I have no DX to report but the Contest Standings are in order & I hope they are right. The Pittsburgh group is making a heck of a showing, taking over second spot. I'll be looking forward to your last entries. I had hoped to make it to Cedar Rapids, but no funds so, Florida next year, hi. 73s. (All is forgiven, Jerry. My recent Baja California Expedition was a real adventure but unfortunately I was unable to DX at all because the daily temperature extremes (115° during the day, 25° at night!) knocked out my transistorized gear. Next time I'll pick the bias points more carefully, hi. I was very pleased w/the new Country List & was able to add seven new countries to my total countries logged count to bring the total to the magic 100 mark! My February logging of PJD2 which at the time I thought was only #93 was actually the 100th country logged during my first year of BCB DXing. So I did it, hi. Of my first 100 countries (gotta think positive, hi) only 20 were on even frequencies, all the rest were on splits. Considering I live almost within the Boston city limits & have nine high power fulltime locals to put up with I don't think I'm doing too badly. The only antenna I can use here because of the HNL is my big direction-finding loop which sits on my desk. Best catches in the last year have been Nigeri -1458, Thule-1425, North Korea-655 & Tonga-1020, all of which are QSLed in spite of the fact I'm more interested in the technical aspects of DXing than in just collecting QSLs. I've made some interesting experiments during the last year which tend to remove much of the mystery from certain types of atypical reception modes - I plan to write quite a few technical articles for the NRC this Summer describing my results. Also this Summer I'm going to run off certain problems associated w/propagation predictions on the computer & if all goes well we'll have some really interesting predictions to make next season. In order to get a value for the screening height constant I need data regarding late & early TA reception. I've gathered quite a bit myself but I'd like to hear from other DXers regarding the exact details (dates, times, etc.) of early (more than an hour before SSS) & late (past 4:00am) TA reception. Of all the bonafide DX reported during the last season, the most scientifically interesting is Ken Butterfield's verified reception of Baghdad-908 on 2/1; I'm at a complete loss at the moment to explain that propagation mode, hi. Latest DX here has been South Africa on 764 & 1286 around 10:30pm, heard since the equinox. Good DX. (It sure is, Gordon, hi -ERC)

Greetings DXers. Well, DX has taken a turn for the worse, as I have suddenly been struck by an onslaught of electrical interference & TVI. Until a few weeks ago, I had never had any problems at all w/spurious noises. Now it seems to be increasing every day. The only veries which I have received since I last Mused are from WRR WPIT & WAUK. Incidentally, the letter from WAUK said that my report was the "finest and most intelligent" report they had ever received. Illinois is now on CDT & will remain so until the last Sunday of October. The only trouble w/DST is that it confuses the f/c list. The latest issue of Radio-TV Experimenter has an article concerning a mechanical filter which will increase the selectivity of any radio to 2 or 3 kc/s. I plan to build it this Summer, so will let you know how it turns out. Latest DX includes the following: 4/28- WRTH-590 ex-WBBY heard at 9pm in & out of WKZO & WOW. 5/1- WWCM, Brazil, Ind. heard throughout the day u/WBEL. Wonder how come I had ever heard them before? 5/5- Much needed WSUI-910 finally heard during the evening hours. 5/8- WATC-900 heard at 8pm s/off. WATC is only the second U.S. station on 900 kc/s. that I have heard, the other being WKYW Louisville. The WLS XR, being only a few miles away, makes it very difficult to hear anything on 900 or 880 kc/s. for that matter. By the way, the other day WLS was having XR difficulties & so went off the air for a few minutes. Much to my surprise, WREF-880 was coming in w/a very good signal strength. ROY PATRICK, Derby, England, checks in again: DX has dropped off during the past week, can't even hear T.W.R., 800 kos, so condx must be poor. Do we count Caroline North as Isle of Man or Intl. Waters? (Isle of Man-Ed) Now for some news: R. Caroline North, now testing at 2300 GMT (1800 EST) with calls in Dutch, German and English. Reports wanted from Europe. GRM from time to time, and from tuning note, I suspect it's Prague, with E.T. on 1520 kc. KING Radio, now back on the air, 1260 kes., CTH, Oxford House, Folkestone, Kent. EAST GERMANY: R. Berlin International, 1511 kc., heard in English at 2200 GMT (1700 EST) with GRM from Brussels. Quite a mix-up. WEST BERLIN. AFN Berlin 935 kc heard with good signal at 0400 GMT (2300 EST) with C & W show. LATE NEWS: R. City now 5 kw on 1033 kos. I make the other frequency 1609, this is off the broadcast band." At deadline, a second letter in from Roy, mentioning the following logs: 1070, R. El Mundo, good signal here at 0330 GMT on May 7; 1130 WNEW still heard with a lot of CSB, however; 1165 R. Americas good signal at 0400 May 8th. Got a QSL card from ELBC, which gives me another country." Roy also mentions that the BBC plans a new relay on medium wave in Monrovia, Liberia, to transmit for 10 hours a day. Power and frequency unknown.

JAMAICA. I've got Radio Jamaica verifying. C.E. tells me he's getting (SL)'s printed up. But heard the same old story of not enough program details, etc. JBC's says he'll have to consult the General Manager after I finally got to see him. (Silvera, Jamaica) Thanks, Mike.

In this issue of IDXD, you will find the latest Ron Schatz Cuban list, a government list of stations from El Salvador, and a similar one from Nicaragua. I must admit, there appear to be some stations we know are operating that are left out of these latter two lists. It is, unfortunately, quite difficult to get up-to-date information from these countries. Note also, in the What's Heard section, 647 kc. for information on the radio situation in the Dominican Republic.

The new typewriter, for those who are interested, is an Underwood Touchmaster Five, Standard, and, unfortunately, I cannot recall the name of the type. Obviously, we will be able to cram more information in the IDXD column.

- 535 GRANADA. W.I.B.S., St. George's, in nicely at 2100 5/3, with slot frequency setting on minus side. Verified earlier on 545. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 580 PUERTO RICO. WKAA, San Juan, noted under local, but copy impossible 1908 5/10. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 620 UNID. Spanish speaker seems to be AN here, usually way under USUN, but occasionally atop. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 647 DOM. REP. HIFA, R. San Isidro, La Voz de San Isidro, R. HIFA, San Isidro. This station, another in Santo Domingo on 960 kc/s, and R. Santo Domingo, are the only stations operating during the crisis; all other stations are off the air. HIFA (FA for Fuerza Aerea)(San Isidro is the Dominican A.F.B.) is one of the official stations of the Government of National Reconstruction (loyalists/junta). First heard 5/7 on 644 kc/s testing with Stars and Stripes Forever, and frequent ID's. Programming and slogan changed gradually during the next few evenings, with anti-Communist, pro-American harangues, and long periods of classical music. Heard on 647 kc/s 5/9, and started relaying the S.D. station on 960 kc/s 5/12. No frequency or power announced. Irregular s/off times -- usually 2200. Reported for what should be historic verie; as HIFA is probably only temporary. (See 960 kc.) (Schatz, Fla.) A Santo Domingo station here the last few days. Can't tell who. About 1000 watts. Signs off around 2200. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Station of the loyalist forces, possibly using HIAT-650 equipment, as only 12 miles from Santo Domingo. Plays martial music and much anti-communist talk. No commercials of any sort noted. Most other Dominicans seem off the air for the duration. I understand HISD-620 and satellite stations are under rebel control, and exhorting the people to resist U.S. Marines. (Miller, Fla.) Good bit of reporting, gentlemen. (Ed.)
- 660 VENEZUELA. YVLH, R. Girardot, Maracay, very strong at 1917 5/10 for first time here, but used to hear a R. Caracas here. But aren't they both impossible on the same channel? (Silvera, Jamaica) YVLH relays, and is verified from, R. Caracas. (Ed.)
- 750 JAMAICA. J.B.C., Galina, quite good on 4/24 and 4/26 around 1900-2000. Can't seem to coax a verie from them. Reports out. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 764 SENEGAL. R. Senegal, Dakar, is the only TA coming in now, and it does that very well. (Schatz, Fla.)
- SO. AFRICA/UKRAINE. SABC and Odessa have been putting through a weak jumble some nights around 2230-2300, but only rarely is the audio good enough to copy. SABC plays lots of distinctive So. African "Little German Band" pop music. SABC heard best on 4/20, and logged as Country #101. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 800 CUBA. CMKL here runs on and off, mostly off. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 840 PHILIPPINES(?). DYSR, The Voice of Christian Brotherhood, Dumaguete City. A tentative report, with tape recording, has gone to this outlet for 3/15 reception at 0436-0443 following ID of the lingo on my tape by Richard Wood as Tagalog. The Oriental here was beating with two Brazilians and an unid. English-speaker that morning. If it pans out, the station will be my best all-time catch. I note, though, that WRFVH lists only English and Visayan for the lingo used by this one. (Callarman, Texas)
- 850 URUGUAY. CX16, R. Carv, Montevideo. Noted here 0357-0420 5/3, thanks to Mike Silvera tip. GRM'd by CMKC, CKVL, and WJW. IRCA lists s/on at 0355, and at tune-in, was giving parts of s/on annct. As Mike said, plenty of commercials. (Callarman, Texas)
- 870 PUERTO RICO. WHOA, San Juan, clear, behind WML on 4/19 at 2105, in English. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 910 VENEZUELA. YV??, R. Aeropuerto, Caracas, logged and reported during severe Aurora CX on Tuesday evening, 4/20, practically in the clear 1930-2015. (Cooper, N.Y.) I think YVRQ is now correct. (Ed.)
- 915 NETH. ANTILLES(?) Nice, friendly letter in from Paul J. Pietsch, Jr., station manager of PJA-6, R. Victoria, Aruba, containing schedule and pictures. Regarding my inquiry, he said they were operating on 900 kc. He was also puzzled at who I am hearing on this freq. almost nightly, using Dutch language mostly. I am beginning to think this may be R. Caribe-PJL3 of Willemstad, operating on a new freq. with higher power, as mentioned on p. 221 of WRH/65. (Burnham, Conn.)
- 925 PERU. OAX4E, R. Central, Lima, listed 930 with 5 kw., is heard in New Zealand on this channel. (NZ DX Times)
- 959 SPAIN/NIGERIA. Weak pair of carriers here 0130 5/10 is almost certainly Enugue and EAJ29; one looped West Africa, the other Southern Europe. Heard audio from the Nigerian at this time last year, but none so far this year. Wath this frequency when 1358 is high. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 960 DOM. REP. "La Voz Oficial del Gobierno de la Reconstruccion Nacional, Santo Domingo. Not heard here yet, but ID'd over HIFA-647 on 5/12 giving this frequency. Still trying to log this temporary outlet, but without luck. By the way, the rebels have "Radio Santo Domingo." (Schatz, Fla.)
- 1000 BRAZIL/UNID. PRB9, R. Record, Sao Paulo, smashing in as usual 0300 5/10, but bad GRM from at least three other carriers at that time. Only PRB9 audio up. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1015 PANAMA. HOU44, R. Reloj, Panama, logged on AN show 4/19 and reported for second time. Hopefully, but doubtfully. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 1020 COLOMBIA. HJFG, La Voz del Pueblo, Pereira, is the Todelar outlet here till 2400 s/off. La Voz de Escalleras seemed to be another ID. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- VENEZUELA. YVWX, R. Calendario, Maracaibo, here from 1030 kc/s. (Schatz, Fla.) Is the Reloj Continente reported in 2/6 IDXD. Relay news from R. Continente network; this location was reported as Caracas. (Silvera)
- 1030 ARGENTINA. LS10, R. Libertad, Buenos Aires, up with fine signal and Spanish ID with morse code at 0155 5/3. Logged as country #102. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1090 VENEZUELA. YVNT(?), R. Universo, got only I.D. under KAAV at 0459 5/6. (Silvera, Jamaica) Latest WRH shows YVPE, R. Yaracuy, San Felipe here, and YVNT, R. Universo, Barquisimeto, on 730, but there've been many changes. (Ed.)
- 1110 PUERTO RICO. WVJP, Caguas, heard at s/off 2400 5/3 with P.R. N.A. and S.S.B. They surely must suffer from YVNN down there, as it's like a local in Miami. YVNN s/off is 2301. (Miller, Fla.)
- 1115 ECUADOR. HCLA2, R. America, Guayaquil, is heard on this frequency in New Zealand. (NZ DX Times)
- 1120 GUATEMALA. TGRR, R. Reloj, Guatemala, logged one past late evening by nulling out KMOX. Very good signal. (Schatz, Fla.)
- 1128 ENGLAND (Intl. Waters). R. London, with music pgm and annets. Very weak 4/23, CBD off, at 0001. (Calkin, N.B.)
- 1170 COLOMBIA. HJ??, R. Corozal, quite good at sunset skip, but gives no calls or locations in ID. Not the R.C.N. noted two weeks ago. (Silvera, Jamaica) HJDP, R. Colosal, Neiva, has 1 kw. here. (Ed.)
- VENEZUELA. Still working on this channel. Came up with ad. saying "Diez Bolivares." Who is the YV here? Some of Americas' jammers till on 1165, made things rough. Noted 4/21 1732. (Silvera, Jamaica) YVQV, R. Aca-rigua, Acarigua, is shown here. (Ed.)
- UNID. Spanish Speaker seems to be AN here Easter SM, heard 0158-0216 4/18 during severe Aurora, with no signal from WVVA; had Coca-Cola ads and made ID at 0213, but very weak and not able to get it - anybody know definitely who this is? (Cooper, N.Y.)

- 1180 COLOMBIA. HJFX, La Voz del Ruiz, Manizales, noted with s/off under HJGK, R. Santander, 4/28 at 0039. (Silvera Jamaica)
UNID. Spanish-speaker here also since 4/18, ID'ing after each selection as "Radio X", but otherwise UNID. Any help would be appreciated. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 1190 COLOMBIA. HJCV, R. Cordillera, Bogota, is the Todelar network station fading in and out with WQMO 0008-0030 s/off. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1205 ECUADOR. Unid. HC is heard in New Zealand, too. (NZ DX Times)
- 1230 PUERTO RICO. WNIK, Arecibo, probably the Spanish-speaker among regular U.S. ANs on this graveyard channel, on 4/18, but not loggable. I paid too much attention to the UNID's on 1170 and 1180, hi. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 1235 BERMUDA/COLOMBIA. ZBML, R. Bermuda, Hamilton, put in best signal ever heard 2300 5/9, S9+40. All season, I have been seeing a second carrier here on the scope, but audio has never come up; 2nd carrier loops Colombia, and is no doubt the same station Mike Silvera reports hearing. It's annoying to be able to see them, but not hear them, hi! (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1280 COLOMBIA. HJKN, R. Metropolitana, Bogota, is another of the AN'ers. Noted atop Reloj 5/3 at 0106. (Silvera)
- 1286 CZECHOSLOVAKIA/SO. AFRICA. SABC shows up on the scope some nights with Prague, around 2245, but so far, not enough signal for audio. Also was unusually good 4/20. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1295 SINT MAARTEN. PJD2, Philipsburg, nightly with English religious program at 2000. Fair to strong. (Calkin, N.B. Best signal heard 2210 5/9 with religious program. 30 over S9, rock steady. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1300 VENEZUELA. YV--, R. Crono Radar, Caracas, heard only s/on anncts 5/7 at 0504. (My lists say call is YVKE, but latter is R. Cultura on 1100 kc/s.) (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1330 DOM. REP. HJDB, R. Libertad, Santiago. Never believed anyone could get atop HJAO. But they made it 1752-1806 4/21. (Silvera, Jamaica) Note pre-crisis date. (Ed.)
- 1340 MEXICO. XENV, R. Alegria, Monterrey; N.L. Dug up ID on this graveyard. Not bad if still 250 watts. Noted 4/26 0902. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1355 COLOMBIA. A New Zealand DX'er heard a Radio Tricolor de Colombia on this channel. (NZ DX Times)
- 1358 NIGERIA/UNID. TA's, Ibadan put in best signal ever heard 5/10 AM 0000 to past 0100; U.S. pop music (e.g., Sam Cooke, "Chain Gang") and bilingual anncts by both male and female annctrs.; strong, but had strange fast fade; up high, then suddenly out, and slow recovery. Scope showed a very weak 2nd carrier at the time, far below readability, probably last traces of a fading European. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1360 COLOMBIA. HJMI, R. Savana, Sincelejo, is one here, ex-La Voz de Bolivar. Caracol network. S/off 0005. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1375A COLOMBIA. HJEA, La Voz de Cauca, Popoyan, heard in New Zealand on this channel. (NZ DX Times)
- 1400 DOM. REP. (?) Station ran til around 0200 with very strong signal, seems to be anti-government. HIAL listed here, but on 1415; seemed much too strong for 250 w. Noted 4/26 (Silvera, Jamaica) This is channel for clandestine R. Libertad, which, supposedly, broadcasts to uba??? (Ed.)

- 1045 PANAMA. HOJ2, Ondas del Canajagua, Las Tablas, Excellent airmail letter back in two weeks for 4/21 reception. Address: Apartado 10, Ave. Belisario Porras 2984. Nilda Dominguez says "su reportaje es perfecto." Running 1000 wattos. (Burnham, Conn.)
- 1079 SPAIN. EFE14, La Voz de Madrid. Picture card verie of radio mast. #25 in Spain. (Tyndall, Vt.)
- 1140 PUERTO RICO. WITA, San Juan. Verified f/up to 11/30 report with prepared card, signed by the Treasurer, whose signature was illegible. (Rugg, Que.)

Said mine was the first from U.S.A., and was surprised, and also pleased because they were transmitting from new 150 foot tower just put into service. (Burnham, Conn.) Good one, Clarence. (Ed.)
 - 1530 HAITI. 4VAZF, R. Quisqueya, Port-au-Prince. Long air verie in English by Felix Edgard Neptune. (Tyndall, Vt.)
 - 1562 HOLLAND (Intl. Waters). R. Veronica, sent v/q to verify my report of 3/1/65. (Rugg, Que.)
 - 1563 HOLLAND (Intl. Waters). R. Veronica, sent letter, post card, and 2 QSL's separately for report of last December. Beautiful cards. Took 3 and 3½ months respectively. (Calkin, N.B.)
 - 1585 UNID. (In the verie section, yet.) Russian. New R. Moscow QSL in for 1/25 reception of 1585 kc. (Frequency specified.) However, no location given, as usual, and no logging of it to be had anywhere. Anything, John? (Taylor, Calif.) No, Pete. But see below. (Ed.)
 - 1586 WEST GERMANY. Norddeutscher Rundfunk, Oldenburg. Nice specific card for reception from Hamburg on 4/15. They call this one Mittelwellensender Oldenburg, and running 40 kw. Typed following on card -- "Anlagen folgen por Drucksache." Translate please, John. (Burnham, Conn.) I'll leave specific translation to Rolf Bludorn, but, Clarence, I believe it's mailing instructions, hi! (Ed.)
- UNID. Russian. I sent a report to R. Moscow, asking if they could identify and verify the station here. Result: They wrote and said that the station was not in the Soviet Union and that there were no stations in their country on 1586.
