Good Neighbor Chain

Radio's biggest step of the week in further strengthening the ties of hemispheric solidarity between the Americas came Tuesday (May 19) when CBS dedicated its new Latin American Network (Network of the Americas) with an hour-long, star-studded program which was heard here through KNX and transmitted to 76 stations in the new chain.

The new Network of the Americas is a significant achievement in radio and serves to create a "Two-Way Street" for hemispheric broadcasts between Central and South America and the United States.

The new sister stations of CBS in Latin America are the realization of a long-standing ambition of William S. Paley, far-sighted CBS president who made a personal survey in 1939 to substantiate his opinion that the ties uniting American republics could be strengthened through the medium of the microphone.

Following a seven-week air tour of Latin American countries Paley became further convinced that short-waving North American programs to the Southern republics was not enough, since, as in the U. S., most persons in those countries listen to their local broadcasts.

Not only will Paley cover Latin America with CBS programs, but he has set up machinery that will enable programs originating in the Southern republics to be heard in the U. S. over CBS.

Three transmitters will serve the Latin American station chain. These were erected at a cost of more than \$500,000, and in test operations since the first of this year have exceeded in reception and quality even what the engineers who designed them had hoped for.

Redlands' Glee

Good news to southern California radio listeners was last week's announcement by Fred Waring that Redlands University's excellent glee club (heard via local programs many times) has been selected as one of the eight finalists in Waring's Pleasure Time national glee club competition.

The University of Redlands glee club, along with the other seven finalists, will compete for the national title in a concert scheduled for Carnegie

Hall May 30 and 31, with all proceeds going to the U. S. O.

Waring has announced that the winning club will be presented on his broadcast of May 31 via NBC-KFI, KFI, 8 p.m. Mon., Tues., Thurs., Fri.

Famous Voice Stilled

When the rages of a throat infection (streptococcus) took the life of Graham McNamee at the age of 53 on May 9 in New York's St. Luke hospital one of radio's most famous and fabulous voices was stilled.

McNamee, who began his air career in 1923 as an announcer-singer at Manhattan's Station WEAJ, "covered" the first of his now-famous string of sports contests in the summer of that year when he gave the blow-by-blow account of the Greb-Wilson title fight and his first description of a World Series classic. For the first time that year, the sports fanatics heard the familiar "Take it away, Graham!"

McNamee was the first of radio's breathless, exciting ad-libbers. Admittedly no expert on things athletic, Graham nevertheless won great audiences with his enthusiasm and ability to dramatize the "color" of a sporting contest.

When he came west in 1926 to mike-report the first Rose Bowl game ever aired over a coast-to-coast network (NBC), McNamee went into spasms about the green Pasadena hills and the California sunshine and almost forgot to describe the action of the ball game.

His most dramatic faux pas came when he announced the wrong winner at the Poughkeepsie regatta.

Famous reporter Ring Lardner, who sat next to McNamee one time during his broadcast of a baseball game, remarked in his column that he had attended a double-header—the game that was played and the one McNamee announced.

When the Ted Husings and Bill Sterns bounced into the sportcasting circle in the 30's, McNamee gradually began to be in less demand for big-time sports reporting, although until recent years sponsors still clamored for his "color" commenting between rounds at the championship fights.

Listeners heard the familiar Irish baritone voice of McNamee during the past months as master-of-ceremonies on Elsa Maxwell's Party Line broad-

casts over the Blue Network on Fridays from New York.

Graham gave his final radio sign-off on the Party Line show of April 24, the day before he was admitted to the hospital for a checkup. According to Walter Winchell, the famous announcer was advised by physicians for months to consent to a tonsil operation which he refused.

Corky's Mother

An attractive, smartly-dressed young woman sat at a microphone in Studio G of Radio City on a recent Wednesday (May 6) talking leisurely but seriously to Hank McCune, young master of ceremonies on It Happened in the Service.

"Corky's two today!" she said proudly as any mother would of her own child on its second birthday.

The young woman was Mrs. Colin P. Kelly, widow of the late Colin P. Kelly Jr., whose name has gone down in history as America's first aerial hero of World War II.

And the "Corky" she talked about was Colin Kelly, III, born at Riverside's March Field Army Air Base when Capt. Kelly was in training for his wings two years ago.

Although she is working at a local aircraft plant, Mrs. Kelly still finds time to make numerous appearances before large groups who are devoting their efforts to the drive for funds to carry on the war.

Attempts were made by the sponsor of It Happened in the Service to remunerate Mrs. Kelly for her appearance on the program, but as usual (she has never accepted money for any appearance) she declined, although saying that she would be grateful if Par Soap would make a donation to the Red Cross. Before she was off the air, Hank McCune had wired and received confirmation from the Par Soap people in Oakland that they had just donated \$100 to the Red Cross.

When asked about her plans for young Corky, Mrs. Kelly said she hopes to send him to West Point when he's old enough. She added that she was very happy that he was already able to name off all the important planes like the P-38, P-40, etc.

"Every one at home should write letters to their friends and members of their family who are in the service," declared Mrs. Kelly. "Letters that are cheerful, and don't expect any in return as the boys are busy. Every mother should be proud to have her son in the service, wherever he is, whatever he's doing." KFI, 5:30 p.m. Wed.

Rudy Foregoes Siesta

Rudy Vallee, like so many other radio personalities, will forego his usual summer sojourn which for the past 14 years has taken him to that famous lodge of his in the backwoods country of Maine.

Not only will the curly-haired Vallee continue his Sealtime airshows from Hollywood's Blue network stu-

dios during the summer months, but he will continue to spend much of his off-the-air moments in active service with the State Guard Evacuation Unit of which he is a Lieutenant.

According to Cinemactor Lewis Stone, who commands the State Guard Unit, Vallee's suggestion that the Evacuation Unit officers and men undergo a complete course in auto mechanics has been adopted. All of which means that Lieut. Vallee's summer will be spent in overalls rather than leisure shirts. KECA, KFSD, 7 p.m. Thurs.

Revise Burns Show

Do you recall the Arkansas Traveler format which Bob Burns used to inaugurate his current CBSeries for Campbell Soup? Well, the report this week is that Bob, who isn't any too happy about the switch (which took place some months ago) from the Traveler idea to a variety show type of broadcast, has talked his sponsor into allowing him to go back to the original Traveler idea for the final three broadcasts of the season which ends June 9th.

These three stanzas with the Arkansas Traveler format will be in the form of a test to see if the sponsor can't be sold on resuming next fall with the Traveler idea rather than the current variety show routine.

If Bazooka Bob cannot resell his sponsor on the Traveler type of show it is understood that Burns will probably go on the ether for somebody who does like the Traveler idea next season. Reports are also rife that Bob might return to the Kraft Music Hall with his former radio colleague, Bing Crosby, although Radio Life's editors consider this unlikely. KNX, 9:30 p.m. Tues.

Toscanini's Return

Radio Life readers who often express themselves as being in favor of the classics and symphonic music will be interested in the announcement from New York this week that the NBC Symphony Orchestra will broadcast another series of 24 concerts beginning October 31.

Arturo Toscanini, after a year's absence from the radio podium, (except for five Treasury Hour broadcasts) has been signed to conduct the first 12 broadcasts of the season. Leopold Stokowski, suggested by Toscanini as his successor when the latter decided last spring to take a sabbatical year from broadcasting, will share the NBC Symphony Orchestra baton honors with the Italian maestro, directing the final frame of 12 broadcasts through April 10, 1943.

The new series by the NBC Symphony strikes an interesting note for those who follow "inside" radio in its many complex network problems. Although the series is sponsored by the National Broadcasting Company and is scheduled to originate in NBC's own studio in New York's Radio City, the broadcasts will be heard via the Blue Network and KECA every Saturday from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. It is understood that NBC was unable to

clear the proper time on its own airways for the series, and rather than sacrifice the programs from a listener's standpoint, decided to complete necessary arrangements with the Blue for the coast-to-coast airing.

On Fred Allen

Fred Allen is famous as one of the few comedians on Broadway who draws more panhandlers at the studio door than he does autograph fans. Irving Hoffman, one of Winchell's right-hand men who is well known as the writer of a column titled "Tales of Hoffman," passes this item on from New York.

As Fred was leaving the CBS Playhouse after his broadcast, the usual mob of panhandlers gathered around the stage door. Noting the familiar face of an old vaudeville headliner, Fred took a bill out of his pocket and handed it to the chap. The fellow looked at the bill and handed it back.

"I'm sorry, Fred," he explained. "But I've already reached my salary ceiling for the year!"

Hull Wins Spot

Warren Hull, the former cinemactor who encountered a small bit of radio popularity on the Maxwell House airshow several years ago, has become a radio regular again according to advice from the sponsors of Vox Pop in New York.

Hull, who on the basis of a program called Grin and Bear It which he ran on a Boston station several months ago, won two "trial runs" on the Vox Pop show recently with Parks Johnson, has proven himself an effective co-interviewer with Johnson.

He succeeds the former Vox Pop co-emcee, Wally Butterworth, who left the program some weeks ago to free lance as a radio producer and writer.

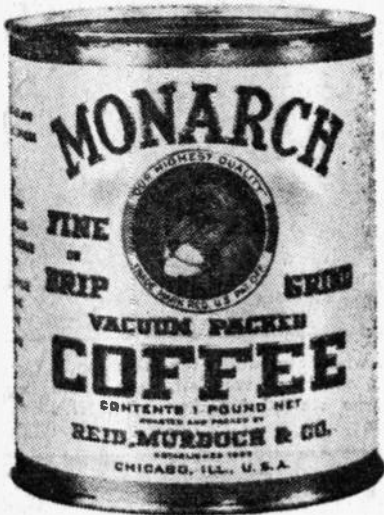

Tribute to a Hero

Radio, like no other medium of expression, has brought home to Americans and all freedom-loving peoples the horrors of war. Radio, through the magic of its wave lengths and the superb artistry of its performers and writers, sometimes puts into stirring words and music the things so many of us feel in our hearts. On a recent Kate Smith Hour over CBS-KNX on Fridays at 9 p. m. the popular singer and commentator paid tribute to the memory of Samuel Marrett of the United States Army who died in the line of duty in the Philippines on December 10, 1941. Grape Nuts, sponsor of Kate Smith's program, has granted Radio Life special permission to reprint this memorable Tribute to a Hero.—The Editor.

I speak to you from New York City,
Samuel Marrett.

I address my remarks to you,
Because, on December 10, you led an
attack on enemy transports:
Two of them you destroyed,
But in a dive against the third . . . in
the explosion of the ship,
Your plane was caught and the enemy scored.

I speak to you from New York City.
It's not much different from the night
you died.
People are at the movies, or dancing
. . . or sleeping,
And the city is settling down for the
night,
Whispering itself to sleep.
I thought of you tonight, Samuel Marrett. . .
I looked up at the stars and thought
He watched them once in Texas. . .

I've seen Texas, Samuel Marrett,
I know the wide sweep of the horizon,
the height of those western stars,
I know the calm sunburned peace of
Texas
I wish we might have talked together,
you and I . . .
I've seen what America is to you . . .
A creed to die for.
And it is that to me too—and to all
Americans.

Do you realize how many times you
died before, Samuel Marrett?
You died at Bunker Hill and Gettys-
burg, the Alamo and Wake Island,
For the creed and the flag are all-
embracing,
And the ideal for which you died has
been unchanging since its concep-
tion.

Samuel Marrett, do you know how
they sat in counsel in Czechoslo-
vakia once.
They sat and talked freely and openly
until the boot came down
Until the iron heel came down on the
up-turned face,
The whip on the bowed back. . .

And a word cut across their souls . . .
verboten! verboten!
And a suffocating silence set in.
And once . . . yes, once, they laughed
in Vienna!

They danced and sang and laughed:
There was the music of Strauss and
Beethoven.

Schumann, Mozart, Haydn.
There were lovely ladies in wide skirts
and cavaliers to court them

Johnny on the Spot

● For sheer drama, up-and-down-the-spine tingling lump-in-the-throat stuff, this column doffs its new Dobbs straw to Wyllis Cooper, the author, and the other War Department men responsible for the creation and production of The Army Hour, streamlined, world-wide-hopping ether juggernaut aired over NBC's network to KFI every Sunday afternoon.

With each successive presentation since its debut on April 5 The Army Hour has matured in radio finesse and entertainment values. Even in its third week The Army Hour was surpassing anything the high-powered, much-heralded This Is War show ever displayed during its 13-week life on the wave lengths.

Two Sundays ago, on May 10, The Army Hour came through with its finest performance to date. It was significant that on the first Mother's Day to find American boys locked in battle since World War I ended in 1918, The Army Hour dedicated its sixth edition to American mothers with tributes expressed by U. S. soldiers here and overseas.

With amazing timing and without benefit of introductions, The Army Hour leaped into one U. S. foreign outpost after another for simple, heart-warming statements from the throats of Uncle Sam's fighting men who were remembering their mothers on Mother's Day.

And although he, like all the other boys who preceded him, said simply, "This is Joe, mother. I've been in a lot of fights, but this is the biggest yet!" those with ears to their loudspeakers immediately recognized the husky, familiar voice of Private Joe Louis Barrows, better known to sport-loving American millions as Joe Louis, heavy-weight boxing champion of the world.

Yes, it was Joe Louis, the same stalwart chocolate soldier of Uncle Sam's troops, who on March 10 of this year stood on the stage of the Walter Winchell-inspired Navy Relief Society Show in New York's Madison Square Garden and said simply:

"We are going to win because we are on God's side."

● An extra helping of drama was handed listeners on The Army Hour broadcast of May 10 when, for the third straight week, a Nazi Station in Germany tried to jam the proceedings with a pianist doing his unavailing best to drown out a pick-up from Curacao, Dutch Guiana. Several weeks ago the Japs succeeded in jamming a pick-up from Chungking, China, but Army Hour engineers managed to get the remote through from Curacao despite the Nazi piano which you heard in the background during a three-minute portion of the show.

● When a studio visitor asked Fibber McGee scripter Don Quinn why he uses only original material on the Wistful Vista show, Quinn quipped: "Guess I'm too lazy to do any heavy lifting."

● This is war, too: Arch Oboler, the much-quoted author-director of Plays for Americans over NBC, is practicing the thing he has been air-preaching—that precious item called patriotism. Arch, who used to make the 120-mile round trip to Hollywood twice weekly from his home near Oxnard, in order to outline the plot of his Sunday scripts to Composer-conductor Gordon Jenkins and then to hear what Jenkins had written, is now saving wear and tear on his rubber tires by utilizing the telephone. He outlines the plot to Gordon via phone and then hears Jenkins' score played back over the telephone after it is completed.

● Star Dust: Isabel Randolph, who started her acting career as a juvenile trouser with her parents on the stage, is the Mrs. Uppington you hear with Fibber McGee and Molly on Tuesdays . . . In the studio wings where Mrs. Jordan (Molly to you) handled the introductions, Mrs. Uppington proved anything but uppity . . . A warm, gracious, eye-sparkling type, she has spent the past 10 years in radio . . . Has two grown daughters . . . and an Encino house full of pets . . . Likes knitting . . . movies . . . horseback riding . . . and acting . . . Once the leading lady with repertory companies in Rochester, Cleveland, Detroit, Chicago, etc. . . She appears on other NBC shows although her Mrs. Uppington character is her most popular contribution to the laugh lines.

● The mayors of several southland towns we know could well take a hint or two from a fellow by the name of James Jordan who is letting no grass grow under his feet as mayor of Encino. Jordan, who

is better known to radio fans as Fibber McGee, is really serious about his duties as Encino's chief executive. When we saw him the other day he was completing plans with his city council for the erection of a new fire hall for Encino. Apparently nothing he has done in recent years has given him as much joy as the successful raising of funds for Encino's fire house, for the day we saw James Jordan he was wreathed in smiles.

● Upcoming Star: Dave Lane, whose songs-chatter-piano routines via KNX these days are catching on big with femme listeners as well as the male contingent, is a 5-foot blend of informality and Southern hospitality in person. Dave was brought out to Hollywood in February, 1941, when Al Pearce heard one of his recordings and invited him to leave Charlotte, N. C. long enough to appear on one of the Pearce broadcasts here. Before he could return to his hometown, KNX executives signed him up and he's been a happy Lane ever since. Dave's a sentimental fellow who likes to recall childhood memories, and as we swapped tales of yesteryear, he came up with what he tabs as his favorite memory. At the age of 10 he stood on the front porch of his home and invited everyone who passed by to drop in for lunch. Dave said that 31 people accepted, and his parents, as well as himself, haven't forgotten that occasion to this day!

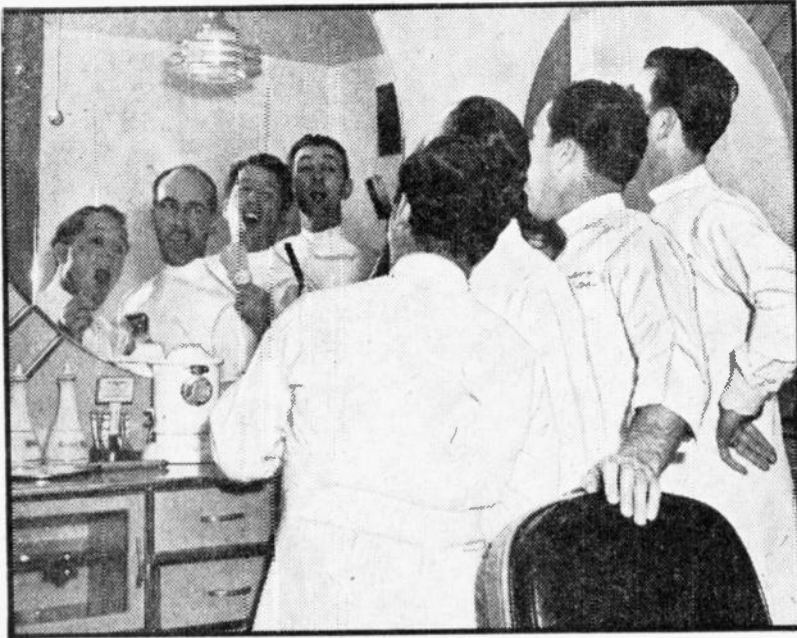

HENRY ALDRICH'S pal, Homer—that's Jackie Kelk. Squeaky-voiced, pop-eyed, friendlier than an official city greeter, this radio veteran grew up on a steady diet of microphones, Hollywood cameras, and Broadway boards. Now approaching 20, he's still growing.

Jackie was play-acting in front of his mirror when he was five, and three years later he was doing it in earnest on Broadway. That was twelve years ago, when he became a hit in Fanny Brice's famous "Cohens". Today, with Hollywood, Broadway, and radio as his playground, this grinning youngster is still hitting, and on high.

A star? Well, yes, but in radio they don't think of Jackie that way. To page boys and to Eddie Cantor, to Tallulah Bankhead and the girls in the drug store, he's the fresh kid with the grin. In and out of NBC's studios like an imp, he knows them all, and they all know him.

"Hi, Jackie!" they grin back at him, for when Jackie says hello, there's something friendly and funny in the way he says it.

That's the "Homer Brown" in him, the character he plays on the popular "Aldrich Family" for NBC. Homer's a fresh kid, funny and friendly, and amazingly adept at getting Henry into trouble.

"Gee whiz, Henry," Homer says at least once on every program, and then the audience roars. That's Jackie Kelk.

This unspoiled friendly boy came up radio's hard way, through years of trouping, a childhood crowded

with stage doors and microphones, and not much time for fun. He's a regular boy, though, for his mother saw to that. Somewhere between Hollywood and New York, between rehearsals and shows and programs, she found time for Jackie to play. When they made their first trip to the West coast, to join Loretta Young and Cary Grant in "Born to be Bad", Jackie carried a suitcase across the country. In it was a flea-bitten mongrel pup.

"After all," Mrs. Kelk decided, "a boy's got to have a dog."

Mumps, measles, camping trips in Vermont, swimming with the gang in Long Island, building boats, fixing up the roof on the summer cottage, —that's Jackie Kelk, too.

His first date was just like the boy's down the block. Dressed in his first stiff shirt, he took Nancy Walker to a dance at school, the Professional Children's School in Manhattan. Nancy was studying singing and dancing, and today she's a rising young star in the Broadway hit, "Best Foot Forward."

"We had a swell time," Jackie laughs, "I borrowed my father's braided vest, and I could hardly breathe all night."

The original of such network favorites as Terry in "Terry and the Pirates" and Bob Putnam in "Wings Over America," Jackie's had to give up much of his time to concentrate on "The Aldrich Family". He still does some Navy recruiting programs, and his regular appearances on NBC's "Young Widder Brown". It's as Henry's pal, however, that Jackie has become a national tradition.

On Thursday nights, after the pro-

gram goes off the air, Jackie reports to the Stage Door Canteen, Broadway's night spot run exclusively for service men by the Theater Wing. There, in a bus-boy's jacket, he rattles dishes for the soldiers.

"You wanna 'nother cupa cawfee?" he draws, and the service boys respond at once.

"Gee whiz," they gasp, "it's Homer!" "Yeh," Homer grins, "gee whiz!" That's Jackie Kelk.

Coming out of the Ether

Better take care of that radio receiver, brother. No telling what's likely to happen. Maybe we won't be able to get parts one of these days. They're already clamping down on some radio items.

Curtis Mason and H. L. Blatterman, chief engineers at KFI and KECA, have been in the radio business a long, long time. And they're having

their own private radio sets checked over now, before it's too late.

They suggest a couple of things to do. Such as using common sense in playing the radio. "Don't go away from home and leave it on," they advise. "You'll not only run up your electric bill if you do, but it means that much more wear on the equipment."

In addition to having a reliable repair man look it over, the two aforementioned gents suggest a checkup of the power and antenna installations might be in order.

As for folks who have combination sets . . . those that play records too . . . Mason and Blatterman point out that records, (which won't be as easy to obtain), should be carefully cleaned with a soft cloth. "Don't pick 'em up with your fingers and leave moist prints. That's bad." Might be a good idea, too, to follow the instructions on the needle package. And don't use needles once, set them aside, then put them back in the holder. Needles wear on one side and when they're used over again, they wreck a record. Finally, the motor should be given the once-over now, before it's too late. Electric motors are on the priorities list, you know.



Not long ago, I put my head on the chopping block when I frankly criticized, in a general way, some of our

And besides, I ain't exactly crazy!

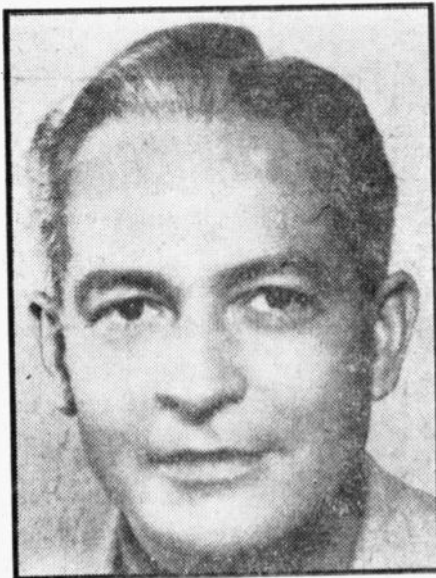

Hearty thanks to readers who let us know they liked our musichatter in Radio Life. And now we'd like your opinion on this: Should we confine our wordage largely to bands on the air or should we dig some general news of Coast bands and handmen? Our boss wants to give Radio Lifers what they want, but he is, after all, getting out a radio, not a music mag.

However, it seems that the West Coast does need a musical news medium. **Down Beat, Metronome, Music & Rhythm** and **Orchestra World** are all published east of the Rockies, and, geared to national circulation, can devote only limited coverage to California music news.

We believe Radio Life has a logical place in the musical news field because, in actuality, every musical organization of any importance is "on the air"—if not by direct or remote broadcast, then through phonograph records, which are played on radio stations all over the country. What do you think?

ABOUT DISCASTING

The broadcasting of phonograph records enables radio stations to give the public the finest music of all kinds—popular, symphonic, jazz, and their many variants. No station could afford to give its listeners such a vast store of musical wealth by broadcasting only actual performance.

The musicians (we mean "side-men"—not leaders) who make these records receive about \$7.50 per side or \$15 per record. They rarely share in royalties from the sale of the discs, as do bandleaders, songwriters and publishers. A group of professional musicians, organized here in Los Angeles, want to establish a plan whereby radio stations (and juke box operators) who use records on commercial programs will pay performance royalties to musicians. The money would be divided among the performing musicians and among unemployed musicians (many of them displaced by juke boxes). A portion would also be set aside for aid to sick and over-age musicians.

Sounds very reasonable to us.

PASSING NOTES

Apologies to the new Louisiana, opening May 21, for referring to it as the Wilshire Bowl, the last days of which were unhappy for all concerned. Operators of the Louisiana want to start with a clean slate. They tell us that Radio Singer Bob Carroll will emcee the show, which will feature delectable Dorothy Dandridge (although it is not a sepia show), and that Sterling Young's ork will be heard from there nightly via the Blue Network, a nice break for Sterling . . . Listen for Joe ("Pagliacci") Reichman, opening May 28 at the Biltmore, on KFI . . . Freddy Martin's sonorous saxes and silky strings are heard nightly from the Coconut Grove via KHJ . . . Ella Fitzgerald has two KHJ periods nightly from the Trianon—except on Thursdays, when she has three, 10:00, 11:30, and 1:00 a. m. By the way, Ella's band is really Eddie Barefield's. The Bob Crosby band will summer at Balboa's Rendezvous, opening July 3. Harry James will officially open the summer season at Balboa with a one-nighter June 27. Mutual is expected to carry Crosby's band from Balboa . . . It's Ted Lewis after Jan Savitt at the Casa Manana, which airs nightly via KHJ. . . . The lovely young singer heard with Art Whiting's ork is Margie Carle, 16-year-old daughter of Frankie Carle, ace piano man with Horace Heidt. . . . The Wilde Twins, Bob Crosby's new vocal duo, are said to be grand-nieces of the late Oscar Wilde. If you mention it to them they will reply: "So what?" . . . KAY KYSER LEADS IN EGG LAYING CONTEST

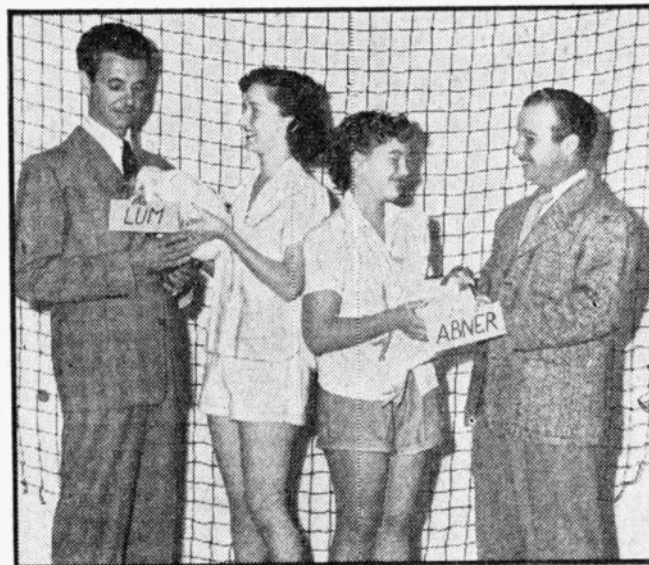

"Kay Kyser" is a thoroughbred, registered White Leghorn chicken named after the famous NBC orchestra leader who is following the daily activities of the Derby from the east where he is on tour.

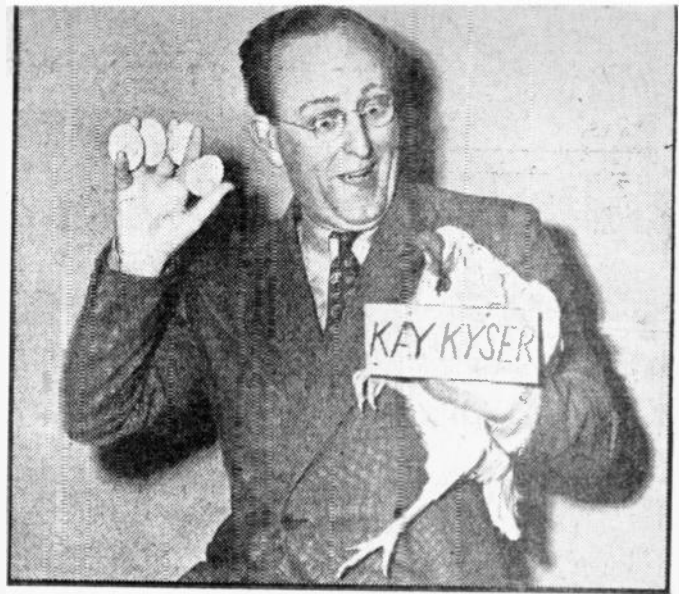

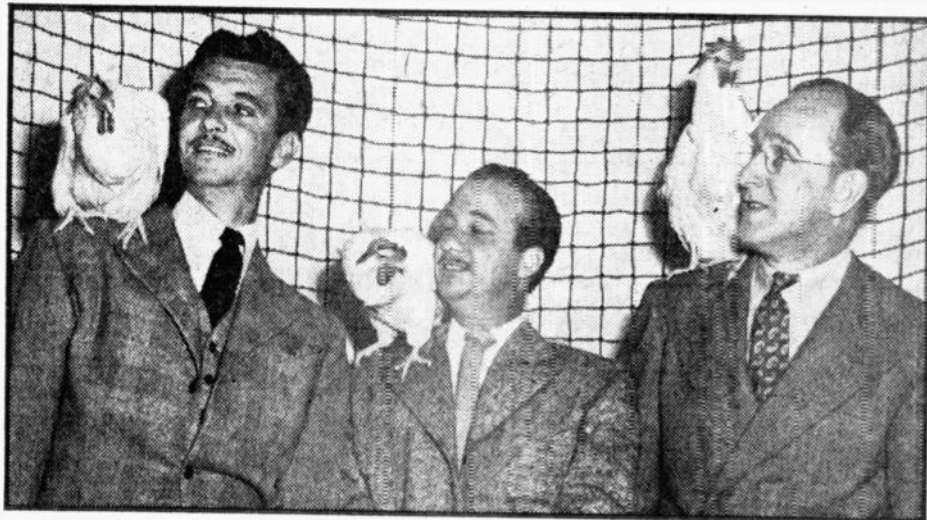

Family Doctor Is 'Drafted' By Women's Ambulance Corps

KECA's "Family Doctor" may be a little advanced in years to serve in the front line of World War II, but he's not letting any grass grow under his feet in the matter of contributing to America's war effort.

Onetime surgeon on the staff of the United States Public Health Department in the Philippines, the Family Doctor is as enthusiastic about the extracurricular work he's performing these days as he is about the radio programs he airs every Tuesday and Friday at 11 a. m. over KECA.

"All the jokes by radio comedians about women and their first aid experiences in the war effort are so much hokum," says the good doctor.

"They certainly don't apply to a group of women I've been working with during the past few months," added the Family Doctor as he talked about his outside-radio activities.

Several months ago a member of the Manila Unit of the Women's Ambulance and Defense Corps was listening to the Family Doctor's program on which he was discussing his experiences in the Philippines.

For some weeks following the attack upon Manila this group of women, many of whom had husbands stationed there in the service of the U. S. Navy and some who are native Filipinos with relatives in Manila, were being trained under Alexander Capas, veteran of World War I and Past Commander of the Filipino Post of the American Legion, as a military accessory unit.

But one phase of the training of this unit was sadly neglected. The women had no one to give them first aid instruction.

That was where the Family Doctor fitted into the picture. One of the members of the women's military accessory group called personally on the KECA commentator to ask for his services as an instructor.

The Family Doctor immediately stepped into the breach, instituting daily first aid classes which during the past several months have prepared these women for any emergency that might present itself either here on the home front or on foreign shores.

"Every American woman who is waiting to be 'drafted' into some type of war work can well take a lesson from these loyal women who have demonstrated a will to serve their country and loved ones through their serious training in first aid and other defense measures," declared the Family Doctor as Radio Life concluded its interview.

"Them Was the Days"

Say Nostalgia-Smitten Members of the Old "Carefree Carnival" During Reunion in Hollywood

THE OLD "Carefree Carnival" gang reunited recently in Hollywood to put on a show.

If you recall radio's cradle days, when San Francisco was the Western nursery, you'll remember the "Carnival" with a cozy glow. It was the most precocious trick that Baby Radio performed out here in the early 30's.

On this show were developed many of today's favored personalities — Meredith Willson, Barbara Jo Allen (Vera Vague), Tim and Irene, Gogo Delys, Charlie Marshall, Elmore Vincent (Sen-

ator Fishface), and Donald Stuart (Percy, the Playwright).

In 1938, the "Carnival" had moved to Hollywood and become Signal Carnival, but it still used Meredith Willson's theme song: "Smile with Me and Be Carefree." Most of the radioites, too, had moved south, but today they were eager to stage a Blue Network salute to San Francisco's new million dollar studio, KGO.

After rehearsal, the gang gathered around — those we've named plus Dresser Dahlstead, who was announcer for the old show and who is now Chief Announcer for the Blue

Network; Ned Tollinger, original emcee for the "Carnival" and now an NBC director; and Arnold Maguire, former "Carnival" producer and at present a Blue Network director.

"Remember how we used to broadcast from the Western Women's Club and how the serpentine and confetti used to shower down as the show went on the air?" It was Irene, asking in her squeaky little voice.

"Yeah," recalled Willson. "We used to call the confetti 'black-out snow,' they swept it up and used it over so many times."

"The thing I remember," ventured Gogo Delys, "was that ceilingful of balloons they'd let down when the show began. Everybody would risk a barked shin to break a bubble before someone else had the chance."

It was like touching off TNT in the Willson memory. "Remember the time that we were doing a western and my cue to come in was a gun shot?", Meredith demanded. "About that moment, Johnnie O'Brien touched a cigaret to one of the balloons, everybody started popping 'em like mad, and the fun was on!"

"Say", he continued. "Does anybody remember the night the whole back-drop caved in just as the curtain went up?"

Howls of laughter indicated the bunch remembered.

"The guy with the sousaphone

**KHJ Music Librarian
Asserts He's Real Author
of Western Song Hit**

To clarify the matter, your Radio Life reporter paid a return visit to "Shep," who unraveled this story:

"Yes, I wrote 'I Love You, California,' and it was a delicious comedy which I thoroughly enjoyed.

"I came to California from Illinois in 1910. In 1912 I was 'doing time' at the Orpheum as assistant conductor to Frank (Mr. Frankenstein). One day, Frank handed me a very dirty piece of paper with words typed in blue, and asked me to pin a tune on it. I said 'All right,' and at the next show, I gave him back his lyric with two tunes attached. He picked out one of them and asked: 'Where's the chorus?'"

"I said: 'Well, where's the lyric?'"

"You write the chorus," Frank replied, 'and we dig up a lyric.'

"Next day I returned him a chorus with a dumpty lyric for the person who had done the verse. Frank liked that and sent me with it to see Daddy Silverwood.

"Daddy explained that Frank was in dutch with the Shrine and that if I would let Frank use this song, turning over the proceeds to the Shrine, that would 'square the beef.' Frank had been very good to me and I was very happy to do this for him.

"So I brought him back the material and delivered Daddy's message. Frank asked me whose name should go on the song as composer.

"I replied: 'I don't care whose name it is as long as it isn't mine!'"

"Why did you do that?," interrogated your Radio Life fact checker.

"Because," elaborated "Shep," "I was a serious young musician and didn't want the public to hook up my name with popular song composition. I was simply trying to prove a musical theory—the 'Tin Pan Alley formula' that a writer can cook up a hit by taking a popular song of a few years back and by changing the words and rhythm, make a fortune.

"The theme for 'I Love You, California' came from several sources. The words to the verse, written by Silverwood's publicity man, were adapted from a song which went:



While the young maestro of KHJ, David Rose, glances over a 30-year-old copy of "I Love You California," the man who says he wrote the song, R. A. Shepherd, sits down to strike out the familiar chords on the piano.

Oh, Jemima loves you,
She loves you best of all,
She loves you in the summer
In the spring and in the fall.

"The music for the verse was something I took from a song, 'I'm Tired,' then about 10 years old. The tune for the chorus was from a song 25 years old, 'In Dear Old London.' Words for the chorus were actually inspired by an unforgettable sight I experienced as a lad when our train pulled into San Bernardino from the east and my first impression was viewing snow-capped peaks with fruit-laden orange groves below.

"That's how 'I Love You, California' was put together. For a current example of the same theory, refer to 'Deep In the Heart of Texas.' It reminds me of 'La Cucaracha,'" stated "Shep."

He proved his theory, all right. At the end of a year, the Shrine grossed about \$100,000 from the song.

"I have always felt", remarked "Shep", "that they were fully entitled to such returns as accrued to them from the song; for a finer bunch of robust salesmen never undertook a campaign; they were marvelous in their audacity and resource. I was convinced then, as I am now, that any yokel can write a song hit, but it takes mighty smart men to sell it.

"What would I have done with all that money? Money is bad luck," "Shep" continued. "I don't want a lot of it. It's a fence that keeps you in and others out.

"I've never had a penny from the song, although I believe that money is still coming in from it. All I got out of it was a little fun watching lady autograph hunters gush up to Frank. That's when I sat back and wondered what consternation I would precipitate if I yelled: "Hey, ladies! Over here for the real author!"

Beef Cakes with Noodles, Onion and Butter
Sliced Squash Sauteed in Bacon
Sliced Tomatoes with Oil Dressing

Beef Cakes with Noodles and Onion

1 lb. chuck beef	1 onion
4 slices day old bread	4 tbsps. oil
1 egg	4 tbsps. butter
3 tsps. Gravy-master	$\frac{1}{2}$ cup water
$\frac{3}{4}$ tsp. salt	7 oz. package egg noodles
Pinch of pepper	1 qt. salted boiling water
1 branch parsley	

Grind 1 lb. chuck beef very fine. Soak 4 slices day old bread and squeeze thoroughly. Mix meat, bread and 1 egg, and season with 3 tsps. Gravy-master, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt, a pinch of pepper, and 1 branch parsley minced very fine. Mix all ingredients thoroughly, and then form into 4 even flat cakes. Chop 1 onion and saute in 4 tbsps. oil and 4 tbsps. butter. When onion is golden color, put the meat cakes to cook, cover the pot, cook 5 minutes on one side, then turn over for 5 minutes on the other side, with the pot always covered. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water, $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt, cover the pan and let simmer for 30 minutes. While the cakes and butter sauce is simmering, put to cook in a pot with 1 quart salted boiling water the contents of a 7 oz. package of egg noodles. Boil noodles until tender, drain well and pour sauce on top and garnish with the four beef cakes.

Recipe for Wilson's Tender-Made Ham with Honey, Mustard and Coffee

1 Wilson's Tender-made Ham 12 to 14 lbs.	
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup strained honey	
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup dry mustard	1 cup coffee
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter	Some cloves

Unwrap the Wilson's Tender-made Ham, and cut in the fat top part—diamond shaped with a straight knife—until you reach the solid ham meat. Then insert a clove in each diamond. Put the Tender-made Ham in a roasting pan and pour on the bottom of the pan 1 cup of strong brewed coffee. Put to bake in an oven at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Then mix together $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of strained honey with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of dry mustard and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of butter and spread the mixture on the ham to cover the top. Raise the heat to 400 degrees. Return to the oven and let bake for another 30 minutes, and then serve.

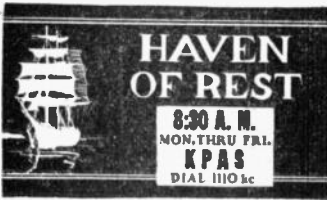

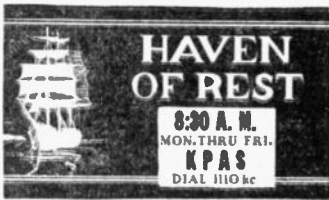

GENTLEMEN:

The following is a Resolution submitted to the members of the Woman's Press Club of New York City (of which Mrs. Amelia B. Moorfield is president), and passed by them on April 11, 1942; submitted to the members of the National Opera Club of New York (Baroness Katharine Evans von Klenner, president), and passed by them on April 9, 1942; submitted to the members of the Parliamentary Council (Mrs. Harry Harvey Thomas, founder and president), and passed by them on May 6, 1942:

WHEREAS,

There is a strong tendency towards the reduction of appropriations made for advertising via newspapers, magazines, radio and all other forms of advertising media; and

WHEREAS,

Women determine the selection of purchases which include more than 80% of the merchandise customarily advertised via newspapers, magazines, radio and all other forms of advertising media; and

WHEREAS,

There is an ever-increasing belief that the country should sustain the policy of continuing the normal purchasing of products of all kinds wherever it may not be in conflict with our government's needs during this war, to the end that, insofar as possible, business activities may be preserved for the good of defense activities, and positions held ready for our war workers when war is ended,

THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the . . . in meeting assembled . . . urge all advertisers via newspapers, magazines, radio and all other forms of advertising media to continue normal advertising during the war period, believing that any material interruption thereof will have a detrimental effect on the morale of the home, for which we women are responsible; and that we as individuals shall make special effort to direct our purchase in favor of those products which continue to be advertised in normal fashion via newspapers, magazines, radio and all other forms of advertising media.
