The Mystery Is How He Does It

Prolific Writer Of "I Love A Mystery" And "One Man's Family" Follows Early-To-Bed, Early-To-Rise Policy, Works Seven Days A Week, Bites His Nails And Has Indigestion

◀ **A CROWDED CUBICLE** in the heart of Hollywood serves as Carlton E. Morse's office. He arrives there at 6:30 a.m., writes a daily episode for "I Love a Mystery" series by 9:15 a.m.; then takes time out for a cup of coffee and a doughnut.

THE COLD gray light of dawn still hangs heavy over Hollywood when Carlton E. Morse (the "E" is for Errol) settles himself down at his typewriter each morning to pound out the daily episodes of his CBS "I Love a Mystery" thrillers and his weekly half-hour scripts for the long-time favorite dramatic serial, NBC's "One Man's Family."

He works in his office—a small crowded cubicle in the Otto K. Olsen building, near Hollywood's Radio City. Its walls bear framed certificates of merit awarded his shows, autographed photos of his programs' cast members, a lovely portrait of his wife, Patricia Pattison DeBall, and a banner from San Francisco's Bohemian Club. Furniture in the room includes a couch, a desk, chair and typewriter stand, and a long table heaped with bound volumes and mammoth scrapbooks. On the shelves above it are the impressive gold trophies his airshows have been awarded and the neatly-bound copies of the vast number of scripts he has penned since his "Family" and "Mystery" programs took to the ether waves. (There are one hundred and sixteen volumes, at this writing, with an average of 90,000 words in each volume.)

Huge Reference Library

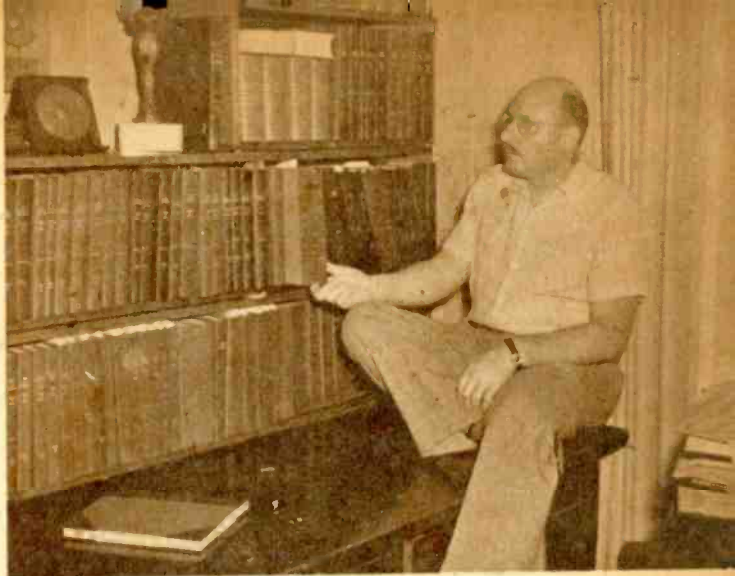
Seated at his typewriter, Morse has a globe of the world at his right hand, a massive dictionary at his left, and reference books of every kind within arm's reach. The latter collection now includes a complete set of Encyclopedia Britannica, Roget's Thesaurus, Bartlett's Familiar Quotations, a book on Pagan Symbols, a History of Heathen Gods (these last two specifically for use as reference on his "Mystery" scripts), Sunset's Complete Garden Book, Mother and Baby Care in Pictures, the Handbook for Nurses and the Medical Dictionary (the latter group of particular use in following the specialized pursuits of the various members of his famed "Barbour Family.")

Morse's preference for a crowded cubbyhole of an office comes from the early days of his writing career when he worked as a reporter, columnist and copy reader for the Sacramento Union, the Seattle Times,

and San Francisco's Chronicle, Herald and Bulletin.

Today, his secretary, Frances Abts, finds herself working in equally cramped quarters in Morse's outer office. "We haven't half enough space," she sighs with a resigned smile, "but he likes it."

There is a cartoon hanging above her desk showing a harrassed secretary with a phone to her ear, one hand making memos, the other pouring the boss a cup of tea, and her feet operating a typewriter. On the door of the office shown in the cartoon, Miss Abts has lettered in the name, Carlton E. Morse. (She serves Morse a cup of tea around ten o'clock each morning.)

When Morse leaves his office in the afternoon, he makes a point of being sartorially correct to the extreme of a buttoned collar and tie.

But in the office, he switches to comfortable, loose-fitting sports shirts (he has them specially made at a cost of ten to twelve dollars, with sleeves adorned by his initials, C.E.M.).

Mrs. Morse once described her famous husband with these words: "He is subject to nervous indigestion, bites his nails and wears probably the worst-looking sports clothes—or what he thinks are sports clothes—I ever saw."

When the day is extremely hot, however, Morse sweats over the typewriter, stripped down to his waist.

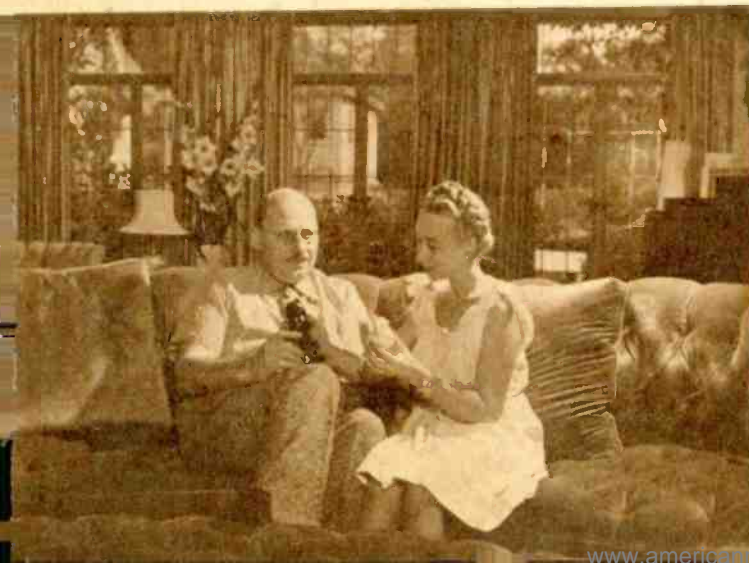
The suit coat that hangs on his office hat rack while he's working almost always bears a flower on its lapel. The writer has a great love of flowers, and when those at his Los Angeles home are in bloom, he

Talking Turkey

"Now let's talk turkey to Japan" is the slogan of NBC's day-long contribution to the sixth war loan drive on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 23. On that day, NBC will devote twenty broadcast hours to the war loan campaign, and eminent military leaders, stars of the entertainment world, distinguished clergymen, as well as war bond salesmen, will offer bond messages. Saluting the nation's 5,000,000 volunteer bond salesmen, the broadcast schedule will include hourly tributes to the nation's historic shrines, Thanksgiving prayers delivered by service chaplains of the three major faiths, firsthand reports on how the men overseas are spending their Thanksgiving Day, and pickups from shrines of liberty in both the European and Pacific theaters of war at points where America's fighting men have consecrated the soil.

Every NBC program on the air during the day will devote some part of its time to the war bond and Thanksgiving themes, and at the end of the day a star-studded ninety-minute variety show will be presented.

All day long, at least once every hour, the sound of a doorbell on the air will signify that a bond salesman is appearing on the network in a bond appeal, and every listener is urged to give thanks to our boys "over there" by buying a war bond that will help to bring them back.

Conried vs. Civilians

All of you avid radio-dialers who have long admired the outstanding work of versatile Hans Conried, colorful character actor who played an amazing variety of roles on almost every airshow in Hollywood, will be interested to learn that he is now stationed in Kentucky as a member of the tank corps. He chose that branch of army service specifically.

Before he left Hollywood, however, Hans stopped by to say so-long to all his pals at the CBS studios—and lo and behold, gone was the old familiar Conried, with his dashing ensemble of rainbow hues and carefree coiffure of long sweeping shanks of limp brown hair. He had already been given a G.I. cut.

But his inimitable yen for "hammy" dramatics was still delightfully in evidence. Lifting his nose in an haughty scowl, he approached his airline bud-

dies with a dramatic sweep of his arm. "Be gone with you," he shouted disdainfully in a Shakespearean tone of voice. "Already, I hate civilians!"

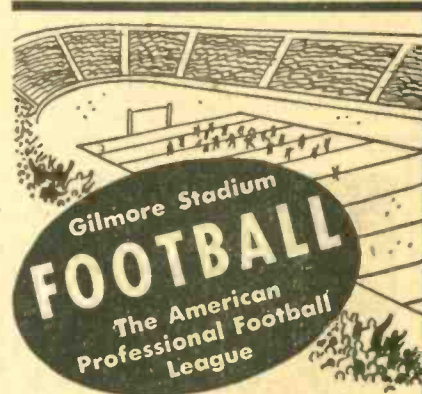

fills the office with them.

Is Reserved

Those who work closely with the prolific radio scribe maintain that what has been labeled his difficult temperament is really a wall of reserve he has built around himself by his extreme shyness.

"It is difficult for him to be at immediate ease with people," his secretary told us. "He is easy-going only with easy-going people, such as Buddy Twiss (I Love a Mystery's' assistant producer)."

Morse works steadily, seven days a week, and manages to get away for a vacation only by repeating or buying a series of "I Love a Mystery" scripts. Now, his demanding schedule of radio work is supplemented by the tasks involved in the preparation of the "I Love a Mystery" movies which will soon debut on the screen.

Asked if he harbors the desire to get away from it all someday, Morse answered with a smile, "Oh, yes, we all do." Until that day comes, however, he continues to follow a strict daily schedule.

The jarring jangle of his alarm clock routs him out of bed at 5:30 a.m. He sets the clock in another room rather than beside his bed, so it will awaken him completely. "Once I'm up," he laughed, "I come to." Raised on an Oregon dairy ranch, he is used to early rising.

At six a.m., he leaves the house. If the housekeeper is up, he downs a cup of tea before going out the door, but never eats his breakfast at home. He doesn't want anyone to talk to him until he gets to his typewriter, so he hies himself off to a drive-in or to the Ontra Cafeteria to eat his breakfast and read the morning newspaper in solitude.

His Working Schedule

By six-thirty, he is in his office and at work on a new "Mystery"

One-Man Family

IN 1934, a soft-spoken, quiet-mannered young man with an idea for a new radio show, arrived in Baltimore, Maryland. He had been working on the idea for years, but was still doubtful of its merit. Having readied it for an audition, he was finding it difficult to summon enough confidence to give his premiere performance. So he shyly requested a young lady who was living in the next-door apartment to be his initial "audience."

"You sit here," he instructed her, "and I'll go into the other room and shut the door. Then you tell me truthfully if the voices you hear sound as if one person is trying to sound like three people!"

In that way, Miss Lynn Cooper, a young lady who happened to be living in a Baltimore, Maryland, apartment next door to a man named Jimmy Scribner, was the first person ever to hear the now-famous laughable, lovable "Johnson Family."

Ten years later, Miss Cooper, now living in Los Angeles, saw Scribner's name on a local theater marquee and went backstage to say "hello."

"She didn't think I'd remember her," smiled Scribner when we talked to him later, "but I'll never forget. If it hadn't been for her vote of confidence, I couldn't have summoned the courage to have the show auditioned. I was afraid people would think I was crazy. I thought sure they'd say, 'Come and listen to this guy—he's goofy!'"

Instant Reception

But once he had presented himself for an audition at the Baltimore radio station, Scribner and his "Johnson Family" made an immediate air debut. The monetary reimbursement was small, however. "I had to pawn my watch every week to see me through," Jimmy told us with a laugh.

When "The Johnson Family" first took to the air ten years ago, there were just three characters—Mama and Papa Johnson, and Lucy. Now Scribner does some twenty-two voices on the show! The cast of characters

includes the original three, supplemented by such names as "PeeWee," "Gorilla Joe," "The Deacon," and "Mr. Phillpots," the lawyer—most of whom are characterizations of people Scribner has known.

"PeeWee," Scribner informed us, "is an exact copy of a little colored boy named 'Shine' who lived with my aunt for seven years or so. PeeWee's expressions, such as his familiar 'great dav in the mornin'," (Scribner launched into his "PeeWee" dialect at this point) are those Shine always used.

"As for Mama Johnson," Jimmy went on, "I created her in the image of a lovable old Negro mammy who lived with us. The character of 'Gorilla Joe' was born in a massive giant of a fellow I once knew. He always went barefoot, even when the ground was thick with icy snow. His feet had soles on them an inch thick. He's never worn shoes."

Loves Colored Folk

Scribner has a great love for the colored folk, and a rare appreciation of the drama and humor in their lives. "I remember the day I found Mammy chasing a fellow around the yard with a butcher knife," laughed Jimmy then, "She wasn't going to hurt him, but she was plenty mad because he had told her that her feet were big! Oh, they're wonderful people!"

Colored folk, in turn, have formed a great affection for Scribner. He told us of an incident that occurred during his local theater engagement. A "mammy" and her small son came backstage to meet Jimmy. "Ah hopes yo' won't get angry with me, Mist' Scribner," the mammy drawled, clutching her cute little pickaninny in her arms, "but ah's gonna ask a favor o' yo'." She hung her head bashfully and flashed a shy, white-toothed grin at the genial creator of "The Johnson Family." Then she asked in a hesitating drawl, "Woud yo' mind if mah li'l James Robert kissed yo' on da cheek!"

Jimmy Scribner was born and brought up in the southland, near Norfolk, Virginia. Early in life, he took part in amateur minstrel shows and at the age of seventeen, he

HERE'S a dollar for you if you stump us," tempts "the Joe with the dough" Jack Sherman while "the mighty midget with the dextreous digits," Merle Clark, stands by at the organ and does his best to remove the possibility.

Which is to say, the radio audience is invited to participate in a musical quiz in reverse on "Stump Us," heard over KMPC Monday through Friday mornings at 11:30. Banter mentor Sherman pays off the people who ask too tough musical questions of Master organist Merle Clark.

Four days a week Emcee Sherman queries Maestro Merle from requests

in more than 150 letters they receive daily. On Thursdays the program features audience participation — when over 100 spectators, who fill the studio, fire selections at the organist, "have to show us if they can stump us" by singing, playing, or whistling the hard ones they dream up.

"We're just a couple of work-horses," Jack claims. "He works, I horse around." On Thursday's free-for-all Sherman clowns with the customers. One lady stumped Merle with an odd request. When she got up to sing the number Jack asked her under what conditions she did her best vocalizing. When she replied, "The bathtub," Jack produced a small tub and a glass of water,

with the aid of which props she "made like" Lily Pons.

Another lady was handed a doll when she claimed she did her best crooning to her infant in arms. A "stumper" with a sense of humor, when asked where she did her best singing, quipped back "Just above contralto."

"Kopasetic cat of the 'Stump Us' clambake," as Merle is referred to when the show goes jives has as high a batting average as there is. They keep score of the number of requests as opposed to the number of requests fulfilled each broadcast, find that only about 3 out of 27 "stump" him. Merle has played over 3000 different tunes from his vast repertoire in the past four months. Before coming to

While "America's Town Meeting" tries always to be fair and impartial, it also endeavors to produce an hour of hot debate, knowing the great American public dearly loves a fight.

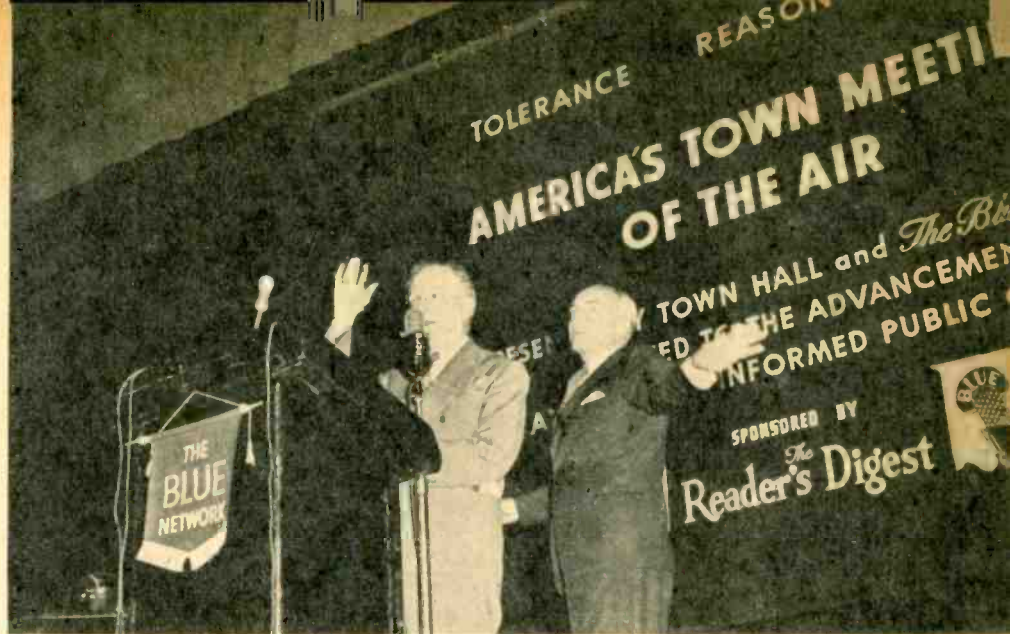
"Town Meeting" recently became a sponsored program for the first time in its ten-year history. Reader's Digest, the famed pocket-sized magazine, took the program under its financial wing, and devoted fans immediately started worrying whether the Meeting's long record of open and unrestricted debate would be sidetracked in favor of the "special interests."

First In L. A.

First chance to observe the workings of the Meeting under the roof of its new landlord came in Los Angeles, and some two thousand five hundred Los Angelans crowded the Philharmonic Auditorium to listen, participate and check on the possible changes in policy.

Mr. Denny immediately made it quite clear the Meeting would continue as it has always done, and the new sponsor would exert no influence over the choice of subjects,

speakers or material. The subject bore him out: "Should We Join a World Force Which May Require Us to Enforce its Decisions?" The speakers were Miss Vera Deane, research director of the Foreign Relations Association, and Senator Joseph Ball of Minnesota, for the affirmative, and Senator Burton K. Wheeler of Montana and Attorney Joseph Scott of Los Angeles, for the negative. The material, pro and con, soon had the openly-partisan audience squirming in their seats, impatient for the chance to pop questions.

"Town Meeting" is unique among radio programs in permitting broadcast needling of the speakers by members of the audience. A lesser moderator than George Denny might find himself in plenty of hot water, as every variety of amateur debater, many brilliant, some just crackpot, crowds in for the final argument. Mr. Denny takes them in stride.

"That lady over there," he points calmly, expertly singling out a neat, elderly woman from a swarm of waving hands. "Will you read your question, please?" (Before the war everyone was privileged to ask what he pleased, but now, because of the danger of messages to the enemy through coded questions, all questions have to be submitted in advance on cards for quizzing by an assistant moderator roving the aisles).

Intelligence and Zeal

Denny likes to choose those audience-participants who indicate a nice balance between intelligence and fiery zeal. Among those who were permitted questions at the Los Angeles gathering were a WAC lieutenant, a housewife, an elderly businessman and a 20-year-old on crutches.

Well down in front sat fifty special guests—wounded war veterans from Birmingham Hospital, who took a lively interest in the program. All were members of a weekly Birmingham Town Meeting, modeled after the air program.

Senator Wheeler caught most of the fireworks from a patently pro-World Court audience. The Senator maintained his good humor through most of the questions, though his answers grew short and the back of his neck ruddied at some of the more vociferous hecklers. A direct give-and-take was restricted because both affirmative speakers had to cut in from Washington, D.C. for arguments over three thousand miles of telephone wire.

Uses Black-White Ball

Just to keep things moving on a fairly even keel, Mr. Denny kept his black-and-white ball in plain sight on the table. Mr. Denny's two-colored ball is becoming as well known in radio as Jack Benny's fiddle. He uses

it to illustrate graphically that there are two sides to every question. Holding it to the audience, black side out, he inquires: "What color is this ball?"

Someone calls out "Black," which is Mr. Denny's cue. "Not from this side," he answers, and slowly turns the ball in his hand, uncovering the white half to the audience. "That's the way it is with all questions," he continues. "You have to know both sides before you can judge properly, and that's what we try to offer on Town Meeting. You will probably not agree with half the speakers, but remember there are others perhaps sitting next to you who do.

"And by the way," Mr. Denny likes to get this in before every meeting, "don't boo or hiss the speakers. It's un-American, and there's only one critter that hisses, you know."

With that parting thought, Moderator Denny calls his Meeting to what he hopes will not be too much order.

Nearly 10 Years Old

Denny has been doing that every week since May 30, 1935, when his first program went out over the BLUE Network to 18 stations. His opening program had a lively subject: "Which Way America — Fascism, Communism, Socialism or Democracy?" and his speakers show how far America has traveled since those days. Arguing for the Fascist side was Lawrence Dennis, who went on trial in Washington not long ago for sedition.

The meeting's 18 stations have grown to 170 in 10 years, still over the BLUE. The questions have run into the hundreds, with practically every national figure a speaker one or more times. Antagonists have become choleric, fists have waved, but no Meeting has ever broken up in a brawl, and only half a dozen or so listeners have ever been removed to keep order.

For the air's most expert tight-rope walking act, you can credit George V. Denny Jr. who is devoting his life to bringing America the truth, but who knows that people only listen to the truth when it is presented as fascinatingly as fiction.

KMPC he was organist on station WWJ in Detroit, and before that he was for years one of the top-notch theater organists in the East.

Improvises

An accomplished composer as well as a musician, Merle delights in improvising on the "Stump Us" program. Often he asks a member of the audience to make up a song title, then he immediately composes a piece of music to go with it. Another of his accomplishments is to take a telephone number, assign musical notes to the numerals and improvise a piece from that. It's all a push-over for him.

The after-show which follows

"Stump Us" on Thursday mornings is as much fun, if not more, than the show that goes on the air. It's then that Merle shows off his musicianship to a greater degree, plays several selections entirely through (on the air he plays only eight bars of each request), and tries to stump the audience with a medley—a reversal of the rest of the show, when the audience tries to stump him. Participants let down their hair and behave excitedly, insist their requests be heard. Some confident souls even come prepared with sheet music—they're so sure he won't know their numbers!

joined a circus. "It was exciting at first," he related to us, "but it was a hard life, too, and I soon got tired of it." Leaving life under the big top, he became one-half of an act called "Stutter n' Whine," a colored comedy duo which inspired him to create his "Johnson Family."

His greatest fear when he first presented the latter show was that he would sound like one man making an attempt to sound like several people. So he delivered his dialogue (and still does) at a speed that baffles his listeners into believing that it couldn't possibly be one man alone doing all the dialogue. He told us that he writes the dialogue with an ear for a balanced rhythm, much as a composer does a melody.

Scripts Are Fresh

Although he usually keeps an outline of the general plot several weeks in advance, Scribner writes each script on the very day it is to be broadcast. On some occasions, he even ad-libs a portion of the dialogue on the air. Because he has been doing the show for so many years, he finds no difficulty in timing his program or in keeping track of his many voices.

"In fact," he told us, "I've found that I've done the 'Wedding of Lucy and PeeWee' episode on the stage so often, that I can do it subconsciously, with my mind a million miles away." When he has a cold, he finds "mama" and "Lucy's" voices difficult to do, and "Gorilla Joe's" easy.

"The Johnson Family," which now originates in Cincinnati, Ohio, is not ordinarily presented before an audience, although onlookers are admitted upon request. At the microphone, Scribner airs his show while seated in a chair with his script on a music stand beside him.

To write the show, he shuts himself away from interruptions in a secluded room where he dashes off each script on a typewriter in the record time of two hours. "The most difficult part of my program to write," Scribner explained, "is the 'Papa Johnson Says' feature at the beginning of the show. I wish I hadn't started that!"

In real life, Scribner is short, dark,

and of rather stocky build. He resembles a busy business-man. His recent theater engagement in Los Angeles was his first trip to this part of the country; now, he is hoping to bring his show to the west coast. California would also give him a better opportunity to follow his favorite off-mike pursuits—fishing and swimming.

Jimmy Scribner is married to a non-professional and they have two small children — a six-year-old daughter and a five-months-old son. His little daughter, Gail Lee, works with him on a radio show aired for local Ohio audiences. Entitled "Uncle Nappy," it may be released more widely via transcriptions in the near future.

On it, Scribner, in the role of "Uncle Nappy," tells stories to his small daughter, whose spontaneous, unrehearsed reactions provide novel entertainment for listeners. "I think she's wonderful," exclaimed Jimmy proudly.

"She sure keeps me on my toes, too," he laughed. "I have to know all the answers!"

Meanwhile, out front, Penny and the emcee were carrying on with some fast ad-libbing.

"Well," smiled the emcee, looking uneasily toward the stage entrance, "it looks as though Dagwood is staying out in the kitchen with the strawberry shortcake."

"If you ask me," retorted Penny, looking equally uneasily toward the stage entrance, "I'm beginning to think he's out there with a strawberry blonde!"

script. He works on "I Love a Mystery" five days a week, writes his "One Man's Family" on the remaining two days. He keeps the former some ten days in advance, pens the latter from week to week.

By 9:15 a.m. he has finished his "Mystery" script (Morse maintains that his mind doesn't dwell on his writing tasks until seated at his typewriter. Then, when the inspiration strikes, he works rapidly and finishes each script in record time.). When his early-morning writing chores have been done, Morse, usually accompanied by Buddy Twiss, goes out for a cup of coffee and a glazed doughnut.

At 9:30 or so, he returns to the office to attend to the many tasks that are a radio producer's lot. "I find my secretary awaiting me," smiled Morse, "with stacks of mail and memos, and reminders of appointments I've forgotten to keep." He spends the late morning hours doing such chores as dictating letters, calling actors, arranging for auditions, and clearing studios for his use.

At noon, he leaves for lunch, often with Twiss, Walter Bunker of Young and Rubicam and John Swallow, who join him in a game of gin rummy. "We've been playing together for several years," Morse laughed, "and in that time, Buddy has won about one dollar and thirty-five cents!"

Relaxes

From 1:30 to 2:30, the writer takes refuge in his office to stretch out on the couch and relax—"if I'm lucky," he adds. Then, at 2:30, he heads for the CBS studios to oversee the afternoon rehearsal of his "Mystery" show. At four p.m., the eastern broadcast is aired, after which the writer-producer joins his cast members for a roundtable session at Brittingham's to talk over the show and discuss any changes that should be made before the repeat broadcast at night.

"Then," related Morse, "I get home in time to kiss my wife before dinner." He remains at home to listen to the west coast airing of his "Mystery" show, in order to get the listener's perspective on it. "Before broadcast time," he told us, "we manage a few moments of relaxation to walk the dogs in the patio. But about a half-hour after we've heard the show, Morse is 'pounding his ear!'"

"P. S.," added Morse at this point, "this schedule is not good for your social standing, for your nerves, your stomach ulcers, your own and your wife's dispositions, nor is it the way to live long and happily."

"But," he laughed then, "it's typically Hollywood!"
