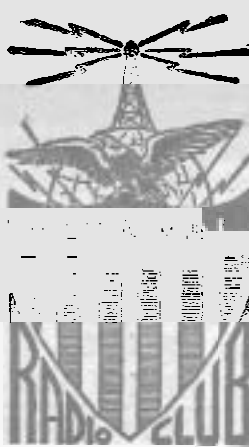

"WGAU has a f/c the 3rd Monday morning of each month, from 1:15-1:30am EST. Mr. Brook will send a reply to all correct DX reports he receives. On February 15, in addition to their r/c, WGAU will be on for a special test from 4:00-4:30am EST "if no other station in this area has regular f/c at those times." This test will consist of a 2,000 cycle tone and voice announcements. This is possibly the only time WGAU will be on as late as 4:30am on Monday, so let's take advantage of this chance to log 27-year-old WGAU, Georgia's "Station of the Year." There are several stations, of course, running all night on 1340 at this time, but it is the best time nevertheless to try for WGAU, so let us all be tuned to look for WGAU's rather high-pitched cycle tones. CHANGES IN STATION DATA TO BE COMPILED BY ROGER WINSOR

We had a pleasant chat with Roger Winsor, 7001 West Stanley Ave., Berwyn, Ill. 60403 earlier this week via long distance telephone. Roger has accepted our call for a volunteer to compile all station data since the publication of the most recent Vane Jones Log, in order that we might prepare in handy-reference-form, all changes from the time the Jones Log went to press (Nov. 1963). This is sure to be a big help, and we'll be sending it along in a subsequent issue of "DX News". Howard Sams and Company have advised us the next edition of the Jones Log will be published in July, 1965, which means it probably won't be available for some time after that date.

ACROSS THE PUBLISHER'S DESK - -

Among the mail we have received of late was a much appreciated letter from our old friend and faithful member Walter I. Goldy, 4156 E. Pima, Tucson, Arizona 85716. Walter has retired to Tucson on a permanent basis now and while he is not at the dials as much as in days gone by, he continues his interest in the hobby. He answered my questions about a station that I suspect not many members remember...W M B J Wilkesburg, Pennsylvania...a station that preceded WWSW. Ever hear of 'em Tilbrook? Steve Weinstein? WMBJ was owned by a preacher and was primarily a religious-type station. They sold out and the new owners changed call letters to WWSW. Best wishes to you Walter, and we hope you enjoy a lot of traveling. Stop in and visit with us if you ever make it to our town!

Another exchange of correspondence that I appreciated was with old friend and long-time member John Tweedie, Box 103, Oakhurst, New Jersey 07755. John sent me a photo copy of an oldtime verie I was interested in...WBAK, Harrisburg, Pa. which was owned and operated by the Pennsylvania State Police. John verified 'em in 1933. I can just vaguely remember this station. Operated on 1460 kcs, or thereabouts.

Incidentally, John Tweedie also reports reception of HUELVA, SPAIN on 836 kcs. John says they were in the clear early evenings, and later interfered with by Nancy, France. WRH lists them as 2 kw. Nice catch. No doubt this is the UNID. T.A. listed in the "golden behind" pages by Howard Fountain, Rome, Georgia.

"SOUND OFF!" I've been reluctant to "sound off" editorially in these pages. Each time I have made some small comment I have received a card or letter from what seems to be a dedicated opposition. They are a tiny minority, and sometimes are annoyous. At the risk of provoking these so-dedicated correspondents, I shall use this space to comment on what seems to be a growing problem...VERIES... or rather the LACK OF 'EM. Several of the older members have urged me to make some comments about this and I'm sure we are all concerned about the "diminishing returns". Maybe the following thoughts will help, particularly the newer members.

1. Be courteous in your correspondence. Make your reports neat and clean.
2. Make your reports interesting. Some of us enclose local view cards or clippings from local newspapers. If you use a report form, comment on your locality, the kind of equipment you use, the weather, other stations being heard, etc.
3. Always enclose return postage. Use of commemorative stamps adds interest.
4. Be sure to submit material that can be checked as proof of your reception. Give as lengthy a log as you can. Sometimes a station can be logged satisfactorily in a few minutes, depending on what you hear. Tape recordings are fine if you have the facilities and can afford the expense.
5. Don't make unreasonable requests of the station. Most stations operate with a small staff, and answering mail is a real burden.
6. Imagine yourself on the receiving end of the report. How would you be impressed with what you send a station if you were the Chief Engineer.
7. Follow-up letters are worthwhile; be polite. Enclose postage again.
8. Prepared cards usually get results if you like this method. Sometimes it's the only way you'll get an answer.

DX continued slow during these past two weeks w/only one half-decent catch caught - KAPT-1220 on 1/25 for the NRC TEST; pretty loud & readable for 2,700 miles & lkw. The only other logging was redicent-worth CMGU-1340 AN w/Reloj Nacional. Speaking of Cubans, CMJL, no longer on 920, has probably moved to 1140. Other LA news: HOJ2-1045 has either left the air or moved back to 1040; Dresuen-1043 has had almost a clear channel since it disappeared. YND is back on 675 roaring beside TIU. UnID on 1245 hitting 1246, so noted this evening (1/28) w/the latter 1.5 times stronger; 'tis for you, Gordon Nelson. Some DXers' mystery on 781 or 782 may be YVOD in San Cristobal, & the Venezuelan on 1344 is YVQU in San Carlos. HJAI is now blasting on 1015, one of the loudest splits on the dial. The only TA news is the s/on time for my 1554 mystery - 11pm. If anyone is interested in what South Florida DXing is like, here's a rough idea: The daytime dial, on the lower end, is an uncrowded mixture of Floridians up to 200 miles distant and Cubans up to 300 miles distant. There are less Ws noted than CMs, but the former, being closer, average slightly stronger. The upper end of the band is as in most other area of the U.S., give a few Cubans & local-like ZNS. Ground wave reception at fair levels is a regular phenomenon up to 700 miles, like 4VEF-1035, Radio Americas-1165, WWL-870, WPAL-730 & the JBC-750. At night the picture changes. A typical NARBA "clear channel" has one dominant U.S. or Mexican station (or Cuban, for that matter) partially masking from one to three LAs, the stronger ones being coastal Colombians or Venezuelans. The domestic fades out for one third of the time, leaving what's behind it in the clear, commonly a couple of lively LAs and a piercing hum from their hetro-dyne. Many LAs, however, are dominant themselves, but there are many more dominant domestics. The "regional & "local" channels are practically all domestic w/a few Cubans, Puerto Ricans, & Colombians scattered around. Only a couple of the most powerful splits can be picked up w/a small RX but the communications RS reveals a myriad of them of good to fair strength & modulation. And that's Florida DX. Excuse me for being abrupt but I'm near 30. Think of the WX outside & think of the WX in Wonderful Florida! Miami in '65!

I don't really have much of interest to report in the way of new DX, but maybe I'm spoiled from the reception of October, November, & December, and had better start digging a little bit. On looking back to 1/17 I note a logging of a Moroccan on 1043 kc/s from 5:30 to 6:30pm, mixed w/the usually dominant DDR station. MM 1/18 was a blank for me (wish I'd tried 1300 kc/s.!) marred by a buzz that covered most of the dial & sent me back to bed. Maybe this was a relation of your buzz, Ernie. Sunday afternoon of 1/24 found quite a few strong TAs after 5pm, but none I didn't have. Getting desperate I even turned in reports on Porto-1367 and TIW-775, for reception at 7pm & 10pm, respectively. These I had often heard but never tried to verify. This Fall we purchased a small cottage at Fair Haven Cliffs, Fair Haven, Md. on the Chesapeake Bay about 25 air miles E of Washington D.C. & 15 miles below Annapolis, Md. On a number of the warmer weekends I have gone down to the cottage w/the HQ-129-X & have DXed Saturday afternoon, evening & early SM. The cottage sits near the top of a high hill about 500' from the water, & overlooks most of the cottages in the area. This is a tremendous DX location for FM TV & BCB w/a strong N NE & E reception pattern. It's far superior to Chevy Chase. CBT-540 Grand Falls, CBN-640 St. Johns, & CBY-990 Corner Brook are frequently noted evenings w/CBY & CBT usually overriding their respective channels. The three week long break I was just forced to take from DXing really hurt the old Log, but now I'm back at it again. I recently got a letter from my old pal Don Jensen, P. of ANARC, asking me to turn my direction-finding equipment on Radio Americas as a question about its location has recently been raised. I spent an evening on the problem & here's what I found. I know from other experiments that the absolute calibration of my setup is good to within a degree, but for greater accuracy (and for a number of theoretical reasons) I chose to measure the angle between Americas & Belize-834. The average of 100 independent bearings on Belize was found to be 216.2 degrees. Since the computer says the bearing to Belize should be 215/5 degrees, the calibration seems to be off by about 0.7 degrees, which is reasonable. I then took a series of 100 bearings on Americas & got an average of 203.2 degrees. Since the distribution of angles seemed to be skewed a bit & I could hear a jammer in the background, I took a second series of 100 bearings on Americas a few hours later. This average came out to 202.7 degrees, or different from the first run by 0.5 degrees. This is more variation than I usually get between two runs this extensive & I believe it is due to the presence of the jammer. The computer says the difference in angles between Belize & Swan should be exactly 8.0 degrees, but we observe a difference of 13/3 degrees between Belize & the averaged value for Americas. The best bearing for Americas passes a bit S of Swan Is., right through Grand Cayman & Corn Is., & a bit S of San Jose, C.R. Statistical analysis shows it is unlikely that the observed error is due to chance alone. I was unable to use the scope nuller to get rid of the jammer because the primary jammer seems to be FM, not AM. I've tried to calculate how much effect to expect from an MM jammer on Cuba but it became too hairy & I was forced to quit. My conclusion is that Americas is either on the Swan Island path or close to it. The observed anomaly is probably due to one of the following: 1. Incorrect coords used for Swan (I used 17 d. 24' N, d. 55' W) or 2) More Cuban jamming power is located E of the path from Swan than W of it, therefore the bearing is pulled slightly Eastward. I need other DXers' w/loops to supply bearings to triangulate with. Anyone interested please contact me. I'll give all details & instructions about how to take the data. It'll be a couple of hours work but the results might be real interesting! Good DX.

- 1220 BRAZIL. PRA9, R. Mayrink Veiga, Rio de Janeiro, logged under S7 OC (with occasional TT) carrying "carnival" music, announcements between every other record in Portuguese. 3d Brazil this year. Date: 2/1. (Callarman, Texas)  
MEXICO. XEB, R. Mayestique (Sp. unsure) All AM 1/24 over/under Unid. Canadian rocker; now slogan? (Edmunds, N.Y.) Majestic is a brand name of radios sold in Mexico. Often has commercials on XE-stations. (Ed.)



- 1223 SPAIN/SWEDEN. Unidentified Spaniard s/off 1830 leaving Falun on by itself; Falun audible 1830-2400 1/28., light musical programs, etc. Scope shows no trace of Arabic station. (Nelson, Mass.)
