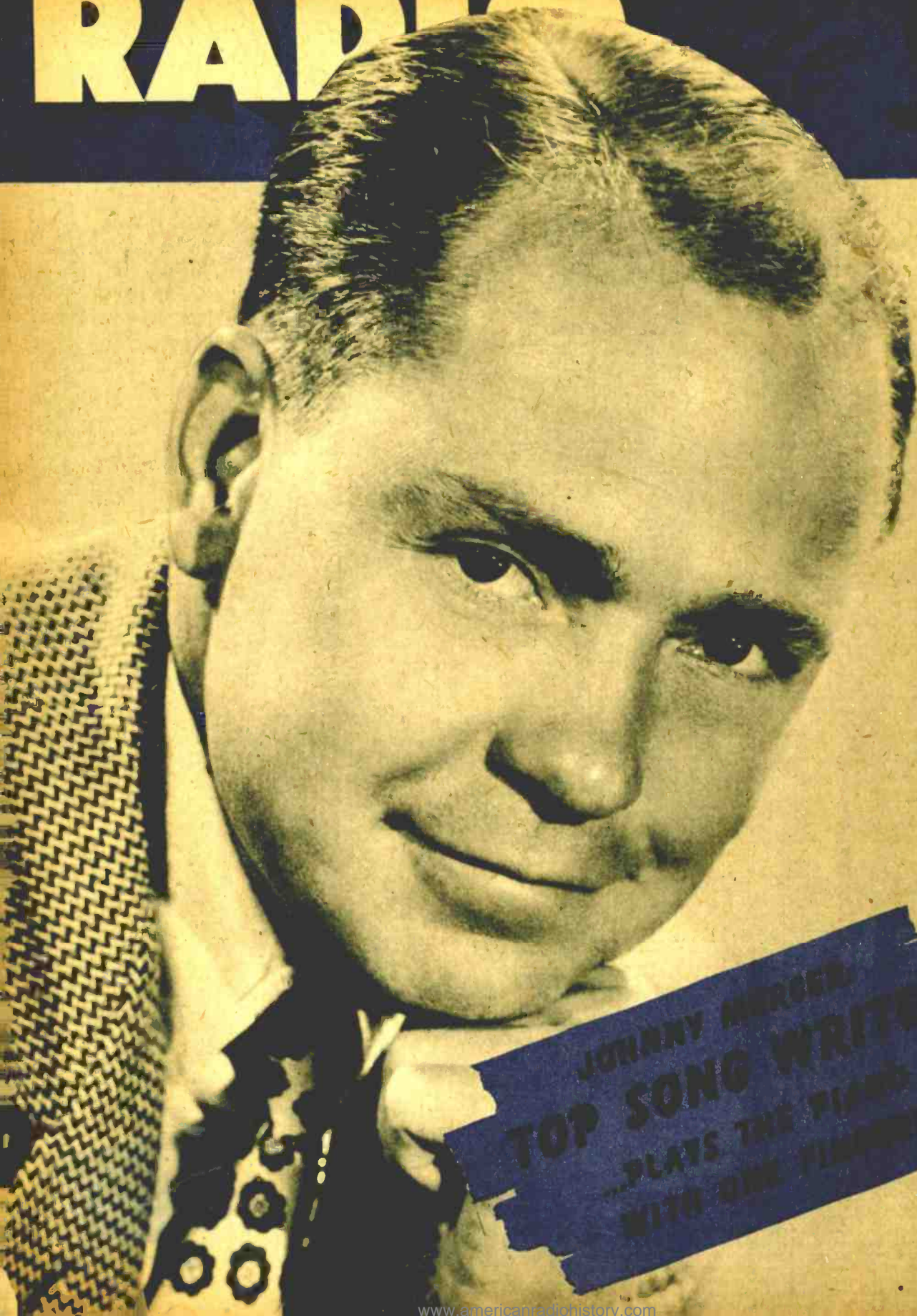

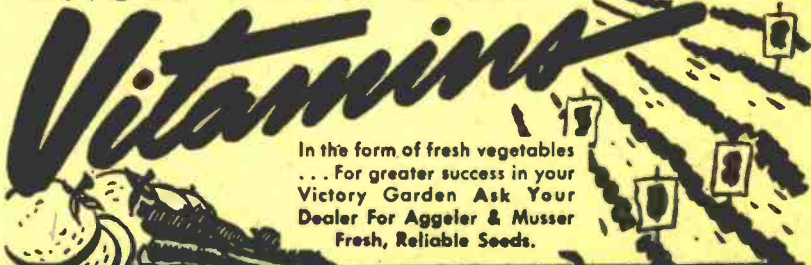

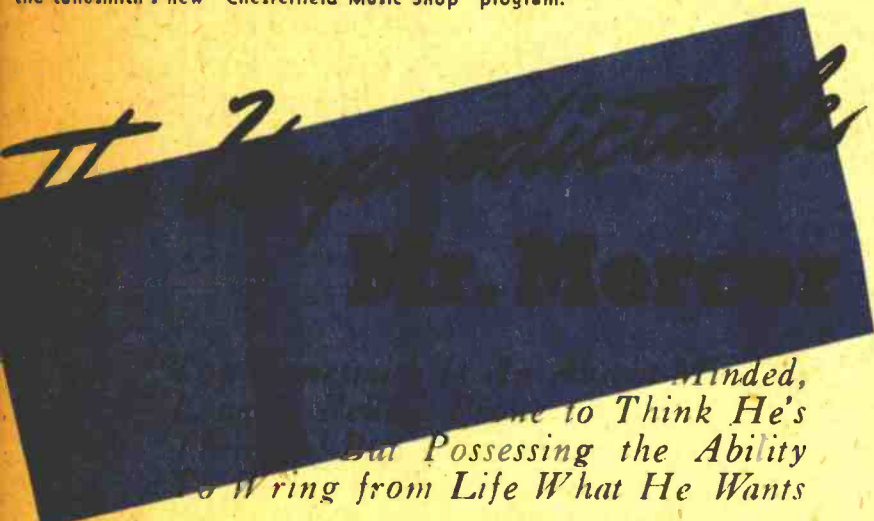

*... Minded,
... to Think He's
... But Possessing the Ability
... to Write from Life What He Wants*

JOHNNY MERCER, lately installed headman of "Chesterfield Music Shop", has written more than 500 songs but he plays the piano with one finger. Creator of more than half a hundred hits, proud composer to have had four songs simultaneously on the "Hit Parade" ("Blues in the Night", "Skylark", "I Remember You", and "Tangerine") Mercer, according to his vivacious, understanding wife, is constantly thinking he's through.

"It happens regularly", Ginger Mercer remarked of her husband's periodic despair. "Yet," she broke into a smile, "Johnny gets whatever

he wants. I remember when he came to New York and I was dancing in the Garrick Gaieties. I'd have another date, but Johnny would appear from nowhere and I'd find myself in a taxi with him, starting out for the evening. We were married fourteen years ago."

Although Mercer's rise to tunesmith fame holds much of interest, the shy almost-35-year-old musician's history takes a back seat to his own personal charms and those of his wife and five-year-old daughter, Amanda. So we may presume, although we have heard from Johnny's own lips the tale of his success, to skip lightly over his first song, "Sister Susie Strut Your Stuff", written when he was fifteen, and his first

hit, "Out of Breath and Scared to Death of You" . . . mention in passing his contribution of the words for "Lazy Bones", "Jeepers Creepers", "You Must Have Been a Beautiful Baby" . . . his writing of both words and music for such songs as "I'm an Old Cowhand", "Strip Polka", "G. I. Jive" . . . also his work with Paul Whiteman, his collaboration with Harold Arlen, Jerome Kern, Harry Warren, and other great composers and his success in writing songs for the movies. All these things Mr. Mercer has accomplished since about the time he was twenty-one.

The Real Chap

What we saw in Johnny Mercer and would like to share with our readers is the chap Mercer . . . modest, but definite, admittedly lazy and absent-minded, worrisome yet pacific, thoroughly unpredictable, utterly lovable.

According to Mrs. Mercer, who recognized him from the word "go" as a definite personality, Johnny is so absent-minded that people often label him as downright rude. "He goes to sleep in everybody's house when there's a party", she remarked without the least trace of stigma. "He has a perfect record. We usually find him under the piano with his feet sticking out. He thinks people won't see."

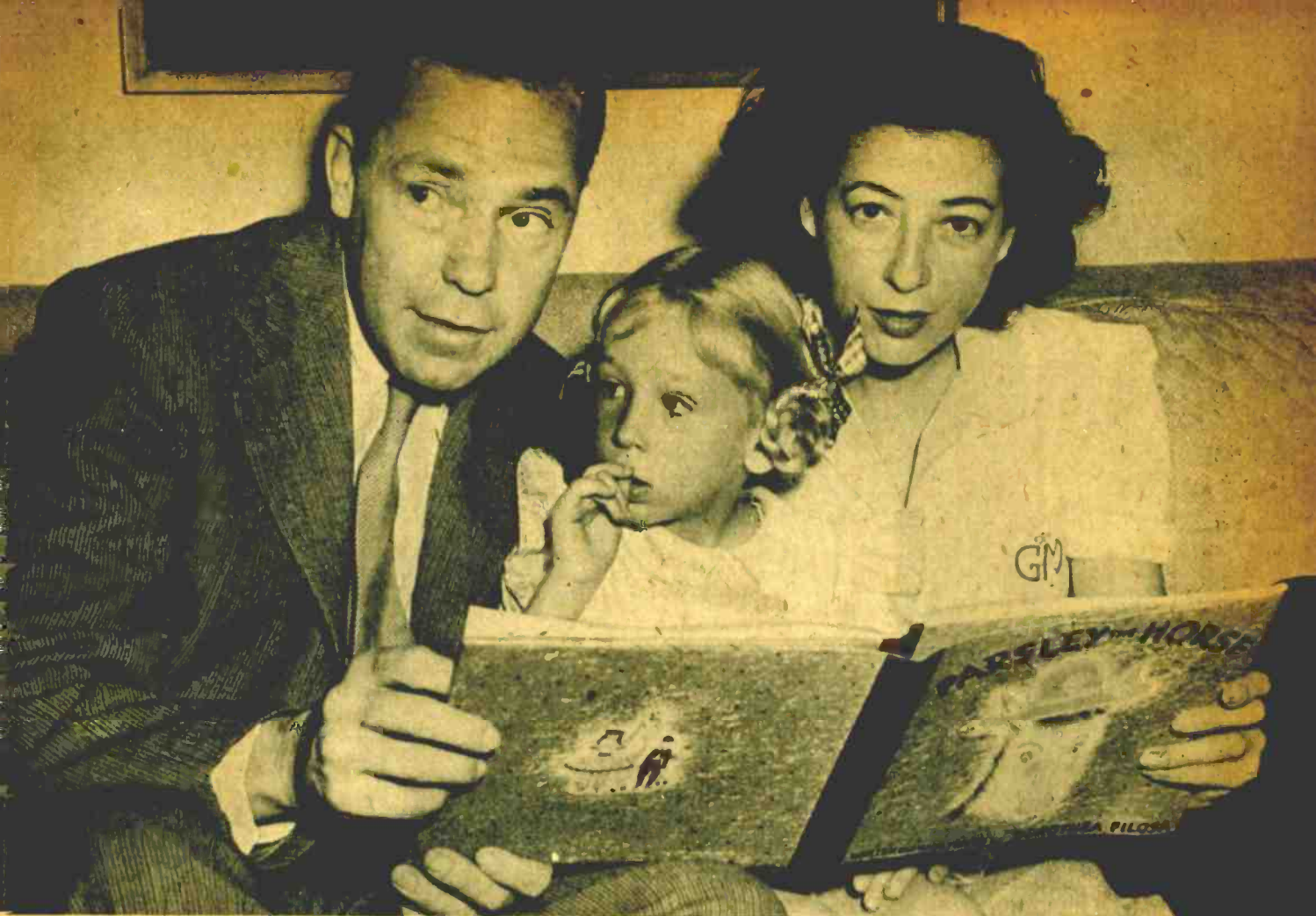
He always remembers anniversaries. It may be at the last minute, but he always remembers; then, he'll rush into the store and ask to look at something like handbags. The clerk produces several, and Johnny always winds up saying "I'll take that, and that, and that."

"He goes to get one bag and usually ends up with three or four", his wife laughed. "He always forgets, too", she added, "to tell me until the last minute that he's leaving for New York the next day." She has to pack bags like mad, but she's used to it now. At least that's easier to stand than losing return trip tickets from New Orleans to New York, a trick Johnny pulled several years ago, much to Mercers' dismay.

Out in the comfortable Hollywood home which the couple have, order is evident at every hand. "But Johnny's very untidy", sighed Mrs. M. "Yet, he often admits he couldn't bear to live with anyone not neat as a pin."

His Clothes

It seems he only owns seven or eight suits and doesn't like to bother about buying any more. He owns a couple hundred ties and has an astounding collection of summer hats. His tastes are very simple and he hates shoes and getting them shined. Someone once observed that Mercer had the "most informal feet in the world." Other appellations which have been bestowed on him include "Peck's Bad Boy", given him by Harry Warren, "The Absent-Minded Professor", and "The Colonel" —the latter name being tied to him when he first came to New York from Savannah, his birthplace, and was wont to go about the big city

in a seersucker suit and a floppy panama hat.

"Johnny thinks he's a great cook", admitted his wife. "He displays great dash in a kitchen. Never measures anything and gets out all the pots and pans. Leaves all the cupboard doors open. But he does make good chicken and spaghetti and dreams up a crab bisque."

Ask Mercer where he likes to eat and he says, "Any place with a clean tablecloth."

He likes to sleep late—until 10 or 11, and when possible, goes in for a game of golf. He shoots in the high 80's or low 90's. He is also fond of swimming and plays a little tennis. Johnny believes that a game of golf helps him compose. "A good song is pretty spontaneous", he observed. Many of his ideas come while he's riding in his car, a dusty grey convertible Cadillac. Sometimes the whole song spills right out. Take "G. I. Jive", for example. He thought it up one night after dinner in about an hour, then whistled it and picked it out on the piano with one finger. Ginger often helps him, because she reads music sufficiently to play lead sheets.

"I've been around Johnny so much

JT WAS NOON on Friday, and the Durante-Moore cast was beginning to assemble on-stage for final rehearsals before show-time. Radio Life promptly sat itself down in front row, center, to bring its readers an eye-witness account of the zany goings-on.

Jimmy Durante, in a brown suit, soft felt hat and spectacles, sat at the piano beating out his own particular brand of rhythm. "Where you been all week, Jimmy?" Georgia queried.

"Oh, the usual haunts," Durante replied with studied nonchalance, shrugging his schnozzle airily. "The art galleries . . . the concerts. . ."

Then he returned to his rousing rendition of "Umbriago".

Director Phil Cohan, in bow-tie and shirt-sleeves, stood in the control booth and grinned his approval. Durante is show business, and there seems to be magic in a theater when he steps upon the stage. Although obviously getting along in years, he's a live wire at a piano or a microphone and keeps a show moving at a fast pace.

Is Raconteur

At this point, Jimmy interrupted his song to tell the Umbriago story from his evening's script.

"One day," spouted Durante, "Umbriago comes up to me and says, 'Jimmy, I need three thousand dollars to open a canteen and make doughnuts for the soldier boys.'"

"So I gives him the three thousand, and two days later when I walks into the canteen, there's Umbriago—fast asleep! And I says, 'Umbriago! What's the idea of bein' asleep when you're supposed to be makin' doughnuts?'"

"And Umbriago says, 'Today we're makin' the holes!'"

The boys in the band guffawed loudly. Schnozzola grinned and sputtered. "I got a million of 'em! A million of 'em!"

When the laughter died down, tiny, titian-haired Georgia Gibbs stepped in front of the orchestra to rehearse her song. She sang "It Had To Be You", and the irrepressible Durante stepped to her side with a lovesick

sigh, then sat down at the piano to pantomime the rendering of Ye Great Piano Concerto.

Georgia finished her song with a giggle. Roy Bargy nodded at her with enthusiasm, and exclaimed, "I'll buy that!"

The orchestra was playing a rousing rendition of "Love, Love, Love" when Garry Moore came in, executing a graceful (?) ballet leap to land in front of the microphone. A young fellow in his late twenties, Moore is currently not sporting his familiar crew haircut "trademark" and looked quite handsome with his hair slicked back and a smile spread from ear to ear.

He put a cigarette (Camel!) in his mouth, lit it, then started reading his script, the cigarette bobbing up and down like a yo-yo on a spree.

Into Dialogue

Tall, blonde, bow-tied Howard Petrie, the show's announcer, joined him at the mike.

Moore: Well, thank you . . . thank you very much, my friends, and good evening ladies and gentlemen . . . a very happy two days before Mother's Day to you all.

Petrie: Ah, Mother's Day . . . do you celebrate it at your house, Garry?

Moore: Oh, indood we dee. All her life my mother wanted to have children, and she finally got her wish. Four years after I was born, she had her first child . . . She was so happy.

Petrie: I'll betcha. But just when were you born?

Moore: Well, strictly speaking, Howard I wasn't born at all . . . My father sent in a couple of box-tops and I was delivered by Parcel Post . . . I was a cute little rascal, too. Until I was ten years old, I was tied to my mother's apron strings.

Petrie: Say, that must have been nice.

Moore: Yes, it was—except that she kept sending her apron to the laundry . . . Oh, I was the *dampest* baby!"

Moore went into his specialty later in the script, and songstress Georgia, comedienne Elvia Allman, announcer Petrie, Durante and the rest of the cast sat back to enjoy some hearty belly-laughs.

It was Garry's rapid-fire version of the story of "Hansell and Gretel", recited at a speed of some 120 words a minute . . .

" . . . And the mother said, 'Where would you go to get some wood? Why, if you would send me to get some wood, I would go to the woods to get some wood, then where would you go to get some wood?' So the kids said they would and they went to the woods to get some wood . . . So they were out in the woods there getting some wood, when all of a sudden they came upon a little house in the woods . . .

" . . . when all of a sudden they hear a voice . . . They heard a voice that said, 'Hey whaddayuh doin'? Whaddayuh doin'? Whaddayuh doin' to my house, fuh gosh sakes' . . . And when the kids look around, there stands a wicked old witch! . . . Ohhh, what a witch! . . . And she says, 'Whaddayuh doin' to my house, I said?' And the kids says 'We ain't doin' nothin' . . . we just ate up the windows, the walls, the window shade, the dresser-drawer, the davenport, the pillows, the porch, the paint, the pipes, the kitchen, the clock, the cozy chair, the bricks, the broom, the bric-a-brac, the lights, the lamps, the tablecloth . . . (HIC!) . . . and where can we get some bicarbonate? . . ."

Into Finale

Moore's fellow performers gave him a hand, then Petrie stepped forward and clowning his way through a commercial. Director Cohan beamed his approval of the final script.

Moore and Durante returned to the mike for their farewell. Garry jingled the coins and keys in his right-hand pocket, "lipped" Durante's lines energetically.

Durante: And thus, Junior, we end our third week in Hollywood.

Moore: Yes, and have you found an apartment in Hollywood yet—or are you still sub-letting from a gopher?

Durante: No, Junior, I found a wonderful little place . . . I'm living in a grandfather's clock.

Moore: In a grandfather's clock? Isn't it a little crowded?

Durante: It won't be after grandfather moves out.

Moore: That's my Jimmy who said that!

I NEVER TAKE myself seriously," tall, sandy-haired, bushy-browed Tobe Reed chuckled. "I often look like I'm frowning because I'm near-sighted, and I make enemies because I can't remember names. A lot of people have me labelled as a guy with 'the wrong attitude'."

Actually, Tobe Reed, genial mike-man of such popular airshows as "Don't You Believe It", "Three of a Kind", "Duffy's Tavern" and "The Star and the Story", is a chap with a terrific sense of humor. Take, for instance, his answers to a CBS biographical questionnaire:

Question: What are your convictions regarding show business?

Tobe: I'm convinced that radio is better than working.

Trying to tie Tobe Reed down to a sober discussion of his life and career is fairly an impossibility. He's too full of fun. With typical humor, he tells how he bluffed his way into radio.

He had read once that the sound of a fire was produced over the air by crackling cellophane into the microphone. So when he filed an application for radio work, and was asked to give his previous experience, he stated smugly that he was the man who thought of crackling cellophane into a mike to make the sound of a fire!

Newspaper Bluff

Before radio, Tobe continued with a laugh, he blithely bluffed his way into a newspaper reporter's job. He didn't know anything at all about

being a reporter; he couldn't even type. So, unbeknown to the editor who hired him, he persuaded someone else to give him stories which he simply (so he says!) "colored" up a bit. The person who supplied him with the ready-made skeleton stories was none other than a reporter on a rival paper!

Reed maintains that his childhood ambition was "to become a man", but later, in college, his earnest ambition was to become a lawyer. He majored in philosophy, with the thought of taking an extensive sixteen-year law course that probably would have qualified him for no less than the Supreme Court. He entered college when still less than sixteen years old, and at seventeen, he was studiously assisting a learned psychiatrist.

But "things happened", as Reed himself puts it, and when he left the University of Washington, he became a reporter on the San Francisco Chronicle. During his four-year stint with the "press", he had many memorable experiences.

At this point in his story he became serious for a moment to tell us of the times he interviewed prisoners at San Quentin. One afternoon he had occasion to spend several hours in "Death Row", the block of cells in which are interned the men who are condemned to die.

"The silence," related Reed with a grimace, "was ominous and overpowering. But as I stood there, I was startled to hear one of those stone-faced condemned men suddenly start

to whistle the most cheerful tune in the world! It was the only sound he made before going to his death."

Some day, Tobe declared, he would like to do a series of broadcasts based on the simplicity and drama of such sounds as that convict's whistling. His chief desire concerning radio is to spin yarns, and he has an extensive supply of story ideas on which to base his narrations.

His First Broadcast

Resuming the story of his radio career, Reed laughed heartily and related this tale of his first big broadcast. Having made an inconspicuous debut on the airlines as an announcer giving station identification, he was elated to be suddenly sent out to do a remote broadcast. Chuckling, Tobe commented at this point that, being new to radio, he thought 'doing a remote' meant some magnificent deed. "I contemplated getting a medal for it," he smilingly maintained.

Actually, the "remote" turned out to be a pick-up broadcast from a big night-spot, with Reed emceeing a coast network show. It was his big moment! But two minutes before air-time, he accidentally locked himself in the men's room! A key couldn't be located in time, so the microphone was inserted through the transom and, according to the fun-loving Mr. Reed, he started his radio career there, amid such unglorified surroundings!

Convention Coverage

Radio, which has been fulfilling such a tremendous responsibility in bringing news of the world-at-large to its dialers, will turn its attention toward the home front this coming week, when the Republican National Convention convenes. From the many bits of data descending on Radio Life's desk of late, we have sorted out the following information for those who are interested in following the G.O.P. conclave.

The broadcast schedule for the highlights of the G.O.P. National Convention, which starts Monday, June 26, in the Chicago Stadium have been set by Chairman Harrison E. Spangler of the Republican National Committee, and the four U. S. radio networks, Mutual, Blue, CBS and NBC.

Mutual-Don Lee plans to carry each of the important events of the convention as scheduled, but definite announcement of the time of each broadcast cannot be made because of the unscheduled delays that will occur. Normally, broadcasts will begin at 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on all days

except the first, when the opening broadcast will start at 3:30 p.m. Each broadcast period is expected to run approximately thirty minutes. Among the speakers to be heard are Governor Dwight H. Green of Illinois, Governor Earl Warren of California, Rep. Joseph Martin of Massachusetts (the convention chairman), ex-president Herbert Hoover and Rep. Clare Boothe Luce of Connecticut.

A full corps of MBS newscasters and commentators will be on hand to cover all important convention highlights — among them, Fulton Lewis, jr., Walter Compton, Upton Close, Mrs. Raymond Clapper and Ray Dady.

NBC announces that for the first time in the history of communications, radio and television will be coordinated to provide a report of a nationally important event when the network combines microphones and cameras to cover both conventions.

The program will begin with a television showing over WNBT, scheduled one hour before the network goes on the air from the stadium on the opening night, June 26. Scenes will show Chicago as a favorite convention city of other years, with glimpses of conventions as far back as 1860, when Lincoln was nominated, followed by a pictorial journey to the home towns of the present-day leading presidential candidates and highlights of their careers.

After the television scenes, televiewers will be directed to tune to local NBC outlets for pick-ups direct from the network's reporters and commentators in the stadium.

CBS will have two broadcast periods daily from the convention, each period to be of at least an hour's duration, at 10:00 a.m. and at 7:00 p.m., with the exception of the opening day when the initial broadcast will be at 9:30 a.m.

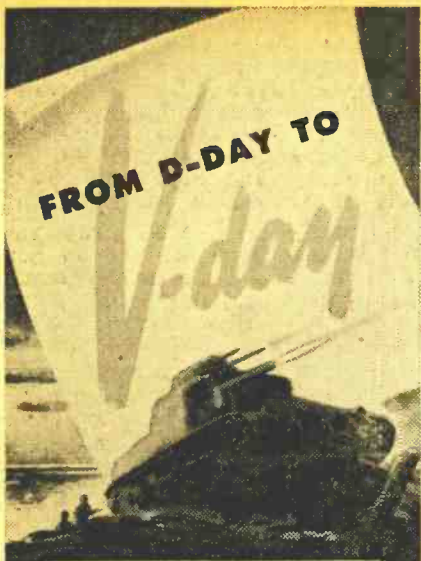
To bring all phases of the Republican convention to its coast-to-coast audience, the Columbia network has assigned to Chicago a staff of thirty-six men and women, ranging from news analysts and reporters to special events broadcasters and technicians. Paul White, CBS Director of News Broadcasts, will direct all convention programs, assisted by Bill Slocum, jr., CBS Director of Special Events, and Bob Wood, Columbia's Washington news chief. Bob Trout and John Daly will be the network's chief announcers. Station KNX, Hollywood, will have Wallace Sterling as its convention representative.

The same complete coverage by radio will prevail during the period of the Democratic National Convention beginning July 19.

OFTENTIMES WE wonder just which musicians a bandleader would pick for his band if he had a free choice of the field. The other night on his America Dances show on KFWE, emcee FRANK BULL conducted an interview with LOUIS JORDAN, who waxes for Decca and whose "Ration Blues" is a big seller. Frank asked Jordan to list his choice for an all-star band. Here's the way Louie picked 'em: REED SECTION—Benney Carter, Johnny Hodges, Ben Webster, Coleman Hawkins and Louis Jordan; BRASS SECTION—Pop Smith, Diz Gillespie, Roy Eldridge, Matthews and Higginbotham; PIANO—Jess Stacy; GUITAR—Al Casey; BASS—Oscar Pittiford; DRUMS—Cozy Cole; FEATURED AT DRUMS—Duddy Rich. . . . There's one bandleader's opinion, and it sounds like a pretty solid band.

XAVIER CUGAT, that great spreader of Inter-American goodwill via music, has a new album for Columbia called "CUGAT'S MEXICO." Featured are a variety of Mexican folk rhythms. The set contains "Guadalajara," a cancion tapatia; "Las Mananits," a Mexican folk song; "Chiapanecas" and "Marimba," two Mexican waltzes; "Ojos Tapatios," a cancion Mexicana; "Jesusita," a Mexican polka; "Jarabe Tapatios," the Mexican Hat Dance, and "Coconito," another Mexican cancion. Soloists with the orchestra and chorus are Carmen Castillo, Lina Romay and Miguelito Valdes, three of the nation's top Latin singers.

HELEN FORREST'S first solo record for Decca comprises cleverly arranged selections by Camarata for Helen's considerable vocal talents. Tunes are "Time Waits For No One," the theme from Warner Brothers' "Shine On Harvest Moon," and "In a Moment of Madness," which Helen sings in the M-G-M picture, "Two Girls and a Sailor." Delightful to hear. Swell for dancing.

VICTOR REACHES back into its files for two new releases. Waxed by Capt. Glenn Miller before he donned khaki are "Basket Weaver," a smooth waltz with a tinkling tempo, and "On a Little Street In Singapore," written some y'ars ago by Billy Hill and Peter DeRose. Ray Eberle's fine baritone is featured on both sides.

Duke Ellington's "Little Brown Book" and "Someone" comprise another new Victor release. The latter is one of The Duke's originals, featuring Rex Stewart's capable trumpet playing, with spots of Johnny Hodges' shrill alto sax and Lawrence Brown's mellow trombone. A fine instrumental.

From the field of radio, such personalities as Bob Hope, Bing Crosby, Burns and Allen, Eddie Cantor, Jack



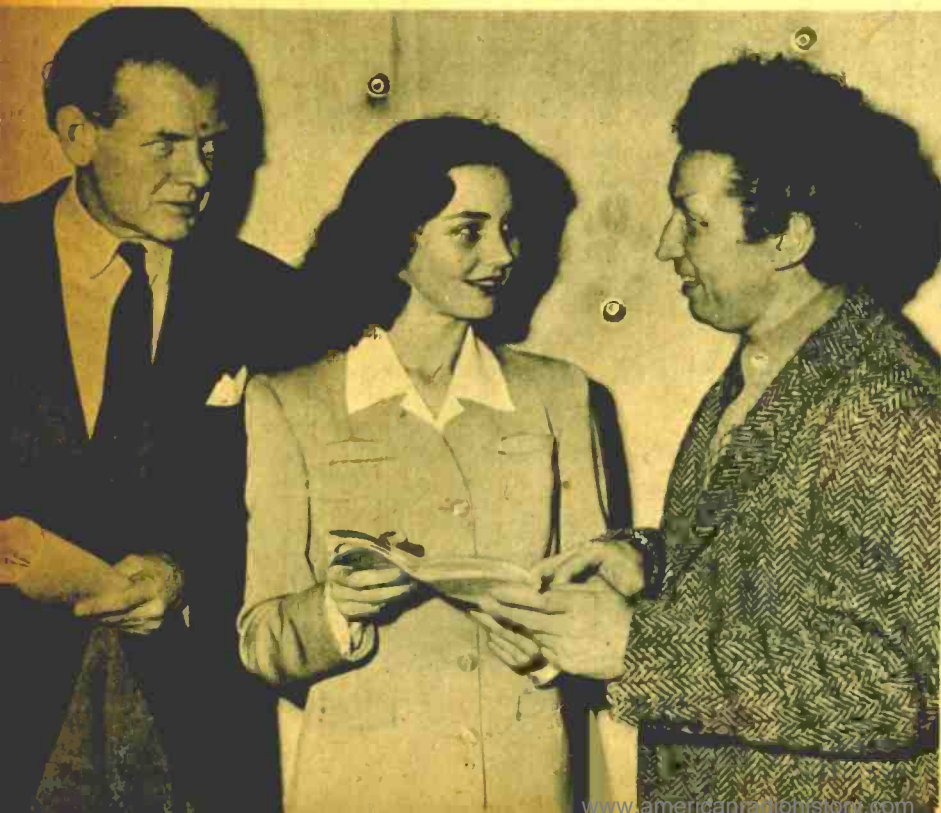

Whiteman made a brief trip to the west coast a few weeks ago, and Radio Life managed to slice off a corner of his busy schedule to bring our readers his views on this impressive Sunday afternoon radio program.

We found the inimitable "Pops" out on a Republic Pictures lot, rehearsing for a new musical flicker called "Atlantic City". Although majestically referred to as The Dean

of Modern American Music, Whiteman is not always the imposing picture of white-tied-and-tailed dignity that he presents upon the podium.

As a matter of fact, to our complete delight, we found the genial "Pops", comfortable and casual in a loud-checked out board shirt, skidding down a children's playground slide and tripping the light fantastic in a gay session of ring-around-the-rosie!

These playful antics were a part of a musical number for the picture, but the informal nonchalance with which Whiteman performed his pecu-

liar picture chores didn't disappear at the finish of rehearsal. He stretched out in a chair and began our conversation with ease and eagerness. Making movies obviously didn't disturb him one way or another. He was completely relaxed—even after such a strenuous routine.

He pointed out at that moment, however, that he had been following a somewhat strenuous schedule for weeks prior to the picture assignment. Doing five shows a day at the Roxy, he had to run back and forth between performances to attend to his radio duties. In addition to his

broadcasts, he is musical director of the entire Blue Network.

Idea for Identification

One of his pet ideas is to persuade this network to use the opening strains of "Rhapsody in Blue" with the words, "This is the Blue" as their distinctive network identification.

Speaking of his "Radio Hall of Fame" broadcasts, Whiteman emphasized that it has proven to be an exceedingly pleasant program. He considers outstanding the work of the comparatively small thirty-one piece orchestra which he conducts,

had three programs lined up to start on before he hopped the train. As he was announcing Hildegard's show in Chicago, it seemed a natural that he should officiate here for Red Skelton. The same sponsor that bankrolls "Ma Perkins" in Chicago foots the bill here for "Dreft Star Playhouse," so Mueller acquired the Playhouse assignment without quirk-ing a finger. His role as "Coronet Story Teller" travelled right along West with him to be aired from Hollywood via the Blue.

It is obvious from the foregoing data that Mueller is a magnetic person. He attracts jobs and at the rate he is going, he'll soon be doing 45 shows weekly in Hollywood—the very thing from which he ran away. Due to be 31 years old on July 18, Mueller started out to be a newspaper man until the lack of glamour dampened his ambition. It was while he was attending Washington University in St. Louis and was polishing off his excellent German, French and Spanish, that he became annoyed with the manner in which local radio announcers bungled foreign words. Like any cock-sure collegian of eighteen, Marvin applied for an announcing job, was informed he was "lousy".

"But we're looking for a one-man show", one of the judges informed him.

One-Man Show

That was cue enough for Mueller. In two days he had written a solo program, auditioned it, and was on the air. His principal characters were two Negroes and two Englishmen, but his "cast" promptly enlarged to seven or eight parts (all played by Mueller) and by the end of thirteen weeks, he was in the spirit of the program so thoroughly that he had originated forty-five roles which he glibly carried in addition to the narration.

His next important venture was at KMOX, where he got wind of a new show requiring an elderly narrator—at least 65. After a hopeful detachment of grey-haired men had auditioned for the part and failed to come up to the sponsor's expectations, Mueller took a whack at the lines, reading them from behind a screen so that the critics couldn't see him in all the fresh vitality of his nineteen years.

He was hired—at \$39 a week—but not until the sponsor almost fainted when Marvin stepped out from behind his hiding place.

In off-mike life, Mueller is as compelling a personality as he is on the air. He collects symphony records, likes to putter at woodwork, keeps scrapbooks, is an amateur bartender. His wife, Elizabeth, has a C.A.P. pilot's license and is a clever illustrator. Marvin speaks proudly of her

A FEW WEEKS AGO, Marvin Mueller was announcing and acting on 45 shows a week in Chicago. "My wife and I wanted to come to California and enjoy life, so I sent her out to see (a) if we'd like to settle down here (b) if the prospects for my work were good (c) if we could find a place to live.

"It took her two days to decide we'd like it here", Mueller said, arching his already curved brows a notch higher. "In four days the prospects looked good. It took a week and two days to find a house. We bought a duplex out near The Strip."

Marvin, who has a round face and whose structure is on the substantial side, took another drag on his coke and continued the story of trans-

planting himself from the Windy City to Hollywood.

"I'm a helluva lot better actor than announcer", he claimed disarmingly as he mentioned that his 45 weekly stints included both thespian and announcing departments—"Guiding Light", "Ma Perkins", "Beat the Band", to mention a few of the announcing jobs; "Backstage Wife", "Road of Life", "Right to Happiness" to cite a trio of acting assignments. Together, the 45 chores added up to twelve hours a day, seven days a week.

Skip and Jump

Mueller did his parting program in Chicago on a Friday night at 8:55 o'clock. His first show in Hollywood was the following Monday night at 6:55 p.m. Showing he lost no time in picking up work here; in fact, he

of San Francisco. They're both old timers in radio, though both are still a few years shy of 40. They've both done about every kind of radio job in the book—announcing, writing, producing, emceeing, even the thirty-second chorus for a singing commercial. Both have worked only for one station, both are associated with the Don Lee network. Both are great favorites for personal appearances, and each year Stu and Bob compare their lineups for club luncheons, civic drives and public welfare campaigns.

Then, as we've already noted, the two men are identified with old programs with which they are no longer associated. This is a cue to the personality of each man. Each has a way of taking over the program on which he is heard and stamping it with his own personal charm. Which may be a little hard on successors, but is fine for Stu and Bob—and for "Quiz of Two Cities."

Bags of Tricks

Because each fellow is a home town man, that, too, is fine for the inter-city programs. If Bob, for example, makes some claim for San Francisco that leaves the Angels gasping with hurt pride, Stu is perfectly capable of reaching into his knowledge of Southern California achievements to bring his supporters back to normal.

Now, about the differences between Stu and Bob. Physically, they're great although Bob seems to be crowding Stu's record for skinniness. Stu is about 5-10 and about "that" big around—as he himself says meat was rationed for him a long time before the war began. Bob is 6-2, and a few months ago got a pretty definite reaction when he stepped on the scales. He's dropped off about 40 pounds lately, though, but still outdoes Wilson by a long way.

◀ The Los Angeles man has a newspaper background for his radio career. 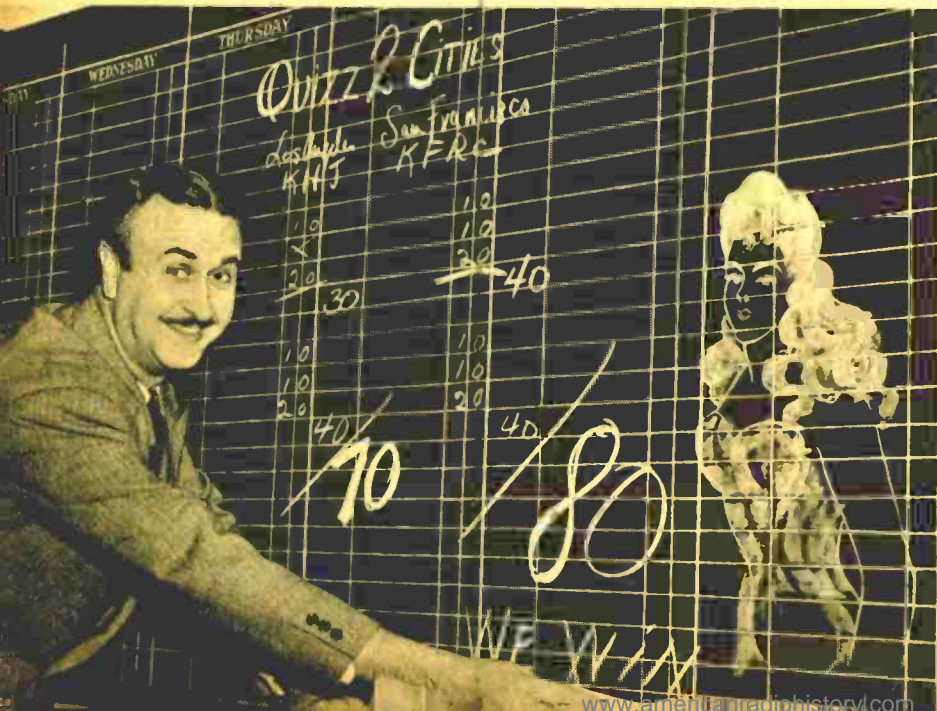
THE TWO fellows who do California's "Quiz of Two Cities," to keep seething a very real rivalry between Los Angeles and San Francisco are Stu Wilson and Bob Bence. If you talk to a Los Angeles radio fan and mention the "Quiz of Two Cities," he'll probably say, "Oh, yeah, with Stu Wilson—I know Stu, KHJ's 'Rise and Shine' guy."

Stu hasn't been on "Rise and Shine" for three years.

Likewise, if you talk to a radio fan from the San Francisco area, and mention "Quiz of Two Cities," he'll undoubtedly say, "Oh, yeah, with Bob Bence—remember when he was 'Bob Bounce' on KFRC's 'Hodge Podge Lodge'?"

That program went off the air seven years ago.

Either by coincidence, or because such are the qualifications for the emcees on "Quiz of Two Cities," there are a great many similarities between Stu of Los Angeles and Bob

Angeles, was attended by 35,000 fans.

"Wretched Rancho"

Vocal talents are not Stu's only accomplishments, however. He writes, too. Currently he's doing a "Time Out" broadcast on KHJ, which he narrates, and on which he uses human interest stories that he collects as he takes part in about 15 other programs a week. Stu is married, has two youngsters, and a home in North Hollywood. The home is really a hobby, for it's a ranch with chickens, ducks, gardens, and a goat. You can be sure that his "Quiz of Two Cities" listeners hear plenty about "Wretched Rancho," both from Stu, and not so flatteringly from Bob.

Switching controls to Bence, we find that he went to work at KFRC, the Don Lee San Francisco station, about 1930. He, too, was a "Rise and Shiner," but gained his greatest renown with the comedy variety show, "Hodge Podge Lodge," which was on the air for years up to 1936. Chinese dialects were Bence's favorites, and the plural is intentional. One of Bob's gags was to wear a two-sided Chinese hat, and as he carried on a two-way routine between a Chinaman from Canton and one from Peking, he'd turn the hat with each change of character. His audiences loved it, and still talk of it, though Bence has given up dialect work for straight scripts.

Before he took up the microphone, Bob was a salesman. He still is, of course, but for years he used the salesman-to-secretary-to-client method. Born in Placerville, California, Bob went to "the city," as Los Angeles people do not refer to San Francisco, when he was a youngster, and today knows nearly every business man there. He calls himself a pre-bridge San Franciscan. He calls Stu Wilson a pre-bridge Angeleno, too.

A City Man

Married, Bob is a city man. He lives in an apartment, doesn't go in for pets, has no children. Something of a pianist himself, Bob is often host to San Francisco's musicians, and likes all kinds of music. Though he can almost match Stu Wilson's radio background, Bob can also identify himself with more elaborate productions. He took part in the "Don Lee Breakfast Club" broadcasts made famous on the coast by Jack Kirkwood. He has been announcer on many of the symphonic series on the network, and is host on many of the famous Don Lee dance remotes.

On "Quiz of Two Cities" the traditional battle between those who live in the Bay City area and those who call themselves the "real Californians" is personified by Stu and Bob. The insults that the more or less reserved and well-mannered guests refrain from saying are glibly tossed back and forth by the two emcees. Bob complains because Stu talks too much, Stu complains because Bob has nothing to say. These

personal comments make no ill feeling, Bob is in San Francisco, and Stuling, however, because to those listeners is Los Angeles.

Loyal Fans

Sometimes the two get a little confused about the score. The audience is sure to straighten them out, for the side that has been short changed on points rises to protest immediately and loudly.

Since the teams used on "Quiz of Two Cities" are chosen to fit identical patterns—firemen from each city, insurance salesmen, copy writers, etc., four from Los Angeles and four from San Francisco, the scores keep on a pretty even keel. But no matter what the total may read, each emcee always claims a victory, moral or actual, on the grounds that the other can't add, and besides "we had to tell them all their answers anyway." In fact, "Quiz of Two Cities" has been going on now for about 140 weeks, and not even the producers on the show know the actual score, Stu and Bob keep them that confused.

accomplishments in the air, but perhaps wistfully. "I'm an avid student pilot," he admitted.

He would like to have an evening program earmarked as his own—"commentation or symphony orchestra", he qualified. He dismissed popular music with a suave gesture. "I like it definitely sweet", he said. "Sure, Crosby is wonderful."

The Muellers have a four-year-old son, Anthony Dawson Mueller. Unless Marvin takes immediate steps, Little Tony will have to suffer what his daddy has for years—having his name pronounced incorrectly.

"It's not Mewler or Muller", the radio announcer-actor stated wearily and almost mechanically "It's plain Miller and I'll change the spelling if I have to. Now, when I'm starting brand new in Hollywood might not be a bad time to do it."

and has been very well-satisfied with all of the musical scores which they have presented on the program. "Music," he declares, "should tap the feet and stretch the soul."

Preceding each Sunday's broadcast, Whiteman diligently studies the complete musical score, then assembles his orchestra on Thursday evening for a three-hour rehearsal. Friday, the arrangers make the changes which he has worked out and Saturday morning there is a second rehearsal, which is recorded in part, so that he may study the score further before conducting Sunday's full dress rehearsal with the program's entire cast.

"The Hall of Fame" (a name which Whiteman himself considers "too stuffy") is an imposing program that has presented during past months the greatest names of comedy, music and drama in current entertainment history. It has paid tribute to some of show business' biggest and best personalities.

"I think," smiled "Pops", "it has given some deserving people that nice 'Oscar' feeling, which is what it is intended to do."

"Pops" paused in his observations to chuckle and declare, "It seems to me I've been starting too many sentences with the word 'I'!"

Praises Director

Resuming his discussion of the "Hall of Fame", he spoke with admiration and respect of the program's gifted young director, Devere Joseph Engelbach, more conveniently known as "Dee". A chubby, worried, blond young man who is not yet thirty, Engelbach started in radio as a page-boy. Backed by both musical and dramatic scholarships, he worked his way into singing and acting assignments, then entered the field of production.

His first directorial post, in 1938, was "Radio City Music Hall of the Air", followed by production assignments on such programs as "My True Story", "The Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street", and the Metropolitan Opera and Boston Symphony airshows.

On Monday morning, Engelbach confers with the editors of Variety who select the talent for his program, the William Morris office which books it, and the show's script writers. Then all week long, the producer works himself into a frenzy, fretting and fuming for perfection.

Broadcast-time on Sunday finds him caged in the control room, swaying nervously, his eyes jumping from the script to the stage to the electric clock.

As Paul Whiteman pointed out, "The Radio Hall of Fame" is a program that pleasantly combines an air of impressive dignity with an atmosphere of relaxed informality—Plus," "Pops" added with his good-natured chuckle, "plenty of perspiration!"
