The BBC doesn't specify frequency so don't know which station they verified but at least it's a TA verie, hooray! Still weekly issues - trust not "weakly!" As for my own Domestic DX, latter term is correct I fear, with only one new logging since last report, that being 4/1 when KNIN-990 Wichita Falls, Tex. was logged from 7-7:30am, before XET took over. Veries in: KGMI-790, WCTA-920, and XENU-1550. Looking back over this past season (and it does seem that same is fast waning) I would observe that the broadest over-all change in reception patterns from previous years was the frequent and extended reception of Aussie-New Zealand stations. Using Foreign Contest eligible veries as comparitives I note that in '61-'62 contest I verified only 5PI, 2RE, 1YA, 4QL and 3KZ from these countries. In '62-'63 season, only 5GL - not a single N.Z. So far in '63-'64 12 have been verified from these two countries with reports out to seven more. An outstanding individual example as that of 4ZA-820; this is a station that has been rarely heard in previous years, and never clear of oft-heard 2GL; this season has seen frequent reception of 4ZA, many times completely alone on the channel! As further evidence of strength of reception from New Zealand itself, the veries this season from 2XA and 3YW tripled my total of 2kw. N.Z. verified! Over Australia way, no particularly spectacular catches have been made, but the additions of 2kw. 4TO and the 10kw. 5AN are most valued. As to continents other than North America and Oceania, the mailman holds key to my success for this season, as so far the only new verie outside these two continents is from HLCA, and that a very unsatisfactory one. Reports out are numerous, and many long overdue! Just as an indication, unanswered foreign reports mailed in following months number: Sept. '63 1; Oct. - 7; Nov. - 9; Dec. - 8. The additions of AFRTS-Thula-1425, "Radio Barbados"-795, and HIL-790 have made this a good season as far as North American foreign DX is concerned. Domesticwise, not much to brag about; WHOU-870, WCNT-1210, WTJH-1260, CBUB-900, WHAG-1410 CBXI-610 veries have been nest. Conspicuously absent is any DX on the graveyard frequencies; almost a "lost phase" of the DX game here I'm afraid.
