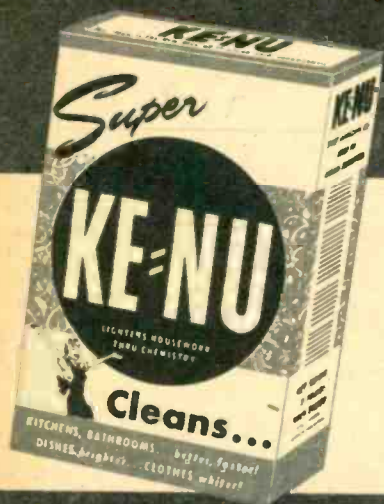

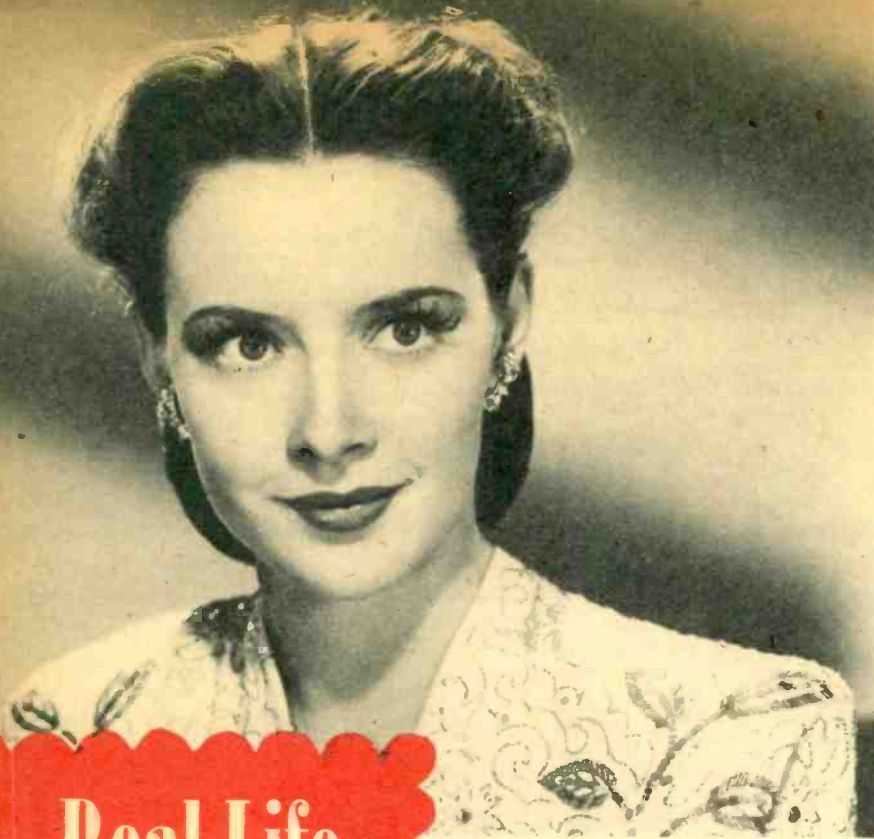

**I CAN WALK!"**  
The dramatic impact of this simple statement resounded in the hushed stillness of the fan-packed CBS Vine Street Theater as the words were spoken in a soft, steady voice by the pretty young girl seated onstage. The words were from the script in her hand and the girl was playing a part, but the audience well knew that, in this instance, certainly heroine and actress were, in the girl's own casual, cheerful way of saying it, "in the same boat."

The scene was the "Theater of Romance" broadcast of "Love Affair," the story of a girl who became paralyzed when she was struck down by an automobile on her wedding day. Playing the part was Susan Peters, the gifted young actress who became

paralyzed when she accidentally shot herself in the back while on a hunting trip during her honeymoon.

"Why did they make her do that play, of all things!" sympathized well-meaning onlookers, with the thought that portraying a part so startlingly parallel to the tragic occurrence in her own life must be proving a difficult experience for the youthful star.

"Van and I thought it would be a good one to do," was Miss Peters' simple explanation. "We chose it ourselves."

For the broadcast, Susan, dressed charmingly in a white organdy blouse and ankle-length plaid taffeta skirt, sat in a wheelchair at a table with a microphone and script before her, co-star Van Johnson seated beside her. It was the couple's second appearance together on the "Theater of Romance" stage. Their initial vehicle was a radio adaptation of "Seventh Heaven."

#### Was Afraid

Susan admitted that, following the first broadcast, she had been frightened by the sight of the fans which had thronged outside the stage door to view the two stars as they made their exit from the theater. Van preceded her out of the building and she watched fearfully while the enthusiastic youngsters milled around her popular co-star to the point of manhandling him.

Susan was to be carried to her car by her husband, actor Richard Quine, and, she recalled, "I was afraid they'd crowd Dick and make him fall or drop me."

What actually happened was a heart-warming experience for the young actress. As Quine stepped out of the theater with her in his arms, the fans stepped back, cleared a wide aisle for his passage, and broke into hearty, spontaneous applause for Susan.

"I was so grateful to them," she told us, her wide gray eyes glistening. "I wanted to keep saying, 'thank you, oh, thank you!' over and over again."

Susan Peters' recent appearance on CBS' "Lux Radio Theater" (in "Johnny Eager") was third microphone stint since her accident. One other (on "Cavalcade of America") was cancelled when illness prevented her appearance. "That's why, for the time being, I'm not appearing on the air more often," she explained. "I want to be sure I'm well enough to do it. I don't like having to call it off at the last minute."

When she believes her condition to be enough improved to do so, Miss Peters may appear in a weekly radio series. ("Possibly air previews of MGM screen stories," she specified, "if the studio likes the idea.")

Susan said that she preferred doing drama rather than comedy. "Love Affair" (the early sequences) had been her first attempt at deliver-

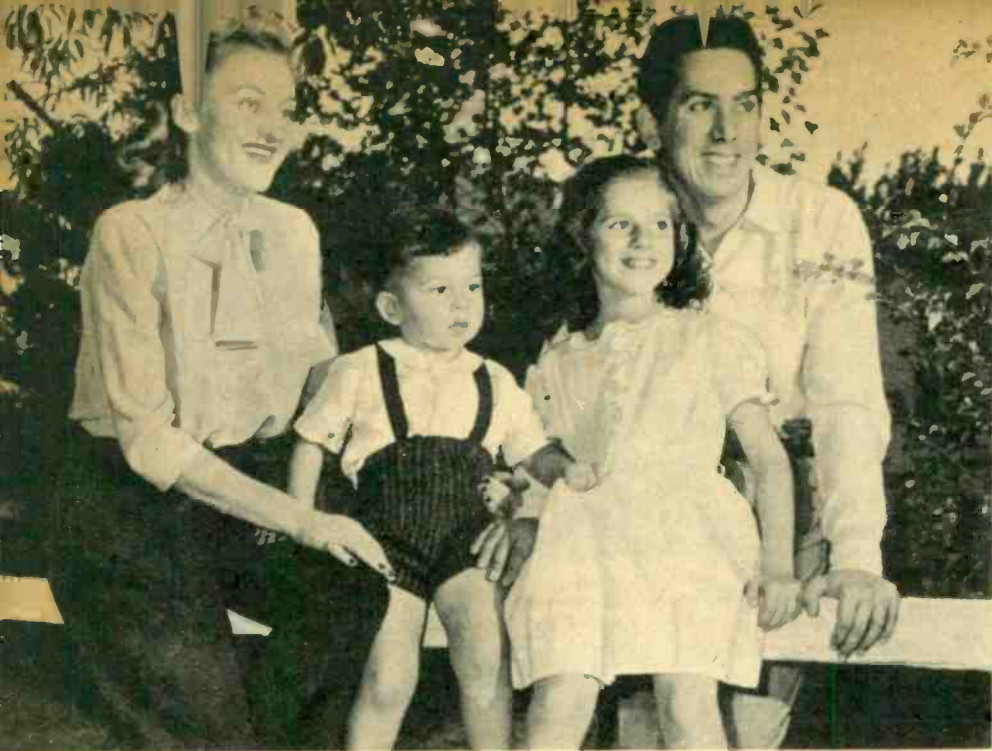

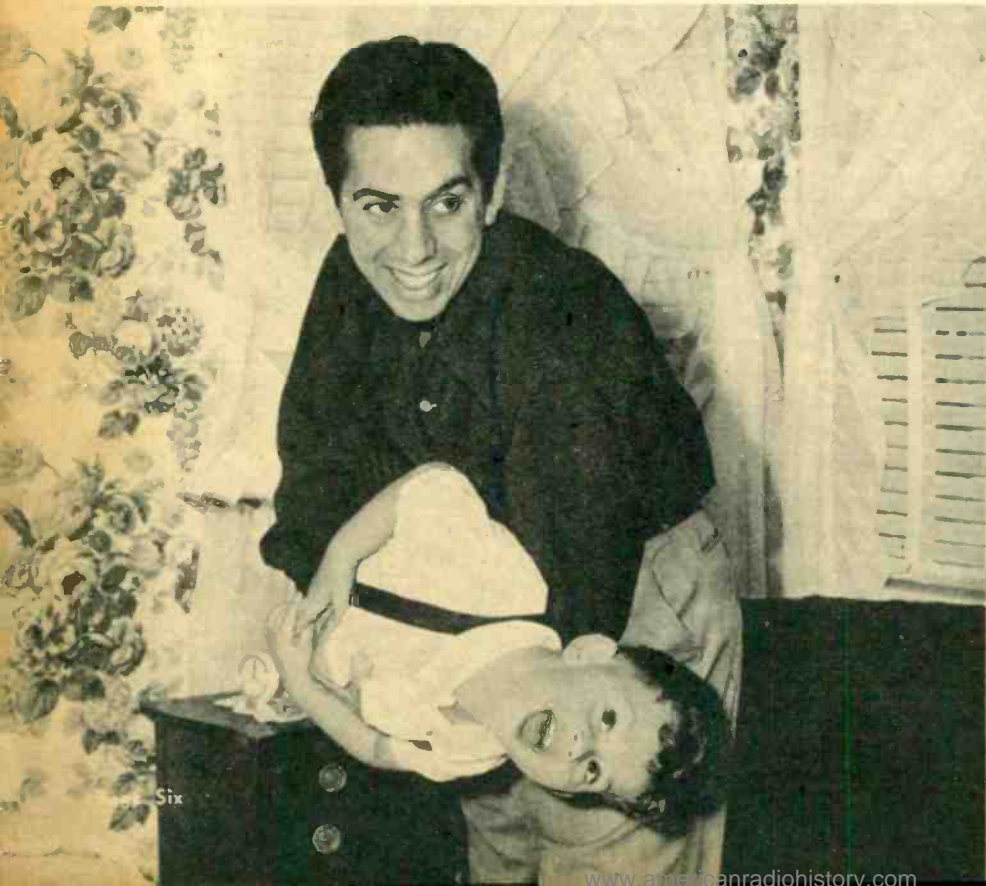

# Carmen On The Keys

**C**ARMEN CAVALLERO is that well-known figure, a Latin from Manhattan. And like many Manhattanites, he has taken up permanent residence in California. At least, it's as permanent as popular and hard-working Carmen can be for a while. We met Mr. Cavallero during his last week in Hollywood—he was soon to take off on a tour to New York—and his radio show was brand new.

"It's really a new field for me," he said, "and a great opportunity to do many things I haven't done before. For instance, the show has two big piano spots, 'Album Time,' where I select a nostalgic tune from yesterday, and the 'Poet's Scrapbook' which features a special arrangement for piano and orchestra. I also play many of the tunes I've recorded." Carmen's recordings have made him a favorite with fans everywhere, starting with his first "Dancing in the Dark."

Carmen started picking out tunes on the piano at the age of three; at six he was receiving instruction. His first professional job was playing at a summer camp when he was fourteen. "I got eight dollars a week and all the food I could eat. It turned out to be a good wage," he laughed, "I gained fourteen pounds and my mother didn't recognize me when I got home." He studied classics for ten years and gave many concerts, but admits that the glamor of popular music finally got him. However, he longs to do a concert tour and feels that someday he will return to the classics. No wonder that, of all musicians, Carmen was qualified to adapt the Chopin "Polonaise" in popular form on record.

### Neat Trick

Cavallero has a seven-year contract with Warner Brothers and his next appearance will be in "The Time, the Place and the Girl," in which the wildest trick ever dreamt up by a movie producer falls to Carmen.

They strung a piano and bench with wires and cables, hoisted it up in the air and made it float idly while Carmen played "Through a Thousand Dreams." "I was a little dizzy at first," Carmen admitted. "It's a very odd sensation." We can imagine. Anyway, it seems to us that it's hard enough to play the piano on the ground. It just proves that under any circumstances Carmen is a fine pianist.

Carmen hates distortion of facts about himself. He was terribly upset last year when a Hollywood paper printed an interview with him in which he asserted that not jazz was dying and being kept alive by a lot of old men who couldn't play. "A press agent was just trying to start an argument in order to get my name in the paper. I would never say a thing like that. Good musicians are good musicians no matter whether they play classics or jazz. A lot of people were mad at me because of that statement." We hope all those jazz lovers who were mad at Carmen see this. He even admitted he's taken part in jam sessions, "not, however, for public consumption," he laughed. Carmen likes the close, personal contact that comes from playing for a live audience. "I enjoyed playing here at Ciro's," he said, "I felt as though I were meeting people personally, and keeping in touch with them through music."

He used to do all his own band arranging, but no longer has the time. "That's something that band-leaders just don't have time to do. However, I still supervise all my band arrangements." Though Carmen has cut some of the most popular of piano records he admits to being supercritical of his own work. We asked him which of his records he liked best, anyway. "I'm never satisfied with them," he smiled ruefully. I suppose I could name one for you and let it go at that, but it just isn't true. I haven't made one to satisfy me yet." Carmen's deep love of classical music, which is apparent in his playing, led to an interesting parallel. We had asked him what kind of music or what composer he liked to listen to for his own enjoyment. "Well," he explained, "that's like asking a man to live on ice cream when what he really likes is food! You can't say one composer is greater than another. They were all great and what you don't find in one, you'll find in another."

#### Theme Song

Carmen's new home is in Sherman Oaks in San Fernando Valley. He's proud of the fruit trees and flowers and wants to get some pets for his children. He regrets that he has so little time to spend in his garden. He has two children Dolores, nine and Paul, two-and-a-half. Dolores is studying piano and getting some expert coaching from her father. He met his wife, Wanda, when she walked into Hotel Lexington in New York while he was playing "The

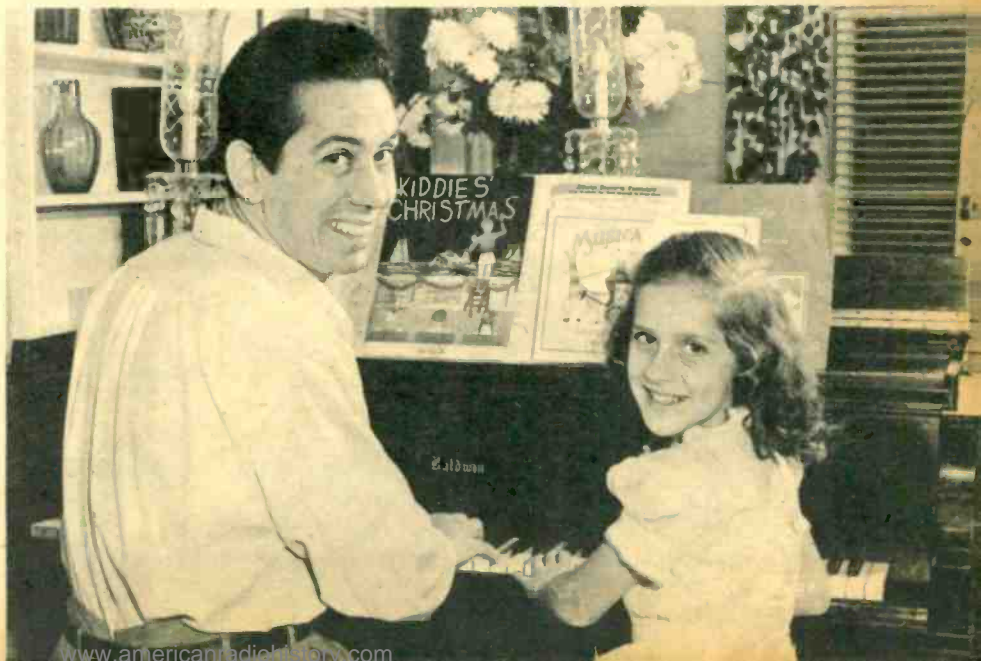
Very Thought of You." That was the first record Carmen recorded for his first album. It's been their romantic theme song.

Cavallero's hobbies are swimming and golf, when he has time for them. Also, throughout his career he has collected calling cards from friends and celebrities. While playing at a banquet in Washington, D. C. he managed to secure cards from most of the political figures of the day, including one belonging to the late President Roosevelt. We asked him if he included one of his own in the collection. "Oh, I don't even have one of my own," he laughed, "I'm just interested in other people's!"

There's only one thing wrong with his new Valley home, he says. He doesn't have a big enough record collection in it yet.

Carmen has a pet peeve that stems from his emphasis on honesty. "Some people have tried to make me out a Latin-American musician and pronounce my name 'Caval-yaro' as if it were Spanish. It's just plain Cavallero—pronounced with an 'L.' I'm of Italian descent and while I have many Latin-American rhythms in the piano and orchestral repertoire, I don't concentrate on them. We want to play all types of songs that the American public likes to hear and dance to."

*Horace Murphy Rode Wagon Shows and Show Boats Until His Colorful Career Led Him To Radio as "Buckskin" in "Red Ryder"*

**F**ROM SHOW BOAT to radio buckaroo... that's the saga of Horace Murphy, veteran actor who plays the part of "Buckskin" on KHJ-Don Lee's "Red Ryder" program.

Many Hollywood actors can remember the early days of crystal sets and carbon mikes, but Murphy

can remember the early days of show business per se. At eleven, he was already off to a good start... triple-tonguing a cornet. And at seventeen he was band leader of the Newton Family Wagon Show.

"Wagon shows," explains Horace, "means just what it says... a show that travelled in wagons. All I did was lead the band, clowned the

### ABS Out

Leonard A. Versluis, president of the Associated Broadcasting System, the fifth transcontinental network, last week announced discontinuance of the permanent line structure of the network.

Versluis attributed the decision in part to the exorbitant demands of musicians' unions. He stated: "The demands of musicians' unions in various parts of the country requiring the employment of many high-salaried musicians who were not needed dictated to a great extent the decision to discontinue the permanent line structure of Associated."

ABS has been operating on a sixteen-hour daily schedule since its inaugural program September 16, 1945. Discontinuance of the permanent line structure will place the West coast portion of the network on a per occasion basis, operating as it did for a year and a half prior to full time operations.

### Salute

Kudos to Neil Reagan, producer of CBS' "Dr. Christian" show. Seldom does a Wednesday go by that a servicemen's button (and usually several of them) isn't in evidence at the microphone of the Reagan production. The McCann-Erickson producer consistently gives good breaks to newcomers, particularly those who have recently returned from service.

### Lost and Found

Mrs. Andrews, mother of CBS' famed singing trio, lost her purse on the Sunset strip one recent afternoon. Two honest ladies found and returned it. ("The first time that anything lost has been returned to us," the girls stated grimly.)

In this instance, the purse was safely returned to Maxene of the singing sisters. "I was terribly grateful," she recounted to Radio Life, "but at the same time, it was a somewhat disconcerting experience." It seems the lady expressed regret at not being able to return the pocketbook to its owner personally. She told Maxene, "I was hoping I would get to see somebody famous!"

### Audition

Those prize KFWE platter-spinners, Al Jarvis and Peter Potter, last week waxed an audition record for a new

fifteen-minute show which they're calling "Business is Business." It's about a "hick" announcer (Potter) and a network "biggie" (Jarvis).

### Addition

There's been a last-minute change in the plans for that new "house of tomorrow" which Hyatt Dehn is building for CBS' Ginny Simms. They're adding a nursery.

### Look For It

Jimmy Scribner, creator and voices of Mutual-Don Lee's popular "Johnson Family," has just completed a new show, titled "In This Corner," and designed especially for children. The series will tell the story of a young Brooklyn prize-fighter and his hectic adventures in and out of the ring, and is designed to keep youngsters happy . . . "not heckle, voodoo, or scare the skin off them," Scribner explains.

Engineers and producers went gray before they discovered that Zimmerman was practicing an arrangement for "Adventures in Rhythm" in his dressing room, and that the arrangement was leaking right smack into the middle of "Red Ryder."

### Ring Dem Bells

Bert Parks, KHJ emcee-announcer, recalls that when he started his career, one of his first jobs was an early morning show. Being one of millions who hate to get up in the morning, alarm clocks meant nothing to Parks, until one gray day when he slept till just a few minutes before broadcast time . . .

ing laugh lines. "I've always done overly-dramatic things," she reminded us. "The timing is so different for comedy. And also," she added, smiling, "I have the wrong voice for it. Everybody says it's too low."

The actress also declared, "I don't like radio"—but explained further the reason: "I get so scared of the audience. It's not that little thing in front of me that bothers me." (We noted that the actress, though delivering her lines with seemingly casual skill, had appeared noticeably nervous on the stage.)

The rehearsal scheduled for the show had been arranged so that the star could receive her required rest (husband Dick was with her and her nurse was in attendance), but Susan, presenting such a charming appearance and merry manner, made it easy for one to forget her illness.

At the same time, she discussed it with ease and intelligence. She expressed a desire to work with paralytics like herself, particularly veterans in service hospitals (her early ambition, incidentally, was to be a doctor), and on the anniversary of her accident, she visited the patients at Birmingham Hospital. She feels she can give encouragement and cheer to the men (especially the spinal cases like herself) "because," she smiled, "we're in the same boat."

Her chief intention is to "get 'em outdoors." She hopes to arrange for their excursions to football games, prize fights, the races and other similar events. "I think that will do more for them than working with them in the wards," she asserted. "It's important that they get over the feeling of being invalided. I know how I felt when I was cooped up in the house. I want them to be able to go places like I do now."

horizontal bar act in the main show, did a wooden shoe acrobatic dance in the concert, helped put up the tent by swinging a sledgehammer on those pesky iron bound stakes, and drove one of the wagons over the road for six dollars a week and trimmings. I ate in the cook tent, slept under the big top when we were in camp and in the back of the wagon when we were on the road. I had to drive a little old gray mare on the road, so I'd just tie the reins loosely, crawl in the back and curl up and let her follow the trail on into the next camp.

"At the end of that season I joined a little dramatic show playing halls in small towns. At a little town in

Indiana we couldn't find a hall, so we played 'Ten Nights In A Bar-room' in an old dilapidated covered bridge.

### Joined Medicine Show

"The following spring I promoted myself to a honey of an engagement as band leader of the C. W. Parker Carnival Co. of Abilene, Kansas, 'Ike' Eisenhower's home town. The Parker carnival was a million dollar show, and I had a forty-five piece band and a soft spot. No more driving tent stakes and wagons. But I couldn't let well enough alone. All the time I had a craving to be an actor, so after two seasons with Parker at top money, I joined Dr. Rucker's Korak Wonder Medicine Show in Dallas, Texas. The deal was that I lead the band provided he let me act on the stage, for which I got \$12 a week and no room and board.

"The good doctor had a tent seating 2,000 paid customers, a company of 40 people, and believe it or not, a change of show every night six nights a week! They did full length plays with vaudeville between the acts . . . everything from Shakespeare to Jesse James. The first performance I appeared in was Faust, and the rent of my costume for the performance cost me my whole week's salary.

"One night a skunk got under the platform we used for a stage. The odor was terrific, and the cast elected me to climb underneath and get it out.

"For thirty-two weeks I stayed in Dallas, putting on a different show every night. When, after all that time, Rucker turned down my request for a two dollar a week raise, I went to Captain Price's 'Water Queen,' a show boat on the Mississippi River.

"Captain Price was a character out of a story book. He was the stingiest man I've ever known in my life; yet he was one of the most lovable. He never got mad at anything, no matter what happened, and he was always interested in the welfare of his people.

### Peculiar Pockets

"You could tell what day of the week it was by looking at Captain Price's pockets. During the week he'd collect old pieces of string, bent nails, rusty nails, bottle caps, all the junk he could find. By Saturday his pockets would be bulging. Sunday he'd empty them all out, put away the string and the bottle caps, straighten out the bent nails, put the rusty ones in kerosene, and start all over again.

"He was a millionaire, yet he never spent a dime more than he had to for anything. Once he bought a straw hat for ten cents which he wore constantly."

Until Murphy came on the scene, the repertoire of the "Water Queen" was confined exclusively to black-face comedy. To this the captain paid no attention. But when Murphy began putting on real melodramas, that was a different story. The captain had never seen a real play be-

fore, and he was completely absorbed. He had his own special seat in the center of the front row, which he refused to sell to anyone, money or no. In that chair he sat night after night, his eyes glued on the performance.

In one play the villain dragged the heroine on stage, chloroformed her, then shoved her off-stage into a closet when footsteps approached. The heroine's husband burst in on the scene, demanded to know the whereabouts of his wife.

### Captain Routed

Captain Price, catching the hero's eye, gesticulated wildly in the direction of the door through which the heroine had disappeared. The actor, deciding something must be very wrong, fumbled his lines trying to figure out what on earth the captain could be pointing to. Finally the captain could stand it no longer. He stood up and shouted in his best ship-to-shore bellow.

"Look in that off-shore door!"

The audience burst into shrieks of laughter and completely broke up the play, while the captain, brought back to earth with a thud and covered with confusion like a cloak, crept away in complete rout.

After the "Water Queen," Murphy bought a half interest in Captain Emerson's "Cotton Blossom" show-boat. Two years of that and he sold out in favor of a string of tent shows from coast to coast known as "Murphy's Comedians."

In 1914, Murphy came to California to retire. Retirement, he found, comes hard for an old showman. A year later he put out another string of shows in and around Los Angeles, among them the Strand Theater on Whittier boulevard. He sold all of them in 1928, this time to retire for sure.

Retirement in this case ended in pictures as Tex Ritter's comic, a post he didn't much care for. "They called me the comedian, but my material was more like a tragedy," he says. "The only time I ever got a belly laugh was when I purposely dropped my chaps so that the audience thought I'd lost my britches."

After Ritter came Gene Autry, and for three years Murphy played "Shorty Long." When Autry went into the Army, Murphy joined the "Red Ryder" cast where he's been ever since.

"And if there's anything else you want to know," he concludes, "just ask the sheriff."



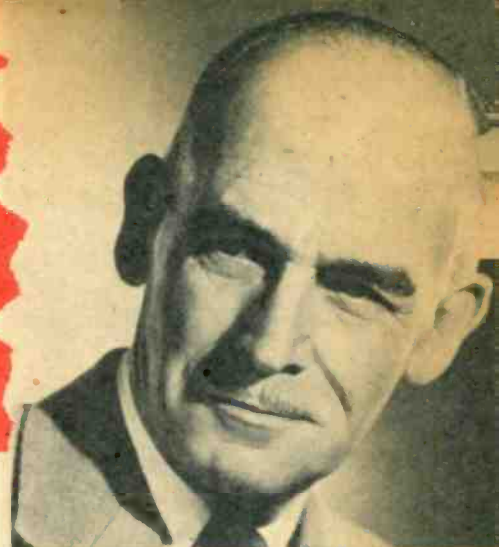

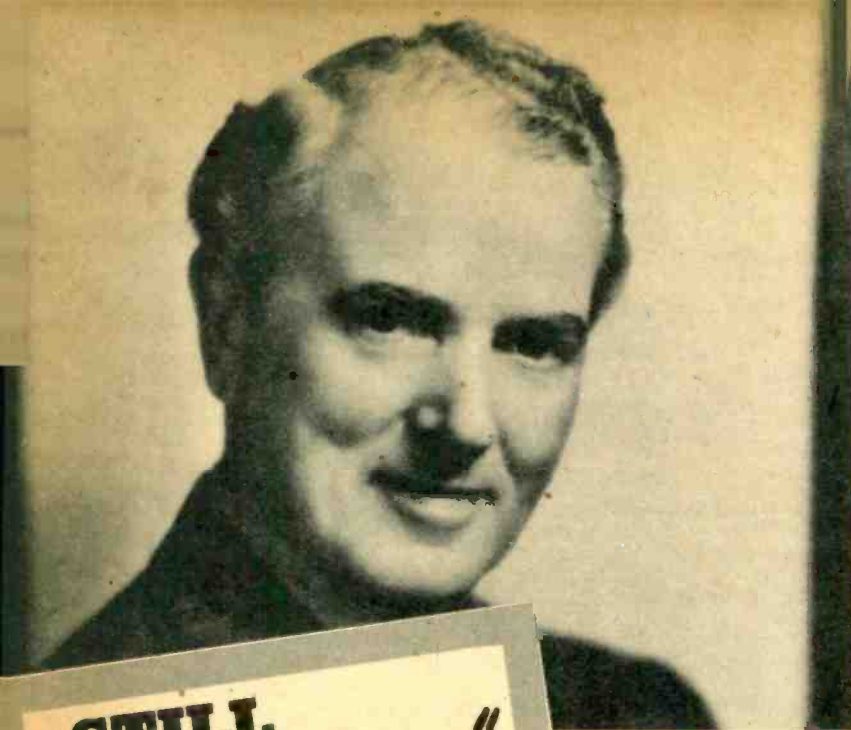

*Herbert Rawlinson, Idol of Early Film Epics, Is as Handsome and Dashing as Ever, and Still Has Fan Appeal as One of Radio's Top Performers*

**STILL**  
*"Box Office"*

**I**N ITSELF, the name Herbert Rawlinson conjures a wealth of sweet nostalgia and old memories for every early Hollywoodite and longtime moviegoer. It brings to mind the beginning of the fabulous American motion picture industry, those first impressive epics on celluloid and the picturesque cinema trail-blazers who made them, among the foremost of whom was Herbert Rawlinson. (Remember him as the dashing romantic Lothario of "The Sea Wolf," "The Spy," the Craig Kennedy detective series, "Come Thru," "The Passerby" and "The Black Box" serial, to name but a few.)

Today, ether audiences hear Herbert Rawlinson with frequent regularity on their favorite airshows ("Cavalcade of America," "This Is My Best," Screen Guild Players," "Lux Radio Theater," "Rogue's Gallery," etc.; he also played "Van Steven" of the Billie Burke program, is one of CBS' "Twelve Players"—off the air at this writing), and his tall, debonaire figure has become a familiar sight along radio row.

"As a matter of fact," Mr. Raw-

lanson smilingly informed us, "several radio producers have told me that the only reason they granted my initial request for an interview was curiosity. They wanted to find out what I look like now."

Fiftyish, blue-eyed, smooth-skinned, Herbert Rawlinson appears today as handsome and charming as he did some twenty years ago (the latter period of time the actor calls "a conservative estimate"), save for the whiteness of his, wavy hair which adds a striking dignity to his suave appearance. On the afternoon of our interview, he looked especially sporty in casual, light-colored slacks and a tan zipper jacket, with a jaunty red scarf folded in the open collar of his blue-checked sports shirt.

Continuing on the subject of his entrance into radio, Mr. Rawlinson considers it a notable achievement. Although he appeared at the microphone "spasmodically" for over a decade, it was just a few years ago that he began to work at an air career in real seriousness.

"I was told then to 'just try and get in,'" he recalled. "I was constantly reminded that the so-called 'inner circle' of radio was a tough one to break."

#### Is "In"

But if an 'inner circle' exists, Rawlinson is now a select member. He credits his own determination and perseverance, and the friendly encouragement and help of his fellow radio performers ("Nice fellows such as Wally Maher, Eddie Marr, Paul McVeigh and the like").

In the beginning, Rawlinson admits, he had little faith in radio. "I didn't believe in what I was doing," he says of his early air appearances. Today, his enthusiasm for radio is boundless. He has turned down further film assignments to devote himself to his career at the microphone. His biggest ambition in this direction is to secure an emceeing

"host" role on a good weekly program. He was offered such an assignment on the "First Nighter" series, but turned it down because it would have meant deserting California for Chicago.

The Rawlinsons have a home in Hollywood. The actor's wife, Lorraine, is a non-professional. "She studied for two years with the idea of becoming a ballet dancer," Mr. R. related, adding merrily, "but then the thought suddenly occurred to her that being married to an actor would be much nicer."

The Rawlinsons have two children—son David, nineteen, and daughter Sally, twenty-one. "They're good kids," Herb (He likes being addressed in this friendly manner) declared modestly. "We've had quite a time with them," he went on happily. "Sally has her library of plays and theater books; Dave has gone through the motor scooter stage and taken great pride in a series of hopped-up jalopies—five of them altogether, I think. What wrecks!"

Dave is now serving in the Merchant Marine. Sally is now majoring in dramatics, and recently portrayed the title role in a school presentation of "Claudia." "And she was darn good!" exclaimed her father, energetically whacking his knee. "She really gave an excellent twenty-year-old performance."

Resuming then the topic of his own career, Mr. Rawlinson obliged us with a choice bit of reminiscing.

He first came to Los Angeles from the east to be the stage manager of a stock company at the old Belasco theater on Fourth and Main. Hobart Bosworth played an engagement with the company during Lewis Stone's vacation, and Bosworth, who was then a member of the Selig Polyscope Company, suggested that Rawlinson also join this group. Later, and also through Bosworth, the athletic young actor ("I jumped off

cliffs and the like.") became leading man at Universal.

#### Privileged Persons

His first films were three Spanish productions, "The Novice," "The Medallion" and "When the Gringos Came." "We had some sort of contract with the missions," he recalled. "Our company was even allowed into the sacred gardens, where previously, I believe, no woman had ever been permitted to enter."

Universal was then an all-wooden structure located where the Columbia parking lot is now. Across the street (where CBS' modern broadcasting studios are today) was the old Christie Comedies studio. "My dressing room," smiled Rawlinson, "was about in the spot just behind Brittingham's Restaurant. It was just a little room with a table and a mirror at which I sat to apply my makeup. No makeup men in those days," he reminded

us, "and I've always preferred to put on my own greasepaint anyway."

In those days, there were no elaborate legal contracts, either, he related further. "Just a shake of the hand and a comradeship. It was great. Every day, we were out there working together—rain or shine. That is, mostly shine. There were no lights then, of course. If it rained, we went home and played poker."

Most amusing memory Mr. Rawlinson called to mind concerned the time he was appearing in "Damon and Pythias." Highlight of the picture was a thrilling chariot race which had Herbert, as the heroic "Pythias," driving four stallions at a fast and furious pace—"something, I assure you, I had never done before," he interpolated at this point.

The director then set about obtaining crowds of spectators to be witnesses of the exciting event. With an eye on the studio budget, he noted that a convention was in town at the time. He immediately phoned the chairman and magnanimously invited the entire assembly of delegates—their wives, included—to watch a motion picture in the making. Then, as the crowd of celebrants were hustled into the grandstands surrounding the spacious area, they were issued cotton smocks with the explanation that they were to be photographed and were supposed to appear as Romans.

The incongruous result was that movie audiences who viewed the picture saw, as cheering Romans at the chariot race, this gay group of convention delegates ceremoniously garbed in Roman togas, but at the same time decked out in an absurd variety of modern chapeaux!

"The Roman atmosphere," smiled Mr. Rawlinson in remembrance, "was somewhat punctured by the derbies, straw hats and cigar smoke."

But it is doubtful that the moviegoers of that day, enthralled by the climactic chariot race and entranced at the sight of the dauntless "Pythias," took any notice of the weird effects in the background.

Nor was Mr. Rawlinson's recollection of the scene without its grim note. He remembered that it was a simmering summer day with the sun beating down in full force. "We were sweltering under the terrific heat," he frowned. "Our skins became covered with big water blisters." (Remembering how he and the other pioneers of the film industry underwent every sort of hardship and worked under the most primitive conditions, Rawlinson remarked, "If the youngsters of today can't make good in the business as it is now—with its vast organization and skilled technicians and modern equipment—

they're just not worth their salt!")

"We had no stand-ins or stunt men," he went on. "I drove those four horses in the chariot race myself, and on other occasions, I fell off trains, climbed mountains, and jumped from speeding autos to zooming airplanes!"

### Still In Form

(Mr. Rawlinson is somewhat as agile and athletically-inclined today. He can still do the "splits" and "make like six o'clock by tossing one of his limber limbs straight up over his head!")

Concluding our most enjoyable visit, Mr. Rawlinson laughingly related an incident that occurred recently at an afternoon rehearsal of a "Suspense" broadcast. During an idle interval, the actor was entertaining the other cast members with tales of his experiences as the hero of early screen epics. He related with relish the time, for a sequence in one adventurous production, he had to ride daringly on top of a racing automobile, leap to the wing of a hedge-hopping airplane, crawl into the cockpit as the plane soared into the sky, then have a knock-down, drag-out fight with the villainous pilot, take over the controls himself and set off to rescue the fair heroine.

As he finished talking, a wide-eyed youth who had entered the studio in the middle of Rawlinson's story, piped up with "Gosh, Mr. Rawlinson, did you used to be a movie stunt man?"

her able to walk again is Capt. Jack W. (Bob) Gregory, chief of the physical reconditioning and retraining hospital at the Santa Ana Army Air Base (though he will be back in civilian life by the time this reaches the press). In the time he can allow from his regular Army duties, Capt. Gregory is devoting himself to putting Susan back on her feet.

"The thing is, however," Gregory pointed out when we commended him for his work, "it is Susan herself who has to do it. Our first hurdle, of course, was the psychological adjustment. She had become terribly discouraged by the conclusions others had come to about the case." He repeated that in any discussion of his work with disabled persons (he refuses to call them "handicapped"), the importance of the patient's mental attitude toward the illness should be doubly stressed.

(In addition to his Master's Degree in physical education from the University of London, Gregory holds a Bachelor's Degree in psychology. His own background story is an inspiring one of a young boy, confined to a wheelchair for two years as a result of an accident, who made a vow that he would devote his life to helping disabled people. Gregory's

record of study includes three years at London's St. Thomas Hospital, a time spent studying orthopaedics under Mensendieck at Berlin Hospital and the poliomyelitis treatment under Sister Kenny, plus an additional period spent at the Roehampton Amputation Center in England. Sports-lovers are familiar with Gregory's name for his achievements as British Empire wrestling champion—1937-38; British Olympic representative—1928; and ju-jitsu champion of Great Britain—1935-38.)

Continuing on the subject of Susan Peters' fight for recovery, Capt. Gregory praised her highly for the courage and will-power she summoned, once the early barriers of despair and discouragement had been broken down.

"The patient has to undergo intense physical strain in order to make this treatment effective," he explained. "I once attempted to force myself to do the things Susan is required to do, and I just couldn't do it, because I was aware that I could toss aside the heavy braces and crutches and walk. It requires the superhuman strength which can be summoned only by someone who knows he can walk again solely through his own will to do so."

"Susan," he went on, "has a very intelligent outlook on her disability, and she is utterly determined to conquer it. She works tirelessly toward this goal. Our biggest battle now is outside disease and infection which are apt to weaken her ability to fight."

### Feels Routine

He told us that the actress' daily schedule includes a precise series of exercises—to strengthen certain muscles in compensation for those she cannot use, to regulate breath control, to maintain correct balance and posture. (He remarked that the actress has the best posture of all his patients, which Susan attributes to her horsemanship.) In her home at Malibu, Capt. Gregory has built for her walking bars which aid her greatly in practicing balance and taking those first difficult steps. Susan's instructor told us also that his young patient had courageously worked first of all with the most difficult crutches, foregoing the two preliminary types.

He praised, too, the actress' young husband. "Dick has studied the histories of spinal cases such as Susan's, and has contributed some very worthwhile ideas which I've been able to put to practical use.

"With her determination to become completely independent," Capt. Gregory said again, "Susan can't lose. She did all of her own Christmas shopping last season, incidentally, and she's now waiting for a new car with special attachments which will allow her to drive."

Then, with the same confidence with which Susan herself had said it, he assured us:

"She will walk."
