I really don't have much in the way of DX this time, but I do have a few news items to mention. The first is that WAQI-1600, Ashtabula, Ohio, is on the air. It has been on since at least the week of 2/3 (I logged it on 2/10), but I haven't seen it listed in DX NEWS, so I thought I'd mention it. They are 1,000 (-3, I believe), and play pop mx (the so-called alternative to rr.) Their phone number is 995-5527. Elsewhere on the local front, WGAR-1230 and KYW-1100, both in Cleveland, are presently applying for license renewals. Westinghouse Broadcasting, which owns KYW, has been ordered to trade with NBC for WRCV-1060 in Philadelphia, because apparently NBC used coercive means to get the Westinghouse franchise in Philadelphia in 1956. KYW moved from Philadelphia & took over NBC's WTAM at that time. NBC was given 60 days for appeal. WWIZ-1380, in Lorain, has had its license revoked because of apparent irregularities in their license renewal application. This was in June, and they were also given 60 days for appeal, & are still on the air. I think I probably owe you an apology, John Sexton: you asked me last February what my totals were, and, due to my vast backlog of unread DX NEWSes, I only saw it a couple weeks ago. So I'm sorry for the delay, and they are presently 513 heard, 115 verified. I wound up with 45 Contest points this year, less than last time. I sent out 28 reports last season, and got 22 veries back, for an 84.6% average, which isn't bad. One last thing: Three cheers for Ray Edge! He's done a terrific job for the NRC, and he certainly deserves a round of applause from everyone! I've just sent in the money for my fourth year as an NRCers 73 and good DX.

Max Baldwin - 8 Georgian Circle - Newark, Delaware

This is my first Miss as I received my card only a couple of days ago; however, I have been BCB DXing for two years and totals now read 224/135, states 30/26. Newark has finally got its radio station WNRK-1260 (sked to open in May) into operation 8/18 with 500w, 5am-7pm EST. Summer DX gave me a chance to build a foundation but am looking forward for Christmas vacation (my DX season) when I might have an HE-30 (best buy?) to replace my antiquated National SW-54 and Blaupunkt table model. KUSN WFDR WRUF WISM WSWW & WLDY. I've received a lot of letters recently in regards to my blasing in the Huly issue, where I mentioned "coax" and numerous people have written asking me what it was. Well, I'll give you all a break by telling you, hi. Coax is short for "coaxial" cable which is real thick cable used by amateurs, and citizens band stations for transmission lines, from their XR/RX to the antenna. It comes in two major types, RG/58U, and RG/8U and has a resistance of 52 ohms. The RG/58U is the thinner of the two (about 1/4" in diameter) and has a single strand of about #16-18 copper wire, surrounded by Polyetholean foam, and then a covering of stranded copper wire, maybe #26-28, which is in turn covered by heavy vinyl plastic. The RG/8U is about 3/4" in diameter (I use this) and costs about 9-20¢ per foot. It is a 5-8 strands of #16-18 copper wire, covered by a very thick coat of polyetholean foam, and then surrounded with stranded #18-20 wire, which in turn is covered by a very thick coat of vinyl plastic. On both types, the RG/58U and the RG/8U, the inside wire is the Hot Line (or antenna's signal line), while the outside, stranded coating is for the XRs/RXes antennas' ground. I've hoped this has cleared up a few questions (I'm even confused now, more so than when I started) hi, and with that I'll say 73s, and willees all, I hope, in the next issue, if I can squeeze in. 73s.

First, a few notes about this location. C.V. is located ten miles S of San Diego and six miles N of old Mexico. I've put up a 100' longwire directional E/W, but I've had best results with my ham radio folded dipole. It's made out of about 60' of 300 ohm TV twinlead. The new governing body consisting of Dick Cooper, Ernie Cooper, and John Callarman, met in Buffalo Saturday, September 5th, with the following action taken:

A Courtesy Program Committee letter, prepared by Dick Cooper, was unanimously accepted and turned over to C.P.C. chairman David Oved. Callarman will check with his senator and representative, who head the respective subcommittees that deal with the F.C.C., for clarification of F.C.C. rulings re test programs.

Callarman was named to receive items directed to the governing body in connection with Rule 7 of the N.R.C. operating procedures. All complaints and other official correspondence, aside from direct business in the domain of other editors and committee heads, will be directed to John Callarman, P.O. Box 1914, Pampa, Texas 79066, who in turn will take up said business with proper club officials.

The governing body accepted a letter of resignation from DX-Down-the-Dial Editor Everett Johnson, and named Joe Brauner, Punxsutawney, Pa., to replace him. The governing body commended Johnson for his five years' yeoman service to the N.R.C. in his editorial capacity.

Jerry K. Conrad, Lexington, Kentucky, was named manager of the domestic DX contest, the rules of which will remain the same as last year's, both in the states and provinces and the letterama competition.

Ben Dangerfield, Chester, Pa., was named foreign contest manager, and contest rules were adopted as appear elsewhere in this issue of DX News.

The governing body established a series of certificates to be made available to club members, and appointed Hank Wilkinson, North Hollywood, Calif., to handle the certificates in conjunction with his supremacy ratings column. The governing body authorized Wilkinson to draft copy for the certificates, which will be printed by Dick Cooper. The certificates will be available free of charge upon application and suitable proof to Wilkinson, under rules established by Wilkinson. Certificates will be offered for 1000, 2000, 3000, 4000, 5000 and 6000 stations verified, and for 30, 50, 75, 100 and 150 countries QSL'd.

The governing body took up several specific projects requested by members. It was the general consensus of the governing body that such specific projects as those to be enumerated (as well as others) could be taken up and made available to club members by interested individuals in the club. The governing body would receive the proposal, give its sanction if okay, and the interested individual could publicize his project through the Musings column or by direct mail.

Specific projects so discussed at the meeting were:

- 1) A study of stations which consistently fail to verify reception reports. (Such a study was made several years ago by Porter Atherton, it was pointed out, and proved inconclusive.)
- 2) A proposal for changes in the N.R.C. reception report form. (Dick Cooper reported he had printed revised report forms, but several comments had been made regarding further changes, so the project is open for comment to the governing body through Callarman.)
- 3) A proposal that the NRC print prepared card forms to be sent to hard-to-verify stations by the individual member. (The consensus of the governing body was that those of us who verify by prepared card will prefer to prepare our own, but any individual wishing to make such a form available to club members may do so.)
- 4) A proposal for a Courtesy Program Committee "program arranging" contest was referred to C.P.C. Chairman David Oved.
- 5) A proposal was earlier turned down, by mail vote, that the executive secretary be required to print a membership list annually to be sent to all members.



The governing body recommended that Cedar Rapids, Iowa, be chosen as the site for the 1965 N.R.C. convention.

At the official business meeting Saturday night, September 5th, at the Kenton Manor Motel, retiring Executive Secretary Ray B. Edge turned over the club reins to new Exec Sec Dick Cooper. Other officers, editors, and committee heads in attendance were introduced.

D. Cooper presented his predecessor with a beautiful Bulova wrist-watch, suitably inscribed, from the entire club membership as a token of appreciation for Pop Edge's 24 years' continuous service to the organization. Orchid corsages were presented to wife Kate Edge and daughter Janette, whose work for the club was above and beyond the call of familial duty.

Callarman reported the previous actions of the governing body. Reports were also made by Editor Ernie Cooper, by Joe Fela re the frequency check list, and by Len Kruse re the conditions of frequencies list. New DXDD editor Joe Brauner was introduced.

D. Cooper also reported a by-mail vote by the governing body to name Ray Edge treasurer of the N.R.C., to retain the Buffalo mailing address. Governing body vote under the proposal submitted by D. Cooper, remains solely with the exec sec, musing editor, and DXDD editor.

Callarman reported that Joe Fela had arranged for a four-to-five-minute B.C.B. DX program to be broadcast weakly on shortwave on WRUL, Radio New York Worldwide. Arrangements for the broadcast, to be recorded by Callarman, will appear elsewhere in DX News.

Bill Stone moved and Allen Nissen seconded that the governing body recommendation that the 1965 convention be held in Cedar Rapids be approved. It was, unanimously, and hosts Bob Gorsuch and Len Kruse issued an official invitation to come to Cedar Rapids and celebrate the 10th anniversary of the 1955 Cedar Rapids convention!

This report respectfully submitted to the club membership in accordance with the N.R.C. rules by the governing body this 19th day of September, 1964.

Resume of past 5 years

When the club was turned back to Pop Edge in Buffalo after the 1959 Omaha Convention we had a total of \$713.31 in the club's treasury and no bulletin supplies to speak of. Reason for no bulletin supplies is that Hal Wagner knew he would not continue as publisher and did not wish to be loaded down with such supplies that he might have had to deliver to another location. In these past 5 years the following equipment was purchased by the club;

1 Addressograph Model #30 at a cost of - - - - - 140.76  
283 Address plates to cover all members at the time - - - 31.72  
Absorbed the additional .01 postage on all bulletins  
mailed since January 7 1963. Postal rates went up that date 170.00

Total added expenditures in past 5 years \$ 646.63

Thus you can see your club is being operated with the utmost efficiency and have continued to keep our annual dues at a minimum and still giving our members all possible DX information that can be gathered by members musings and outside sources and also maintaining our 34 issues each and every year.

It must also be remembered that our Musings Editor has been cutting the stencils for the musing section for the past 18 years. He uses his personal typewriter for the job. One of these days that typewriter is going to quit and being that it is many years old, repairs will be hard to have done because the typewriter companies do not continue to make parts for mills after they are 10 years old. So in case of a breakdown of Ernie's mill I am sure that the club should be responsible for replacing Ernie's Typewriter. You can be sure that many hundreds of our stencils have been cut by Ernie and from the way it looks he will be cutting several hundred more in the future. Actually the number of stencils Ernie has cut runs into the Thousands in the past 18 years.

Here in Buffalo we have been fortunate in obtaining prices that are below the prices in so many other locations especially on our mimeo paper and bulletin envelopes. The savings have contributed enough that the above purchases of the new mimeo-addressograph and original plates along with absorbing the increased postal rates on our Bulletin could be paid by your club without any increase in annual dues and still be in a position to take care of any near future needs of the club.

With the change of the Club's publication location you are assured that there will be no disruption of any kind. Further you can be assured that Dick Cooper along with Ernie and John Callarman will operate your club in the same efficient manner with the thought uppermost in their minds that this club will continue to serve the interests of the majority which in the past 24 years has shown that receiving all possible DX info and getting it on schedule is the most important factor.
