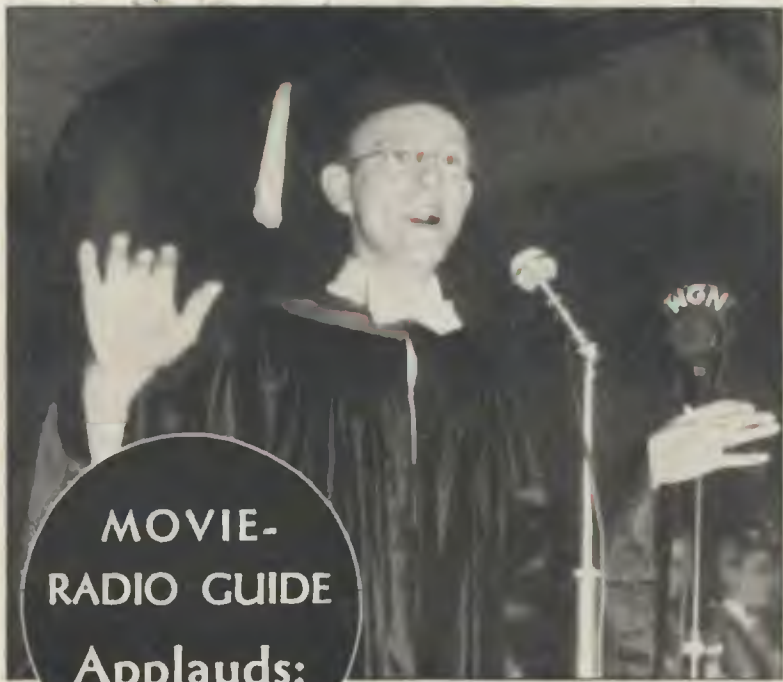

WHAT does it take to make one a star? Talent, undoubtedly. But talent is not everything. Many persons with exceptional talent have failed miserably in the entertainment world. What one needs in addition to talent is showmanship. Showmanship can sometimes make one a star when that person is not too greatly talented. A typical case in point is Kay Kyser. Kay is not a great musician, yet his showmanship has made him one of America's most famous bandleaders. Whenever he goes with his band, records are broken, crowds are thrown into a state of rhapsody. Why? It is because Kay is a superb showman—master of the art of pleasing the public.

Others far more talented in a musical way could take a few lessons from the "O! Professor." What are some of his secrets? The first and foremost principle which Kay follows is "to make the crowd think I'm their friend."

He is forever testing the pulse-beat of the dance and music crowd.

An interesting example of Kyser's superb sense of showmanship was related the other day in *Variety*, a trade publication. Kay had received a letter from a group of women in Manteca, Calif., who wrote, "Many of us have heard you play in the Bal Tabarin in 'Frisco, but we guess you're too big now to bring your band to Manteca."

Kyser showed them how big he was by taking his band to Manteca. He proved that he was big enough to realize that even though he lost a few thousand dollars through having to cancel an engagement in a larger city, he was gaining something far more valuable—the everlasting friendship and regard of an entire community. For that and other exhibitions of showmanship, of which the entertainment world stands in greater need, *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* applauds Kay Kyser!

THIS WEEK: The crying season is on again in Hollywood. Certain movie-makers are complaining that the "box-office" is dropping off seriously, and the suspicion grows that to offset this situation many a little secretary and small-salaried worker may soon be in jeopardy of their jobs. This is ridiculous. Remember how movie-makers were horrified at the loss of the foreign markets? They lost them, yet business was as good as ever for most studios.

The trouble sits right on Hollywood's doorstep, and save for a few outstanding producers eyes are shut to real facts. If the public stays away from pictures, it stays away because pictures lack quality. Hollywood right now is busy remaking old plots simply because those old plots were once "big box-office." Everybody wants the sure thing. And when the latest flop is previewed everybody "covers up." Special exploitation and whirlwind publicity campaigns "hypo" pictures, fool Hollywood into thinking a good job has been done.

It is a fact that there are a handful of producers who haven't had a solid hit picture for years. Yet they go on drawing huge salaries, blaming everything from the economic situation to what's happening on the African front for public apathy.

Hollywood can take a lesson from radio. Every day the airwaves produce dozens of shows—some good, some bad. Entertainment pours out of radio in a perpetual stream. There are no

"big name" producers who take bows among themselves in radio. For the most part, radio producers are young men with average salaries of around \$250. While Hollywood is amazed no end at the genius of Orson Welles with his "Citizen Kane," movie producers haven't awakened to the fact that there are a half-dozen "Orson Welles" in radio who could do better than the film production geni who have shot their bolts.

Who? Irving Reis, who produced the Coast end of Archibald MacLeish's "The States Talking" program in "The Free Company" series and other outstanding programs. He has produced more good entertainment in six months than many a Hollywood genius does in six years. There are others, including Vic Knight, who has been with Eddie Cantor for years.

What's the solution for Hollywood? It doesn't rest in firing the small fry but in cleaning out the deadwood that really is responsible for entertainment the public doesn't want to see. This hasn't been a pleasant editorial to write—we are glad we have it off our collective chests!

NEXT WEEK: Putting out a publication week after week is mostly hard work, but once in a while there is a high moment. Such a thrill comes next week. It's the cover—Sandra (Baby Sandy) Henville and her baby brother in full color—as appealing a picture as ever published. Watch for it!—The Editors.

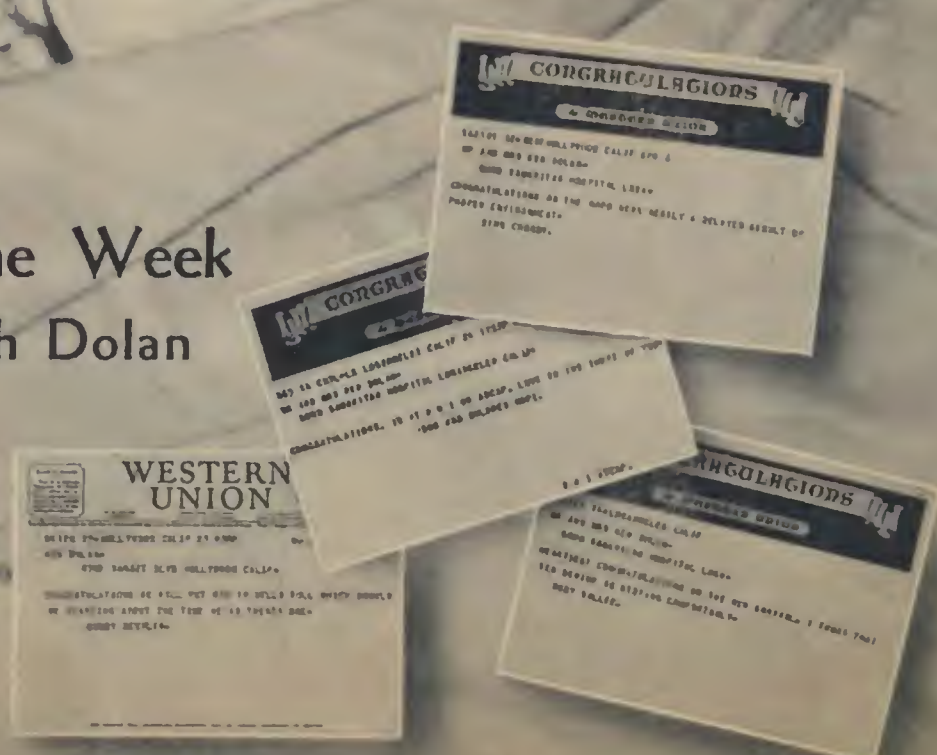

Shirley Ross With Son—John Kenneth Dolan

FIRST PHOTO Rushing in where father was not allowed to tread, Hollywood's ace cameramen, including MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's Bruce Bailey, obtained the first pictures of John Kenneth Dolan, son of actors' agent Ken Dolan and Shirley Ross, lovely star of screen and radio fame. Confronted by the photographers dressed like surgeons, wearing gauze masks and sterilized hospital gowns and caps, seven-day-old John Kenneth, following in his mother's footsteps, posed almost like a veteran. Discussing Papa Dolan, who had been almost constantly at the hospital and who had seen his heir only through the glass window in the nursery of the hospital maternity ward, Shirley Ross said to the cameramen: "My husband would give his right arm to get that close to his young heir. He haunts the hospital, wondering when he will have the first opportunity to hold his son in his arms."

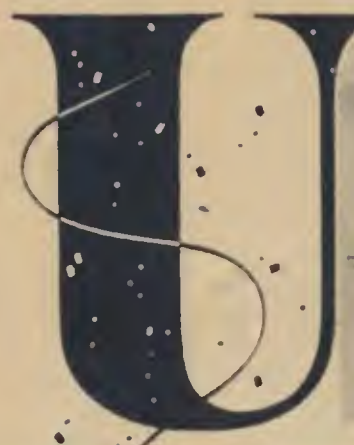

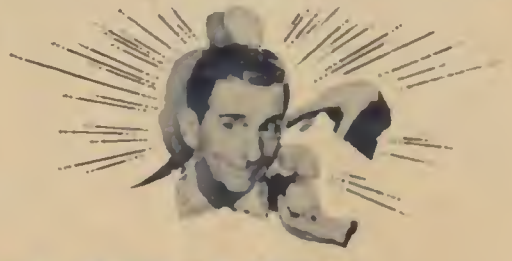
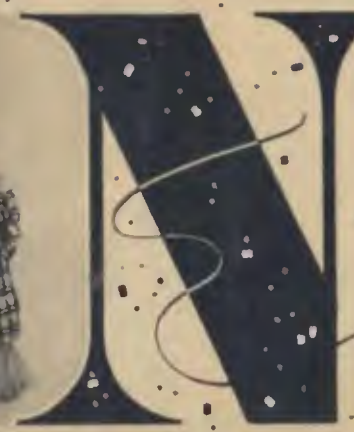

Jackie Cooper - the Wonder Boy

To Feature Desk:

AGREE that Jackie Cooper rates a story after his fine piece in "Ziegfeld Girl" and appreciate the assignment. I've been pretty close to him for the last three years. He was fifteen when we met, a little rough around the edges. He's a much brighter lad than he was then and is twenty pounds heavier. It's always been my theory that there is something wrong with obviously nice boys. Mark Cooper down as the exception. He is a complete gentleman at all times—it doesn't matter whether he's talking to the star in a picture or to a waitress.

The boys at Beverly Hills high

school learned what sort of lad he really was when he went there after he began to "lay an egg" in the awkward age. The principal called his mother, Mrs. Bigelow, after he'd been there a week, suggesting that he be taken out of school. Jackie refused, despite the trouble he was having with the boys who thought their girls liked him too much, stuck it out, and soon the situation was completely reversed with the whole gang hanging around his place.

He lives in the same three-bedroom house in Beverly Hills bought for him at the age of twelve from film earnings. It's not too pretentious, although

it has a swimming-pool in the backyard. I was close to Jackie when he first became interested in girls. He handled himself very well. His family was frightened silly when he had his first crush, and Jackie probably doesn't know to this day that they broke it up. For a time it was a steady thing between Jackie and Judy Garland. Bonita Granville was always around in the background, but he never paid much attention to her. About a year ago Jackie stopped seeing Judy and now it's something between "Coop" and Bonita.

Bonita and Jackie are really a cute couple. For Christmas he gave her a

gold brooch, earrings and a ring—spent about three months of a thirty-five-dollar-a-week allowance buying it for her. Jackie is eighteen now. Chances are he won't marry Bonita for about three years, but it's almost certain—as certain as these things can be—he won't wed anyone else.

There's a personal sincerity about Jackie you find in few people. In his work there is no one outside of Spencer Tracy who matches the depth of his performances. He's a small edition of Tracy with a touch of Gary Cooper; but better than any of that, he's strictly Jackie Cooper and a man to watch.

What promises to be one of the biggest smash hits of the current vogue in service comedies is Paramount's "Caught in the Draft," starring Bob Hope. Because Hope is such a funny fellow, we thought you'd like to hear about the picture direct from him. So here you are.—The Editors.

WERE you ever in the Army? No? Well, you may be any minute, so don't brag. Take me for example. The Army wouldn't, but maybe you will. I was in the "Army" for six weeks making "Caught in the Draft" for Paramount, and maybe you'd like to know what Army life is like. To give you a rough idea:

I started off by being scared to death by a .45 Colt automatic and falling kerplunk right into a slimy, oozy nud puddle right when I was trying to make an impression on Dorothy Lamour, who plays Tony, the daughter of a U. S. Army "mess sergeant" (that's doughboy talk for a colonel).

Then, I think that the "brass hat" (officer) who is visiting my movie set is an extra and toss mud on him to get him into character. . . . I find out my error later when I make another mistake and enlist accidentally in the real Army—and he's my commanding officer! Funny, he never does seem to like me after our first meeting. And he keeps bringing up the issue at various times—such as when he discovers me on guard duty at the nurses' barracks with only underwear on under my overcoat. What's wrong with that?

His daughter Tony (that's Lamour and very tony, too) tries to get me a job driving his car, but the meanie transfers me to a tank corps instead. I still can't see why the Colonel got sore when a blond hitchhiking nurse we had picked up tickled me in the ribs and caused me to smash the tank into his automobile. The Colonel was covered by insurance, wasn't he?

That's when I started my course in learning how to peel potatoes. After two tons of spuds, I finish just in time to get tossed into the guardhouse for wandering off the reservation and into Tony's bedroom. I was only chasing a nightmare, wasn't I? Everything is all right after that, except that I make another slight error in my aim and shoot off the Captain's favorite toe, and later jump from a transport plane without a parachute on.

I turn out to be a very brave guy (who, me?) in the end and I win the Colonel's daughter. But I still can't remember what I did with my uniform breeches and blouse. It was very embarrassing to turn up at my own wedding without them!

So let that be a lesson to you, men. Always salute the colonel. He'll like that.



1. "HOW TO GET IN GOOD with your girl's father. I thought he was an actor and that made him mad. What does that make me?" asks Hope. Well, he wins the girl (Dorothy Lamour) though she escorted him to a real recruiting sergeant instead of a phony, thereby making sure he joined Army

2. "NOT THAT I WANTED to get flat feet to avoid the draft, but I thought I might look better in my wedgies" is Bob's explanation for this one. Additional style note: Since the Army has changed its uniform, Paramount had to employ three shifts of tailors for weeks to make new, correctly styled uniforms

3. "SO ME, WISE GUY, I thought the phony sergeant was at the desk as I 'enlisted.' I gave him the office. He gave me the business and the works." That's how Bob describes the basic plot of "Caught in the Draft," in which he gets into the Army by mistake as the result of a grandstand play to girl friend

5. "SO I SMASHED into the Colonel's automobile while trying to take in the double feature, 'Tanks for the Memory'" is Bob's way of passing this one off. The tank is something Paramount's prop department will remember, too. They couldn't get a real one—and it took them ten days to make one!



4. "WHEREUPON I PEELLED so much I felt like Sally Rand. I'm one of her fans you know," is Hope's cute way of captioning this picture. In the actual filming of the scene, he peeled potatoes for about a half a day, got to be quite an expert at it too, as did Bert (Eddie Bracken), Steve (Lynne Overman, r.)

8. "WHEN THE Colonel caught me guarding his daughter in the bedroom, he didn't think the scene would pass the national board of review," gags Bob. Goings-on in this film wouldn't happen in a real army, but they're fun



9. "I MARRY the Colonel's daughter, which proves to everybody but the Colonel that all's fair in love or war," explains Hope. And that tells how "Caught in the Draft" turns out for Bob Hope!

6. SAYS HOPE: "This picture really belongs in 'Esquire' with a caption reading 'What the well-dressed guard on duty without his pants on will try to get away with.'" In addition to its timeliness, "Caught in the Draft" is the ideal type of picture for Hope because it shows off his fast-talking and wisecracking brand of humor to the best advantage

7. "HERE'S WHERE I ALMOST got 'Caught in the Draft' again," explains Hope, "but my blond nurse-girl friend covered up for me. She had to!" Major Harold E. Hopping, technical advisor, obtained some old maps to be used in the picture. In taking them out of their case, Brig. General Harcourt Hervey's Croix de Guerre, which had been missing for fifteen years, was found!

To cash in quickly on the world's most astounding news event of the year, Warner Bros. have inserted a Rudolph Hess flight to England sequence in that lot's soon-to-be-released picture, "Underground." Movie-Radio Guide CRITICS' REPORT

MOVIE VIEWS by Carl A. Schroeder

WE MAKE no apology for our column this week. It's somewhat on the bitter side. You can blame that on one W. R. Wilkerson, who wrote the following line one day in his trade paper, the *Hollywood Reporter*: "There's something wrong with the picture business at this point," Mr. Wilkerson says. "The box-office has dropped too low to ever refer to it as a slump—it's a washout!"

This Hollywood sage—and he is one—has numerous reasons for his statement. This columnist, purely an observer for the last ten years, can speak only from the customer's side of the matter. Hollywood, we think, is mighty lucky that those who review pictures are as kind as they are. Hollywood needs more than anything else a good strong dose of the truth. Herewith is some of that, so pull up a chair, you movie moguls:

For one thing, you boys seem to think about everything but your business, and that's story-telling. You want a big-name producer, a big-name star, a big publicity campaign, a big premiere. And after you get all done with boiling all these BIG elements together, a pint-sized thirty-five-dollar-a-week critic walks in on your picture, takes one look and mumbles, "It st—ks!" The sad part of it is that the critic usually is right.

Now don't send us messages saying, "If you could do better, why don't you?" We'd take you up on that for \$1,500 a week, but for that \$1,500 you wouldn't have a writer. You'd merely have a man who was so worried about protecting that huge sum he'd borrow every tried and true situation to make sure his picture didn't flop.

BIG money is paid for good stories, but when the manuscript becomes celluloid it is shot through with routine situations, directed, acted in the old pattern. Result: A LITTLE picture.

Perhaps we shouldn't have brought the subject up at all. It only means a huge stack of mail from readers who have been complaining to us for weeks in the same vein. Then we'll go right on as we have before—looking for a good story, finding it in one picture out of five!

During the past couple of years a talented British actress, Anna Neagle, and her producing-directing mentor have been trying to do a Marilyn Miller on the screen. "Alice Blue Gown" was good, "No, No, Nanette" was very bad, but Miss Neagle's latest, "Sunny," will boost the dancing, singing English lady's stock considerably.

Of course, she is helped tremendously by the dancing ability of Ray Bolger, the love-scenes and singing of John Carroll, and the comedy of the Hartmans, Edward Everett Horton and others in the supporting cast. But, for all their help, Anna must be given applause for her work in this screen musical. She was applauded by the preview audience, which goes to prove the point.

A big lift will be given the lethargic career of Bolger, too, by this production.

VERDICT: On the RKO lot, Ginger Rogers tired of dancing pictures and went in for heavy drama to win an Academy Award. On the same lot, Anna Neagle has tabbed such dramatic successes as *Queen Victoria* to win laurels as a singing dancer. That's Hollywood. This is a good picture.—C. S.

"Too Many Blondes"

I wanted and all your friends wanted you to be good, for you are a swell person, we all agree. So naturally we were pulling for you.

But the story, budget and what-not let us down. It wasn't a bad picture, nor was it good. It was so-so, and mediocrity is one thing I know you don't like. To be a good actor, I know, is one of your fondest ambitions. So cheer up. I think you were a much better actor this trip than your last several times to the screen.

For the answer, watch your radio playmate, John Barrymore. Never in John's life has anyone taken a scene away from him. You can be just as good. I know you will be eventually, because a Rudy Vallee is a perfectionist, and a perfectionist just keeps on going until he is tops.

VERDICT: This little comedy has one virtue—it only lasts one hour. Vallee gets in some very good singing, and the trio has Martha Tilton doubling for Helen Parrish for harmony. It's strictly light fare, okay for the family, but not a rave. —E. P.

RADIO VIEWS

by Martin Lewis

A SHORT time ago we had occasion to drop into a studio in NBC's New York headquarters, where we found a number of small children sitting around a table with earphones clamped to their ears. They were laughing and talking animatedly. Suddenly their voices were stilled. Announcer Ben Grauer was saying, "Come in, London."

For a moment thereafter there was an interval of silence, and then a thin eight-year-old boy, his voice tight with excitement, cried into the microphone, "Hello, Mummy . . . hello, Pops . . . This is David in America."

From across the sea came back the reply, "David, my child! It's good to hear you, son!"

You can imagine just how good the sound of that child's voice made the mother in London feel. Standing there in the studio, listening to the exchanges of "cheerios" and halting, heartfelt greetings, we suddenly realized that in making possible a momentary reunion of these British child refugees with their parents back home, radio was indeed playing a Good Samaritan role.

There have been more than a dozen of these broadcasts since they were begun last October. Through them more than 150 children have been able to speak with their parents. Another of these heart-throbbing conversations will take place June 1 at 1:00 p.m. EDT. If you haven't as yet heard one, then tune in at that time. It will be an experience that you will not easily forget.

What do the kiddies and their fathers and mothers talk about when they converse with one another? The war? Its hardships? Not at all. On the contrary, the conversations are about ordinary things—what the children are doing in their new-found homes, things about their old homes—their dogs, kittens, pet turtles, aunts, uncles,

cousins left behind . . . school, old playmates—familiar things, the mention of which tightens the throats of both parent and child.

Some of the children request that their toys be sent to them. One boy asked for his bike. Another said, "Daddy, you might send me my cricket bat, because there is a cricket club in New York and I am going to have a knock at the net sometime."

To us their accents are definitely British, but to the parents it appears that the children are acquiring Ameri-

can accents. An Americanism frequently used by the children is the word "Okay."

In another of the broadcasts a father couldn't believe it was his son talking. But he had a way of finding out.

"Snort, Allan," he said. "Snort like a pig—you know, like you used to."

A not so amusing incident occurred, however, when a mother in speaking to her daughter remarked that she had forgotten and had set a plate for her at the dinner table.

Back in the New York studio a little girl blinked hard and exclaimed, "Oh, Mummy . . . dear Mummy!"

That over-the-sea broadcast left your reporter with a terrific lump in the throat.

No Government Control

St. Louis, Mo.—"Neither the government nor two or three private groups shall control broadcasting in this country," said FCC chairman James L. Fly in assuring the National Broadcasting Company that the Federal Communications Commission's recent order to dispose of one of the two NBC networks did not presage taking over of radio by the government. He added: "There is no present

For the baby these sounds will probably be just customary noises, like the sound of the wind in the trees and the surf on the shore . . ." The new-born baby that MacVane was referring to was his own. It was born in the midst of a London air raid.

A guide for listeners who love great music

MUSIC NOTES: Another of radio's tributes to the National Federation of Music Clubs, which meets in Los Angeles June 12, will take place this Saturday over NBC. The program will begin with songs by Martha Tilson, winner of the Federation's Young Artists contest in 1937. Following Miss Tilson will be the Eastman School Orchestra, under the direction of Dr. Howard Hanson. Edwin McArthur, brilliant American conductor, will conduct the NBC Symphony Orchestra Saturday evening in six movements of Handel's "Water Music." In connection with "Water Music," it is interesting to note that for many years it was believed that the composition was written for the purpose of appeasing the wrath of George I, King of England, which had been evoked when the King permitted Handel to visit England—George having been at that time Elector of Hanover. Later he succeeded to the English throne. . . . Sir Thomas Beecham, conductor, will probably make his last appearance of the year on an American podium this Sunday when he conducts the CBS Symphony Orchestra. He is planning to return to London in July, although his orchestra has been called to the colors. It is understood, however, that the authorities have cooperated with him by stationing the players near places where they can be available for concerts. . . . A spring and summer season of chamber music by the Radio City Music Hall String Quartet (with Jacques Gasselin as first violinist and the Music Hall String Symphony, under the direction of Maurice Baron) will feature lesser-known works for chamber music ensembles, including a number of compositions by contemporary composers, both of the U. S. and Latin American countries. . . . Francis White, soprano, returns to "The Telephone Hour" Monday night, following a two week leave of absence, during which her place was taken by Virginia Hood and Helen Jepson, respectively.

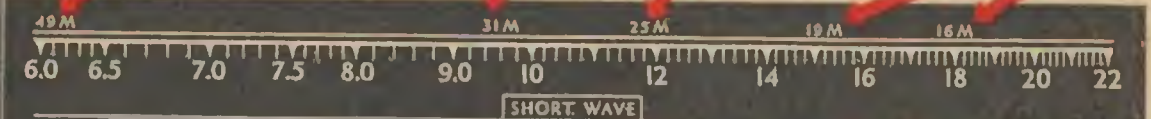

Read this carefully—then sit down and tune in any foreign short-wave station for the latest war news!

Look at your radio, Mr. and Mrs. Listener! Has it a short-wave band? Do you ever use it? Or are you the kind of person to whom short-wave tuning is complicated and difficult?

If you are that type of person, it's time to wake up. All over the world events of signal importance are occurring. A titanic struggle, which may become our own battle in time, is being waged. As the owner of a short-wave radio you are privileged to get first-hand information of that struggle. All you have to do to have a ringside seat in every theater of war is to learn to use the short-wave band on your radio!—The Editors.

NATURALLY foreign stations do broadcast in foreign languages. They also broadcast in English. All leading world stations broadcast regular daily transmissions to North America. If you want to hear Jack Benny, you must know what time he comes on and over what station. By the same token you must learn, for example, that London broadcasts to us nightly from 6:20 p.m. to 12:45 a.m. EDT, that Berlin broadcasts from 5:50 p.m. to 12:00 midnight EDT.

What are called short waves cover a lot of territory and include many types of service other than broadcasting of programs. There are police, aircraft, amateur, telephone, television stations, and many other kinds. Broadcast stations can be found on, and only on, certain little spots on the short-wave band. For sake of easy identification these spots are known as the 16-meter band, the 19-meter band, the 25-meter band, the 31-meter band and the 49-meter band. Your short-wave band, or bands, will be divided off into divisions similar to inch marks on a ruler. The main division marks will bear numbers—6, 7, 8, 9, and so on, probably up to 18 or 20. Each of these numbers indicates the frequency in megs (megacycles); for example, 6 would be 6 megs, 7 would stand for 7 megs, and so on. In *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* the station's frequency is always given in megs, as GSD (11.75), which simply means that GSD is operating on 11.75 megs, or half-way between 11½ and 12 megs on the dial. The 16-meter band will be found near 18 megs on your dial; the 19-meter band will be found near 15 megs; the 25-meter band will be found near 12 megs; the 31-meter band between 9 and 10 megs and the 49-meter band near 6 megs on the dial. These various bands may be indicated as little heavy lines on your dial, indicated as 49 M (49-meter band), 31 M, 25 M, 19 M and 16 M.

When you have turned onto the short-wave band and have learned that short-wave broadcast stations are

grouped in small isolated bands, you will want to know what band to turn to for best reception. This will depend entirely upon the time of day and upon the season of the year. For this time of year use this guide:

Assume that you are on short wave and have now selected the proper band, depending upon the time of day. Next refer to the chart on this page which is a "Guide for Tuning in Leading War Stations." Refer in the chart to the band you are on and then plunge right in and try your luck by tuning slowly across the band and picking out the loudest station that is broadcasting in English. Hold onto it until you have definitely identified it. It will probably be one of the stations given in the chart, but if it isn't, remember its location and try again. You will soon find one of the leading stations given in the chart. Suppose you are on the 25-meter band and you find that your station is GSD (11.75), London. This is in the chart and you will note that DJD (11.77), Berlin, is slightly above in frequency. Move your dial just a hair and you will have DJD, Berlin; just a little more in the same direction and you will have 2RO4 (11.81), Rome. See how easy it is!

There are also certain peculiarities about each foreign station that help in identifying it. For example, the Rome stations use a twittering bird signal before each program starts and sometimes between items in the program. The German stations use a distinctive music-box melody, which is repeated over and over.

If you don't feel wholly satisfied with your first session on short waves, don't give up in disgust. You may have been unlucky enough to have picked out one of those rare periods when foreign reception is poor. Once you have tasted the first thrills of foreign reception, however, you will want to try for other and more distant stations. Follow the short-wave department in *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* and soon you will be expertly twirling the dial from Berlin to Tokyo, and from Havana to London, with ease!

Paley Award Goes to Kansas Amateur

Marshall H. Ensor (W9BSP), forty-one-year-old radio amateur of Olathe, Kansas, has been chosen for the William S. Paley Amateur Radio Award for 1940. Ensor will fly to New York for a presentation luncheon at the Waldorf-Astoria June 2, where Mr. Paley, president of CBS, will make the award of the trophy.

Ensor was chosen by the judges because of his service to the nation in voluntarily conducting courses in the fundamentals of radio over his own station, W9BSP, over a period of ten years. During this time he has given code-practice lessons on the air to thousands of young men and women, enabling them to pass their examinations for amateur radio licenses.

Schedule of Dakar Station

Dakar, important seaport of Senegal, French West Africa, is in the news again. According to information received from the Gouvernement Gen-

eral de L'Afrique Occidentale Française, short-wave station FGA, at Dakar, is operating daily from 7:15 to 8:15 a.m. on 6.435 and 13.355, and from 2:15 to 3:15 p.m. CST on 6.435 and 9.41 megs. Transmissions on the 9.41-megs channel have been well received in this country but no reports of reception have come in lately.

General Notes

Programs sponsored by the Iraq government, are broadcast from Baghdad daily from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. CST over short-wave stations Y15KG (7.08) and HNF (9.78). These broadcasts are rarely heard in the United States but are well received in Europe and northern Africa. They remain the

principal source of news concerning the tense situation in Iraq . . . Believed to be the German Freedom Station, illegal transmitter dedicated to anti-Naziism, a German-speaking station on 9.66 megs is being heard daily from 3:00 to 3:30, 5:00 to 5:30 p.m., etc., CST . . . Commercial television has been given the "green light" by the Federal Communications Commission and it will make its nationwide commercial debut on July 1. Certain definite standards relating to picture detail have been set up. The accompanying voice transmissions will be by the new FM radio. Television images are bigger and clearer than they were a year ago and have in fact been refined to the point where they can furnish a really enjoyable home service. Television backers would undoubtedly like to make a big publicity splurge on the coming debut of commercial television but hesitate to play it up too big for fear that sufficient television receivers will not be forthcoming from the manufacturers. Government radio orders are taxing the facilities of all radio plants and they are necessarily given priority. Sponsors in turn will hesitate to expend large sums of money backing the new service if they cannot be assured a reasonably large audience of viewers. Thus it would seem television may be due for another in its long series of setbacks.

TO MASTER CHARLIE McCARTHY, the country's best-known urchin, recently came a signal honor—the mayorship of Los Angeles during a celebration of International Boys Week, when for a day the city government was turned over to a boy mayor, boy sheriff, boy fire chief, boy district attorney and boy judges. But political honors were no novelty to Edgar Bergen's redwood protege. Already he was the world's only international fire chief. He had also served as honorary mayor of San Francisco. Consequently, "Hizzoner" felt quite at ease seated on a soft, padded leather chair before the endless, gleaming conference table at which Los Angeles' Mayor Fletcher Bowron usually conducts the city's affairs. Here, for millions more who have never had the chance to go, *Movie-Radio Guide* offers a photographic visit—and it's free! Although NBC listeners hear only a one-hour broadcast at 9 p.m. EDT, visitors can choose between two two-and-a-half-hour shows, both of which are heard on Chicago's station WLS. They see an actual stage show, presented by performers in costume and with scenery complete down to hayseed and cowbells. Many "Barn Dance" stars have left for other fields—for example, Gene Autry, Lulu Belle and Scotty. Others fill their places—and here are the current hayloft folk for your pleasure!—J. C.


