What Makes Connie Click"

AS YOU RECALL, Radio Life once published an article entitled "Twenty Minutes With Nelson Eddy." This is a story about ten minutes with Constance Bennett, who is, without a doubt, the busiest woman on radio.

When Miss Bennett (Constance not Connie to her friends) added radio to her ever-increasing list of activities last May, the aforementioned friends held their heads and gasped. With the C.B. Independent Film Productions, were already the Constance Bennett Cosmetics, Constance Bennett Frocks (debuting this month), and always La Bennett, the actress, with one or more pictures up her sleeve. How would radio fit in? That we wanted to know, too.

Descending upon the chic blonde actress at her beach-front home late one afternoon, we viewed Constance in action. We had learned beforehand that in addition to being a paragon of svelte sophistication, she was a dynamo of energy. She was never too busy for her charming family of three, nor was she ever too exhausted to listen to a good idea.

In Adrian Suit

Miss Bennett greeted us with a warm, firm handshake. She was strikingly garbed in a beige Adrian suit with matching alligator pumps. Atop her head was perched a brown chiffon-lace handkerchief—"Haven't even had time to take it off." She was wearing horn-rimmed dark glasses and puffing on an ebony cigarette holder. And she was in the midst of a business conference.

Apologizing in her deep throaty voice for the delay, she graciously

ushered us onto her sundeck, where she vigorously attacked several sandy chairs with a huge brush, at the same time berating son, Peter, for falling to keep them clean. Close on her heels came Gladys Young, secretary and companion for the past fifteen years, and two French poodles, Prancer and his bride, Miss Prue.

Chatting with Gladys, we learned that Miss Bennett lacks fear, is outspoken, possesses that wonderful ability of being able to laugh at herself, is a lady of indomitable will and independence, and a very understanding mother.

Daughters, Linda and Gyl were away that afternoon attending dancing school. But Gladys regaled us with tales of their devotion for their mother. How they spent hours playing together and how the role of Constance as a glamor girl is utterly foreign to them. First and foremost in her life are her children.

Like Fifteen Years

At last joining us, the star launched into words of praise for radio. "I've been trying," she explained with her deep laugh, "to get into radio for years. But nobody would have me. Until one day the idea of a five-time a week, commentary was hit upon. That's a cinch, I said to myself. But, oh," she

Mementoes Of *The* **Ziegfeld Girl** By Emily Howard

AS PROBABLY one of the busiest stars in the radio business, with two radio programs and a recently completed movie, Billie Burke none-the-less lives a very quiet life tucked away in the hills of Brentwood. But she has often said that she might have been wiser to move into a museum instead of a house because she has such a vast collection of things.

Miss Burke claims that she began as a child collecting things—like her father's old watch-chain, empty perfume bottles belonging to her grandmother — trinkets that happened to catch her fancy. "And I like to have the things I collect around me as a part of my house furnishing," says the blonde star.

Her upstairs living room is the most interesting place in the house, because it contains many of her most prized possessions. The contents of the curio cabinet is almost like a diary. There are two white lace fans, one of which dates back to her formal debut as an actress in the musical comedy, "The School Girl," at the Prince of Wales Theatre in London in 1903. The other fan, studded with rhinestones, was the

During his sojourn on the Coast, Corwin wrote, directed and produced three special programs which won nation-wide acclaim and which commemorated three of the greatest events in modern history. His "Fourteen August" was aired immediately after confirmation of the Japanese surrender, and "God and Uranium" was broadcast by Columbia on the national day of prayer.

Les Mawhinney, special events and new director for the Don Lee Broadcasting System accepted the award in the name of the correspondent at ceremonies held at the night-fighter base, where a P-61 Northrop Black Widow Night Fighter, "The Fourth Estate," was dedicated to the war correspondents who were killed in bringing the story of the war to the newspaper, magazine and radio audiences of the nation.

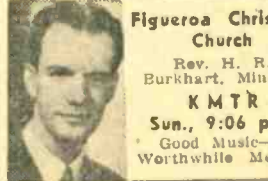

For another, it brought into her life the blond young southerner, Scotty Wise-man, who was to become her husband,

and partner and collaborator in collecting and publishing songs from the American hills. So who's to say it isn't a good luck symbol?

"Stuffy" Norman

Gene Norman, voice of "Mild and Mellow" over KHJ, has earned his title "Stuffy." "Stuffy" Norman didn't achieve his nickname through the use of white shirts and black bow ties—he prefers sport clothes. Neither does "Stuffy" bore his audiences with long dissertations, in fact his show boasts no commercials at all. Why the "Stuffy"? Well, in his younger days (he's only twenty-two now) Gene did a bit of college work at Wisconsin University and the University of California at Berkeley and has two degrees to show for it—so naturally, a bookworm like that was bound to be "Stuffy."

"I'm sold on radio. The broadcast itself fascinates me, I enjoy talking with the listeners, and I love receiving letters from them."

Miss Bennett, herself, does much of the writing and decides what she will talk about. She now has her five days categorized and finds this the simplest and most interesting procedure. She is as capable, at discussing current affairs as she is the problems of children.

She eagerly welcomes constructive suggestions and criticism. Her co-workers are very fond of her, and it looks as if the fabulous Bennett has taken radio, as everything else, in her stride.

If she were superstitious, she might look upon this month of September as a most auspicious one. Her first independent production (and one in which she stars) "Paris Underground" is to be released. Her frock firm debuts and she, herself, starts a new picture for Twentieth Century-Fox.

She isn't wary of it. Quite the contrary; she naturally looks upon it with a sense of mingled excitement and hard work. She follows no schedules, but every duty is quietly disposed of on time. WHEN LUX Radio Theater went on the air, Monday, August 27, beginning its eleventh year of dramatic one-hour shows, the only "Green Room" in Hollywood once again became the scene of frenzied attempts on the part of players to keep the jitters from making them tongue-tied.

Hollywood's Radio Row has one "Green Room" only, among its many buildings. This is located in the Lux Radio Theater on Vine Street, and each Monday when the Lux program goes on the air, it becomes the scene of so much excitement, so many

Everything connected with the show happens in this room, draped solidly with beige monk's cloth, its furniture upholstered in pale char-

treuse. Here, scripts are re-written; producers, directors and writers go into huddles, emerging with blood in their eyes and secretaries at their elbows. Here, players jab at their lines with stiletto-like pencils, while Dorothy Lamour balks at some such sentence as "Stalking through the shimmering sunshine," which she insists causes her to hiss. Photographers with flash bulbs catch everybody in candid camera poses and

press agents swarm around like bees encircling a Cape Jasmine bush.

An Institution

"The Green Room" has been an institution of the Theatrical profession since 1732, when the first one was built as part of Covent Garden Theatre in London, where it was also known as the "retiring room," shortened to "tiring" room by ladies of the theater of that day. It was

Record Shower

Newscaster Frank Hemingway's Plea For Corona Convalescents Answered By Deluge of Platters and Radios

Monday-Friday, 7:00 a. m.
KHJ—Don Lee

THANKS TO THE efforts of Frank Hemingway, there's no shortage of phonograph records at the U. S. Naval Hospital in Corona now.

And, thanks to that same fellow, Hemingway, who broadcasts the Breakfast News over KHJ-Don Lee Mondays through Fridays at 7:00 to 7:15 a. m. there'll soon be no shortage of bedside radios either.

For a recent Hemingway program broadcast an appeal to Southern California radio listeners for bedside radios to complete the work started for servicemen on another Hemingway broadcast last April. From the way the sets are pouring in to KHJ from generous donors, Hemingway is confident that there soon won't be a man in the hospital who can't listen to just what he wants to hear.

Last April, Ralph Ware, whom the boys call "Pop," informed Hemingway that phonograph records were

badly needed at the Corona Hospital. The boys had no bedside radios, nor could they get them, because the hospital wards were not wired for it. But they did have two record players, minus records. If Frank would only mention the urgent need on his "Breakfast News" program, maybe they could get some records.

Broke Record

Frank would, and did. And the result was not a few records . . . It was thousands. A doctor in El Cerrito wired \$50 fifteen minutes after hearing the broadcast, and later sent in one room-sized radio and two bedside radios for the boys' use. A history class in South Pasadena High School invited Hemingway to address the class, and paid him off in phonograph records. The day after the broadcast, KHJ received several packages, countless telephone calls and hundreds of letters with money, and for weeks afterward all Don Lee stations were swamped with calls and donations of records.

Celebrated motion picture stars, singers, violinists, pianists have foregathered here in an effort to pull themselves together before going on the air. In this room, Bob Hope has hurled some of his best and most telling insults at Bing Crosby, who has returned the compliment by tearing Hope apart with outrageous jibes and jeers. Here, Bing and Frank Sinatra have practiced duets together and laughed over the "feud" which is supposed to exist between them. Auditions have been held at the big desk with contestants for soap commercial honors drooping down the hall in despair or leaping like spring lambs to Mike Lyman's restaurant next door for a refresher to celebrate their luck.

Have Tea

British stars on the Lux program invariably call for tea, which has been served in the "Green Room" to such celebrities as: Merle Oberon, Ronald Coleman, Greer Garson, Nigel Bruce, Joan Fontaine, Cary Grant, Charles Laughton, John Loder, Herbert Marshall, Olivia DeHavilland, Basil Rathbone, Ida Lupino, Maureen O'Sullivan, Dame May Whitty, Brian Aherne and Raymond Massey. Continental players usually ask for coffee or chocolate, which the call boy hurries out to bring to Marlene Dietrich, Charles Boyer, Heddy Lamarr, Paul Henreid, Paul Lukas and Annabella.

American players sit around swapping lies and cigarettes (when they have them), ordering ice cream sodas from the corner drug store and generally enjoying themselves, while crowds out on the street clamor.

If the "Green Room" of Lux Radio Theater had kept a guest book for the past several years, it could be

auctioned off today for a considerable sum in a bond drive or for charitable purposes. Such a book would contain the signatures of almost every celebrity and star ever to appear in motion pictures.

The records were loaded into a truck and taken to the hospital, but what about the money? It came from school classes, labor union, employe and social groups, and already the hospital had so many records there was no need to buy more. What to do with it?

Hemingway got together with Captain Harold Jensen, commanding officer of the hospital, and put the problem up to him. "Why not use the cash to wire some of the T.B. wards for bedside radios?" Jensen suggested.

Electricians Help

The idea was great, but before Hemingway had a chance to act on it, C. A. Rector, business representative of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers came up with an offer. The IBEW has a "Victory Service" consisting of electricians and radio workers in the shipyards, and they offered to repair, free of charge, any radios which were donated. Hemingway told Rector about Captain Jensen's suggestion that the hospital be wired for individual bedside sets, and as a result, the union volunteered to do all of the work on evenings and Sundays. Not only that, but it also donated some of the necessary supplies.

So now, thanks to Frank Hemingway and the "Breakfast News," there's music in the air at the Corona Naval Hospital, and plenty of it!

Clock From Ince

Another milestone in her career is embodied in a small gold clock on which her name is engraved. It was given to her by Tom Ince, the producer of her first motion picture, "Peggy," of the silent picture days.

Since President Roosevelt made the day-of-the-cluttered desk so popular, Miss Burke is less hesitant to make excuses for her writing desk. It is literally covered with small snapshots in gold and silver frames. She has a special fondness for snapshots, but not in an album. "There is something grim about snapshots glued in a black photograph album. I much prefer them in individual settings where I can look at them when I please without pulling out a musty volume with pages loose."

Most of the snap-shots are of Florenz Ziegfeld, Miss Burke and their daughter, Patricia. In the den there is a group of pictures of Ziegfeld, the fisherman, who spent many vacations fishing off the coast of Florida and others of Ziegfeld, the hunter — he loved to hunt in the northern part of Canada where the family had a cabin. "We called it 'Whoopee'," Miss Burge explains, "because we always had so much fun there."

Included in her collections are many valuable items left to her by her late husband. Probably the most famous are eleven elephants, ranging in various sizes, of jade, rose quartz and onyx. They were gifts from friends on opening nights of the great producer's plays. The interesting thing about the collection is all of them have trunks with an upward sweep—with the exception of one, which was given to Ziegfeld by an old friend whose feelings he couldn't hurt by refusing to accept it. It meant good luck if the elephant's trunk was up.

Family Pictures

Miss Burke takes special pride in the family circle of pictures representing four generations which hang in her den. And in the way they tell the history of her family background.

There is a large center portrait of her grandmother, Cecilia Flood Beatty, who lived in New Orleans and who, along with Harriet Beecher Stowe, wrote articles against the South's treatment of negro slaves. According to Miss Burke, her grandmother was quite a fabulous woman, who commanded a great deal of respect in her time.

Included in the group is a slightly faded picture of her mother, Blanche Beatty Burke, who was also an alert and well-educated woman, but she broke the family ties when she married a circus clown, much against her mother's approval. After her marriage, she succeeded in persuading her husband, William E. Burke, to leave the circus and organize a vaudeville troupe, which he took to London.

Although Blanche Beatty Burke never became an actress in her own right, she was determined that her daughter should. For that reason, Billie Burke always knew that she would some day perform before the footlights. Miss Burke's daughter, Patricia Ziegfeld, on the other hand, passed up an acting career and took up writing instead, following in the footsteps of her great-grandmother. Before her marriage, Patricia wrote a column for Will Rogers Jr.'s Beverly Hills Citizen.
