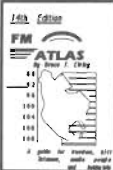

FCC Relaxes Radio Station Owner Rules

WASHINGTON—The Federal Communications Commission, seeking to bolster the ailing radio industry, voted Thursday to let financially successful broadcast owners buy more radio stations. The FCC will now allow one company to own 30 AM and 30 FM stations nationwide, instead of 12

AM and 12 FM stations, with only one of each in a single community.

A company will be able to buy from three to six stations in a single market, depending on the size of the community.

Commissioner Andrew Barrett abstained from the 4-0 vote, saying the action seemed "based more on wishful thinking and personal goals than upon a thorough and balanced examination of real-world market implications, public

interest concerns and economic factors."

Rep. Edward J. Markey (D-Mass.), chairman of the House telecommunications subcommittee, also criticized the decision, saying it would stifle diversity. He said he will introduce legislation to reinstate stricter rules.

But FCC Chairman Alfred C. Sikes and the others voting for the plan said the action was necessary to save failing radio stations.

Of about 10,800 commercial radio stations in the country, more than 100 have shut down in the last year, a number are in bankruptcy and hundreds are restructuring debts, industry analysts say.

1240 KJCY ID Mountain Home - is NOT silent, as reported in AM Switch. They play *love songs*, and simulcast with KJCY-FM 99.1. (BP-ID)

1280 WSAT NC Salisbury - Airs Sports Byline USA (per 2/18 pgm), airing weekdays 2000-2300 from KSFO-560. (DP-HI)

1340 KANR ID Nampa - is now CNN news so change your Logs. (BP-ID)

1370 WXXI NY Rochester - As of 3/2, to return to 24 Hr NSP. The result of successful pledge drives in 1991 & 1992. (JR-NY)

1380 WRBQ FL Tampa - 1/30 Midnight Good over WAOK with The All New AM 1380 is WRBQ Tampa - St. Petersburg legal ID -> SMN Touch. Ex: CHR & | FM. (EB-GA)

1430 KWDO CA Fresno - is now Oldies. (DXAS)

WFXF IN Indianapolis - 1/30 0006 Good with good \$ over others with AM 1430 The Fox slogan, joining WFXF-FM 103.3 with classic rock. Apparently classic rock 0000-0600, otherwise all-sports. (EB-GA)

1450 WOL DC Washington - 1/31 0028 This NSP pest (although it's my favorite for regular listening on Saturday afternoons because of the doo-wop mx played) noted off the air. (WPT-DC)

1470 WPDM NY Pottsdam - 2/16 0708-0800 ID WSMN used many times. WSMN is listed on 1590 in Nashua, NH. Also ID as 99 WSMN many times. On the hour legal was WPDM/WSMN so it appears WODM is now | WSMN-FM. (LK-ON) [Their FM calls are WSNJ at 99.3. WSMN remains in NH - Ed.]

1490 KTOB CA Petaluma - 2/13 is now silent. (DXAS)

1110 UNID ?? - 3/2 1400 CNN Headline News, IDd as Eleven-Ten CNN. WHIM format change? (DW-CT) [Yup. See SPECIAL in Issue 20 - Ed.]

1120 UNID ?? - 2/6 0647-0650 Hrd over/under KMOX with wx with current temp of 10 (several degrees colder than here) followed by ads for J.L. Roberts and the Accurate Appliance at either 582-00xx or 528-00xx (had to work from memory as the car was moving, hi). Could be either unnn WBIS or wanted WADN. (RJE-PA)

1140 UNID ?? - 2/23 0520 With SS male signing Mexican ballad, but then slipped under KRAK running IRN. KCMJ or KLUC with weekly pgm. Poor, then very poor with het from 1143. (DP-HI1)

1190 WLIB NY New York - may be LK-ON's unID here in 3/2 DX News, as I have heard them with reggae. (MS-ON)

1230 UNID ?? - 2/5 2008 Fair with Arkansas BKB. 2008 Mention of the Razorback Network. (RD-IA)

1240 UNID ?? - 2/5 2015 Fair with Arkansas BKB | the unid on 1230. KWAK, maybe? (RD-IA)

1340 UNID ?? - 2/5 0140 Fair - good with Q100 IDs and CHR mx. Looped NNE/SSW. (RD-IA)

1390 UNID ?? - 2/17 0229 Female with Dusty Radio 1390, Sounds of Gospel - GOS choir, then faded away. Waited until 0247 to see if it would come back, but never did. I think she said Dusty, but can't be sure. Who is this? All is not for naught, though, because I logged WFBL, which was new, while waiting for a comeback. (GH-OH)

1400 UNID ?? - 2/6 0035 Atop with wrap-up of Oklahoma Sooners BKB postgame show. This almost makes me wish that someone out there would have sent me some network lists for Arkansas and Oklahoma this year!! (RD-IA)

- 1143 SPAIN R. Popular de Reus 2/16 2220-2224 - Spanish talk regarding Yugoslavia, more interviews, // 999. SIO 242. [JB-NF]
- 1161p BULGARIA Stara Zagora 2/20 0329-0333 - Presumed, with fast eastern European music on flute-like instruments. Heard this sort of music many times before, but no announcements heard on this occasion. SIO 232. [JB-NF]
- 1355 CLANDESTINE/SPANISH SAHARA Polisario Front Station 2/21 (no time shown) - Talks in Arabic over Arabic music. A Finnish contact tells me the station is probably really in the southern contested area of Morocco (thus ex-Spanish Sahara). I know that the SW transmissions from this organization almost certainly emanate from Algerian transmitters. SIO 242. [JB-NF] (As far as I know, the Algerian location for SW transmitters is definite! - Jim)

- 1020 VENEZUELA R. Mundial Margarita 2/21 2311-2312 - LA ballad, usual "la hora en Mundial" TC. Nice signal tonight. SIO 343-4. [JB-NF]
- 1030 ARGENTINA R. del Plata, Buenos Aires 2/21 2312-2314 - Nasty mix w/WBZ and, I thin, another LA station, but was up briefly for 2 minutes with Spanish talk about the "campeonato del Argentina" but not sure of what sport they were talking. Dallas Lankford wrote in to explain that shortwave broadcasts heard on false medium wave frequencies "are not images, but rather 2nd order intermodulation distortion (IMD) products". Dallas sent me a draft article which I hope we will soon see in final form. In the article he explains "If you observe any IMD products from an amplified MW loop during on-the-air use, you can virtually be certain they are 2nd order products. Moreover, the second order products you will hear, if your amplified loop has any, are usually due to a frequency difference f_1 minus f_2 of the SW signals f_1 and f_2 ." So, Tony Bernhoffer and others, there is an explanation for this, and Dallas' article, when it appears, will provide some tips on how remove or reduce this interference. Thank you, Dallas.

 Just back from our annual trek to the Daytona 500 and a few more weeks being tourists in the Sunshine State! Visited JOHN BOWKER in his beautiful new home, quite a climate change from NJ. Notes from the road: Heard WQAI-1570 back on the air w/Classical Music for some odd reason. This station has very good coverage for such a high dial position. Parked in the driveway to the WXTL-1010 transmitter for a photo of their impressive big six tower system and noted that 1010 was empty on the truck radio, a pretty sure sign they were silent. I always wondered how they fit three high-powered stations on 1010 in FL. Looks now like the one in Seffner is the only one presently on the air. While passing through construction areas N & S of Charlotte on I77, I noted several cute little solar powered TIS transmitters on trailers with short vertical antennas. Although there were no signs, I tuned to 1610 and there they were. And they were playing MUSIC! That's right, about 30 seconds of an UNID tune followed by a 'generic' drive safely message, over and over. Has anybody else ever noted music on a TIS? Drove within 100 feet of the WKFL-1170 transmitter on I95 & heard nothing on the frequency. I heard them on their last day of operation in 10/90, wonder what is happening with this station?  Dave, your mentioning of having borrowed my old Philco back in the 60's jogged my memory a bit. That grand old set served me well from 1936 to 1961 and is still up in our attic, not having functioned for at least 20 years. With its 6 tubes, it brought in lots of West Coasters back in to 30's and got me started on TA's in the late 50's. It's hard to believe the HQ180 has been in use for over 30 years. Well, as announced in my previous MUSE, we took a little trip to Morocco and Spain last month. Also, we spent the last week of Feb. on Marco Island, FL. It was fun hearing at first hand the Moroccans so often heard over here. And my tiny SONY 4910 still does just fine. Crossed the Mediterranean by ferry from Spain to Tangier at the Strait of Gibraltar. The last time I passed this place was 12/45 on the way home from France, never expected to return. We drove down the coast from Tangier to Rabat then further down to Casablanca, inland to Marrakech, NE to Fes in N central Morocco, and then back to Tangier and across to Spain. Morocco took 10 days.
