W A G L - 1560 - Lancaster, South Carolina. This will be a half-hour TEST period, consisting of music (recorded) and IDs very frequently. WAGL is known as

"The Voice Participating in Weaving A Greater Lancaster." This station first went on the air in July of 1962, but has seldom if ever been on since then for tests or frequency checks, so this up-coming test is a must for all DXers, as their big chance to hear WAGL. The frequency should be clear as this program goes on, 3:00-3:30, and our thanks to Mr. Phillips for informing us about this equipment checking occasion. We hope they get out well! So if you tune to a spot and find two stations battling it out and a bad 200 cycle het, you know that the stations are separated by 0.2 kc/s, likewise any het you can measure the frequency of gives you an exact measure of the difference between the stations involved. OK? DX CX have been as variable as a woman's heart, therefore things have been interesting. Up until the night of 10/30 TA CX were usually good, especially to Iberia, Central & Eastern Europe also North Africa. IAs have been very poor and no Central Africans (e/g. Nigeria) have come through since the beginning of September. On the night of 10/30 the Scandinavians mysteriously appeared; since they were all coming on the paths that are expected, obviously there was a violent drop in the usually great auroral area absorption. So, says I, if the high latitudes aren't eating up BCB signals from North Europe, they shouldn't bother similar signals from the West either. Tried for KFQD-730 but found the channel dominated by a very powerful CKLG, Vancouver. There was another EE there, coming from very far North that was very likely the Alaskan but not enough to log. Then came the coup de grace in Pyongyang-655 who was nice enough to fade in at the right time! I got a good report off via Hong Kong - hope they are as good about BCB QSLs as they are about those for SW. Tried my best to snag Peking-1040 but even the super-loop couldn't kill WHO. Think I shall consider Pyongyang my second best catch after Tonga-1020. Recent loggings including RNE-620 Canary Islands, Damascus-785, Iraq-464, Sweden-1223, Norway-1313, Kiev-872 are described in John C's excellent IDX section. Have spent the last week trying to get decent loggings on the presently unID TAs on 836 (Beirut), 791 (VOA Greece) 723 (Saudi Arabia) 962 (Finland) 638 (Cyprus) and 650 (ELBC); it's really torture to be able to tell who these stations are but not get enough clear audio to log or report. All the technical tricks in the book can't replace the human ear. To those eager souls who are lusting after a loop setup like mine, please be patient. It took me six months of hard work to get mine running right & the problems of modifying the design so those of you who don't have exactly the same setup as I can build one are very difficult. I'm doing my best. UnID Arab On 707 around 6:35pm s/off loops Cairo-Baghdad-Cyprus or so may be new Jordani or Kuwaiti XR as sked. Everyone listen to WRUL program & give John a plug w/the station! As I type this I have a TA on 827, (probably Sofia) testing with (get this) a square wave! Honest - the scope never lies!

- 566 IRELAND. Athlone, heard well several times of late between 1800 and 1830 s/off. The time they leave the air varies by a few minutes; up to 1834 or so. S/off with anthem. Reception erratic here. (Robie, Mass.)
- WEST BERLIN. Sender Freies Berlin, S6 2140 11/6, parallel to 575 and 593. First time heard. Much weaker than the big ones. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 575 UNID. German station heard fairly well here between 2200 and 2300, but don't know which one it is. Muhlacker? (Robie, Mass.)
- 584 SPAIN. R.N.E., Madrid, in well any evening prior to 1900 or after 2200. Should be one of the easiest for anyone needing Spain. (Robie, Mass.)
- 625 COSTA RICA. TIRICA, La Voz de la Victor, San Jose, fair with quiet music at 2330 11/6. (Leamy, Pa.)
- 629 ASIATIC RUSSIA. Khabarovsk. S5-6 at 0445 11/9, not in parallel with 548. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 635 KOREA, NORTH. R. Pyongyang outlet was S6 at 0450 11/9; parallel to 655 kc. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 638 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Prague is the stronger of 2 TA's heard here 11/8 1545-1600; also positively IDed R.N.E.-San Sebastian, SPAIN. No sign of Cyprus. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Sign-on 2227 with interval signal consisting of chords such as a harp or similar instrument. Time pips at 2230 followed by news. Fair signals. (Robie, Mass.)
- 640 CHINA. R. Peking outlet S7-8 0705 11/9; first time this year. (Wilkinson, Cal.)
- CUBA. CMQ, Habana. Has been broadcasting R. Moscow Spanish programming during the daytime. Anncr has Castillian accent. On all CMQ stations. (Miller, Fla.)

- 647 ENGLAND. B.B.C. European Service, Crowborough, is one of the most consistent B.B.C. stations of late, best before 0100. Had interesting talk on how to build "aerials" (in English) on 11/7 around 0045. (Fela, N.J.)
- SPAIN. A Spanish station was heard beneath BBC Third Program on 11/7 at 1545 and on 11/8 was heard signing off 1916 with Spanish National anthem. (Dangerfield, Pa.) E.B.U. lists R.N.E. Sevilla here, in addition to 683. (Ed.)
- 650 UNID. English speaker in briefly around 1650, slightly accented, and modulation too poor for a U.S. station; lots of WSM QRM; looped right for ELBC, suspect it's them. Noted 11/10. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 655 KOREA, NORTH. R. Pyongyang, believed to be station heard from 0510 to 0600 Sunday, 11/8; very clear in Oriental language and music, with flutter fading; thanks to Gordon Nelson. Now, getting a verie is another matter. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Noted parallel 635 at 0450 11/9. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 665 ICELAND. Eidar was probably the station heard clearly under Lisboa 11/7 1945-2000 s/off, as the very same program was heard on 737 kc. under Barcelona, and the language was completely unfamiliar. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- LITHUANIA. Vilnius, strong 2340 11/6. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- PORTUGAL. CSA2, Lisboa I reported on prepared card; heard 11/8 from 0202-0212; only 10 minutes, but enough for a report; at the time, BEC-1414 was barely audible, but Dakar-764 was as strong as ever heard. (Freeman, Calif.) Loud and clear most evenings. Seems to s/off at 2000. (Leamy, Pa.)
- 670 JAPAN. JOBK, Osaka, was S8-9 most of the AM on 11/9. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 683 UNID. Being heard some nights, a station signing on at 2215 and playing occasional Oriental music; mixes with Belgrade for awhile, then fades away. Think this may be Nairboi, KENYA, with Hindustani service, as there is also a sign-on signal (unreadable) on 863 kc. at the same time. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 685 GUATEMALA. TGRT, R. Fabulosa, Guatemala, blasting in here 2100 with ID as "La emisora mas moderna del pais," U.S. style breaks, etc. (Miller, Fla.)
- 690 CUBA. CMBC, Habana, is all night, guess no silent period. They're stronger than CBF here half the time. (Fela, N.J.)
- 695 UNID. Weak English here; possibly Roseau, but too weak to copy with any ID. (Leamy, Pa.)
- 707 UNID. Arab speaker nightly to s/off 1835; not parallel to Cairo or Agadir; loops Cairo-Cyprus-Baghdad area; may be scheduled new 100 kw. Jordani or Kuwait transmitter. Worth trying to find a shortwave parallel. (Nelson, Mass.) Starts to come in around 2240; at 2330 the music was noted as being Arabic or African. This was 11/11. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 720 COLOMBIA. HJAN, Barranquilla, clear Spanish s/on over Cuban at 0559 11/10; WGN carrier hit at 0600. Tuesday only AM WGN off. Prior to HJAN on, Cuban over weak SS till 0546 when carrier w/200 cycle beat added. (Hansch, Wis.)
- 725 UNID. Noted 11/12 at 2243 with "Aqui Columbia" but not able to get call. (Hansch, Wis.) TLX, Radio Columbia, San Jose, COSTA RICA listed here. (Ed.) Unid. LA around 2230 11/8. Who? (Fela, N.J.)
- 737 ICELAND. Akureyri, quite probably the one logged under R.N.E.-Barcelona on 11/7 1945-2000, as carried exactly the same program as heard on 665 under Lisbon. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- ISRAEL. Tel Aviv. Believe this may be the station heard signing on here with interval signal at 2255; woman speaks briefly at 2259, followed by man in Arabic at 2330; fair signal for about 5 minutes after this, then gradual fade. Heard a couple of times, and I have Gordon Nelson working on it to get a bearing with his loop ... which may prove me all wrong, hi! (Robie, Mass.)
- SPAIN. R.N.E., Barcelona, has been signing on here every night at 2255 with a new 10-note interval signal; when first heard it, had visions of Lourenco Marques, but no such luck; definitely Barcelona. Scope shows another station also signing on at 2255; this may well be ISRAEL, which though scheduled to s/on 2330, has been coming on at 2255 on its shortwave parallel. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 746 HOLLAND. Hilversum I. Fairly well heard recently until s/off at 1800 when clock strikes 12 and anthem is played. (Robie, Mass.) Excellent signal 1630 on 11/7; first time heard here in the afternoon. (Sampson, N.J.)

- SYRIA. Aleppo 2240 11/6, new for me, weak. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- UNID. Weak s/on at 2230 on 11/9, sounded like Arabic language but was almost unreadable and faded out shortly thereafter. My thought is that this was Damascus, SYRIA, as a weaker signal also noted on 785. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 750 JAPAN. JOIB, Sapporo, with news in English 0455-0500 11/9. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 755 PORTUGAL. Lisbon 1750 11/3, fair in English. (Siegel, N.Y.)
- RUMANIA. Timisoara, quite good 11/11 2213-2235, seemed parallel to 854, but that outlet pretty rough due to 855 QRM. (Schiller, N.J.) Heard with poor signals after 2200 some nights; still waiting for verie on 9/18 report. (Robie, Mass.) Is on before 2230, but interval signal at 2300 didn't check with one listed in WRH. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 760 CHINA. R. Peking outlet 10 DB over S9 at 0710 11/9; No WQA yet. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 764 IRAQ. Baghdad, faded in with chanting right after 2200 s/on 11/5 and 11/6, thanks to tip from Gordon Nelson. (Robie, Mass.)
- SENEGAL. R. Senegal, Dakar, noted weakly at 0345 11/9, before engulfed by WAEC about 0400. (Sampson, N.J.) Heard every evening prior to 1900, but not with the terrific signal they were putting in earlier in the year. (Robie, Mass.) Logged briefly 0200 11/5, with interval signal, then man speaking French. Still not enough to warrent new report; that of last spring unanswered. (Miller, Wash.) Good from 0050 s/on to 0230 when it faded; uses native drums as I.S. (Leamy, Pa)
- UNID. Odessa, UKRAINE? Under Iraq 2335 11/6. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 770 COLOMBIA. HJIX, Em. Monseratt, Bogota, believe this station now here, back on frequency. (Miller, Fla.)
- 773 U.A.R. Cairo, still heard quite frequently before and after 1800 with good signal. Guess I'll send another report to see if my luck has changed. (Robie, Mass)
- 780 PUERTO RICO. Ramey AFB, noted with good signal 0500 s/on Monday 11/9. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 782 PORTUGAL. CSE9, R. Clube Portugues, Miramar, s/on is at 0200; sometimes so strong they make reception of WBDM difficult. (Fela, N.J.) Battling with 4YA at 0330 11/9, fantastic 10DB/S9 at 0200. (Conrad, Ky.)
- UKRAINE. Kiev, tentative parallel to 935 and 665 2300 11/6. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 785 KOREA, NORTH. R. Pyongyang outlet not as good as 655 or 635 same AM. (Wilkinson)
- 795 BARBADOS. R. Barbados, Black Rock, w/Lord's Prayer 0503 11/9. Tremendous signal. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 809 SCOTLAND. B.B.C., Westerglen/Burghead in well 10/30 around 0200; this was a Friday AM when WGY was off. (Fela, N.J.)
- 810 PUERTO RICO. WKVM, San Juan heard 10/30 s/on 0439 $\frac{1}{2}$ and on 11/6 at 0425 $\frac{1}{2}$ with Star Spangled Banner, English ID, Spanish ID, and Spanish Program. (Johanns, NY)
- 818 ANDORRA. R. des Valles and somebody else at 0200. Cairo? Very strong. (Conrad)
- U.A.R. Patra, generally has an excellent signal at 0000 s/on; hope they verify. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 820 MEXICO. XESB, Santa Barbara, Chih. was clobbering WFLA until 2105 s/off 11/9; Reported again as no answer last season. (Freeman, Calif.)
- 827 BULGARIA. Sofia is probably the TA overriding EAJL with CC 2315; 11/12; testing with square waves (honest!) at 2320; woman comes on in unfamiliar language (Scheduled to be Macedonian) at 2330. (Nelson, Mass.) Logged around 2330-0015 on 11/7; interval signal doesn't agree with WRH, but got definite ID. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 830 JAPAN. JOBB, Osaka, strong all AM on 11/9; shuld be heard in East. (Wilkinson)
- 834 SR. HONDURAS. R. Delize, good to excellent most evenings. (Leamy, Pa.)
- 836 FRANCE. Nancy, noted 11/9 0130 parallel 944, 863, 1205 & 1376. (Conrad, Pa.) Booming in at 1600 11/7; no sign of Lebanon later, unfortunately. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 845 ITALY. Roma II 2300-2330 11/7, among others, English language noted. Bcth lady and man announcer; multi-lingual, I believe, but not at a readable level; apparently AN. (Miller, Wash.) S/off with English ID 0030; s/on 0145 in Italian. (Conrad, Ky.) Blasting here 2130 at room-filling level. Lovely TA signal, plays good music. (Miller, Fla.) Fair 1740 to 1800 11/1. (Siegel, N.J.) AN with good level most every evening. (Sampson, N.J.)

- 854 RUMANIA? Seemed to be parallel with 755 but heavy QRM from someone else plus a lousy signal precluded anything positive. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 863 ARMENIA. Erevan, s/on 2100 11/6, ID a bell-like song; parallel to 935 & 665; Never over S6; new for me; Country #69. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- FRANCE. Paris parallel 836, 944, 1205 & 1376 0130 11/9. (Conrad, Ky.)
- UNID. While trying for Armenian S.S.R. again (to get better log) another station was heard signing on at 2215, and I think it may be Nairobi, KENYA. Nothing readable yet, but worth lots of efforts. Heard various nights. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 872 SPAIN. EAJ101, Zaragoza, poor signal after 1700. (Robie, Mass.)
- 881 UNID. In English, suspect Wales; light soap opera at 0300 11/9. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 885 UNID. Heard Spanish believed to be Mexican about 0630, apparently a daytimer, or an image of some sort. (Freeman, Calif.)
- 890 DOM. REP. HIPJ, R. Popular, Santo Domingo, new station on the air, s/on Monday 0456, anthem and calls given; starts off with extremely nationalistic program; strong signals. (Miller, Fla.)
- JAPAN. JOHK, Sendai, was S7 at 0520 11/9. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- UNID. Het noted on WLS in late afternoon. Algeria operating off frequency? (Sampson, N.J.)
- 900 UNID. Japanese heard here for a few minutes on A.M. of 11/9. No ID. Too much U.S.A. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 908 ENGLAND. B.B.C., Brookman's Park, another regular often heard at its 0135 s/on. Surprisingly clear next to 910, a graveyard channel here. (Fela, N.J.)
- UNID. Who signs on here at about 2300 - too much 910 slop to copy. (Sampson, NJ)
- 917 YUGOSLAVIA. Ljubljana, good signals around 2300 s/on and later 11/7. (Sampson)
- UNID. Still driving me batty. Is this Mozambique? Could be Portuguese. Weak; s/on 2300, preceded by cuckoo interval signal. Neither time nor signal agree with WRH for Mozambique, however. (Hoffman, N.J.) Poor signal 1828-1850 with classical music 11/7. (Siegel, N.Y.)
- 926 BELGIUM. R.T.B., Brussels, log report out for 11/7 reception; also very good 11/9 til 0300+. (Conrad, Ky.) Often strong enough to override WPAT slop at 0100 s/on. (Sampson, N.J.)

- 940 JAPAN. Several Japanese stations heard here on A.M. of 11/9. Mixed too much. Will try again. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 944 FRANCE. R.T.F., Toulouse, noted 1130 11/9 parallel 836, 863, 1205 & 1376. (Conrad)
- 953 SPAIN. EAJ29, R. Continental, Madrid, sounds like xylophone interval signal plus harp! Sent a tape to them, 10db/S9 at 0100 11/9 with U.S. music in Spanish. (Conrad, Ky.) I believe they still s/on at 0100, but by the time they hit the air, the carrier is little more than a het. (Fela, N.J.)
- 960 BERMUDA. ZFBI, in with very strong signal 0100-0200 11/11; clear ID 0100; with a program of semi-popular music and some advertisements. (Burket, Pa.)
- 962 TUNISIA. Tunis II 1735-1800 11/8 in English. (Siegel, N.Y.)
- UNID. T.A. het heard many mornings, but rarely breaks through. Did hear them giving exercises one morning around 0045, but not sure of language. (Fela, N.J.)
- 973 SAKHALINSK. Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk, S5-6 at 0515 11/9. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 998 MOLDAVIA. Kishinev, rough but loggable 11/11 1933-2031, English from 2000-2030 only, as near as I could determine, relaying shortwave Radio Moscow. (Schiller, N.J.) Heard 11/6, but not until 2310. Weak, parallel to 665 at times. (Hoffman)
- 1000 CHINA. R. Peking outlet heard all morning 11/9. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- NEW ZEALAND. LZD, Tauranga, first D/U for me, 0330-0400+, 10db/S9 signals for a surprise. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1010 NETH. ANTILLES. PJC7, R. Hoyer, Willemstad, Curacao, a powerhouse here Mondays at 0430 s/on; programming in Papamiento; girl announcer, Latin records. (Miller, Fla.) One of my favorites. 5 years ago, played U.S. C&W tunes at this time. (Ed)
- 1020 DOM. REP. HIJP, R. Comercial, Santo Domingo. Strong with news and local ads at 0530 over KDKA. They're a few CPS off frequency. (Miller, Fla.)

- 1020 GUATEMALA. TGUX, R. Panamericana, Guatemala, good under KDKA TT and KGBS with English 11/8. (Leamy, Pa.)
- 1030 MEXICO. XEQR, R. Centro, Mexico, D.F. Found well atop WBZ 11/15 2130-2150 for log on notorious non-verifier. WBZ usually tops here. (Callarman, Texas)
- 1030A INTL. WATERS. R. City, after moving around 1015, etc., now heard here. Is ex-Radio Sutch. (Patrick, ENGLAND.)
- 1034 ESTONIA. Tallin I with two-tone gong IS at 2400 11/7 after a program of very fine music, lady announcer. Not relaying Radio Moscow. (Millar, Wash.)
UNID. Tallin I, ESTONIA? Believed parallel to 935 2300 11/6. Not sure at all, however. (Hoffman, N.J.) Roy's tape very good, used on WRUL show 11/21. (Ed.)
- 1035 UNID. Are people finding an open carrier here after Panama signs off around 2200? Noted here several times as late as 0100. (Freeman, Calif.)
- 1040 CHINA. R. Peking outlet, most powerful of all Chinese stations. This one should be heard in the Mid-West and the East. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1043 MOROCCO. R. T.M., Sebaa-Aioun, at 1640 on 11/8, the East German station was on top, but right underneath and quite clear was a Moroccan, in French, and parallel to 701. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1061 DENMARK. Kalundborg is apparently now carrying Program I; good nightly; OC s/on 2345; man comes on in Danish with news at 0000; pop music later. Norte II puts OC on about 0009 and messes up the channel rather badly. Female announcer has very sexy voice -- anybody remember Marianne from Danish SW service years ago? Like her. (Nelson, Mass.) A big break for those searching this country. (Ed.)
PORTUGAL. Norte II 1804-1822 11/1 in English. Severe WRCV QRM. (Siegel, N.Y.)
- 1075 COSTA RICA. TIFC, Faro del Caribe, San Jose, has English at 2200 religious programs, address is Box 2710, San Jose. (Leamy, Pa.) Heard around 2330 11/8 with English religious programming. (Fela, N.J.)
- 1079 SPAIN. EFEL4, Madrid, in very clearly at 2130 s/off on 11/11. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
A Swedish DX'er has verified him here. (Ed.)
- 1097 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Bratislava. Heard several times since 10/30 around 2300. As a rule signal has not been good here. (Robie, Mass.)
UNID. At 0000 6 pips, followed by a man's voice, then a female singing; WHO? Didn't have the Czech sound. More like B.B.C., but they're 1080. (Conrad, Ky.)

Stuttgart is now on 1142, Munich on 1106. (Ed.)
- 1115 NICARAGUA. YNL, Chinendega, clear ID at 2330 11/8. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1125 COSTA RICA. TISRHB, R. Popular, San Jose, heard 11/9 at 2400 s/off and before for another try at a verie. (Freeman, Calif.)
- 1151 ENGLAND. B.B.C., Stagshaw, logged even through local WDEL at 1845 on 11/8. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1165 SWAN I. R. Americas, gave QTH P.O. Box 352, Miami, Fla. 10/27 and starts 0455, English ID, then Spanish ID for 5 minutes, and English sign-on 0500, followed by Spanish R.S. Logged till 0555 for INFO-report. (Johanns, N.Y.) Answering your question, Ralph, QTH means "location," QRA "name of station." (Ed.)

UNID. Booming het, but couldn't find any signal 11/12, 0605-0620. 1180 had VOA and WHAM, but no jammer. Doubt if it was jammer off freq. VOA more likely, from Okinawa, but when do they s/on? Got to work on this one. (Schiller, N.J.) 3/on now 0500, Ron, but note below. (Ed.)
UNID. On 11/8, station in English with woman announcer 2153-2203 fade-out; played "Java" (Al Hirt) and a c&w record; tremendous het makes me believe it was undoubtedly a TA. Dunno if Sweden or ??? South Africa listed for Comm. Svc. s/on 2200; believe they're not English. Guessing it's unneeded Sweden. (Schiller, N.J.) (Farther below) (Ed.)
UNID. Sounds like a jammer here ... is 2 kc. +1 kc. away from WHAM ... Is this Cuber? (Sampson, N.J.) Than what? (Ed.)

- 1214 ENGLAND. B.B.C. noted til 2100, didn't know they ran this late. (Sampson, N.J.) Poor signal 1815 11/7. (Robie, Mass.)
- 1235 BERMUDA. ZBML, Hamilton, good most evenings; have sent third report, still no verie. (Leamy, Pa.)
- 1250 ASIATIC RUSSIA. Khabarovsk, was S7 at 0555 11/9; Kremlin chimes heard at 0601. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1268 YUGOSLAVIA. Novi Sad, first time logged; definite ID 2315 11/7; weak but in the clear. (Hoffman, N.J.)

- 1502 POLAND. Very strong in French, English and Spanish 1720-1800 11/7. (Siegel, NY)
- 1510 CHINA. R. Peking, outlet, heard and logged from 0633 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 0658 $\frac{1}{2}$ on 11/9; a new one for me. (Wilkinson, Calif.)

EDU shows the following, with powers: ENGLAND: Brookmans Park, 60; Moorside Edge, 58; Newcastle, 2; Plymouth, $\frac{1}{4}$; Redruth, 2; SCOTLAND: Burghead, 20; Redmoss, 2; Westerglen, 50; NORTHERN IRELAND: Lisnagarvey, 10; Londonderry, $\frac{1}{4}$. It provides return airmail postage in the stamps of the various countries around the world, for use by DX'ers. Prices per unit range between 10¢ for Canada and 60¢ for Aden, Burma, etc. A.N. "Sax" Ringler, W2SAW, who runs the DX Stamp service, offers a complete price list from the above address for a stamp or SASE. Many countries' smaller post offices do not know what an IRC is, and many stations are far enough away from a post office that it would be somewhat inconvenient for them to traipse down to same to cash in an IRC for surface mail return postage. And when air mail return postage costs only a few pennies more, through the DX stamp service, and is more convenient for the station anyway ... well, friends it oughtta help your verification percentage. I bought 12 bucks worth of stamps earlier this year, and haven't used a one ... due to a very heavy buzz at my current location, which cropped up recently, DX has been negligible. I have a new location to move to next week. So watch my smoke, Semrad, Conrad, Wheeler, Hathaway and Lutzenberger, hi!
