mistake of playing one game which led to five hundred. They haven't gotten over it yet—because Prindle won two-hundred-and-fifty and Niles won two-hundred-and-fifty.

The only time they don't argue is when they are in the sun. Niles tans but Prindle burns—and so they can't stay together.

The only thing they don't argue about is religion. Says Niles, "We stay away from religion — Prindle stays away from church."

Radio's newest team of gagsters is tickling America's funny bone with the above mentioned competitive spirit. Since their first meeting some twelve years ago they've been ribbing one another. They haven't stopped—they've just acquired a bigger audience.

First Impression

"So you want to know what my first impression of Niles was, eh?" said Prindle. Carefully looking around, he leaned forward and with his hand to his mouth, answered, "I thought he was a big jerk and still do."

But the "Madam and Serge" were shortlived because in 1935 Prindle came to Hollywood to write the Joe Penner show. Niles joined shortly after—"He was a big help," grunted Prindle, "all he did was sleep through the writing sessions."

From there each went his own way, with Prindle becoming one of radio's top gag writers and Niles one of its top announcers. They never gave up hope of having a show of their own. After what they term three "false starts," Niles and Prindle are off at last—in spite of the fact that they're still arguing over who's playing straight man.

"Listen brother, I gave up voluntarily," retorted Niles.

In more agreeable moments, the "mutual irritation society" of Niles and Prindle has a gay time out on the golf course or tennis court. They took up horseback riding but had to give it up when Prindle's horse began losing weight.

When they talk of their hunting expeditions their eyes gleam. Says Niles, "We're trying to make Prindle as manly as possible." A couple of sports enthusiasts from 'way back, they like nothing better than a quick jaunt to Mexico or to their own California ranch.

Niles likes to tell the story about the time Prindle got a little confused and shot his own car. Prindle, it seems, will never live that down. "Yes," solemnly nods Don, "I think you might say Wendell is the better hunter."

In retaliation, Prindle tells about his only time in the air with Niles at the stick. "Uh huh, I've never been up with him since I looked out the window and saw the ducks were flying upside down!"

ON THANKSGIVING DAY, 1944, "Maxwell House" was freighted with its customary resplendent talent—Frank Morgan, Robert Young, Cass Daley, Carlos Ramirez, Eric Blore, Harlow Wilcox—AND a tall, distinguished-looking gentleman who had a very significant part in the script.

At a given cue while the other cast members looked on in envy and amusement, the tall strode up to the mike, settled his broad shoulders and 190 pounds, distended his mouth, AND gobbled like a turkey!

"The pay-off," remarked Bob Bence in speaking of his role, "was that I hadn't had my own Thanksgiving dinner when I gobbled."

But those cognizant of Bence's extensive radio experience and versatile ability know he required no succulent slabs of white meat to produce a realistic gobble. Those who have admired Bob's air activities since 1927 recognize in him a clever thespian, a trigger-quick emcee, and a sonorous announcer. San Francisco benefited by his talents for seventeen of those years. Five months ago Bob finally weakened to the "when you coming down?" queries of his radio pals and moved to Hollywood, where his ad-lib tongue keeps "Rise and Shine" a lively sunrise feature on KHJ and where his animal imitations pull guffaws on many a show. Lately he played a dog on Fanny Brice's program and a horse on "Glamor Manor."

Alcatraz Effect

His sound effects are not limited to fauna. Once in the North he was asked if he could duplicate the wailing siren on Alcatraz. "If you want to pay for it, I'll do it," promptly

responded Bence, who achieved the desired effect by covering a piano with canvas, placing a microphone near the strings, clamping his feet on the loud pedal, and himself giving forth with waves of direful hoots.

Bob, who calls himself a "great putterer," is constantly rigging up some unique effect. One of these was a bazooka-type instrument consisting of a length of gas pipe, piece of garden hose, and a radio horn speaker into which he hummed. It was meant to be funny, but he wasn't off the air five minutes before one of his buddies telephoned to exclaim: "I didn't know you could play the trombone!"

"Neither did I" responded Bence. "Wasn't it funny?"

"Heck no!" protested his friend, "It was too good to be funny."

Currently, Bence is working on a one-string violin proposition which he plays like a cello. "They call me 'The Maggle' because I'm always tinkering. I pick up every nut, bolt, and piece of string I see. It always

comes in handy. When anyone wants anything, they tell him to see Bob Bence. I even have handcuffs. Yes, once I locked a man in handcuffs and then discovered I didn't have the key."

That Was It!

And a few months ago he was on the air with "Quiz of Two Cities" before he realized that he had the script for next week's show. "Well," Bob informed his studio and air audience, "there comes a time in every emcee's life and I guess this is it for me. I've got the wrong script and it'll be five minutes before the right one arrives. So we'll just go ahead anyway. The ensuing three hundred seconds were tops in ad-lib brilliance and show merriment.

For Bence is a veteran. Way back in 1927 he ran the "Who Cares?" hour every afternoon on KPO. It was all improvised—no rehearsal, not even the piano. Those were the callow days of radio when an audience response of six or eight telegrams was indicative of colossal success and when the performers' pay was coffee cake and sandwiches after the show.

Becoming an announcer at KPO, he instituted his role of Professor Bob of the morning exercises. "And not from an armchair," he points out emphatically. There followed parts on those well-known favorites,

New Quiz Show Requires Minimum of Knowledge, Offers Maximum of Fun

WE SPENT an enjoyable hour with Sid Singer and Jack Bailey one recent afternoon, chatting about their popular CBS quiz show, "Money on the Line."

Sid Singer, writer-originator of the program, says that he literally "dreamed up" the novel show. The scripter keeps an "idea book" beside his bed. He had long been trying to think of a new type of quiz program that wouldn't demand academic knowledge. "I figured people are getting tired of so many brain-teasing quizzes," smiled Singer.

Then, one night after he had gone to bed, the thought struck him that almost everybody, at one time or another during his life, has the urge to write a song. He made an entry in his "idea book." In the morning, it took him just three hours to prepare the entire audition script for "Money on the Line"—a quiz show

◀ **1200 LETTERS A WEEK** are received by the program's writer-originator, Sid Singer, who finds an average of three limericks enclosed in every letter. Here, he and emcee, Jack Bailey, look over amusing entry that contained a total of 192 verses!

◀ **CONTESTANTS ARE CHOSEN** from the studio audience just fifteen minutes before airtime. They are interviewed by Jack Bailey, then try to guess rhyming song titles. Sometimes, they have hidden talents and are persuaded to perform.

that simply asks participants to supply a popularly-accepted song title as the last line to limericks sent in by listeners.

Sample Doggerel

Now, after six months of airing, the popularity of the program has proved his point. Singer receives some 1200 letters a week, with an average of three verses in every letter. (One letter contained one hundred and ninety-two limericks!)

Some of the prize-winning rhymes are these:

A certain pen is advertised
With copy very clever.
But just suppose that pen should break

On the *Day After Forever*.

Paul Bunyan once picked up a cow
As if she weighed an ounce,
And threw her high into the air
Then watched that *Jersey Bounce*

There was a little songbird
Whose throat one day went wrong
They took his little tonsils out
Now he's *Without A Song*

Ever since I swallowed some soap
My friends all call me a dope
And you can bet I'm having troubles
For I'm *Forever Blowing Bubbles*

When Willie Hill
Eats his fill
The waiter will
Give Hill the *Bill*

It takes Singer four days to read a week's entries. The ones used on the show are selected by an editorial board. The senders receive cash prizes, duplicates to those awarded to the studio contestants who supply the correct last lines. When a contestant misses, the listener who sent in the limerick receives a double amount of money.

Singer has found that seventy-five percent of the listeners who send in limericks are women, fifteen percent are men, ten percent, children. It seems, also, that women write their limericks around the most romantic titles, whereas men will just choose any title in order to write a humorous verse.

How Show Runs

Contestants chosen from the studio audience (fifteen minutes before airtime) to guess the rhyming song titles are interviewed on the air by the show's genial emcee, Jack Bailey. "Actually," Singer said, "the limerick quiz is just a gimmick on

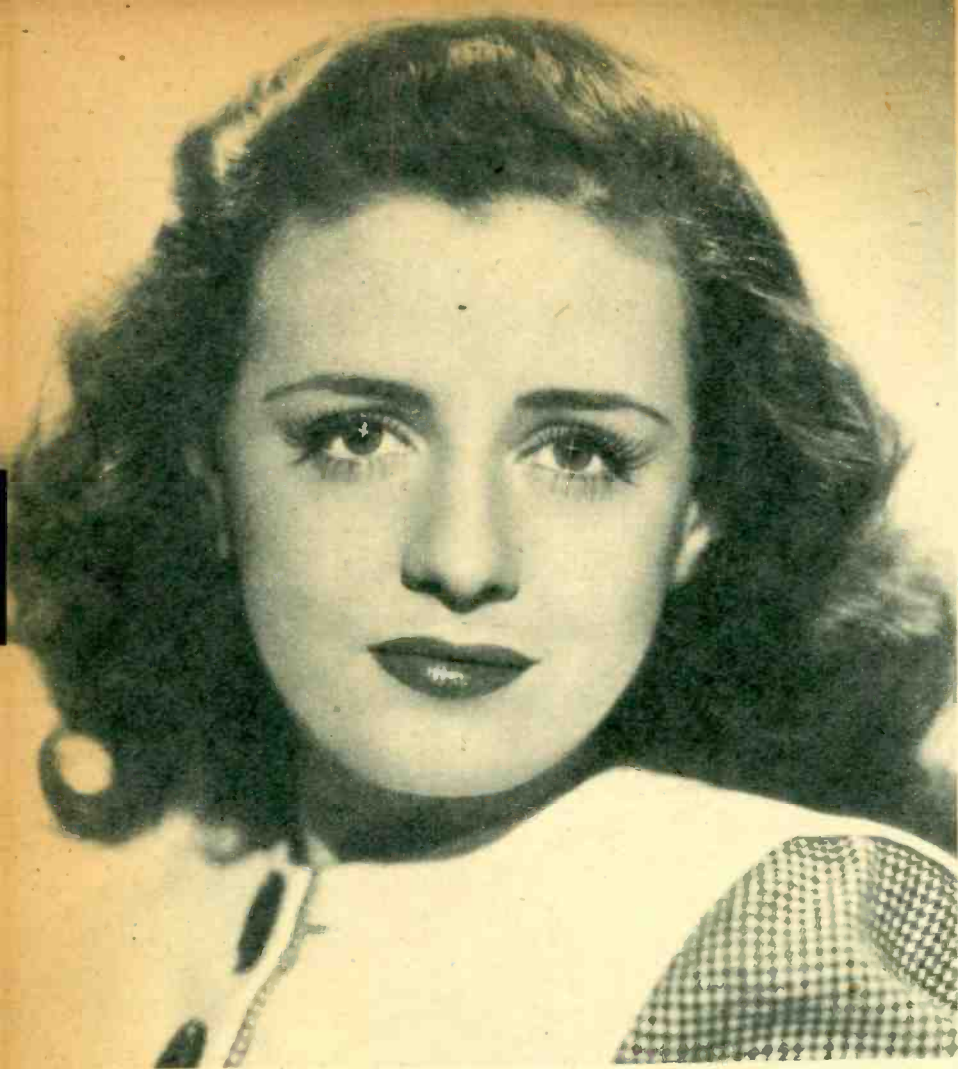

Bence has lived in California all his life. He was born at Bijou, on the shores of Lake Tahoe. His father mined with Marshall and Marshall gave him his gold scales and shot gun which are now in the museum at Sutter's Fort. The Bence family used to own and live in Carey House,—an adobe with iron window shutters—which was the original bank in Placerville.

Luckily for him, and his tall, brunette wife, Lillian, the Bences found a small bungalow reasonably close to KHJ. He averages five hours sleep nightly. "I'd like eight," he observed pensively. food, smart clothes, and a well-planned social life. Mrs. Bence is an expert cook, especially with Italian dishes which her family has handed down. Bob usually buys blue or gray suits which accentuate his hazel eyes. "I go for yellow ties, too. Wow!" he burst out. "Don't ask me my age," he spouted on. "I won't give it to you. But I have the mentality of a seventeen-year-old. Whoopee!" he concluded.

He's glad he moved to Hollywood and is wondering about supplementing his air chores with movies. He's been told a thousand times that he'd be swell in the flickers, but so far nothing has happened. Albeit, he's happy with his early morning show, because its ad-lib nature allows so much fun and freedom. . . . in fact the "Running Wild" theme song of the program neatly sums up Bob's role and the show. Right now he is working on two radio ideas of his own.

But his knack for creating sound effects and characters should not be forgotten. He has stood in front of zoo cages for hours on end studying the animals. So it's inevitable that he took it as a compliment when a script called for the sound of monkeys and the sound effects man protested: "But we have no monkeys or recordings of monkeys." And the producer shot back!

which to hang these interviews that are the most entertaining part of the program." Sometimes, the contestants perform.

But the contestants who find it difficult to supply the winning last lines shouldn't be awed by Bailey's glib tongue. He readily admits that he wouldn't know the answers himself if he didn't have a script.

"We sometimes play the game in the conference room before the show," Jack told us, "and I never guess right!"
