# Every Day a Party

*Butterfly McQueen Keeps Busy Doing the Things That Make Her Happy; Maintains Her Flair for Making Other Folks Laugh*

**I**T JUST SEEMS to come natural to me," is Butterfly McQueen's modest way of accounting for her inimitable delivery of comedy lines.

Familiar to radio and movie audiences for her rib-tickling work as Mary Livingston's maid on NBC's Jack Benny show, and as the laughable, lovable, aggravating Prissy of the super movie, "Gone With the Wind," Butterfly McQueen, a quiet, mild-mannered young girl of twenty-two, is a completely enchanting personality.

"Many people think I'm childish," Butterfly pointed out in her soft, high-pitched, child-like voice. "Per-

haps I am, because I like to play and to be silly sometimes.

"But," she continued in earnestness, "I do think that I have mature judgment about many things, and the things that I don't know, I'll surely learn as the years go by."

Contradicting the opinion of those who consider her a child, Butterfly discusses many subjects with impressive wisdom and forethought. She talks eagerly and intelligently of the theater, of comedy, music and dancing.

#### Goes to College

She disclosed that she daily attends classes at the Los Angeles City College, and is currently studying dancing, music appreciation and music analysis. In addition, she works with dramatic and dancing

groups, relaying to her pupils the knowledge she gains in her studies. She works with the USO, helping to plan entertainment for the boys in service, and visits army and navy posts frequently, either with USO units or with the Benny troupe.

"Whatever I am doing each day" declares Butterfly in her delightfully eager manner of speaking, "I try to make it a sort of party—whether it is sweeping the walk, playing the piano, going to school or doing my radio work. I don't like to go to real parties, because I find it difficult to mingle with people, but I find great happiness in each little thing that I do."

Born in Tampa, Florida, Butterfly was educated at the Walker Baptist Institute and St. Benedict's Convent in Augusta, Georgia, and at schools in New York. At one time she considered nursing as a career; then discontinued her training in that line when she discovered that she was much too sensitive to other people's pain.

#### On Stage

She then turned her talents toward amateur theatricals and made her professional debut as the comic little maid in the Broadway production of "Brown Sugar," followed by appearances in two more George Abbott presentations, "Brother Rat" and "What a Life." She made her radio debut in 1938 as a member of "The Goldbergs" cast.

# He Tries Anything Once

*Chet Huntley Has Aired Shows From Planes, Ships, Mountain Tops, and a Lion's Cage; Now Writes and Delivers Own CBS Newscasts*

**C**HET HUNTLEY, CBS' popular nightly radio reporter, is one of the few newscasters (if not the only one!) to write and deliver his own copy. In preparing each evening's script, Huntley scans an average of 250,000 words daily, gathering information for his fifteen minutes of news from the Associated Press, United Press, and International News Service wires, and from the reports of Columbia's overseas correspondents. With this information laid out before him, he writes ten pages of copy, containing some twenty-two news stories.

"And I talk it as I write it," he points out. "I hope to develop a style that will strike a 'happy medium' between the overly dramatic radio reporting and the straight delivery of British broadcasters."

Huntley's nightly news is written and delivered with the assumption that his listeners want *all* the news, with every story followed up to its complete conclusion.

This tall, slim, handsome newscaster has had a background that highly qualifies him for the job he is doing. He has talked into a radio microphone under every conceivable circumstance—and some of them almost inconceivable.

## 14,000 Feet Down

Take, for instance, the time he described the sensation of zooming downward through space in a Douglas Dive Bomber from the height of 14,000 feet. "We pulled out of the dive at 6000 feet," Huntley recalls with a grimace, "and I was plenty green around the gills!"

Radio listeners who heard this spectacular broadcast will remember that, at the conclusion of the dive, when someone asked him if he would care for some chow, Chet answered weakly, "I think I'll take a rain check on it."

What listeners did not know was that the daring mikeman had rehearsed the dive bombing broadcast three times before actually doing it on the air!

Another time he concluded an air "interview" inside a lion's cage with a snarling 650-pound bruiser named "Alexander."

"There was nothing to it," scoffs Chet with a grin, "'Alexander' was just a mangy old dog." The real truth is that "gentle old Alex" was actual-

ly an ornery critter and proprietor Charley Gay of the Lion Farm at El Monte stood by with a loaded rifle while Huntley entered the cage alone and presented another unique broadcast, with a restless powerful King of Beasts roughly pawing the microphone in annoyance.

Upon another occasion, Huntley was assigned to cover the Spring Roundup at the vast El Tejon ranch near Bakersfield, Calif. Not content to sit on the sidelines and give a spectator's account of the proceedings, the ingenious Chet hopped in a saddle and did his broadcast on horseback, with the aid of a pack transmitter.

A seasoned special events mike-man, Chet Huntley has been heard broadcasting from ships at sea, soaring air transports, from the top of Mt. Whitney and from beneath giant dam constructions.

Born thirty-three years ago in Cardwell, Montana, Huntley spent his boyhood on a large cattle and sheep ranch, and his early schooling, showed a marked aptitude for dramatics and debating, and a preference for history. He attended college for seven years, majoring in

# He Boasts Highest Night-Time Audience

**T**HE OTHER night Tom Hanlon, emcee for KNX's "Midnight Merry-Go-Round," decided to test his listening audience. At the stroke of midnight when his record program flashed on the air, he requested fans to call. Forty minutes later, 3400 messages had been received. One man, well-known in radio, reported he had to wait half an hour before obtaining a connection. Other fans called from such far away points as Bellingham, Washington, San Francisco, and Phoenix. Hanlon's "Crossley in reverse," as he called the test, proved that he has a flock of fans. "Just double since the war," opines the husky, brown-haired Tom, CBS' night supervisor who started the midnight record program five and a half

years ago and has stuck with it religiously since.

His roster of dialers includes many of Hollywood's great. According to Tom, Bob Burns, Fannie Brice, Eddie Cantor, and Connee Boswell have called to tell him they were listening. "Bob Hope never misses," enthused Hanlon, "and Orson Welles is my newest fan." Because persons in the entertainment business like "Merry-Go-Round," Hanlon calls his program "the little show that entertains the entertainers."

#### Pulls Mail

"We're the only local program that gets mail from all the 48 states," he stated, thereby confirming the report that KNX is heard throughout this country and in other places, too, which cannot be mentioned while we are at war. "We know," continued

Tom, "that our sponsor, Kelly Kar Company, has sold an average of 450 cars every month since they started with this show."

Night after night and round and round the carousel goes, spinning its listeners on a gay whirl of recorded music and light comment. Tom, who selects all of the records, chooses eight hours of music in almost as many nights. Before the war, he was able to answer requests the same night. Now they must wait until a propitious time.

such subjects as zoology, history, drama, voice, and music appreciation.

It seems that the charge for a diploma was ten dollars, a sum which he did not possess at the time. He declared that he would get one later. In 1943, some five years later, he discovered that he had never had sufficient credits in history at the University of Washington to qualify for graduation. Upon learning this, he immediately mailed one of his original radio scripts to his college professor, was given a grade of A, and awarded his belated diploma!

Huntley entered the field of radio when he became program director of

KIRO, Columbia station in Seattle, and had added experience as an announcer-writer in Portland before coming to Hollywood. He joined the staff of announcers at KNX in 1939, and today is recognized as a speaker of note and an authority on wartime analyses. At the microphone, he combines an enviable nonchalance with a compelling drive. This pleasing, forceful mike manner, coupled with his distinguished writing ability and natural talent for good news reporting, makes Chet Huntley's delivery of the news the delight of every news-hungry radio-dialer who tunes to CBS each weekday evening at ten o'clock.

Away from the microphone, Chet's chief interests include photography, golf, badminton, and his extensive collection of magazines. He owns every edition in existence of Reader's Digest, Fortune, Scribner's, Mercury and Harper's. His collection is reverently kept in a specially built room of his San Fernando Valley home, where he lives with his lovely wife and two little girls, aged four years and fourteen months.

Even before embarking upon his radio career, Chet Huntley practiced his policy of trying anything at least once. In college, he worked as stage manager. Between semesters he found jobs in the anamology department at the university, in a cannery, a bank, with a railroad section crew, a steel construction crew, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Only once has Huntley met his Waterloo. That was the time he accepted the position of floorwalker in a ladies' lingerie shop!

"I'm just a guy who has tramped around a lot and now has decided to stay settled down," explains Pat. "That's all there is to tell," says he. That's not the half of it, say we.

Wanderlust hit young Patrick before he had reached the age of fourteen, so he signed on board the *Leviathan* as an apprentice seaman. For six years he sailed around the globe, making friends and getting acquainted with the world and its peoples. On his eventual return to New York, he embarked on a series of musical comedy and vaudeville shows. Then he met Con Colleano, the famous wire-walker, who hired Pat as a companion-secretary to tour with him in the Ringling Brothers Circus.

Once again McGeehan was on the move—spending the next six years trekking all over the United States and Canada with the big top and its fascinating inhabitants. He had his mind set on someday writing a story about the circus. Mr. Ringling told him to stick with the troupe, and the idea for an unusual true tale of life under the big top would come to him. On week-ends, the actor-announcer-commentator holds open house for servicemen. "McGeehan sleeps on the floor," he adds with a grin. It has always been Pat's policy to befriend the wanderers of the world, and he extends a helping hand to one and all.

An unmarried "jolly good fellow," he lives in a bachelor apartment in Hollywood, goes in for filmtown's gay night life, is one of the most entertaining story-tellers in town, and has no special heart interest.

"I've no idea of an ideal woman," laughs the merry, mad McGeehan. His one and only love, he says, is "Peggy," his 1941 Hudson convertible!

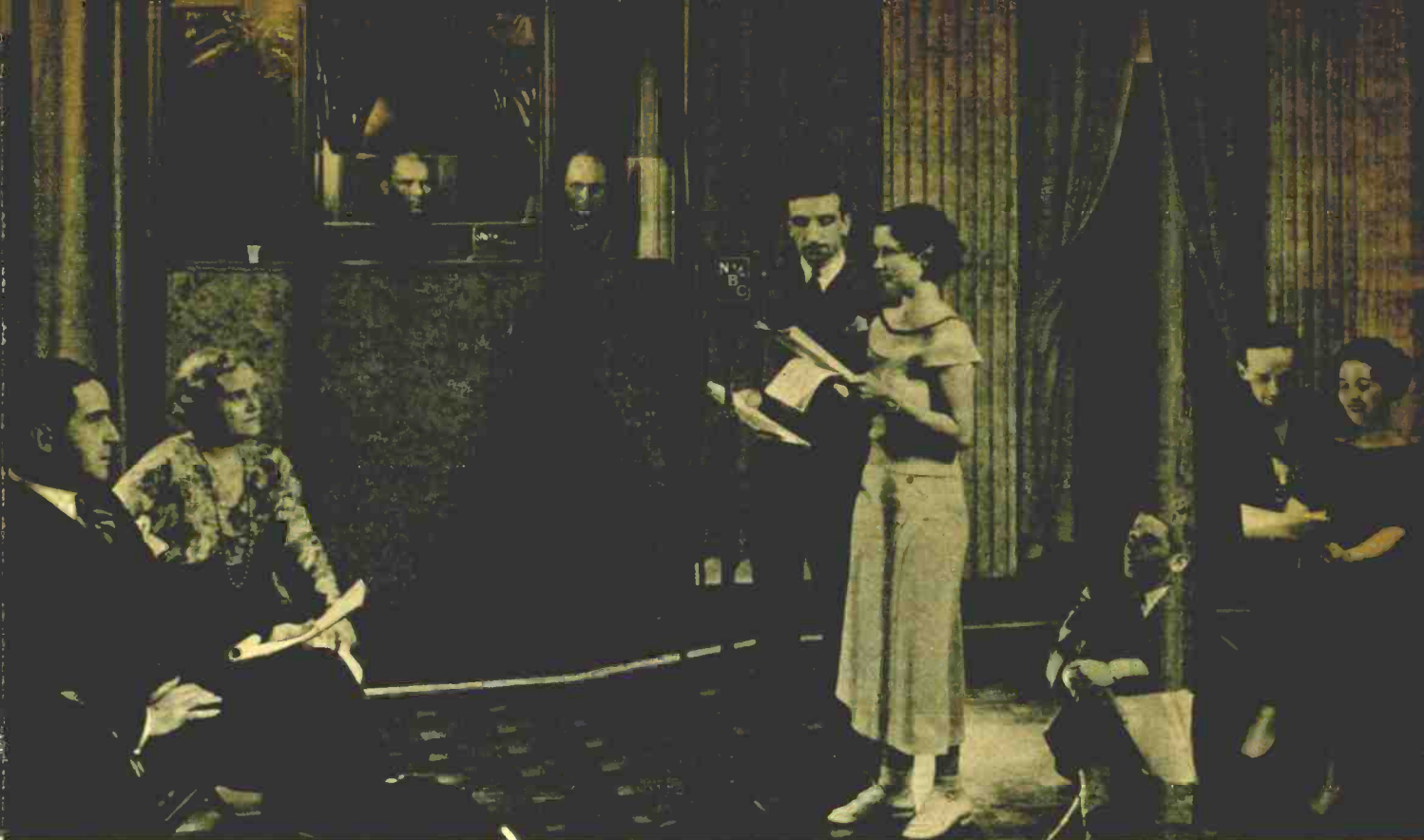
