Happy-go-lucky Bill Goodwin Finally Hit Pay Dirt After Losing Numerous Radio Jobs

I'M SORT of a fatalist, said Bill Goodwin. "Before the war, I used to fly a 'plane. One week-end I took a bunch of fellows up to my ranch in the San Joaquin Valley. After lunch I went up by myself and fooled around to show off, then I came in hot and low, trying to look like a military pilot. Before I knew what was happening, I was heading into three 15,000 volt power lines. They snapped. There was a big flash, and the motor quit. I got the 'plane in without busting it up, then I got out, walked a hundred feet, and my knees just buckled under. Since then I figure I've been living on borrowed time."

His own or borrowed, Bill's time is crammed. Radio Life stalked him for six weeks, waiting while he sandwiched movie roles between air assignments, then finally cornered him one morning in Columbia Square's lounge. Tucking his feet under him, curly-haired Goodwin settled in one of the comfortable brown leather chairs. From this luxurious vantage point he hailed, with a buoyant "hello", every man who passed and spouted banter with every girl. (He seemed to know everybody).

Fired Continually

It was natural to be curious about Bill's personality. His voice sounds so happy, one inevitably wonders whether it belongs to a carefree person. Questioned about his disposition and outlook on life, Bill related the story of his near-brush with death. Then he went on to describe his early struggles—job after job from which he was fired. Even now, telling about it, he shrugged his shoulders with a "so-what?" gesture and grinned about his former inability to stay put.

Born in San Francisco, he quit the University of California, after one semester, to join Henry Duffy's stock

company. That is how he met Leo Carrillo, who was a cast member. When Leo decided to try his luck acting in Portland, he told Bill: "If you drive my car, I'll take you along!"

Goodwin lasted the 1930 season in Portland. "Then they canned me!" he recounted. "And my step-father said, 'You see, I was right. You'll never get anywhere acting!'"

KFKB, a 100-watt station in Sacramento, wanted an announcer for \$15 a week. "I stayed there six months," Bill related. "Then they canned me. I went back to San Francisco and my step-dad said, 'I told you so,' again."

Harrison Holloway at San Francisco's KFRC hired Bill for \$25 a week. One of his chief assignments was on the popular "Feminine Fancies."

"Guess what?" queried Goodwin in relating his stay at this station. "In six months it happened. They canned me!" And remembering his exit from KFRC, he grinned from ear to ear.

Hopped Into Ford

"I hopped in my second-hand Ford and drove to Hollywood. Started at KHJ for twenty-five bucks a week."

Goodwin, at last, had found his niche. Between 1932-36, he gained well-rounded experience in radio at KHJ, then the Columbia outlet. He became production manager, built shows, held auditions. When CBS and Don Lee split, he elected to go to New York to study CBS production methods; stayed six months, came back to Hollywood to settle down for good . . . announced "Hollywood Hotel," Joe Penner's show . . . produced Camel's shows . . . produced Bob Hope's show . . . in 1938 hooked up again with Burns and Allen, with whom he had worked at KHJ, and produced their show for Chesterfield . . . did some "Silver Theater" dramatic leads and was signed for pictures . . . currently is announcing

Burns and Allen, Chase and Sanborn, Sammy Kaye . . . will soon be seen in M-G-M's "Mr. Co-Ed" starring Red Skelton, and Paramount's "Incendiary Blonde" with Betty Hutton, recently cut an audition record for his own half-hour radio show.

Now 35, Goodwin avers that he'll never leave radio, although he is fond of pictures. Those who realize how extensive his radio experience is, marvel at his spontaneity. He can still breeze into a studio and read a line with gleeful gusto. Like other top announcers, he is a member of the cast and participates in the gags. He is a casual script marker, rehearses the minimum, loops alliterative phrases, gets a kick out of his chores. Yes, he's like his voice—carefree, happy.

Family Life

Before the war, he flew for fun; his favorite golf partners were Marshall Duffield, John Conte, Johnny Mercer, and Bobby Dolan. "My wife and I used to be night club kids," he chuckled. "Now our kids put on a floor show for us." The children are Jill, four; Bill, two; and Lynn, three months. Jill likes to listen to her daddy on the radio, but when he asks her, "Did you hear the show," says succinctly, "Yes, I heard you!" Bill's wife is a non-professional.

As his most exciting moment in radio, he cited the time when President Roosevelt visited Los Angeles five or six years ago, and Goodwin handled the color description from the Coliseum. As Goodwin nonchalantly described the scene, the chief executive's car rolled to a halt in front of the announcer. Bill was so overwhelmed that he was dumbfounded, only recovering his "voice with the lilt" when F.D.R. bestowed an understanding smile. "My gosh, it's the President," the usually resourceful Goodwin gasped as he shoved a hand mike under the famous visitor's chin.

others unrecognizable. The quiet studio suddenly became a bedlam of noise as the fellows set up their instruments, tuned them and tried them out. Saxophones, a guitar, a violin, the drums—then crash, clang, bang! Someone rolled in Spike's special equipment, including such assorted items as a washboard, a pop-gun, auto horns, whistles and bells—and a lyre made from a wooden toilet seat!

Enter the Twins

The band's vocal duo, the lovely, lively Nilsson Twins, made their entrance then, clowning their way across the stage, leaping over the high-backed chairs and singing strains from their scheduled songs of the evening. On the heels of the Nilssons came the maestro himself, and with his familiar words of direction, "Leave us try out the first number," Spike sounded the starting signal for the afternoon's rehearsal.

At the same time, in another room, beautiful brown-eyed Beryl Wallace, the Earl Carroll queen who officiates as femcee of each Friday night's "Furlough Fun" session, was reading script with this evening's servicemen—guests of the show.

Meanwhile, if Bradford Brown, the program's producer, is cornered, he will tell more about this popular coast variety show. Now in its second year on the airwaves, "Furlough Fun" brings radio listeners a pleasing menu of music by Spike Jones and his City Slickers, comedy by George Riley, and thrilling, timely interviews with our boys who have been "over there."

Contacts have been established with hospitals and redistribution centers, camps and flying fields, where servicemen with interesting, informative stories are selected to appear on the program. The accounts of their experiences are made as "breezy" as possible, without deviating from the actual facts. The thrills are made vivid, the more grim details are eliminated.

How Far to Tokyo?

Then, after the actual broadcast, the guesting members of the armed forces participate in a quiz session for which they receive cash prizes, and a lot of laughs, when attempting to guess the answers to such baffling queries as: "How many pennies in a stack a foot high?" "How tall is the Empire State Building?" "How many drops in a pint of water?" and "How far is it from here to Tokyo?"

Participating in "Furlough Fun" have been heroes from every theater of war in the world, including a sailor whose ship dodged twenty-seven torpedoes in the South Pacific, a corpsman who risked death to care for the wounded Marines on the

A Show That Brings You Music, Comedy; Plus the Thrilling Tales of Our Boys Who Have Come Back From "Over There"

AT THREE in the afternoon, when one enters NBC's spacious Studio A, the stage is completely cleared off and none of the program's personnel is in sight. Five minutes later the studio is bristling with confusion and activity, in preparation for another Friday night airing of "Furlough Fun."

The boys in Spike Jones' band came in first, bringing with them their assortment of instrumental accessories—some familiar, some novel,

beach at Tarawa, and a former all-American quarterback, Granville Lansdell, who piloted paratroopers and dropped them out over enemy territory in Sicily.

Guests on this broadcast included a young sailor who was blown through the side of his ship when it was torpedoed off Makin Island, and a soldier whose life had been saved twice by a tiny monkey he had mothered in a forlorn African fox-hole.

At six o'clock the cast members always ready themselves for a dress rehearsal. The stage that had been so barren just three hours before is now cluttered with equipment and crowded with people. Spike and his boys are rehearsing over and over again the Swiss bell arrangement of "Mairzy Doats." The Nilsson girls are doing the vocal, handling two of the bells, and using up their spare energy in the high rhythmic kicks of acrobatic dancers. Dapper Larry Keating, the show's announcer, is preparing a commercial at the mike, his hat cocked nonchalantly on the side of his head, his fingers flicking the ash from a cigarette.

Hero Appears

Dark-haired Beryl Wallace, looking lovely in a bright red gown, is once more going over the script with her servicemen guests, coaching them in their lines and putting them at their ease. The sailor, James Honold of Malver, Arkansas, is a sober-faced, boyish-looking lad on crutches. With a badly injured leg, he had spent three hours on a raft in the Pacific. He had a hole in his arm, his hair singed off and his body aching with severe burns. We talked with him for a moment, and found him worrying about speaking into a microphone to a lot of people. He smiled and admitted a bit shyly, "I'm pretty nervous."

The soldier, Floyd Steward of Vil-lisca, Iowa, was in a worse state. In the earlier rehearsal he had found that it was just impossible for him to follow a script in the telling of his story. So, with the script folded away in his pocket, and his prized monkey tucked beneath his coat, Soldier Steward was standing at the side of the stage mopping his brow at the thought of ad-libbing his tale into the mike.

The monkey, heroine of the soldier's story, had been caged in a house-like box on the stage, but it chattered so fiercely that Steward grinned and let her out, apologizing over the fact that "she hasn't got anything on but a sarong." For the actual broadcast the monk was to be dressed in the uniform of a WAC.

As a rule, when she conducts her airtime interviews with our boys, Beryl stands alongside them, ready to coach and to cue them when they need it. But when this soldier brought his animal friend with him, Beryl worked at another microphone. The monkey made it known that she

didn't like strange girls and nail polish, so the charming "Furlough Fun" hostess stayed clear and took no chances.

Beryl Is Nervous

Chatting with Beryl Wallace before broadcast time, we found her to be as nervous as any of her servicemen guests. "I'm petrified!" she exclaimed over the prospect of being on the air with a soldier minus his script and a monkey who snapped at her.

Her stint with "Furlough Fun" is Beryl's initial introduction to radio. "But it's in my blood now," she de-

clared. "I look forward so eagerly to every Friday."

She told us that each boy she has met seemed even braver than the one before. For the sake of their buddies who are still on the battle-fronts, they are all anxious to tell their stories, and she considers herself wonderfully privileged to have the opportunity of hearing their experiences first-hand.

"Talking with the boys has become a most important part of my life," Beryl Wallace declared earnestly. The "Furlough Fun" femcee herself has three brothers who are now overseas.

Oozes Sentiment, Humor

Radio Life readers almost two years ago (July 19, 1942) named Rube Samuelsen, portly Pasadena sports editor and NBC "Sports Scripts" commentator, as the "radio personality we'd like most to see a picture of in Radio Life." This week the editors of Radio Life, who answered requests by printing a full page portrait of Rube, point with pride to the progress of the same gentleman on the wave-lengths; and nominate him as a good bet to talk his way into a top-line Hopperating off his first four stanzas with a new KNX show titled "Voice of Americans in Uniform."

Samuelsen's newest airplane showcase, a 25-minute Sunday afternoon (4:15 p.m., KNX) commentary for Helms' Bakeries, is made up of personal letters written by men and women in the armed forces to their friends and families at home. Radio Life recommends this program to its family of listeners as one that fairly oozes with sentiment and the typical Yankee humor reported to be so predominant on all fighting fronts.

Samuelsen, affable sporting editor of the Pasadena Star News and vet-

eran Rose Bowl writer, does a sparkling job with the letters mailed him each week by Southern California families. The enthusiastic tone he gives the thoughts expressed in pen and ink by service men and women is not simply a microphone manner. Rube, you see, has been receiving letters like those he reads each Sunday for a long time now from ex-athletic stars like Tommy Harmon and the late Louie Zamperini, and he feels deep down inside the thoughts of these young Americans who now battle a common foe.

Rube, when complimented on his new show by Truman Bradley in the corridor at Columbia Square the other afternoon, replied: "Thanks, Truman, but how can a guy lose with a show that depends for its material on the fellows out there fighting? Why, they're not only the best fighters in the world but they're also the best writers!"

The Voice (not to be confused with F. S.) admittedly likes a letter that tugs at the heart strings. Only two weeks ago he aired a letter written by an Army captain to his young twins whom he had never seen. So moved was a Los Angeles department store magnate who heard the letter read

Recently when we had the pleasure of meeting charming Dorothy McCann of the McCann-Erickson Agency which handles CBS' "Dr. Christian" series, we learned an interesting fact concerning the program's annual contest in which listeners submit original "Dr. Christian" scripts to be used on the air.

Mrs. McCann pointed out that each script submitted can be classified under a specific type of current problem facing the American people today. Abundant, she said, are the scripts dealing with boys about to be drafted and the return of war veterans to civilian life.

Our Apologies

Radio writer Lou Fulton rang Radio Life's phone the other day to pass along some information. Fulton is the scribe who pens the script for the Blue Network's new Horace Heidt show for servicemen. In our story on the show in our March 12 issue, we credited Horace Heidt with the idea behind his new program—the obtaining of jobs for war veterans via a network radio show. Diggin' Discs

WHILE WE don't know what its Crossley rating might be, one of the most popular programs around town is FRANK BULL's "America Dances" heard Mondays thru Fridays from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. over KFVB. We point to this show with pride, since it is strictly a disc prog. Only it is handled with a little different treatment. Bull plays the tunes requested by listeners. And he's rapidly setting a new fan mail record at the station. Over 1,500 letters last week, and a weekly average well over a thousand.

AIDED BY two fun-loving assistants, JOE YOCAM and BENSON CURTIS, Bull telephones numbers picked at random and right on the air asks the answering party his or her favorite popular recording. Then plays it. The stunt calls up many humorous situations, and Bull takes every advantage of the situations that arise. Bull says that sometimes records requested are tunes that he has never even heard of. But if he has them in the vast library at his disposal, he'll play 'em anyway—and many times they turn out to be terrific.

LETTERS COME from every Army camp, Air, Marine, Navy and Maritime Service base in this area. Soldiers ask him to call up their girl friends and play their favorite tunes. One mother wrote in asking Bull to play BENNY GOODMAN's recording of "And The Angels Sing." She wrote, "It was the favorite tune of my son. He was taken prisoner by the Japs at Corregidor."

MOST REQUESTED tune, Bull says, is TOMMY DORSEY's "Boogie Woogie." LOUIS JORDAN's "Ration Blues" is about second, but ELLA MAE MORSE's "No Love, No Nothin'," the MERRY MACS' "Mairzy Doats" and BENNY CARTER's "Hurry, Hurry," are big top contenders. Boogie woogie tunes, generally speaking, get a big play. Hill-billy stuff, surprisingly enough grabs off considerable of the requests, too, notably TEX RITTER's recent recording of his own tune, "There's a Gold Star In Her Window."

BULL RECENTLY collected 36 thermos jugs for the Marines based out on the Mojave desert when the Navy was told no more jugs were available for purchase. He also learned of a man who has 300 of them for sale, and who would be most happy to turn them over to the Navy.

TO THOUSANDS of southland listeners, Bull as a disc authority might come as a surprise, since for sixteen years Bull has been known as Southern California's foremost sportscaster. But the fact is that Bull has been a jive enthusiast for more than sixteen years, personally has one of the finest disc libraries on the coast and knows intimately many of the outstanding bandleaders and vocal stars of today. To improve your disc education, we'd recommend getting in the groove with Bull one of these nights. He's a favorite of ours.

bunker of a golf course. Only the sand saved him from burning to death. He still bears red scars where the fire licked him, wears a silver plate on the left side of his forehead where his skull was cracked.

Scott gave up his favorite 'plane, Dimples, went on sick leave, and taught school for some months after his crash. But when his country needed help in survey work, he went back to the service and touched some parts of the world he had missed previously. In a mid-African jungle, he settled a tribal dispute between natives and whites.

"I gave the chief my commander's hat and the gold buttons off my uniform", the diplomatic Scott recalled.

When Britain started cutting down her air force and talked disarmament, Scott decided to strike out in another field. For some months he worked as a guide for Thomas Cook and Son. This job brought him to the United States. "I met my wife on my first trip over, married her on the second."

Adventures Continue

Commander Scott's experiences since arriving in this country have been almost as vivid as those encountered in foreign lands. In 1932, depression year, he worked as a laborer on the San Francisco Bridge, made 50 cents an hour, at 30 hours a week. "And if it rained we didn't get in our 30 hours."

Count von Luckner, the plate of World War I, addressed a luncheon meeting which Scott was attending and the two of them carried on such an animated discussion that the pilot received offers of speaking engagements. His original radio series comprised tales of the west; later, he inaugurated a colorful "bus trip" via the airlines. His quest for unusual stories, "unreal realities" as he calls them, has driven him deep into the Mother Lode country, into Monument Valley in Arizona, to Coral Mountain in Imperial Valley. Before the war, "Scotty" covered about 3,300 miles a month in search of unique material.

When England went to war after Munich, Scott spent some time in San Francisco directing courses of British vessels, plotting their way to Pacific ports without their bumping into mines. But a few months ago, he became an American citizen. Coincidental with this step, he dropped his membership in the very British St. George Society. As if to emphasize that he has made his Americanization complete, Scott twinkled: "I joined the Elks last night. That's why I'm a bit sleepy today."

and commanded the largest radio audience on the Coast, with 68 per cent of the listening sets, and when he and his troupe made public appearances and broke all existing theater attendance records. They've liked him for something like twenty years; and that's a long, long time for any star in a business as precarious and as swiftly-changing as radio.

Low-Pressure Salesman

More than liking him, they have believed him. Among the trade, Al Pearce has a reputation for being a terrific salesman. I doubt that he is. I've heard him go on the air for Pepsodent, and Grapenuts, and Ford Cars, and Dole Pineapple—and I've never heard him do any selling. He merely talked to folks in their own language simply and sincerely. He believed what he said; he can afford to be choosy enough not to accept the sponsorship of a product he doesn't believe in.

Over the years, the format of the Pearce show has undergone alterations, has been polished and streamlined. The Pearce troupe has naturally added new performers and lost others. Many of the old "Happy-Go-Lucky" alumni are now stars in their own right in radio, pictures, and the theater. But the essential Pearce quality has continued to prevail, has continued to imbue the show, and has continued to attract large audiences. The reason, I think, is pretty clearly understood by the audiences themselves. But it would be rather difficult to explain Al Pearce to the young lady at British Broadcasting. To understand him, she would have to understand a great deal about America.

his companions, and with the wagons went all their provisions. The trip took nearly two years.

Once in the gold fields, he set to work with determination. However, realizing that he knew nothing about mining, he went to work for wages digging pay dirt for others. One of his bosses was none other than Jim Fair, the man who played such an important part in early California history. After working in the "diggins" all day, Uncle Tom would spend the evening cleaning up the local store for John B. Stetson who started building his tremendous hat fortune right there.

Finally came the joyful day when he had at last saved the required amount and enough besides to carry him back to Tennessee. He made arrangements for his transportation out of Sonora down to Sacramento, and there planned to join a caravan bound for the East.

During his stay in the gold fields he had won everyone's respect by his kindness, thoughtfulness and honest hard work. So on his last evening in Shaws Flat he went visiting the miners to bid them farewell. Then he returned home to his little shack only to find that while he had been away someone had broken in and stolen every cent of his savings. He was again penniless, but without once complaining, without ever thinking of giving up, "Uncle Tom" Gilman set to work once more, and by hard work actually again earned the required amount and returned to Tennessee to buy his freedom and that of his fellow slaves.

Today the ruins of his old stone fireplace, standing in the middle of a field alongside the Sonora-Shaws highway, remains the only monument to "Uncle Tom" Gilman, the man who refused to give up in the face of tremendous odds. ... The man whose word was truly his bond.

You Name It; He's Been There!

*Mutual's Commander Scott
Has Visited Every Corner
Of the World But Nepal*

THERE ISN'T a corner of the world, except Nepal, India, where Commander Fred Scott has not set foot. That's why he is able to spin such fascinating stories on his Sunday morning, "Romance of the Highways," over the Mutual System.

If the Commander had been the eldest instead of the youngest of eight sons, he would now be living in the family's castle between Bristol and Bath, England—a castle built by his forebears in 1123. A feudal structure with twelve-foot walls, a moat, drawbridge, and forty-two bedrooms (until Scott's father took over there was only one bathroom to service the 42 sleeping rooms).

But Fred was the youngest of Lord Scott's lads, the youngest and most adventuresome, for when he was ten years old, he stowed away on an English sailing vessel, the Star of

Africa. He hid under the canvas of a lifeboat for three days.

"Mighty hungry, very cold, awfully seasick," eventually he was impelled to make his presence known. They flogged him at first, then when he was found to be of some use as a cabin boy, the crew let him occupy a normal place in the ship's routine. Two months afterward, the vessel docked in San Francisco on one leg of a world cruise that lasted two years.

Joined Navy

"I was a man when I got back to England," Scott recalls, amused. "I was twelve and wanted to go into the navy. On ship the men had taught me the subjects they knew, so I passed my examinations in mathematics, geography, and history, but failed in my French. The examining board made me a cadet and allowed me six months to make up my foreign language. Incidentally, Chur-

chill was a member of the examining committee which passed me."

Young Scott began to fly in 1912 with the RNAS ("real naughty after sunset") Royal Navy Air Service division of his majesty's fleet. By the time World War I started he was a lieutenant-commander, used to fly over the German front lines when flying meant only reconnoitering.

"We would meet a German 'plane and wave at it. No one thought of a 'plane fighting another 'plane. Then one day the Germans came up with a rifle. Next day we went up with a machine gun!"

Scott's chief assignments were experimental and training pilots. In the experimental field he used to try out various contraptions which their inventors thought would fly. "England had only eight 'planes and eight pilots when World War I broke out", he explains. One of the "flying machines" he tried out was built like a venetian blind, with 32 front wings. Five pilots drew lots to see which one would take the machine up. Scott who won, was convinced it wouldn't leave the ground. His amazement when it soared 20 feet, then collapsed and settled like a fallen leaf, was secondary to his attempt at managing the queer invention.

Cracked Up

After the war, he continued in the service, until a crack-up one day after supervising a squadron doing deck landings. On the way back to his field, one wing of Scott's 'plane crumpled and he crashed on a sand

"Scotty's" Favorite Story

On the way to Shaw's Flat from Sonora, not far from the Mississippi House, there stands the ruins of an old fashioned fireplace in the middle of a field, with a few loose stones lying about. That is all that a fire left of the cabin of "Uncle Tom," a negro slave.

The story really started at Mount Pleasant, Tennessee, in 1852. One of the big plantations there was owned by a lady who was extremely kind and considerate of her many slaves. So one day when an elderly slave named "Uncle Tom" Gilman approached her and requested permission to go to California to earn gold to buy the freedom of himself and his fellow slaves, she readily gave him permission.

She gave him some provisions, and with little else he set out across the continent. His journey was extremely tedious. Again and again it looked as if he would never reach California. On two different occasions the caravan with which he was travelling was attacked by Indians; another time, a sudden flood carried away the three covered wagons belonging to

Folksy Formula

THE YOUNG lady at British Broadcasting was a writer herself, with a keen interest in American radio; and among other things, she wanted to know what dramatic characters I had originated.

Well, there was a small town doctor. The young lady nodded her head; she knew all about village medicos—besides, she had seen Jean Hersholt on the screen.

Then there was a detective who always got his man—in fiction, don't they all? The young lady was also fully conversant with crime and the detection of criminals.

Then there was a door-to-door salesman, and a couple of old codgers of the cracker barrel school. The young lady wasn't familiar with the word "cracker," so I hastily substituted the British equivalent "biscuit"—biscuit barrel.

She didn't quite understand.

I amplified. The two characters run a general store down at the cross roads, an emporium which sells everything from cleansing tissue (if you can get it) to concrete blocks. There's a cat asleep in the store window; and inside the flapping screen door are shelves piled high with assorted merchandise. There's a candy case filled with mixed candy—and an old-fashioned coffee mill—and a pot-bellied stove. The proprietors are called Eb and Zeb.

The young lady didn't get the picture at all. Even the names Eb and Zeb threw her. Fancy, shop keepers with names like that.

Didn't Know Elmer

I had no better luck in explaining the character Elmer Blurt, the low-pressure, door-to-door salesman. Elmer, as a type, didn't exist in Britain. Neither did Eb and Zeb. There are no British counterparts. Elmer, and Eb and Zeb, are strictly American, are part of what highbrow political economists call the American way of life. They're folks.

Elmer, and Eb and Zeb, have been features of the Al Pearce show for a long time; and if you stop to analyze the Pearce broadcasts now heard

every Sunday at 1 p. m. on the Blue network, you'll discover that *every* character appearing on them are folks, types common to every city, town, and flag stop station on American soil. They are the kind of people that you and I and everybody immediately recognize. Every neighborhood has its gabby Arlene Harris by another name. The fluttery, baby-voiced, ineffectual Minerva Nubride isn't a mythical creation compounded out of paper, typewriter ribbon, and a gag file; she really exists. You know somebody just like her.

Al Pearce, himself—who plays Elmer Blurt, and Eb of Eb and Zeb—is folks. He has been at the top of American radio, and has remained

Elmer: His Birth and Growth

Elmer (he wasn't given a last name, Blurt, for some time afterward) was born on half an hour's notice. That was almost 18 years ago, when Writer-Producer-Salesman Jack Hasty, now Writer Hasty, wrote the character, Elmer, into an audition script. At that time, Al Pearce was hanging around KFRC in San Francisco and was making thirty-five dollars a week as a singer. Thirty minutes before audition time, Hasty asked Pearce to enact the Elmer role. Pearce has been doing it ever since—on the "Blue Monday Jamboree" until 1933, on the "Happy-Go-Lucky Hour" between 1928 and 1932, and on the Al Pearce show, currently under sponsorship of "Dr. Pepper."

People like Elmer because he's always the fall guy. He's the low-pressure salesman who knocks on the door and asks the lady of the house if he may demonstrate a vacuum cleaner. He goes into the living room, sprinkles soot, sand, and feathers on the carpet, then turns to ask the housewife where the plug is only to be told that "We haven't got any electricity!"

Said Writer Hasty: "Elmer is often vulgar, but never dirty; earthy, but never sexy." If you have observed, drinking is never included in the Pearce script.

Pearce always does his low-pressure salesman role wearing a banged-up hat. "Al used to borrow my lid," remarked the writer. "In fact, one time I bought a very goofy hat just for that. When it wore out, Al used to grab anybody's hat. All the other men on the show started going hatless, because he battered the hats so much. Finally, only a short time ago, Al cut down one of his own hats. That's the one he wears now."

Elmer's last name, Blurt, began as Blurp, but was changed because it was difficult to say. "But Elmer," stated Hasty, is essentially the same character as when he was born." —(The Editor)

there longer than any M. C. I can name, largely I think because he is the same kind of person as the guy who sits alongside of a radio set. He and his audience are the same kind of people.

No Synthetic Folksiness

Perhaps I'd better explain here that "folksiness" of the synthetic variety is a radio ingredient not unknown to shrewd performers and producers. It can be, and has been, injected into a good many radio programs. It never quite comes off. You may fool the people about a lot of things, but you can't fool them about themselves. Either you're their kind of people or you aren't; and if you aren't they know it at once. They

may continue to accept you as a performer, but not as somebody they'd ask to drop in and take pot luck for dinner.

With Al Pearce the quality is natural and real. He had it when he first started in radio, not as an M. C., incidentally, but as a singer. He accompanied himself on a guitar; and while I leave to the experts the question of whether he had a great voice, you could lean back and relax and listen to him. The folks liked him.

They went right on liking him when he gave up singing, and became M. C. of the "Happy-Go-Lucky-Hour" — and after that when he launched "Al Pearce and His Gang,"

Pretending To Please

DEAR LET'S Pretenders, I do think your fairy-tales are grand! I love the music that is played while we're in fairy-land. And Nila Mack, I want to say how much I love your plays . . . (The ones you write yourself, I mean, for special holidays).

The above is a poem from Phyllis Knapp, an eager eleven-year-old devotee of Nila Mack's popular Saturday morning presentations for children, young and old. Miss Mack, the child-loving, imaginative writer-producer of CBS' "Let's Pretend" programs, wrote to Phyllis in reply:

"Dear Phyllis Knapp, just past eleven . . . your poem put me right in heaven. How very nice to take the time, to put your story wish in rhyme . . . I really think you have the

knack . . . my love to you, Miss Nila Mack."

Nila Mack, in her thirteen years as guiding light of this long-established best children's program on the air-planes, has endeared herself to thousands of children—and many an adult too—because her work reflects a warmhearted understanding of boys and girls.

In 1929 Miss Mack brought to radio's enthusiastic, impressionable audience of little folks a fairy-tale program titled "The Adventures of Helen and Mary," which eventually developed into the present-day "Let's Pretend" program. Along the way, it has acquired an audience of adults who are as entranced as the youngsters over the chance to step aboard the magic carpet of a fanciful and delightful tale well told.

Appeals to Adults, Too

Because Nila Mack thinks and creates with a child's directness and interpretation, "Let's Pretend" has the essence of truth and charm that enchants grown' folks as well as tiny tots. Particularly in a war-torn world, a simple story that expresses eternal truths is universally welcome.

While the backbone of the program consists of those fanciful characters who have held children of many generations spellbound, Miss Mack at times will inject a dramatization dealing with problems of the day. An example is the program which had Actor Bill Adams imitate President Roosevelt's voice in a stirring appeal for the Infantile Paralysis Drive. Now and then, a newly-written story combining whimsy and fantasy of a quality found in the classic tales of childhood, is presented by Miss Mack.

All the tales are readied for radio by her nimble pen. Traditionally at Christmas, her original "House of the World," is presented, and each holiday likewise is marked by an original story.

No small part of the charm of the programs are the original musical backgrounds specially composed for each tale. These are played by an orchestra under the direction of Maurice Brown.

Amasses Honors

Reflecting a year-after-year growth in popularity, "Let's Pretend" in 1943 gathered first honors in the polls of radio editors conducted by Radio Daily, Motion Picture Daily and New York World-Telegram; and was selected as the best children's program by the Women's National Radio Committee.

The program has been a spring-board to fame for many young actors and actresses. The Mauch Twins, Billy and Bobby, went on to Hollywood, as did Billy Halop, who became one of the "Dead End" kids. Pa-

tricia Reardon went to Broadway as the much-lauded star of "Junior Miss." Prominent among the program's present-day cast are such popular young performers as Patricia Ryan, Larry Robinson, Sybil Trent, Marilyn Erskine and Robert Lee.

10,000 Waiting

However popular Nila Mack's "Let's Pretend" program has become with grownups, it remains essentially a show for youngsters. The broadcast's studio audiences, for which there is always a waiting list of more than 10,000, consists chiefly of wide-eyed little boys and girls who sit in wonder at the dramatic unfolding of their favorite fairy-tales.

The youngsters arrive early, bringing bags of candy, peanuts and sandwiches. They love to applaud, laugh and cough with the announcer in the before-the-broadcast throat-clearing session. Upon the program's completion, there is a burst of chatter as the children compare comments about the young members of the cast.

Janitors say they can always tell how absorbing the drama has been. Their clue is the amount of peanut shells, apple cores and candy wrappers left on the studio floor!

PARENTS ARE GRATEFUL to nimble-minded, child-loving Nila Mack for bringing to radio a program which they can wholeheartedly recommend for their children's radio enjoyment.



People You Should Meet



No. 3 of Radio Life's Series

Donald W. Thornburgh

GIBRALTAR-LIKE Donald W. Thornburgh of the Columbia Broadcasting system is big (six feet, one inch—200 pounds) and carries the burden of a big job (vice-president in charge of West Coast operations). His background: born in Indianapolis, A.B. degree from the University of Indiana, captain in Field Artillery, World War I, ten years with Wasmuth-Endicott (kitchen utensil manufacturing) Company, Indiana, where he became vice-president; broker of building specialties; manager of the Chicago office for Cosmos Broadcasting Company, a radio production and sales organization; assistant to CBS' Chicago vice-president.

When CBS formulated ambitious plans to expand its Western operations, it purchased KNX. Thornburgh was the man chosen to guide the destiny of Columbia's western advance. Much of the phenomenal growth of CBS on the Pacific Coast may be attributed to this man's foresight, executive ability, and planning.

Thornburgh feels that KNX can perform invaluable assistance to this community by airing local problems. His station, for example, went on the air with a discussion of the zoot suit fracas designed to make both sides think. The current series dealing with the Negro question is another example of KNX's powerful influence in helping solve community issues. As the Pacific Coast constitutes an ideal section on which to try out radio programs (due to the diversity of its inhabitants) Thornburgh encourages KNX to build good programs. "If they are a success on the Coast, they are almost sure to be successful coast to coast," he points out.

In addition to conducting the affairs of CBS-KNX from his fifth floor suite, Thornburgh belongs to the Chamber of Commerce, Better Business Bureau, All-Year Club. When he is asked for information about himself, his reply is: "I don't know what to tell you. Nothing ever happens to me!"
