Technology makes antiques every decade!


Because knowledge in all fields is doubling every 10 years, electronic equipment usually becomes outdated every decade. This is difficult for the average person to realize; but when one considers that the electromagnetic theory was a formula in 1864; and a hundred years later, man was broadcasting pictures from space, the magnitude of progress becomes clear.

In Charleston, S.C., the WCSC Broadcast Museum shows the stages of development of radio and television. There are experiments, demonstrations, displays, exhibits, and memorabelia to tell the past, the present, and the future of broadcasting.

The Museum is housed in an historic residence (c1795) which lost its third floor in the earthquake of 1886. Beside the house is the "South Carolina"

Liberty Tree" -- the reminder of a former oak where colonists gathered to protest harsh demands of the British prior to the Revolution. The Declaration of Independence was read under that tree for the first time in the state. During the occupation of the city by English troops, the general ordered the tree cut down and the roots burned to destroy the symbolism. The new Liberty Tree was dedicated during Charleston's Tricentennial in 1970.

Inside the Museum, the rooms are designated as different periods of developmental history. There are separate rooms for battery radio and for electric radio. There are also a prebroadcast room and a TV room. On display is a remarkable collection of sets from a spark gap transmitter to an integrated circuit design; from the first disc model gramaphone to multiplex holography.

The WCSC Broadcast Museum is more than a repository of old sets. Frank Blair, who had his first job at WCSC Radio, has narrated the tour tape



"From TomTom to Telstar" which tells the story of man's desire to communicate over long distance. Early equipment plus explanatory demonstrations have been built by engineers, schools, and colleges to illustrate the processes of sight and sound.

(Variable Speech Control) tapes to present audio developments.


If folks have thrilled to sound that "flies through the air" since Marconi's transAtlantic demonstration in 1901, television pictures have mesmerized an entire population. The WCSC Broadcast Museum explains the transmission and reception process in simple basic terms. A mock camera with photoelectric cells activates light emitting diodes in the mock receiver made from a real picture tube sliced in half. A Crookes tube illustrates the cathode ray and

Book review....TUNE IN YESTERDAY. The ultimate Encyclopedia of OID-TIME RADIO 1925-76. By John Dunning. Prentice-Hall. 1976. \$17.95....

While, this review will be brief, this has nothing to do with what I think of the book. This 703 page book is an alphabetical listing of drama, comedy, and variety shows on network radio programs. The author gives a brief description of the show with a list of major players in the show, typical plot lines, development of the characters, plus comments on the way that the program first came on the air, switches of sponsors, cast, or changes in the network. In the foreword, the author mentions a number of authors/books to which he owes a debt of gratitude for providing information, including Buxton & Owen's THE BIG BROADCAST. I feel that TUNE IN YESTERDAY is the best volume on the programs of old-time radio on the market today. It provides more information on each program than THE BIG BROADCAST, which was the best volume up until John Dunning wrote this book. The information on each show ranges from a brief paragraph on an obscure show, such as ABBOTT MYSTERIES, to 6 pages for MERCURY THEATRE OF THE AIR. But even in a brief paragraph, Dunning tells you that ABBOTT MYSTERIES was a spin-off of MR. AND MRS. NORTH, gives cast, tells you a little about the brief life of the show, etc. Again, this book is worth every penny of its price. Any fan of radio would enjoy reading about the different programs.




Singers take a break during recording sessions.

Dear Jim:

Thank you for the timely reminder that my subscription as expired. Unlike last year when I was confined to my bed, I have been able to obtain the necessary U. S. funds from my bank immediately, and so have pleasure in enclosing a cheque for the coming years subscription.

The move of our residence from Avondale to Point Chevalier has still left me with a lot of work to do in the matter of gardens etc., and I still have a lot of tidying to do in workshops and study. Browsing through some of the boxes of "junk" I brought here has been lots of fun, and I have found lots of old tuning condensers, neutrodyne coils, vernier dials and even some old galena and zircon crystals. I made one of the neutrodyne coils into a crystal set and found that it goes very well. I have restored a 1931 Gulbransen, series 50, 7 tube screen grid super heterodyne with avc, and its performance has startled more than a few people. There are dozens of old receivers and tubes on display as well as the camera tubes: iconoscope, image orthicon, videcons, and plumbicons. There is also a CCD chip as preview of things to come; but the real pazzaz of tomorrow's television is the holography demonstration. There are slides to show the three demensional picture image and a multiplex holograph of a lady blowing a kiss in eerie three dimensional realism.


The Museum is financed by WCSC, Inc. which includes AM, FM, and TV; but it would not be possible without the generosity and enthusiasm of the collectors and individuals who have contributed time, ideas, and materials for the exhibits. In addition to many who loaned one or two items, three collectors participated from the beginning and have offered advice and guidance on setting up the arrangements. They are: Wells Burton (KLQF), Kenneth Feinberg, and Dallas Swindal. Neilson's Electronics School donated time and talent, as have Trident Tech and the College of Charleston. Of course, the WCSC Radio and TV engineers participate regularly with Joe Sarco as chief model-maker and technical advisor.

A brand new room has just been added to show the first home entertainment machines. The collection of Mr. Kenneth Hanson of Clearwater, Fla., includes gramaphones, phonographs, and Magic Lanterns. (He has also supplemented the radio and TV collections.) Mr. Hanson has been a serious collector since the twenties and has traveled all over the world to gather his models. In addition to the more familiar machines, there are many unusual record players like the klingsor, a German machine with plano strings in front of the horn that vibrate tones as the record plays below. The Guinephone has a cardboard horn that folds flat in the top to make a compact set to take on an African safari.


Just as today's milady chooses colors and designs for her living room accessories, Victorian homemakers selected horn speakers in their favorite decor. Mr. Hanson's horns show the familiar brass design, as well as unusual colors and shapes - the morning glory, hand-painted flower embossed models, and a solid mahagony design (the latter on loan from his grandson, Eric Ewerts).

In the Hanson collection are Magic Lanterns that projected handpainted images long before the invention of cameras and films. The Kinetoscope, Edison's first motion picture projector, is on desplay as well as opaque and post card projectors — all of which use flame for light source: candle, kerosene, gas, carbide and arc.

The WCSC Broadcast Museum is an ongoing project adding new displays and

exhibits regularly to tell the continuing story of home entertainment and long distance communication. Thousands of school children have come through since its opening to the public in March, 1977.

The Museum is located at 80 Alexander Street just behind the studios of WCSC Radio and TV. It is open Monday through Friday, 9:30 to 1:30 p.m.


