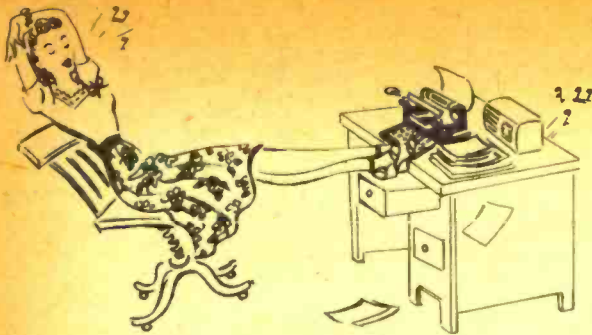

Hans Conried's Personality Is as Vivid and Varied as His Red Ties, Yellow Shirts, Blue Suits and Purple Socks

EVEN at blase, sight-surfeited Hollywood and Vine, eyes bulge when character actor Hans Conried goes striding by. Colorful is the word for Conried. He looks like a Greenwich Village "arteeste" or, as one fan put it "what a Hollywood actor is expected to look like—but doesn't." Long-limbed, slender, large featured, with a lofty forehead, long, straight, limp dark brown hair, worn pompadour; expressive brown eyes, a sensitive mouth. Clothes and demeanor to match.

Even without the startling apparel, you'd notice Conried. Even without Conried, you'd notice the clothes.

Through the door of Radio Life's office the day of our interview came a belted beige raincoat, gunmetal gray suit, white shirt, brown and white checked vest, crimson tie, cherry red plaid scarf, wool socks in still another red tone and brown "lazy loafers"—with Conried more or less carelessly inserted therein. But that was, for Hans, a conservative get-up. He's on intimate terms with the rainbow. If he ever was burdened with any inhibitions about color combinations, they've long since "gone with the wind." His utter abandon in throwing together a sartorial Aurora Borealis has been known to wed a red sock to a blue one.

Fond of Red

He's seldom seen in an ensemble lacking some item in red. "I'm almost superstitious about that color," he confides. "It makes me feel more confident of good luck. But blue—

the other way. Once I had a beautiful blue costume and I blew up in my lines, as high as a kite. But maybe it was just because I kept thinking, "This isn't going to be good!"

His checkered vest took our eye. "This? Oh, yes!" he kidded. "I like it, too. An ex-tablecloth from the tavern."

A publicity story explained Conried's long hair and high-colored wardrobe as his means of making casting directors remember him in his early quests for work. But this he denies. "I like to think that it's ability that gets me parts," says Hans. "I've always worn bright colors. I just naturally like them."

"But why should the public be interested in any of this personal stuff?" he stormed. "An actor is the same as a plumber or anyone else—just a worker. If he wants to wear red neckties or paint the end of his nose blue, why shouldn't he?"

A less vivid personality would be completely drowned out by raiment of such Neon-like brilliance as Conried's. But in conversation with this thespian, the vibrant-hued duds are forgotten. Watching the fast-changing succession of expressions which play across his countenance is like looking at the sky on a day when

storm clouds and sunshine alternately vie for dominance. He impatiently sweeps back the strands of long hair that fall over his face and his long, slender artist's hands shoot out in frequent and dramatic gestures as he talks. On "the boards" and off, he's ever and always the actor.

Born in Maryland

Conried's off-stage diction is sometimes stagey, often more than a trifle British—a hangover from an admitted early affectation. Yet, despite his English mode of speech and foreign-sounding name, he's a native of Maryland and a former Columbia University drama student. Possibly it was at Columbia that he picked up the British accent. His much-admired instructor in Shakespearean drama was former English actress Estelle Davies.

"Shakespeare," he opines, "is a wonderful basis for playing roles of any kind. It's an excellent thing to learn and then forget, for it will mark you in these times if you use it too much."

Hans got a foothold in radio doing roles in uncut Shakespeare over KECA in 1936. Today he's one of Hollywood's busiest supporting players. Perhaps his best-known regular

Blue-KECA

THE teletype clicked out its message on the stage of the Blue Network's broadcasting studio and an excited youth rushed to the machine to repeat the incoming words one by one over the microphone. An enthused audience listened eagerly as the news was received that the young lad was to report for immediate employment at the Bridgeport, Connecticut, office of Columbia Records publicity department. A good job—one filling his particular wants—had been found for another fellow who had just finished doing a good job for Uncle Sam. Another honorably discharged serviceman had been given a real "welcome-home" by the people of America, through the plan being carried out with his customary competence by the orchestra world's most successful straight-thinking idea man, handsome Horace Heidt.

With his new show, sponsored by Hires Root Beer, Heidt has scored another spectacular network first. His is the initial coast-to-coast show to give a break to the boys who have come back to civilian life after serving their country in the armed forces. Previous to the new series, this business-minded batoneer had instituted the idea of calling radio listeners by telephone on his famed "Pot of Gold" program; before that, he lays claim to being the one who started the present-day popular audience participation programs. "Anniversary Night With Horace Heidt" was the name of the show, and Heidt had to take personal responsibility for any out-of-the-way incident that might occur at the mike when impromptu interviews were being conducted with unschooled guests from the audience. The farsighted band-leader found himself facing plenty of problems, but his ever-active mind always found the way to successful solutions.

Always Has Troubles

Difficulties are always encountered, and overcome by the keen minds and broad shoulders of pioneers in every field. Horace Heidt today continues to blaze new trails, and face new trials—his latest problem being the unfortunate occurrence that disrupted the second airing of his new Hires show for servicemen.

On each broadcast two ex-servicemen are scheduled to make an ap-

pearance, broadcast an appeal for jobs, and receive news of employment offers as word comes over the teletype machine on the studio's stage. The men have been interviewed by the veterans' division of the U. S. Employment Service, presenting their official discharge papers, stating their past experience in the work in which they are interested, and specifying in what section of the country they want to be situated. Then, during the broadcast, Horace introduces them to the listening audience, tells of their record of service and asks that any employer in that section of the country with suitable work to offer contact the station manager of his local Blue studio, who, in turn, will relay the message to the Blue network studio in Hollywood where the program is being broadcast.

On the show's presentation of January 31, a colorful young veteran from the Navy with a spectacular record of active service and distinguished awards, was scheduled to be one of the program's job-seekers. Then, during the morning rehearsal, word was wired to Heidt that the boy had grossly misrepresented his record of service. With no hope of securing a substitute in so short a time, Heidt cancelled the youth's appearance on the program, and went on the air with only one applicant. A frank explanation was made to the radio listeners.

The incident, although most unfortunate, served to emphasize the fact that the show is utterly sincere in its efforts to aid men who have shown themselves to be worthy of the help of a grateful America, which is not forgetting those that have served well for the cause of freedom and victory. Considering that an estimated total of 600,000 men have already been discharged from the armed forces since the start of this war, the fact that two men each week are being given help on the Hires-Heidt show does not seem very significant. But it should be noted that the program brings real aid to ex-servicemen everywhere by creating a public consciousness of this currently vital problem.

Will Schedule Injured

After that broadcast on which only one of the applicants was allowed to appear, we talked with Robert Coleson who was formerly in charge of radio for the War Department in Hollywood and at present occupies the position of radio director for the Ayres Agency which handles the Heidt show. Mr. Coleson declared that the program's policy from that time on would be to work through the hospitals, talking to the veterans before they are released to return to civilian life. In that way, in addition to learning about the boys' condition and character from army doc-

tors and chaplains, they will find the soldiers' complete official records on file for absolute verification of all facts presented in the men's stories. Mr. Coleson added that he will keep in constant contact with the War Department, to avoid any further flaws in the program's presentation.

Original idea for the show came to Horace Heidt from his contact with Bob Matthews, the band's new romantic baritone. Twenty-two-year-old Matthews is the Heidt organization's own honorably discharged man from the armed forces. He served in the Army Air Force for thirteen months, then was released because of a nervous condition. While in the army, he attended radio school in Chicago and it was there that he first won Heidt's attention with his smooth singing.

At that time the band was on an eight months' tour; on every show Horace would invite servicemen to come up to the microphone and display their talents. Bob Matthews stepped to the mike, stated that he "did a little singing" and demonstrated with a song. Both Heidt and his audience were impressed. The bandleader told the youth to look him up when he got out of the army. Today he is an established member of the Heidt aggregation. Five feet, ten inches tall, with black curly hair and grey-blue eyes, he sings romantic ballads, although he's never had a lesson in his life!

Talking to Bob Matthews about the band during an afternoon rehearsal, we found him eager and enthusiastic in his praise of Horace and "the boys." It is young Matthews who leads the blind whistler, Fred Lowry, to the mike, and Lowry has become one of his best pals. "Fred's a very jolly fellow," Bob declared. "And he's always willing to give out with a laugh." One of the organization's oldest members, Lowry now whistles a portion of the Heidt show's theme, thereby becoming an identifying fixture of the program. The other boys kiddingly call him the "No 1 Big Shot of the outfit."

Another of newcomer Matthews' best pals in the group is clever little Ollie O'Toole, who is one of the best mimics in the business. "Ollie is a pleasant person," Mathews told us, "and even off the show, he's always full of stunts." We looked up at Ollie on the stage just then, and listened to his version of "Mairzee Doats," sung in the timid lisping voice of a "Waymond Wadcliffe."

Standing by with a wide grin on his face was Henry Russell, vocalist,

The "Good" Things

Last week, NBCanary, Vivian della Chiesa, was in Los Angeles for concert appearances and guest radio work. Radio Life, fortunate enough to meet Miss della Chiesa, was interested to probe her reactions to the public's musical wants.

"People want the good things," she answered simply. "Never underestimate the public." Then she went on to tell how she had guested Sunday night at the Trocadero and had arranged to sing something light like "Smilin' Through" and "Siboney." To her amazement, patrons called out for arias. She had to disappoint them because her accompanist had come unprepared.

Probably all of you who have enjoyed hearing Miss della Chiesa on "Album of Familiar Music" will be glad to know that her absence from this program does not mean her withdrawal from radio. Like all artists, she felt the urge to make personal appearances and her current swing through the country has brought her rich satisfaction. She came to Los Angeles from Cuba, but wished that she might linger here for a rest. "I'm very tired," she said a little pensively.

The singer is a well-built blonde, about five feet eight in shoes and weighing about 140 pounds. Born in Chicago of Italian parents, she learned to like Italian food in general, but is not especially fond of spaghetti, although her mother has taught her to prepare it in the Italian manner. "I feel depressed after I eat it," she confided. Perhaps this is partly due to the fact that she has to watch her weight because she is hypo-thyroid. She refuses to take pills, however, because it might affect her singing. Her best method of trimming down is a course at Elizabeth Arden's, where she dropped sixteen pounds

which she has never regained. "I was the prize pupil," she explained. Miss della Chiesa works hard, and usually devotes the time from 11 a. m. to 1 p. m. in rehearsal. She has made numerous camp appearances and devotes much time to selection of a suitable wardrobe. "The boys like you to look feminine," she said. DON OTIS is so well versed in both fields of music—classical and popular—that with equal enjoyment he can (1) attend the Hollywood Bowl (2) listen to a three-piece combo on Central Avenue. This fact has made him one of Southern California's best-liked record maestros.

January 1, Don left KFAC after thirteen and a half years. When he started there in 1930 he was singing "over a remote"—radio vernacular for night spot brought-in by 'phone line to the broadcasting station. He worked his way up to announcer, musical director, program director.

Now young Otis (he is 34) has joined the staff at up-coming KMPC, where, until a few weeks ago, he was conducting a record program every afternoon between 4:05 and 5 o'clock. "In a very short time I don't want to be on the air at all," states this good-looking, tall, blond commentator.

This means that Otis hopes gradually to work into the executive end of the business, and although his absence from the air would be a grave disappointment to his thousands of listeners, it would mean better planning for KMPC's record programs. For no one disputes Otis' familiarity with the music world.

He spent six and a half years as emcee and radio announcer at the Cotton Club. "I got to know bands like Jimmy Dorsey's and Ben Pollock's. One of Pollock's trumpet players was Harry James. He's somebody I've known for years and years. I got acquainted with Cab Calloway, the late 'Fats' Waller, Jimmie Lunceford."

Knowing the "names" of musical show business has become one of Otis' strongest assets. Last year when Lucky Lager staged its second anniversary party, he was in a posi-

Hollywood Picks for the Daytime Serial

Initiates Its Own Morning Strip in Effort to Break New York-Chicago Monopoly On Ubiquitous Air Fare

THE SERIAL is still solidly entrenched among American women as their favorite form of daytime listening. This fact was revealed upon completion of a 1943 Hooper survey, which showed that the popularly dubbed "soap opera" holds the attention of thirty-five per cent of the country's daytime fans. This, despite a war which has turned women's vicarious joys and sorrows into real, personally-experienced emotions.

Last year there wasn't an hour from eight in the morning until four in the afternoon when a listener could not tune in to one or two of these quarter-hour dramas. Radio Life logged thirty-nine of them.

Thirty-nine quarter-hours repre-

sent approximately ten hours a day—a sizeable hunk of network time. Too, they represent talent costs close to four million dollars a year. This is Big Business.

But Hollywood had none of it. All of the daytime serials originated in Chicago or New York. It was high time Hollywood, which had taken away the comedy-variety cream from the East, should cut in on the "soap opera" monopoly.

This appears to have been the conclusion of local NBC executives, for they plotted a daytime serial, bankrolled it as a sustaining feature, and are now determinedly moving toward snagging a sponsor. Thus, Hollywood has thrown its hat into the ring.

Is Quality Product

Name of Hollywood's serial is "The

Gallant Heart," which has all the earmarks of a superior production. For actors it draws on a pool of the finest supporting players. In production, music, and sound effects it takes advantage of Radio City's superlative facilities. For writer it has Virginia Cooke, a serene-faced, russet-eyed young lady who implores: "Please don't call our show a 'soap opera.' It isn't. We've got to give people life the way they live it and want to live it. A show can't succeed if seven of its fifteen minutes are devoted to sighs."

Instead of sighs and maudlin situations, "Gallant Heart" digs into the problems of today's young people—the ones who grew to adulthood after World War I and had just achieved a fine adjustment to life when they were catapulted into the chaos of an-

songwriter, and another of the band's oldest members. At the mike, rehearsing a cheery commercial was personality-voiced Terry O'Sullivan, the shows' animated announcer; while Buzz Adlam, the organization's gifted musical director and arranger, readied the band for a laugh-packed novelty number called "Jack and the Beanstalk." It is no wonder laughter and fun are rampant on the Heidt show, with such a stellar trio of smiling Irishmen as the aforementioned Ollie O'Toole, Terry O'Sullivan, and Bob Matthews.

Airing 12 Years

It is altogether understandable that the Horace Heidt aggregation has held box-office records in theaters throughout the country. In addition they have been on the air for twelve successful consecutive years, and have had four well-satisfied sponsors, with only two or three free weeks between them. Their outstanding success may well be based on the fact that their organization is a complete unit within itself—an entire staff of entertainers capable of writing, performing and producing a well-balanced, top-flight variety show.

We commented on that fact to tall, gracious Adaline Heidt, the band-leader's lovely, brown-eyed wife, who declared, "I think the secret of Horace's success is the fact that he himself does only that which he knows he can do well, leaving the other things to be handled by those who know how. He maintains a staff of experts, and willingly steps out of the spotlight in recognition of their specialized ability."

Heidt is the business-minded brain behind his organization. He started a band, not from an interest in music, but because he realized that it was a big business being neglected. Quick-thinking and ingenious, with four or five ideas always stored in the back of his mind for future use, he has been developing all of the band business' many potentialities. The result is an entertaining, interesting, timely and thrilling production such as his new Hires show for servicemen.

Horace himself declares, "I've never been as thrilled with anything as I am with this new program. It has universal appeal, it deals with a big problem of today and it can certainly be considered one of the most wonderful things in radio."

Horace Heidt has been in the music business for twenty years. He started in Oakland, California, playing the piano with a little college band of his own; then toured Europe. His was the first American jazz band to play in the Paris Opera House. Upon his return to America, he found vaudeville fading fast. So he started building for radio by doing a two-years' stint as house band in a San Francisco theater. His first commercial airshow was Shell Oil's "Ship of Joy."

In high school, Horace stuttered so

tion to ask a dozen "name" band-leaders and vocalists to cut special records with greetings for the two-hour program. It has likewise enabled him to secure "big names" for interviews. For example, Frank Sinatra, whom he met about the time "The Voice" parted company with Tommy Dorsey.

Otis liked Frank and gave his records consistent play. After Sinatra became the bobby-sock brigade's idol and arrived in Hollywood for motion pictures, he lost no time in calling Otis and thanking him for his support. While fuming press contacts were unable to interview Sinatra, Otis was able to secure him for a live interview on his nighttime record program.

Don has always been attached to show business. When he was a junior in local high school he obtained a job as usher at the Million

badly he could scarcely speak. Today he is completely at ease talking to millions of people through a radio microphone. During the pre-broadcast warm-up fun session for studio audiences, he goes so far as to sing a la Sinatra while the ladies squeal and swoon.

Heidt's initial ambition was to be an athletic coach. While in his senior year at Culver Military Academy, he was voted the best all-around athlete in school, having starred in football, swimming, track, baseball and boxing. But it was when he was playing football at the University of California that he emerged from scrimmage with a broken back, which brought a sudden, tragic end to his active athletic career.

Still tall, tanned and athletic-looking, Heidt is enthusiastically occupied with his 15-acre ranch. "It's just a plain place," Mrs. Heidt exclaimed, "but we love it!"

Home Life

The Heidts have three children—twin boys, aged twelve, who were born on Christmas day, and a little two-year-old daughter, born on Pearl Harbor day. The latter's name is Hildegarde Harriet Heidt. "And that was a problem for me," Mrs. Heidt declared. "Horace's name is a double H, so he wanted me to think of a pretty triple H name for our little girl."

On the subject of her famous husband, Horace Heidt's charming wife points out the following facts: "He loves golf, shoots down around par, knows a lot of the pros and hopes sometime to take a year off and do nothing but play the game."

"Horace's eating habits are funny," she continued with a smile. "He drinks quantities of skimmed milk and eats meat, with a lot of lettuce leaves instead of bread. He watches his weight because he's always had the thought that he looks too much like a pugilist to be a bandleader!"

Dollar Theater. After laboring in a north Michigan lumber camp, he went to Detroit and worked his way to chief usher at the Capitol, before returning to Los Angeles.

He makes no bones of his admiration for Sinatra, a fact which many listeners feel. "But his publicity and exploitation have been almost obnoxious," he states. "He's losing too many male listeners. But the same thing happened with Crosby when he started." Don's favorite girl vocalist is Jo Stafford.

Otis' presentation of weekly guest stars in interviews has always been well worth tuning, for many are the walloping surprises. No one who heard it will ever forget the night Otis presented as swing record commentator none other than Leopold Stokowski.

For two hours "Stoki" spun the "poo" platters and dug the jive talk. He did his stint as a personal favor to Don, who helped him secure some ancient platters for a G.I. album Stokowski was assembling. So sensational was the deal that five national magazines blossomed with pictures and stories on Stokowski's appearance.

In his new capacity as KMPC's program director, Otis will continue to secure guests for the station's afternoon record program at 3:30. Recently he has busied himself hiring a live orchestra for the progressive outlet and in engaging a new femme and a male singer for the station. His work embraces all features of KMPC's programming, but you can bet that Don's most earnest efforts will always point toward the musical side of the log.

In all the years Otis has been commentating, he has had the misfortune to lose his singing voice. He used to be a fair tenor, but due to the demands of announcing, he worked to lower his voice. "I lowered it so successfully," he relates, "that one morning I awoke to discover I had a four-note range!"

role is that of "Nigel Bolingbroke," the eminent Shakespearean actor and poolroom bum" of Columbia's Burns and Allen show. His two latest are "Uncle Baxter" in the new William Bendix show, "The Life of Riley," on the Blue Network and "Eric Hoffman," in NBC's "The Gallant Heart," a Nazi general here as a spy, pretending to be a German watchmaker. Here's a sample week from Conried's January schedule:

Seldom Plays "Straight"

"Whatever you aren't, you play," Hans commented. "The older I get, the more young men I play. When I started in radio, I was almost invariably did characters years older than I was—and almost never a straight part." Only twenty-seven now, he looks years older. "Even now, I seldom get a straight part. Once in a while, the rival lover."

Conried has done a total of some 6,500 broadcasts, averages from seven to fifteen a week. His first try at radio, however, was inauspicious. He fluffed four times in the two lines assigned to him.

Hans frequently appears in screen as well as radio roles. He gives his portrayals all he's got, rates his profession the most fascinating in the world. "If you couldn't be an actor," we queried, "what vocation would you choose? Do you like business and money matters?" He almost shouted, "NO! I loathe them," adding, "If I weren't in this work, I don't know what I'd choose. It's the only way of earning a living that ever interested me."

Hans has a strong preference for serious, highly dramatic portrayals.

"Of course," he observed, with a sardonic grimace, "there isn't as much money in such roles as there is in comedy."

Fellow players like Conried and greatly admire him for his talent and the whole-hearted zest he has for his work. "He's never boring," one of them told us. "His individuality makes him fascinating."

Between bits, at rehearsals, Hans, double-jointed, sometimes relaxes by wrapping one leg around his neck and contorting himself into other grotesque positions.

Eccentricities

With his wife, eight dogs and five cats, Conried lives in Westwood, where he bought and remodeled a big, square, former sorority house. The actor hasn't the slightest interest in sports. He makes a hobby of collecting toy soldiers, representing various countries and periods of history. As a motorist, his style is characteristically unrestrained. He drives like mad, never permitting his job at the wheel to interfere with his expressive gesturing. As a theatergoer, he prefers historical plays and movies.

Conried, six feet two, towered over us as he arose to leave. "Some day," he declared, "I'm going to a broadcast. I've never seen a radio show, except from the stage side of the footlights."

other universal conflict. To this lost generation, the "gallant hearts" of our time, Virginia Cooke dedicates her script. As she talks about it, one senses her high idealism, a compulsion on her part to contribute spiritually to these bewildering times. Youth thus faces youth's problems and brings the solutions into homes confronted with the issues.

For Authoress Cooke, writing is not burdensome. "I grew up in the profession and Hollywood," she states simply. Growing up in the profession and Hollywood isn't as uninvolved as it sounds, but it does give one background and is the sesame to diversified assignments.

To her credit Scriptor Cooke has "Ports of Call," "Speed Gibson," Bill, Mack and Jimmy (the air's first juvenile aviation series) scripts for Jim Nesbitt's Passing Parade, "Eyes Aloft," "Do You Want to Be an Actor?" "First Nighter," "Manhattan at Midnight," Lewis Stone's Christmas Day show for Standard Oil.
