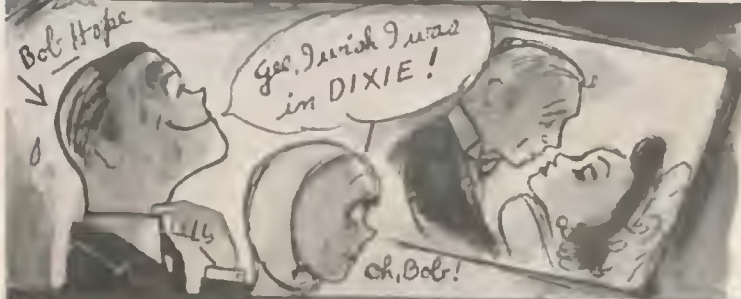

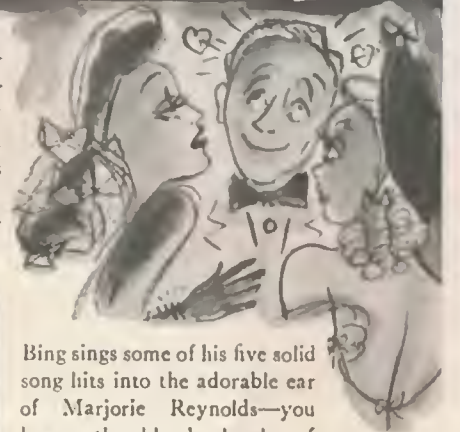

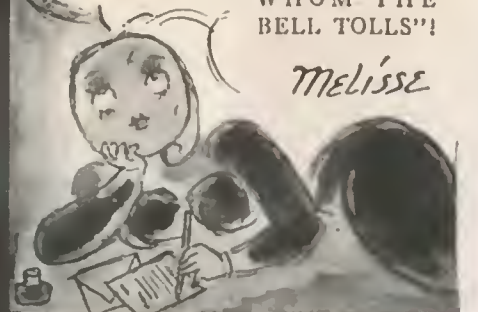

# MENACE TO THE FOUR FREEDOMS

**M**ASSIVE air raids on the cities and villages of Japan are the only answer America can give the Japanese for the recent execution of American pilots and the Jap stab in the back at Pearl Harbor.

Our just vengeance will be incomplete and ineffective if we confine ourselves to only a handful of Jap "militarists" who were directly implicated, because the guilt lies with ninety-nine percent of the Japanese people. They genuinely applauded the cold-blooded murder of our airmen. They enthusiastically celebrated the attack on Pearl Harbor. They made gods of the sneaks who fortunately perished while attempting to wipe out our Navy in peacetime.

To American correspondents who spent the greater part of the past decade in the Far Pacific, often under the menacing shadow of Jap terrorism, Pearl Harbor and the execution of a few American airmen in Japan came as no surprise. Especially to those of us who were captives of the Japanese for more than half a year after Pearl Harbor, these dark-age barbarisms were characteristic of the Japanese.

But apparently no two events of the entire war have so shocked our nation as such as Pearl Harbor and the execution of our Tokyo raiders. This can only be because we Americans paid so little attention to what the Japanese were doing from 1931 to 1942.

## Robert Bellaire Points Up the Nature of Our Enemy, the Nips

Here, very briefly, I give you a few highlights of the Japanese record for that decade. Americans were not always the victims, but the victims always were human beings—Chinese or Indo-Chinese, Malaysians, Siamese, East Indians, Filipinos, or Burmese.

In ten years, the Japanese have slaughtered more than 10,000,000 human beings, most of them innocent

civilians. Usually these non-combatants were killed in Jap bombing or strafing attacks on civilian areas.

The Japanese in a decade have driven more than 200,000,000 human beings out of their homes or off their farms. Families totaling more than the population of the United States have been scattered far and wide, in terror and destitution. Their homes

were destroyed. Their goods confiscated.

In the same short while, the Japanese have enslaved more than 500,000,000 human beings—considerably more people than we have in all the Western Hemisphere from Point Barrow in Alaska to Cape Horn near the Antarctic. The Japs have invaded and conquered almost a dozen nations.

And the Japs hope to hold these conquered peoples in eternal slavery by making of each and every one of them an opium or narcotic addict. Japan is flooding the conquered areas of the Pacific with opium, morphine and cocaine—to destroy the will to resist and hope of delivery.

This, of course, is only a glimpse at what has been done by the authors of the infamous "Rape of Nanking." That rapine debauch, unparalleled in seven hundred years, has been repeated on a thousand less-publicized occasions in a thousand Jap-occupied cities and villages from Peiping to Singapore.

Certainly any nation capable of bringing that grief upon the human race would scarcely have enough regard for international law to give us warning of the attack on Pearl Harbor. Certainly any nation capable of killing, maiming, rendering homeless or enslaving almost one billion human beings would not hesitate to put to death in cold blood a few, or many, Americans.

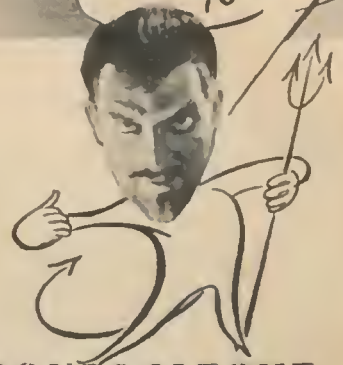

# A Salute to Capt. Gable

LET there be no mistake. I am not a bosom buddy of the man now known as Capt. Clark Gable, U. S. Army Air Forces. I can, however, tell you more about Gable than his closest friends. They are all troubled with a strange affliction of the tongue. A sort of *rigor mortis* sets in when his name is mentioned. They respect his privacy not because he has asked them to but because once having known Clark intimately that's the way you feel about him.

There is a reason why none of the damning publicity hokus-pokus so typical of Hollywood has ever touched Gable's reputation or undermined his character. Like most folks born and bred in the Midwest, everything to him is a case of black is black and white is white. A man is honorable and decent, or he isn't. To Clark there is no in-between avenue of escape for a man who excuses what he does on the basis that it is necessary for him to "work the angles" in order to get along. These are not just words.

Clark never hated anything unless he loathed it completely. Until the war, his hates were minor dislikes, like night-clubs, fawning women and flattery. Came December 7, 1941, and like all other Americans he found a hate worth cultivating. That's why, even though at the age of forty-two he could have safely stayed at the business of picture-making, he insisted against every method of persuasion known to executives on getting into the fighting end of the business.

And right now, as he contemplates the machinery of war at close range in England or wherever his job has taken him, I know he feels as he did when he said to me in retort to a pointblank, cynical question: "A hero? Good Lord, no—I don't want to be one—I had enough of that in Hollywood."

I am not at liberty to quote Captain Gable's comments on his part in the service, as he has made them while in Hollywood on leave, but I can tell you how he feels: He'll be as proud as any Air Forces officer over promotions, such as his recent elevation to captain. At the same time, when he's in a plane.

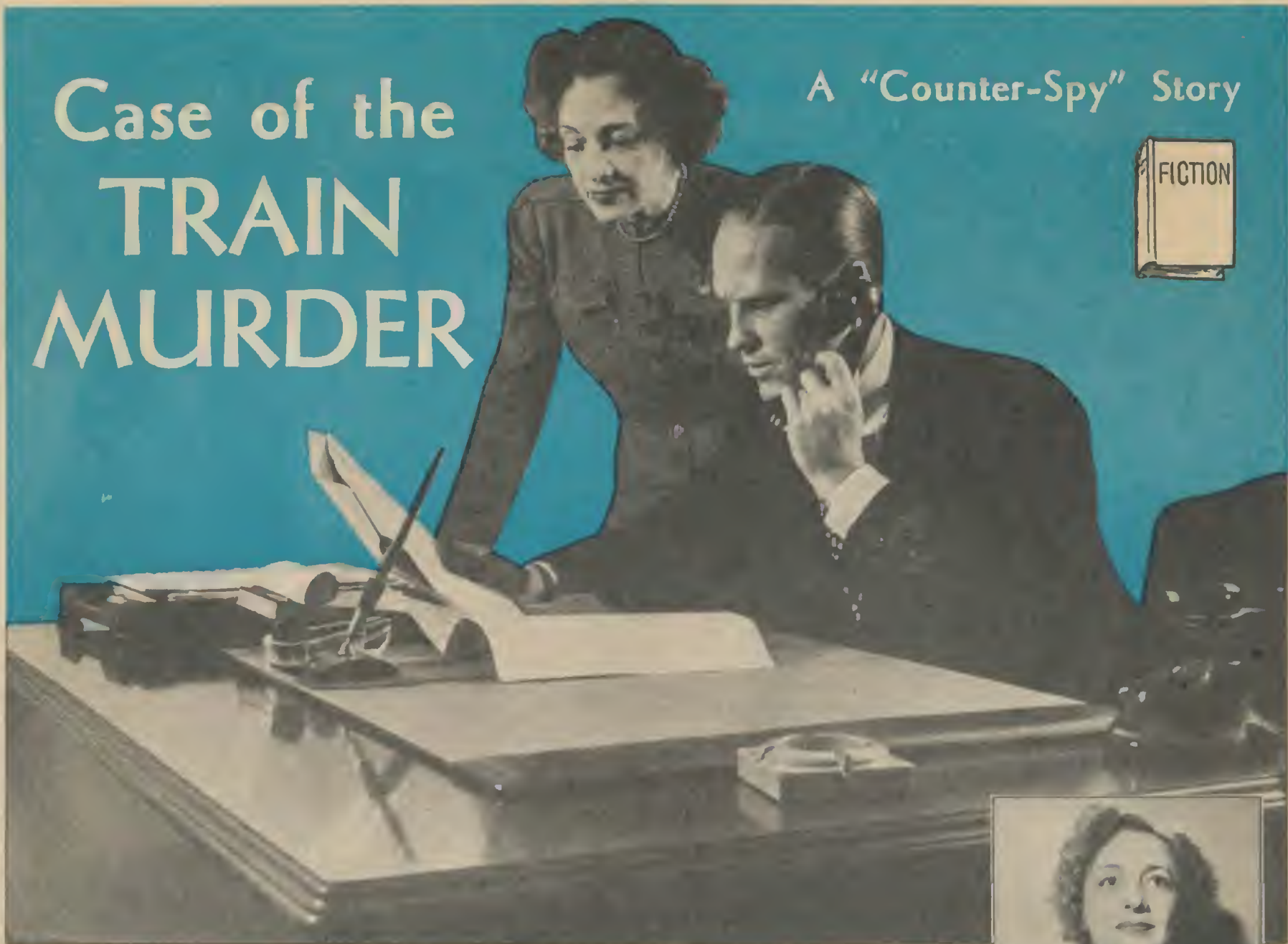
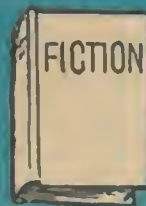
# HERO

So, at the age of thirty-three, this native-born Californian enlisted as a pri-

vate in the Marine Corps under his real name, H. H. Enfield, and was among the first Marines to arrive in Iceland. Here he did his share in paving the way for comrades that were to follow. When he came home after ten months in the Northland he was a sergeant, recommended for officer training, and finished it with the rank of second lieutenant. Immediately after graduation, Craig was ordered to Tulagi, where he again pioneered with the Marines. (Continued on Page 58)

# Case of the TRAIN MURDER

A "Counter-Spy" Story

**G**ERMANY has its Gestapo, Italy its Ovra, Japan its Black Dragon. Matched against these sinister agencies are Uncle Sam's highly trained counter-spies and the man who commands them—David Harding, the ace counter-spy of them all.

Clearly, the case of the train murder was in Harding's province. There was no question but what it had been the work of enemy agents, and extremely clever agents at that.

Harding's lean, angular face became grim as he studied the report that came to his desk in Washington, D. C. After a moment spent in silent cogitation, he raised his six-foot-one-inch frame from the swivel chair and began pacing the floor as he considered the steps necessary to solve the murder of First Lieutenant John O'Brien and to capture his killers. Harding believed in doing first things first. He ordered a complete investigation of the circumstances surrounding O'Brien's departure for San Francisco aboard the transcontinental limited.

The story began in the office of Brigadier General Whitcomb in Washington. Whitcomb, white-haired and serious, said he had gone out of his way to impress O'Brien with the importance of the mission and insisted that he had complete faith in the man entrusted to carry it out.

"O'Brien," he said, "was beyond corruption. He had been my official messenger for nine years. Never in that time had he failed me. He was

methodical, resourceful and diligent—a good man. I told him the papers I had given him to deliver to the commander of the San Francisco area command had to do with the changing of some of our heavy artillery, and O'Brien was instructed to place them in the hands of the commander personally—to no other living person. He would have obeyed my orders to the letter had he not been killed."

But there had been a leak—there must have been, O'Brien had been instructed to take the transcontinental train rather than a plane so undue attention would not be called to his departure. The train left at 10 p.m. that same night and O'Brien had only a bare two hours to arrange his departure. Who, in that brief period, had time to plan the messenger's death and the theft of the papers?

The murder itself revealed planning of a high order. Questioning of the train crew revealed that O'Brien had struck up no acquaintanceships on the trip—in fact, he had sat by himself, even refusing to take a berth. Harding nodded grimly when he learned this fact, because it was confirmation of the general's opinion regarding the messenger. O'Brien had not even trusted himself to sleep.

The train conductor said the only person who sat in the day coach with the lieutenant was a woman. Shortly after midnight, the lights had gone out during the course of a severe electrical storm. During the excitement, and in the dark, a window was broken and O'Brien disappeared. Obviously, he had been pushed through the window!

The woman was available for questioning. She told a straightforward story. She said she had spoken to O'Brien immediately after the lights went off, asking him what the cause might be. O'Brien, she said, was polite but abrupt. He believed the storm had caused the failure. Then, in the darkness, she had heard a scuffle, the crash of glass, a muffled groan. Trainmen entered the coach almost immediately afterward with flashlights. The wind was howling through the double panes of the broken window—or what was left of them. O'Brien was gone. The only persons in the car were the woman, the conductor, a brakeman and a Negro porter.

Harding's agents concentrated on an investigation of these persons, but all were above suspicion.

The conductor explained they'd found the light connections had been

**NEW YORK CITY'S** great playground, as it looked at the turn of the century, provides the background for "Coney Island," with elaborate settings for twenty-three production numbers that highlight the attractions—musical and otherwise—of Betty Grable. In fact, the plot of the story serves only as a means of presenting la Grable in the bustles and flounces of that era.

Betty, in the role of Kate Farley, one of Coney Island's brightest luminaries in the gay and gawdy '90's, is the bone of contention between Eddie Johnson (George Montgomery) and Joe Rocco (Cesar Romero), a rival club-owner.

Eddie is determined to get control of Joe's profitable business, and by means of a few high-handed deals, plus some nimble-witted trickery, he succeeds. With his superb showmanship and Kate's singing and dancing, the Ocean Gardens Concession becomes more profitable than ever. Not only does Eddie corral most of Joe's profits but his girl as well.

There's a tussle of wits when Joe (Romero) makes an attempt to break up the romance between Kate and Eddie by dangling some tempting bait before Kate. How she responds makes a "purty" ending, but one hardly in keeping with present-day career gals.

## "Mister Big"

**IF YOU** are a boogie-woogie tune fan and old sweet love-songs bore you stiff, "Mister Big" is a movie that you'll like a heap. For boogie is featured in a big way all through the picture. It's good juvenile fun and a made-to-order vehicle for young up-and-coming star Donald O'Connor. He's a past master at "jump" dancing and "hot" song numbers. Songbird Gloria Jean and Peggy Ryan prove excellent foils for Donnie in his jitterbug role.

All three are supposed to be serious students of the drama, but one day they play truant to appear in a jitterbug version of a Greek classic. They're having a grand time singing and hoofing in "Jimmy's Backyard," when they are discovered by their drama teachers. From then on it's a tussle between ancient Greek dramas and modern jive.

Gloria Jean's Aunt Mary (Florence Bayes) is horrified at the idea of jive, reminds her niece that she is training her to be a serious dramatic actress and not a jitterbug. How the kids plot and plan to circumvent Auntie and her old-fashioned notions forms the foundation of the story. Even young love has its moment in this piece when Donald takes Gloria Jean to the corner drug store for a soda. Radio's Ray Eberle makes his debut in this picture and does himself proud in a minor role.

## "Salute to the Marines"

**EXACTLY** what the title implies, "Salute to the Marines" is a snappy, two-fisted action picture that portrays the courageous fighting spirit of America's toughest soldiers in general and one in particular—Sergeant Bill Bailey (Wallace Beery). This role of a veteran marine, who's seen thirty years of service with the corps but who has, by some trick of fate, never been on the fighting line, is one that fits the acting talents of Mr. Beery to a T.

As Sarge Bill, Wally's great ambition is to get into active service and win a hero's citation. Before "Pearl Harbor" he is sent to the Philippines to train Filipino civilians in the business of warfare, succeeds in turning raw recruits into model fighting men. But that success doesn't cure Old Sarge's itching feet. He longs to go to the Asiatic front for real action. And his heart is heavy when part of his battalion goes and he is left behind. In disgust, Bailey accepts an honorable discharge and retires to a small settlement. Here he trains groups of boys, whips them into fighting squads. The bombing of the village by the Japs gives Bailey his chance for action, and the way he finally realizes his ambition for a hero's citation gives a surprise twist to the climax of the picture. This is Beery's first appearance in a Technicolor production.

## "Destroyer"

**WHAT** the sea and its moods means to men who make their homes on boats is graphically portrayed in "Destroyer." Steve Boleslavski (Edward G. Robinson) loves to the point of obsession the destroyer he helped to build, reveres it above home and family.

As chief boatswain's mate on the *John Paul Jones*, Boleslavski, who has been reared in the tradition of old and strict Navy methods, is insistent upon stern discipline. Because of this martinet attitude, he arouses the resentment and antagonism of his crew, especially Mickey Donohue (Glenn Ford). And to complicate matters further, Mickey falls in love with Boley's daughter, Mary (Marguerite Chapman).

But with eighty men aboard the destroyer Boley never lets up in his drive to whip them into shape—make them fighters who can defend the ship when occasion demands. This is the only way he can see to make them worthy of the gallant ship he loves. Mickey tries to get along with Boley, but he's new Navy and Boley is of the old school, which mix about as well as oil does with water. Trouble brews in the smoldering resentment of the men, and boils over when the destroyer goes into action against Japanese subs. Only then does the crew learn what Boley has been driving at.

## "The Prodigal's Mother"

**BEN AMES WILLIAMS**, author of the story on which this screen play is based, has a knack for writing heart-warming tales about ordinary folk who blossom forth in some extraordinary manner. "The Prodigal's Mother" is no exception. Republic Pictures officials were so impressed by the reactions of sneak-preview audiences to this one that they graduated it from the "B" to the "A" class before it was released.

Credit for that boost goes in great measure to the star, Mabel Paige, who plays the title role. Outside of May Robson, we never saw an actress handle a grandmother part with more distinction.

Basically, the theme is as old as China—that of a mother and her love for an errant son who runs away after a heated quarrel with his dad. But the way Miss Paige as Mrs. Freeman handles her life and affairs after her husband's death, still clinging to the faith that her son, Dan, will return, is delightful and decidedly refreshing. Especially those sequences where she finds her home taken over by the university and turned into a dormitory for boys. She sweetly but stubbornly refuses to move because it's her home, and she wants to be there where her son will expect to find her when he returns. The whole cast turns in good performances, but it's a triumph for Miss Paige.

# SHORT WAVES

Radio Brings Sport News to U. S. Troops Abroad Daily

**T**HE English section of NBC has installed a special sports news-ticker service to provide Johnny Doughboy in the British Isles and North Africa with the latest baseball returns. Last-minute scores are now broadcast daily without loss of time to short-wave listeners over station WBOS (15.21) from 4:00 to 4:15 p.m. CWT.

This is only one of three special sports shows presented daily by NBC for American fighting forces overseas. The opening program at 12:15 p.m. is a review of the preceding day's sports results. The second offering at 2:45 p.m. is a brief report on baseball with highlights on other sports.

The addition of a spot for baseball scores at 4:00 p.m. delivers the latest results to England and North Africa not more than a second later than they are heard in this country. According to Frank Nesbitt, head of the English section, "This is important to the listeners over there. It also enables men to read about the games the following morning. We have learned from letters that these scores are written down and then used as the basis for some of the sports columns appearing in camp papers for men in North Africa."

## Post-War Television

According to Dr. W. R. G. Baker, General Electric vice president, when peace comes, radio manufacturers, now devoting all their facilities to war production, will be prepared to build reasonably priced television sets in large volume. These sets will produce pictures in black and white, because color television may be too expensive and still has not been worked out to the engineers' satisfaction. The size of the picture produced by a television set will depend on public demands, but Dr. Baker points out that in his opinion the American people will not want a picture the size of the wall in their living-room. The average person probably will want a picture from twelve to fifteen inches square so that he can sit seven or eight feet away from the set and enjoy the program. There is no technical reason why motion-picture houses cannot receive and project special television pictures on their screens after the war if such a procedure can be made economically sound. Post-war relaying of programs will be done with coaxial cables or television relay

stations, or possibly a combination of both. Dr. Baker observed that television would have a tremendous effect on people's lives, quoting the old Chinese proverb that a picture is worth ten thousand words.

## Soviet Transmissions

Radio Center, Moscow, transmits several broadcasts to North America each day. Since short-wave reception from the U. S. S. R. is very erratic, each broadcast is made on various frequencies, at least one of which usually furnishes fair signal strength. The present schedule is as follows (CWT):

All transmitters are located near Moscow with the exception of the frequencies 9.545, 15.11 and 15.23, which are those of an eastern Siberia station at Komsomolsk.

According to a Calcutta broadcast, a flock of Australian merino sheep have been sent from India to China by an old caravan route, traversing a 16,000-foot path. It is the first time the route has been used for a century. The objective is to build up the Chinese wool industry. This flock forms the first consignment of non-military supplies that has been sent to China from India, following an agreement on the route with the Tibetan government.

## Menace to the Four Freedoms

(Continued from Page 1)

So we wonder: Have we done the smart thing in not retaliating against the few hundred Japanese prisoners in our hands? The answer is that retaliation of that type would do more harm than good.

The Japanese people respect only one language at home or abroad. That is the language of superior force. They are realistic enough to know that we have superior force over the few hundred Jap prisoners now in our hands. Anything we do to these prisoners by way of retaliation will result only in the execution of more Americans in Japan.

The masses of the Japanese people have not felt the armed might of America. Until they do feel it, they will not be impressed by what we do to helpless and defenseless prisoners of war. The Jap people will continue to revel in the barbarism which their leaders stage for their entertainment—just as men once enjoyed the spectacle of foreign "heathens" being thrown to the lions.

I will never forget what one high Japanese official, in a spectacular burst of frankness, told me after Pearl Harbor:

"The Japanese people demand that we punish Americans for daring to resist His Imperial Majesty's armed forces. And we intend to punish you American correspondents and radio commentators first."

They did. The press and radio have told you how.

But this Japanese official was not trying to dodge his share of responsibility for the atrocities committed upon Americans and citizens of the other United Nations. He was simply telling the truth. The water cure, the thousand stabs, rapings, bayonetings and rubber-hose beatings were widely popular among the Japanese people. He was simply saying that anyone who wanted to be a leader in Japan—a militarist—had to answer this popular demand for ruthless persecution of the heathens who refused to accept Hirohito's leadership in "eternal salvation."

The truth is that these so-called militarists of Japan are not freaks within their own country. They are not a self-perpetuating aristocracy. They are the Japanese people. They come from the Japanese people. The most important of them come from simple Japanese homes in the small towns, fishing villages and farms of their country. They are brought up like all Japanese. They are behaving exactly as Japanese society and tradition says they shall behave. They are the leaders of Japan only because they are the most proficient manifestation of the common mores and ambitions of the Japanese people as a whole. The complaint most commonly heard against the "militarists" in Japan is that they are too "timid" and too "shrew" in carrying out low aggressions. And that feeling has cost many of them their lives to assassins who "played" to the applause of the entire nation.

Some Americans still try to defend the Japanese people on the idealistic grounds that some Japanese are Christians. Therefore, by some strange twist of logic, these Japanese are supposed to be pro-American, or pro-Western. But there are fewer than 50,000 sincere Christians in all Japan. Fifty thousand out of 85,000,000. There are far fewer real Christians in Japan than there are Shintoists in the United States. And all the "Christian" churches in Japan have pledged their loyalty and their lives to Hirohito, whom they believe in their hearts to be the real man god.

The Japanese people have the exact leadership they themselves created, trained and idolized in their own towns and villages. That leadership is popular. It caters to the national flavor for blood—the blood of the heathen unbelievers who deny the divinity of Hirohito. The Japanese people are responsible for having encouraged the so-called militarists to wage this war. And it is upon them, as well as the "militarists," that we must heap our vengeance when our war strategy permits. Then, and only then, will the menace to civilization's four freedoms be erased!

**T**HE ink has been dry for 10, these many weeks, since the Philharmonic-Symphony Society and the United States Rubber Company signed contracts to give year-round radio music via CBS. The tremendous possibilities of the association, however, have scarcely been exhausted. The event is a signal one in musical annals, particularly since the Philharmonic-Symphony had never had a commercial sponsor before. And it is interesting to note that both organizations are centenarians, the Society being 101 years old, the United States Rubber Company one hundred.

In its century of music-making the Society has undergone many changes. There have been amalgamations with other orchestras, there have been changes in business policy and also, I might add, in musical policy. The Philharmonic-Symphony, however, has ever striven for higher and higher goals in its long career. Sometimes mistakes were made, but these same mistakes proved often the very means to a better end.

In the Sunday afternoon broadcasts over the Columbia Broadcasting System the Philharmonic-Symphony has won an amazing number of listeners during the past thirteen years. These are loyal listeners, most of them, who would no more think of foregoing that symphonic program than doing without Sunday dinner.

The present set-up, involving intermission period presentations by noted figures in literature, the theater and the films—possibly including other sources—is a departure from the familiar offerings of the past. The brilliant and pertinent observations of Deems Taylor, for instance, are being and will continue to be missed by many listeners.

Yet music and the historical feature are not strange mates, nor should they be, particularly at this time. Carl Van Doren, celebrated historian, and his distinguished collaborators of the intermission period seem to have no major problem there. Mr. Van Doren calls the memorable utterances of our

famous figures the "American Scriptures." They belong, of course, to the ever mounting credo of Americanism that will help to win this war. Now, more than ever, we must be made aware of these utterances. We must relate them to the period in which they were born, and relate them, in turn, to our own time, to our present problems, with the view, always, of becoming united strongly during the most perilous era of our existence.

#### Youth Serves

It would be surprising if Raymond Paige, American, were not devoted to American music. He is one conductor who grew up with the classics, as well as the popular—it's about time we began to call it the folk—music of this country.

On Tuesday evenings Raymond Paige and his "Young Americans" orchestra plays for your supper. They play again for a midnight snack, perhaps, later in the evening. That is in order to cover the whole NBC network. "But, on the level," he told the writer at luncheon recently, "this is a real youth orchestra."

He watched with soaring interest the work of young native musicians throughout the country when he was associated with the American Musical Arts Foundation. Out of that study, which entailed a close scrutiny of many youngsters, he formulated a plan to create an orchestra whose members should

be American, young and exceptionally gifted. In all, he auditioned some 3,500 male and female musicians.

Out of them he selected a stellar one hundred, and for his present orchestra drew on these to the tune of fifty or thereabouts. He has trained the young musicians himself. "The draft, naturally, makes heavy inroads on the membership," he remarked, "so I have to make continual replacements. But the raw material is there and you can take my word for it that the material is anything but raw."

Some of them come from famous American schools of music, others from dance bands, thus proving, I suppose, that a musician is a musician no matter where he got his learning.

Mr. Paige, who is just touching forty-three, has had an extensive and profitable career as a conductor. On the radio he has been associated with such programs as "Hollywood Hotel," "99 Men and a Girl" and "California Melodies." His movie ventures include "Hollywood Hotel" and "Hawaii Calls." As batonist he has presided over the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Hollywood Bowl symphony and others.

Mr. Paige's programs over the Blue Network will be as much American as the public can take—which should be a great deal. Europe used once to be the important training-ground for musical artists. With Mr. Paige's help we may soon be able to say good-bye to all that.

She declares, quite readily, that she left Jimmy Dorsey not because singing with a band grew tiresome but because she wanted a chance to sing the less hysterical songs. Four years of pounding away metrically gave her an understanding of rhythm which she can ever put to good advantage.

They tell us that Miss O'Connell has developed a new song style. Examining the assertion—and also the situation—one finds that her forte now is understatement, which she makes a feature of in her Blue Network broadcasts. She doesn't shout. She doesn't bubble over with cute vocal mannerisms. She merely sings romantically, soulfully.

One isn't prepared to say whether or not the Lima (Ohio) born chanteuse will ever make the operatic or concert grade. But she is talented and young enough—just twenty-three—to give that a fling sometime, provided she can put in the practise and study hours before trying it.

After all, it is quite a jump from *Six Lessons from Madame La Zonga* and *Murder, He Says* to Puccini's *Tosca*. From the looks of things, Miss O'Connell will steer clear of the Metropolitan. For all one knows, the Metropolitan may be doing a good job of steering clear on its own account.

But Miss O'Connell is very contented with what she is doing now. So are numerous radio fans. The Metropolitan can wait—maybe forever.

cial permission to build—and probably waiting long months until the Federal Communications Commission could get around to acting upon them.

In February of this year, however, the FCC changed its mind and announced that, upon suitable request, it would be glad to reinstate any of the dismissed applications. They would be kept on file for action just as soon as the war ends and things begin to get back to normal.

In other words, for FM it was very much like being pushed out of a long line and then, some time later, being told that its place in line would be restored.

The decision to help FM development in this fashion was made, according to Chairman James L. Fly of the Federal Communications Commission, "simply because we want to encourage FM . . . as much as we can."

### Here's What Happened

The other day Washington reported on the results of its February offer to reinstate pre-war FM applications. Practically everybody who wanted to build an FM station before the war started apparently still feels the same way about it. Over ninety percent of the applicants were quick to ask for reinstatement, attesting to the high degree of enthusiasm which continues to prevail among radio people.

If you live in one of these cities, the chances are good that you may be enjoying local FM reception a lot sooner than you might have otherwise: Lexington, Ky.; New Bedford, Mass.; Ashland, Ky.; Baltimore, Md.; Syracuse, N. Y.; Louisville, Ky.; Washington; St. Louis; Reading, Pa.; Houston, Texas; Indianapolis, Ind.; Grand Rapids, Mich.; Trenton, N. J.; Providence, R. I.; Manchester, N. H.; Winston-Salem, N. C.; Rockford, Ill.; San Bernardino, Calif., and Albany, N. Y.

Increased service is also in immediate post-war prospect for Boston, Los Angeles, New York, Detroit, San Francisco, Chicago and Cleveland.

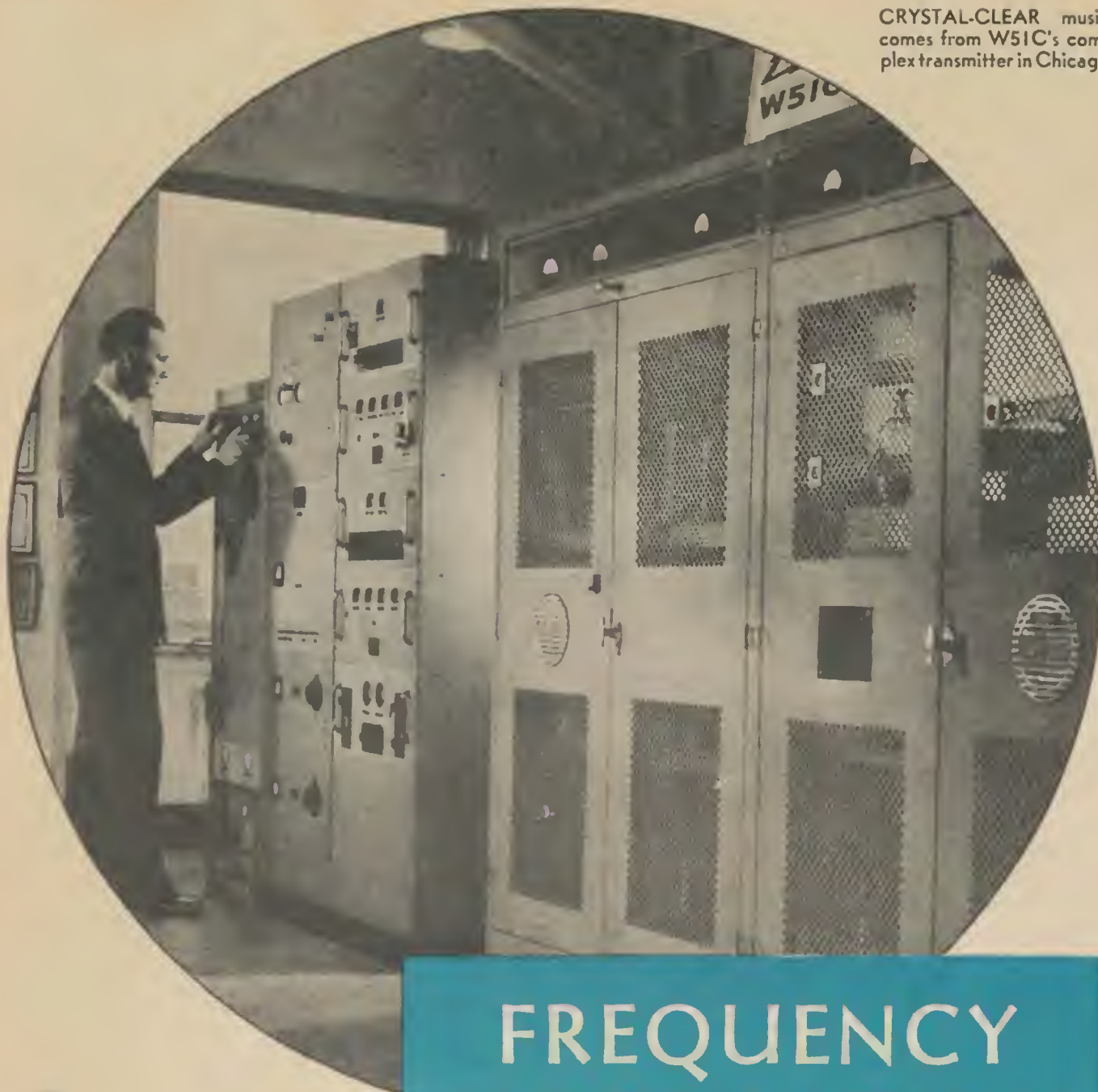
### Another School Station

FM station WBEZ, operated by the Chicago Board of Education, is now on the air Mondays through Fridays, broadcasting programs of fourteen regular weekly series which are produced by the Radio Council of the Chicago Public Schools. WBEZ is a newcomer to the ranks of non-commercial educational stations operating in the FM broadcast band, where five channels were set aside for the broadcasting activities of schools, colleges and similar institutions.

Other cities with educational FM transmitters are Cleveland (WBOE), San Francisco (KALW), New York (WNYE), San Diego (KSDS) and Memphis (WMBE).

WBEZ transmits on 42.5 megacycles (calibrated at "25" on the dials of some FM receivers) and will not, of course, be heard during the summer months when schools are closed. Chicago educators first made use of radio in the fall of 1937, when an epidemic of poliomyelitis made it advisable for school children to stay at home temporarily. All classes were suspended and the help of ordinary AM stations was enlisted so that lessons could be broadcast over the air.

The arrangement proved so successful that the board continued to use the AM stations as a means of supplementing classroom work. The final step has been the construction of FM station WBEZ so that full utilization is possible of broadcasting as an educational medium.

## FM Seen as an Outstanding Industry in the Post-War Period; W71SB Debuts in South Bend

**T**HE nation's total of noise-free FM stations was increased by still one more in May when W71SB, the FM transmitter of the South Bend (Ind.) Tribune, went on the air. This brings to a total of forty-eight the number of frequency-modulation stations operating on regular schedules throughout the country.

W71SB is Indiana's third FM outlet, although the first to be heard in South Bend. Already on the air for some time are W45V, Evansville, and W49FW in Fort Wayne. The new station, because of war-time equipment shortages, will operate at reduced power for the duration, covering only a central portion of the full 4,300 square miles it is authorized eventually to serve.

### Meeting of the Clan

FM boosters gathered in force recently when FM Broadcasters, Inc., the national association whose membership includes the country's leading FM stations, held its fourth annual session at Chicago to discuss progress and plans of noise-free, full-fidelity broadcasting.

Outspoken enthusiasm for the manner in which FM is weathering the war was a keynote of the meeting. None of the station owners and operators present expressed discouragement over war-time curtailments or indicated plans to abandon FM activities. All looked forward optimistically to the return of peace, with a general be-

lief prevailing that frequency modulation will be among the outstanding industries of the post-war period.

During the session twenty new members were accepted into FM Broadcasters, Inc.—an association which operates as a national trade group to protect and promote the interests of frequency-modulation broadcasting. Its membership roster now includes all but four of the commercial FM outlets in the country, as well as a number of experimental and educational stations, and several manufacturers of FM equipment.

Walter J. Damm of W55M, Milwaukee, was re-elected president of the group, with T. C. Streibert of W71NY, New York, continuing as vice president.

### Post-War Insurance for FM

Late last February the Federal Communications Commission, which has authority over all broadcasting in

this country, came forth with a pronouncement of considerable importance to FM. It's important because it opens the way for swifter expansion of FM broadcasting as a post-war industry.

To understand why, we must go back to the time when America was attacked by the enemy. There was then a sizable number of applications pending at Washington from people all over the nation who wanted permission to build new FM stations. Several months after the war started, however, it became evident that vital equipment could no longer be spared for the construction of new civilian radio transmitters, antenna towers, broadcasting studios and similar installations. So, early in 1942, Washington simply dismissed all the applications which were then waiting. It meant that after the war these people would be faced with the lengthy task of making new plans, filling out new application blanks, reapplying for offi-

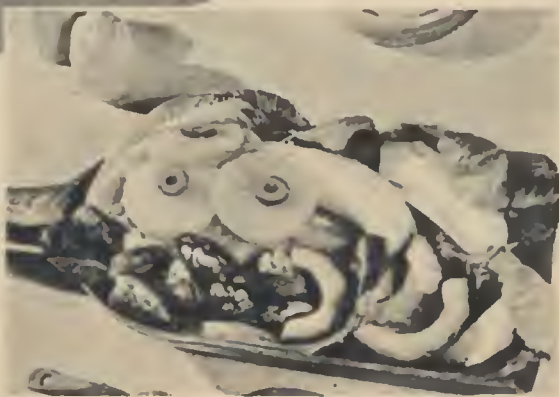

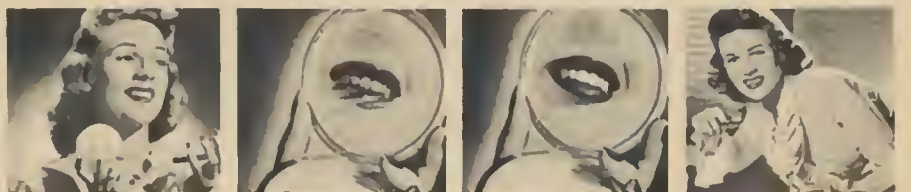

## BE KIND TO YOUR CLOTHES

EVERY well-groomed woman realizes that to keep up with fashion and to look fashionably dressed at all times, she must take regular inventory of her clothes. She makes a list (with pencil and paper) of every single wearable item in her closet and dresser drawers. She puts those that need alterations and repairs in one column, those that need cleaning and pressing in another, those that can be given to some charitable organization or another in column three, and finally, in the last column, she lists the clothes that are in good condition. This isn't a yearly refurbishing—it's done every two months or so by this well-groomed person. When all the alterations, cleaning and what-nots are complete, then (and then only) is she ready to decide just what new additions are needed for her. Sometimes she doesn't even need anything.

Why don't you use this same system? Honestly, you'll find it comparatively simple to sort out your clothes. In the long run, you'll be saving time. For

Craig was at Guadalcanal for six months. At the height of the Japanese attack, he was severely wounded when a bomb exploded, burying him in a foxhole. When his men dug him out, Craig discovered that his left leg was useless. But he was the only officer at the battle-station and there was no time to seek medical aid. So for eighteen days he continued to direct his men in combat. As a result, his leg is partially paralyzed.

Now at the Corona Naval Hospital in San Diego, Craig faces a long siege of treatments in the hope that he can again get back into active service. The only time he has been away from the hospital, since he entered it four months ago, was the day he and his Barbara were quietly married in a small Hollywood church.

A deserving tribute from the U. S. government came to Craig the week of his wedding. He was promoted to the rank of captain. His record as a fighting marine merited it—made him a hero. But we can't help wondering a bit how some Hollywood actors, who ran temperatures looking for a nice soft spot in this global scrap, feel when they view Craig's part in it.

taken a pretty serious turn. Tomorrow night should tell us a lot . . ."

dresses, blouses and hats may be cut out of "Press-On." 4. Hubby's frayed or torn shirts can be mended with white mending tape.

As a matter of fact, you can mend shoe linings, vacuum-cleaner bags, repair books, rugs, slip covers, window shades and a million other things that you might find need repair. Don't take my word for it, though, try the tape yourself and see what wonderful things it can do.

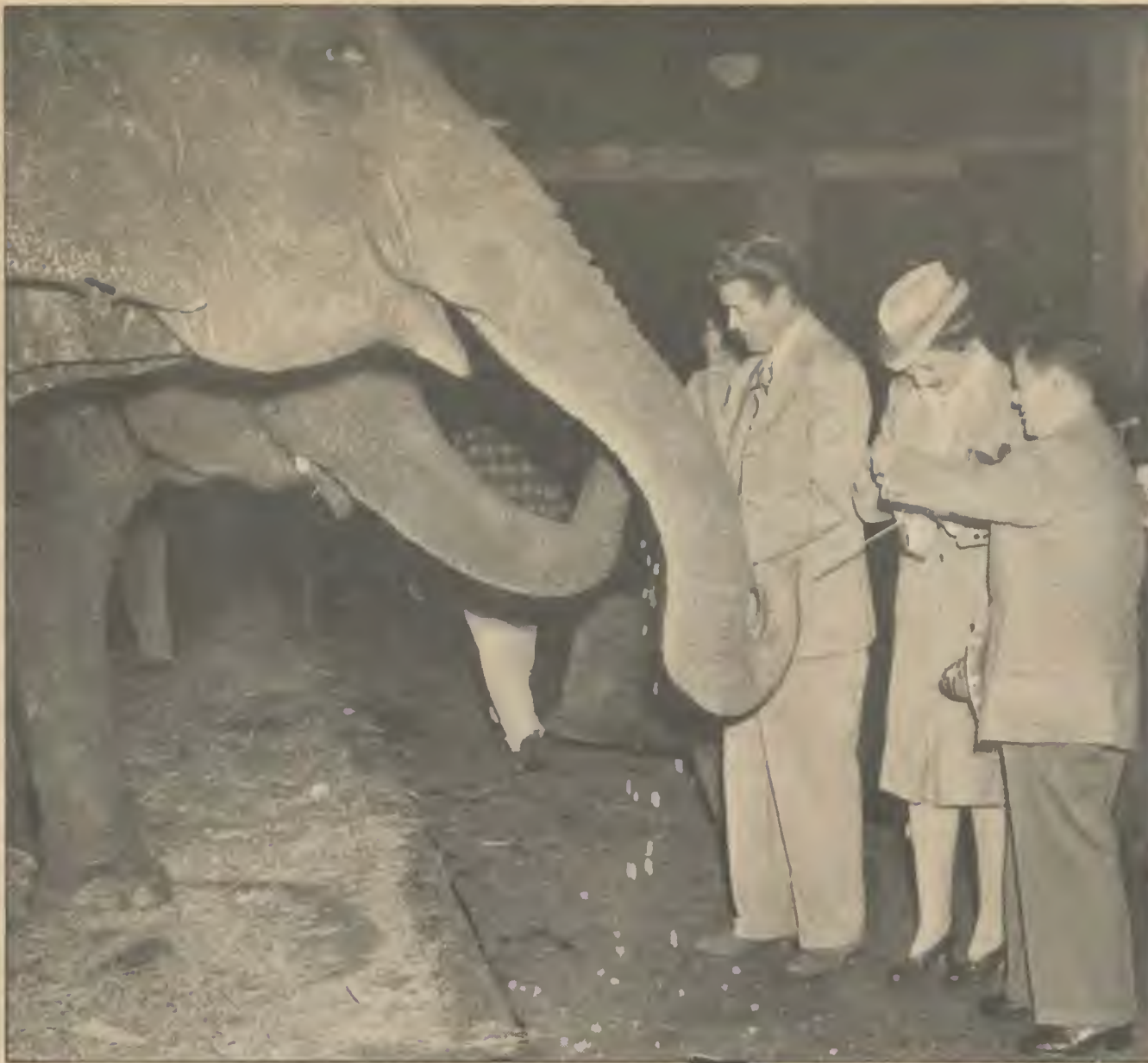
### Care for Stockings

To make precious stockings last longer, give them plenty of attention. For instance, remove all your rings, junk jewelry and so forth before you don stockings or launder them. Always buy the stockings that fit properly. Never fasten them below the heavy welt at top—and never use garters that have lost their elasticity. Always attach garters while you are seated to insure proper adjustment for knee action without undue strain. Always wash your stockings in Lux after each wearing and they'll give better service. Carefully squeeze suds through the stockings. Rinse well in lukewarm water. Don't twist or wring, but squeeze out the water. Hang on smooth rod to dry; avoid the use of clothespins. Keep away from excessive direct heat and sunlight. Never, never wear rayon stockings until they are thoroughly dry. Rayons washed at night will not be completely dry and ready to wear the next morning. Allow at least thirty-six hours' drying time after each washing. Alternate wearing your rayon hose if you want them to last longer.

### Care for Your Shoes

Now that we can get only one pair of shoes every few months (unless our husband is eager to part with his coupon) we'd better take good care of what we have. Here are the rules for good shoe care: When you're not wearing them, keep your shoes on shoe-trees or stuff the toes with balls of newspaper. Keep them on a shoe-rack—not on the floor where they can gather all kinds of dust and dirt. Keep shoes away from heat. If they get wet, let them dry at normal room temperature, never near a radiator or fire. Keep your shoes well polished and always clean. Before storing shoes away for the next season, polish them well and wrap in tissue paper. And do buy the proper polish—and make sure you use it often. Paste, cream and liquid wax are for smooth leathers, such as kid, calf and alligator. Suede and gabardine dressing are for nappy leathers such as suede and buckskin fabric. To get further benefit from your old shoes, try dressing them up with pretty clips and dainty bows, as Elizabeth Reller does in the pictures at the beginning of this article—you'll be surprised how smart they can look and will look if you have just a little time and patience to pamper them a little. Maybe all this is a little more trouble than you're used to, but it certainly is worth it when the compliments start flying.

from 7:00 to midnight, positively, without exception and no foolin'! So this man-child had braved the most horrible night in years, and come to the canteen, and waited for Dinah to come and sing, and no soap. Now, this is a very serious situation! I wasn't much younger than he when my life was blackened for a year because of a lesser tragedy. So I told him, carefully, that it wasn't Dinah Shore's night to be at the canteen. I said I knew Dinah Shore very well—which was a lie, because I don't know you at all—except that I get goose-pimples when your voice comes into my living-room over two radios, you being with me a two-radio program. doing a job, he wants to be a part of a team and to lose his identity completely in the work of the men who are with him. If Gable were to shoot down two Axis planes in a dog-fight it would be his desire that he not be mentioned in the action, since he is explicit on the fact that no man in a bomber can be singled out as the one responsible. The man who squeezes the trigger owes his score to the man who pilots the bomber, he in turn would be lost without the navigator, and so on down the line.

Clark once told a young actor: "Look, son, don't try to do anything the way I do it, or like anybody else does it. Don't be a celebrity worshiper." In that comment is the key to what Gable always avoided in Hollywood, which is a place where celebrities worship celebrities.

A psychiatrist probably would reach back into the man's childhood to show that his character in this regard developed when his mother died while Clark was still an infant. The first five years of his life were spent on a farm with his grandparents. His only playmate was a dog and there wasn't another kid within five miles of the place. Like many another man, Clark doubtless grew up with that inner feeling someone vividly described by saying, "The more I see of most people the more I like dogs."

There have been stories to the effect that Gable graduated to acting after a career as a laborer in oil fields and lumber camps. The reverse is true. Clark trod the boards for the first time when going to night school at the University of Akron, where he met a couple of actors at a lunch-counter and talked the manager of the local stock company into letting him play a "super" for no pay.

After Clark's stepmother died, Bill Gable (Clark's father) got lonesome, sold the farm and asked Clark to go with him to Oklahoma to see if they could strike it rich in the oil fields. They didn't, and Clark joined a traveling stock company, the trail of which lead him to Oregon, near starvation and the lumber business. The story of his rise to screen fame and of the two women who shared his life as wives before he met Carole Lombard is too familiar for retelling. It is sufficient to say that he never did anything in his life that took advantage of others for the sake of his own advancement.

I first met Clark several years ago when assigned to do a newspaper feature story on him. "To hell with talking," Gable said after the introduction. "If it hadn't been for you I'd be out shooting this afternoon. Why not come along with me, and you can write what you please tonight." So we climbed into Clark's car and headed out for the clay-pigeon range. We discovered that we had a friend in common—the late "Captain Billy" Fawcett, a rugged veteran of the first World War who was a champion skeet-shooter. Gable talked about the fun he'd had that summer at the captain's place in northern Minnesota, and in between rounds of shooting kept his conversation strictly on the matter of guns and men who loved them.

Here was a man who earned \$5,000 a week, who spent his working hours with glamorous women like Jean Harlow, Joan Crawford and all the rest of the exciting stars of the day, interested only in people unknown to the public.

It struck me as odd that he seldom mentioned his wife, Carole Lombard, either in general conversations or in

interviews. Later I learned that he believed that career wives were more likely to be happy wives than those who stayed at home waiting for their husbands, and that there should be no connection between his career and hers. In this way, Carole and Clark had the nearest approach to a normal life as any couple in Hollywood.

That this was true I found out in a simple observation when I visited them at their Encino ranch home in late November, the year before Carole's tragic plane crash. It was around ten in the morning. Gable showed up in his usual maroon dressing-gown and Carole appeared a few moments later in a pale-blue housecoat. They had finished the decorating of their Christmas tree the night before, and packages were stacked knee-deep around the room. They explained that they liked Christmas and they darned well were going to prolong the event as long as possible.

I told Carole that I was planning to buy a dog. She laughed as she said, "Don't ask Clark's advice—he'll talk you into a nice, sensible hunting-dog. Get a silly one like Commissioner, to make your wife happy." Commissioner was the dachshund, a splendid red sausage animal with more phony dignity than a small-town justice of the peace. He was Carole's and gave the impression that he tolerated Clark around the place only for her sake.

On this particular morning California was enjoying one of its famous drizzles. We all went out to the barn, getting soaking wet on the way, where Clark showed off a brand-new calf and we spent the morning talking about farms a fellow would like to have some day when he could get out of the movie racket. At the time, Gable did not know that he was soon to be out of the movies or that his home was to be broken by the accident that cut short Carole's life as she was finishing her war-bond tour.

"There's only twenty acres here," he explained. "It's nice and as comfortable as you could want it and still be close to work, but what I want is a ranch so large that when hunting season comes all I have to do is pick up my gun, whistle for the dog and get going! It's the old routine—you're born on a farm. You get ambitious. You work hard, go to the big city and become a 'success.' Then you're really ambitious. You work like hell trying to get enough money so you can go back to the farm."

I know how much of the public feels about movie actors who turn soldier. They are naturally distrustful that such a man, devoting his life to playing-acting, can be competent when he's doing something grim and real. On the other hand, knowing him from an impartial point of view, I can say that Gable, who is not the typical actor, gives me a comfortable feeling. In my mind's eye I like to picture most of our fighting men as being men like Clark Gable. Calm men with their feet on the ground. Men who are slow to anger but efficient and quick to act when events demand it. Men who know that what they are fighting for has to do with the importance of hunting seasons to come, with a man's right to go out with his dog and bring back the limf. Men who want to get back to the simple diplomacy of live and let live.

As Bill Gable (Clark's dad) puts it, the happy day will be when the whole nasty show is over, the door swings wide and Clark calls, "Hey, Pa, what's for supper?"

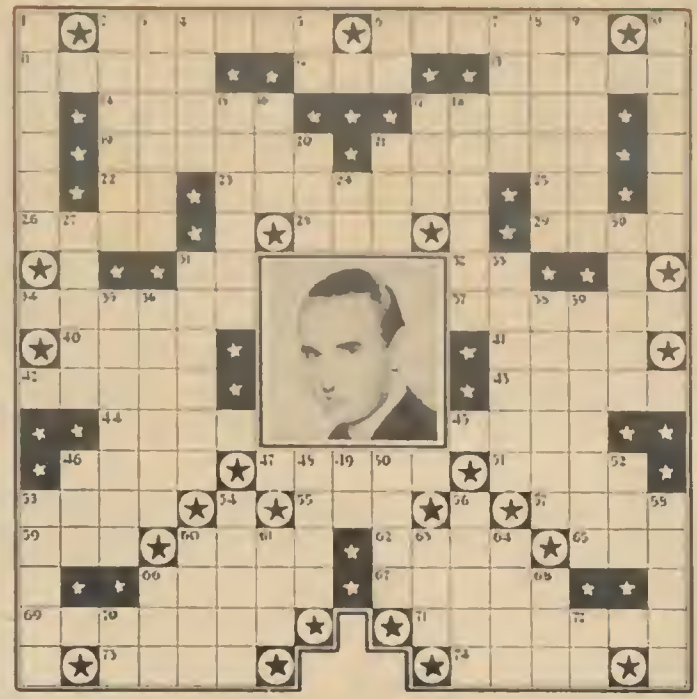

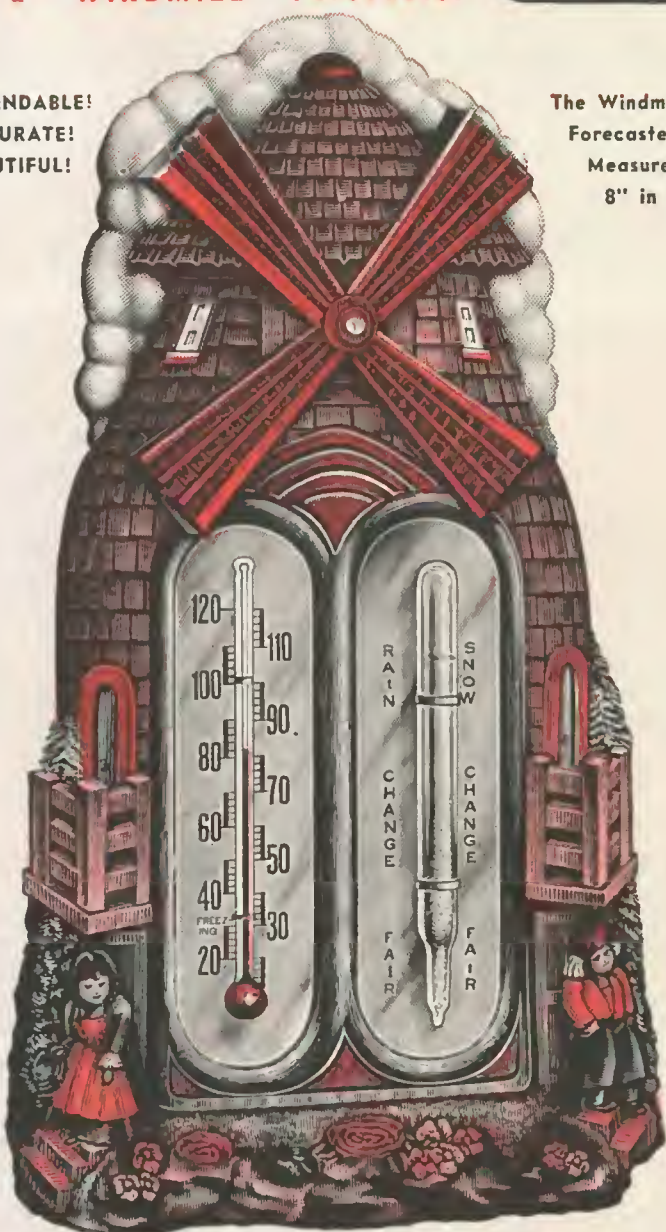

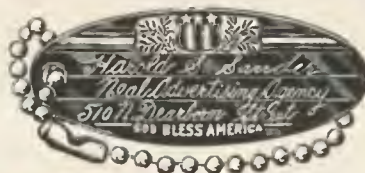
