I trust I will be forgiven for momentarily departing from the subject of radio, but I have just experienced something that is a little bit bigger than microphones and radio stars and loudspeakers. I have just paid a visit to a shipyard. I went through the place from stem to gudgeon. I watched the welders and riveters and the pipe fitters and the carpenters and the mail girls and the executives. I am now thoroughly convinced that America is on the road to victory.

The workers in this shipyard have come to Southern California from Oklahoma and Arkansas and Iowa and Alabama and Texas. They came here expecting to find the roads paved with gold. They have stayed to build ships, lots of ships, good ships, ships that will win the war. Have no doubt about it. As I watched ten thousand sweating, grimy, unsmiling men go about their task, I realized fully that I was witnessing a twentieth century miracle. These men were inspired. Here was no gold bricking, no loafing, no cheating. No man of the ten thousand paused to light a cigarette, paused to wipe away the perspiration, paused to observe the miracle that was taking place. They were building ships and each ship was the personal property of each man.

I came away from this factory of freedom feeling pretty proud that the Okies and the Arkies and the cowboys of Texas are making it possible for us to enjoy our radios and our movies and our newspapers and our right to cuss out the President and the Congress and each other for all time.

I would like to take each program manager down to that shipyard. I would like for each of them to see for himself how America looks at this war. I am sure that if the program manager could see what the little fellow is doing to preserve his freedom we would experience quite a change in our radio listening.

There exists in a small way a feeling of 'business as usual' in the radio

### Hopper on Ayres

Hedda Hopper, whose excellent quarter-hour CBS broadcasts for Sun-kist are not heard locally, is well known for her fighting ability and alertness to defend what she thinks is right. On her April 1 broadcast she aired the following significant comments on the case of Lew Ayres:

"Everyone in town is talking about Lew Ayres. And it isn't very pleasant to hear. Sure, they admit that he contributed \$5,000 to the Red Cross, \$3,000 to the Infantile Paralysis Fund. He conducted 9 first aid classes a week, conducted one the night before he left, and even though we KNOW that he offered his services to the Medical Corps and was turned down, still Hollywood, with fear written on its face, condemns him.

"Twelve years ago Lew Ayres, an unknown actor, played the part of Paul, the tragic bewildered boy in All Quiet on the Western Front. It was the greatest document against war put on the screen. It made Lew a star overnight, and the same public which showered him with praise now turns on him with hatred because in real life, he holds to the conviction they applauded in that picture. I'm not defending Lew Ayres' convictions to you. I'm defending his right of a conscience, one of the things we're fighting this war for, and it's no part of a brave and free people to brand as a coward a man who dares disagree with them. Wasn't it Voltaire who said 'I do not agree with what he says, but I'll defend with my life his right to say it'?"

### Flagg Series Mutes

The four-way controversy which has waged over the 'Captain Flagg and Sergeant Quirt' series between the sponsor (Mennens), U. S. Marine Corps, U. S. War Department and NBC for the past few weeks came to an end last weekend when the sponsor's agency withdrew the pro-

gram from the air following the broadcast of April 3.

NBC, through its national program head, C. L. Menser, released the following statement:

'Due to the fact that changing conditions in the war emergency have made it impossible to bring it within the limits of NBC program policies, the 'Capt. Flagg and Sgt. Quirt' program is being cancelled by the sponsor and NBC after the broadcast of April 3.'

Sponsor finally decided to call the series off rather than try to keep pace with the Marines, the War Department and the network.

War Department is said to have frowned on the last two programs and made an outright demand for its compliance with certain regulations (including having the scripts okayed in Washington, D. C., prior to each broadcast) which both NBC and the sponsor's agency (Russel Seeds) felt would militate against the program's success.

Sponsor fell in line with demands

of the Marine Corps some weeks ago when the Marines asked for a change in story formula so that a captain and sergeant would not fraternize socially in conformity with regulations in the armed service. This change found Bill Gargan being dropped from the show and a new role of Sgt. Bliss being introduced a fortnight ago.

her letter would be front-paged across the nation a month later (April 2).

Each week the BLUE variety half-hour, staged especially for the men in U. S. armed forces, invites an unidentified mother to appear on 'Blind Date' and read a personal letter to her son.

Last Thursday the radio newscasters led off their news roundups with the dramatic story of the sinking of a Japanese submarine by a U. S. Army bomber, skippered by a 26-year-old Yank who battled through the December holocaust at Pearl Harbor in his bedroom slippers.

Edmundson, 26, of Santa Monica, Calif., son of Mrs. Nora Edmundson, the mother who appeared on 'Your Blind Date' March 5th to read a letter to her son.

### Hastings' Big Day

Probably the most nervous young man in this part of the country on Sunday, April 12, will be young Ross Hastings, native Angeleno, whose original operetta was voted a cash prize of \$1,000 and named one of three finalists to compete for a grand prize of \$5,000 in the \$10,500 Great American Operetta Quest being made by the Chicago Theatre of the Air over Mutual. Among the 3,000 persons who will assemble in the famous Chicago opera house at curtain time to hear the winner announced will be in addition to the Los Angeles composer Percy Faith, well-known Canadian composer-conductor now living in Illinois, and Lee Armentrout of Chicago, Ben Bernie's arranger.

Local listeners who have heard all three prize-winning operettas during the last three Sundays believe that Hastings has an excellent chance to win the major award. DLIS, 3 p.m. Sun.

anniversary in the entertainment field, the 'Calling Pan America' series transmitted a program simultaneously in English, Spanish and Portuguese for an audience stretching from Canada to the Argentine.

Columbia's far-flung facilities which made the broadcast possible included the CBS system's coast-to-coast net in the U. S., its new 76 station chain in Latin America and the lines of the Canadian Broadcasting Corp.

Fractional-second timing by a corps of radio workers made possible the complex arrangement through which listeners heard talks and music originating in Buenos Aires, Vancouver, Montreal, Mexico City, Hollywood and New York during the 45-minute broadcast. KNX, 3:15 p.m. Sat.

### Back from War

First American radio war reporter to reach the shores of U. S. from the Dutch East Indies since December of last year, blonde, willowy Elizabeth Wayne who has been 'covering' the Java war front for Mutual was safely back on American soil this week.

Landing in New York last week after travelling half-way around the world aboard an American steamer that zig-zagged its way for three months and two days safely through sub-infested seas, Miss Wayne—although cool and smiling as she set

foot in New York—had a hair-raising story to tell.

'Our boat, heavy with extra cargo and extra passengers, had its narrowest escape from enemy submarines a few days out of Bombay while en route to South Africa,' declared the Northwestern University graduate who two years ago won her assignment to cover the battle front for Mutual.

'Our radio reported the sinking of one of our escort ships a scant two hours behind us after leaving Bombay, and off Madras another ship traveling the same course was torpedoed.'

Miss Wayne had other facts to mention upon her arrival: 1) Her vessel was unarmed during the voyage except for a wooden gun which was taken off at Bombay, 2) Aboard were 45 Burma Road workers, as well as government and military officials who had been stationed in Java, 3) South African situation is more serious than Americans realize, 4) Her immediate plans include 'seeing a lot of bright lights, eating a lot of oysters, visiting my home in Swarthmore, Pa., and plenty of rest—and then, off to Australia, I hope!'

### Breckner at 'The Point'

Pinch-hitting for ailing Wally Butterworth on the Vox Pop broadcast from the grounds of the U. S. Military Academy at West Point, N. Y., KNX's ace special events commentator, Gary Breckner, rendered a potent account of himself as Parks Johnson's mike-mate last Monday, April 6.

From a bevy of ad-lib specialists over the nation last week the Vox Pop program heads selected Breckner to fly east for the West Point program when Butterworth's physician refused to allow him to face a microphone.

Vox Pop, first commercial radio program to conduct a half-hour of fun questions and answers at 'The Point' in August of 1941, returned to the hallowed heights of West Point Monday to record the voices of the cadets who before World War II had ended might well follow in the illustrious footsteps of such gallant men of arms as Grant and Lee, and more recently MacArthur, Wainright and Kelly—all graduates of 'The Point.'

First Class men, soon to graduate and speed to active commands on America's far-flung battle stations, paused briefly in their day and night training to assemble in the West Point War Department Theater.

broadcasts from San Francisco early in 1941, and immediately gained a huge following by his impartial and dignified analysis of the news of the day, delivered in calm, measured tones. He avoids the personal pronouns and is noted for the clear-cut pattern of his broadcasts.

### Scully's April

Theme song of blonde, vivacious fashion reporter Frances Scully who has been dishing up glamorous tidbits on the stars over BLUE ether waves on the 'Speaking of Glamour' twice-weekly series might well be 'I'll Remember April.'

It was April, 1936, when blue-eyed Miss Scully from Pocatello (Idaho) joined the NBC press department in Hollywood as a fashion publicist.

It was April, 1939, when Irene Rich developed a case of laryngitis the day before she was scheduled to act as mistress of ceremonies for a fashion show being broadcast coast-to-coast from the Biltmore Hotel, and Frances was selected to pinch-hit for the famous actress.

So, in April, 1940, after months of personal appearances before women's clubs, national conventions, etc., Frances was launched on her own show, 'Speaking of Glamour.'

Five weeks ago the blue-eyed

blonde from Pocatello bobbed up with an idea for a show called 'Your Blind Date' that BLUE Network program executives thought so highly of that they immediately marshalled together an all-girl cast with Frances Scully as mistress of ceremonies and placed the half-hour show on the air over the BLUE's Pacific Network.

So great has been reaction to the 'Your Blind Date' airshow that last weekend Bob Moss, BLUE'S alert program director in Hollywood and producer of Frances Scully's new show, announced that beginning April (there's that April again!) 20th 'Your Blind Date' will be moved from its Thursday spot to Monday at 6 p. m. (P.W.T.) and broadcast over the BLUE's transcontinental hook up of stations from California to New York.

### Paramount Gets Bill

Bill Goodwin, Burns and Allen foil and one of radio's outstanding announcers, early this week affixed his signature to a long-term acting contract at Paramount film studios.

Goodwin's superb acting performance on Silver Theater opposite Joan Bennett recently is said to have excited three different studios, with Y. Frank Freeman's lot finally winning out.

Not many people know it, but the handsome Burns and Allen performer was an actor before he turned announcer. In 1934 at KHJ, when it was the CBS affiliate here, Goodwin appeared regularly in dramatic roles on Edward Lynn's notable series, 'Catherine the Great,' which was produced by Ken Niles.

According to Sportscripper Samuelson, the ex-Stanford mentor who is now conducting spring grid practice at the University of Maryland on the East Coast after leaving the Indians a few weeks ago, told a friend while en route to Maryland that 'I expect to be back—after the war!'

WILCOX: The Johnson Wax Program, with Fibber McGee & Molly!  
ORCH: Theme.

WILCOX: The makers of Johnson's Wax and Johnson's self-polishing Glocat present Fibber McGee & Molly . . . written by Don Quinn, with songs by the King's Men, and music by Billy Mills' orchestra.

The show opens with: "There's a Great Day Coming, Manana".

ORCH: "There's a Great Day Coming".

WIL: After dinner tonight while Molly was starting her dishwashing, Fibber suddenly threw down his magazine and dashed out of the house. Why? Well, we refer you to Fibber McGee and Molly!

SOUND: (Dishwashing effect).

MOL: I wonder what got into McGee all of a sudden. Oh well—

SOUND: (Dishwashing effect).

MOL: (Sings) McGee never helps me wash the dirty dishes—McGee—

SOUND: (Footsteps off mike fast) (Door open and slam).

FIB: Okay, Molly—one side there! I'm takin' over the dishwashing to-night. Gimme that apron.

MOL: McGee, what on earth—

FIB: Come on, come on, come on!! This is important . . . Open this package of soap, . . . while I roll up my sleeves. Then you go sit down and knit a natty little nightie for some nipper in the navy while I wash these dishes and—

MOL: McGee!!

FIB: Eh?

MOL: Calm down!!!

FIB: Okay . . . I'm calm. I'm as cuke as a cucumber. I mean—

MOL: Take off your hat.

FIB: Oh . . . scuse me. But come on! I gotta—

MOL: Stop skipping around while I'm talking to you, for goodness' sakes! You're as jumpy as a jeep. Now then . . . tell me what this is all about.

FIB: Okay! See this package of soap? This is Latherino. The soap that's gonna be worth five thousand bucks a year to you and me!

MOL: You don't say! What do we do with it—wash the Rockefeller Foundation?

FIB: Maybe I better start at the beginning.

if my broadcasting didn't get beyond the stadium public address system.

**The fact that my Dad taught me to swim at the age of five had a lot to do with my radio career, too. What does swimming have to do with radio? Well, all those years of swimming led to my getting a job at Santa Monica one summer as a lifeguard.**

One morning while on duty in my tower I saw a couple of huskies playing baseball on the beach below, which was against the rules. The rule-breakers turned out to be a couple of fellows from NBC—Ted Hediger, a producer, and an engineer by the name of Ferguson.

Hediger proved to be a former lifeguard. So we hit it off from the start. Before I realized it I was out there tossing the ball around, too, while we all gabbed about radio. From that morning on, I ate, slept and lived radio. I used to go to bed at night counting microphones instead of sheep.

**But it was really my thumb that finally got me my first radio opportunity.**

In my junior year at U.C.L.A. a buddy of mine and I thumbed our way east for two big track meets in the summer—the Pacific Coast-Big Ten classic at Evanston and later the nationals at Minneapolis. We had arranged with the Los Angeles Times to cover the meets. We wrote our stories on the Evanston meet and then pulled out for Minneapolis. There we ran into Bill Henry who happened to be on his way through

## INDIAN TRIBE ADOPTS 'Little Beaver'

**T**OMMY COOK is only 11 years old, but already he boasts two aliases, and come Monday, April 13, he'll have three—all of them come by right honorably, ladies and gentlemen.

To BLUE Network listeners and movie fans, Tommy is known as Little Beaver, the Indian boy companion of Red Ryder.

To classmates at Carthay Center grammar school, Tommy has built quite a reputation as the 'Little Slugger,' a title he won with his ability to apply the hickory to the horsehide on the school baseball team.

That takes care of two of the boy's aliases. The third he will adopt on April 13, when he is inducted into the Yakima Tribe of Indians as an honorary member.

Thereafter Tommy will be known to other members of the tribe as 'A-To-Ka', which, translated into English, means 'Water Fish.'

Tommy has earned his trio of aliases through diligent application to the thing he had to do. As Little Beaver he has mastered the idioms and voice inflections of the Indian to such a degree that many listeners to the 'Red Ryder' series believe he is actually a member of the race. When he takes his turn at the plate in school baseball games, Tommy forgets everything but the ball zooming its way toward him.

As for the forthcoming honor to be conferred upon him by Chief Yowlachi of the Yakimas, it stems from his realistic portrayal of the Indian boy in the BLUE Network series. Incidentally, Tommy's induction into the tribe

on April 13 will be the occasion for a special broadcast that day at 3 p. m. (PWT) over KECA. As an added highlight of the special ceremony program Chief Yowlachi will chant an ancient Indian song.

Born in Duluth, Minn., on July 5, 1930, Tommy Cook came to Los Angeles with his family about five years ago. Having already shown an aptitude for the dramatic, his mother enrolled him at Ben Bard's and later at the Emerson College in Hollywood, where he took a course in diction.

In December, 1939, Tommy won his first role at the Pasadena Playhouse, and scored so heavily that he has since played several featured roles on Gilmor Brown's Crown City stage. His first radio acclaim came in 1940 when he appeared in the BLUE serial, 'Your Neighbors, The Haines.' The same year Arch Oboler selected him for various featured roles in his broadcasts. Early this year he presided over the March of Dimes broadcast from Hollywood and proved a sensation as the master of ceremonies of a star-studded show that included the greatest names in the radio and film capital.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Sydney Cook, Tommy lives with his parents at 6517 Olympic Place in Los Angeles.

town, and promptly wired The Times that their ace columnist and former sports editor was in town to look over the meet. That was our fatal boner. The Times promptly wired Henry to cover the meet and wired us that we were off salary.

And so back to the West Coast we thumbed our way, landing in Fresno just in time for the National A. A. U. meet, with no job, no prospects, and just enough money for a night's lodging and a couple of hamburgers. But we were in luck. We ran into Buddy Twiss.

I had met Buddy at NBC in Hollywood before college had closed for the summer. He was their top special events man, and I had been hammering at him trying to get a break on the kilocycles. I had learned that Fresno was getting the National A. A. U. meet and had tipped off Buddy so that he had arranged an exclusive broadcast of the meet. He was grateful for that tip, and so when we bounced into each other at Fresno the rest was easy.

Buddy admitted he hadn't seen any of the athletes in action previously, and so my pal got the job spotting the boys for Buddy and I was given the assignment of announcing the first half of each race because I was more familiar with the runners. That was my first job on the air—a debut over both the NBC red and blue networks!

The breaks began to come thick and fast for the fresh young punk from Pasadena high school. I bobbed up with an idea NBC liked and bought for a football show. It played all season.

Then came the Rose Bowl game of 1941. One of my best chums at U.C.L.A. was Clark Shaughnessy, Jr., the track star and son of the Stanford coach. Every weekend we usually wound up in Palo Alto to watch the Indians cavort. We stayed with the Shaughnessy family and at night the great Indian mentor would sit down and show us how that now-famous T formation worked. When Stanford got the Rose Bowl nod my knowledge of Stanford's formations gave me the inside track to the job as Bill Stern's Stanford representative in the NBC broadcasting booth at Pasadena.

This led to several broadcasts—a weekly sports review that carried through spring, a chance to describe the A. A. U. meet at Stanford three days after U.C.L.A. finally decided to give me a sheepskin last June, and finally an army camp show that started in mid-July and gave me enough experience to handle the current 'It Happened in the Service' assignment on NBC each Wednesday afternoon.

## Battle of the Budget!

By EVELYN BIGSBY

### In This Corner, Agnes White With Food Tips For You Housewives

**F**IVE TONS of food! 'That,' says the KFI home economist, Agnes White, 'is what the average housewife prepares in one year. It represents one-fourth (by careful management, one-fifth of the family income.'

'Indeed it is a bulky problem,' she admits smilingly but confidently. 'Since the holidays, 90 per cent of my mail has changed over from general household problems and entertaining to the question of marketing and preparation of food. Women are tussling with higher prices, shortages of materials and packagings, sugar rationing, and in some cases, where men have entered the service, with diminished incomes.'

Mrs. White suggests that housewives divide their purchases into five classifications and that they spend one-fifth of the food budget on each of the following:

Milk, cheese.

Fruits, leafy green and other vegetables.

Lean meats, fish, eggs.

Cereals.

Fats and sugars.

Here are some of her tips to help Radio Life housewives better Old Man Budget and yet serve your family nutritious meals:

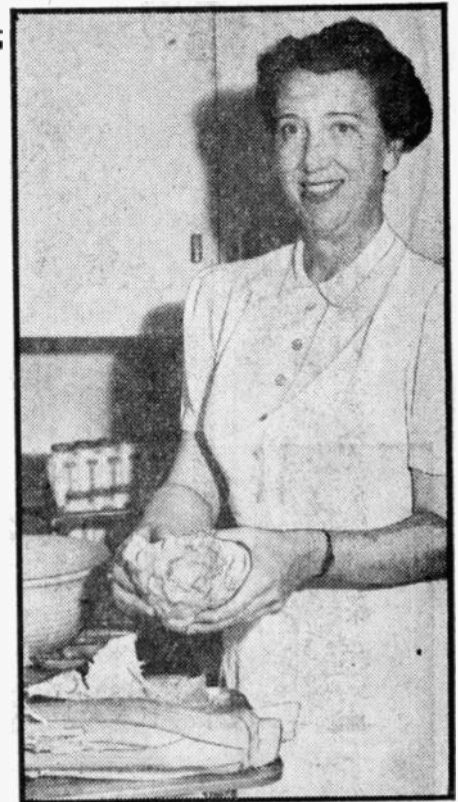
1. Don't think of milk as a beverage only. Use canned milk for soups and sauces and use cheeses (concentrated milk) in sandwiches and casserole dishes.

2. If the family doesn't consume enough fruit juices and salads, place the fruit bowl on the table as a definite part of the lunch or dinner meal. (This is done extensively in Europe.)

3. Buy frozen foods, which are net weight and which are packaged at the height of the season.

4. Never select the largest vegetables—they are apt to be woody and over-grown. Medium-sized are the best buys.

5. Use every edible scrap of the vegetable. Stew the tough ends of asparagus and the stems of spinach. Combine with cream sauce to make cream of asparagus or cream of

"Use every bit of them", she advises as she prepares celery to stuff, stew, and as a soup base.

spinach soup. Do same with celery. Stew the outside, heavy green leaves of lettuce (which are not considered attractive for salad but which are rich in chlorophyll) and serve with hot butter and lemon juice. Or shred and serve as wilted lettuce with bacon fat.

6. Use moderate heat with your meats as too much toughens the protein.

7. Watch for greater values in the enriched cereals, now available in the markets.

8. Feed your family members adequately on the four foregoing classes of food, and they won't need so much sugar and fat. Many times the craving for these is due to a false hunger, attributable to malnutrition.

9. As substitutes for sugar use

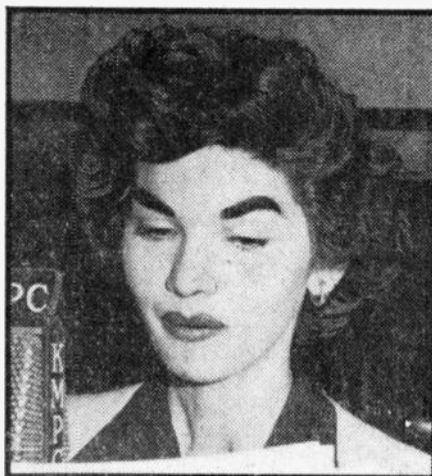

honey, fruits, prunes, (never sweeten) dried fruits, raisins, molasses.

10. After you have marketed discreetly, be careful how you cook your foods. Don't throw cooking liquids down the sink—save for soups and sauces.

11. Don't overcook things. If your cabbage has an odor, it has cooked too long. Simply shred the raw

cabbage, drop it in small amounts into boiling water, let boil three to five minutes.

12. Never light the oven for just one dish. (Mrs. White always slips in a pan of rice pudding, if not a whole meal.)

13. Explore dehydrated foods, which are coming to the fore.

14. Remember this: Every time you open your garbage can, you are wasting the labor of your husband. Only if your food is spoiled—if a bug got there before you did—are you

justified in virtually dumping dollars and cents into the refuse container.

MOL: Which did you prefer?

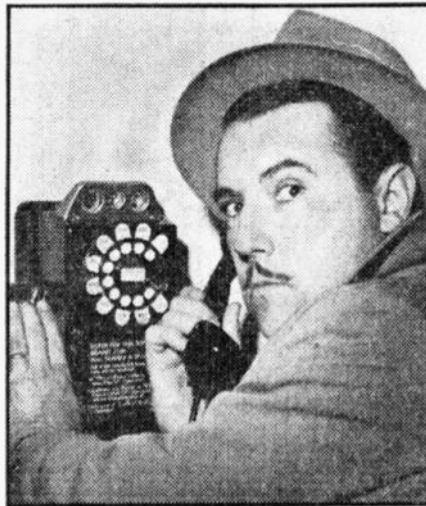
MAYOR: Darby.

★ ★ **T** O A MAN on the street in Glendale a Radio Life reporter last week posed this question: "Why is there no visible evidence of complacency here as there is in so many cities in southern California?" The answer was simple and to the point: "Art Baker has taken care of that."

For five and six nights a week Art Baker—utilizing a magnificent voice in which people readily believe—has been spreading and verifying the rumor that America is at war.
