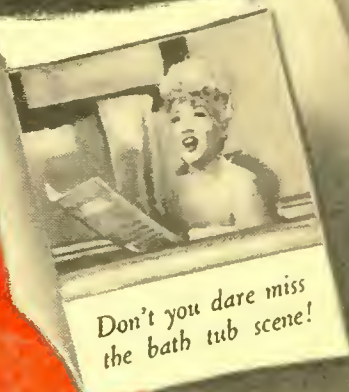

**A**ND I'm proud of it! From the day I met her in college in 1931, our existence has been a cooperative one. I was trying to work my way along in the depression, and had fallen upon such evil money-making days I was forced to take a job as a model in the art department for thirty-five cents a posing hour.

If it had not been for the art students such as she was making up the class, there wouldn't have been need for me to sit around clad in a smile for people to sketch—therefore, no thirty-five cents an hour.

When I graduated in 1933, she was standing at the door of the Coliseum to catch my cap and gown and diploma as I threw them and ran to an eight-dollar-a-week newspaper chore which had been paying me part-time money.

Before we were married, I was always afraid I'd be one of those bores who spend their time at home talking shop. I was working in and writing about the show business, which is the shop-talkiest of all businesses. So I used to take her with me on all my night-time assignments.

Nearly every newspaper column I ever wrote was checked with her before publication, and the same is true of my broadcasts. If she looked down her nose at a gag, I respected her judgment and deleted it. Thus, after a time, the things I talked about at home were as much a part of her daily life as they were office problems with me.

Prior to the war, I was writing theatrical and feature stuff for eleven newspapers, plus contributing to the tremendous wordage (not all good) of the press-association wires. When Uncle Sam opened the gate to

gather his kids to khaki in 1940, and my turn, as a reserve officer, came in November, it terminated my consecutive nightly broadcasting string at 889 microphone appearances.

Much to my wife's amazement, as she listened to that final broadcast from me as a civilian, she heard that by skulduggery with my sponsor and publishers that she was to take over

the whole business when I went into uniform. She was totally unprepared for it, and it was a sort of dirty trick to have the first news of it come blaring out of the loudspeaker at her. But she reacted as she always has under pressure and went quietly about doing the best she could.

She carried the broadcast until the contract expired, and her last newspaper contribution was July 18, 1943, two days before she went GI.

She has followed me rarely during the time I've been in the Army, because neither of us thought much of trying to dovetail domestic life with the whims of the War Department. Besides, I believe an officer should live with his troops, holding little brief for those who leave the field at night to go home. She has been a believer in wives who are without dependents doing something which will also help in the war effort.

For a little guy (she's five feet one, weighs 103 pounds), as quiet and reserved as the little lady she is, I think she has done very well shouldering burdens thrown on her.

Now that she has volunteered for the WAC, I am her first champion and will continue to be her constant rooster.

Her joining-up is not a sudden idea. She thought about it seriously when the corps first started. In fact, I remember now that she wrote me asking what she could give as an example of qualities of leadership. Thinking she was kidding, I suggested:

"Tell 'em you've been leading me around by the nose for seven years."

She has been debating the various services since that time, wondering whether it should be the Wacs, the (Continued on Page 59)

# RED BARBER TALKS SHOP

A Veteran World Series Announcer  
Answers Some Pertinent Questions  
About America's Great Sport Classic

**M**R. BARBER, the question of whether or not baseball can exist in war-time has been asked many times. We think it has been answered in the fact that we are now approaching another World Series. And from all indications, we feel that interest in the baseball classic this year is as high as it has ever been.

Also, from all reports, our boys in the fighting zones and the camps here at home are showing a keener interest—more than ever before—in the trials of the beloved "Bums," the success of the Yanks and Cards, or whatever their favorite team might be. The only explanation we can find for that is that baseball most nearly symbolizes the democratic sporting and fighting spirit of Americans.

We are happy to note, too, that plans have been made to short-wave a description of all the games of the series to our fighting forces wherever they may be. And you, Red, will probably be the guy at the other end telling 'em all about it.

As for the part baseball plays in morale at home, we think the attendance records take care of that. There are many questions to be asked about baseball in war-time, the coming war-time World Series in particular, and we thought that you as radio's recognized baseball authority would answer some of them for us:

1. *How would the prospective war-time pennant winners stack up against those in the past? For the sake of comparison, let's assume it will be the Cards and the Yanks again. They seem to have the inside track at this writing.*

Red Barber: This is written late in August and right now the Yankees and Cardinals have large leads and give no indications of losing them. Should they go into the series, then for the answer we have the same clubs that met last year, and we have an exact measuring stick.

It is the opinion of many baseball men that the champion Cardinals are even stronger now than when they won a year ago. Certainly they are just as strong. The infield with Sanders at first and Klein at second is a better infield than a year ago. Marion and Kurowski remain at short and third. The catching is the same with Walker Cooper hitting better. The pitching staff has not produced the single star to replace Beazley but it has come through with several young men who balance it. Harry Walker has been an excellent center fielder in Terry Moore's old job, and while he isn't quite the ground coverer, he can cover plenty, and is a much more dangerous and consistent hitter than Terry. Last year's first baseman,

Hopp, and Johnny Litwhiler are the left fielders, while Stan Musial in right has come into his own as a great player this season—he has blossomed, and his maturing has about evened the outfield scales. Add in the confidence of winning last year, and again in the lead this year; add in the smooth balancing time and Manager Southworth have blended into the club, and I join those who regard the Cardinals as a better team now than a year ago.



Joe McCarthy has a corner on the managerial records for all-time success. He has had great players through the years, and he has handled them, got the most out of them and created powerful teams. This year he has done a masterful job of switching, polishing, and guiding. He took Nick Etten and made him a fine first baseman who's had his greatest season. He sent Lindell from the mound to the outfield. He fitted rookie Bill Johnson into the left side of the infield, with the veteran Crosetti. With Joe Gordon left of his regular inner defense he has given us an excellent first line. No one replaces a star like DiMaggio.

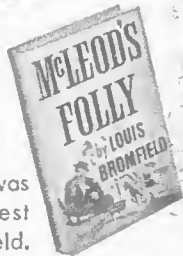

THE poem wasn't very good. Actually it could hardly be called a poem, but in its clumsy rime there was a good deal of meaning. A marine sergeant who had been contemplating Hedy Lamarr at the Hollywood Canteen for several weeks each Friday night wrote it:

Hedy Lamarr, Hedy Lamarr,  
Stand still just where you are.  
Keep that smile on your sweet face—  
I'll kiss it off as we embrace.

The marine is not the first man who was moved to poetry at the sight of Hedy Lamarr. Mostly, though, the inspired words have been accompanied by rare gems and a landslide of orchids and gardenias. The marine sent his poem with a cake, for he was a baker in his company—better baker than poet. Without fear of contradiction, I can say that Hedy appreciated this more than the polished technique of the many men who have courted her. But on the following Friday she told the ardent marine gently, "You shouldn't have written that." Then,

seeing that she should have said almost anything else, she thanked him profusely for the cake and explained that she was engaged. "A marine," she pointed out, "wouldn't care for a girl who could forget she was engaged, particularly since it only happened to me yesterday."

With that she called to her husband-to-be, actor John Loder, who was near by wiping dishes, and introduced the two. The marine went away not too happy, but he won't forget Hedy, because she didn't laugh at him.

"That Hedy," he told a friend expressively, "is a beauty thing."

This little story tells a great deal about the fabulous Hedy Lamarr. It explains, in a way, why a lady of her beauty has been so notably unsuccessful in love. She considers the emotion something you can't quite define but one totally removed from the influences of money, society, beauty and fame. If husband John Loder can retain the same idea, they should put an end to the "to be continued" aspect of Hedy's romances until now.

Hedy's first husband, Fritz Mandl,

the Austrian munitions maker, is said to have caused her considerable grief because of his violent protestations over a film called "Ecstasy," in which she appeared while still in her teens. Her second husband, Gene Markey, a fine gentleman who's now a naval officer, was divorced by reason of "grievous mental anguish" after slightly more than a year of married life. The complaint was not specific, but in the opinion of some the real reason for the split was partially because Hedy has "peasant" leanings. She adopted a son whom she named James and became so motherly and domestic that her married happiness fell apart.

The saga of Hedy's great beauty and mysterious charm is so great that most men are slightly disillusioned to discover that her wardrobe consists of anything in between movie costumes, lounging-ropes and evening gowns. You are always aware first of your friends' faults—that's why they are friends, because you overlook the traits that trip them up and they overlook yours. Hedy is one of those people who persistently make their first judgment their last. Only painful experience and time provide the cure.

At twenty-nine, Hedy can recall how, as Hedwig Eve Maria Kiesler, daughter of a Vienna banker, she obtained her first job as an actress at the age of fifteen without her father's knowledge. When he protested, she continued, for she felt that there was nothing wrong in it. She was right in a way, but if she, like many another girl the world over had "listened to Dad" and waited a while, she might

"RADIO was the salvation of the Walker family," said Robert when interviewed recently. "There was a time when none of us would have eaten if it hadn't been for the small parts I did on air shows. The stage would have none of me."

He was happy when, instead of censuring him, his neighbors all admired him for his sincerity and became Walker boosters.

Ever since he was a freshman at the Army and Navy Academy in San Diego, where he was sent from Utah because he cut one too many capers in his home town of Salt Lake City, Bob wanted to be an actor.

It was during student days at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York that he met Jennifer Jones, the lady who is now Mrs. Walker. They worked and rehearsed together and were great pals. ## ELLA MAE MORSE

Number One Interpreter of That Peculiar Bit of Americana, "Hot Jive Tunes," Ella Mae's a Blues Singer With a Texas Accent

ELLA MAE MORSE, the little girl from Dallas, Texas, who set all the juke-box addicts of the nation whistling and dancing to Cow Cow Boogie and Mr. Five by Five, woke one day to find herself a personage in the entertainment world and didn't know just how to take it. In fact, Ella Mae was frankly confused. And for good reason. Jimmy Dorsey, the bandleader, had fired her not so long before because she couldn't sing, and a Dallas announcer had told her that she better get in some other business or else start learning to sing like Kate Smith if she hoped to succeed.

Now, Ella Mae, who describes her singing as "blues with a Texas accent," comes from a musical family and began warbling with the Morse family orchestra at the age of twelve. She was only fifteen when she auditioned for Dorsey at the Adolphus Hotel in Dallas, but he hired her on the spot and took her to New York, where he was opening at the Hotel New Yorker.

What caused Ella Mae to fail in her first big break is not yet clear in her mind even today. Perhaps it was a combination of extreme youth and fear. At any rate, she returned to Dallas very much a lassie in the doldrums.

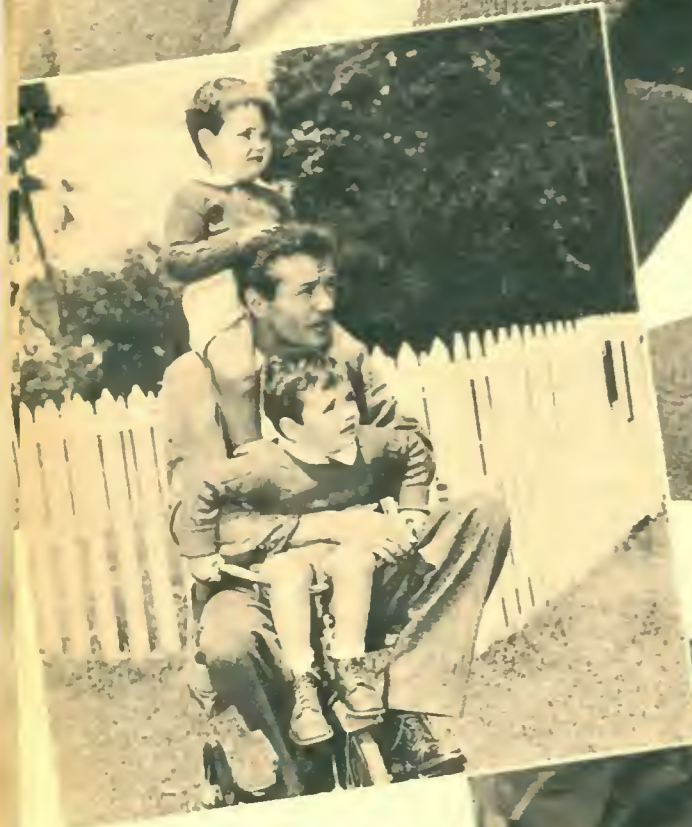

Ella Mae makes her home in Hollywood now and is combining movies with her radio work. In private life, she is Mrs. Richard Showalter and the mother of a son named Richard, too, who made his debut last April. Now she is charting her course for success in the movies. But even though Ella Mae is career-minded, she never puts it ahead of a happy home life.

# Gene Autry - Warrior

Three Hundred Solo Flying Hours Has Earned Gene Autry a Pilot's License in America's Air Forces. Now He's Rarin' to Go Overseas

**J**OYOUS nickers echoed briefly over Melody Ranch recently when Gene Autry's famous horse Champion and his great golden Palomino, Robin Hood, welcomed their master home on a flying two-day leave, crowded in at the end of Gene's eleven-week tour of Army camps.

In those short forty-eight hours, Sergeant Gene Autry, brown as a nut and looking right as rain, revisited all his old haunts at the ranch, dropped in on old friends, tried to recapture the magic of his trailway days with Champ and Robin Hood. The horses did their best to help by showing their master that they hadn't forgotten a single trick that he had taught them. For animals are smart, and perhaps they sensed, even though they couldn't put it in the words of humans, that this was Sergeant Gene's last chance to say good-bye to Melody Ranch and carefree days with them before he entered training as a flight officer in either the Air Transport or Ferry Command. A commercial pilot's license, earned through over three hundred hours of solo flying, had won him that promotion.

Gene's greatest thrill, since he has been in the Air Forces, was piloting

the famous bomber *Mary Ann*, starred in Warner Brothers' "Air Force," from Louisville via New York and Florida to Chicago. Right now, Gene's itching to get overseas. By the time this issue of *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* reaches the news-stands, he may be there.

There has been little publicity bally-hoo about Autry's entrance into the air service, and comparatively few know that ever since he joined up, over a year ago, he has been working against time and the age limit permitting him to get into active service. In fact, all the chips for deferment were in Gene's basket had he wanted to use them. Instead, he volunteered at the height of a phenomenally successful career. For the reason, as he stated simply, "I should hate to think, when it's all over, that I didn't have a part in it somewhere."

Gene twirled the "ten-gallon" hat, which was his only headgear before he entered the service, as he made that statement, and his look said that he had no regrets, and no intention of trading his military cap for civilian clothes until the war was over. But the next moment he was laughing and telling us about his first experience with an Army barber. When he got

his first G. I. haircut, the barber asked him if he wanted to keep his sideburns. "Sure, I want them," Gene replied. "Okay," said the clipper-wielder. "you can have 'em." With that he deftly clipped them off, put them into an envelope and handed them to Gene.

Talking with some of the men who have been stationed at Luke Field with Gene reveals the fact that he always has been considered "one of the boys," and has worked harder than the average soldier in order to be sure that no one would think he was getting special privileges or any undue attention.

The eagerness with which Sergeant Gene greeted his horses on his brief leave at Melody Ranch naturally prompted the question as to whether he did any riding at Luke Field. "Not much time for that," he replied.

As for his plans after the war, Gene sums them up like this: "IF I'm lucky enough to come out alive, I want to produce my own pictures, with my own company." Radio work? Well, it was under the guidance of the Wrigley Company that Gene achieved fame on the airlines. When the fighting's over, he'd like to renew that association.

But whatever Sergeant Autry does

when peace comes again, we feel safe in saying, will be all right with his loyal followers. They haven't forgotten him. In fact, his mail has increased twofold since he went into service. From England alone, the mail he receives has necessitated adding another member to his staff of three secretaries who do nothing but answer mail. Even across the big pond they haven't forgotten the American cowboy who created a sensation in the British Isles and did more to cement American-British good-will than a whole corps of diplomats.

Yet, after almost ten years in the spotlight of unprecedented fame, Gene still keeps an active membership in the telegraphers' union, still harbors the thought that he may wake up to find that his success was all a dream. "If that happens," he says, "I can always go back to my old trade."

Yes, this son of poor American dirt farmers and self-schooled telegrapher, whom the late Will Rogers told to go to New York and become a singer, has more than proved the merits of the American way of life. American youth always has respected and loved him as an entertainer and a man. And Gene Autry—warrior—is still their idol.

## Humility Still Marks MBS Commentator Who Began as a Five-Dollar-a-Week Copy Boy and Reporter on a Brooklyn Paper

I HAVE just completed ten years of radio broadcasting—ten years of reporting news and trying to give it meaning. If I have had any education at all in my life, this has been it. I am sure I have learned ten thousand times as much as I have taught. For me these ten years have been a great adventure in life and living.

What have I learned? I have discovered the man or woman listening in is generally as well informed as the man who is broadcasting. He knows more details. He spends more time on background. He may be able to anticipate some things. But the man or woman listening in knows as much—knows more, frequently. If anyone beginning as a news commentator were to ask me, What shall I need for my work? I would say, You will need humility and a respect for the men and women you are talking to.

I have learned more from my mail than I have from a hundred books or years in college. I have discovered people hold strong convictions on many things, but beyond all convictions, people believe firmly in the laws of good taste. I think if anyone were to ask me what else do I need to groom myself for a career as a commentator, I would reply, Develop a sincere and profound respect for the laws of good taste.

There will be a thousand temptations to use a punch line to say something clever, something striking. Read it again and again and see if it violates that law of good taste. I read my program at least three times before I go on the air (that after rewriting it half a dozen times), and I try to read it aloud. I want to know whether there is anything in it which might hurt anyone. It's surprising to find how different it sounds when you read it aloud.

What I am trying to say is, I think the radio listener expects sincerity beyond anything else. He may not agree with a word that you say, but he demands that you mean what you

say. You are in his home. His wife and children may be there. You are putting out impressions, ideas. You are asking him to trade his time and attention for what you want to say. Let him suspect that you are saying it to please him or that you are saying it to fill time and you are just another voice. Let him feel that you mean what you say and he'll listen.

That was always true, but it's many times more so now that we are living through days which try men's souls. Here are millions of American homes where vacant chairs point to men who are away fighting a war. These are

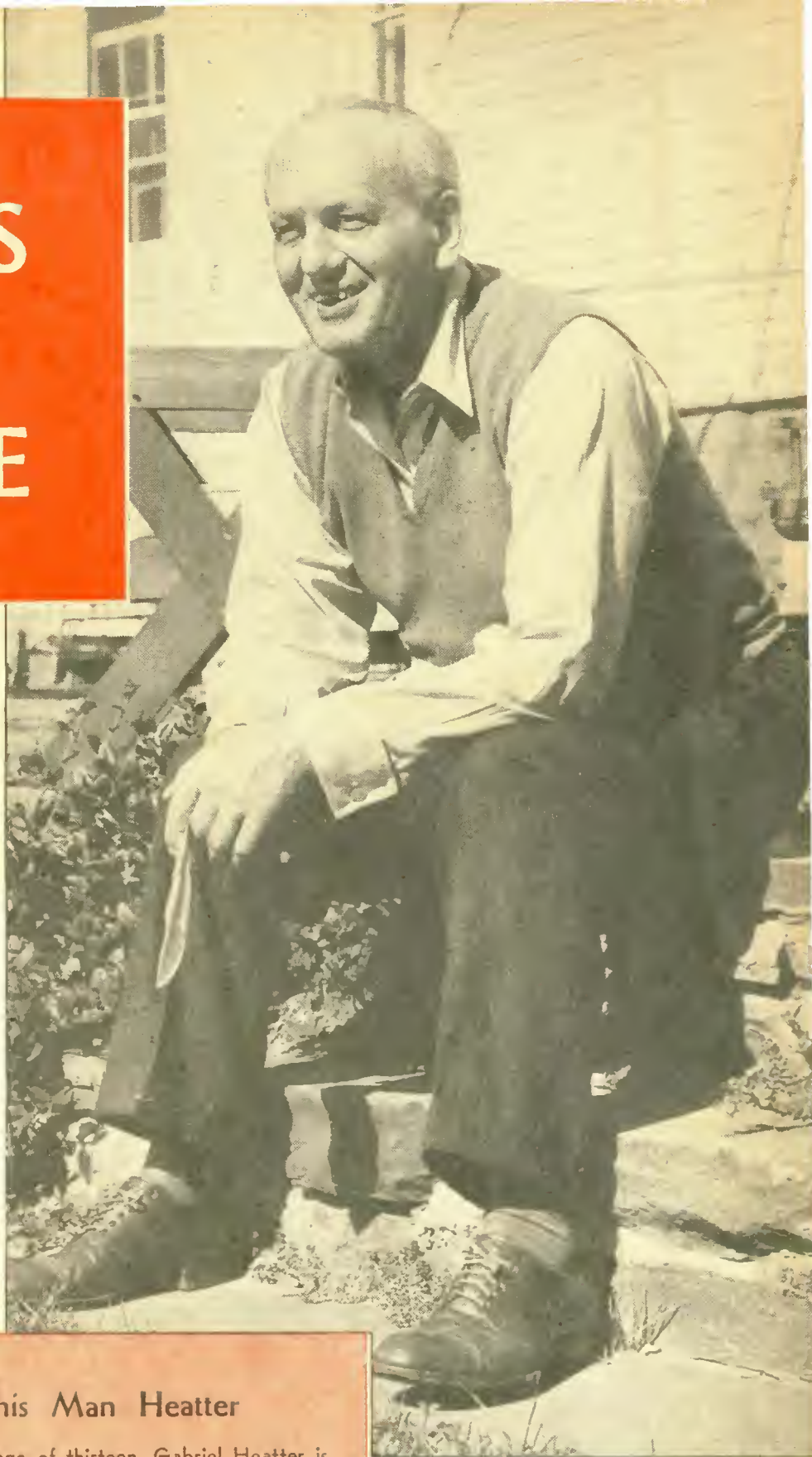

homes of people who are desperately anxious. No, they don't want any Pollyanna-like assurances. They want no easy overconfidence, no pat on the back and assurance that all is fine.

They are beset by many great doubts and anxieties. They want facts, to be sure. But no one has any monopoly on facts any longer. The bulletins pour in and out night and day and the stirring news reports and photographs flashing by radio give people all the facts. What they want

of a commentator, I think, is this: What do these facts mean to me, to my home? What can I reasonably look forward to?

And that brings me to my third recommendation to anyone planning a news commentator's career. Don't talk down to these people. Remember they know the facts, hear them as quickly as you do. Talk to these people. Talk as if you are trying to exchange what you feel in your heart for the things they feel in theirs.

"AFTER TEN YEARS in radio, guess a man is entitled to stop for a few minutes and reminisce," says Mr. Heatter as he sits down in his back yard in Freeport, L. I.

I recall the nights when I tried to say the sky over England would never fall into Hitler's hands; Moscow, Leningrad and Stalingrad would hold; Rommel would be smashed; we'd take Tunisia. I had no secret military information. Yes, I talked to a dozen military men a day. I asked a dozen questions of every man. Out of it all I felt a deep and abiding conviction. I tried to pass on that conviction to other people. Fate was kind. It proved me right. No, it didn't prove that I knew anything more than anyone else did, for I didn't.

But I think it proved if a man really feels something deep inside—feels it

## CBC Begins Own News Roundup Service From War Scenes of Action

**T**HE periods of on-the-spot news shortwaved daily from the battle fronts to United States networks have long been of outstanding interest and popularity. A possible rival for news scoops now appears in the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, which has recently initiated its own CBC "News Roundup" from various battle fronts and war capitals. This new feature is broadcast daily Mondays through Fridays, at 6:45 p.m. CWT, over the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation's network and over Montreal short-wave station CBFW (6.09).

Reports from London, Algiers, Sicily, Washington and Ottawa are broadcast during the fifteen-minute period. They are presented by CBC's own correspondents stationed in these places. Home news is broadcast on special occasions from provincial capitals and leading cities across Canada. The roundup opens with Wilson Woodside, speaking from Ottawa or Toronto. He is widely known for his incisive and discerning analysis of current events. He gives the initial summary of round-the-world news.

The latest news and events in Great Britain are reported by A. E. Powley, speaking from London. Powley was sent to England last May to head the London bureau in CBC's Overseas News Service.

Reporting from Allied Force Headquarters in North Africa are CBC war correspondents Matthew Halton, Peter Stursberg, and Andrew Cowan, who have been assigned to the Mediterranean area to give a first-hand account of their fighting forces there.

To help in the preparation of these programs the CBC now has four completely equipped mobile recording units manned by expert technicians in use overseas.

# RADIO ALBUM

"The Telephone Hour," Now in Its Fourth Year on the Air



**O**N MONDAY night, April 29, 1940, the Bell Telephone Company ventured into the field of network broadcasting for the first time by reserving a half-hour period on NBC for a program of classical and semi-classical music. Headliners in this new series were James Melton, Francis White, the Ken Christie Chorus and a 57-piece Bell Symphony Orchestra directed by Don Voorhees. That was the first "Telephone Hour" broadcast and the beginning of a series of Monday night programs which was to win the applause of a nationwide audience for its unusual programming and discriminating interpretations.

The original pattern of the "Telephone Hour" remained unchanged for two years. In launching the third season of broadcasts in April, 1942, the format of the program was basically changed with the introduction of what was called the Great Artists Series. This plan, instead of featuring the same talented stars each week, called for appearances by different top-ranking singers or instrumentalists drawn from the concert stage, opera or radio. Don Voorhees, however, continued as director of the Bell Symphony Orchestra and chorus.

Typical of the musically distinguished guests who have appeared on "Telephone Hour" broadcasts every Monday night since the Great Artists Series was inaugurated are those on the roster for the month of October, 1943, when Jose Iturbi, Marian Anderson, James Melton and Grace Moore will appear.



**JOSE ITURBI**, celebrated pianist, harpsichordist and conductor, on October 4 makes his third guest appearance on the program. Born in Valencia, Spain, where he began his musical studies, Iturbi made his American debut in 1929 and became a sensation almost overnight. # THE NEW

"Hi Diddle Diddle," Martha's Latest Picture, Gives Her a Chance to Play a Glamorous Role in Modern Costume

EVERY now and then, Hollywood bigwigs, who pride themselves on discovering talent which can be described in adjectives ranging from terrific to colossal, overlook someone with such outstanding ability that they go around for several moons with very red faces after the person in question

definitely has proved them wrong. Martha Scott belongs in that category. For the little girl from Gee's Creek, Missouri, who was such a smash hit in "Our Town" and "Cheers for Miss Bishop," was described as "completely unphotogenic" when she first went to Hollywood to test for the role of Melanie in "Gone With the Wind." Even in mature roles that called for Martha to be buried in layers of flounces and dresses of ripe old age, the term "unphotogenic" was never mentioned by critics or play-goers. Quite the opposite, in fact. What they saw was a wholly charming dramatic actress of great capabilities.

Having succeeded in heavy dramatic roles, Martha refused to be typed. When, as Mrs. Carleton Alsop, she retired from the screen last year to have a baby, Martha vowed that she would not return until she found a part that didn't require her to portray a matron or a spinster of nineteenth-century vintage. She wanted to prove that she could also play the role of an attractive young woman with a warm, human personality that accented glamour. "Hi Diddle Diddle" was the answer. When theater-goers see her in this picture, they are going to see an entirely new Martha Scott who's glamorous to the nth degree.

In the "Hi Diddle Diddle" role she reveals amazing ingenuity and a positive gift for frothy comedy as a girl who dashes in and out of numerous designer Adrian costumes, portraying a little disturber pursued by innumerable admirers, all seeking her favor. There isn't the faintest resemblance to her former roles of the little maid who looked as though she had stepped from your grandmother's album on the marble-topped parlor table.

# MARTHA SCOTT

Perhaps much of Martha's success lies in the simple philosophy she has followed all her adult life—"Be prepared for the breaks when they come." Certainly she was ready when the first one came—a chance to play Emily Webb in the Broadway production of "Our Town." And the Little Scott who had made her dramatic debut as Patricia Dare, the intrepid girl spy in World War I, over a local Detroit radio station, became the toast of Broadway. In the screen version of the play, Martha gave with a performance that won her a nomination for the Academy Award and led to a succession of fine character roles that skyrocketed her stock in Hollywood and, more important, the box-offices of the nation.

But of character parts, Martha states emphatically, she has had enough. From now on she intends to remain a free lance and pick her roles with care. At present she is making "In Old Oklahoma" for Republic Pictures, co-starring with John Wayne. In this picture she plays the role of a teacher with liberal and progressive ideas who is chased out of town by an outraged citizenry. Says Martha, "It's the sort of role that has meat in it. I'm having

a heap of fun playing a woman with a tinge of devilment in her make-up." In private life, Martha is happily married to radio producer Carleton Alsop, one of the founders of the Red Cross plasma bank in Los Angeles. She is also the proud mother of a beautiful little boy who is just learning to walk. Her home is a big ranch about twenty-five miles from Hollywood, where she and her husband raise turkeys and chickens. When they were away on a New York trip, they turned the place over to servicemen in return for looking after the poultry and milking the cow. The men thought they had landed in a miniature Utopia.

A fastidious little person, Martha is often irked by distasteful manners. Her pet phobia is the use of bad grammar. She once broke an engagement with a boy who dared to say "ain't."

If her United Artists' picture "Hi Diddle Diddle" is any sign, we have a sneaking suspicion that Martha is all set to invade the glamour field. If that's true, the other pretties in Hollywood had better move over. For we don't mind stating flatly that they are in for some stiff competition. Martha Scott not only has beauty, personality and poise—SHE CAN ALSO ACT!

## Country Gentleman

He Combines Airplane Chores With Farming Out Connecticut Way

IT WAS a real homecoming for Barry Wood, baritone and emcee on NBC's "The Million Dollar Band," when he brought his wife, Jane, and two little daughters, Bonnie and Beverly, to live on his Connecticut farm near East Haddam. For Barry was born only a few miles from the place which he bought three years ago.

Since taking over the eighty-five-acre farm, the Woods have remodeled the 125-year-old farmhouse, but it still stands on the original granite foundation, and has a newly added fieldstone terrace.

One old barn on the premises was torn down and its hand-hewn chestnut beams were used as supports for the ceilings of the house. Inner walls of the dwelling are partly lined with knotty pine.

To Barry, this farm is not merely the hobby of a man whose profession takes him to the city. It's a serious business. The main products—poultry and eggs from 3,500 Barred Rock chickens—find their way to New York markets. All vegetables for household use, together with feed for the livestock, are grown on the acreage.

"It's the good way of life," says singing-emcee Wood. "Fact that my program is broadcast at ten p.m. on Saturdays gives me more time out here. It's a dream come true."

## IT'S A MAN'S WORLD

**R**ATIONING or no rationing, the male of the species still demands, stubbornly but justifiably, to be well fed. This insistence may be a temporary headache to Mrs. America, but if she's wise and imaginative, she can still find ways to serve hearty and wholesome meals and keep within the laws of rationing at the same time.

Morton Downey, the tuneful tenor of the Blue Network, is a man who likes his food and refuses to say "uncle" to the bogeyman of rationing. Father of five growing children, Downey supervises their diet and his own and is an excellent amateur chef in his own right. He's forever dreaming up new food concoctions in the kitchen of his Connecticut home, and the kitchen staff in his New York hotel know him as well as the desk clerk does. Being both a hearty eater and an enthusiastic chef, Downey understands both sides of the food problem. But by combining research and his own resourcefulness, he has succeeded in ferreting out a number of dishes which are appealing to male appetites, and at the same time are gentle with the ration book.

We asked Downey the other day to provide us with his favorite war-time menu, and he immediately obliged—with recipes and all. Here it is, com-

plete with soup, salad, entree and dessert—and all the benefits of including mainly non-rationed materials.

There's nothing like starting off a meal with a good nourishing soup, and Downey has just the delectable concoction to fill the bill. Oddly enough, this Irish tenor adores Russian beet soup borscht. He makes it by mixing 12 small cooked beets, 2 cups of water, 2 tablespoons of sugar, a touch of salt and pepper and  $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoon of cinnamon and allowing them to simmer for 10 minutes. Then he adds  $2\frac{1}{2}$  tablespoons of vinegar and brings the mixture again to the boiling point. Next he allows the liquid to cool, then places a beaten egg in each serving-dish and pours the mixture slowly over it, mixing thoroughly so the egg doesn't curdle. As a final touch, he heaps two tablespoons of sour cream into each portion.

A simple and satisfying entree is Baked Chicken Supreme, which is built on a base of still unrationed poultry. For this, Downey uses a small frying chicken ( $2\frac{1}{2}$  or 3 pounds), flour, and vegetable shortening (the kind that can be drained after using and used again). He has the chicken cut into sections, then rolls each in

## Radio's Schedule for the Fall Season Promises To Be a Real Feast for Nation's Music-Lovers

**T**HE NBC Symphony Orchestra, says Mr. Samuel Chotzinoff, is looking forward to a year of "unprecedented musical achievement" under world-famous conductors. Occasion for this statement was the announcement this summer of the orchestra's plans for its first year of sponsorship under the General Motors banner, and it's just what you'd expect Mr. Chotzinoff to say at a time like that. You see, he's the director of NBC's music division. We agree with Mr. Chotzinoff, but the tendency with us is to go one step farther and include the other great musical organizations who likewise are facing their most promising year so far as radio is concerned.

There is, for example, the New York Philharmonic-Symphony, which also not many months ago began broadcasting on a year-round schedule under commercial sponsorship. We also have the Boston Symphony starting another season of broadcasts over the Blue Network. And we are told that the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra, directed by youthful Erich Leinsdorf, has a contract with Mutual for a series of exclusive broadcasts over their facilities. In addition, the Philadelphia Orchestra this summer signed a three-year contract with CBS and resumes Saturday broadcasts early in October.

Classical music, we feel, is looking forward to the most promising year in its history—thanks to radio.

### Highlights in Brief

**NBC Symphony Orchestra, NBC, Sundays:** Currently under the baton of Dr. Frank Black, on October 31 Arturo Toscanini takes over for a series of six concerts. He will be followed by Leopold Stokowski.

**New York Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra, CBS, Sundays:** October 10 marks the first appearance of Dr. Artur Rodzinski on the podium since he was appointed music director of Philharmonic-Symphony last spring. In the meantime, the Sunday afternoon concerts have been directed by notable guest conductors. Vladimír Golschmann directs the final broadcast in the summer series on October 3.

**Cleveland Symphony Orchestra, MBS, Sundays:** Under the direction of thirty-one-year-old Erich Leinsdorf, the Cleveland Symphony begins the fall season on October 10, broadcasting from the \$3,000,000 acoustically perfect Severance Hall in Cleveland. The youthful Mr. Leinsdorf last spring succeeded Artur Rodzinski as director of the Cleveland group, and October 10 marks the beginning of his first full season as conductor.

**Boston Symphony Orchestra, Blue Network, Saturdays:** With Serge Kous-

sevitzyky on the podium, the Boston Symphony begins its second season of exclusive broadcasts over the Blue Network on October 9.

**Philadelphia Orchestra, CBS, Saturdays:** Under a new, exclusive contract with CBS, the Philadelphia Orchestra begins broadcasts on October 2. Eugene Ormandy, director of the organization, will conduct most of the concerts, but from time to time guest conductors and eminent soloists will appear with the orchestra.

\* \* \*

### Mr. Chotzinoff Again

"The sponsorship by so great an institution," Mr. Chotzinoff explains, referring to the General Motors contract with the NBC Symphony, "confirms our belief that radio music has so enlarged the public which listens to great music that industry now finds it advantageous to address itself directly to that group. In effect, radio has pioneered with such success that symphonic literature has become a necessity to millions of people in the United States.

"Maestro Toscanini and the NBC Symphony," he went on, "have imparted a new freshness to the classics, which, of necessity, must always remain the backbone of the symphonic repertoire. Toscanini also has impressed the listening public both here and abroad with matchless first performances of modern works.

"Speaking eloquently in terms of music, the maestro has time and again proved his championship of the cause of liberty and his hatred for tyranny and despotism. His love for freedom and his love for great music were demonstrated in his broadcasts, and there is every indication that his programs during the year will continue to draw attention of music-lovers everywhere."

### Something New

A survey of listeners' radio tastes conducted by the Blue Network some months ago indicated that an appreciable number of daytime dialers want new and varied types of entertainment. Using this as a directive, the Blue has actively promoted programs to appeal to these listeners. The Dubonnet Corporation joined the campaign to "revolutionize" daytime radio on September 4 when it launched a half-hour musical-variety program for Saturday mornings featuring Xavier Cugat's orchestra.

This assignment for Cugat is the first major one since his recent illness, which forced him to relinquish assignments on the Lanny Ross and Moore-Durante shows. Well and active again, "little Coogie" adds great weight to the trend to brighten up daytime radio fare.

# FREQUENCY MODULATION

## FM Stations Prepare For the Future by Experimenting With New Program Ideas

**D**ESPITE certain inevitable hardships imposed by the war upon FM development, many of the noise-free, full fidelity stations now operating in this country (and there are about forty of them) are taking advantage of this period as an opportunity for extensive program experimentation.

"Experiments" on a large scale, involving the type of program schedules offered listeners, were not generally undertaken by radio stations during normal times. For one thing, the majority of them depended upon maintaining their popularity with audiences for continued livelihood. Any extensive "experiment" that flopped might lose them a lot of listeners. Consequently, most ordinary (AM) broadcast stations clung—and still do—to the time-honored program types that are known to be acceptable.

FM, however, has struck out across some uncharted fields and—aided by the greater tonal fidelity it offers—is now using this war-time period to find out if there aren't other things radio listeners like besides quiz shows, daytime serials and swing bands.

Because the FM pioneers, anxious to show the wide tone range that frequency modulation permits, broadcast a great deal of symphonic and other classical music, FM was early labeled as a luxury for "long hair" audiences only. Aside from the fallacy that a taste for classical music is confined to esthetes and college professors, most FM program schedules are actually well rounded and included everything from Brahms and Verdi to news commentators and dramatic shows.

### Some New Ideas

An example of a radical departure from conventional radio programming is the arrangement being used by W45CM, Columbus, Ohio, which broadcasts the same type of program at the same hour every day. In other words, if a listener wants dinner music he can always tune it in each night at 6:15. Or variety and comedy at 8:30. News, brief and really news, is aired once an hour. Other special types of program entertainment are heard always at the same time, every day of the week. W45CM recently canvassed its listeners and discovered their approval of the system was virtually 100%.

Other interesting experiments include the limiting of all commercial messages to short announcements. Today it's possible for a sponsor to buy a quarter- or half-hour of air time and present almost any kind of show in it that he feels like (including his relatives whose talent may be questionable). This sometimes results in complete disruption of a carefully planned program schedule with a succession of incongruous and inferior broadcasts that may please their sponsors but certainly bore the listener.

Under the arrangement projected by some FM stations, no sponsor would be permitted to do more than purchase spot announcements, and these might even be inserted into the program schedule at the discretion of the station.

Many people, of course, laud FM today because its commercial blurbs are few and far between. This state of affairs, however, is not destined to continue after the war—simply because operators of FM outlets must eat like anyone else. Today there aren't many FM sets in use, compared with ordinary AM broadcasting. Hence there are few sponsors. But as the FM audience increases, so will the number of commercial broadcasts.

### FM Men Gather Again

FM Broadcasters, Inc., the national association of FM stations whose membership now comprises all but four of the frequency-modulation transmitters currently on the air, has had another meeting—its third in a

little over three months. The increasing frequency of these sessions is caused by more intensive planning for a quick resumption of FM growth after the war.

The latest meeting, held in Milwaukee, Wis., (where W55M played host), was addressed by such FM leaders as Major E. H. Armstrong, inventor of the FM system, and Dr. W. R. G. Baker, vice-president of the General Electric Company. Major Armstrong warned against a repetition of what he termed "blunders" in the technical progress of the broadcasting industry over the past 25 years. He urged that FM planning be made flexible enough to correct any errors in judgment—particularly with regard to the number of channels established for FM stations and other technical standards of transmission.

Dr. Baker had this to say: "It is of paramount importance that the FM receiving sets produced after the war be of a high-performance type. To satisfy the public, they must be able to bring in programs loud and consistently without the use of special antenna. The set owner of today has become used to a radio with built-in antenna, and the best FM salesman in the world is not going to be able to make him climb up on the roof and string a lot of wire around. Good sets, eight tubes or stronger, and a strong station signal must be provided. That means the engineers must be permitted to produce the best transmitting equipment and receiving sets. Unless FM lives up to its high standards, its great promise may be blighted."

but McCarthy had Keller left, and, with Lindell and Weatherly and rookie Metheny, Joe has a set of pickets who can go. Red Ruffing is the big pitching gap, but Wensloff has come through, and with Chandler and Bonham around, the Yankees have great pitching. Bill Dickey remains back of the plate, and the Yankees have the poise, alertness and confidence of their great tradition, which just didn't happen by accident.

I think the Yankees will go into the series a more balanced team, with keener zest and relish for the test this year than last. Pitching is the precious asset in a short series, and both teams have more than enough. Power and speed and poise—both clubs have it. Inspired direction by both managers is there. I think this series will be a hotter one than last year.

2. Now, with all that, do you think the mental attitude of the players in a war-time World Series might affect the play?

Red Barber: The mental attitude of the men in baseball is the reason why baseball is so soundly established. Baseball has asked nothing except how it best could help the war effort. Baseball has given money, sold bonds, donated blood, played benefits and exhibition games at camps, curtailed transportation drastically, provided baseball equipment for service teams. Furthermore, baseball has done these things voluntarily. The game has yet to be asked to assist in a war effort, because it has not waited to be asked. And for whatever value it is to the servicemen to think baseball, argue baseball, baseball has put on the best set of pennant races it could. Baseball has regarded itself as a business that should function until the Government said differently, and that it should do the best job of its business possible with those men left it by the Government. It has. And strongest of all, baseball has yet to say one word for itself that it has a morale value. Baseball has wanted its players to go into the armed forces when their time came. Baseball has yet to make a claim for itself, and the game has carried on so honestly I have yet to hear of a question being raised about its place in our country.

The player's attitude is merely that of other civilians who are doing their best job as civilians as long as they remain civilians.

3. At this writing, it is almost conceded (barring miracles) that both league races are runaways. In view of that fact, don't you think, Red, that the interest in the series this year might be enhanced if we could at least have had the same kind of knock-down-and-drag-out battle for the pennant as we've had in the senior circuit between the Dodgers and the Cardinals during the two previous seasons?

Red Barber: The interest in a series is fundamentally in the two teams that are playing. On occasion, interest builds in one club because of a tight pennant race. This year it does not need anything for series interest except to turn the Cardinals and the Yankees loose on each other. Everybody has been interested enough in watching Southworth keep his Red Birds flying high and in seeing how smoothly McCarthy has blended together another sound Yankee club.

This year's series has a rich carry-over of interest from last fall. Everybody knows McCarthy doesn't forget and his Yankees don't forget. While on the subject of baseball interest let me say that such has been the complete honesty of baseball's position, such has been the appreciation for the game by the public, such has been the surprisingly good play, that had there been gasoline and lights for night games in the East, this would have been one of the really big attendance years—and that despite the thousands of fans who were thousands of miles from the parks and took their baseball interest in hearing broadcasts and reading letters and papers.

4. The World Series always brings back that old argument about the difference in baseballs used by the separate leagues. Is there any real difference this year?

Red Barber: There is absolutely no difference in the baseballs used by the two leagues. They are made by the same company, of the same materials, under the same specifications. Just the name of the league stamped on the ball is all that tells them apart.

5. It seems to us something should be said in connection with what the baseball owners have done to meet the drafting of their stars into the armed services. Can you enlighten us?

Red Barber: The owners have merely dug around and come up with the best players they could find to fill the gaps. They have set up try-out camps all over the country. They have traded among themselves. In other words, they've been proud of their players who've gone into the armed forces, and have hustled harder themselves to hold the game to its high standard of play. I have yet to hear one owner complain of a player's absence due to war. Everyone in baseball has recognized the basic truth of this situation—and that is, that the country's needs are the ones that matter.

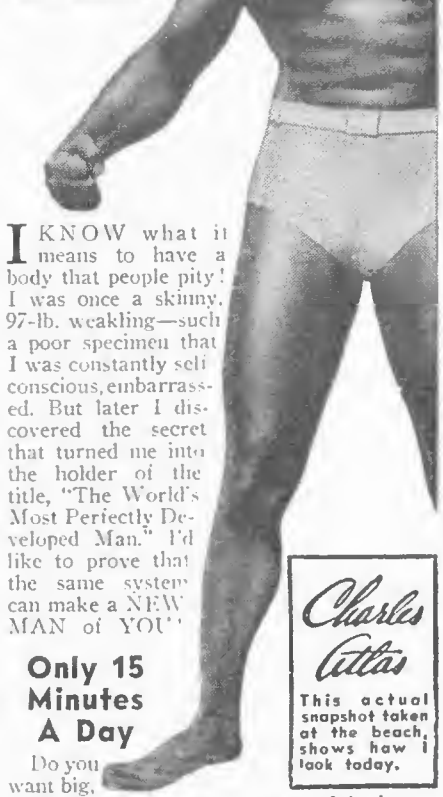
6. If you will, can you tell us what the owners' attitude has been regarding the drafting of the baseball players in general?

Red Barber: Part of this answer is above, and for the rest let me cite a few cases. Last year it was the owners who conceived the idea of playing games for Army and Navy Relief. Each team gave one of its most attractive days at home, which meant each team thus gave in toto the receipts from two dates, remembering that the visiting team must be figured, too. The World Series last year had a gross of \$1,105,249.00, which does not include the \$100,000 the Gillette Safety Razor Company paid for the radio rights. From the gross \$362,926.65, plus the radio \$100,000, was given to the USO. And all the receipts from games six and seven would have gone to the USO had the series gone past the five games. So far this year, baseball has seen sixteen major-league days when total receipts went to various war funds and to the Red Cross. The amount raised by those games was \$346,123.00. These dollars, and more than I have space to refer to, were dollars that were paid at the gate for seats, and were given from baseball. In other (Continued on Next Page)

after checking at every possible source—why, then trust your feeling. Match it against other men's opinions; don't be afraid to speak out. You will be wrong many times. People won't mind that. They'll know you are saying what you really believe. And if fate is kind and you are right, they'll know you were not afraid.

What I am trying to say is, radio isn't a classroom with the listeners the pupils and the commentator the teacher. Radio is a family—a town meeting. You, the commentator, happen to have the floor. Give yourself to it completely. And if you find yourself weeping at times, as I have, don't be afraid of that. You will like your work that much better.

For it's hard, gruelling, grinding, heart-breaking work. You will begin early and end late. And the first second after you sign off you will get the sickly, agonizing feeling which comes to a man when he knows how much better it might have been. But you know tomorrow is another day, and one hour after you have finished you'll be at your typewriter struggling to fix what you felt was wrong.

This is radio. This is news reporting. This is the grim responsibility, the never-to-be-escaped responsibility which hangs over a man who embarks on this business. But this is the joy you find in this work—the realization that you no longer belong to yourself or your family or your friends or your leisure or your hobbies, but to that

night-and-day responsibility—the people who count on you.

In ten years of working at nine o'clock at night I have had to give up theater and dinner parties and many things I'd like to have. I have had to concentrate all my reading on dry technical documents. I doubt if I have passed a single hour in those ten years (except between midnight and morning) without tuning in to keep in touch with the news. You get so you are afraid to lose it. It's part of you as much as your heartbeat. Every new bulletin is a new adventure. In radio, the whole world is your stage and all the people in it the players.

It may be a president, a prime minister, a dictator, a general or a buck private. It may be a boy and a dog or a mother whose son isn't coming back. It's yours to do with as you will. You are humbled by it, dwarfed by it; but there it is—challenging, alluring and inviting. The sweat on your typewriter keys will be the measure of your work and your only real reward.

If that kind of life appeals to you, the whole world is your workshop. If you would rather call some part of your time your own, if you would rather know the things millions of other men and women know and call their own, shun it as you would something evil.

This is radio. I have had ten years of it. How do I feel now? I want ten more.

Red is a hard worker who frequently during the baseball season puts in a seven-day week. Besides covering the afternoon baseball games, he does newsreel commentary work, keeps his baseball record book up to date, and acts as emcee on the Old Gold show over CBS on Wednesday nights.

salted flour, and browns in the hot shortening. Just about enough to cover the chicken. Then the chicken is placed in a large roaster and covered with cream gravy made with milk, flour and the remains of the frying grease—about a quart of gravy to the chicken. To cook this, cover the roaster and bake the chicken slowly until tender—a process requiring about an hour. Served in its own sauce, this dish is a thing of beauty and a joy forever.

Like most rugged males, Downey likes salads—but none of your dainty, lettuce-leafy varieties. His salads must be hearty and filling and one of his favorites is a salad that is both. For it, Downey cooks 4 beets and 2 carrots in their jackets until they are soft. Next he peels and cools them, then slices them, together with 2 cucumbers, a dill pickle and a green pepper. He mixes them all together, and adds a can of peas, carefully drained. Salt, pepper and mayonnaise are all the seasoning required—and Downey recommends that this salad be served ice cold on lettuce with a watercress garnish.

To ease that sweet tooth every man seems to have, here's a Downey dessert that's guaranteed to have everyone shouting for second helpings. Derived from an old continental recipe, it's a form of sweet pancake, served with cheese. For it you need ½ pound of flour, 4 eggs and 3 additional egg yolks, ½ pound of cottage cheese, milk,

salt, sugar and vanilla. Downey prepares it by beating the eggs well, salting them very slightly and adding 2 tablespoons of sugar and beating again until light and fluffy. Then he blends the egg mixture with flour, adding milk until the finished product has the consistency of pancake batter. He prepares it just as he would plain, garden-variety pancakes—on a hot slightly greased griddle—browning slightly on both sides. Then a sauce of blended cottage cheese, egg yolks, sugar to taste, vanilla and salt is spread on the pancakes, which are next rolled and placed once again on the frying-pan or griddle, until fully browned. If you have any powdered sugar around, it's a neat idea to dust the pancakes with it—if not, they stand well enough on their own merits. Downey likes these with a side helping of home-made jam or jelly, and when he can get hold of pancake syrup, he varies this by covering the pancakes with it before eating.

That's a typical Downey meal, one which he swears by. And since each of the dishes mentioned is a standby with all the male Downey friends who are forever dropping in for an odd snack, he has concrete evidence that other men swear by it as well. Try it on your own menfolk, and see what their reaction will be. Downey warrants that you—and your over-taxed ration book—will be delighted with the results.

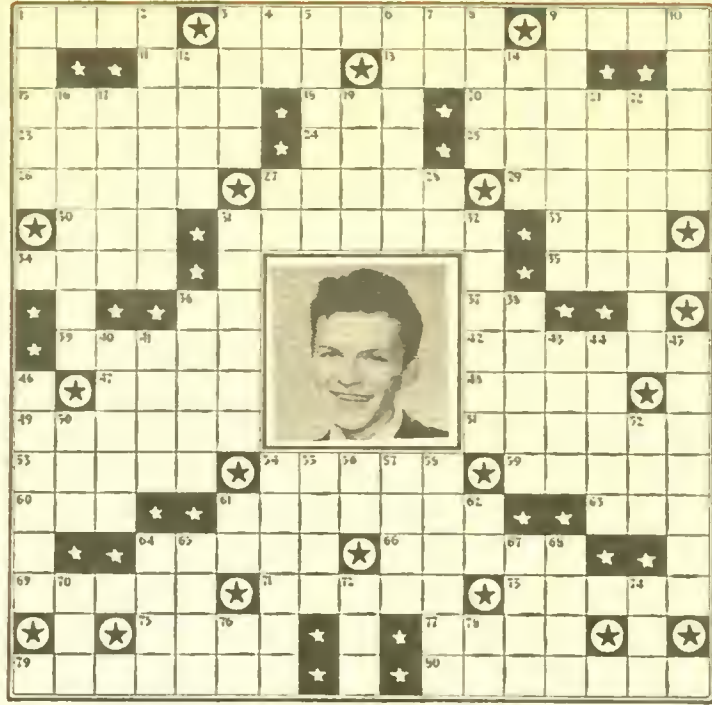

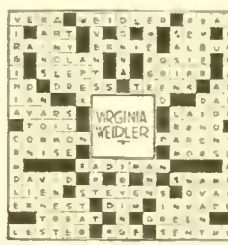

# HEDY IS A BEAUTY THING

have been able to shape her career with more mature judgment, and thus avoid much of the heartache and criticism that later came her way.

Before she was seventeen, Hedy had appeared in several pictures and plays, one of which was "Ecstasy," about which she has explained: "We started the film and everything went well until we went on location by a river. Now, I was told, we had come to the nude scenes. I protested bitterly and was told that they would be long shots, but even as long shots they would be vital to the story. When I asked what would happen if I refused, I was told that according to my contract I had to do everything that was required. Should I fail to do so, the picture would be ruined and the producer could collect his entire losses from me. So there was a sixteen-year-old girl seeing visions of creditors descending upon her respected father in a bank, with legal right to collect a great sum."

Later Hedy discovered that the scene was not a "long shot" and the embarrassment haunted her for years. At seventeen she married, and again "knowing her own mind" cost Hedy dearly. Her husband sternly ruled out the theater. She remained married to him for five years before she ran away to Paris. Now, more by accident than through clear thinking, she was embarking on a happier life. She took the risk of boarding ship without a movie contract, but on the boat met Louis B. Mayer, who admired her spirit and gave her a short-term contract.

Busy typewriters have tattooed the Hollywood success story of Hedy Lamarr into the American mind ever since, and in one way or another the result has been largely a false impression.

For example, one writer points out that she sleeps in neither nightgown nor pajamas. Topping the questionable delicacy of that revelation, another quoted her as exclaiming after a horseback ride, "Oh, brother, my fanny still hurts." One reporter says she "breeczes" into a room and another points out that there is always a quiet dignity in her walk. If you think this is typical only of Hollywood, get your friends to describe each other intimately sometime and see the vastly different impressions that are forthcoming.

Personally, I believe that much of Hedy's charm lies in her always freshly scrubbed appearance. Cosmetics are essential to every woman, but Hedy relies only on a little powder, and the consequent lack of make-up emphasizes the extreme beauty of her gray-green eyes. Eyes are so much of Hedy that perverse critics have called attention to the supposition that her figure leaves something to be desired. This isn't so. Hedy's erect posture carries her 128 pounds on a five-foot-seven-inch frame beautifully. That weight on any other movie actress would make her fat.

Hedy is most irked over occasional statements that her "legs aren't good." As a result she recently spent a whole day being photographed with the questionable extremities clothed in long black silk stockings. A publicity man now in the Army told me that the result was gratifying. "She's sort of a super pin-up girl," he told me. "Now I can go to war happy. I consider the vindication of Hedy in this regard the triumph of my career."

I should not be such a Hedy Lamarr enthusiast had I not seen her in her own home on a few occasions. Hedy

does not gallop around the place in a pair of tired slacks to make a good-fellow impression. Daytimes, she often wears a flowing housecoat unless she's going for a swim in the big pool in her back yard. She doesn't impose her own immaculate tendencies too strongly on Jamie, her five-year-old son, but lets him romp in a special place that has all the normal equipment, including good, honest dirt, that a growing American youngster could want.

It is an unfortunate thing that the glamour legend has prevented the public from knowing Hedy as a sincere person who from the beginning of the war has accomplished what most of the rest of us talk about. Her war-bond tour, in which she surprised the citizenry by bitter references to Hitler and Tojo as "dirty little beasts," has been accepted as just one of those things every actress does. On the contrary, no one has done more bond selling—or buying—in Hollywood than Hedy. Her biggest contribution, however, has been in the every-day work. Many a star has been photographed "doing her bit" at the Hollywood Canteen. Hedy, however, has not missed a Friday evening, except on the occasion of her marriage, since the place opened.

IF YOU want to know how you'd get along with Hedy as a personal friend, make a list of your own likes and dislikes and compare them with Hedy's on the same varied questions. Hedy doesn't like to smoke or drink and is worried because some people think her "dull" as a result. She knows better than to be superstitious, but she'll blow out a match if she catches you in the act of lighting a third cigarette on one. She believes spinach is a great health-giver, but will douse a hotdog with more mustard than is good for her digestion and then wonder why she feels punk. Mice, spiders and snakes never bother her. She likes to sit on the floor, but would rather not go on a picnic, because she sees no reason for competing with ants for her food.

If you insist that spanking a child is good for him now and then, you'll have an argument with Hedy. She believes the most efficient discipline is to deny a youngster temporarily something he's very fond of and explain why in advance, never using this as a threat for future behavior, and never giving in when he's "cute." If you harbor a grudge, you are like her. If you harbor one after an unspoken apology, you are unlike her.

Hedy learned to sew because she felt every wife and mother should, no matter what her circumstances, but she doesn't like the tedious task. She'd rather have a Great Dane than a lapdog and she likes to sit beside hers as she plays her collection of symphony recordings by Tschalkowsky.

As for the eternal subject of men, Hedy believes they are most attractive past the age of thirty-five, but that a uniform gives a young man that adult quality he can't get any other way. As for women, she believes that there are more really beautiful grandmothers than there are coeds. That may be the reason she is not in the least afraid of growing old.

Do you like Hedy Lamarr as a personal friend? If she thought you didn't, she'd be concerned, but not because you might fail to buy a ticket for her next movie, "The Heavenly Body."

Hedy would rather have one marine call her "a beauty thing" than come out first in a Gallup poll. She shouldn't have any trouble with either.

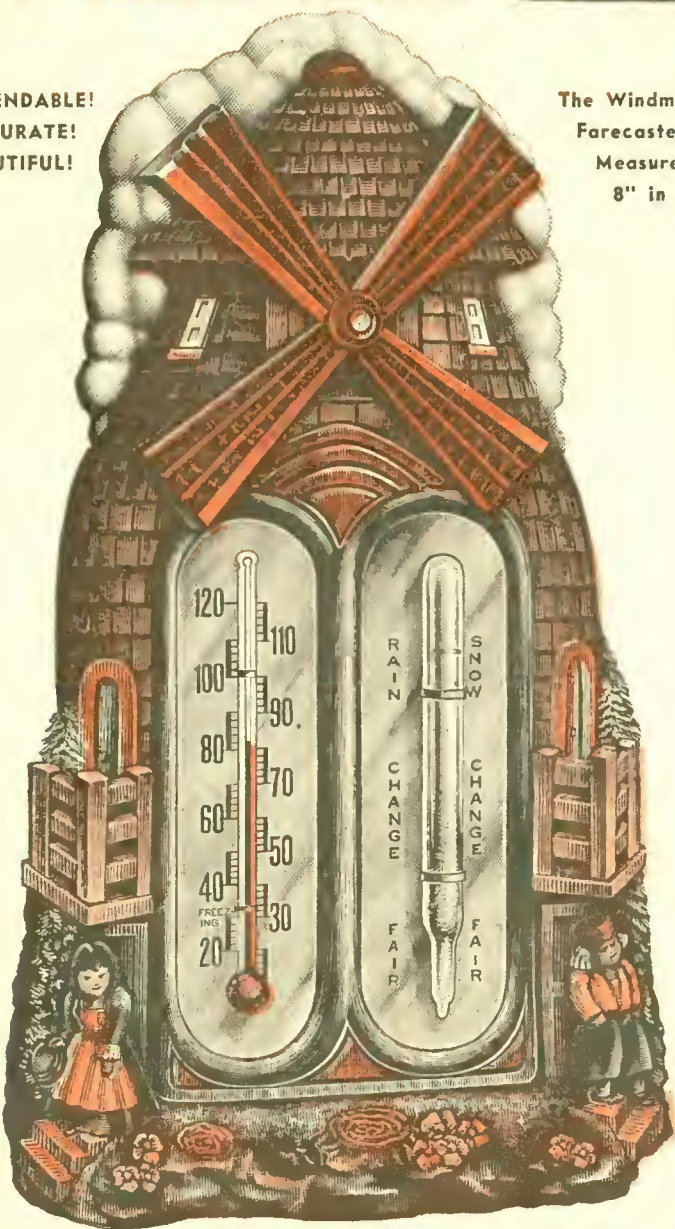
