New stations, changes, skeds, etc

AUSTRALIA 4AK Toowoomba is now on 1220 khz (ex-1240). * 4BH Brisbane on 1390 khz is to move to 880 khz within the coming year. * 4WK Warwick is now (or shortly will be) on 960 khz (ex-880). * New 2CC, Canberra, 2 kw, due on in Oct. 75 will be on 1210 khz, not 1390 as previously reported. * Two new "Ethnic Australia" stations went on the air in June. They are 2EA Sydney on 800 khz and 3EA Melbourne on 1120 khz. These two stations will initially be on the air 6 hours a day with programs in Italian, Greek, Turkish, Maltese, Arabic, Spanish and Yugoslav. * A possible move in Australia is the abandoning of call signs. According to a Government Minister, this could be done in favor of a channel numbering system. (NZDXRA)

INTERNATIONAL WATERS Radio Caroline in EE sked 1800-0500, noted in April and early May while on holiday. Format 90% rock album music. "Caroline 259" ID noted around the hour. Mi-Amigo in DD 0500-1800, all on 1187 khz. (Vernon)

IRAQ The new super-power station on 1038 khz is being well heard in South Africa to s/off at 2335 in Arabic. (WRB)

JORDAN Tests were due to begin in April over 2 new 1200 kw MW transmitters. Frequencies have not been finalized yet, but 590 and 1495 khz have been suggested. (WRB)

PARAGUAY Following the decree of 9/27/72, local time is advanced one hour from 10/31 to 2/31. (Jaar)

SPANISH SAHARA R. Sahara on 656 and 998 khz is now signing on at 0700 (ex-0800), as heard on SW. The language schedule has been changing a lot, as monitored here during the February-June period. (Jaar)

SUDAN Radio Omdurman reports that a new station at Nyala will soon be on the air. A 1500 kw transmitter at Sennar will soon begin tests. (WRB) Frequencies not given and I assume that these are MW. (ED)

UPPER VOLTA The Regional Station at Bobo-Dioulasso on 1586 khz is to increase power to 50 kw. (WRB)

The following is a press release passed on by Charlie Wootten. "Israeli Abie Nathan has given up his self-styled "Peace Mission", trying to sail his radio ship through the Suez Canal. Today, he and an international crew of 14 turned around and (Cont)

steamed north into the Mediterranean. Nathan had broadcast an appeal to Egyptian President Sadat asking premission to sail through the waterway. But he told radio listeners that he received no reply. Nathan says his ship's radio receiver will remain tuned to Port Said, and the ship will return as fast as possible if he gets word that he can transit the canal. Nathan, a former Israeli Air Force pilot and restaurateur, has tried vainly to get permission to pass through the canal, as a gesture of peace, since Cairo re-opened the waterway June 5".

FCC favors six-month DST

Financial and audience losses of daytimers during extended fast-time periods explained to Department of Transportation

If the FCC had its way, the country would go back on a six-month on, six-month off, system of daylight saving time. Such a system would be in the interest of the AM broadcast industry and the public.

The commission expressed those views in a letter to a Department of Transportation official, who had requested them in connection with DOT's ongoing Daylight Saving Time Impact Study. The official, Robert H. Binder, assistant secretary for policy plans and international affairs, was interested in DST's effect on daytime AM stations.

The commission said that, on the basis of industry reports and a staff analysis of four metropolitan markets, revenue losses were suffered by the 2,300 daytimers, although the losses were not spread evenly among the affected stations. The 500 on U.S. and foreign clear-channel outlets, where nighttime skywave interference and treaty protection considerations limited the extent of relief, in terms of sign-on times and powers the FCC was able to grant, suffered the most.

The commission estimated the general magnitude of audience loss to daytime stations under year-round DST conditions as follows: October, 1%; November, 2%; December, 3%; January, 4%; February, 3%; March, 2%, and April, 1%. For 1975, the average audience loss during the eight additional weeks of DST (Feb. 23 through April 27) was estimated to be 1.5%, or 0.23% on an annual basis. In the winter of 1974, when DST was in effect for 16 weeks instead of eight, the average audience loss was estimated to be 2.5%, or 0.76% annually.

The commission translated the au-

ience loss into audience figures for the 1,900 stations in U.S. and foreign clear in 1974, and found that they lost some \$750,000, or \$1,500 per station, and in 1975, \$271,000, or \$454 per station. The 1,900 stations on regional channels

suffered less, since the commission had been able to allow them to begin operating one hour earlier with enough power—generally 500 watts—to escape substantial advertising cancellations and defections of timebuyers to fulltime stations.

The commission acknowledged that the losses estimated, when measured against total AM revenues of \$1,500,000, are "statistically insignificant." But more important than station losses, the commission said, was the "known curtailment of early morning AM service to the public which occurs when stations engineered separately for daytime and fulltime operations are compelled to operate on the same frequencies under essentially nighttime conditions."

Under those conditions, the commission is faced with a dilemma: early-morning listeners will have departed for work or school before sign-on times if stations are not allowed to begin operating before sunrise; or, if all stations are "back up" one hour at full power (a remedy not available to stations on foreign clears because of treaty commitments), they would cause severe interference to clear channel and other fulltime stations, thus depriving vast areas of the country service normally available.

The commission told Mr. Binder it recognized he is involved in a "complex study in which the urgent need for fuel conservation must be weighed against arguments favoring the abandonment of wintertime DST." But, it added, "from our standpoint," and in view of the impact on AM stations and their audience, it would be best to retain the "traditional" six and six-formula provided under the 1966 Uniform Time Act.

NBC puts NIS in starting gate

Though short of expected number of affiliates for start, Thayer sees nothing but brights things ahead

NBC Radio will have 33 subscribing stations picking up its News and Information Service (NIS) when the venture starts Wednesday morning (June 18) at 6:06:30 a.m. NYT. NBC Radio President Jack Thayer expects that number to grow to 40 by July 1, and to 80 by Sept. 15. Eight of the original list, including three in the top-10 markets, are FM stations.

NIS, described by one NBC source as "a \$10-million risk," thus goes on the air substantially short of the 75 of the top 100 markets Mr. Thayer had said the service would need to be effective (BROADCASTING, Feb. 10). Mr. Thayer's enthusiasm for the project's chances, as well as NBC's commitment to it, remain undimmed: "We're going to make money on it in '76," Mr. Thayer predicted.

The NIS staff began 24-hour dry runs for the service last Tuesday (June 10), and will continue them up until Wednesday morning. The dry runs are being fed down closed-circuit lines to enable participating stations to practice with their own personnel prior to air time. NIS also fed a series of seminars on sales, marketing and operations for the service to its subscribers last Wednesday and Thursday. Included in the seminars were recorded messages from National Association of Broadcasters President Vincent Wasilewski and Radio Advertising Bureau President Miles David.

Mr. Thayer attributed the delay in adding stations in part to the service's mid-week, mid-month starting time, with some stations also unable to join immediately because of prior sponsor commitments. "We're interested in making their transition as smooth as possible," Mr. Thayer said. NIS's selectivity in its acquisition of subscribers also is a factor in the slow growth of its station list, he said.

Noting that "we've faced more problems than you can imagine" in setting up the service, Mr. Thayer said NIS would work out its on-air bugs gradually, as procedures become more familiar.

Mr. Thayer claimed that relations have remained relatively good between NBC Radio affiliates and new competitors buying NIS, with the notable exception occurring in the Palm Beach, Fla., area. WPBR(AM), the NBC Radio affiliate there, took umbrage at an advertising campaign undertaken by WPOM(AM) Riviera Beach, Fla., in which that station claimed to be the "NBC News Radio" station in the area. Mr. Thayer pointed out that NBC does not use that title, and thus does not

own it, but has asked WPOM to discontinue the advertising.

Thank you very much for your letter of April 12; but please excuse the delay in replying!

I can very well understand your bewilderment in not knowing the origin of what you heard on your radio on the night of April 7! It took me some time before I could come up with the answer myself!

Let me say, first off, that the station you heard is not a repeater station but a private one, affiliated to the CBC french network. You actually heard CJEM, Edmundston, N.B., located in the north-western part of the province, broadcasting on 570 khz, with a power of 5,000 watts daytime, and 1,000 watts at night.

Now for the explanation:

It seems that after 9:00 o'clock every night, all local programming at CJEM being all over, they lock up the building, (meaning they don't have to pay a technician until 1:00 a.m.), hook on to CBAF, Moncton, and let all programming from CBAF go through their transmitter ... including programs, promos, ID's, even including the closing of the station (which actually is ours). The CJEM transmitter automatically shuts down for the night shortly after closing and normal programming from CJEM resumes in the morning.

As for the rest of your information, I must say it is quite complete and up-to-date. However, two new LPRT's (low-power relay transmitters) have been added to the list you already have. For lack of medium-wave locations on the dial, these are re-broadcasting all the AM programs from CBAF on the FM band. They are: CBHM-FM, Richibucto, located on the eastern seashore of the province, and another FM LPRT, soon to be on the air, to service the french populations of Saint John and Fredericton. We do not yet know the call letters of this new repeater station, but we do know, however, that it will operate on 102.3 MHz.

Thank you again for your letter. I simply hope that the information included herein will clarify your mystery station.

FCC pushes back bounds of AM: more stations, power, time

Way is cleared for additional outlets; rules for nighttime and for power ups are loosened

The FCC, after two fairly successful tries at turning the screw on AM applications, decided last week to ease off. And the result could be significant for the oldest broadcasting service, in terms of opening the door to still more, and expanded, AM service, including nighttime service by stations now restricted to daytime. An application for a daytime or unlimited time station will be accepted if it is to provide a community with its first or second service. And rules on power increases have been liberalized.

A new 2.5 kw power classification has been added as an intermediate step between 1 kw and 5 kw in the commission's classification system. The suburban rule, which has been a burden for some applicants seeking to provide service in suburban communities, will no longer be invoked in cases of noncontested applications. And, for the future, applications for changes in frequency, like those for power increases, need meet only daytime and nighttime interference standards.

Commission officials say they cannot estimate the effect the new rules will have on the flow of AM applications; for one thing applicants will still be required to meet technical standards. But the commission is thinking ahead to a possible heavy influx of AM applications; if a large backlog develops, it said, it might seek to control the flow by declaring "open" and "closed" seasons on the filing of such applications.

The FCC liberalized its AM rules after being persuaded, both in comments filed in a rulemaking instituted last November (BROADCASTING, Dec. 2, 1974) and in lobbying by AM broadcasters, that the rules adopted in 1964 and 1973 were too restrictive. The aim of those rules was to reserve the disappearing spectrum space for the assignment of stations that would serve underserved areas, and to encourage development of FM in areas needing an aural service.

The rules that restricted the growth of AM service limit the acceptance of applications to those proposing new daytime and nighttime service or increased power for existing stations that can make a showing that 25% of the area to be served by the resulting facility is "white area"—that is, lacking in interference-free, full primary service from either an AM or FM station. Alternatively, an application for a

new station would be accepted if it showed that the proposed facility would provide a first or second "adequate" service to the community. (A station provides "adequate" service if its 5 mv/m contour covers 80% of the population of the area to be served. However, the alternative was of little help, since signals from outside the community could be considered as providing "adequate" service.)

But AM broadcasters complained that the rules prevented them from obtaining the power increases needed to serve cities whose population centers have stretched beyond the stations' existing signal contours. The commission also came across cases in which application of the rules seemed to bar needed nighttime service.

The rules, the commission said, failed to afford reasonable opportunities to meet developing needs for additional aural service.

Accordingly, the commission decided on a less-than-two-services standard. It will accept applications for a new daytime or unlimited time station, or for nighttime facilities for an existing daytime-only station, simply on a showing that the community involved has fewer than two independent aural transmission services with an AM-FM combination counted as one) during that time of the day for which the new service is proposed—assuming the proposed station can meet existing interference standards.

What's more, an application for a new unlimited time station meeting the first or second nighttime service standard will be accepted even if the proposed station's daytime operation would provide the community with more than two broadcast services. (The commission is retaining the 25% rule as an alternative to the first or second service standard.)

The new, 2.5 kw power classification fits into rules that require that maximum rated carrier power of a transmitter be at a specific power step. Those steps have been 500 w, 1 kw, 5 kw, 10 kw, and 50 kw. The commission said the creation of a step between 1 kw and 5 kw is both logical and useful; it will facilitate the maximum use of facilities in cases where power greater than 1 kw was feasible, but not as much as 5 kw.

The relaxation of the suburban rule adopted in 1965 as a means of assuring that applicants for stations in suburban communities intend to serve those communities and not the adjoining large city, was a necessary consequence of the actions taken to relax restraints on power increases.

The rule requires an applicant for a suburban station that would put a 5 mv/m contour over a neighboring large city overcome a presumption that the station is intended to serve that city. The rule will now be limited to mutually exclusive applications that are involved in a comparative hearing. Continuing to apply the rule to applications for new stations for power increases would conflict with the new policy aimed at removing the restrictions on such applications. However, requests for unusually high power will be examined carefully, the commission said.

Portugal Planning The Nationalization Of Radio Stations

LISBON, July 3 (UPI)—Portugal's military rulers said today that they would nationalize the country's radio stations in a move aimed at ending a power struggle over control of a Roman Catholic station.

The decision further strained the already deteriorated relations between the Government and the once powerful church.

"We will try to get a meeting with the Revolutionary Council," a spokesman for the Lisbon Patriarchy said. "We cannot accept this."

The decision was a reversal of an announcement two days ago by Premier Vasco dos Santos Gonalves, who said workers occupying the studios of the Catholic Renascença station had to give it back to its owner.

A communiqué, issued after an all-night meeting, said:

"Analyzing the crisis situation created in Radio Renascença, the Revolutionary Council decided to immediately appoint an administrative committee to run the radio station until the nationalization of radio frequencies and the radio station takes place, guaranteeing from now on the use of nationalized radio by the church and other currents of opinion."

The protesting workers said in a broadcast, "Victory is ours."

The Renascença struggle began over a dispute on personnel layoffs. But it soon became aggravated when the workers attacked the news policy of the church management.

There are four radio stations in Lisbon, including Radio Renascença and one that has always belonged to the Government. The military Government last year nationalized television.

The military also announced new uncompensated expropriations of property and military trials for those persons guilty of negligence in a prison break on Sunday of 89 former members of the secret police.

As was true of the other AM rules it modified, the commission felt the one governing applications for changes in frequency constituted an unnecessary "bar to the acceptance" of an application. The rule subjects a frequency-change application to the same limitations on interference as those applied to a new station applying for the frequency. Under the new rule, the acceptability standards will be the same as those applied to applications for power increases. The commission said its rules could be modified without weakening its policies aimed at preventing "the undue multiplication of stations serving the same community."

The commission, in bringing the rulemaking to an unusually speedy conclusion, thus was sympathetic to the desire for relaxation of restrictions that was expressed in most of the 273 comments filed in the proceeding.

But one proposal it rejected was that its allocation rules take into account the needs for unique, specialized or minority program formats. The commission said that "the transitory nature of programming makes programming a particularly inappropriate factor to consider in the context of the adoption of such generally applicable rules" as those it was considering in the AM allocations system it was designing.

As for those changes it did make, the commission said they "should provide many opportunities, unavailable since the adoption of the restrictive amendments of 1964, for the assignment of new standard broadcast stations, and the expansion of facilities of existing stations."

Postal rates to rise 33%, Mackasey says

PARIS (CP)—Canadians can expect a 33 per cent increase in postal rates within a year, according to Postmaster-General Bryce Mackasey.

Mr. Mackasey, in Paris to meet his French counterpart, Eymard Achille-Fould, said such an increase would be necessary to improve postal service.

The 33 per cent increase would raise the cost of a first-class letter to between 10 and 11 cents.

In May, Mr. Mackasey assured the Canadian Direct Mail Association at a meeting in Toronto that there would be no increase in postal rates until the Post Office improves its efficiency. In a later interview he said he could not foresee an increase in first-class rates for at least a year.

However, he noted at that time that the 8-cent charge for first-class mail was unrealistic. He pointed to the

cost of automation and large wage increases.

Canada's letter carriers recently ratified a 30-month contract giving them a wage increase of 868 a week. The contract will bring their wages to \$245.60 a week by July 1, 1976.

In the Paris interview, Mr. Mackasey noted that the rate in Britain and France for first-class mail is twice that of Canada while West Germans pay three times as much.

The minister, while rating Canada's postal system third best in the world behind Belgium and Japan, said the immensity of the country and its sometimes-intemperate climate are responsible for periodic breakdowns in service.

Mr. Mackasey, who returns to Ottawa on Sunday, is meeting senior French officials and will also inspect several mail-handling centres in the French capital.

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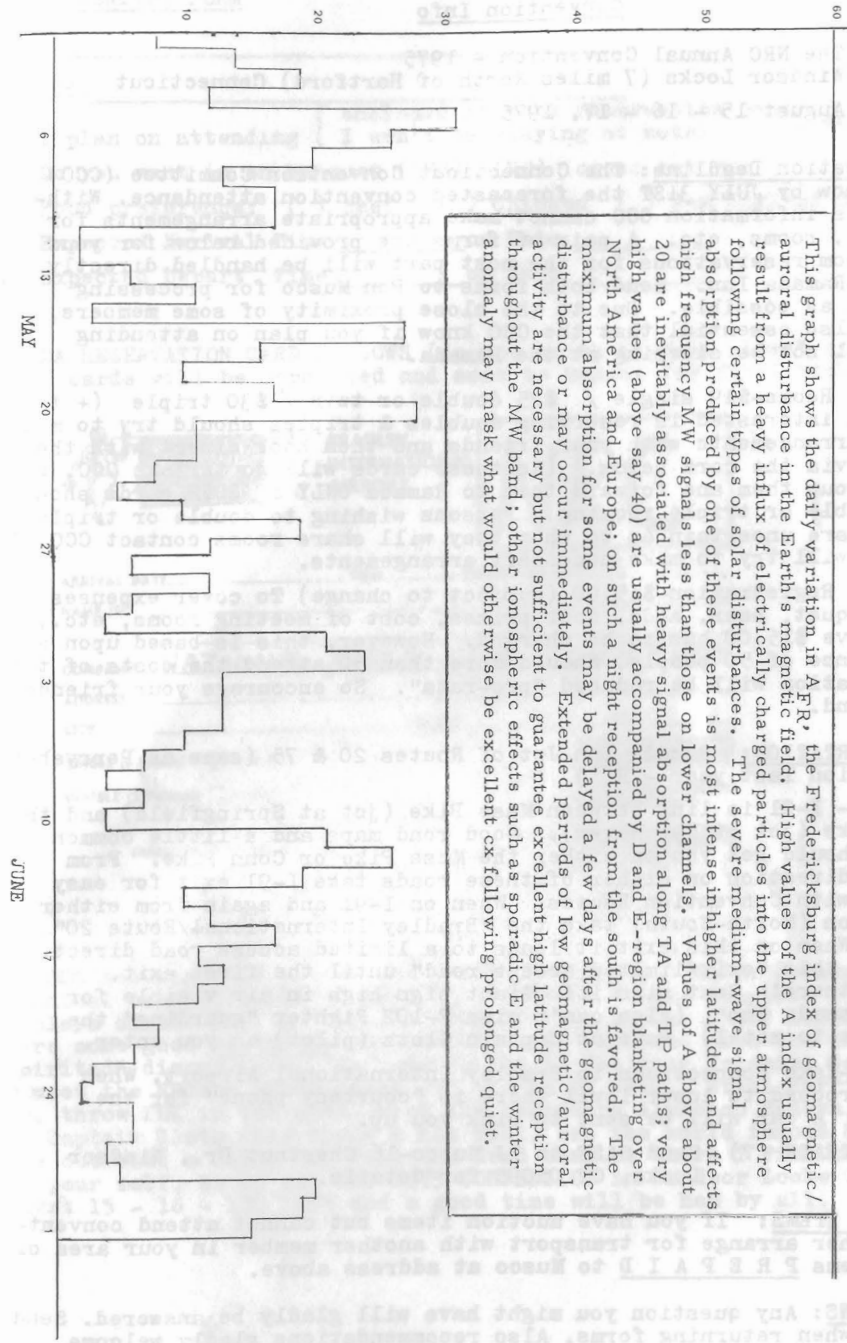

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This graph shows the daily variation in Apr, the Fredericksburg index of geomagnetic/auroral disturbance in the Earth's magnetic field. High values of the A index usually result from a heavy influx of electrically charged particles into the upper atmosphere following certain types of solar disturbances. The severe medium-wave signal absorption produced by one of these events is most intense in higher latitudes and affects high frequency MW signals less than those on lower channels. Values of A above about 20 are inevitably associated with heavy signal absorption along TA and TP paths; very high values (above say 40) are usually accompanied by D and E-region blanketing over North America and Europe; on such a night reception from the south is favored. The maximum absorption for some events may be delayed a few days after the geomagnetic disturbance or may occur immediately. Extended periods of low geomagnetic/auroral activity are necessary but not sufficient to guarantee excellent high latitude reception throughout the MW band; other ionospheric effects such as sporadic E and the winter anomaly may mask what would otherwise be excellent cx following prolonged quiet.
