*Lionel Barrymore Is Known for His Caustic Verbal Explosions, But He's a Softie at Heart, Has a Liking for Sweaters, Bright Bow Ties, Cats and His Program Co-Workers*

ly any improvement that may be made in his delivery, timing or interpretation.

"Lionel is one of a mere handful of inherently great actors who possess an overwhelmingly magnetic charm and compelling power, a projection of personality exceedingly difficult to suppress.

"Restraint is the most admirable quality in an actor's work today," Mr. Entrikin went on to explain, "and for Lionel, it is a tremendous achievement. He must force himself to use restraint. He has such nervous and physical intensity. He could certainly never be colorless.

"I frequently instruct, 'Gentle' this, Lionel. Don't punch it"

Regarding radio, Mr. Entrikin ex-

plained that his star greatly appreciates being in such close touch with such a vast audience. He also likes the sense of reality which he knows the listener feels so strongly through this medium.

"As for Lionel, personally," the producer commented, "after talking to him for just a few minutes, one receives the impression that he is giving a good impersonation of a small-town big-man. That is his intention. But, a more lengthy discussion reveals how erudite the man is. He knows so much about so many things."

The great actor has an inexhaustible knowledge of the theater, of literature, music and sports, and avidly enjoys lengthy, detailed discussions of these subjects. He quotes from memory the works of great writers, describes with great delight sports figures and events of the past, proudly recalls the time that the great John L. Sullivan sparred with him and knocked him down.

Of Dickens' "Christmas Carol," which he enacts annually for radio's Yuletide audience, he declares, "Everyone on God's earth knows it by heart." Everyone doesn't, surely, but Mr. Barrymore does, and he is instantly aware if the wording of the famed classic has been changed in the slightest way.

Once, when producer Entrikin gave Lionel his cue during a rehearsal by quoting a passage from Shakespeare, the actor promptly continued the speech, eloquently rendering the entire lengthy quotation. When he had finished, an awed onlooker asked, "What was that, Mr. Barrymore?"

"Oh," spouted the actor drily, the familiar mischievous twinkle flickering in his eyes, "just a little something our Mr. Entrikin dreamed up."

Once, when asked how to be a movie star, Barrymore answered, "Just be there at eight in the morning."

In pictures, Mr. Barrymore points out that an actor can always inject visible mannerisms and the like to enhance his performance, but in radio, he maintains, "An actor is no better than his script." He has great admiration for the work of Howard Breslin and Charles Tazwell, who alternately write the scripts of his "Mayor of the Town" series. He also greatly respects the work of Agnes Moorehead and Conrad Binyon, who appear on the program with him weekly.

There is an honest affection among the three performers. Lionel and Conrad oftentimes "kid" Miss Moorehead about her clothes—lavish hats and chic-tailored suits with striking accessories, and she, in turn, fusses over Mr. Barrymore, brushing off his suit and smoothing his hair, before the studio curtains part to herald the start of the show's airing. Little Gloria MacMillan, who plays

wordage of two full-length novels. For ten years he's averaged 1,500,000 words. To reread over the air all the items Doyle has spieled during his career would require more than 58 days straight talking 24 hours a day!



### Modern Gardening

Commentator Upton Close can be described as a real enthusiast where victory gardening is concerned, but he can hardly be classed as an orthodox gardener for in the "hydroponics" garden of Close the vegetables grow in water.

The hydroponic system of growing plants discovered by Professor W. F. Gericke a few years ago is one whereby vegetables can be grown in tanks of water instead of in the soil. A water-filled tank contains chemicals that are the counterpart of those elements promoting the growth of plants found in the soil. Over the tank a wire mesh covered with shavings or peat moss provides a seed bed for the vegetables. As the seeds sprout, the plants send roots down into the water where they receive their nourishment from the chemical-laden liquid.

With this food the plants grow as they would in ordinary soil, but according to newsman Close, with greater advantage. Close maintains the desirable chemical mixture for best plant growth is easily obtainable in water, whereas the proper proportions are more difficult to provide in a soil mixture. The newsman says, too, that the vegetables he garners from his water garden are greater in size than the average, and have a greater food value, high in vitamin content.

Besides that, produce yielded by a small water trough garden is twenty times greater than that from the same area of ground. And, to top it all off, there's no back-breaking digging in the dirt, in a hydroponics garden!

Alice is a tall (five feet, seven) willowy blonde with fair skin and gray eyes that turn blue "when I get mad or wear blue." Her full name is Alice Dorothy Margaret Frost Tuttle. It's an old Swedish custom.

She doesn't like to shop. "I'd love to be able to order anything I need in the way of clothes, right from my own home." But she does like to browse in antique shops.

She doesn't like to wear hats, but has to wear them because her hair is too soft and blows about too much. In 1941, she was named the best dressed woman in radio.

She prefers sport clothes, simple well-fitting dressmaker suits and dresses, and evening clothes; she turns thumbs down on dressy afternoon things, and beading, braid or fringe. Her favorite colors are blue, black, tan, gray, chartreuse and white.

Around the house, she dons pinafores; in the country, slacks.

### Fanny Cooks, Scolds

She employs "a wonderful housekeeper called Fanny." "Fanny," the actress went on, "keeps her 'children' with properly balanced meals and scolds us if we work too hard."

Alice cooks—"only if I'm forced to, but I've become a proficient sandwich-maker because Bill loves sandwiches. No, he has no culinary accomplishments—but *definitely* not!"

Ginny, her face sunburned from days spent at the farm, talked with glowing enthusiasm about her home in the country. "I wish I were there right now," she grinned, as we chatted with her during rehearsals for her NBC air show.

When Ginny is at the farm, she divides her time between the kitchen and outdoors. She does farm chores "for fun"—riding the tractor, tending to the cattle and the chickens. Recently, she painted the outdoor furniture.

She loves to work in the kitchen (whips up a creamy batch of chocolate fudge, but really cooks, besides). She doesn't like housework, however. "She'll do it, though, when she has to" smiled her mother, as she joined us in the star's dressing room.

For recreation at the farm, Ginny enjoys outdoor parties, hayrides, picnics, and swimming in her pool. She loves to have company, is talkative at times, but more customarily quiet.

#### Good Appetite

She has a hearty appetite, with a

After that, her off-day schedule customarily reads: 11:00 a.m., shopping; 1:00 p.m., luncheon; 3:00 p.m., voice; 4:00 p.m., interview.

Ginny enjoys shopping ("at times," put in Mrs. Simms), but is a last-minute Christmas shopper, and is always adding extra names to her list.

The star is fastidious about her wardrobe, seldom leaves clothes lying around, ("when she does, it's mother who picks them up!"); Ginny can't sew and envies those who can. versation. Morgan made the comment that the popular emcee should have another radio program. "One that would involve even more interviews than 'What's the Name of That Song?'," he said. "One that could be on the air every day."

Raisbeck agreed, and so did Dud. Then, to spur the thought, Dud began recalling an interview series he'd done years ago, when he took a microphone to a busy corner in a big city, and asked women passing

by to tell him the things most important to them that very minute. "And nearly every woman," Dud commented, "had some wish on the top of her mind. Which gave us a swell chance to talk about what she'd do if—"

#### Bring Wishes True

Right in the middle of that sentence Morgan stopped Dud. "That's our program. Let's give women some of their wishes, and have some

real fun on the air." And so, "Queen For A Day" was born.

As simple as its beginning is the format of "Queen For A Day," yet it's one of the most elaborate programs on the air, from the participants' point of view. Featuring interviews with studio guests by Williamson, the program is climaxed when a "Queen" is chosen from among those interviewed, after a vote by the audience. The "Queen" is seated

Jay came to Hollywood to try for a break in West Coast radio. Before six days had gone by, Jay had become a CBS staff announcer. His first show was (you guessed it) a woman's program—"Your Charm Coach" with Eleanor King.

#### Originated Program

In the meantime, Beverly gave birth to a show idea and sold it to CBS. It was the still-popular "Open House," which she wrote and emceed for several years, with Jay doing the announcing.

Currently, Jay Stewart is doing a total of twenty-five shows a week—fifteen of them, women's programs. His schedule includes the five-times-weekly "Potluck Party," "Meet the Missus," "Rosemary" and "Through a Woman's Eyes," Friday's "Money on the line," and Saturday's "Welcome Home," "That's a Good Idea," "Hollywood Barn Dance" and the "MGM News."

Until recently, Beverly was also still active on radio row, doing dramatic stunts and commercial assignments on such shows as "Mayor of the Town," "Cavalcade of America,"

"The Saint" and "Sherlock Holmes." But now, both Beverly and Jay are beaming over the biggest event in their busy lives—a feminine blessed event who will probably be called Jamie Fix. Fix is Jay's real surname; some day, he would like to resume using it on the air.

Jay Stewart started his air career in September of 1939 when he became a staff member of station WBOW, Terre Haute, Indiana. He was there for nine months, during which he was fired three times—the last time for good.

From there he went to WLW-WSAI, in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he stayed until February of 1941, when he went into the Army. He served for nine months in the infantry at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, then received a medical discharge and returned to his radio work at the Cincinnati stations—and to his meeting at the microphone with Beverly Barnes.

They were married at Beverly's home in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, had a seven-day honeymoon. They spent two of the days at Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, the remaining five in Chicago job-hunting. At the end of the week, they returned to the Cincinnati microphone, did an early-morning record and chatter show billed as "radio's most newly-married couple." It was an informal little program on which they chatted with the listeners about the problems of home-making.

During the next twenty-four hours, the "Queen" is squired about the city of New York, where Williamson now makes his headquarters, in a fashion that would make any member of royalty truly envious. A royal suite in one of the finest hotels in New York is given to the "Queen," and "Her Majesty" is guest of honor at the most popular shows and night clubs on Broadway. Film, stage and radio stars are her companions at teas, dinners and midnight suppers, while the courtiers and stylists of Gotham see that her clothes are the finest, and her jewels as fabulous as any royal gems.

In order to expand the privileges of royalty, Williamson has worked out a plan for appointing a "Queen For A Day" in other parts of the country. This honorary "Queen" receives a royal gift from Williamson and a duplicate of the silver sceptre awarded to the reigning "Queen."

Listeners to "Queen For A Day" are invited to take part in a joke duel carried on by two members of the program's audience. These two women, chosen from the studio, are dependent on jokes sent in by the listening audience for their stories and that's why they really comb the program's fan mail while waiting to begin their duel.

### Bob Bence Shares

The success of "Queen For A Day" is shared by Williamson with Bob Spence, another West Coast radio man who went east with Williamson when the program and "What's the Name of That Song?" were set for New York origination. Bob plays the role of a sort of "Major Domo" for Williamson, just as in "What's the Name of That Song?" he is a foil for the emcee. And of course, the success of "Queen For A Day" is a tribute to the judgment of "Radio Life" readers, who last year named Dud Williamson one of the West Coast radio men most likely to succeed with a nationwide program. Dud did that first with his musical quiz, "What's the Name of That Song?" and now, he's doing it every day, Monday through Friday, with his new and exceptionally popular "Queen For A Day."
