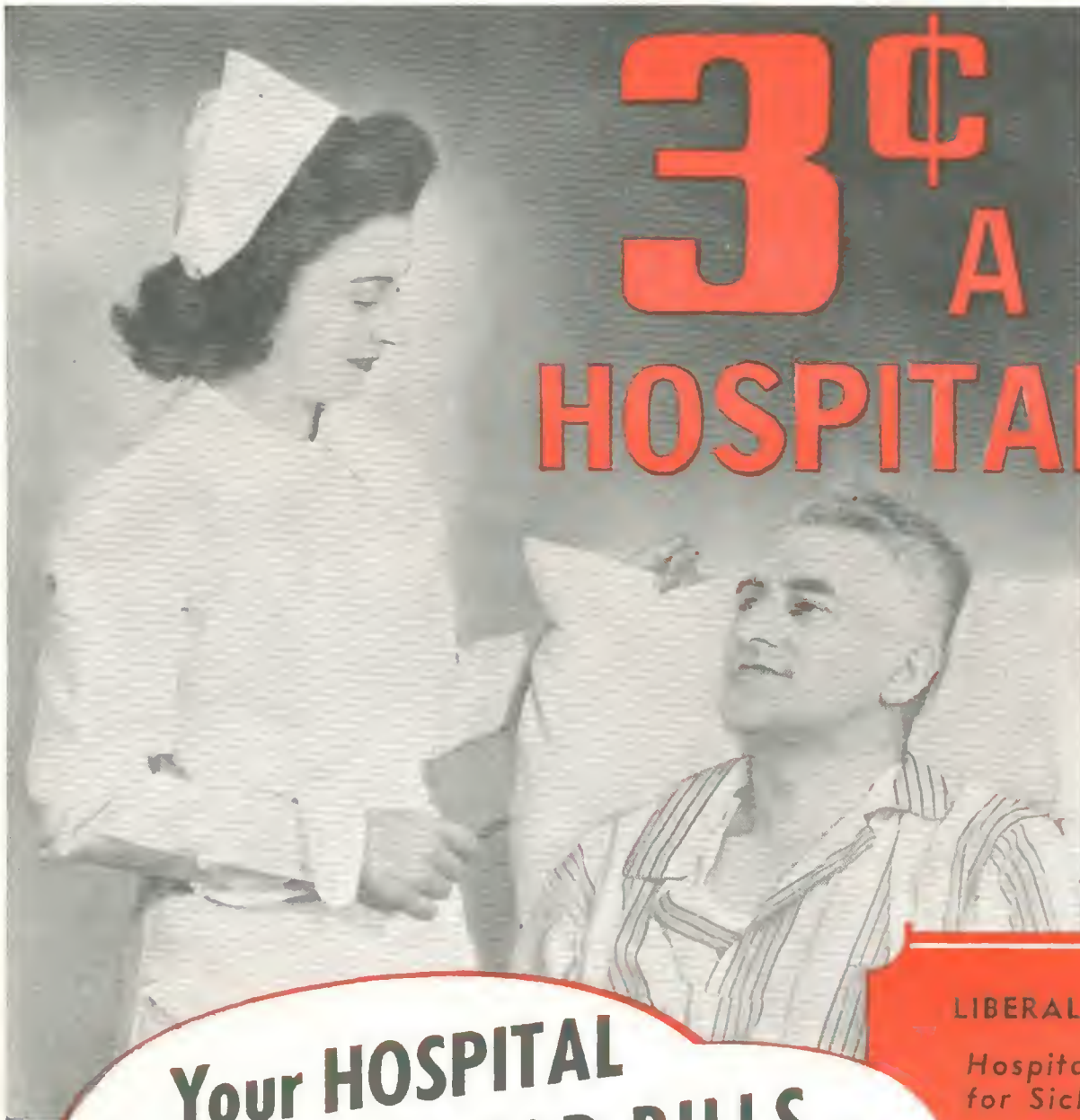

THE WINNERS

Greer Garson and James Cagney
Get Top Academy Award Honors

THE spirit of America at war pervaded the fifteenth annual Academy Award dinner at the Cocoanut Grove of the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles on March 4. There was none of the pomp and pageantry that had marked former dinners.

The most thrilling moment of the whole evening was that when Academy president, producer Walter Wanger, stepped to the microphone and opened the ceremonies by introducing Jeanette MacDonald, who sang the national anthem as she had never sung it before. And there was a tremendous ovation when Hollywood's big service flag, with the number 27,677 on it, was unfurled. From then on, the spirit of the military took over. For every speaker emphasized in some way the importance of motion pictures in the war effort. William Wyler, now with the armed forces overseas, received the award for his direction of "Mrs. Miniver," voted best picture of the year. Award for the best supporting actor went to Lieutenant Van Heflin for his work in "Johnny Eager." And Teresa Wright, who played such a poignantly valiant role in "Mrs. Miniver," was named best supporting actress of the year.

THE FIRST PRESIDENTIAL BROADCAST

A Revealing Article Linking the Past and Present of Radio's Fascinating Development

A decade ago President Franklin D. Roosevelt gave his first fireside chat, and millions of Americans listened to his voice over the radio—many for the first time. The article which follows connects that event with an even more momentous presidential broadcast in the history of radio and of America, for it describes the forward march of men who build for the future good of mankind while war lords plan and scheme to destroy. —The Editors.

ON THE morning of July 4, 1919, American newspapers carried a brief announcement whose import escaped many of their editors. They published a dispatch received by wireless from the U. S. S. *George Washington*, bearing President Wilson home from the Versailles Peace Conference, stating that at 3 p.m. that Independence Day he would address the crew. The message added that this occasion would be marked by a novel feature—the first use of the wireless telephone at sea to transmit the voice of the President to soldiers and sailors on other ships.

Many editors buried this news deep inside their papers. In fairness to them it must be stated that, so far as is known, they received no complaints from readers over this treatment of the dispatch. However, a few scattered radio operators in the United States noted it well. They realized that this was to be the first attempt to bring the voice of a President of the United States directly to the people.

This is how the experiment came to be made: For more than a decade Reginald Fessenden, Lee DeForest and others had pioneered the course that was to give wireless a voice. The war years had brought about the emer-

gence of the radiotelephone, and now, with peace at hand, the United States Navy took a hand in its development. In April, 1919, the Navy Department asked the General Electric Company to build and install a radiotelephone transmitter aboard the *George Washington* for the use of President Wilson and his advisers.

The company assigned John H. Payne, who is associated with its research laboratory today, and Harold H. Beverage to this task. They developed the equipment and installed it promptly, but it was not until President Wilson's return from his second trip in July that he found occasion to use it.

On July 3 it was made known that on the following day President Wilson would address the crew and returning

soldiers. This announcement gave Payne and his associates an idea.

"This was to be a great event for all of us," he recalled recently. "And we felt that it would be too bad if the sailors on the U. S. S. *Arkansas*, 1,500 feet ahead, and the men on the four destroyers, 1,000 feet to our right and left, were not to be privileged to hear that speech. We talked the situation over and decided to ask the President whether he would be willing to make the speech with the telephone microphone in front of him so that we could send it out over the radiophone to our convoys."

Such a stunt would be absolutely out of the question, Payne was told, unless the microphone were to be completely concealed.

"We were informed," said Payne,

"that a microphone in front of the President would make him nervous and that it was not proper that he should be bothered by anything of this sort."

But Payne and his assistants went right ahead with their plans:

They found that if a microphone were fastened to the small end of a megaphone that an excellent pick-up could be obtained, even if the speaker stood four or five feet distant. They learned where the President would stand and concealed the microphone combination in a mass of flags before the speaker's stand.

With plans completed, Payne and his men decided to let the world know about them. A radiotelegraph message was dispatched to shore stations. A few minutes before 3 o'clock, Payne received a message from the *Arkansas* stating that the entire ship's telephone system had been connected with its receiving apparatus; the men were standing by to hear the President's voice.

At the appointed time the President began speaking:

"We told our fellow men throughout the world," he began, "when we set up the free state of America that we wanted to serve liberty everywhere and be friends of men in every part of the world who wanted to throw off the unjust shackles of arbitrary government . . . Now we have kept our pledge to humanity as well as our pledge to ourselves.

"A new freedom has come to the peoples of the world out of this war," the President declared. "This freedom has no date. It has no Fourth of July. There has nowhere been written a Declaration of Independence. The only date I can think of for it is the eleventh of last November, when the Central Powers admitted they were beaten and accepted an armistice. From that time they knew they had to submit to the terms of liberty. And perhaps some of these days we shall date the freedom of the peoples from November 11, 1918 . . . We shall make it a condition that liberty of men throughout the world shall be served and that America shall continue to redeem its pledge to humanity and to mankind."

As he uttered these prophetic words, Woodrow Wilson unwittingly all but lost the opportunity to become the first President to send his voice out across the world. For instead of taking his stand where he had been expected, the President spoke from the hatchway of the lower deck, twenty feet from the microphone and almost completely out of its range.

"Only an occasional word could be heard," Payne recalled. "This was very much to be regretted, as the atmospheric conditions were splendid at the time."

Men at NBD, the Navy station at Otter Cliffs, Bar Harbor, Maine, were sorely disappointed, it was learned later. They had tied in an earphone to a telephone transmitter with the hope of sending the "broadcast" over the telephone wires to the White House. "Reception was very poor," Orrin E. Dunlap, Jr., one of the men stationed at Otter Cliffs recalled, "and it was blamed on the supposition that the ship was rolling in a heavy sea."

Soon after the President had concluded, Payne obtained the manuscript of the speech and read it over the radiophone. The President's words were heard on the conveying ships and well across the United States. Months later an Army Signal Corps officer told Payne that he picked up the speech on a small antenna 3,000 miles away in San Antonio, Texas.

When the President learned of the tragic mix-up in the arrangements he

assured the radio men that if he had known about their plan to broadcast his address he would gladly have co-operated and spoken from the proper place. Later it was discovered that Admiral Cary Grayson, the President's physician and adviser, through whom all arrangements had to be made, had objected to the concealed microphone. Without knowing this, the President presumably had yielded to a suggestion that he speak from the hatchway instead of from the appointed position.

Several days later the President used the radio to put through a phone call to Washington. On July 5 and 6,

Payne recalled, static conditions were so bad that the vessel was unable to get into good communication with the land stations at New Brunswick, N. J., and Otter Cliffs. On the seventh, several calls were put through with poor results. On the morning of July 8 the first really satisfactory two-way communication of the voyage was obtained. Payne recalled, and the President spoke over the radiophone to Assistant Secretary of the Navy Franklin D. Roosevelt in Washington. Wilson's voice was carried by radiophone to New Brunswick and thence over land lines to Washington.

While this was probably the first conversation by radio between a President of the United States and a future President, it was not Franklin Roosevelt's first contact with this new marvel of communication. The story of Mr. Roosevelt's earlier experience was recorded by Mr. Beverage in the October, 1920, issue of the *General Electric Review*:

Beverage and Payne made two round trips to France on the ship, sailing first from Hoboken on April 11, 1919. Because of the short time available for installing the apparatus, (Continued on Page 56)

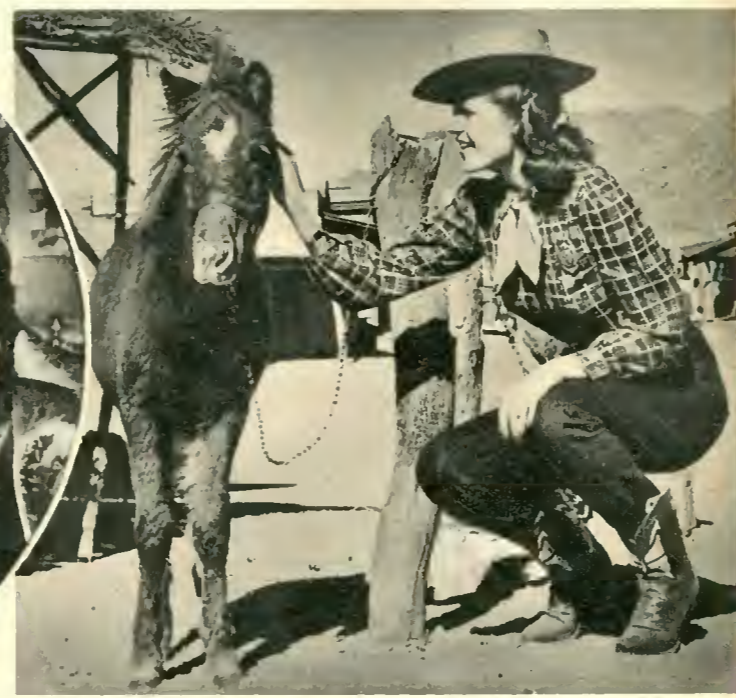

WISH that Rita Hayworth were not in love with my best friend. There's not a woman alive who can help but resent the fellow who knew her husband-to-be long before she did. Rita curbs her antipathy beautifully most of the time, but you can see sparks come into her eyes when I say, "Yeah, those were wonderful days when Mature and I lived together. You never saw so many blondes in and out of a place in your life. We almost had to install a revolving door."

Rita naturally will never be fond of blondes. She's a brunette herself, although California sunshine and picture requirements have changed her hair to a light-golden auburn.

The fact of the matter is that I knew Rita Hayworth before I did Victor Mature, and I wouldn't want to think of life on this mundane sphere without the comforting feeling that both were somewhere within calling distance. The two go together like sleep and dreams, regardless of what you may have read in the line of fantastic publicity about the man known as "the hunk."

When I first met Rita she was married. I had the vague impression that she didn't behave like a bride but more like a sleeping beauty not yet conscious of all that was going on in the world. It was impossible to get a line on her intelligence at the time, because she never said anything but "yes" and "of course" in hushed tones. She was a child born of the machinery of movie-making. She looked with a touch of longing at people who drank cocktails and rushed around in open cars enjoying desert jaunts and trips to the snowy mountains. The only time Rita saw much of the desert was when

the publicity department called upon her to put on a bathing-suit and face a battery of cameras. And she never went to the mountains unless accompanied by skis, which she was never allowed to use for fear that she might break her pretty nose.

Rita had all the essentials necessary to glamorous stardom, but she might as well have been a model in Macy's window for all the fun she had out of life.

That's all changed now. "I suppose a girl has a right to cry over her 'lost youth,'" Rita told me recently. "I won't say whether or not I've ever sobbed into a pillow for this reason, but to be truthful I think the years I have spent in the strict discipline of dancing and learning the things necessary to become a movie star were good for me. I'm sure that if I hadn't been led to hard work and had my nose affixed to a grindstone I should have done a lot of impossible things."

Rita is not exactly submerged in complexes, but she's been so used to taking orders like a good trouper that she will, for instance, stand around at a party and wait for someone to suggest that she go and talk to so-and-so, particularly if it is the usual party with a lot of so-and-so's who wouldn't look interesting to a sailor lost for eight weeks on a desert island.

The camera makes me beautiful, but I'm really such a dope that I can't read lines, and in another five years they'll throw me in the ashcan. And as for dancing, I fake all that." The lad protested gallantly to no avail. Rita insisted that she was a dead loss and convinced me that with such a wonderful talent as a liar she should do more fishing.

Rita happens to know that she is a competent actress, but she's had a hard time convincing a number of bosses of that fact. The scripts she's given to read usually concern a beautiful, beautiful girl and as little story as possible. "I don't want to be a great actress," she tells me, "but I do think

that the public is entitled to see any star in a role that calls for a touch of acting ability. I can't enjoy the thought of sharp-witted movie-goers referring to my latest picture as 'You Were Never Lousier.'" As for her recent battle with her studio, Rita will say nothing. She was scheduled to do a picture with Cary Grant called "My Client Curly." The story, a good one for a change, concerned a man who owned a wonderful caterpillar—the worm variety, not a tractor. Mr. Grant, however, found he could not do the picture, so Humphrey Bogart was summoned. He, too, decided that he couldn't take the part because of previous commitments. Then Brian Donlevy was called in, but that blew up. (Continued on Page 59)

1. If you work at a machine, be sure that all guards are in place before starting operations.
2. Confine your hair in a net, cap or bandanna. Wear snug-fitting garments. Loose sleeves and loose garments are easily caught in whirring machinery.
3. Wear goggles if there is the slightest danger from flying particles. Eyesight is precious. It may save a life.
4. Wear low-heeled shoes at work.
5. Fatigue is increased by slumping in your chair. Sit erect when working, and bend from the hips when necessary, not from the waist.
6. Always look where you are going. Never dash out of a doorway or hurry around a blind corner. Collisions can be costly.
7. If your work calls for an apron, use one of the close-fitting overall type with buttons down the back or side; or held with a steel-spring clasp around the waist.

2. Machine cogs and belts are dynamite to any loose ends on clothing. Don't wear sashes or fancy collars with free ends. Floppy jackets and baggy sweaters are easily caught in spinning machinery.
3. Wear substantial leather brogans with sturdy soles and common-sense heels. Slippers and soft-soled shoes are tabu because they don't protect the feet from rough materials, heavy falling objects.
4. DON'T effect the seeing-only-with-one-eye hairdo of Veronica Lake (above, right), which the War Production Board branded a hazard.
5. DON'T sulk, because Miss Lake's hair style (above, left) is best for war workers.

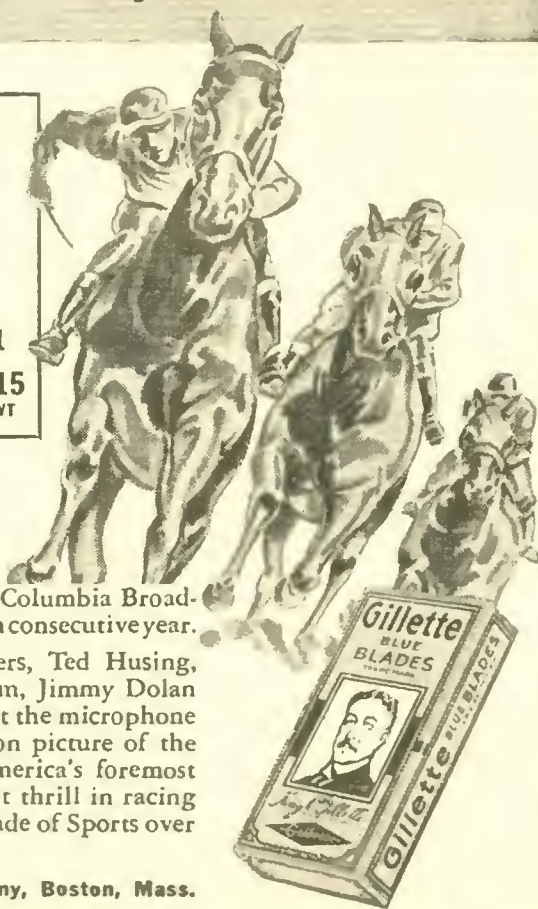

SHORT WAVES

"Strictly G. I." Shows Short-Waved to Our Troops Overseas

THIS war has brought forth a new kind of radio. The American doughboys call it "strictly G. I.," while the British Tommies speak of it as "regulation."

Dozens of these "regulation" programs are beamed from the United States every day and are heard by soldiers and civilians alike in all parts of the world. The producers of these programs are specialists in the radio section of the Special Service Division of the War Department.

Oldest in time of service and a favorite among the troops of the United Nations is the men's own program, "Command Performance, U. S. A." During the year this series has been on the air, it has actually been at the command of the fighting men who listen to it. No matter what the request, the radio section obliges. Perhaps you heard Carole Landis sigh on one program, or heard a baby cry or a church bell ring on another. Those were requests from our fighting men. Two soldiers in the South Pacific didn't want to hear a song or a sigh from a beautiful girl. They wanted to hear the sound of a porterhouse steak, covered with onions, sizzling over a hot fire. And they wanted Ann Sheridan to act as chef. Annie, with her trusty skillet, gave a quick steak-fry right in the broadcasting studio. One Marine, on Guadalcanal, wanted a slot-machine on the program, because he wanted to hear the sound of nickels coming out when the jackpot was hit, and this was done. Such small but important things, to men far away from home, help to bolster morale; keep the men in touch with the life they left behind.

But "Command Performance" is only one of twenty-one separate programs written and produced by the radio section of the Special Service Division. Many of these programs are produced five and six times a week. In addition to these special shows, more than twenty of the most popular commercial programs in the U. S. are beamed throughout the world each week. These are transmitted without the sponsor's message.

The twenty-one tailor-made programs cover a wide variety of entertainment as well as spiritual nutriment. "Music for Sunday" is a fine program that supplies the latter. Straight, uncolored news must be sent to the men. And this is handled by daily news-casts and special-events programs.

"Mail Call" occupies a favorite position with the men, for this is a program that features the great stars from stage, screen and radio as well as concert stars and popular and classical orchestras. The rest of the programs, equally popular with various groups of men and women, include "Yank Swing Session," "Personal Album," "Melody Round-Up," "Front Line Theater," "Downbeat," "Sports Today," "We Who Fight," "Jubilee,"



"Yarns for Yanks," "Song Sheet," "Grandstand Seat," "Are You a Genius," "Yank Sports Review," "Great Music," "Sound Off," "Sports Interview," "Sports Parade," "Sports Review." (Times at which and frequencies on which most of these programs can be heard will be found in our program listings on the following page.)

All of these programs, in addition to the twenty sales-deleted commercial shows, are recorded. This is done so the programs can be beamed dozens of times a day to all sections of the globe for the convenience of the men stationed at the various theaters of war. By putting the shows on specially treated records, impervious to heat or cold, the transcriptions can be shipped to England for use on BBC, to New Zealand, Australia, China, Alaska, Iceland, Greenland, Africa, Russia, South America and other countries for use on government and privately owned stations.

Then the recordings are sent to the actual camps. In cases where the men are isolated, the transcribed radio programs can be dropped by parachute.

The performers on the programs live by the old adage, "The Show Must Go On." The producers of "G. I.," or "Regulation," radio have adopted a similar motto. Their slogan: "The Show Must Get Through."

Cuba's COK Aids United Nations

The Cuban National Sports Department is using COK (11.623) extensively in the United Nations' war effort.

COK's radio activities were initiated on March 28, 1941. Its studios are located in the huge Sports Palace, in the heart of gay Havana, the capital of Cuba. Its 1,000-watt transmitter is located on top of a hill called "Principe Heights," close to the famous "Principe Castle." COK broadcasts daily except Sundays from 12:00 noon to 12:00 mid. EWT.

The notes of the "Peanut Vendor" usher in COK's broadcasting activities for the day. Some of the more important programs featured over the station are: At 3:30 p.m., Pan-American newscast; 5:00 p.m., "Why We Fight"; 6:00 p.m., national news, followed by official news of the Cuban Ministry of State; 7:00 p.m., "The Voice of Liberty"; 9:00 p.m., last-minute news; 10:00 p.m., dance music from the famous Sans Souci restaurant.

During COK's brief history more than eight thousand reports of reception have been received from all over the world, including such places as Australia, New Zealand, Palestine, Iceland, England, Spain, Argentina, etc. More than five thousand reports have been received from the United States. Every report is acknowledged with colored post-cards, a verification card and a souvenir automobile license plate.

Lt. Col. Jaime Marine, national sports director, in his capacity as head of the Cuban National Sports Commission has the management and control of COK's activities. Sr. Antonio Ruiz Azoy, a member of the Cuban consular service, is the COK director.

EUROPE—Messages from American prisoners in German camps are broadcast frequently at 7:13 and 9:13 p.m. EWT. Best reception is usually furnished by DZD (10.543), DJD (11.77), or DXJ (7.24)... Stockholm broadcasts to North America 12:00 noon-2:15 p.m. over SBT (15.155) and SBP (11.705) and SBU (9.535).

ASIA-AUSTRALIA—Chungking, China, is using a new frequency of 7.17 megs daily 6:00 a.m.-12:30 p.m. EWT. The North American transmission is broadcast 10:00-11:35 a.m. EWT on 7.17 and 6.12 (the latter frequency will soon be replaced by 9.63 megs.)

Hollywood Women

AMERICA, and rightly, hears much today of the heroic exploits of our fighting aviators, but little or nothing about the ground crews that do the work which keeps them flying. Joan Bennett, single-handed, raised the money for furnishing thirty-two recreation halls in Army camps, personally shopped for all equipment. Joan has seen to it that every one has a piano, radio-phonograph, easy chairs and games—anything and everything that would make a large, bar room look homey and prove comfortable.

Only doctor's orders slowed up Rosalind Russell. Even though she has a legitimate excuse for less work in her approaching motherhood, Roz kept right on touring camps, working for the Red Cross and doing canteen duty.

The different war organizations in Hollywood number

At War-

no less than twenty, each working from different angles for the common cause of victory. Joan Crawford has been financing a nursery in Sawtelle until it can go it alone. This project provides a place where mothers engaged in war work can leave their children. Joan has her own desk in the nursery office, takes care of bills personally. Because of her quiet efforts, there are fewer absentees from vital war work, and mothers are left free to do a better job. And, as a result of her idea, plans are being laid to open similar nurseries in other war production centers.

Every sincere American woman from Maine to California, who is doing her share, has a counterpart in Hollywood women at war. For like millions of others they work tirelessly to achieve the common goal of winning the peace. And to that end, they also serve.

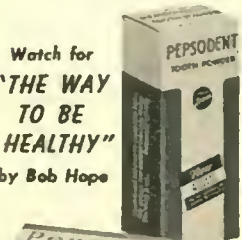

MEAT EXTENDER DISHES

YOU have to be a conniving woman to run a household these days. Timid souls are lost before they begin. But there are so many tempting ways to fix a delicious dinner that most women have become adjusted to the new routine. Don't plan only for today. Remember there's tomorrow and the next day to be included in your planning. Men and women these busy days need nourishing foods and these foods must be prepared with plenty of foresight. Men may not take too readily to a meat substitute as they do to a new dessert, but then meat is rationed, and that means that the meat dish must be made to stretch further. Smart planners receive no complaints from the family.

Why we had to have a war to become conscious of our previous wastes is not understandable. Now we're going to learn to make one pound of meat take the place of two. We're going to use left-overs not only for sandwiches for the next day but as another main dinner dish. What's more, we're going to cook all foods in such a tempting way that our families will praise our culinary ingenuity.

Food experts haven't been asleep at the switch while this change was taking place. They were planning many recipes to help housewives plan delicious meals—without using too much or more than their share of meat. The result is an array of tempting meat dishes that are a boon to any dinner table. Here are some tested recipes to help solve your meat problems. Serve them to your family or to unexpected dinner guests.

American Chop Suey

- 2 tablespoons fat
- 1 cup sliced onion
- ½ pound fresh pork, cut into strips
- ¼ cup uncooked rice
- 4 bouillon cubes
- 4 cups hot water
- ¾ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup green pepper strips
- 1 cup celery strips
- 1½ teaspoons Soy Sauce
- 2 cups oven-popped rice cereal
- 1 tablespoon butter

Heat fat in heavy frying-pan; add onions and meat; cook until lightly browned. Add rice and stock made by dissolving bouillon cubes in hot water. Add salt; cover and simmer about twenty minutes longer. Serve at once with buttered, toasted rice cereal.

The archives are bursting with anecdotes about the divas of old, little larruping anecdotes about the havoc they have wreaked. They might make a good story sometime. The point now is to underscore the difference lying between an operatic diva like Gladys Swarthout, say, and the general run of the older ones who, great as they may have been as artists, were perfect pains as human beings.

The first thing one notices about Miss Swarthout—that is, one must make a definite point of noticing, because she has enough charm to prevent anything like a close-up analysis—is her serenity. She is truly a serene person. Whether or not that is something she was born with, one has no way of telling. The chances are, however, that it just grew out of a wealth of experience in the theater, in life.

She works like a Trojan. She does dozens of concerts a year, all over the country. Scarcely a week passes by without some Swarthout event in some part of the nation. She lives on trains. She lives on planes. That is because she is a very popular artist. She does a weekly broadcast over CBS, the Prudential "Family Hour," you know. She sings at the Metropolitan.

All of that, naturally, takes considerable doing. Yet the effort and energy involved in the keeping of concert, radio and opera dates is nothing as compared to those expended in preparing for them. Rehearsal, everlasting rehearsal, study, learning new pieces, going crazy trying to present different programs. To be original and individualistic in the presentation of a group of items is one thing, to go berserk in a ceaseless search for the unusual, per se, is another. The latter a serious, sincere, intelligent artist must never do.

With all these matters to occupy her, with the thousand and one details that confront her every single day of her life, Miss Swarthout can be a serene person. That is our contemporary diva or, one hopes, what is a representative example of her. That is the way the contemporary diva should be. One wonders just how many of the other present-day ones are as serene as Miss Swarthout.

In her New York apartment, whose windows look out on the East River, Miss Swarthout finds time to relax. An artist who might be called upon to sing any type of composition, from a mild little ditty to a great emotional flare-out, needs relaxation. Then there is a place in Connecticut, whose lovely grounds and views help the cause of relaxation along, too.

No singer is more devoted to her work than Miss Swarthout. She reads endlessly, studies endlessly, investigates everything there is to investigate. All of it helps her interpretative powers, of course. Sometimes she pores over a simple phrase for hours. She is extremely meticulous about musicianship. The singer must be, first of all, a fine musician, she says.

Diction, she has discovered, does not always get the attention it truly

performance over the air.

"Yes," he said, "but what happened to them after that? What I mean is to have a regular repertory company, doing brand-new works. The idea is to create for the radio, and then to keep on performing these works on the radio.

"I suppose it calls for a great deal of labor, but it might be well worth it. No art can survive without a subvention of some kind, whether from private individuals or great companies. When the subvention comes from the public, it means success, you know."

The gentleman, of course, was shouting a battle-cry for new music. There is nothing wrong with doing that, of course. So one lets him shout.

The King Returns

Paul Whiteman, who used to sport rather proudly the title of King of Jazz, has recently been appointed director of music for the Blue Network. The genial maestro has been going in more and more for serious music, as witness his guest appearances with symphonic orchestras throughout the country.

At the present writing one does not know exactly what Mr. Whiteman's actual duties will be. Obviously he will be shifting from jazz to concert music, as he has been accustomed to doing. Anyway, the Whiteman influence will be felt, never fear. He is one of those instinctive musicians who know immediately what is tasteful, what isn't. So the writer salutes Mr. Whiteman and wishes him well in his new work.

JERRY WAYNE, who comes from Buffalo, thought he might become a dentist. Dentists seem to get a lot of work, and, besides, his parents were all for his making dentistry his career.

At high school and college, though, he did some singing with bands. He also played a little piano and guitar here and there. He liked it. In fact, he liked it immensely. He thought that this might be better than dentistry.

Somehow or other, though, he got into acting. He did some theater work and finally lit out for Hollywood, where he appeared in a number of pictures. Small parts, you know.

One day he sang before an orchestra. He liked that, it seems, best of all. He had taken voice lessons back home. Now he was all for going into the thing. This, at last, was what he had always wanted to do.

So he became Jerry Wayne, singer, and it is as a singer that he has attained eminence. He is deeply interested in good music. He goes to concerts, to the opera whenever he can.

Jerry Wayne, it seems important to add at this point, is quite a tennis player. In fact, he could have become a champion. Now he plays it for exercise and relaxation. But he always takes his partners over.

He is an excellent athlete, having played football, baseball, basketball and other sports at college. In short, Jerry Wayne is a balanced individual who knows how to sing popular songs. Every Friday night he goes into Carnegie Hall to sing with the Mark Warnow orchestra on that cigarette broadcast. He hopes, some day, to sing serious music there.

requires. "The words of a song are important. They convey the message that the composer endeavored to put into his music. Together they make the complete work. The interpreter must be equally concerned with text and music. One cannot favor one over the other. That is not being an artist."

Miss Swarthout expects to make a movie soon. She has been much in demand for film roles but she has had little time for work in motion pictures, though she has already appeared in several very successful ones.

All in all, Gladys Swarthout, in a very quiet, unostentatious manner, does a tremendous amount of work. But in everything she does there is always to be noticed the sincerity of purpose that distinguishes the true singer of songs.

Radio Opera

A friend was talking about opera on the radio the other day. He did not mean the Metropolitan Opera broadcasts. He meant opera specially writ-

ten for the radio, with the limitations or the scope of the radio in mind. He meant new works.

His theories were rather interesting. He said: "Lots of communities in this country have lately been made aware that such a thing as grand opera exists. You can thank your Met broad-

casts for that. You can also thank other broadcasts, originating at Chicago, for instance, Los Angeles, in short, wherever opera companies have been functioning before the public.

"But I think," he continued, "that more attention should be paid to building a repertory of radio operas. There is nothing to prevent such works from being done in public, later on, you know. But if a whole series of such pieces were done, it would not only stimulate young composers to try their hand at the new thing but also increase the people's interest in opera that exists already."

One reminded the speaker that Gian-Carlo Menotti, the young Italo-American composer, had already written a pair of works exclusively for

FREQUENCY MODULATION

Forecast for FM

A GLIMPSE of what your family radio set may be like five or ten years from now was given when James L. Fly, chairman of the Federal Communications Commission (which has authority over all broadcasting in this country), uttered a few prophetic words on the subject.

Mr. Fly envisages a single radio receiver designed to combine reception of frequency modulation, television and radio-facsimile broadcasting. "This business of having separate receivers for separate radio services," he said, "that will all be washed out."

The all-purpose home receiver will be based, he declared, "upon the best developments we have had to date, and those we get out of the war, in the FM field and television. I should not be surprised in the course of years if you will have only one receiver. You will have as a basis your highly efficient FM operation and then, at appropriate hours, the television programs. Every hour or so you will come down and tear off your facsimile news reports. We have been in the horse-and-buggy days up to now."

(Radio facsimile is an ingenious form of broadcasting whereby printed matter and pictures are transmitted over the air and reproduced identically in the home. It differs from television, which offers motion pictures upon a screen, in that permanent copies of the printed matter are reproduced at the receiver and may be saved and read at any time.

All-Purpose Receiver for the Home Predicted; Applications for Construction of FM Stations Reinstated by FCC for Quick Action After War

Help From Washington

Mr. Fly's comments were made in connection with a recent move by the Federal Communications Commission which will be of considerable benefit to FM. Briefly, this action relaxes a previous ruling of the commission which, because of war-time conditions, dismissed about fifty applications for new FM stations a year ago. In addition, some thirty-five construction permits that had already been granted to authorize the building of FM outlets in many parts of the country were frozen, due to the need for conserving essential radio equipment.

Now, however, any of the fifty applications or thirty-five construction permits may be reinstated, upon request, and will be carefully kept on file by the FCC until the end of the war. This means that as soon as peace returns FM will have an opportunity to make a quick start, since all Washington needs to do at that time is act upon requests already made for new stations. If this were not the case, aspiring owners of FM stations would

have to go through much official routine and delay before they could obtain the desired permission from Washington to put an FM station on the air.

Here's the Reason

The decision to give FM broadcasting this advantage was made, according to Mr. Fly, "simply because we want to encourage FM . . . as much as we can and cause the least trouble possible. The thing we want to get is a demonstration of the good faith and intention of the parties concerned to go ahead and put up FM stations and serve the public with them. There were not enough of those applications that they would be alarming from the quantitative point of view; and in most localities, of course, there are plenty of FM channels, so there would not be the same embarrassment and difficulties we would have in the standard broadcasting field, where there is a scarcity of channels."

Of the fifty applications pending a year ago when Washington decided to

dismiss them, more than a quarter have already been reinstated at the applicants' request and will automatically be considered as soon as possible at the end of the war. Among the cities concerned are New York, Los Angeles, Duluth, Philadelphia, Houston, Albany, Ashland (Ky.), Detroit, Louisville.

The War Comes First

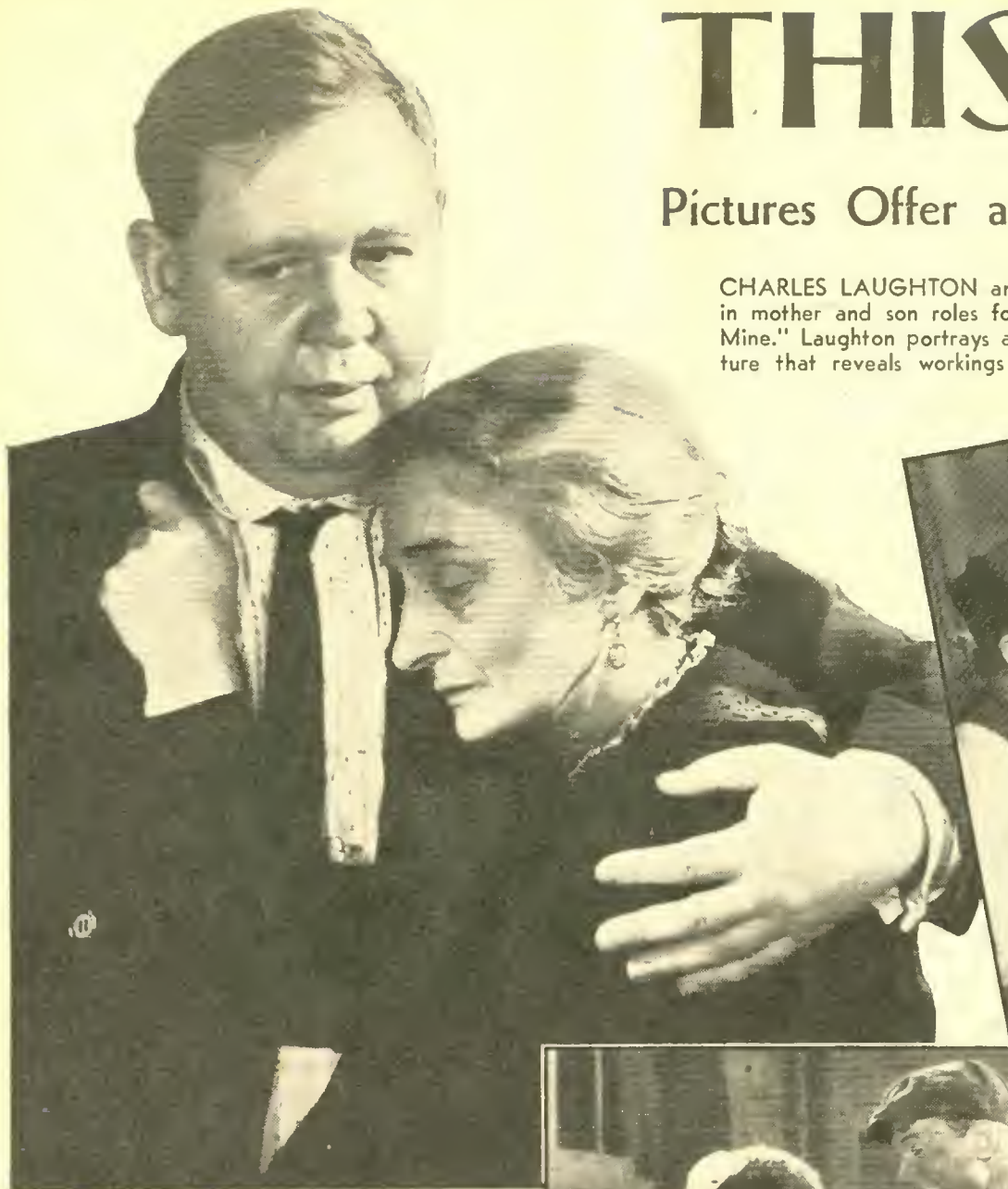

The war is seen through the experiences of a French chambermaid (Anne Baxter) and a British Tank Corps soldier (Franchot Tone). It's Miss Baxter's first starring role, and she more than justifies the faith producers had in her ability. Erich von Stroheim returns to the screen in the role of Field Marshal Erwin Rommel, a part strongly reminiscent of his performances in silent-day pictures. The opening scenes take place in June, 1942. The British have been driven out of Tobruk and back into Egypt by Rommel's swiftly advancing Afrika Korps. From then on it's plot and counterplot as the British try to regain their losses and outwit the foxy Rommel. It is a picture sans a happy ending, but it does show the allied nations on the march toward victory.

THE FIRST PRESIDENTIAL BROADCAST

no two-way conversations were attempted on the first trip to France. On the first return voyage, Beverage wrote, an orchestra was heard aboard the ship by wireless. The music was transmitted by placing a telephone near the orchestra at the New Brunswick Opera House. The vessel at this time was 2,000 miles from New York.

Because of unfavorable atmospheric conditions no conversations between ship and shore were satisfactory until the morning of May 5. Then—

"After establishing satisfactory duplex (two-way) conversation with the engineers at New Brunswick and Navy officials in Washington," Beverage stated, "Secretary of War Baker held a conversation with Assistant Secretary of Navy Roosevelt in Washington. Secretary Baker remarked that 'the connection was as good as over an ordinary toll line.'"

The Payne and Beverage records do not reveal what the reactions of the young Assistant Secretary of the Navy to these primordial radio experiences were.

IT FELL to the lot of Warren G. Harding to usher in the radio era. The advent of broadcasting is generally reckoned from November 2, 1920, election day. That evening Dr. Frank Conrad of the Westinghouse Company put the Harding-Cox election returns on the air through the predecessor station of KDKA, Pittsburgh. He estimated that perhaps one hundred persons heard the report. Harding became the first President to speak to the nation by radio. Ironically, the date was November 11—Armistice Day—the day which Woodrow Wilson had forecast would mark the freedom of peoples. On Armistice Day, 1921, President Harding dedicated the tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery.

"We are met today," he began, "to pay the impersonal tribute. The name of him whose body lies before us took flight with his imperishable soul. We know not whence he came, but only that death marks him with the everlasting glory of an American dying for his country."

He closed with these words: "This sacrifice and that of the millions of dead shall not have been in vain. There must be, there shall be the commanding voice of a conscious civilization against armed warfare."

These were the words—the first of an American President to be heard at scattered firesides throughout the nation.

"Every word the President uttered," one observer wrote, "reached every person through amplifiers, and other thousands upon thousands from New York to San Francisco. The response that came back to him from the thousands he faced, other thousands over the slopes beyond, and perhaps from still other thousands near the Golden Gate or closely packed like the Empire City, rose like a chant."

Woodrow Wilson was present on this historic occasion. He rode in an open carriage near the end of the funeral procession to Arlington.

Two years later, on the eve of Armistice Day, 1923, the voice of Wilson was heard once by the whole nation. On this occasion Wilson broke the silence he had imposed upon himself since leaving the White House March 4, 1921, to make a five-minute address by radio. He spoke into a microphone that had been installed in his home on S Street.

His words came haltingly; his voice was bitter as he charged the nation with "manifestly cowardly and dishonorable" conduct because it "refused to bear any responsible part in the administration of peace or the permanent establishment of the results of war . . ."

"The affairs of the world can be set straight only by the firmest and most determined exhibition of the will to lead and make the right prevail."

WITH these challenging words he closed. When he had finished he turned to someone standing beside him and said in a lower voice, "That is all, isn't it?"

His voice shook throughout this brief talk. He seemed short of breath and some of his phrases were hard to distinguish. But official and unofficial Washington strained to catch his words. His voice was heard through many stations and it reached out to Great Britain, South America and Hawaii, the press reported.

A few months later, February 3, 1924, Woodrow Wilson was dead. A rash of radio stations had broken out over the nation by this time and the broadcasting era was upon the world. Calvin Coolidge and Herbert Hoover came to know the radio well. There remained one further step before the presidential mastery of the microphone was complete. Franklin D. Roosevelt took that step on March 12, 1933. On that day he gave his first fireside chat.

In the past it has been customary for President Roosevelt to take part in the Memorial Day ceremonies held at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington, Virginia, during which he makes his annual Memorial Day address to the nation. At this writing it is expected that Mr. Roosevelt will again carry out this custom, in which case the four major networks will probably broadcast his address.

Beef and Liver Loaf

- 1/2 pound pork liver, ground
- 1 pound beef, ground
- 1/4 cup minced onion
- 4 cups corn flakes
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Combine meats with onion, slightly crushed corn flakes, egg, milk and seasonings. Press lightly into greased loaf-pan. Then bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) one and one-half hours.

(Yield: Nine servings—4 1/2-by-9 1/4-inch pan.)

Beef Biscuit Roll

- 1 lb. ground beef chuck
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- Butter or beef fat

Brown the onion, green pepper and beef in butter or beef fat in a frying-pan. Add the seasonings. Make a regulation biscuit dough and spread dough with meat mixture and roll like jelly roll. If dough is too soft, chill in refrigerator first, then cut in one-one-half-inch slices. Place in greased pan, cut side up, brush tops with melted butter. Bake twenty to twenty-five minutes at 450 degrees F. Serve with brown gravy or cheese sauce.

This is simple talk from a girl who is supposed to be ninety-nine and forty-four hundredths percent glamour, but it does seem to make sense.

I believe that almost everything Rita does, says, and is makes sense, and that there should be more like her to make a town called Hollywood a better place.

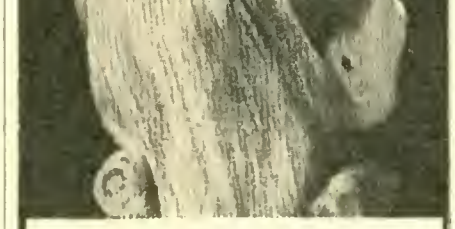

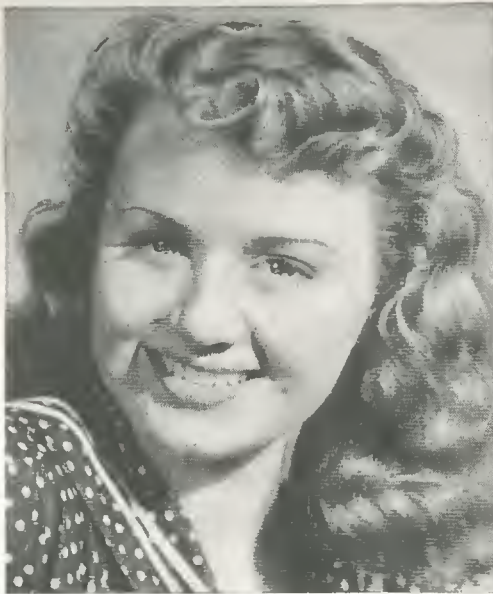
