Whereupon, Owen James Draws A New Hand and Pulls Forth a Singing Career to Match His Announcing, Whistling Chores

AS AN ANNOUNCER, Owen James is tops. But we think he should be a comedian, too! For example, there was the day he burst into the office at our request for an interview and blandly announced that he was born in Council Bluffs, Iowa, home of the world's largest elevator company, therefore, the ensuing story should be entitled the "Ups and Downs of Owen James."

As you can see, Owen James is a witty young fellow and a very likeable one. He has his serious side, too, such as his adored family of three and his love for music. About these subjects, he is in deadly earnest.

Classical His Choice

Owen's entrance into radio as a staff singer for an Omaha station in 1933 led to his becoming a freelance announcer. He had decided he no longer wanted to be a popular singer but a classical one, and began the long, arduous task of training himself. He hopes soon to make his debut as such.

Six feet, one inch, 195 lbs., brown hair, blue eyes and a pleasant face, make Owen a good bet for musical comedy or the stage. Radio, though,

is his first love. "Guess, 'cause I've been in it for so long."

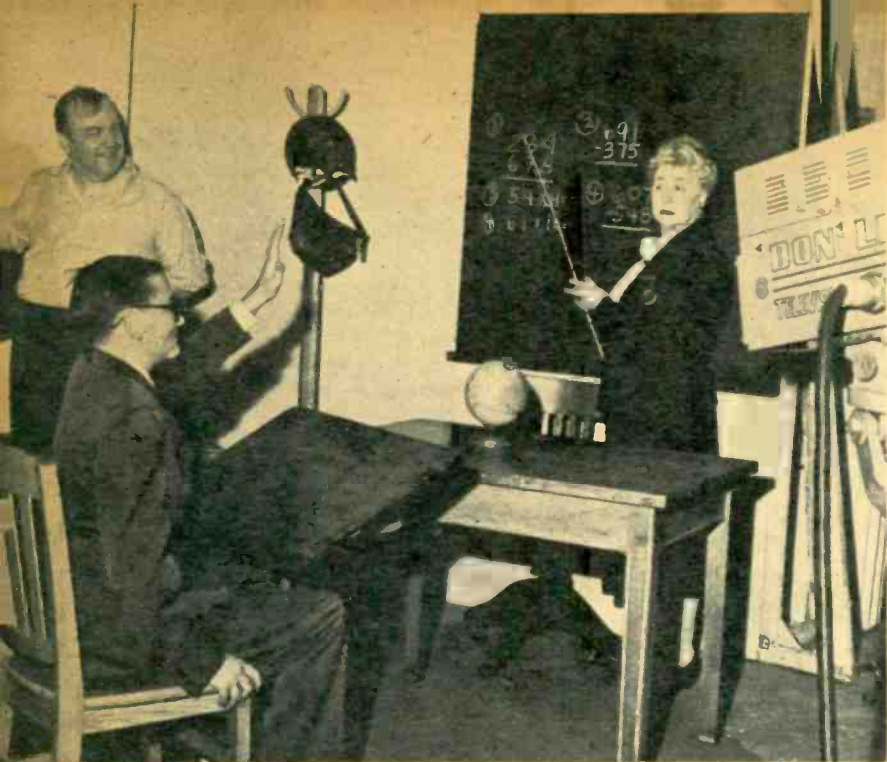
You've heard him on such shows as "This Is My Best," "The Saint," "Bill Lance," "Silver Theater," "Duffys Tavern," "Red Rider," the Radio Life show, and Sherlock Holmes. He is the "whistle" used to identify both "The Saint" and "The Whistler."

He Whistles Too

Asked how one becomes a "whistler," Owen informed us all you have to do is whistle. But there is more to it than meets the ear. When he first began, he learned to identify the note upon which he was to begin his whistling stint by catching it four bars before his introduction. Now he knows both tunes by heart and just puckers up his lips and blows.

Only once in the two years of this weird occupation has he ever missed a cue. He doesn't know what happened, he just puckered and nothing came. A few bars later he began whistling like mad and nobody knew the difference. "You're never sure," he explained, "if you'll be able to whistle or not. But you keep your fingers crossed and blow like Gabriel."



Knox Manning

Reporting

*In Which the Popular Radio Newsmen,
Recently Returned from Active Duty,
Discusses England and Post-War Radio*

KNOX MANNING smacked his lips with relish as the waitress set before him a plate of steaming kidney stew. "I learned to like it from the British," he smiled.


"When I went overseas," Manning maintained. "I had an open mind about the English. I was prepared to like them or to dislike them. I found," he stressed earnestly, "that I liked them tremendously."

Veteran of three years of service in the Army Air Forces (ten months as commander of the first overseas Combat Camera Unit), Major Manning spoke with particular admiration of his overseas buddy, a British Wing Commander (whom he believes has since been killed in action).

Most Wonderful Stew

"He and I contrived many an appetizing meal together," the mikereminded over his stew. "He used to say to me, 'Now, old boy, I know you have a great admiration for the British, and I, in turn, have a tremendous liking for you Americans. Therefore, you scrounge around among the British boys, and I shall scrounge around among your American troops, and with what the two of us manage to get, we shall be able to make a most wonderful stew!'"

Knox rendered the above dialogue in his most amusing English accent, and further confessed that "the ham in me" will always assert itself. In addition to his twice-daily appearance at the CBS microphone, in the capacity of newscaster-commentator, he hopes to obtain acting assignments again, as well.



VETERAN OF THREE YEARS service in the Army Air Forces, Major Knox Manning saw ten months' active duty overseas as commander of the first overseas Combat Camera Unit.

An accomplished character actor, Manning has appeared on the screen in over five hundred Warner Brothers short subjects, in addition to playing featured roles in a number of full-length films. His favorite movie roles were in "Cheers for Miss Bishop" and a Warners' short entitled "At the Stroke of Twelve."

Start in Stock

Before entering radio, the actor spent several years in Eastern stock companies; his air career began when he conducted radio interviews with renowned personages, and for three seasons he also played "straight man" for comedian Parkyakarkus.

Since 1937, he has been one of the West Coast's most popular radio news reporters.

Of post-war news reporting, he opined: "With the war over, newscasts will soon be relegated to their proper place on program schedules. During this conflict, of course, the news has been of such vital interest to every listener and has contained so much drama that it was assured of a vast interested audience. In the newscasting of peacetime events, the showman's angle will have to be injected. Radio, after all, is essentially show business."

Of television, the radio man declared: "I think there is an over-emphasis on the subject. Television isn't likely to be as universally popular as people are inclined to believe. It will require too much concentration of the listener, and certainly it can not be employed at

all with the millions of auto radios in use today. I think it will be incorporated chiefly in the broadcasting of sports and special events."

Of a news commentator's responsibility to his listeners, Manning continued, "One must try as best he can to put across the ideals he holds close. On my program, I try to do all I can to promote racial and religious tolerance and to help in creating a greater understanding among the different peoples of the world."

"Radio," Mr. Manning emphasized decisively, "has a terrific responsibility. Radio can do so much to cement relations among the nations."

BBC vs. Singing Commercials

Of England's BBC, Manning admitted, "It is pretty dull and stuffy, definitely poor showmanship. When Bob Hope's show was broadcast in England, Bob ran over-time and was cut off by the next program—a regularly-scheduled BBC broadcast. So many complaints poured in about Bob's show being interrupted that his entire program was repeated by transcription the next day."

Speaking of the BBC, Manning recalled especially his return trip to the United States after his service overseas. The ship on which he travelled was British, and right up until the time it entered New York harbor its radio was tuned to the BBC. Then, WABC New York was suddenly heard with an unmistakably American singing commercial. The American boys aboard shouted with glee. "Hoo-

A Career Built On Embarrassing Moments

Milestones in the Charlotte Greenwood Career are the Moments She Laughs About Now But Wouldn't Want to Live Over Again

Sunday, 2:30 p.m. KECA

A MONKEY who misbehaved, a morning bath and the national anthem, a pair of padded tights and a Japanese kimono—all of these assorted and seemingly

unrelated items are landmarks in the laughable life of lively, loose-limbed Charlotte Greenwood. "At one time," remarked Miss Greenwood, "they weren't the least bit funny. But today, I can look back on them and laugh." We were visiting with the comedienne and her husband, producer Martin Broones,

in their beautiful Beverly Hills home where, in the small den which they term their "workroom," surrounded by the many mementoes of the crowded Greenwood career, we gradually garnered a riotous resume of Charlotte's most memorable moments in the theater.

As for the monkey who "misbehaved" (Miss Greenwood's term, meaning in a most fundamental manner), the animal was a part of an act which once preceded the Charlotte Greenwood number on a vaudeville program. The monkey's "misbehaviour" left the stage slightly messy—and slippery, which resulted, as one can guess, in Miss Greenwood's animated dance ending in an all too unexpected way. Finding herself suddenly flat on the floor, she grimaced at the audience and made a fast comical exit on all fours. It was so funny that she was persuaded to incorporate it into her act and it became another of the inimitable Greenwood trademarks.

Then there was the "Morning Bath"—the title of one of the funster's best-remembered acts. Recently, during a shopping expedition at her favorite bakery, Charlotte was approached by a woman who immediately recollected the Greenwood bathtub number which she had seen so many years ago. "You know," the woman informed the star, "I haven't taken a bath since then without it bringing back to my mind that riotous act of yours."

Thoughts, Eyes, Divergent

The act had placed Miss Greenwood in a bathtub, intent on having done with her daily scrubdown, but continually being hilariously perturbed by a ceaseless series of interruptions. Between laughs, onlookers speculated as to just what apparel, if any, Miss Greenwood was garbed in for the number. Actually, the performer was dressed, but skimpily—so much so that it was no casual occurrence when, on a closing night, while Charlotte was still seated on-stage in her bathtub, the band suddenly struck up "The Star Spangled Banner." "An enormous expectant hush fell over the audience," related Miss Greenwood, "and though their thoughts may have been on the flag, their eyes were on me!"

Fortunately, some kind-hearted soul, seeing the star's peculiar predicament, turned out the house-lights, thereby allowing the flustered comedienne to be both patriotic and proper.

The padded tights became a milestone on life's pathway for Charlotte Greenwood when she was just

thirteen years old. "I was as tall then as I am now," Charlotte winced, "but as skinny and straight as a stick. You can imagine how I'd look in a chorus lineup, and that's just what I was destined for in the Win-

ter Garden Revue. Mother and I dashed frantically out to spend our last nine dollars on a pair of padded tights!"

Came rehearsal time, and the youngster, her long scrawny legs

trembling inside their artfully-cushioned covering, stood shyly in the chorus before the keen discerning eyes of the show's director. She was beautifully embellished with

A MODERN-day sheriff who patrols the West in a sleek automobile rather than riding hell-bent on a bronco, not firing a pistol wildly into the air, but rather, brandishing as a threat to any law-breaker all the implements of advanced scientific crime detection—such a figure as this is the hero of ABC's new dramatic thrill series, "The Sheriff."

Unlike the usual type of fictional, gun-totin' sheriff, "Mark Chase," honorably discharged Marine and law enforcement chief of Canyon County, uses such modern methods as fingerprinting and ballistic tests rather than hunches and wild chases on horseback to bring a criminal to justice.

Played by Robert Haag, "The

Sheriff" is a forceful, entertaining character of impeccable diction, who gets his man without ever saying "varmint" or "critter," or having anyone point out to him that "He went thataway!"

Born in Cullom, Illinois, and reared in Springfield, Massachusetts, actor Haag was once imbued with a desire for reform in government. Bent on a political career, he worked during the day and studied law every night at Boston's Northeastern University.

But during the summer after his second year at college, the theatrical bug bit him. He was offered a small part in a summer stock company,

took it, and reminiscingly admits, "The minute I walked on the stage, I knew that was what I wanted to do."

In Radio 6 Years

The next three years, he played roles in New York plays—all of them unsuccessful,—and did professional modelling to augment his slender income.

Then, in 1939, came radio—and a steady climb to today's starring role on a top transcontinental airshow.

Tall, broad-shouldered Haag has blue eyes and red-blond hair. His favorite hobby used to be the raising of quackless ducks on a farm

It was an equally embarrassing experience for the comedienne which first engineered her debut in the field of fun-makers. Originally, her renditions of the ballads of the day songs (such as "Carrie," and "Gee, I Wish I Had a Beau") were being given a full dramatic treatment, with no intent to evoke laughter. But much to Miss Greenwood's dismay, every time she rendered a serious number, the audience guffawed.

"Why?" she asked a friend. "What do I do that makes them laugh? I merely sing the number, and accompany it with a few simple gestures such as extending my hand like this."

"That's it," smiled the friend. It was Charlotte's elongated limbs. "You see," she demonstrated for us, "when I throw my arm out, it goes out so far!"

By the same token, the comedienne pointed out, the rangy Greenwood figure keeps her permanently relegated to the rear. "Just yesterday, when I attended Adrian's new fashion showing, someone tried to usher me into a front seat. 'Put me down there,' I said to him, 'and nobody else will be able to see a thing!'"

"No," he commanded. "It's still the same as when I was in the chorus. Always look for me in the back row—and you won't have to look hard. I'll be sticking out like a sore thumb."

Knox Manning is a former New Englander. "I love New England," he grinned, "but I wouldn't want to live there. I like California." Returning to talk of his service overseas, Manning admitted, "I never knew it was possible for anyone to be as scared as I was."

At Salerno

"I remember in particular an incident that occurred during our landing at Salerno, when, for a number of days, things were going so badly that we really thought the jib was up. Sometime," Knox told us soberly, "I'm going down to the Times office and look up the papers of September 9th, 10th and 11th of 1943 and see what the home folks were being told about it.

"My British friend and myself were protecting ourselves as best we could inside an Italian farmhouse. It seemed like the end was near, when we suddenly heard the rumbling approach of tanks which we knew would be ours. We ran anxiously to the window and peered out. The tanks rolled by alright, but, to our horrified dismay, they were retreating!"

"My stomach sunk," concluded the newsman, "but my British pal quickly injected humor into the dire situation by exclaiming in clipped astonished tones, 'Good gawd, man! They're travelling in the wrong direction!'"

Acting as housekeeper to the bachelor sheriff on the series is his elderly cousin, "Cassandra Drinkwater," known throughout the coun-

tryside as "Cousin Cassie." Cassie gossips, dotes on young officer Chase and seeks to protect him, with all the ferocity at her command, from girls with marriage on their minds.

Female Impersonator

A rarity in radio characterizations, "Cassie" is played by a man, Olyn Landick, long famous on the air for the wizardry of his female voice impersonations.

Landick began "making like a lady" when he was in the Navy during World War I. His "Cousin Cassie" is a composite of the many women he has carefully observed so that he could caricature their odd traits.

Landick was born in Newton, Massachusetts, the son of a sea captain. Young Olyn enlisted in the Navy when he was seventeen, and his ship was part of the convoy that took President Wilson across the Atlantic for the signing of the Versailles Treaty. Aboard ship, the boys had to provide their own entertainment and Landick's contribution was "comedy ladies" for such plays as "Charlie's Aunt."

At the end of the war, Landick "hit the road" with a minstrel show, playing interlocutor, endman and his favorite lady characters. Then the future "Cousin Cassie" took a turn on the vaudeville stage, with an act that attracted the attention of a radio talent scout, and his air career was given birth.

Now, Haag and he, as "The Sheriff" and his "Cousin Cassie," are at the ABC microphone weekly to bring thrill-seekers a new slant on the activities of a sheriff, the scene of which has shifted from the plains and the prairies to such up-to-date settings as night clubs, ice shows, and golf links!
