a form letter of verification and I believe answered all reports it had on hand. I like to think this was the result of my visit and f/up report. If you still did not get your verie write to Dean H. Elliott, CE. Since the vacation I have also cleaned up a few California stations, especially recent call changes. In are veries from KINS-980, KGBS-1020, KCKC-1350, KARM-1430, KLIV-1590 and KUDU-1590. This brings my California total to 188 but some of these were from the midwest instead of here, hi. If much noise after 3 a.m., it was caused by me conversing/with myself. 10/11- Too tired and to bed. 10/12- 740 had TT and music atop KRMG, 1:40 to 2:15, then off with no ID at all. 1390 also had TT atop WBEAM, 2:25 to 2:50 when I to bed. 10/13- Very noisy but caught KLEO, 1480, for a new one. 10/14- Seems all I hear is TTs lately. WFBR, 1300, test atop WERE at 2:55. 10/15- Chased 690, 2:05 NX, football scores, WX for the Valley in Arizona, sounded like KLO and this signed off after a prayer about 2:18 EST. The verie stated they run test quarterly but he, John R. Clement the PD didn't know the date. Veries from Virginia now stand at 35 and 419 total. I have tentatives out to WEER-1570 Warrenton, Va. on their 7:14 s/off, and WPEP, same frequency in Taunton, Mass. on their 7:30 s/off, both heard, I hope, on 9/20. Positive s/off's which I have heard was WSHH-1570 Latrobe, Pa. at 7:27 on 9/20. I hope they verie as they never veried the last report under their ^{WLEPM} old call letters, WAKU. A fourth report to WKVO-1580 on their RS at 7:45 p.m. Also heard over WSAN slop-over and WOMB on their RS at 7:05 p.m. on 9/15. However your old address plate is kept on file, so in case you revert back to it, there is no fee. This will help those members who attend school during the winter months and then are back home during the summer. I am glad to report that the using of these address plates have been a real pleasure especially the time saved which amounts to at least 2-1/2 hours for each issue. No doubt you have noted that your address appears a lot plainer and there is no chance of it getting smeared in case a little dampness happens to get upon it.

A slip of white paper 8-1/2 by 5-1/2 is now being used for this purpose and is included in the issue BEFORE your membership expiration date. You are asked to comply with the instructions it contains. By doing this, you help me a lot by not making me continually check and recheck membership expirations.
