



FIGURE 5: MWT-3 REGEN. TUNER / CONTROLLER (SCHEMATIC: BUF-A BUFFER AMPLIFIER CARD)




FIGURE 4: MWT-3 REGEN. TUNER / CONTROLLER (ASSEMBLY: RFE-D REGEN. FRONT-END CARD)








FIGURE 8: RTL-2 REMOTELY-TUNED LOOP





FIGURE 9: RTL-2 REMOTELY-TUNED LOOP (ASSEMBLY: BUF-A BUFFER AMPLIFIER CARD)





FIGURE 11: RTL-2 REMOTELY - TUNED LOOP (ASSEMBLY: BUF-B BUFFER AMPLIFER CARD) BUF-B may be used instead of BUF-A for more gain at rural locations.
