The Deejaays of Donetsk

The pilot of a fogbound jet circling over Moscow's Vnukovo Airport for an instrument landing was startled recently when he began receiving radio signals from "Prince" and "Angel." Clearly these communications did not come from the control tower. Equally bemused were listeners to an official radio broadcast on Ukrainian industrial production, which was interrupted by this message: "Ya Dunai! Ya Dunai! Malchiki i devochki, slushajte menya! Nachinayu peredachu dlya molodezhi Marinskogo Raiona [Danube calling! Danube calling! Listen, all you cats and chicks out there! This is a program for young people in the Marinka District!]

Illegal broadcasting by homemade transmitters has become a persistent and growing youth cult in the Soviet Union. After *samizdat* (clandestine publishing of dissident writings) and *magnitizdat* (circulating tapes of unorthodox poetry and music), there is now *radioizdat*—air-it-yourself programs of pop music, teen-age talk, messages to girl friends and even dirty jokes. All of which represents a somewhat refreshing contrast to official state-controlled broadcasting, which is apt to be long on lectures about beet growing and the life of Lenin, but short on entertainment.

Green Ghost. In the Ukrainian city of Donetsk (pop. 900,000), youthful would-be deejaays adopted such sprightly call signs as "Buzz Saw," "Green Ghost," "Graveyard Goon," "Bullet Hole," "Spark of Love" and "The Invisible Man." The police were not amused. In an effort to make a clean sweep of the cluttered airways, 1,000 amateur Donetsk broadcasters—called "organ grinders" by the police—were arrested and fined 50 rubles (\$69) for "violating rules governing the use of radio frequencies." There have been similar efforts to clamp down on underground broadcasts in other major cities.

Soviet officials claim that their displeasure with the "radio hooligans," who usually steal hard-to-get parts for their transmitters from state factories, is more practical than ideological. The music and chatter of the pirate stations are sprayed so widely across the medium-range radio frequencies that they have become a communications hazard. In Donetsk, many of the illegal transmitters were on the frequency of the railway switching station of this important industrial center. On the inland Sea of Azov, riverboat skippers complain that they cannot hear routing orders because of interference by Elvis Presley tapes. Judged even more hazardous, however, were the broadcasts of an operator in Vilna, Lithuania, who has been sentenced to three years in prison for "anti-Soviet agitation." His crime: retransmitting Western newscasts taped from a short-wave receiver.

- 555 -ST KITTS ZIZ Bassesterre on late past 0500 w/remote broadcast of annual Carnival, female and male commentary of contests, fashion shows, etc., very familiar to ZDK Carnival AN stuff this summer. Xlnt sig 0215-0500+ on 12/27 but usual shallow modulation, some portions w/mx from the studio were quite a bit louder. One fashion commentator was from WSTA-1340 and he gave mention of this several dozen times. Usual s/off seems to still be 0300. (Starr) Your unit on 1330 is probably HLI29, w/programs beamed to Girard, Hubbard and Middleburg Heights. (ED)
- 570 -DOMINICAN REPUBLIC HIM5, Santo Domingo, "Radio Cristal" a pleasant surprise to hear on 12/16 0807-25 w/program of dance mx for Brugal hum. (Krejny) Had any Cha Cha Charnya lately? (ED)
- 575 -COSTA RICA TIWA, San Jose, Radio Musical, tentative 0505-0535 f/out w/mx and very little talking, weak in noise level-but who else can it be? (Sundstrom)
- 590 -CUBA CMM, Havana 12/29 0020-0030 over WCV, low freq het. SS man sounded like news. Radio Rebelde mentioned. (Tull)
- 595 -DOMINICA Radio Dominica, Roseau, good level but poor audio, SS up tempo mx. 12/29 0031-0040. (Tull)
- 600 -CUBA CMKV, Holguin, radio drama, man and woman in SS. Level poor, just over domestics. 12/29 0041-0050. (Tull) / (Tull)
- 625 -COSTA RICA (?) TIKE, low level. Mor SS mx. Just too weak. 12/29 0055-0100.
- 630 -CUBA CMHQ, Santa Clara. Low level. Men in SS, Cuba mentioned w/ID. Much domestic QRM. 12/29 0105-0110. (Tull)
- 640 -CUBA CMQ, Havana. Good level. SS Mor mx, woman DJ. Good ID w/chimes. 12/29 0111-0115. (Tull)
- 645 -PARAGUAY ZP19, Coronel Oviedo, "Radio Caaguazu" was finally logged 12/16 from 0826-0905 by which time it had disappeared completely. Severe QRM from WSM-TT. Managed a definite ID and a mention of Coronel Oviedo. (Krejny) * Presumed 12/30 SS talk, new year greetings; would have been armchair copy 12/30 0857 w/out local noise level; only time I should have bypassed this because of what I almost missed on 650. (Hauser)

- VENEZUELA YVNA, Coro, "Ondas de los Medanos" was in like a rock 12/16 0906-0925 w/holiday program. First time ever able to get a log on this one. (Krejny)
- 665 -USSR Komsomolsk-Amur listed. Classical mx program 12/27 1524. RR amts, IS at 1530. Mayak mentioned. Fading by 1533. (Williams)
- 690 -CUBA CMBG, Havana, good level, SS musical drama, 12/29 0125-0130. Good Radio Progreso ID. (Tull)
- 700 -ALASKA KEYR, Anchorage, 12/27 1541 TC 19 before 6, old pop selections, severe interference from KIRO, ABC mx 1600 t/out. (Williams)
- 705 -HONDURAS "Olanco" resumed, 12/30 1005 w/GST TC for 4:3. (Hauser)
- 710 -MEXICO XEMP, Mexico City, "Radiorama" noted QRMing XEPS on 11/11 from 0625-0629. International mx; noted "Zarzuela" and "Love For Sale". Only fair at best. (Krejny) You ever figure out what all those switches by your front door were for? (ED)
- MEXICO XEPS, Empalme, "Radio Amistad" noted w/a highly variable sig 11/11 0612-0645. Often very good, however. Music. QRM from XEMP. Like this frequency when WOR's off! (Krejny) 132 (ED)
- VENEZUELA YVKY, Caracas, "Radio Capital" caught w/ad string on top of frequency 12/29 1037-1055. WOR a poor second w/CJRN also noted. (Krejny)
- 725 -COSTA RICA TILX, San Jose, Radio Columbia "Feliz Navidad" jingle "en R. Columbia - la musica de diciembre"; TC for 12 y 10, at 0608 12/25; still on at 0759 check. (Hauser)
- 730 -MEXICO XEX, Mexico City, good level. Pop SS mx 12/29 0140-0150. (Tull)
- 752.6 -UNID 12/28 1150-1200 w/one Mexican ranchera selection, some local ads. Faded at same time as the TI'S did, before the YN's were gone. (Gleason)
- 764 -SENEGAL Dakar no doubt producing the het on 765 12/25 at 0801. (Hauser)
- 765 -EL SALVADOR YSKL Net, SS noted in passing 12/25 0801, presumed this; Dakar in for het from 764. (Hauser)
- 770 -COLOMBIA HJKH, Bogota, Radio Tequendama, 12/30 0933 "Desde Radiocentro Todelar en Bogota, les habla Radio Tequendama". (Hauser)
- 775 -COSTA RICA TIW, San Jose. Slow SS mx, good level but some long fades. Costa Rica mentioned 12/29 0201-0210. (Tull)
- 780 -BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS ZBVI, Roadtown, Tortola suspected in WBEM. EE w/British accent. Poor level. 12/29 0210-0220. Some EE mx. (Tull)
- 810 -COLOMBIA HJCY, Bogota, Radio Sutatenza 12/23 0905 w/SS mx then machine gun talk by man. No WGY. Ided by RKS (No foolin, hi). (Mount)
- 820.2 -UNID Het holding own against WRAP briefly, 12/30 1152 w/US mx, 1155 SS man and woman; past 1200. Suspect Cuba. (Hauser)
- 830 -DOMINICAN REPUBLIC Radio HIJB, Santo Domingo, has been practically in the clear here evenings and early mornings, excellent, S9 non-fading signal. (Cooper) Reports from RJE and PT a couple of weeks ago, and now one from ERC! Whats this world coming to? (ED)
- VENEZUELA YVLT, Los Teques, "Radio Sensacion", 12/29 0600-0610 w/hit mx (all types) and headlines from "Meridiano" newspaper, TCs in AST. (Gleason) * 12/25 talk and mx 0626-30, slight whistle 0630, SS talk 0633 then "Radio Sensacion" sung and more mx. Loud sig and alone, WCCO back at 0658. (Mount)
- 834 -BELIZE Radio Belize. Good level. Mor EE mx. Program Saturday Dance Date. S/off at 0502. 12/29 0456-0502. (Tull)
- 840 -HAITI 4VEF, Cap Haitien. Reaches S9 before complete darkness here, the last week of December, in constant severe Aurora. (Cooper)
- ST LUCIA (?) Definitely FF w/HAUS and others 12/25 at 1001. (Hauser)
- USSR Unid Far East. 12/24 1400-1500 tuneout. Semi-cl mx program. Typical Mayak. IS 1400. At first under JJ then surfaced to stay mostly on top. RR amts 1410. // to 6130,6115,6035. IS 1429. RR 1430. 6 pips 1500, IS. 1st log on this for me. I've not noticed it listed. (Williams) Inquiry about this one from Phil Pinkle in his report last week. He received a letter from Radio Moscow stating that this was not a Russian stn. Its not listed anywhere that I can find, including new FBIS received this week. Many changes are taking place in Soviet radio, and all of the info probably hadn't reached Radio Moscow yet. I have no info about location of this one. (ED)

- 881 -WALES BBC Washford hassled by WCBS but copyable 12/14 0725-0805 w/sporting event, possibly cricket or rugby. Mentions of New Zealand and Indian teams and a top player by the name of "Richard" heard. No ID on the hour. (Burns)
- 900 -COLOMBIA HJEY, Cali, La Voz de Cali seems NSP; reported on reception of 12/23 easily o/CHML. (Cooper) * NBC tones on vibraphone 12/30 0929, "Somos Todelar. Somos profesionales. Somos, la Voz de Cali", more tones. (Hauser)
- 905 -EL SALVADOR YSQJ, San Salvador, Radioplis, combining w/Radio Centroamerica and another stn to wish "Feliz Navidad" 12/25 0602. (Hauser) * Unic. Low level SS MoR mx, 12/30 0050-0120. (Tull) Likely YSQJ (ED)
- 925 -UNID Low level man in SS, level into noise on 1/2 hour 12:30. 0125-0135. (Tull)
- 940 -PUERTO RICO WIPR, San Juan - boy this one owns this channel on its s/on time! Rock solid 12/23 from 0950-1006. Has mx program "Radioperiodico El Espectador" after 1000. Also noted in well at about this same time on 12/30. (Krejny)
- 940 -VENEZUELA YVNN, Punto Fijo, Radio Punto Fijo, 12/30 1010, local ads such as Almacenes Combate; well o/everything. (Hauser) * Ran AN 12/23; strong; reported, w/background QRM from a HJ on Caracol net. (Cooper)
- 944 -HONDURAS HRYW, Tegucigalpa, Radio Panamericana presumed 12/25 0806 dance mx segues. (Hauser)
- 960 -COLOMBIA HJHN, Magangue, "Radio Sutatenza" noted w/a good sig 12/30 from 0931-40. Able to loop most of domestic QRM but there were quite a few people present! Program of music - mentioned many letters received from all over Central and South America. (Krejny)
- 970 -MEXICO XEJ, Ciudad Juarez, "Radio Mexicana" surprised me by dominating WWSW and CKCH at least briefly 11/25 0642-0655 w/rancheras. Heard many times in the past but never this good. (Krejny)

PUBLISHERS' CORNER.....

LOGGINGS

Lately, a lot of additional controversy has erupted over what should be counted as a logging related to distance from the home QTH. (Again.) Our comments in the last issue reflect the feelings of NJPC and most of our editors. We repeat that DX'ing is an individual hobby, and that a DX'er can count things as he wishes, but that certain boundaries are pretty much common among DX'ers. We reiterate that the practise of deliberately moving one's rx site back and forth within a given radius of one's QTH for the specific purpose of changing cx sufficiently to log other stations falls outside of those general boundaries. Again, while we cannot tell someone that they cannot do this, we feel that it is our duty to pass on the comments and criticisms we have received from some of the membership about continued emphasis on this practise in DXN. In one specific case, Wes declined to print, and with our approval, items which were obviously outside of even the reporter's self-avowed "25-mile limit" and which were primarily tentatives anyway. This practise will continue.

The argument has, however, brought some other significant points to light. The argument can be, and has been made that a different antenna and/or receiver can effect as great or a greater change in cx as movement within a 25-mile radius can, especially in the case of a beverage antenna. This point is indeed valid, but upgrading of equipment has long been accepted as a valid change by the DX'ing fraternity, while such acceptance has not been accorded the other situation. Several of the members in attendance at the Thanksgiving Get-Together here in NJ felt that they would be inclined to denote all beverage loggings they might make should they ever get such a thing with an asterisk (sort of like Roger Naris' 61 home runs in a longer season than Babe Ruth's 60, hi) because of the special circumstances involved. Of course none of us here could put up a beverage without moving, so the point is moot, but should we move, beverage loggings would be asterisked while loop loggings or "shortwire" loggings would not.

The special case of the beverage aside, however, two cases locally come to point immediately regarding loggings made on a loop as opposed to loggings made on a shortwire but not possible on the loop. You've read about Bob Foxworth's experiences of this type in Musings during the past year and more. Recently, PT has erected a dog-leg 80' shortwire, 8' up which defies logic. The directivity of this wire and its uncanny nulls are most different cx from loop receptions. A longwire used by him several years ago at a previous QTH did similar things, but there was then no loop to compare with. Hopefully, a subsequent get-together at PT's QTH will answer some of the whys of his new antenna, but will not resolve what to do about it.

We must admit that there is a traditional inconsistency here regarding moving the rx about which does not apply to changing rxes or antennas. This leaves us at a question about the competitive aspects of DX. We can accept changes of rx location or not as individuals, but if we are into competition, we must be careful to compare apples with apples as it were. Thus, if you do indulge in the moveable rx ploy, we ask that you carefully state this fact when reporting your DX, especially to SR columns. Many traditions are inconsistent the world over, not just in the DX hobby. Who knows, maybe someday someone will point this way and say as the now-outdated Sunoco commercial did, "He destroyed an accepted belief"? For now, however, the belief is still accepted by a majority of members who have been heard on the subject. We invite further discussion in Musings. As usual, we invite any member to take an opposing view for a counter-editorial so long as it meets the normal standards for articles in DX NEWS.

I'd like to second Gene Martin's comment in an IRCA DX Forum that the foreign-language abbreviations now in vogue with most DXers do not make any sense. While I have been using them myself, I can't help but think when I see "FR", what's that, French-speaking? The reduplicated letter serves no purpose at all except to indicate that the abbreviation is of a language, which is usually obvious already from context. It so happens that a more sensible alternative system has already been proposed, but so far adopted only in the NNRC SW section. Compiled by an unID contributor of Hank Bennett's, its system basically is to choose the second letter as the beginning of the second syllable in the language name (English version), with some exceptions to avoid conflicts and promote clarity. For example: EG -- English; FR -- French; SP -- Spanish; GM -- German; KR -- Korean; JP -- Japanese; HD -- Hindi; VT -- Vietnamese; WN -- vernacular, etc. It could stand a few modifications and additions, but I believe it is a better system than we are using now. Of course, it's more useful for SW, where many more languages are routinely heard than the "big dozen" or so involved in the great majority of international MW DXing. If you'd like a copy of the language abbreviation key, send an SASE to Hank Bennett, Box 333, Cherry Hill., N.J. 08002. Once one grows accustomed to it, SS can easily be turned over to 'signal strength', as Gene suggests. The present system is firmly entrenched, but perhaps as more people become familiar with it, the NNRC system will gradually gain acceptance. As they say aboard the Norwegian vessel "Venator", [ASI - "Language Abbreviations Should Improve." I hope you're enjoying the new site, ERC, & the unlimited time to DX! Happy New Year. 73.

I note for the first time, the Canadian government has granted a permit for a new fulltimer on a U.S. 1A clear, the new 670 in Newfoundland w/10kw U4. (CEN-640 is covered in NARBA, & is Class 1B). But the new 670 is not covered in NARBA. Of course the U.S. has made liberal use of Canadian 1-A clears as evidenced by WDAK, KNOB, WAPE, KGGF, KCBS, KRMG, KTRH, KOAM, KTRB, WNOX, WIEG, WINS, KLRA, KDAY & others, & Mexican 1-A clears such as WHN & WGAR. All of those are covered in NARBA & radio treaties, however. As far as I know 670 Nfld. is not covered by any treaty. Recent DXing on MM 12/15- 660, I heard a station testing @ 3:50 w/an instrumental of Hey Jude, an announcement for EBS test, & then TT until WNBC's OC came on @ 4:30. They never gave an ID. I called WESC & it was not they. Tuning in 1170 Christmas AM failed to bring anything but an 1A - no trace of KVOO as in previous Christmases. I have heard WLDB-1490 while in Stratford. They are black-album nr now, w/National Black Net NX, replacing NBC. Hy Lit, a prominent Philadelphia DJ, is the new manager. Two more Conn. stations have gone AN, WILLI-1400 w/SP MMs, & WINF-1230. WNEW-1130 has taken on the N.Y. Mets. WPIC-1080, WARE-1250 & WSPR-1270 have the Whalers hockey. WELI-960 has the Nighthawks hockey. As indicated in a recent Broadcasting article the FCC says it will now consider granting power inc reases for AM stations. They say part of the reason for the total freeze on AM power increases & new stations was to give FM a chance to grow. But it says FM is now able to compete w/AM, & many AMs are having trouble covering entire markets. FCC says it will not grant without hearings power increases for AN which would give them a 5 mv/m signal over another city twice the population of city of license. WHJB-620'll have to undergo hearings. Ditto WVAR-1110. (30).
