NO SANE American today is against national defense—a program which will soon insure these shores against invasion by a foe which has destroyed the independence of one European country after the other. The defense of our own shores is not quite enough, however. ### Louis B. Mayer

LEGEND extraordinary is the one about movie moguls. A mogul in Hollywood is generally believed to be an overrich individual with considerably more money than any human being has a right to possess, the education of a hobo, the tastes of a Bowery derelict. As most legends go, this one is generally false. In the case of one Louis B. Mayer, the word mogul is to be thrown out. As head of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, he is just "the boss," no more, no less than a hundred thousand genial bosses in other enterprises.



True, he is a man of wealth. He also is a man of vision, a man concerned with problems of his fellow men. MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE selects those whom it applauds by vote of its entire staff. In the case of "L. B." the vote was unanimous—first, because of the consistent high quality of pictures produced on his movie lot. Second, because as head of the Motion Picture Division of the Community Chest this year he inspired Hollywood to vastly oversubscribe its quota of \$450,000. No man in Hollywood or any city deserves more the title "Real American."

Note Miss Dietrich's dessert, ice cream and a plate of cookies. How does she do it—and keep that figure?



THIS WEEK: Radio listening in the past two weeks has lost much of its pleasure for intelligent Americans. The most upsetting incident for those who enjoy radio for entertainment's sake was Charles A. Lindbergh's attack upon the President's foreign policy. It is commendable that radio networks are not partisan, that men can say what they feel they must say. Yet it is apparent that democracy may readily defeat itself in times of stress by the right a man has to stand in front of a microphone and emit a loud "razzberry."

Movie-Radio Guide is an entertainment weekly which does not assume as its mission the deep discussion of world affairs. In the interests of radio, however, it cautions those who buy time on the air for what they believe to be patriotic duties to be more wise in delivering their messages.

If Mr. Lindbergh or Senator Nye or Senator Wheeler wish to speak to Americans in their homes, they should do these Americans the courtesy of speaking directly to them alone. These three gentlemen and others object strenuously to propaganda. Because they do they should bar audiences from the vicinity of their microphones. It is obvious that these semi-hysterical audiences are highly partisan. The recent demonstration at the Lindbergh meeting in New York is not conducive to sound thinking in American parlors or the national unity that is so vitally important in these crucial days.

American listeners must individually

enjoy the courtesy anyone would extend in entering their homes. The networks should preserve free speech and at the same time protect listeners from rabble-rousers. Are we right?

A new type of color photo, it shows the No. 1 man of the screen in a cheerful embrace with Rosalind Russell, a scene from their new picture, "Unholy Partners." You won't want to miss a single page of the next issue.

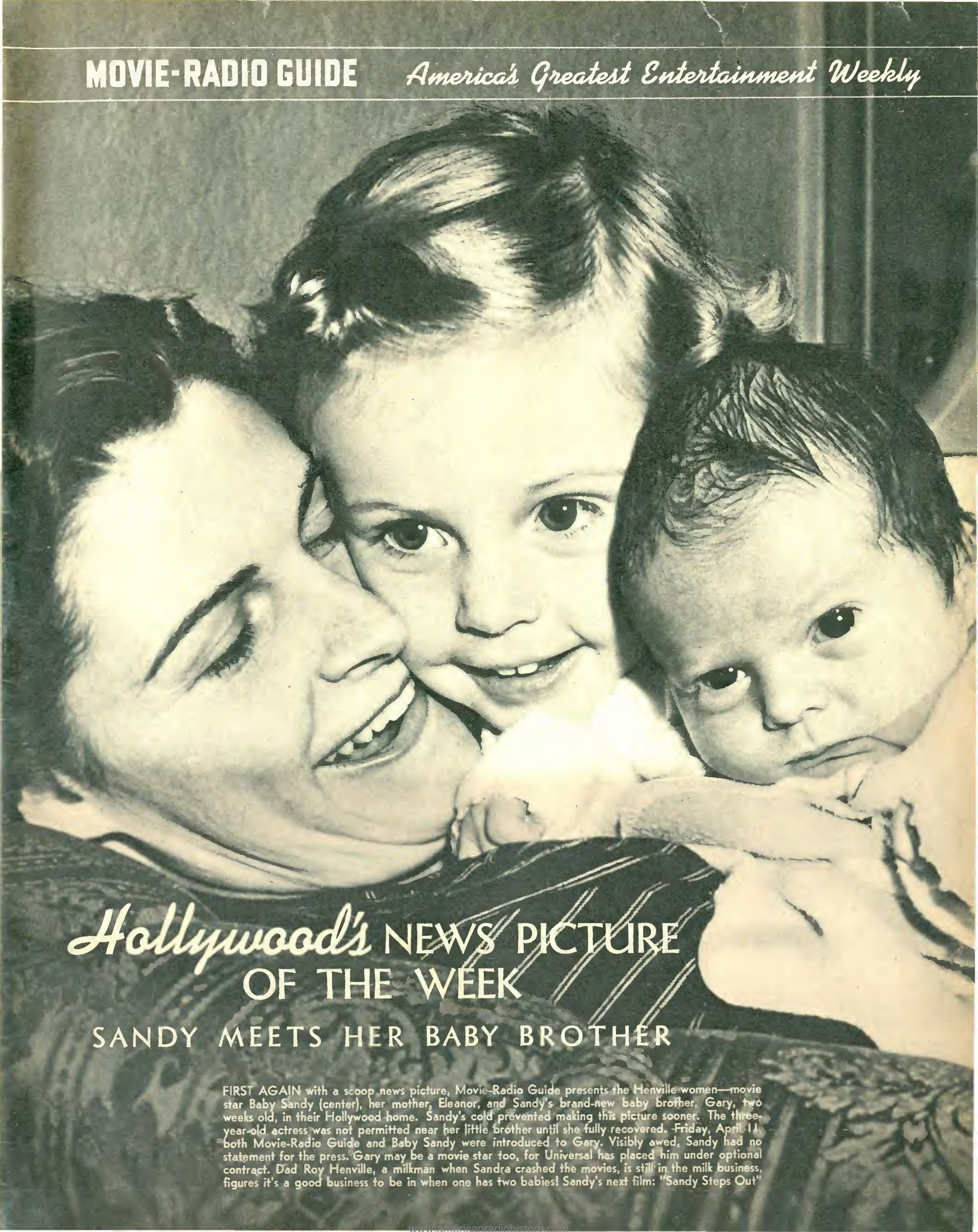

# The Stars INVADE MEXICO

But for the purposes of good-will and friendship—and their invasion is a pronounced success both for the movies and the United States!

Editor's Note: Continuing its policy of obtaining the best authorities for its various features, the staff of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE selected William Wallace, official photographer, to tell the story of the Motion Picture Producers Association Goodwill Fiesta to Mexico City through the eyes of a cameraman. His account follows:

By William Wallace

AS OFFICIAL photographer of Motion Picture Goodwill Fiesta to Mexico City, I was attached to Pan American Plane No. 1 of three chartered to fly to Mexico City. Fellow passengers were David O. Selznick, Norma Shearer, Lady Ashley, John Hay Whitney, Frank Capra, Wally Beery, Frank Morgan, Kay Francis, W. R. Wilkerson, Francis L. Alstock, and Carl Anderson, Pan American tour manager.

Taking off in pouring rain Good Friday morn-storm over Mexico's west coast. As darkness threatened, we landed in Mazatlan that evening instead of Guadalajara. Thousands of people dashed to greet us in cars, ox- and donkey-carts. Wallace Beery was almost mobbed by fans.

At 7:30 a.m. Saturday we took off for Mexico City. Tremendous, happy, pushing and cheering crowds welcomed us upon arrival as 1,500 Mexican City police and soldiers escorted us to three huge busses, the windows of which we closed to keep youngsters from trying to hitch rides.

Then the rush started. First the mayor's reception, then off to tea with Ambassador and Mrs. Josephus Daniels in the American embassy. I barely picked up more plate-holders when the stars rushed off to make personal appearances at four theaters, one of which was holding the premiere of "Pot o' Gold," and later to night-clubs.

Easter Sunday (the next morning) many of us attended mass at Basilea Guadalupe. Later we were guests of Mexico's Motion Picture Producers Association at a charro fiesta (rodeo). At Rancho Blanco, oldest Mexican ranch, we ate native barbecued food and attended a Mexican fashion show with pretty señoritas as models.

Monday as we were packing word came that President Avila Camacho would like to welcome us at 2 p.m. We were greatly flattered by his warm welcome, his bid to return soon and his deep farewell. I left Mexico filled with a desire to return. It is a beautiful country, full of friendly, swell people. I hope they enjoyed our visit as much as we enjoyed their hospitality.

# LOVE ON THE DIETRICH SET!

A news sleuth discovers that all the passionate moments are not in script

NO OBJECTIONS were raised when George Raft stood as best man as Edward G. Robinson married Marlene Dietrich, play-acting on the set. Raft, as Robinson's tough buddy, says to Marlene: "He's my friend. If he hooks up with a dame

like you, he's tying up with a lot of headaches he never figured on." Perhaps, or perhaps not, a headache for George Raft and Marlene Dietrich is the fact that both have been long separated from their real-life mates, have never divorced

IN A SCENE that took five "takes" to film, Edward G. Robinson as the crippled line-foreman gave Marlene an embarrassed peck on the cheek to seal the ceremony. Clearly it wasn't the kiss of a passionate lover-husband

principally because she believes it adds more realism to scenes. True it is that La Dietrich did find George attractive and vice versa. But the safe bet is the Dietrich-Raft romance on the set, though genuine as an 18-karat diamond, will fade fast as picture is forgotten

**EXCERPTS from a GREAT MOVIE SCRIPT**

Editor's Note: Because of its good "picture-taking" quality, significance in an exciting story, and the fact that Marlene Dietrich never before played a better scene, we reproduce her dialog here. This occurs near the climax of a brutal story in which George Raft urges her to go back to the man she married.

FAY: (Dietrich)  
I've been taking the worst of everything all my life. What have I had? A father who quit my mother and no other kids were play-up of coffee... while other kids were playing I was nursing a ribbon counter in the five and ten... other girls got proposals. I never got anything but promises... I can't think of anything good that ever happened to me-- except meeting you-- and I was ready to take the worst of that, too.

Johnny's (George Raft's) cynicism begins to fade. He rises, regarding her intently.

FAY: (continuing)  
I was running away from you! Because you were always around and I couldn't stand to look at you any more without touching you-- because I was going crazy every time I thought of you-- because I love you.

(still more emotionally)

I was setting myself up behind the eight ball again. I was going to take the worst as usual. That's what I was going to do. That's what I tried to do. But you wouldn't let me. So now here's how it's going to be.

She puts her arms around him, kisses him. After a moment, he responds.



TEMPERAMENTAL? That is what Marlene has been called as a result of widely circulated stories that she doesn't get on with her leading men. True on certain occasions in the past, the current rumor is false. This is a picture, unposed, of Marlene talking

with Edward G. Robinson between scenes on the Warner lot. At thirty-seven, a beauty who knows how to stay on top in a tough, exacting profession, Dietrich indulges in no temperamental foolishness, is wise in the ways of movie-making, is a hard worker

**To News Desk:**

CHECKING on that rumor about trouble on the "Man Power" set, I must report that there is trouble, all right, but not the kind you think. For one thing the story about Marlene Dietrich being "difficult" is one you can file away as something dreamed up by editors hard up for a story.

The boys on the set told me confidentially that they expected seventeen different kinds of headaches when Marlene reported for work on the Warner lot for the first time. What they got was something else again. Marlene is a movie star. She never lets anybody forget that. She wheels up to the sound-stage in a sixteen-cylinder Cadillac, sweeps onto the set like a queen. It's glamour with all the trimmings!

Once on the job, however, she drops all that. You'd never call Dietrich a grind, but it's surprising the way she hammers at her work. When a "take" is over she hobnobs with the crew, generally making herself a "good fellow." Off and on I was around sound-stages seven and nineteen for two weeks and I never once saw Marlene "pull a phony."

But getting to the important point, the "queen" really does all right by herself in the romance department. The man in the case is George Raft. In the picture Marlene is supposed (1) to hate George, (2) get to love him, and finally (3) lose him. All except (1) may be true. Let me tell you what Dietrich did to George Raft.



Fighting Dietrich

George, as you know, has been going around with Betty Grable—and pretty steadily—but from the beginning of this picture it has been obvious that Marlene's interest in George has not been entirely confined to the script. She liked George, showed it.

There's no doubt that George liked Marlene, too, but it was she who made the advances. With a hundred pretty extras on the set it was only natural that he looked other ways than hers on more than one occasion. George has acquired the reputation of being quite a ladies' man about Hollywood, and he did nothing to destroy that impression during the making of this picture. His attentions were bestowed rather impartially on all of the ladies.

I saw Marlene give George a present, which he quietly postponed opening. But I also saw a kiss that not only wasn't part of the picture—it wasn't even near the camera! That's what makes this job fun—you seldom get what you go after, but what you do get is worth getting!

As you know, these studio romances come and go. My own personal slant on this romance on the "Man Power" set is that Dietrich is simply applying realistically and genuinely the old acting adage, "Live the role!"

## The Happy Ending

## Highlights

A SPIRITED and whimsical original story formerly called "Miss Wheelwright Discovers America" is being brought to the screen by Warner Brothers as "Million Dollar Baby." One evidence that the film story is spirited is that Priscilla Lane, who in previous pictures has delivered her lines at the rate of one hundred words a minute, in this picture rattled them off at double that speed according to stop-watches. In this picture, too, Priscilla sports her most expensive screen wardrobe—eighteen changes, valued at \$7,500 exclusive of a mink coat. Ronald Reagan gets his biggest role to date, winning Priscilla Lane from Jeffrey Lynn, tough competition on or off the screen. Veteran May Robson celebrated her fifty-eighth year in show business the day the film began. She has one of her best comedy parts. Charles Ray, silent-film matinee idol, chalks up another role on the comeback trail. Nan Wynn, radio and night-club songstress, does some of the kind of torrid torch-singing that won her a long-term contract. Jean Ames, discovered in a Hollywood Boulevard dress-shop, makes her screen debut as a salesgirl. Most novel sidelight during the filming of the picture was this: Priscilla Lane and Ronald Reagan did kissing scenes one whole day. The next day they couldn't work at all. Priscilla had swollen lips and Ronald a stiff neck. Proving that even in Hollywood there can be too much of a good thing!

# Recommended: "A Woman's Face"

**Highlights** JOAN CRAWFORD returns to the screen for the first time in a year in M-G-M's "A Woman's Face." And through at least part of the story it is a different face from the beautiful features Joan Crawford fans are accustomed to seeing. For the first time in her career, Joan wears a disfiguring make-up in her role as a blackmailer with a scarred face. But that's only in the earlier sequences. Later in the film the famous Crawford countenance emerges in all its loveliness. This picture furnishes Joan a different type of part, too—with a very powerful role—in this psychological melodrama with a tender romantic theme. For the first time since "The Gorgeous Hussy," Melvyn Douglas is teamed with Joan. Conrad Veidt again plays a villain, but one whose crimes are committed with éclat. Osa Massen, the Swedish actress who captured attention in "Honeymoon in Bali"; Albert Basserman, memorable in "Foreign Correspondent"; Marjorie Main, who appeared with Miss Crawford in "The Women," and well-known character actor Donald Meek are supporting players. Sweden is the locale of the picture. Uniquely, the entire film takes place in a courtroom during a trial for murder, and the story is unfolded in flash-backs as the witnesses testify. In addition to intense drama, there are picturesque scenes, including a Swedish dance, a sleigh-race and skiing action. "A Woman's Face" is one of Joan's best.

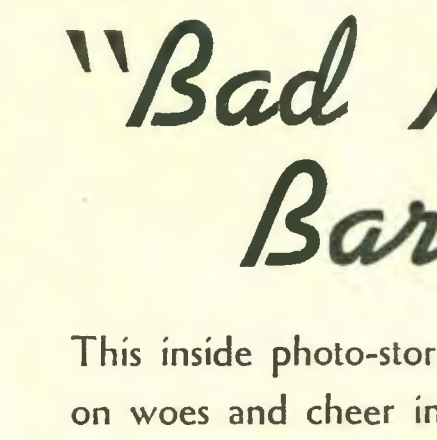

# Movie-Radio Guide CRITICS' REPORT

Dear Public:

YOU can put Orson Welles back in moth balls! I have just discovered the Hollywood producer who is coming in contention like Man o' War—lunched with him two days ago as a matter of fact. His name is David Hempstead and for my meager money he is the only producer ever to really talk sense in the presence of this critic. The sense of what the young, lean, tanned Mr. Hempstead had to say was this:

P. T. Barnum insisted that a man who has a fat lady to display when the public wants to see a fat lady is a great showman. When he has a fat lady and the public doesn't want to see a fat lady, he's a bad showman. The problem then, Hempstead says, is to show the public what it wants to see when it wants to see it. Mr. Hempstead certainly did that with "Kitty Foyle," which he produced and Sam Wood directed.

## MOVIE VIEWS by Carl A. Schroeder

Right now this new genius of the movies has a real chore on his hands. RKO-Radio has given him a foreign star by the name

of Michel Morgan and told him to make Michel as great here as she was over there. Hempstead is not going to do it with "legs" publicity but with a picture called "Journey Into Fear," adapted by that master of adaptation and any other writing assignments, Ben Hecht.

"We'll have a new type of hero in this one," Hempstead says. "He'll be a Fred MacMurray type—an 'ordinary man' who gets into the most amazing situations and figures them out logically. I can't fool myself or the public. There are no really new plots. Pictures the public wants to see are those that go out to second base for a unique way of telling the story."

Yes, we said David Hempstead is something new in Hollywood producers—thank heaven!

### "Major Barbara"

Cast: Wendy Hiller, Rex Harrison, Robert Morley, Robert Newton, Emyln Williams, Sybil Thorndike, et al. A Gabriel Pascal production for United Artists release, directed by Pascal, with screen play and dialog by George Bernard Shaw.

IF YOU consider yourself one of the higher brows, "Major Barbara," 1941 Shaw version of George B's 1905 play, is one to sink into your brain. But for the common people the Shavian theme and wit are a bit too, too to break any box-office records.

Wendy Hiller, the heroine of "Pygmalion," does some powerfully good acting and emoting, as do the other members of the cast, and their many varied character portrayals are every one of them excellent. The story, too, starts off interestingly enough, likewise is brilliant in its dialog, of course, but then in the last act it bogs down into some heavy sociological philosophy and satire that is deep, very deep. In fact, too deep.

Briefly, the story tells of a millionaire turned Salvation Army major, and her effort to counteract her munitions-making father's sins by saving the underdog. She learns, just when her illusions have been smashed, that Dad has had and fostered a couple of pretty nice ideals himself. So daughter and papa become neatly reconciled to one another in the end. Because of the modernized version of the original play, one wonders if Shaw wasn't somewhat influenced by the current war to find something decent about a cannon-maker. At least, that thought prevailed as the play unfolded. Interesting is the fact that this movie was made in war-torn England.

VERDICT: "Major Barbara" excels in two departments, acting and dialog. It's worth seeing and hearing just for those. War-hysterical folk who think England has lost the war may get a new shot of courage by witnessing the picture. Its cast made it under fire. —E. P.

### "People vs. Dr. Kildare"

Cast: Lew Ayres, Lionel Barrymore, Laraine Day, Bonita Granville, Alma Kruger, Red Skelton. An M-G-M picture, produced by Carey Wilson and directed by Harold S. Bucquet. Screen play by Willis Goldbeck and Harry Ruskin from an original story by Lawrence P. Bachmann and Max Brand.

ALTHOUGH "The People vs. Dr. Kildare" may or may not be the best of the M-G-M series, it keeps movie-goers on the edge of their seats through the final scene, holding them in suspense until the climax is reached.

The plot centers around Bonita Granville, a young professional ice-skater, who is critically injured in an automobile accident and later brings a one-hundred-thousand-dollar malpractice suit against young Dr. Kildare (Lew Ayres); Mary Lamont, his nurse-sweetheart (Laraine Day); Dr. Gillespie (Lionel Barrymore), the gruff but kindly head of the hospital.

When Miss Granville recovers from an accident after being treated by Dr. Kildare she learns she has a paralyzed leg. Her career ruined as an ice-skater, she brings suit against the doctor and his associates. With circumstantial evidence against the youthful M. D., the jury returns a verdict of guilty. After much research Ayres and Barrymore discover a spinal growth and not the operation is responsible for the paralysis. Miss Granville is cured and Dr. Kildare and his associates are cleared.

Lew Ayres, Lionel Barrymore and Laraine Day turn in their usual excellent performances. Bonita Granville, as the patient, is outstanding, gives great promise for future dramatic roles.

VERDICT: The picture will take a powerful hold on the movie-goer and will not let go until the dramatic climax which, proverbially speaking, gives him a good thump on the chest and pushes him back in his chair. It's good, but definitely! —I. J.

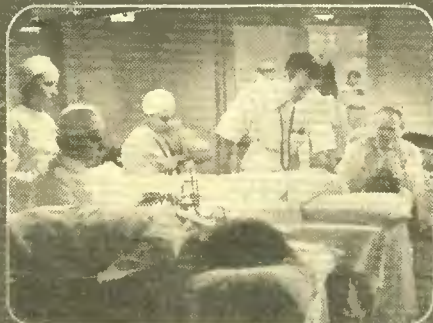

## Today in Radio

ASCAP and MBS agree; Alec Templeton case is settled; "First Nighter" to stay on throughout the summer season

### GENERAL

#### Music Peace in Sight

NEW YORK.—This summer may see ASCAP music returning to the airwaves if an agreement reached between the heads of the Mutual Broadcasting System and ASCAP officials is approved by a majority of the station members of MBS. The new agreement will permit stations to contract for ASCAP music up until January, 1950, thus assuring nearly a decade of peace in music-radio relations. Negotiations with NBC and CBS for the return of ASCAP music to their networks are still in progress.

#### Bergen Dedicates Airport

HOLLYWOOD.—Edgar Bergen took time off from his May 4 program to stage a gala dedication of his commercial airport at Montebello, Calif., which he bought to provide an instrument flying school for worthy young pilots without funds.

#### Hope Tour Delayed

HOLLYWOOD.—Bob Hope's planned

tour of Army camps and eastern appearances must wait. New Paramount picture commitments will keep him here for several months. One new movie deal will cast him as co-star with Jack Benny in their first picture together, entitled "We Want a Girl Friend."

#### Draft Gets Dame Fortune

NEW YORK.—Jack Leonard, CBS singer who earned his own spot on the air after becoming a hit as vocalist with Tommy Dorsey's band, goes into the army May 26. His induction comes just as he was beginning a stretch of good fortune. He was screen-tested by 20th Century-Fox the first week in May, began an engagement at the Paramount Theater in New York the following week.

#### Templeton Suit Settled

CHICAGO.—Alec Templeton's suit against his parents over the income the blind pianist has earned the past few years while his finances were managed by the elder Templetons has been settled out of court.

### SIDELIGHTS

#### "Breakfast Club" Unity

CHICAGO.—The same day Don McNeill and the "Breakfast Club" received their Star of Stars awards they got additional evidence of their popularity—and contributed to national unity! That same day McNeill, Jack Baker, Evelyn Lynne and the Escorts and Betty journeyed to Topeka, Kansas, to help entertain at a Jackson Day dinner. NBC station WREN invited "Breakfast Clubbers" to meet the stars at train time if they were going to attend the banquet. They didn't expect to have the railway station jammed with 5,000 fans. Nor did officials anticipate more than half the 1,700 \$25-a-plate guests—including Democrats and Republicans, from five states.

#### Letter from Bea Lillie

HOLLYWOOD.—Bea Lillie, English comedienne, wrote her friend Hedda Hopper from England. It read in part: "Seems I've been all over England doing bits of entertaining. I've had several offers from New York, but, you see, my son Bobbie is holding me back. I don't want to leave him. Bobbie is fifteen, and he looked so wonderfully young in his uniform it breaks my heart. He'll be going to sea in April for three months. All our windows, doors, etc., have been blown out and been replaced. After three

times they stay out. Mother's house looks perfectly silly with the porch blown entirely off. Please give all my friends my love, and God bless you."

#### Daylight Time Casualty

HOLLYWOOD.—The time was ticking off fast at the West Coast repeat broadcast of Tony Martin's program, and no Dave Rose was on hand. Another musician took up the baton, started the show. Rose dashed breathlessly into the studio. He confessed later he had forgotten the time change, was talking to Judy Garland on the phone when she asked, "What time is your broadcast tonight?" He didn't answer, just hung up and dashed for the studio!

## RADIO VIEWS

LAST January when listeners began hearing "Jeanie With the Light Brown Hair" every time they turned on their radios, a good many of them came to the conclusion that BMI's effort to replace ASCAP music on the networks had come a cropper. As for ASCAP, its joy over BMI's *faux pas* was unrestrained.

Today, however, a perusal of the list of fifteen leading song hits finds that fourteen of the tunes are BMI's product. BMI seems at last to have hit its real stride.

Last month this unique organization celebrated its first anniversary in the music publishing business and in that connection we have something interesting to report. BMI is now the country's largest music publisher, with a total of 1,165,000 copies of sheet music sold. This does not include the songs of other companies affiliated with BMI.

BMI was founded by a group of broadcasters who resented the virtual monopoly on the performance of popular music held by ASCAP. BMI began business in April, 1940, when it licensed its first song, "We Could Make Such Beautiful Music." Substitute "can" for "could" in that song and you have the BMI executives' frame of mind at the time.

In January, 1941, the major networks pulled all ASCAP music off their chains, leaving the burden of satisfying radio's insatiable demands to BMI. It was a tough spot to put the struggling young organization into and nobody knew it better than they.

But today, thanks to the acquisition of the rights to more than 250,000 musical compositions of every variety, that insatiable demand has been met. And what seems more important to this writer, BMI has been able to grasp and hold the lead in the popular song field.

It is perhaps this ability on the part of BMI to hold the lead in the popular song field which led ASCAP to institute negotiations with the networks for the return of ASCAP's music to the air-waves. In a conference the other day, officials of the Mutual Broadcasting System and ASCAP agreed to terms which will return ASCAP music to Mutual's affiliated stations. MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE hopes that such will be the case and that the other networks will soon come to an agreement with ASCAP.

### PROGRAMS

#### "First Nighter" Stays On

CHICAGO.—The doors of the "Little Theater Off Times Square" will stay open all summer this season. Barbara Luddy and Les Tremayne will continue as co-stars, except for a two-week vacation period for each, during which other dramatic stars will pinch-hit. During Tremayne's vacation in June he and his actress wife will drive to Mt. Rushmore to visit his sculptor-friend, Lincoln Borglum, son of the late Gutzon Borglum.

#### "College Humor" Premiere

CHICAGO.—"College Humor," cigarette-sponsored, breezed jauntily and appealingly onto the air-waves April 29, its collegiate angle broad enough to furnish entertainment for all ages. The premiere proved it a program designed for the attending audience as well as listeners, eliciting spontaneous rooting without coaxing and thus contributing to a peppy atmosphere. The cast goes collegiate in costume. Pen-nants decorate the auditorium. Comedians Marlin Hurt and Linn Borden (in World War I uniform), emcee Tom Wallace, and skit-actors played well to the audience, before and during the program. 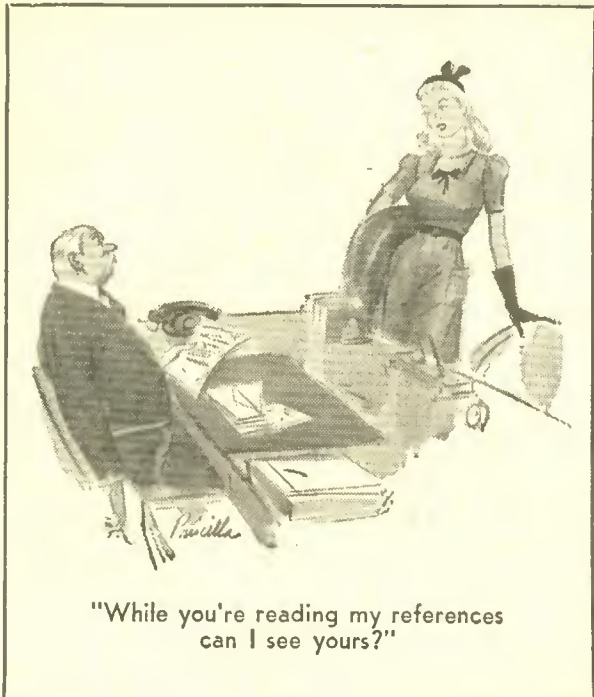

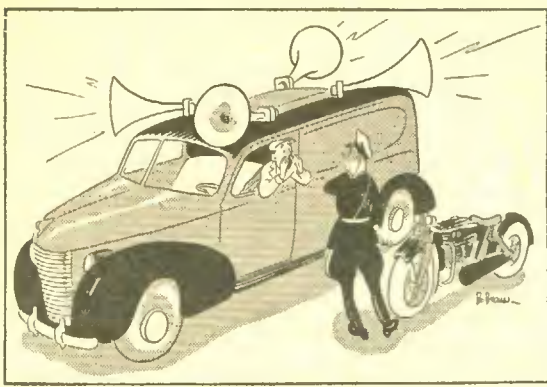

THE holy war is on. Starting with more or less local disturbances between Arab and British troops at Habbaniyah, near Bagdad, Iraq, this latest phase of the war—carefully planned for months by Nazi agents working secretly among the Arabs—threatens to spread throughout the entire Arabic populations of Turkey, Syria, Lebanon, Palestine, Egypt, Saudi-Arabia, Iran and Iraq. To get an accurate picture of just what is going on in this part of the world is not going to be easy. There are a few short-wave stations scattered throughout this vast territory but they are rarely heard in North America, with the exception of the Turkish radio at Ankara, and the British-Marconi commercial station at Cairo, Egypt.

"Radio Ankara," the 20,000-watt station of the Turkish government at Ankara, operates on two frequencies, TAP (9.465) and TAQ (15.195). TAP broadcasts daily from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., occasionally to 5:00 p.m. EDT. These hours are unfavorable for reception in the United States. TAQ, according to reports, is being heard in eastern North America at present from approximately 7:00 to 8:00 a.m. EDT, with news in English given at 7:15 a.m. EDT. TAP is usually employed in the pick-ups for American network programs from Ankara. "Radio Ankara" could put excellent signals into North America providing the proper frequencies and hours for transmission were observed.

The Cairo, Egypt, short-wave station is used primarily for telephonic communication with London and other outside points, its broadcasting activities consisting exclusively of an Arabic program for local reception, radiated daily from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. EDT, over SUX (7.865), and an Italian news bulletin radiated from 1:50 to 2:10 p.m. EDT, over SUV (10.05). This newscast is occasionally heard

in this country. Using beam aerials directional on North America, SUX and SUV are used for Cairo relays to American networks. Reception is often excellent over SUV.

Information concerning radio facilities in Iraq is somewhat meager. The largest short-wave transmitter in the country is (or was, as it may have been bombed or captured by enemy forces by now) located at the Bagdad airport. According to B. E. Zeki, the engineer in charge of Iraq state broadcasting, the Bagdad programs are (or were) being broadcast daily from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. EDT, on frequencies of 7.08 and 9.78 megs. The latter frequency has been picked up a few times in this country but most of the news from Iraq is received in Egypt or Turkey and then relayed over the stations of those countries.

In Iran there are two short-wave transmitters located at the capital, Teheran. The more powerful of these has a power of 14,000 watts and operates on two frequencies, namely, EQB (6.155) or EQC (9.68). Regular programs are sent out daily from 9:45 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. EDT, over one of the above frequencies. Both EQB and EQC have been heard in this country between the hours of 9:45 and 11:45 a.m. EDT. EQC is probably being used for this transmission at present.

In the republic of Lebanon a small 2,000-watt station known as "Radio Levant" (8.03) was recently inaugurated by the Service de la Radiodiffusion, Haut-Commissariat de la Republique Francaise, at Beirut. This station broadcasts a French news bulletin nightly from 1:00 to 1:20 a.m. EDT, which has been picked up a number of times in eastern North America. Most of the news concerning Syria and Lebanon published in the newspapers originates over this small station.

GENERAL NOTES: I recommend that you listen to "Morning in the Mountains," a program that includes Scripture reading, a bit of philosophy, some poetry and a little travel talk thrown in for good measure, which comes over HCJB (12.46), Quito, Ecuador, each morning at 9:00 a.m. EDT. Listeners who report on this program will receive beautiful photographs of the volcanic mountain peaks of Ecuador. The first report brings the album cover and first photo. The other pictures follow at the rate of one each month in return for one report each month. It is refreshing to turn from war and hate to the semi-religious programs of this missionary

station high in the peaks of the Andes Mountains. . . . It will be a bitter disappointment to many listeners who tuned in on the amateur or commercial transmitters of the Byrd Expedition while it was in Antarctica and subsequently sent reception reports to the A.R.R.L., in West Hartford, Conn., to learn that Commander Byrd has pointed out that no verifications of reception will be forthcoming since the government made no appropriation for such purpose. Seems a shame when a few dollars for printing and postage would have made so many listeners happy. There is no doubt that these reports furnished a valuable record for technical reference.

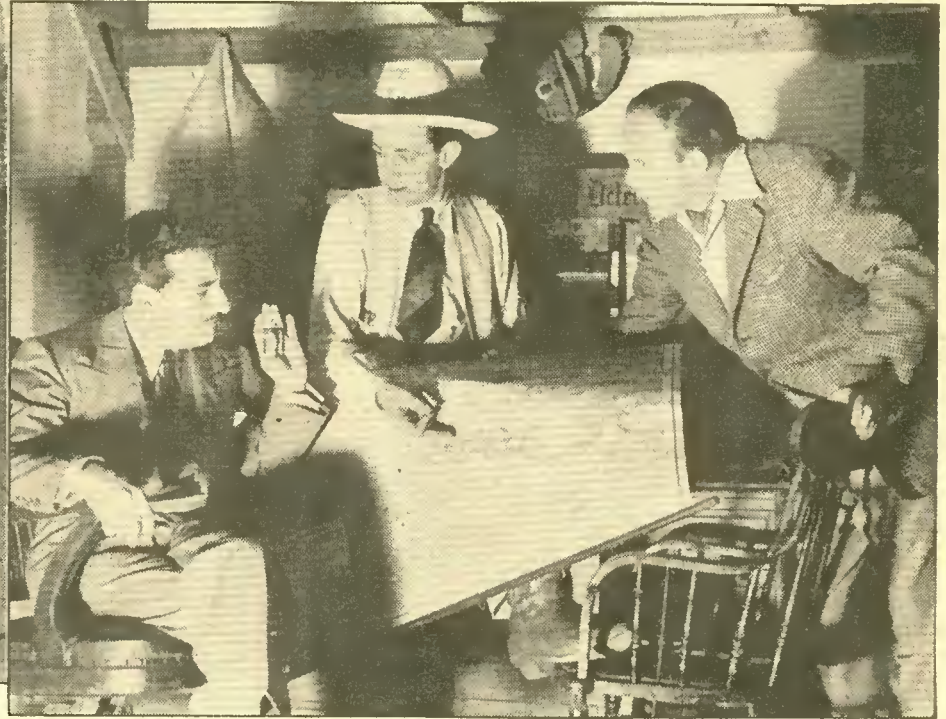

CHARLIE McCARTHY may be about the only animated "prop" and one of the most popular comedy "fixtures" in radio, but he doesn't even see much of his own show until he has lines to speak. Then he is brought from behind a specially constructed screen on the stage of the NBC-Hollywood studio where the "Chase and Sanborn Program" is performed. Ophelia steals the spotlight in the preprogram frolics. Ophelia is another of Bergen's ventriloquial creations, a sassy old dame whose face he draws on his hand, moving his thumb to give the effect of her mouth in action. Usually before each broadcast Ophelia entertains the studio audience for several minutes and gets a big hand. Other behind-the-scenes activity runs along the line of most variety shows. There is an abundance of humorous cutting-up before air-time, and a relaxed, breezy atmosphere during the program. Artists dress informally. One novel piece of stage property is a coffee-table holding coffee in a silex. This for the benefit of any or all of the cast members who desire the coffee as a bracer or relaxer. Special visitors fortunate enough to witness the show's Sunday evening rehearsal often see Jack Benny, whose show goes on a short while before Bergen's, stroll in from his own studio across the hall. The two comedians kid a bit with each other, or more frequently worry together a little about their work, then go their ways to help make the nation forget its worries. —D. M.

FEW listeners who heard Kate Smith's broadcasts from Hollywood could have realized what an elaborate undertaking they involved. A nation had to be traversed.
