Take It Easy!

Says Del Sharbutt, Who Did!
And Look What It Got Him—
Head Mikeman for Top Shows

WRITING THE STORY of tall, blond and good-looking Del Sharbutt is a pleasant task because it's the success story of boy makes good come true. Only "good" in this case is a mild understatement which covers a multitude of things.

As one of radio's most popular emcee-announcers, Del has hit his stride. His rich mellow voice, easy-going, friendly nature and his quick sense of timing have made him a "natural" for the job of head mike man. You hear him cavorting weekly with Jack Carson. On Sundays he can be found announcing the popular "Request Performance."

Often you hear his songs (although you may be unaware of it), "A Romantic Guy I," "Nickel Serenade," and others on your radio. He sings, plays the saxophone and piano. And someday (soon we hope) you'll see him as leading man in a musical comedy.

Versatile

Being able to do everything seems to be simple for Del. After leaving school, where he studied law, he joined a Texas radio station as staff singer, which, in turn, led to announcing. The time was ripe, young Sharbutt felt, to take a bigger step. And off he went to Chicago.

Chicago led to New York and in 1933, within a few months after his arrival, Del found himself emcee of the old Chevrolet program. In those days a studio audience was something of an innovation and frankly it scared him to death.

It wasn't the prospect of the audience which was so terrifying as the thoughts of a warmup. "I had to

wear a tux," he grinned as he reminisced with us, "because radio dressed at that time. The tux only added to my discomfort. I had no idea what to tell the folks but when the time came somebody gave me a push, I found myself in front of the audience and from there on it's a mental blank. I guess I got through it because no tomatoes flew in my direction, but it was the march of doom."

Likes Audience

With this initiation over, Del never feared an audience again, in fact he preferred (and still does) to work with one. But a new worry cropped up. He found that his working hours were very irregular. Sometimes his schedule called for a 6 a.m. broadcast, with his previous day's shift having ended only four hours prior. That wasn't much time for sleep and oh, how Del loved to sleep! His "out" lay in the fact that he was impossible to awaken.

With typical Sharbutt ingenuity he solved this crisis. He began collecting alarm clocks. At last count he had thirteen and wouldn't arise until the thirteenth had rung. "I wasn't late but it took me half the night to set the things."

The ensuing years found him on shows with every top name in New York radio. Yet during all of this time, music had not been forgotten. He acquired a Hammond organ and

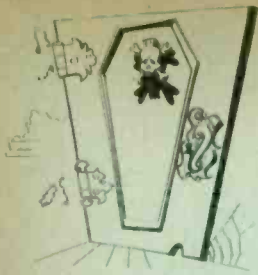
began taking "hints" from friend, Ethel Smith. Another pal, Lanny Ross, and he opened a music company, presenting the public with many of their own tunes, including "A Romantic Guy I." Del even spent some time training for opera, but decided he'd stick to lighter variations.

Today wife, singer Mary Bell, and he have built their lovely Beverly Hills home around music. The beloved organ is still there, myriads of records, and two lively youngsters who love to carol with mom and pop and bang on pop's piano.

Del's still writing tunes and when Lanny is a civilian again the music company will go back into business. He confesses he's a jitterbug at heart and at one time used to hold jam sessions in his apartment with contemporary jazz notables as stars.

He plays a mean game of golf and is quite a handy man about the house. California is an ideal spot for him because he likes its leisurely way of living. And he wishes he could wear sports clothes the rest of his life. His fondest memories include the days when he played straight man to a young comedian named Bob Hope.

"We were terrific," grinned Del . . . which brings up a point! Young Sharbutt has never become a comedian, which is just about the only credit he hasn't to his record. But don't be too sure about that!

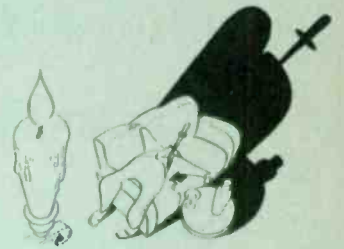

Mr. Otis Regrets

That He's Unable to Think of a Better Name for What He Does Than Disc Jockey Or Platter Juggler — But He Likes It

THE LAST TIME Radio Life interviewed Don Otis, he had just given up Lucky Lager Dance Time, and was settling into a nice, dignified career as program manager at KMPC. And looking forward to it.

Right now, however, Don's singing a different tune. "I was program manager for a year and a half, and I didn't like it at all. I discovered I didn't want to tell people how to do things; I wanted to do them myself. So I'm back with my records again," he smiled genuinely and happily. Don just can't stay away from those records.

At home he has a collection of four thousand discs of his own, and he isn't too worn out from his three record programs in the day time to go home and play them. In fact, he's eager to.


"My wife, Betty, was pleased with that title, program manager," smiled Don. "At last I sounded like a respectable citizen. She didn't like people calling me disc-jockey and platter-spinner. But there doesn't seem to be any other name."

Big-Name Guests


However, no matter what you call it, Don still loves his job. "Do you realize how many guys there are who *hate* their work? I'm awfully lucky to be doing something I really enjoy." Don claims that he has never gotten tired of a record. "I like all the music I play, and I don't play anything I don't like," he smiled.

As guest stars, Don has had Tommy Dorsey, Patrice Munsel, the King Cole Trio, Xavier Cugat, Frank Sinatra, and many others on his program. The list reads like a cross section of

Radio Wonder Boy

He Once Dug Ditches, Slept in Graveyards, Couldn't Sell a Story and Was Fired From Same Job Seven Times, But John Guedel Now Has Own Production Agency, Owns Top Shows

YOU SEE," smiled the mild-mannered, unassuming gentleman seated at the table opposite us, "I always write letters."

Owner-originator of NBC's "People Are Funny," John Guedel modestly credits "fate" for his success. Hearing his story, we more rightfully credit Mr. Guedel's own ingenuity and perseverance. Take his habit of writing letters, for instance.

One afternoon a few years ago, he was sitting in the waiting room of a doctor's office—as have we all. While waiting, he perused a magazine—as do we all. But here the generality stops. Mr. Guedel didn't pick a magazine at random, flip idly through its pages, and set it aside disinterestedly.

He read a radio trade magazine and took note of an item about an airshow that was to be discontinued. Guedel always carries with him a clip-board with a sheaf of note paper attached, on which he scribbles thoughts at random. On this occasion, he promptly penned, on a piece of yellow scrap paper, this note to the agency handling the radio program in question: "Have answer to your problem."

He mailed it and three days later, the agency called him long-distance to ask what he had in mind. He told them about "People Are Funny." A mere two weeks later, his show was on the air coast-to-coast!

Names Changed

"People Are Funny," a top airshow now worth money that runs into six figures annually, was born on a thirty dollar audition record, and was first aired locally in 1938 under the name of "Pull Over, Neighbor" (in deference to its gasoline sponsor), then retitled "All Aboard" (for its succeeding backer, a railroad). At that point, John Guedel decided it was an unwise policy to continue this name-changing and decided to settle on a permanent one.

One night he was attending an advertising dinner and during a not-too-entertaining speech, he observed his fellow diners doodling idly on scraps of paper and the tablecloth. Watching them, he found himself doodling this observation: "People are funny, aren't they?"

Showman that he is, he saw a title for his airshow in that off-hand doodling.

Of medium height, dark complexioned, with brown eyes and a sparse amount of black hair, Guedel, at thirty-two, is head of John Guedel Productions and creator of a handful of top "package" airshows. Besides "People Are Funny," he owns "G. E. House Party," has an interest in "The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet," and originated the Charlotte Greenwood program. In addition, currently he has two new shows to sell—a comedy suspense series starring Jackie Coogan; and a first-class Western drama serial called "Frontier Town," co-starring Claire Trevor and Randolph Scott.

Also, at this writing, Guedel considers it likely that he will resume his production chores on the Red Skelton show with the carrot-topped comic's return to the microphone.

Weathered Crash

Even before his entrance into radio, John Guedel had amply demonstrated his ingenuity and perseverance. Prior to the "crash" of 1929, Guedel was a student at U.C.L.A. His family was of more than average wealth and life presented no particular problems. Then it happened. Like so many others in 1929, many friends of the Guedel family accepted suicide as the only way out. John's father, who lost considerably more than many of the others, at the age of fifty, resourcefully turned to writing. (Today, he helps pen the scripts for Guedel shows.)

Son John quit school, dug ditches on a WPA project, then became a travelling salesman selling advertising paper in a Midwestern territory. He had no money for hotel rooms, usually slept out in the open along the road—preferably in graveyards "where it was quiet."

One night, he visited an old friend in Cincinnati and upon his departure from the house, was given directions to the nearest hotel. He listened intently, took note of the detailed instructions, bid his friend adieu—

A Former Cop On "GANGBUSTERS"

NO MAN WHO has had recent experience as a law enforcement officer can fail to feel concern at the current surge of juvenile delinquency and the possibility of a serious postwar crime wave. As one means of combating these tendencies, we on "Gang Busters" try to impress on all our listeners the

futility of crime, its inevitable end in disgrace, imprisonment or death. We believe these programs fulfill a necessary role in today's radio, a medium which can do so much to educate both young and old to the responsibilities of citizenship.

On retiring from the New York police force after forty years on the job, I did not plan to dissociate myself from my life work of law enforcement, and I have not done so. I have confidence in the potentialities of radio as a force for crime abatement, particularly a show such as "Gang Busters." The old saying that "one picture is worth a thousand words" is applicable here, for ours is a dramatization, an exciting story which holds the attention while it points a moral. Phillips Lord, the writer of the program, is an expert criminologist and a scripter who knows how to achieve suspense and drama without distortion of facts.

The fact that the stories used for program material are actual cases gathered from official police records with no disguising of names, dates, or places and with thoroughly documented action, gives additional urgency to the message of the show. And this message is vital. In this country we have seen a crime wave follow every war in which we have engaged. This is a warning which we repeat on all "Gang Busters"

programs, and we mean it. The men who fought for this nation must not come home to a country ridden by crime.

Influence on Children

There are many ways in which radio can serve the public interest. We all know the fascination which radio holds for kids today. In your son's or daughter's room there is probably a small radio, and a hard-working one. Possibly you once feared that it would interfere with studies or be played until too late at night, but the chances are that your worries were to no avail. The kids will continue to listen to the radio; nothing will stop them; so the problem is to insure that the programs they hear are decent, useful and character-building.

It was because I felt this opportunity in radio that I resigned my position as New York City police commissioner and took up my present duties. A former cop can feel at home on "Gang Busters." The show demonstrates the efficiency of the modern police force; it gives clues to actual criminals now at large, clues which have been instrumental in over 300 captures. All this is familiar to the police officer. But above all it gives an opportunity to repeat with widespread effect the message I have been preaching all my life. Crime does not pay.



A LONG RADIO ROW there sit half a dozen pretentious and unpretentious restaurants, gathering places of the stars. Some specialize in steaks and rare delicacies. Others feature ham on rye and malts that melt in your mouth. And only a cubicle separates you from your favorite personality.

But they have one thing in common—a haven for ether shop talk. When an actor wants to discuss a script, when a newspaper man wants to interview a celebrity, when writers get together to hold a conference—they wind up in one of these special spots. Decisions are easier to reach over a steaming cup of coffee. And careers can be made or die a-borning in the eateries along Radio Row.

So was you glimpse your favorite personality in the swank Brown Derby, Brittingham's, Mike Lyman's, Les Comiques, Tom Breneman's, in the cozy Paris Sweet Shop or Thrifty Drug store, it's often food for thought that's on his mind.

Drama, Fun

It isn't always drama that's brewing in the crowded dining hours. There's fun and relaxation, too. Knowing that our readers would like an intimate peek into these famous spots, Radio Life took it upon itself to visit, question and even eavesdrop a bit concerning the daily goings-on in Radio Row's favorite cafes.

Located across the quadrangle from CBS' main entrance is modernistic Brittingham's, the choicest and most convenient spot for many of Columbia's stellar lights. Life, under the capable managership of Benny van Beck, begins at an earlier hour for "Brits" (8 or 9 a.m.) than many of its brother eateries, because of the nearby location of prominent studios. Greasepaint and 1890 costumes are no novelty to its regular patrons. Thursday nights (when CBS airs its famed "Command Performance" and "Suspense") and Monday nights when "Screen Guild" takes the ether. "Brits" often resembles a busy movie lot.

Unlike the Brown Derby, Brittingham's noon and dinner hours are not composed of blocks of regularly reserved tables. Many of the stars munching their salads or prime roast of beef will return to one of CBS' studios for a final rehearsing or airing. But every day is a holiday for the tourist and any hour will

include names reading like the marquee of an all-star production.

Find Stars Eating

In the cheerful yellow and blue surroundings, Jack Kirkwood can be found any day of the week engrossed in conference with his writers and fellow gagmen . . . lovely Rosemary DeCamp (Judy of the "Dr. Christian" show) rarely misses a Wednesday night supper between shows . . . tucked away in an end cubicle sits Hanley Stafford with his lovely wife Vyola Vonn . . . in the next booth, brown as an Indian and with that haunted expression that thirty million women feel they could remedy if given an opportunity, is Cary Grant, fresh from the set of a neighboring studio . . . laughs are provided by bulbous-nosed Jimmy Durante and crew-cropped Garry Moore. Friday regulars, Durante and Moore favor heaping dishes of ham and eggs, consumed at a quiet table in the rear of "Brits" . . . on Wednesday Jack Carson, Dave Willock, Arthur Treacher and Diana Barrymore while away the hours between their East Coast and West Coast shows with a sandwich and cup of coffee . . . Arthur Lake, inimitable Dagwood of the "Blondie" program, can be seen hurriedly partaking of strange culinary combinations any day he happens to be shooting on a new "Blondie" picture across the street.

Manager van Beck confesses that the noon hour sometimes resembles a madhouse. "Regulars" Mel Blanc (the man of many voices), Lurene Tuttle, Jo Gilbert, Joe Kerns, and Elvia Allman patiently join the waiting line for a table or booth. Joan Davis, in full makeup as a bowery maid of the 1920's, creates a giggle with her luncheon partner, Curly of the Three Stooges.

Van Beck, himself, is well qualified to keep the restaurant in a cheerful, orderly mood for he has been with "Brits" since its opening seven years ago. Employing approximately twenty waitresses, eight cooks, three bartenders and five bus-boys, he is able to offer quick and efficient service to its always-in-a-hurry patrons. The stars are excellent customers. Tipping generously, most of them are courteous and easy to deal with.

Brit's call board, a huge blackboard at the cashier's desk, keeps its occupants informed on all current messages and is a constant reminder of the topic of the day—radio.

Next week we'll take in luncheon at the popular Brown Derby.

At least two of the star's pets have been on the air themselves. Peewee, one of Jimmy Scribner's two fox terriers, is trained to bark, growl, and whine on a silent cue, and has been featured in many a Johnson Family script. Cookie, also a fox terrier and also one of a pair, belongs to Lois January. When Lois was airing "Reveille Sweetheart" in New York, Cookie was a regular feature on the show. She spoke, sang, and got most of Lois' fan mail. It got to the point where if Cookie didn't get her turn at the mike she would push Lois away from it. Cookie had a special permit allowing her in the building where the broadcasts were made, and she got all sorts of presents from her radio admirers. Cookie hasn't yet appeared on Lois' current "January's Calendar of Tomorrow" program, but it probably won't be long before she does, and when it happens, Lois will have to resign herself to second billing on that show too.

One of the most famous dogs in radio is Jack Bailey's Peanut. Peanut, of ambiguous heritage, is about as big as a minute, as sharp as a knife, and the complete center of attention

musical tastes—and Don likes them all.

He selects records, writes and plans his scripts, and spins the records on his three shows. At least, he usually spins the records; right now he's suffering from a badly infected finger on his right hand (yes, he got a piece of a record in it) that prevents him from juggling platters as nonchalantly as usual. Don plans and times his programs to the 'nth degree. "I want them to sound like a big musical show, not just like a guy with an armload of records," he explains.

Don's musical tastes are so all-inclusive and varied, that anyone who likes music at all can usually find a favorite record or two on Don's shows. He likes big bands, and thinks that jazz in its original forms is sadly outdated. "Big bands are the outgrowth and development of the little jazz bands, and what a soloist did with one instrument in the old days, a good arranger can arrange for a whole section," he claims. He thinks that Harry James has done more with bands than any other leader, and waxes enthusiastic over the James band of today. His favorite jazz musician is trumpet man Bobby Hackett. Wagner is his favorite classical composer, and at one time Don had a classical record program on another station.

A Swede

As a child in Oakland, Don studied violin for eight years. He says he was a pretty good student, but that the best violinist in the class was a little boy called Russ Colombo. We were amazed that Don was old enough to have been a contemporary of the long-dead popular singer, and we said so. Don laughed. "I'm a Swede," he said, "and don't you know about Swedes?—they never get old." When Don went to L. A. high he was concertmaster of the junior orchestra, and the only freshman to play with the senior orchestra.

When Charlie Chaplin's picture "The Gold Rush" was world-premiere at the Million Dollar Theater, Don got a job as usher. From there he went to the Metropolitan Theater, which for the benefit of newcomers is now the Paramount. Band leader Rube Wolfe encouraged him in his musical ambitions, and Cliff "Ukulele Ike" Edwards taught him to play the ukulele. Don's career as an usher carried him to Chicago and Detroit. At one theater he sang songs and played the banjo-uke in the lobby while someone went around selling the sheet music of the songs in the picture. He thinks the picture was Harry Richman in "Puttin' On the Ritz."

Don finally came back to Los An-

geles as a singer and M.C. in a downtown night club and from there stepped into radio.

He was raised by his grandmother who now lives in Rockford, Ill., and at the age of eighty-nine still shovels the snow from her sidewalks. "I wrote and asked her if there was anything she'd like me to send her, and she said she's like a dress. I know that she has a whole clothes closet full of them that she never wears. She just likes to look at them. So I sent her a very fancy dress she'll never wear, but it'll look awfully nice hanging up in her closet!"

Don has a four-year-old daughter, Karen. His wife, Betty, still doesn't like those names, platter juggler, or disc jockey. We tried valiantly to think of another name. "There must be one!" exclaimed Don.

The only thing we could think of was wax-whirler, and we don't think Mrs. Otis would like that either. And we don't blame her.

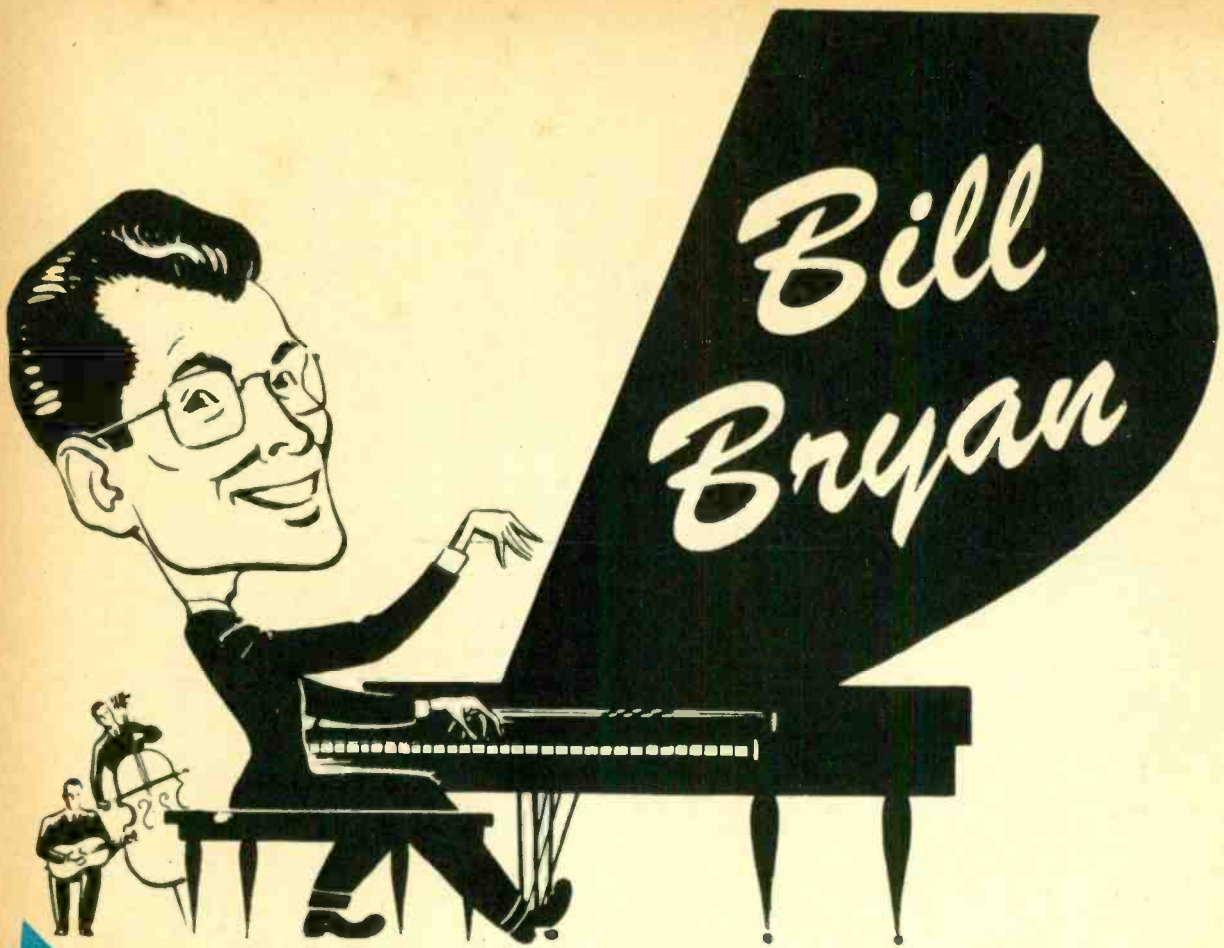
