Another characteristic of Kay's which makes him click is due to the fact that he's always been a doer and not a wishful thinker. Which keeps him always one jump ahead. Proof? When war was declared, the tremendous problem of entertaining thousands of servicemen confronted the Government. But long before that, Kay had been visiting camps and peppering the boys up with his music and fun. And when war was finally declared, Kay went all out for entertainment of servicemen.

Last, but by no means least, Kay Kyser clicks because he is a zealous American patriot who considers it a rare privilege to serve his country both in war and PEACE!

# A Yankee Sub in King Tojo's Court

How Much Damage Have Our Subs Inflicted on Jap Shipping? George Hicks Interviews a Sub Sailor Who Has an Answer to This Burning Question

**W**HILE Axis subs go their marauding way in American waters, what have our undersea boats been doing to harass the enemy? How much damage have our subs inflicted on the shipping of our Nipponese foe?

These questions have been partially answered by recent reports of our sub activities in the Pacific. But these scattering returns seem only to have whetted our appetites for more information, and I decided to find out for myself.

Up to now, my most intimate contacts, as special-feature reporter for the Blue Network, have been with the activities of our submarines in the Atlantic. But I had one splendid source of information regarding the job on Japan that remained to be tapped. And that was my friend, Ensign Samuel Clark. This veteran submarine fighter had just turned in to New London, Conn., where our Navy's submarine base is located, and, as he had seen plenty of action in the Pacific, I knew he would have a story to tell.

Ensign Sam Clark is a southerner—born in Alabama—thirty-three years ago. He's married, and has been in the Navy for twelve years—all of them, up to now—in an enlisted man in the submarine service. Sam Clark is frank and real. If what he says sometimes makes you wince, it's the truth—untampered.

He was on his way to Pearl Harbor—when the war began. He was chief

electrician's mate on the sub. Also gun-pointer. When a sub comes up to do battle with its gun, all the gun crew rushes on deck. But the first man up must be the gun-pointer. He's the man who aims the gun.

They were casing along toward Hawaii after leaving Mare Island, California, where they'd had some new equipment installed. The men were doing their ordinary routine, peace-time jobs. "When," Sam said, "we received this order: STAND BY TO ATTACK ALL ENEMY SHIPS.

"At first," Sam said, "the men thought this was a maneuver." But the message ended: THIS IS NOT A DRILL. "We rigged for diving. As we got nearer to Hawaii, we crash-dived. We stayed down. Then the captain came below and said, 'Well, how does it feel to be shot at for the first time?' We didn't understand at first. Then he said we'd just been dived on, and strafed, by a Jap plane." I asked Sam then if his sub went on into Pearl Harbor. He said no.

Their next order was to search out enemy ships. "We were away for two days. The time when we returned, we went right into Pearl Harbor. The Arizona was still burning. Everything was smashed and broken. And, in the streets of Honolulu, I saw bombed automobiles, with upholstery splattered by American blood."

His wife came to see him—that first day—for forty-five minutes. Next day he got an hour off—to go home. Three

days later they left for their first patrol. "A patrol" means you go out to sink enemy ships.

"Where did you go on your first patrol?" I asked him.

"To Tokyo Bay," he answered. "We operated back and forth before the mouth of the bay, and up the coast."

"That's a long trip. You carry enough supplies for such a long time?" "Oh, sure," Sam said. "Plenty of food. The boat's very comfortable. But it gets monotonous. You lose track of time. You don't know whether it's Sunday or Friday—and no one gives a damn."

"On our first patrol I think we lost a little weight. Some of the men grew beards. We'd sleep always in our clothes. Well, there's quite a bit of suspense to it. You're standing by to dive at any time. I think the first trip's the hardest—because you don't know what to expect. My battle station—submerged—was in the conning-tower with the captain, manning the torpedo firing-board. Also raising and lowering the captain's periscope. On the surface, I was the gun-pointer."

"What happened off Tokyo?" I said.

"We sank three big ones. We were the first sub out there. The first to use our deck gun, too. We used to listen to their radio a lot—to Tokyo Bay, they called her—she spoke in English. At first she said American submarines were 'mere toys' and that the Japanese navy could easily dispose of them. Then, after we sank a few ships, she began to call us, 'the black panther of the Pacific,' and other such names. We got quite a kick out of Tokyo Bay."

I asked him how they got the three. Sam said one was at night. "Running on the surface, we spotted this large freighter. We didn't know if she was a transport or not. We torpedoed her. A few nights later we got another. Then we changed position and, one morning, we spotted two large ships. We got one, but the second ran away."

"Were they attacking you—at any time—off Tokyo?" I asked.

"No," he said, "but this destroyer was looking for us all around. We kept

# IN WHICH WE SERVE

Noel Coward's Epic Story of a Ship Is Even Greater Than His Film "Cavalcade"

Noel Coward in his role of Captain Kinross for the picture "In Which We Serve"



THIS latest film of Noel Coward's, in which he takes the fivefold part of author, producer, director, composer and actor, is one of the greatest war dramas yet to appear. The theme is so profound and unique in its treatment, and Coward has filled it so full of flashes from living experience, that the story cannot be expressed except as he has expressed it—on the screen.

With utter simplicity the picture portrays all Britain at war, shown by flashbacks of a chief petty officer and his philandering, a seaman who meets a girl on a tram and marries her, and the captain who says that he wants "a happy ship." All this against naval battle backgrounds.

Significant is the fact that Coward took the title for the picture, "In Which We Serve," from the prayer which captains of British warships read to their men: "... receive into Thy almighty and most gracious protection the persons of us Thy servants and the fleet in which we serve."

# JOHN CHARLES THOMAS BEGINS NEW SUNDAY SERIES OVER NBC JANUARY 10

Toscanini Continues Brahms Cycle Sun., NBC; Mitropoulos Directs New York Philharmonic, Offers Schubert, Brahms Symphonies Sun., CBS

JOHANNES BRAHMS, who seems to be having a run of popularity second only to that of Tchaikovsky these days, took a long time to make the grade with the general public. Now, besides, his name stands side by side with those of Bach and Beethoven as one of the greatest composers of all time.

It was Robert Schumann, a prophet whose prophecies were seldom fulfilled, who "discovered" Brahms. In an article entitled *New Paths*, which appeared in a Leipzig publication, which he had founded, Robert Schumann first made the big musical world aware of the fact that a genius, or something mighty close to that blessed state, was in the offing. Usually, I steer clear of incorporating long quotations into a story, but this one of Schumann's is revealing and tremendously interesting. This is what he wrote on that eventful day of October 28, 1853:

"Ten years have passed away, almost as many as I formerly devoted to the publication of this paper, since I have allowed myself to raise my voice in a territory so rich in memories. Often, in spite of an overstrained productive activity, I have felt moved to do so; many new and remarkable talents have made their appearance, and a fresh musical power seemed about to reveal itself among the many aspiring artists of the day, even though their compositions were known only to the few. I thought to follow with interest the pathway of these elect, there would, there must, after such promise, suddenly appear one who should utter the highest ideal expression of his time, who should claim Masteiship by no gradual development, but burst upon us fully equipped, as Minerva sprang from the brain of Jupiter.

"And he has come, this chosen youth, over whose cradle the Graces and the Heroes seem to have kept watch. His name is Johannes Brahms; he comes from Hamburg, where he has been working in quiet obscurity, instructed by an excellent, enthusiastic teacher in the most difficult principles of his art, and lately introduced to me by an honored and well-known master [he meant the celebrated Joachim].

"His mere outward appearance assures us that he is one of the elect. Seated at the piano, he disclosed wondrous regions. We were drawn into an enchanted circle. Then came a moment of inspiration which transformed the piano into an orchestra of wailing and jubilant voices. There were so-

natas, or rather veiled symphonies, songs whose poetry revealed itself without the aid of words, while throughout them all ran a vein of deep song melody; several pieces of a half-dramatic character, but of changing form; then sonatas for piano and violin, string quartets, and each one of these creations so different from the last that they appeared to flow from so many separate sources. Then, like an impetuous torrent, he seemed to unite these streams into a foaming waterfall; over the tossing waves the rainbow presently stretches its peaceful arch, while on the banks butterflies flit to and fro, and the nightingale warbles her song.

"Whenever he bends his magic wand toward great works, and the powers of orchestras and chorus lend him their aid, still more ideal glimpses of the ideal world will be revealed to us. May the Highest Genius help him onward! Meanwhile another genius, that of modesty, seems to dwell within him. His comrades greet him at his first step in the world, where wounds may await, but the bay and the laurel also, we welcome this valiant warrior."

Yet with all the interest and encouragement of Schumann and his circle intine, with the enormous success he made in the musical capitals, Brahms did not write his First Symphony until he had gone past his forty-first birthday. One of the reasons he gave for that was, "You do not know how it feels to hear behind you the tramp of a giant like Beethoven." When he did take the plunge he produced a First Symphony of extraordinary worth. Then, it seems, he labored almost feverishly at producing sym-

phonies and other orchestral works.

The "Academic Festival" overture followed in chronological order the Second Symphony. This, in turn, was followed by the "Tragic Overture" and the Third Symphony and, finally, a Fourth. So that in nine years he wrote those masterworks that are the daily bread of concert programs in our time.

Arturo Toscanini, continuing with his Brahms cycle, performs the "Academic Festival" overture and the Fourth Symphony. The archives contain, perhaps, numbers of works inspirational greater than either of these, but none are superior to them in construction, in seriousness of purpose, in a sincere expression of musical ideas.

## Early Schubert

Seven weeks after Franz Schubert's eighteenth birthday the Symphony No. 2, in B flat major, was completed. Not, regrettably, a thoroughly trained composer, Schubert had one of the most divine of melodic gifts. He proceeded, sometimes, by pure instinct, writing works that hold together marvelously, despite their obvious faults of construction. Melody just rushed to his pen-point, to use a figure. He could no more have written an unmelodious composition than he could have tossed off, say, the Chromatic Fantasy and Fugue.

The Second Symphony of Schubert is not a frequently performed work, nor, by the same token, is it totally neglected. The influence of Mozart and Beethoven are strong in it, Mozart noticeable particularly in the theme and variations which comprise the second movement, andante.

(Dimitri Mitropoulos and the Philharmonic Symphony will play the Second Symphony of Schubert, as well as the Third of Brahms in their CBS broadcast on Sunday, January 10.)

## By Request

John Charles Thomas begins a new series of programs over NBC on January 10. His sponsor for these is Westinghouse. The programs will have a concert orchestra under the direction of Mark Warnow, as well as a Lyn Murray chorus.

Mr. Thomas plans to base his program chiefly on selections requested by the listening public. He expects these requests to be varied, as well as valid. In short, he aims to please, but only if it makes for first-class program making. The American baritone has always been noted for the balance and diversity of his presentations. And it isn't likely that he will go erratic in this series. Requests will be given careful attention, but foremost the program's to be the thing.

John Charles Thomas (the Mark Warnow Concert Orchestra and the Lyn Murray Chorus) will be heard over NBC on Sunday afternoons beginning January 10.

## POPULAR MUSIC

AN ACQUAINTANCE of mine made an interesting observation the other day. The acquaintance, a well-known musician, said, "The best American music of our time is being written spontaneously by performers at 'jam sessions.' Its energy and rhythmic variety are not to be dismissed, for they possess the power of immediacy that you almost always find lacking in the works of more formal writers."

Asked just what he meant by immediacy, he replied, "The quick and intimate relationship between the music and the listener. You see," he went on, "these young men who know their jazz, their hot licks, if you prefer, their swing, are at their most creative when they gather together informally, all set to blow and pound out their brains in a 'jam session.'"

"Not too long ago," he continued, "I attended one of these impromptu seances—let me call them that, seances. With the usual camaraderie that always prevails at these things, the musicians started in like friends. They were going to make music—on the spot. Well, they hemmed and hawed musically for a time, then someone got a bright idea, a neatly balanced phrase. And immediately everyone picked it up. They worked together, teamed up on it. Before I knew it, I was listening to some very orderly, purposeful stuff."

"What is important, though, is the fluency and smoothness with which they performed. Of course, most of the music was just rhythm, just percussion. Notes were being played, all right, but they were more beats and accents than they were melodic notes. Harmonies, as you can well imagine, didn't count for too much. They were equal to the occasion, and that was that. But out of many measures—several thousand during the course of the session—there were about a hundred or two that I considered at the time really great music."

"Everything jelled in those passages. The melody was pure melody, the rhythm interesting, the harmonies almost exciting. The musicians had hit a stride at which creation could be possible. I felt then that I had not heard such tingling, rousing music before."

"Looking back on it now, it strikes me that the element of spontaneity had a great deal to do with the worth of those measures. So I said to myself that a composer who is, let's say, a good piano technician, might sit down at his instrument some day and just play, just improvise. Before long ideas would surely come, ideas that he couldn't possibly receive in a stiff or very formal state of being. I think that our so-called serious composers might try it. They couldn't lose anything by it. On the contrary, I think they'd gain a lot."

And so they do, the allies from England and America.

Each Saturday afternoon at 5:30 p.m. (PWT), Betty Rhodes and cadet of the Royal Air Force meet in KJH's Hollywood studio and, with words and ideas exchanged among them, go right after the stealthy, snide word barrage lobbed by the Hitler propaganda agents bent on creating disunity between the Allies.

"Sure, we know what you all mean—that when people have the same aims and ideals, and when they get to know each other, rumor can't break them up. That's why we're so proud of 'This Is the Hour'."

And since the program is presented without fantasy, with the sincerity of the young singer emphasizing the feeling of all who hear it, it's a deadly weapon as well as a half-hour of entertainment. For every second of it is aimed to destroy Hitler's propaganda barrage that would dissolve the strength of the United Nations fighting together all over the world to defeat his vicious program.

# NEW SCHEDULE OF FREE CHINA STATION . . . SOVIETS REVEAL SKI-TANK TACTICS

Fuzzy Wuzzies Receive Christmas Parcels; Schedule of Russia's English Broadcasts; Australia Lifts Ban on Communist Party

## Santa Visits New Guinea Natives

ACCORDING to a letter from ABC correspondent Hayden Lennard "somewhere in New Guinea" broadcast over the Australian short-wave station, Christmas parcels were delivered to native boys who had assisted Australian troops in New Guinea who were sick or wounded. The parcels were provided by the Australian Red Cross out of funds derived from the sale of the poem "Fuzzy Wuzzy Angels of the Owen Stanley Track," written by an Aussie soldier.

Each parcel contained a box of matches, three sticks of tobacco, a package of cigarette papers, two handkerchiefs, a quarter-pound parcel of brown sugar, a piece of soap and a can of condensed milk.

Included in each parcel was a Christmas card carrying in English and native tongue the following words: "New Guinea Boy helped wounded Australian soldier . . . Now Australian men and women say 'Thank you, Native boy, Merry Christmas!'"

## Soviet Skiers Hitch on Tanks

According to a radio dispatch from the central front in Russia, a new winter of war has developed new forms of team work between various arms. For the first time, Soviet skiers are effectively cooperating with tanks in piercing the German defenses on the central front. In some cases the tanks pull the skiers behind them on huge sleds, in others the skiers themselves follow closely in the wake of the tanks. During assaults on strongly fortified centers of resistance, tommy-gunners on skis, clad in white gowns and protected by a mass of anti-tank weapons, infiltrate into the enemy disposition singly and in groups and strike at him from the rear, disorganizing his anti-tank defenses. Simultaneously tanks attack from the front, and in most cases succeed in carrying the enemy positions with few casualties. These groups of skiers cooperating with tanks are also equipped with light trench mortars and machine-guns mounted on sledges. Skiers are also very helpful to tanks in overcoming various obstacles. They fill in anti-tank tracks and clear mine fields.

## Japs Overlook Buried Gold

The Melbourne short-wave station revealed the other morning how G. M. Carr, engineer of the Bulolo Gold Mining Company in New Guinea, saved \$175,000 in gold from the clutches of the Japanese. He said: "When the Japanese landed at Lae and Salamaua I was left behind at Bulolo to carry out demolition work with my own native boys, who were thoroughly trustworthy and efficient. I used 60 cases of gelignite, and destroyed bridges, cranes and all machinery that could be used by the Japanese. We blew holes in the airdrome and set fire in the fuel dumps. The last of the exploding petrol blew me off my feet. About 2:00 a.m. I rolled the gold out of the guardhouse down the steps and

400 yards into the dense jungle, where I buried it in a hole three feet deep beside a tree. About three days after the demolition work I reported to the Army authorities that the gold was safe, as earlier it had been reported missing."

## Shorts From the Short Waves

(Berlin)—British troops in India are suffering badly for lack of quinine, most of which formerly came from Malaya now in Japanese hands. The British have requisitioned all stocks in New Delhi . . . (Rome)—Rome commentators express grave doubts that we are able to turn out ships as fast as we report, unless as one speaker said, they are "made of cardboard" . . . (London)—According to a report from Tokyo, Allied nationals interned in Shanghai received several hundred letters and some Christmas parcels during the holidays . . . (London)—An Italian newspaper complains that the air-raid wardens of Turin quit the city as soon as air-raid alarms are sounded . . . (Vichy Radio)—"The present population of France would be about 80,000,000 instead of little more than half that if the birthrate of 1878 had continued. This is what the Republican regime did for France. Now under the Nazi new order this will all be corrected" . . . (Australian Radio)—Australian troops, as part of their regular military training, are being

taught to find sustenance in the bush, as aborigines do. The new instruction course is designed to make the soldier independent of ordinary supplies if he is cut off or isolated. Troops will learn how to get water from roots of trees and from shells dug from drying mud; that the bark of a certain tree, crushed and thrown into a river, will dope fish and bring them to the surface within an hour; and that onionweed bulbs, thistles, wickity grub and ant eggs can be made palatable. Wickity grubs are large, white wood grubs regarded as aboriginal delicacies. The authorities don't claim that they are satisfying but say they will keep a stranded man alive for weeks . . . (London)—According to Radio Newsreel, the largest and friendliest "army in exile" enjoying the hospitality of Britain is the eager, young and enthusiastic Polish army quartered in Scotland. The armies of Poland in exile rank sixth among the armies of the Allied powers. The one aim of the Polish army is "The shortest way back to Poland" . . . (Melbourne)—The ban on the Communist party and its press has been lifted by the federal government. The Communist Party in Australia was declared an illegal organization by the Menzies government in June, 1940. Announcing the lifting of the ban, Attorney General Dr. H. V. Evatt said the Communists had given satisfactory undertakings of maximum support for the war effort. Dr. Evatt made it clear that the decision evidenced no sympathy by the government with Communist views or actions.

### Tips for Your Lips

"A BEAUTIFUL mouth can make any woman attractive—and any woman can have an attractive mouth!" Wise words indeed, and they come from one of Hollywood's most-famous make-up men. He has taken a man's-eye view of countless feminine faces—he realizes the charm of lovely lips! They're one of the first things a man notices—and nothing is more revolting to the male sex than a helter-skelter lipstick job! So take those words of wisdom to heart—and learn to make the most of your mouth!

Even though very few of us have beautiful mouths to start with, we can make them appear beautiful if we know how. It's easy! Of course, you must choose the right shade of lipstick—but don't stop there. There's many a slip 'twixt the stick and the lip—so be sure you apply it correctly. Then go in for the tricks of the lip trade! However, the old custom of copy-cutting the lip-pattern of your favorite film star is out! So be a rugged individualist when you dress up your mouth! It will pay off in compliments.

Here's the important thing to remember when you select your lipstick: Be sure the color harmonizes! For instance, if you're a blonde with fair skin, don't try the dark, luscious shades that belong to your brunette sister. However, if your skin and eyes are dark, avoid those baby pinks—although they may look perfect on blondes, they're definitely not for you! Above all, blonde, brunette or red-head, choose a color that flatters—it's the first step to beauty.

Maybe you never considered yourself an artist, but just for a minute pretend that you are. In this case, your paint will be a lipstick and your two lips the canvas. For an expert job, go completely artistic and also use a brush—a lipstick brush, of course! Revlon puts out a fine one. First, wipe off every remnant of left-over lipstick, you need a clean slate to work on. Now take a long look into your trusty mirror. Analyze your

mouth—decide whether it is too wide or too narrow, too long or too short. Determine just what should be done to remedy this fault. OF COURSE, you want to be your most beautiful when evening falls, so—Lady, be bold! For the utmost in lip-appeal, use two shades of Dorothy Gray lipstick, your every-day color and a luscious darker shade. Use the deep color on the lip you want to accent—to bring out its lovely curves. And if your mouth is too full, darken the edges all around. If it's too long, apply the night-time shade in the center and blend the lighter color out to the corners. Don't be afraid to experiment, just try everything on your faithful mirror beforehand.

Now that you've mastered the fine art of lip loveliness, you're set! You know that your mouth is beautiful, and that does as much for your private morale as a brand-new hat! But there's one thing more—the most important beauty rule of all! Remember, no matter how you've restyled your lips, narrow or full, rosy pink or deep garnet, they'll be most appealing if you keep the corners turned up!

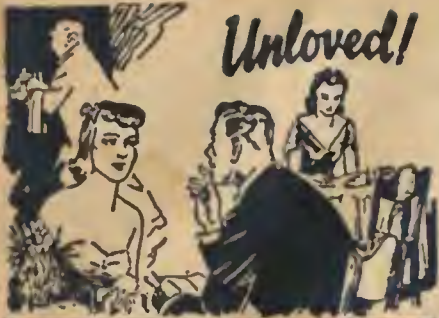

**Entertain a Service Man!**

"ARMY food's swell, but there's nothing like Mom's cooking! Boy, what I wouldn't do for a piece of her chocolate cake right now!" There's a tribute for the fine art of American home cooking, and one that's echoed over and over in Army camps, especially when Sunday dinner-time rolls around. Remember how those boys of ours used to hang around the kitchen of a Sunday morning, watching what went on, taking licks of frosting and getting in the way? Yes, eating is one of their favorite indoor sports—and your cooking is probably one of the things they're fighting for!

Maybe your particular boy is too far away to get home right now. So this Sunday, instead of leaving his place at the table empty, invite a military man—soldier, sailor or marine—to share that roast chicken with you and the family. If there's an Army post near by, get in touch with them. Perhaps you live within easy distance of one of the Navy yards or maybe a Marine base. No matter where, you'll find at least one youngster, far away from home and just a little lonely—one who would love one of your home-cooked meals and a chance to talk to folks like the folks he left back home.

So choose your menu carefully—this should be a gala occasion! Try to include all the touches that military chefs must omit when an entire regiment is being fed. Our boys miss those little "extras" even though they may not admit it! Here's a meal to bring joy to any man's heart:

Set the table with one of your nicest cloths and a gay center-piece. Use your best silver and glassware. And when you bring on the dinner, watch that boy's face. His expression will more than thank you!

Then, when he's had all the "seconds" he can possibly hold, serve dessert in the living-room. Coffee and an easy chair are a combination he doesn't often find in the service! As for entertaining him, you won't find that hard at all! He'll make a bee-line for the Sunday paper to catch up on his favorite funnies. Turn on the radio, let him find his own program, and later on, if he hasn't had too much drilling during the week, maybe he'd like to stroll around and see the neighborhood. And when he leaves, pack up a little of that chocolate cake—it won't last long once he gets back to camp, but while it does . . . U-M-M! Try these recipes:

**Roast Chicken with Potato Stuffing**

- 2 cups potatoes, cooked, riced
- 3 tablespoons melted butter
- 2 tablespoons parsley, chopped
- 2 egg yolks, beaten well
- 3 tablespoons cream
- Salt and pepper
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- ½ cup onion, chopped
- 1 tablespoon butter

Combine potatoes, melted butter, salt and pepper to taste, paprika and egg yolks. Beat until well blended.

Put the tablespoon of butter in a frying-pan. Add onion and parsley. Brown. Add to potato mixture. Add cream. This makes three cups of stuffing. Stuff a four and one-half pound chicken and roast (basting frequently with one-half cup butter and one-half cup water) in a medium oven (350 degrees Fahrenheit) for one hour. Serve with giblet gravy.

**Broiled Tomatoes**

Cut tops and bottoms from tomatoes, then cut in two crosswise, leaving half a tomato for each slice. Season with salt and pepper and sprinkle with sugar. Cover each side with fine crumbs. Broil, turning once, until soft, not mushy. These may be fried instead.

**Chocolate Layer Cake**

- 2 cups sifted Swans Down Flour
- 2 teaspoons Calumet Baking Powder
- ½ cup butter or other shortening
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg, unbeaten
- ¾ cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift flour once, measure, add baking-powder and salt, and sift together three times. Cream butter, add sugar gradually and cream together until light and fluffy. Add egg and beat very thoroughly. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in two greased eight-inch layer pans in moderate oven (375 degrees Fahrenheit) twenty to twenty-five minutes. Spread with chocolate frosting and nuts if desired.

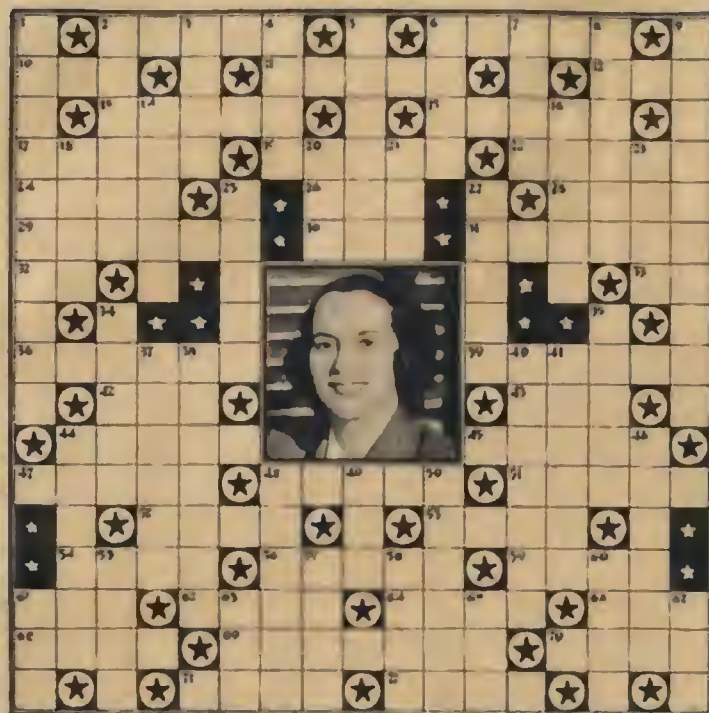

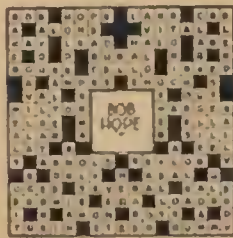

dodging this destroyer for over a week. Our captain—one of the best in the business—is almost entirely bald, really shiny-headed. Well, we'd got down to our last torpedo—our patrol was about over. The captain said, "That destroyer has been in my hair for over a week now. I'm going to get that so-and-so with this last torpedo!" I wanted to say, "What hair, Captain?" but I didn't have the nerve."

"Did you get the destroyer?"

"No, we missed, and that nearly broke our hearts."

They went back then to one of their bases—to Pearl Harbor—for a two-week rest. On their second patrol they went to the Yellow Sea, on the direct sea route between Japan and China.

"Did you get anything on this trip?"

"Yes, and one that was especially good."

"What kind?" I asked.

"I don't know," Sam said. "She was a big one—maybe she was an ammunition ship. I was standing in the conning-tower when we hit her. She exploded. God, what a roar . . ."

"Had the men got over being jittery by now?" I asked him.

"I wouldn't say they ever were jittery," Sam said. "I don't think anybody was scared. They were tense. Especially on the first trip." I asked him what he thought made a good submariner. After twelve years, he seemed to have that pretty clearly in his mind. "He's got to be a fellow who doesn't mind work—there's plenty with such a small crew. He's got to be able to stand close quarters, heat—got to have a good sense of humor—he calm and have common sense. He doesn't have to be any *superman*," added Sam.

Then I wanted to know if the men were glad when they sank an enemy ship. "Yes, they're glad. When they hit one, they cheer, like at a football game. When we missed that destroyer off Tokyo with our last torpedo, some of the men cried," said Sam. "Once, off the coast of Japan, the captain stuck his periscope up, and we were in the midst of fifty-four Jap sailing sampans. I begged the captain to surface and to let me go after them with guns. It would have been like a wolf among sheep. But the captain said it was too risky so near the beach.

"Yes, I'm bloodthirsty," said Sam. "So is the whole crew. One look at that base in Pearl Harbor and you wanted to go fight 'em with a butcher-knife. My conscience hasn't hurt me yet for anything I've done."

They went back to headquarters again. Then they went out on a third patrol . . . off a naval base in Japan. That's all . . . just a naval base—one of the most heavily guarded places anywhere—on the sea. Their prey was to be certain specified ships, which cannot be mentioned. It was big game! They were saving their torpedoes for them. When I asked him if they got any ships—this trip—he said yes, with their deck gun . . . but he wouldn't say about the torpedoes. Maybe they did, I don't know. I do know they tried awfully hard.

The first ship they got with a gun was a large Jap trawler. She was steering an erratic course, so they stayed down all afternoon, watching. "Then the Captain said, 'Now, when we go up, I want you to hit that bridge with the first shot. They have a radio in it . . . and I don't want any messages going out.' We could see the lookout on the bridge," said Sam, "by the periscope. His back was toward us. They had a red Jap ball painted on the side of the bridge. The Captain said, 'I want that first shell—right through that ball!' I wasn't any too sure about this first shot," admitted Sam.

"We 'battle surfaced.' And the first shot tore his bridge off."

"What became of the lookout?" I asked. "He disappeared. He was gone—blown up. The second shell went through their living-quarters. On the third shell, I told the trainer to put the gun on his stack, and put that one right through his engine room. It was live ammunition . . . and she caught on fire."

"On our patrols we got seven of the eight ships we fired on. On the one we missed, we had a large freighter lined up. The firing-ship was broken in the gun. I was pushing the firing-pedal—but nothing happened. The Old Man was shouting, 'Fire . . . fire!' The gunner's mate (he's the one in charge of the gun's upkeep) broke right down crying."

"Why didn't you torpedo this ship if she was a big one?" I asked him.

"We were saving our torpedoes . . . for a special job. Then several nights later, running on the surface, we saw five large trawlers. The Skipper said, 'Now I want you to get one with

the first shot . . . and the next one with another shot, before they scatter and you lose them in the gunflash.' "We got them. The first blew up. On the next the first shell tore off the stern. We put the next shell in the bottom."

I asked Sam Clark how it felt to line up a live, human target. It wasn't a very pretty question. He said it as simply as I asked. He said it was a hell of a thrill. "You knew in one way," he said, "that those few minutes were the answer to all the training you'd been through." Then he told of the time they were making an approach on what they thought was a merchant ship. They couldn't make out her lines clearly because of the darkness. She proved to be a destroyer. And then, in turn, three other destroyers were making an approach behind the submarine.

They crash-dived. Then "rigged for depth charges." "What does that mean," I asked. "Rigged for depth charges?" He said, "That means you close all water-tight doors in order to shut off any compartment which might be burst by explosions. Shut off certain valves which might flood the sub, if broken by concussion, and have all men not on watch get in their bunks so that they wouldn't be knocked down or thrown against the machinery."

"Those four destroyers," Sam said, "really worked on us. You'd stand there wondering if the next one would get you . . . It would all quiet down . . . then it would break out all over again." Sam said they stayed down for a long time before it was safe to come up. Then they changed position—to a narrow passageway—close to a beach. Around an island another destroyer came upon them—and spotted them. They couldn't dodge this time because the destroyer had them cornered . . . against the beach. He was following up—following them with his sound gear—which can detect them under the sea.

"But, luckily," Sam said, "we got in a rip-tide which was running near the beach. Two fast cross-currents—one running against the other. This rip-tide drowned out our noises—so the detector couldn't hear us. We stayed in it about half an hour," Sam said. "By that time, we'd got far away enough to speed up and get away."

They were still hunting. They were hiding and diving and crouching, and clinging tenaciously to the front of

this Jap naval base. They got a small oil tanker. "I was just going on watch," said Sam Clark. "I'd just got a cup of coffee. This ship blew up with the first shell. We surfaced, shot and blew her up so quick my coffee was still hot when I went below again."

Then they got orders to leave the area—to return home. He wouldn't say whether they got the big game or not.

When they were going back, they sighted a vessel lying to. At first it looked like a destroyer. The sub submerged—to make an approach—to attack. Then they saw it was a trawler—and "battle surfaced" . . . "and that was the first one we missed by the first shot," said Sam. The first shot had misfired.

"Did you get him?"

"Yeah. We put three into him . . . That finished it up."

Well, I hadn't more to ask Sam—but I thought of this job. It was war, all right—clear, brutal, swift and killing. That made me ask, "Do you like this service?"

"Sure, why not?" he answered.

It was also dangerous. At least I thought so.

"Why do you like it?"

"Well, I guess it's the type of people you live with. I think," he added. "We have a better type of officers and men—a small crew like a big family—more friendly all the way around. And it's really pretty safe—about the safest place of all—in time of war."

So I said, "What are you going to do now?" He said he was now learning the officer end of it—a chief engineer—at the New London school. Also, he taught enlisted students on practice runs.

"I've worn the dolphins (the diving fish worn only by submarine men who have qualified for a particular duty in the service) as an enlisted man," Sam said. "I've worn them on my jumper sleeve twelve years. This is the first time I've ever been without them . . . and I don't like it. I'm going to qualify now as an officer—and then I'm going to wear them—right here—on my breast."

And this is the way Sam told it to me—as a fighting submariner.
