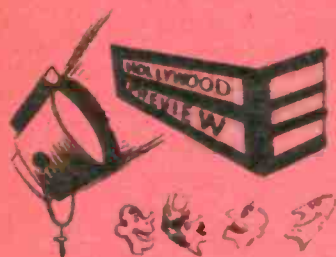

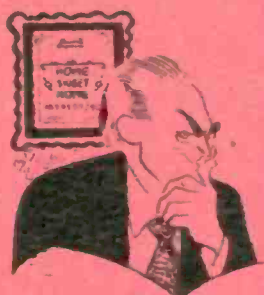

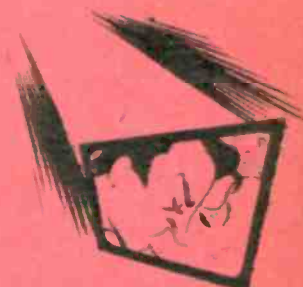

was on the road to fulfilling my ultimate aim and I wanted to create believable comedy characters and comedy situations. So it isn't that my comedy will change, but, I hope, it will be completely believable."

We have a hunch that what we are listening to and laughing at today is a bit of the real Joan Davis—the warm-hearted, good-natured, modest and shrewd businesswoman who is as much Mrs. Si Wills as she is a number-one radio comedienne.

Joan's beginning in show business is an old story to her fans. She says this is the way it happened:

"When I was seven I was billed as 'Josephine Davis—Midget' in order to escape the New York child labor law. My mother bought me a pair of spike-heeled shoes and made me all up with paint and powder. Then she rehearsed me to talk in a deep midget voice way down in my boots. Everything went all right until we got out of a taxi in front of the theater. As we walked in, those high heels kept turning over on me and I kept falling down. Ma and Pa just stood there and howled. They thought it was so funny. But the manager of the theater—who was watching us, didn't think it was so funny. He booted all of us out. He knew I was no midget when he saw my Munsing underwear."

In March of 1931, her manager teamed her with Serunes (Si) Wills and they toured vaudeville as "Wills and Davis" until 1936 when Joan entered pictures. Since August 13, 1931, they've been Mr. and Mrs. and in 1933 a daughter, Beverly, was born.

Twelve-year-old Beverly is just about the biggest thing in Joan's busy life. The spitting image of her mother, Bev has perfected an imitation of her that sends Joan into gales of laughter. She portrays Joan as a child in the latest "George White's Scandals," and has appeared with her on the air as "her sister."

"I'll give Bev every bit of help or encouragement she needs," Joan promises. "It's entirely up to her to decide upon her own career."

Business Woman

There are many compensations in real life for the knocks Joan takes in her zany screen and radio characterizations. By playing dumb, she has been smart enough to slice herself a nice big hunk of success. Regarded as a highly practical businesswoman, Joan handles all of her own affairs. It is often she who comes up with many of those funny gags and situations for her radio show.

The Patrons of Her "Tea Room" Are Discovering a New Davis Who Is as Welcome as a Full Tank of Gasoline

J HERE'S A NEW Joan Davis running CBS' "Joannie's Tea Room." Have you noticed?

She's still the same lovable comedienne who won the titles of "Queen of Comedy" and "First Lady of Laughter." And she still speaks with those sharply rising inflections that make you howl before she's finished. But she's no longer the forlorn,

frustrated female to whom 'glamour' is only a word in Webster's dictionary. "Hey, look at me! I'm livin,'" she laughs.

This "new" Joannie is adding more laurels to her already overflowing cup. What brought about the change?

Public Likes Change

"There really isn't a change," Joan explained. "The public may tire of a character always being the same and in the same predicaments. When I started my own show for CBS I

7:20—9:30 Joan conducts all of her business. (she is now owner of the Joan Davis enterprises with the purpose of finding and exploiting new talent).

10—12 Is spent in going over scripts and ideas.

1—5 Joan devotes to radio conferences and rehearsal.

6:00 p.m. Arrives home, has dinner. Helps Beverly with her homework. Reads and answers own mail.

9:00 p.m. Off to the Hollywood Canteen to entertain the boys.

1:00 a.m. Ready for bed. Shuts off the light and goes to sleep. Suddenly turns light back on and checks to see if alarm is set for 7 a.m.—or 5 a.m.—and so on!

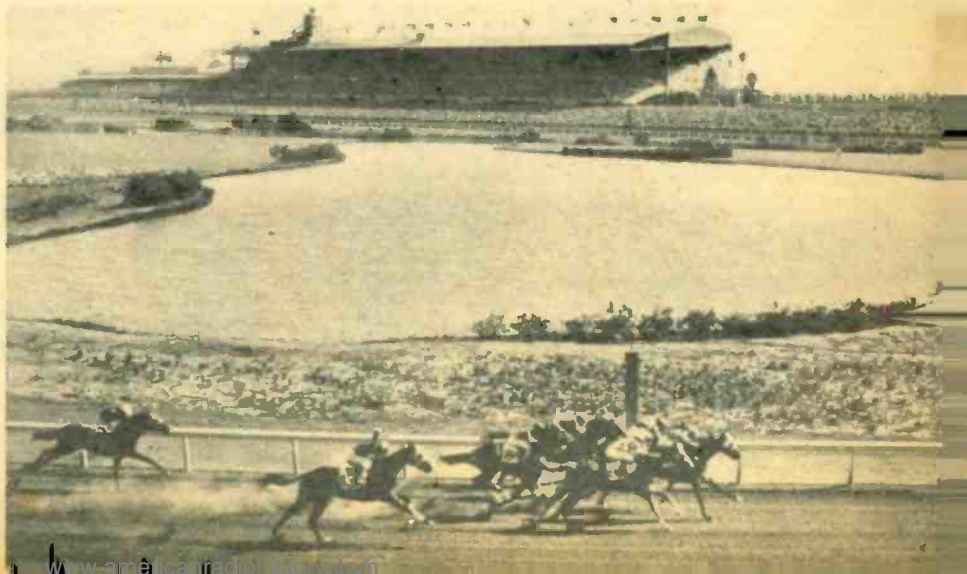

Jennings Suit

Now in litigation is the suit of Al Jennings against the Don Lee Broadcasting Co. and the sponsors of "The Lone Ranger" airshow, which dramatized Jennings' adventures on August 7, 1944.

Suing for \$100,000 for defamation of character, Jennings states that he was falsely accused during the dramatization of contributing to the delinquency of a seventeen-year-old boy by inducing him to share his banditry.

Jennings also complained that the show made it appear that "The Lone Ranger" could outshoot him.

Don Lee, not wanting to "confuse the issue," declined to make any statement at this writing.

New Addition

NBC is swelling with pride over its recent announcement of the construction of two new broadcasting studios. Totalling approximately \$630,000 in cost, the studios will be built on Argyle Ave., near Sunset, and will be connected with the present building which was constructed in 1938, at the corner of Sunset and Vine.

Each of the studios will have seating accommodations for audiences of 340 and stages for the largest orchestras, dramatic or comedy casts in the West. They will provide 38,000 additional square feet of space when completed in about five months.

"We have been in dire need of these studios for several years, Sidney N. Strotz, vice-president in charge of the Western Division of NBC said, "and with building restrictions about to be relaxed, we are taking immediate steps to correct the situation."

An exact date for the construction to begin has not been named, but it will begin soon after building restrictions are lifted in mid-October.

Jarvis' Pastime

It seems that there is a new past-time at KFVB. It's called "watching Al Jarvis keep two shows on two different stations going at one and the same time!" While he spins platters and gives with the chatter for the "Make Believe Ballroom" on KFVB, Al's also doing a show for the Associated Broadcasting Company called "Hall of Records." joining studio to do a commentary for Associated and the "Hall," sticks on a record there, and dashes back to keep the folks on the "Ballroom" going. In spite of the fact that it keeps him hopping, Al is proud as a new father about it because it affords him a chance to reach New York audiences.

Jiggers! The Boss

Charlie Cantor, Finnegan of "Duffy's Tavern," caused quite a commotion on Vine Street the other day. Blowing what sounded like a policeman's whistle, and waving his hands wildly, Charlie was grandly ushering a big Cadillac around the corner. Grinning from behind the steering wheel sat Ed Gardner. As the car "safely" rounded the corner, Charlie turned to the crowd and explained, "Gotta make way for the boss."

Broadcast from Blimp

CBS songstress Geri Sullivan was afforded one of her biggest thrills recently. She was commandeered by the Navy to sail out above the briny deep in a huge blimp and sing songs over a loudspeaker to returning Pacific war veterans in the hospital ship, "Dogwood," steaming for California some one hundred yards below. Earl Colbert, guitarist, accompanied her while she rendered nostalgic numbers such as "If I Could Be With You" to the cheering boys who crowded on the deck to listen.

The trip was so successful, more of etherdom's pretty songstresses were scheduled to do the same trick—Dinah Shore two days later, and then, Ginny Simms.

Shirer Returns

William L. Shirer, CBS news analyst and foreign correspondent, has left the States to return to Germany, where he will report the trials of Nazi war criminals which are scheduled to start in Nuremberg around November 1.

Previous to covering the court proceedings, Mr. Shirer is spending a week in London, examining at first-hand the new British Labor government, then will go to Paris to report on the mid-October French elections. During the latter part of October, he plans to visit and broadcast from Vienna, Budapest, Prague, Warsaw and Berlin.

His eye-witness accounts of the Nazi war trials will also be aired, direct from Nuremberg.

This is Shirer's third trip overseas since early in 1941, when he found it no longer possible to broadcast from Berlin.

Samuelsen's Father

Sportcaster Rube Samuelson left for San Jose last week after receiving news that his father, Chris Samuelsen, had passed away. The father had been involved in an automobile accident last Friday, and although he had assured his family that he was improving, a blood clot developed, which caused him to fall into a coma from which he never regained consciousness. It was a doubly hard blow for Rube, as he had not recovered from the sorrow of his mother's death just five months ago.

Into Army

Norman Sper, Jr., national senior tower diving champion and national senior ten-foot diving champion, sang his swan-song as an actor (temporarily) last September 24th when he made a final appearance before the NBC "Date with Judy" microphone.

He reported for Army induction the following day. The nineteen-year-old diving star just recently returned from

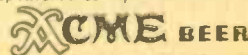



THEY HANDED me the lines—and I read 'em," explained Tommy Dorsey when we asked him how he'd happened to blossom out as a radio comedian and M.C. Tommy's ability to star on his own program not only as a fine musician and band leader but also as a comedian seems to have surprised a lot of people, including one T. Dorsey. "But I'm really enjoying my radio work," he smiled, "for me, it's new and different, and very interesting." We wondered whether to tell him we'd just decided that his voice sounded like Cary Grant's. But already he had launched into his number one enthusiasm—music.

Tries for Versatility

"I've always tried to keep the band versatile," he said, "both sweet and hot." For that reason he feels he has not had to slant his music to appeal to his new radio audience. "We know that we can't play like the Duke and Count Basie and the boys, so we don't try," he explained, "but I think we've got a pretty good score on both the sweet and hot side. Right now people think of us as primarily a sweet band, but when I can get the men who can play it, we'll play the other stuff again."

We reminded him of one night at the Hollywood Palladium several years ago when he and the band were ceremoniously presented with a trophy for being the best sweet band of the year. Mr. Dorsey accepted gracefully, gave the boys the nod, and the "best sweet band of the year" beat out the hottest, loudest jive ever heard anywhere for one solid hour. We often suspected him of blowing the trophy right out the roof. "We can do it again, too, when we can get the musicians again," he

said. Most of his boys who are away will be coming back, he thinks. Drummer Buddy Rich has already returned, and other original members, unless they've settled down for good, will be back with T.D.

When we asked if he could tell which way the trend in music would go, now that the war had ended, he smiled at us as if we were sweet, but not quite bright. "I only wish I knew. I'd be a very happy man. Suppose you tell me." We couldn't either.

"I do know this, though," he added, "the kids who return from overseas don't want to hear the current hits, the songs that have been popularized while they've been away. They want to hear the same tunes that were popular when they left. Every time a soldier comes up to the bandstand to request a number it's something like "I'll Never Smile Again," "There Are Such Things," "Boogie-Woogie" and so on—the stuff people were singing and dancing to a couple of years ago. I think there'll be a revival of some of those tunes."

"Just a Salesman"

What kind of music does he like

the best? "I honestly don't think I have a right to personal views as far as preferences go. I'm just a salesman. I can't afford to specialize. We've got to have something for everyone. After all, it's up to the people—if they like what you have to sell, they buy it. If they don't, no power on earth can make them take it and like it." That they take it and like it, all right, is proved by sales of Dorsey records. His biggest seller was "Boogie-Woogie," which sold over 2,000,000 copies with "Marie," "Song of India" and "I'll Never Smile Again" right behind it. He thinks Benny Goodman is responsible for his success and the success of every other band going. "It was Benny who started the craze for swing bands—and I haven't forgotten it."

Soon he'll be off covering the one-night stands and theater dates again. He doesn't think he'll ever settle down to any one medium, much as he likes radio. "You've got to cover them all—pictures, radio, theaters, and so on." As for pictures? He was afraid to look at himself on the screen the first time he made one.

nickel when she was eleven, Miss Paula Stone has done alright by herself! She's learned. Daughter of world-famous Fred Stone and talented member of the fabulous Stone family, Paula has more than proved she can stand on her own two feet. She has danced, sung, radio-emceed and produced her way up the golden ladder of success. And now that she's on top, she modestly doesn't know how it came about.

"How do you do it?" queried your reporter, "how do you write, emcee and produce nine radio shows a week, in addition to your newly-acquired status of producer of the 'Red Mill'?"

Blonde Miss Stone sat back, took a deep breath and answered with a twinkle, "On a bicycle."

In Hollywood to supervise the

opening of "Red Mill," Paula is conducting her Kreml show from the heart of the cinema capital. Twice a week you hear her as singer, emcee and interviewer of her own fifteen-minute program. Such guests as Bing Crosby, Walt Disney, Charles Coburn, and Sylvia Sidney have made it a radio favorite.

Paula's entry into radio still affords her a laugh. Ashamed to admit that she didn't know what the radio expression "across the board" meant after spending a life-time in the theater, she agreed to undertake such a project in New York. She found herself with a six-time weekly radio show on her hands. That was in 1942. Today she still has her "across the board" fifteen-minutes, plus her twice weekly Kreml show and a one nighter called "Leave It To the Girls."

Paula admits it entails an unbelievable amount of work to turn out the nine shows a week, but it has now become her life. When her mother warns her against working too hard, Paula laughingly reminds her of the three-day vacation she took last year. She got sick.

Father Fred, sisters Carol (who is starring in the Broadway play "Dark of the Moon") and Dorothy (to be featured in the "Red Mill") look upon her with awe. "We could never do that," they exclaim.

"Dad's afraid of radio," Paula grinned, "and it's a yearly battle to get him to appear with me at all. But he's all for my doing it."

The "Red Mill," written for her father thirty-five years ago by Victor Herbert and which she is co-producing with Hunt Stromberg, Jr. came about indirectly through radio. Paula met Hunt, Jr. while she was in California working in pictures. A few years later she attempted to contact Edgar Bergen for her radio show and, instead, got Hunt. They both yearned to try their hand at producing and decided to form a team, unbeknown to their families. Following the "Mill" they have several new plays in mind for early production.

Betty Grable's Pal

While in California she has spent much time with her dearest friend, Betty Grable. "Betty's an angel. And what a mother she has turned out to be! It's such fun to visit her home and play with little Vickie; I could rave on about her as if she were my own."

A completely charming woman, chic in appearance and possessing an abundance of vitality, Paula eagerly looks forward to what the future will bring. She was almost afraid to attend the opening night of "Red Mill" for fear she would faint dead away with excitement. "I even caught myself worrying about being unable to obtain a seat. Imagine at my own play!"

No matter what heights she may scale as a producer or writer—she

has several books in mind—she'll never forget radio. "Oh I couldn't," she protests, "I love it too much. I doubt that I'll ever go back to the stage or pictures, but I'll never leave radio."

It was given her by her fiance, an Army Air Corps Lieutenant and a childhood friend. How news of the engagement leaked out, she didn't know. All Patrice wanted (and she narrowed the space between her thumb and index finger until it was infinitesimal) was just "this much privacy"—and a chance to announce her engagement at a little private party in her own living room instead of having it blared ("so gruesomely") by a Hollywood gossip columnist.
