MORE ABOUT THE PATTERN BOOK...

A last minute count by Wes Boyd indicates that the Night Pattern Book contains between 1425 and 1450 directional station patterns; of all the nighttime directional stations, only a half-dozen have proved so elusive as to evade our intrepid workers - they'll be appearing as PATTERN BOOK UPDATERS here in DX NEWS of course... Several very sharp-eyed members noted that KCLS had been omitted from the 600 kHz map last issue; rest assured that was a sample page and the final copy now being printed contains the Arizona station - plus the Puerto Rican on 600 also not shown...

Several members have asked why we've decided to split the Pattern Book into Night and Day versions instead of combining all patterns into a single volume. After considerable analysis of the project logistics, Wes Boyd and GPN decided (with the concurrence of the Publishing Committee) upon the two-book strategy for several reasons... Most important is the fact that the majority of DX'ers are concerned primarily with the effects of directional patterns at night; daylight domestic DX'ing is still rather much virgin territory (we hope that Dave Fischer's soon-to-appear Daytime section will spark interest in this neglected area of the hobby!) and it was felt that the majority of members would prefer the option of purchasing the daytime pattern book separately rather than pay for day patterns in a single volume. The Pattern Book Group has also experienced unexpected problems in obtaining patterns for Canadian daytimers - the Canadian DOT may have a master file of daytime patterns but all attempts to gain access have been frustrated to date... We know that the NARBA central repository is in Washington so GPN is going down to DC to pry out the remaining daytime Canadian patterns as soon as the Night Book is safely in bed at the printers... Hopefully the Canadian daytime mess will be resolved by the fall and you can (hopefully) expect the Day Pattern Book within a few months.

BOTH MIND AND BODY BOGGLE...

In addition to the typing of station keys and final pasteup for the Pattern Book, the HQ crew is currently bogged down with the unpleasant but necessary task of converting our elaborate mailing system from the PDP-8 to PDP-10 computer; Secretary Chuck Rossier is handling the computer reprogramming and the rest of the HQ types are doing the necessary data entry and crosschecking tasks... Effects of the computer switch are: (a) A number of unavoidable typographical errors in mailing labels issue-after-next; if it doesn't arrive within a reasonable time, drop us a card - (it's pretty much impossible to input 600 plus addresses without a few typographical errors). (b) Renewal notices will arrive a few issues earlier than before as the previously announced proration of dues goes into effect to compensate for last year's postage increase. (c) The HQ Crew will have a minimum of extra time to answer the many requests for specific technical advice, etc., which're received each week until conversion is complete!

Hi there. After a brief "vacation" from DXing for a couple of weeks, I bagged four new ones, plus some nice "old" ones on 5/20-22 weekend. I tuned around the night of 5/20 & found WNL WLS WCCO etc. inaudible & WBAP barely making it, but decided to leave the RX on 1560 & let the recorder DX while I slept. 'Twas worth it. WDXR s/on @ 6 w/SSB into "Navy Hoedown", KWOO s/on @ 6:58 w/SSB really strong o/unID SSB, c/w mx faded atop @ 6:10, turned out to be KCAD Abiline for a welcome 500w Texan. MM 5/22 produced good results through the static. HOLBI-890 string enough through WLS WID @ 2:55 "Ra--(static)--terdad, la Voz de la Revolucion", CJAT-610 fair w/rr * KFRC nulled @ 3:10. First time heard in a long time, LPRIS-740 s/off 4am w/O Canada & GSQ. Then I whipped up to 1370, left the recorder & RX on & went to bed. Mostly just WSPD in/out through the static, except just after 5, when weak mumbling noted u/them, which faded atop just as the announcer said, "here on WFEA," at 5:05, & then dropped back down into the noise. New Hampshire became State #43. Only recent veries come from KIVM-1350, & R. Nacional de Colombia on 756 for a report of last October - didn't specify calls or location though. The transmitter and studios of RXKR are located aboard the SS City of Panama, which sails nightly out of Santa Monica Bay, California.

RXKR is the first commercial radio station aboard a steamship and we believe we have completed quite an engineering feat. We operate on a power of 500 watts and on a carrier frequency of 815 kilocycles, by authority of the Republic of Panama.

Our broadcast hours are from 8:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. daily, and on Sundays from 2:00 P.M. until 6:00 P.M., Pacific Standard Time.

This particular list was taken off the air 9 June 1972 starting 0408 GMT. This time the copy was fairly clear; we lack only one seemingly unimportant geographical word - the name of a valley in Boyacá. The data, however, is not necessarily 100% accurate; there were definite omissions and bits of erroneous information in previous announced lists:

For those still wondering about the origin of the station name: "Radio Quince (15)", it does not refer to frequency nor power. A 15-year-old in Latin America, called a "quinceanera", traditionally becomes the subject of a social event similar in many ways to a Jewish "Bar-mitzvah", only larger. So 15 is somewhat of a special number for Latin youth, thus the name "Radio 15", the age the station appeals to.

Fantasia-1550 which plays old U.S.A. MoR, stuff like "Strangers in the Night," etc., 1:55-2:59, no sign of WOKJ, even @ 1:55.
