

Thank you again for your letter and I hope this will suffice.

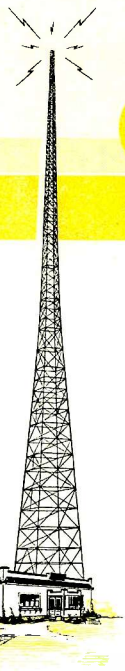
