Dear DX Friend:

It was a pleasure to receive your letter reporting reception of WGBG. We have checked your report against our program and transmitter log, and find the program correct. This letter serves to verify your reception of the station from 6:00 to 6:10 AM, EWT, January 4, 1945.

The transmitter and studios of WGBG are located in a new modernistic building, designed especially for broadcasting purposes. We are located south of Buffalo Creek, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Greensboro proper. Our ground system, which is laid in a low swampy area, consists of 180 radials, 250 feet long. We have approximately 900 square feet of hardware cloth directly under the tower. The 235 foot Blaw Knox vertical radiator is fed at all four legs. The transmitter is a Western Electric, 1 Kilowatt, type 443-A1. Our speech equipment is a Gates Console, with associated 5-C Speech Racks. Western Electric Combination Vertical-Lateral pick-ups are used in connection with two Dual Speed Presto turn tables, RCA Velocity mikes are used in all studios.


All in all, we believe we have one of the best equipped and most modern Radio Stations in the South. We are very proud of our coverage which reports seem to indicate, is far better than the average 1 Kilowatt station.

If at any time in the future you should be passing through Greensboro, do not hesitate to stop and look over the Studios and Plant. All visitors are assured a hearty welcome. Of course, our control rooms and transmitting rooms are closed to all persons, except employees, due to War Time Restrictions. However, each piece of equipment has been so arranged so you may view it from a large window from the outside.

At the present time, our monitor schedule is from 2:00 to 2:15 AM, 17th of the month. Our regular schedule is from 6:00 AM to local sunset, which at present is 6:30 PM. We will be happy to hear from you at any time, with any comments you wish to make regarding reception.

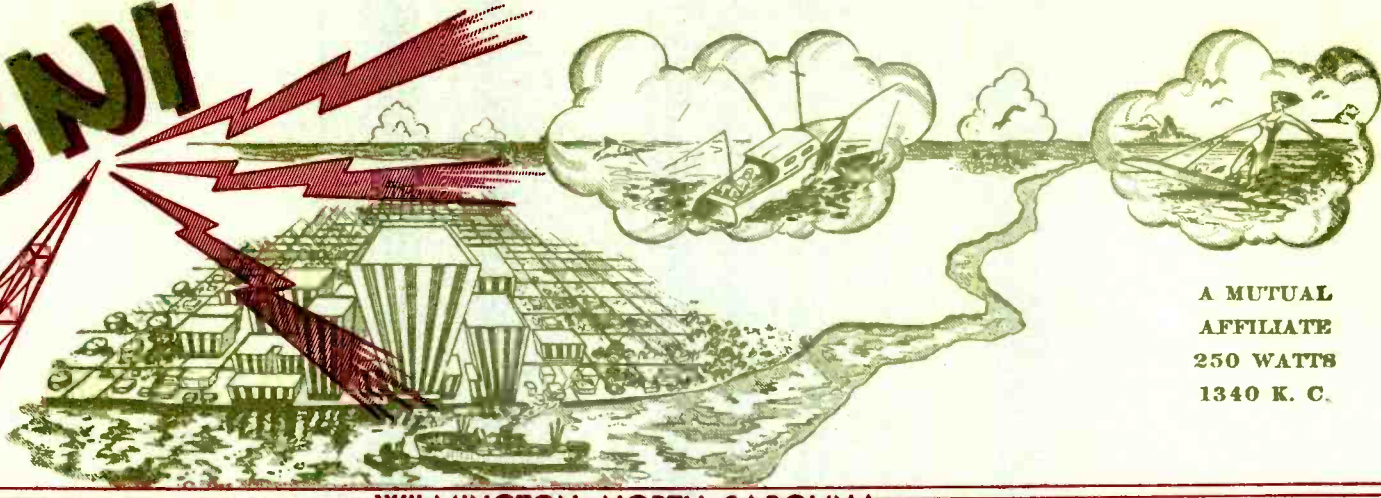

I am in receipt of your letter of May 15, 1947 telling us that you received our test signals on the night of Feb. 15, 1947 and we hereby confirm your report. Thanks very much for your letter and please excuse us for being so late in answering, our only excuse is that this is a new station and we are snowed under with trying to get her running as best possible.

In case you are interested here is the arrangement here, our studios are in Wilmington, N.C., and the Transmitter house is on Eagle Island about five miles from the studio. We are using telephone lines from the studio to the transmitter feeding a Western Electric 298-23-c ~~ix~~ console the output of which is fed into a Western Electric 298-A limiter, which feeds a Western Electric 451-A 250 watt transmitter using a Type 312A tube to drive 6 Type 242-C tubes in push-pull parallel. We are using General Radio frequency and modulation monitoring equipment, and find that it is doing excellent work.



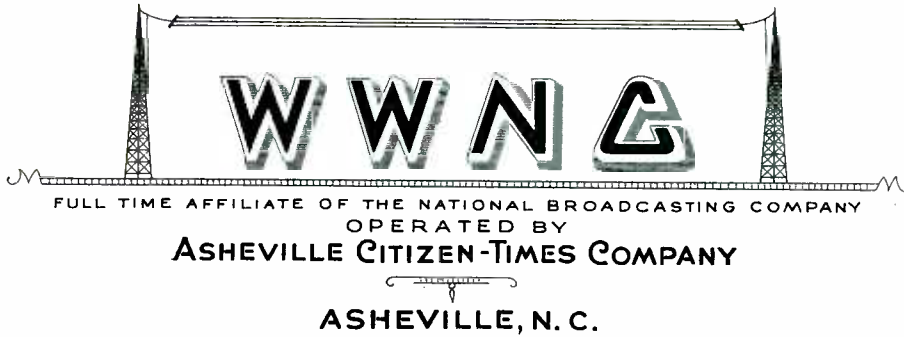
