With listening drastically cut since mid February, not a neck of a lot of DX heard, but here goes anyway. 2/17- SS completely along on 650 between 6:45-7 pm., no ID; ditto for 1070 and 1120. Another SS on 1190 mentioning Barranquilla - who might this be? YNOL-820 or thereabouts and HJBI-840 both good; rather phenomenal, finally heard clear five minute stretch from CHEX-980 10-10:05 pm. This is real DX despite only being about 20 miles away as they must be very strongly directional away from here in daytime to protect CFPL. 2/20- Noticed TIW-775 coming in strongly 12:05-12:15 am. even better than WABC/WBEM at times. Had long commercial for Kellogg's Corn Flakes before fadeout. Next catch of note was on 2/24 - WCTW-1550 over CBE most of time between midnight and 12:10 am.; WRSC-1390 heard for first time on RS at 5:36 pm.; YND-675 weak at 10:35 pm., SS under WSB-750 at same time, presume YNX. 2/28- WARD-1490 with good DX at 8:06 pm. 3/1- KWMT-540 weak at 7 pm; KWNT/KCHA-1580 s/off together even with CBJ at 7:15 pm. 3/4- Another good night for CHUB-1570 at 11:30 pm with only slight CFRY QRM. 3/5- WTTN-1580 on top at 6:52 pm; U.S. station on 690 (not usual WVOK) under CBF at 6:56 pm but couldn't dig ID. New for me KHM0-1070 with ID at 6:59 pm, #11 on 1070; not too common. KS00-1140 really dominating frequency as nil WRVA (just after 7 pm); WNOE-1060 as no WRCV; FF on 710 almost surely CKVM as WOR nothing. Opera on 895 at 9:38, XEN? SS all over usual spots like 700 720 1190 and one on 800 belonging to Circuito Radial ABC in Colombia - nobody fits here in 1961 WRH. They were way over CKLN for quite a while around 10 pm. 3/7- WDEW-1570 ET heard again at 12:20 am. In the evening, still another SS night but nothing new added - most notable frequencies were 670 700 720 830 1090. 3/8- WCTW-1550 heard for first time in early evening as still on after 7 pm. 3/9- TT on 1560 after midnight but no ID; above average reception to W with CBK KOA KNX KSL all very strong. Best catch was KBIG-740 testing with only 1,000w. 3:40 am.
