(Eric Nelson) 1240 Virginia, and on the evening of 1/9 I logged CKBM-1490 Quebec and WKTQ-1450 Maine. WFK-1420 Ohio on 1/13. 1/15- AM, I received WEAM-1390 in clear and a distorted s/on from WHAV-1490. The AM of 1/16 yielded me JBC-750 Jamaica for country #11 and WWIN-1400 Maryland. That afternoon I logged WRC-980 at 3:50. This being my first look at Florida, I was naturally curious about DX down here, so I brought a small portable radio with me. Key Largo is way down here - only about 150 miles due North of Santa Clara, Cuba. You can guess what country shows up on the dial most frequently around here! Seventyone Cubans - that's right - 71 - in the middle of the day! That's more in one day than I've heard in 12 years in Fort Wayne. And I complain about Cubans at home! Actually it's not so bad here at night - skywave cancelling part of the ground wave weakens many of the Cubans, thus many of them are weak and buried. Briefly, here is the results of about a week's trying down here: 1/24- Noted that most Miami stations are not by any means impenetrable - QRM beneath WQAM WCKR WINZ WMIE and others. (We are about 40 miles from Miami.) YNW-935 is so strong their heterodyne can still be heard when I'm tuned right on WINZ! Noticed that many Central and South Americans are no better than at home - some, in fact, are weaker. Stations across the Gulf, such as WDSU-1280 WSMB-1350 WABB-1410, etc. come in very well. Others of interest noted: 1/26- Power stations from up North that do well down here are KMOX WLW WHO WBZ WABC CBL WNEW WQXR WOWO (ugh!) WTOP WHAS WGY and KYW plus closer ones in the South, of course. Many others are weak or hard to hear, such as WJR WBEM WCCO WMAQ WOR etc. 1/29, noted WAXU-1580 on RS s/off at 5:45 p.m. KLIF-1190 comes in good at sunset but when they switch to night pattern, they are gone. 1/30, some real surprises. Around 9-11 p.m., heard CBW KFI and CFOR-1570. On 2/1, WRVA could be heard beneath WMIE. Incidentally for those of you who do not know, WMBM ed-800 is now on 790 and operates full time. WKIZ-1500 is also full time. I note that WWIL-1580 WMMA-1260 WLOD-980 and WPOM-1470 are all directional days - they cannot be heard even down here. I'll try and obtain skeds of all area stations. Hope this report has proved to be of some interest - next time you hear from me I will be back in Fort Wayne shivering. 73.

VIRGIN ISLANDS--*Finally got around to logging and reporting to WIVI (970) which I found just under WWSW on 2/1 between 0425 and 0445. (BD)

BAHAMAS ISLANDS--*ZNS (1540) Nassau s/on just before 0600 1/9, in clear, although very weak for about 5 minutes before KXEL s/on. (RHM)

WINDWARD ISLANDS--*On the evening on 1/26, picked up station on about 1043 Kcs. very weak signal and British type programming. Signed off at 2130. Did not catch ID, but think it may have been St. Georges (1040) off frequency. (BD) It has been reported that the Caribbean Broadcasting Co., St. Lucia, has a license to begin operating on 12/1/60 with 20 Kw. on 840 Kcs., 17 hour daily schedule. (MED) Anyone hear him yet?

SWAN ISLAND--*"Radio Swan" (1160) hasn't been heard here at all for at least a month due to a bad heterodyne which louses up WJJD also. (AB) (Cuban jammer, I think-FV)

CUBA--*Following are the member stations of Circuito-CMQ at the present time: CMQ (630) Havana 25 Kw.; CMKU (630) Santiago, 2 Kw.; CMHQ (640) Santa Clara, 10 Kw.; CMKJ (740) Holguin, 10 Kw.; CMJV Ciego de Avila, 1 Kw.; CMAQ (920) Pinar del Rio, 1 Kw.; CMJL (920) Camaguey, 10 Kw., and COCQ (9670) Havana, 1 Kw. (CMJV is 900 Kcs.) (NNRC) Heard a clock and announcer on 1550 Kcs. that sounds like the "Cuban Minute-man" referred to in DXN; probably CMCG. This was a Sunday morning, 1/8 just before 0700 and S/on of KREB. (RHM) For up-to-date info on Cubans, watch for the March issue of POPULAR ELECTRONIS. (CMS) (Stan, I print this because you sent it in as a member of the NRC, and there it is. However, I would like to mention that it is not the policy of the NRC or the DIGEST to advertise other domestic DX publications. (MWN) XENU (1550) Nuevo Laredo, Tams., verifies by letter in English for reception of 1/8 State were operating with 250 watt emergency equipment as 5 Kw. power plant out of order. State s/on time at 0655 each day, all in Spanish. (RHM) XEHD announces as "XEHD in Miguel Aleman of Friendly Radio Fronterizo News in Miguel Aleman in Tamaulipas, Central Mexico". (TI) XEJP (1150) QRA is "Radio Variedades", Calle Articulo, 123 No. 90, Mexico, D. F., Mexico. (EJ) XEL (1260) Mexico, D. F., QRA is "Radio Capital", Avenue Reforma No 400 Deps 701. (EJ) XEWA (540) San Luis Potosi, S. L. P., "La Voz de la Americana Latina desde Mexico", V/s is Jose Gonzalez Cordova. (EJ) XEEW (1420) Matamoros, Tams., Mexico, "La Voz del Bravo", Apartado 465, P. O. Box 1732, V/s is Enrique Cardenas G., Gerente. (EJ) XELG (580) "Radio Impulso Del Centro S. A.", Apartado 301, Leon, Gto., Mexico. Signer is Ricardo Gallardo Munoz, Dir Gerente General. URUGUAY*-CX-28 (1090) has excellent signal on 1/23 and 1/30 between 0200 and 0300. ID at 0245 very clear as "Radio Imparcial", CX-28 Montevideo. (BD)

SURINAM*-On 2/1 between 0445 and 0500 I logged the mystery station on 820 Kcs. with what sounded like Chinese music and announcements. I believe this station is either "Radio Apintio", moved from 840 or "Radio Paramaribo" moved from 800. Does anyone have any more definite information? (BD)

COLOMBIA*-Carrera on 1020, listed at one kilowatt has planned to install and operate at 10 Kw., this past summer, according to a letter from the station. (NNRC) HJKU announces "Radio Maria" Government HJKU, Bogota. (TI)

ECUADOR*-Col Ibarra (1475) announces "Radio Col Ibarra", Col Ibarra, Ecuador, Toledo Arpehuna National". (TI)

CHILE*-CC148 uses English and Spanish in chain with CB62, CB143, and others. (TI)

PERU--Following stations have been logged this season by members of the MED in England: OAX4U (1010), OAX4T (1320), OAX4Y (1360), OAX4D (1390), OBX4E (1400), OBX4F (1470), and OBX4D (1523). (MED)

EAST GERMANY--Deutschlandssender (782) logged 2/2 at 1915 by CMS and at 2015 by BD, CMS says fair copy, BD says not readable. (BD-CM.)

NORWAY--Another pleasant even of the past week was the receipt of a QSL card from "Radio Norway" confirming my reception of station LKF, Fredrikstad (1578) on 12/20. I couldn't read the name of the verie signer, but noted on the card that LKF uses 10 Kw. Verified country #33. (BD) Also received by CMS.

REGARDING SAMPLE COPIES OF DX NEWS

Appearing in DX News under the date of September 17 1960, on the sheet entitled "Notes taken at Annual NRC Convention" was an item about sample copies of DX News. It told of the large number of requests and the cost of same plus the very small percentage of new members gained by these sample copies. The result was that in the future it would require a fee of 25¢ to obtain a sample copy of DX News and those who joined the NRC as a result of receiving their copy, the 25¢ fee they paid would be deducted from their First years dues, thus they would not spend this 25¢ in vain. However, later, an article appeared in a radio magazine informing anyone interested may obtain a sample copy of DX News by sending in 10¢. To date I have honored all requests that also contained 10¢. However again the requests have become so great with so little new members from said article that despite the inclusion of 10¢, it is still a drain on your Clubs treasury as it does not pay for the actual cost of an issue. So beginning March 1 1961 I, your Exec Sec, will not send anyone a sample copy of DX News unless said request contains the 25¢ fee as outlined on September 27 1960. Further any NRC Member who has an article published in any magazine telling about the NRC MUST INCLUDE that a fee of 25¢ will be required to receive a sample copy of DX News. On and after March 1 1961, I, your Exec Sec, will not be responsible for not mailing a sample copy of DX News to anyone who requests same and they do not include the 25¢ fee. This does not apply to any NRC Member who has a personal friend to whom he would like to have a sample sent to believing that they might become an NRC Member.

DUES NOTICES

A word regarding your renewal notices. To make the book work easier and to eliminate time consuming effort, Dues notices are usually included about 2 weeks before your expiration date. If nothing is heard from you a 2nd notice is included with the next issue of DX News and upon the sending of this 2nd notice your address plate is removed from the file. If nothing is heard from you after that, it being past your expiration date your address plate stays out of the file, but if you reply then it is placed in its proper order. We ask your cooperation in complying to the advice contained in your dues notice. I do not intend to be quick on the draw by using this method but time available to me does not permit the checking and continual rechecking expiration dates week after week. If you happen to be in some situation where you would like to continue your membership but find it impossible account of lack of funds, drop me a card and the chances are that some agreement can be made to pay a little later. In any event, we would appreciate a card from you informing me of your intentions. Will you cooperate?? Thanks.

ADDRESS PLATES

The use of our present addressograph system has greatly saved time in the addressing the bulletin envelopes for each issue. However we do have a considerable number of address changes from time to time. Having a new plate made costs the club 15¢ each, that is why we have to ask members requesting a change of address for this amount, either in coin or the same value in either US or Canadian Stamps. Please do not send IRCs as they only are worth 4¢ in the US, thus this is a 11¢ loss which the club would have to make up. Despite an IRC costing 15¢, they are only worth the price of mailing a letter of 1 ounce, first class, thus even to a foreign country the most they are worth is 8¢, so please no IRCs. To those who have changed their QRAs to other than their home, and later return to their home, the original plate is kept on file, thus in those cases where a member returns to their original QRA, no Fee, is required. Good DX to all and cooperating on all above is appreciated.
