They installed a CBS Labs Volumax & he reports that reports were being sent in from everywhere. Letter from Terence King, CE at WILI arrived 5/12 for a February report. So, now along w/the old Halli-crafters S-20-R RX, HP7 Frequency Standard, & Heathkit QF-1 Q Multiplier I should be in pretty good shape for the coming season. Some very interesting happenings around here lately, mostly connected w/the E20 project. On the basis of the E20 predictions, I've been attempting to log some of the S & E Africans that should theoretically be heard only during our Summer. During the last few weeks I've repeatedly hears South Africans on 1286 & 764, Conakry-1403, & Dakar-1304. I'm hearing an unID West African on 1286, likely Taounde. Weak Central or East African on 764 probably is Blantyre, Nairobi-863 occasionally shows up right after s/on but signals are still miserable. Most intriguing mid-Summer African is the one signing on around 10:27pm on 728. Computer says both SABC & Uganda are possible at the time; while both stations' sked s/on 10:30pm, only one carrier shows on the scope. Calculated bearing for SABC (Capetown) is 116°, Uganda is 96°. Best DF bearing on the unID is 94° so naturally, suspect Uganda. Observed fadeout time of unID checks well w/expected time for Uganda also. Mozambique continues to be heard a couple of nights a week during July on 737; Barcelona is almost gone at 11:19pm when RCM throws carrier on; never would have logged Lourenco Marques without the knowledge that they should only be heard during our Summer. A fair number of Europeans still being heard in July but only those expected from E20 considerations (e.g. 737, 728, 809, 882, 731, etc.) RNE stations recently noted s/on early (before 10pm) so beware when trying for Africans, hi. Recently got poorly worded reply from Peking for Spring reception of 1000; QSL not positive enough for me so still no China logged here. Unique experience last week when I finally got to visit Hank Tyndall, "Mr. ECB DX." While enjoying the wonderful hospitality of the Tyndalls, I went through Hank's records & copied details of many of his unique foreign loggings. I've just finished checking this data against the predictions of E20 in an attempt to determine if E20 predictions are sunspot variant as presently formulated. With the exception of a couple of stations 'probably incorrect data on QSL) everything checked very well. I wish to express my thanks to HHT for allowing me access to this unique scientific data. Much interesting propagation data is to be found in the files of NRC members, data that is unique. More on this next time.

I have just become a member of the NRC & I would like to submit a reports to Musings. A little introduction of myself. I've been DXing for about two years, but most of this time has been spent on SW & amateur bands. In fact, I did not listen to the BCB seriously until 1/64. Since that time, my interest & time spent on BCB has increased until I now spend almost 90% of my time tuning 540-1600 kc/s. I don't have any idea of how many stations I have heard since only those to which I have sent QSL requests are noted in my logbook. 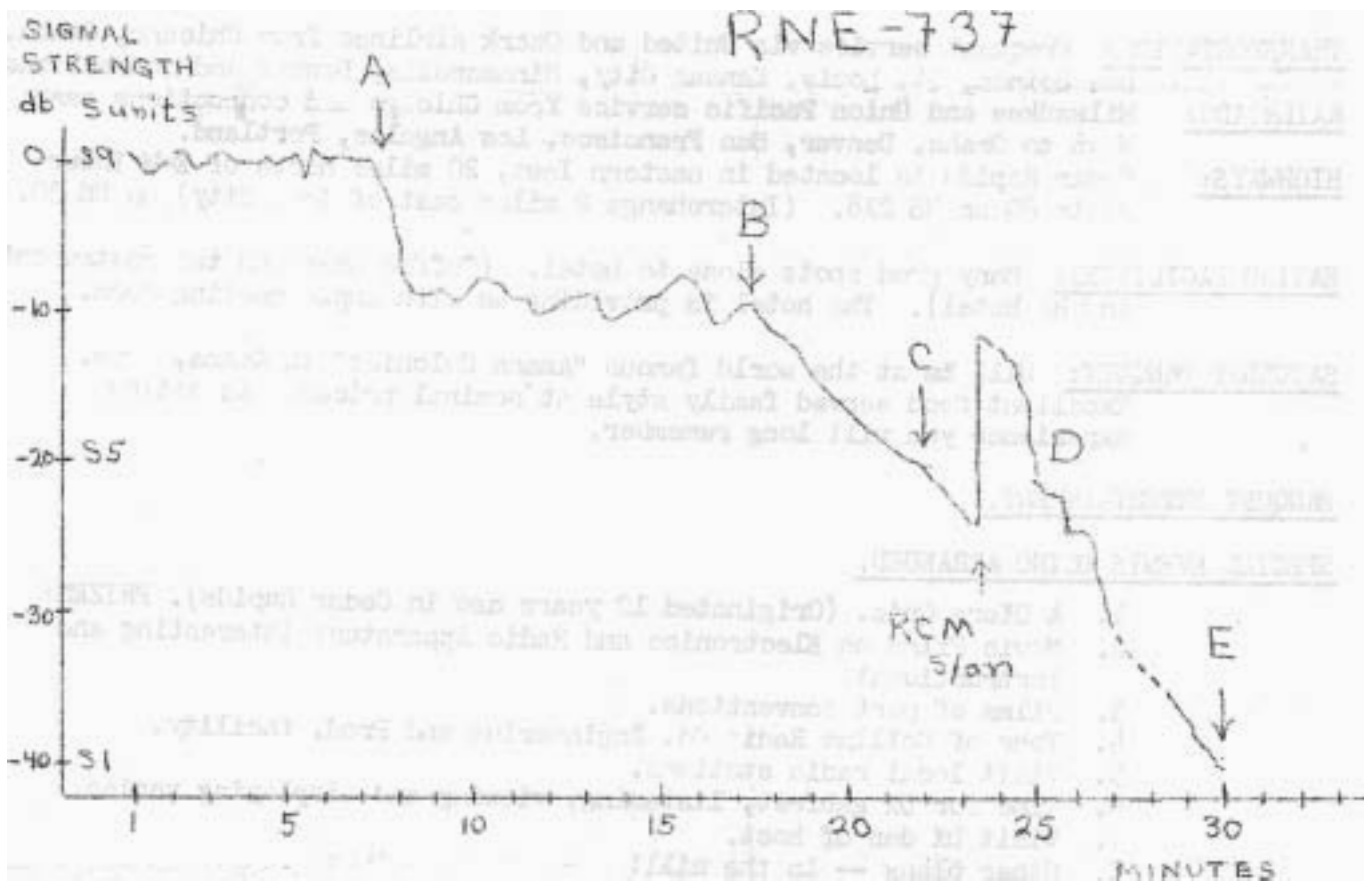

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Colombian Call & Frequency Allocations

By Ronald F. Schatz

The large number of frequency changes on the part of Colombian stations which have occurred during the past year is more than coincidence; the stations involved were complying with the Colombian government's new system of frequency allocations, arranged as follows:

1. The frequencies between and including 540 and 1010 kc/s are "international channels." Only one station can operate on each, and stations are spaced 40 kc/s apart in the same locale. This leaves 4 "international" sets of frequencies for 4 sections of the country:

- 540, 570, 610, 650 - every 40 kc to 1010 for Bogota.
- 550, 599, 630 - every 40 kc to 990 for Medellin, Manizales, Ibague, Bello & Pereira.
- 560, 600, 640 - every 40 kc to 1000 for northern Colombia.
- 580, 620, 660 - every 40 kc. to 980 for Cali, Pasto, & Buga.

Note irregular 540 kc/s for Bogota rather than for Cali. 660 kc/s is unoccupied at present, the only one. Announced HJMK-960 in Manizales doesn't fit, look for a change here.

2. The frequencies between and including 1020 and 1600 kc/s are "regional channels." Several stations can operate on each with a power limit of 10 kw. Stations are spaced 30 kc/s apart in the same locale. In general each departamento, intendencia, or comisaria (Colombia's political divisions in order of autonomy) is assigned one of the three possible sets of frequencies, but the pattern has irregularities in sparsely-populated areas. A few of the assignments follow:

- 1020 every 30 kc to 1590 for Medellin, Cali, Neiva, Ibague, suburban Bogota, etc., & surrounding areas.
- 1030 every 30 kc to 1600 for Pereira, Armenia, Manizales, Bucaramanga, Cucuta, Sincelejo, Barrancabermeja, etc., and surrounding areas.
- 1040 every 30 kc to 1580 for Bogota, Barranquilla, Pasto, Cartagena, Ocaña, Cucuta, Popayan, Pamplona, Monteria, Mangangué, etc., and surrounding areas.

The call situation, once a regular pattern, is now a mess. The old system of assignments, indicated below, is no longer followed, and in a few cases, two stations have identical calls; e.g., HJCT-1090 in Barranquilla, and HJCT-6180 in Bogota; also two HJCP's, two HJLT's, and two HJZH's.

In the defunct system, the 3rd letter of the call indicates the department:

HJA- Barranquilla, Cartagena	HJB- Santa Marta, Cucuta etc.	HJC- for Bogota
HJD- Medellin	HJE- Cali, etc.	HJF- Manizales, etc.
HJG- Bucaramanga, etc.	HJK- Bogota	HJH- Pasto, etc.
