"Snooks," Fanny confessed, "is just the kid I used to be. My brain worked just the way hers does, and it was always full of schemes. Often my brother Lew and I would team up

to put them into operation, and we were a sharp pair."

Miss Brice then recalled, by way of illustration, one of the more ingenious and profitable of these crafty projects, which rarely failed to yield a big day at Coney Island, though she and her brother had started out with empty pockets,

Their Strategy

"We lived on St. Mark's Avenue, Brooklyn, then," she said. "A block away ran the Bergen Street car line. At the corner you could transfer from a Bergen to a Vanderbilt car, which ran to Coney. Some passengers got transfers who didn't use them, so we worked these over, one after another, until, we had two of those precious little pieces of colored paper. With these, a handkerchief and some pebbles we were all set to begin our ride."

The pebbles, Miss Brice explained, were knotted into a corner of the handkerchief. Aboard the Vanderbilt car, then of the open-type, it was her part of the act to swing the handkerchief around with studied carelessness, singing out the while so that nearby passengers could overhear, "I have seventy-five cents, I have seventy-five cents."

The transfers being good for only part of the ride to Coney, the conductor would soon appear to collect a second fare. Timing her operations carefully, the slick little Fanny would anticipate his arrival by allowing the handkerchief with its apparent treasure of coins up in one corner suddenly to fly from her hand as if by accident. 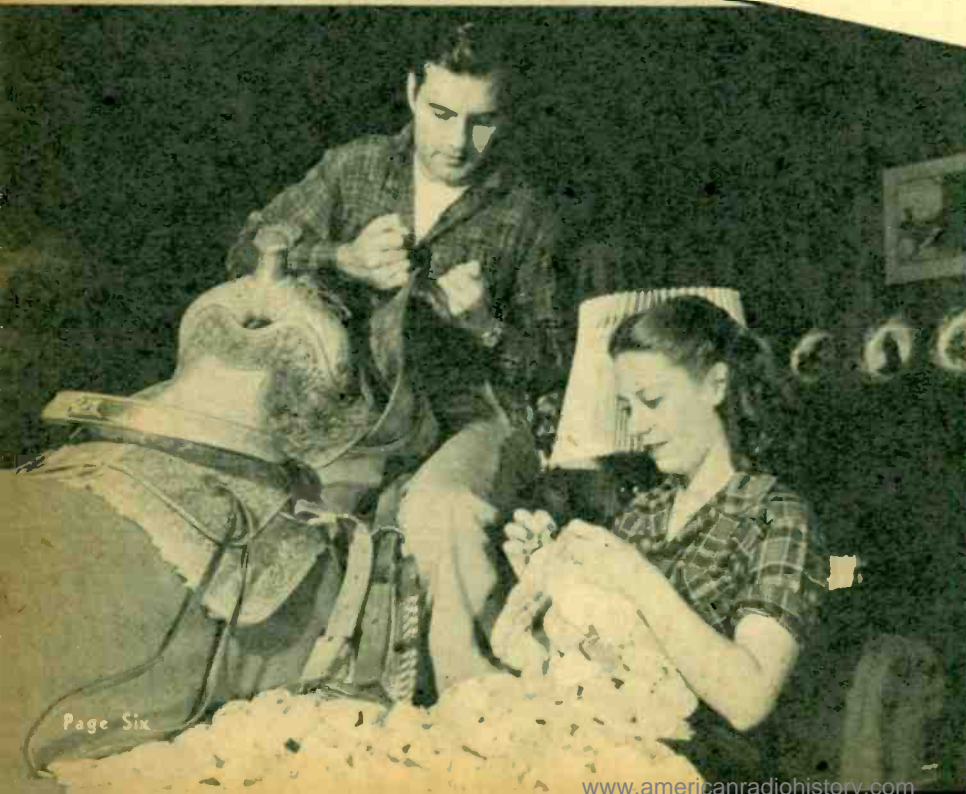

A New Kind of

GENIAL MAURI is as fond of "his kids" as they are of him. He receives more invitations to participate in their activities than there are hours in the day.

IF YOU took a popularity poll among today's teen-agers, would you be surprised at the winner? He'd probably be a young fellow by the name of Mauri Cliffer. And if you don't know who Mauri Cliffer is, you're not hep!

Slightly-built, sparse-locked, Cliffer can't understand why the kids "take to him." "Anybody can see I'm not the Van Johnson or David Street type, so you doubly imagine the thrill I get when hundreds of youngsters write in to share their happiness as well as their troubles with me."

Cliffer is probably better qualified than anyone else around these parts to know the troubles of young America. He receives hundreds of letters about them weekly, for Mauri is

emcee and man behind that popular 'teen-aged show, "Teen and Twenty Time."

When it began its unpretentious career in November of 1944, "Teen and Twenty Time" was another recorded half hour. Cliffer was (and still is) sponsored by the Telephone Company. There must be an easier way, he decided, to interest young misses in the merits of the company. Before long he had them so interested in what he was saying that he began receiving letters and requests. These grew and grew until today you're apt to find Mauri at the very bottom of a huge mail pile.

Cooperative Enterprise

"T and T Time" is run entirely by its audience. It's wish is Cliffer's

command. The only requisite for membership is that you belong to a club or canteen actively engaged in useful deeds. The clubs are invited to the weekly Friday jamboree (the only audience get-together) to inform Mauri and other members of activities. At present Cliffer has some 1800 clubs on his roll book, with an average of one hundred requests for admittance pouring in weekly.

The secret of Mauri's charm, we discovered, lies in a friendly attitude toward "his kids." He never talks down to them, never uses insincere "hep talk," nor treats them as children. And that, if you haven't tried it, is an art.

He's sincerely interested in their activities and receives more invitations to participate than there are hours in the day. He knows what they like in the way of music (Monday through Thursday's shows are dedicated to fulfilling record requests), what they're talking about—and more important, what they're thinking.

Name Own Projects

"My real interest in the show is the wonderful job the kids are doing. I never suggest any projects; they are all their own ideas, such as our recent collections of used playing and Christmas cards."

The Friday Radio Life attended a session of "T and T Time," several hundred 'teen-agers had gathered to welcome orchestra leader Boyd Raeburn. Other guests have included movie star Bob Mitchum, Jack Carson and Dave Willock, Dave Street, and many more big-name radio stars. In most cases, the guests are requested by the members.

Cliffer begins his Friday afternoon meeting with roll call. Among the latecomers the day we visited were the Mauri Clifferettes, Mauri's own fan club. "Ah," he grinned, "they just don't want me to get conceited."

Immediately the air was rent by distressing wails of "I've lost my money," accompanied by sobs and tears. In the face of such crushing misfortune hearts inevitably would be touched, and seldom did someone in the crowd fail to toss the conductor a dime to save the unhappy youngsters from being put off the trolley.

This, however, was merely the first act of the little comedy-drama, "Going to Coney." Arriving at the resort, the pair lost no time. Here was a whole day's fun to be had, if one could only continue to lay hold of the required nickels and dimes, and the wily young Brices had their plot well laid.

Return Trip

Picking a likely subject for their stratagem—"usually a kindly-looking fat man, if we could find one," Miss Brice recalled, they would inquire as to "the shortest way to walk back to Brooklyn." Almost without fail, the unsuspecting victim would fall into the trap and reply that walking to Brooklyn was out of the question; it was much too far.

"But we gotta walk," the budding Snooks would insist. "We spent all our money."

This usually brought a contribution of at least two nickels, often more. Thanking the kindly donor the two would quickly slip away, to turn up next at the dispensary where chocolate ice cream or sodas could be bought, or perhaps on the roller-coaster, which always provided especially fitting thrills with which to start the day's fun. Repeated as needed, this ingenious, if not altogether ethical procedure, was good for endless, unforgettable hours such as could be spent only at Coney.

"My childhood days were filled with such experiences," Miss Brice said, "so if Snooks is no angel, what would you expect? She's my kind of youngster, the type I like. She has imagination. She's eager. She's alive. With all her deviltry, she still is a good kid, never vicious nor mean."

Snooks, the actress added, must never appear as trying to be funny and must avoid the wisecrack.

"I love Snooks," she said, "and when I play her I do it as seriously as if she were real. I am Snooks. For twenty minutes or so, Fanny Brice ceases to exist."

First tentative approach to the Baby Snooks character, according to Miss Brice, was made as long ago as 1914. Then in vaudeville, she was singing "Poor Pauline," a song suggested by the exploits of a contemporary movie heroine in a melodramatic series, "The Perils of Pauline." One night at a party, called upon to entertain, she did the song in the high-pitched treble of a little girl and with all the mimicry this sug-

gested to her. The effect was gratifying.

Seeing possibilities in a child-first act of the littletoinshrdluetaou character for her stage act, Miss Brice thought of developing it, but several persons whose advice she sought dissuaded her. Though subsequently, from time to time, she returned to the idea, it remained on the shelf, she says, until 1921. Then, once again at a party, she became a child in voice and gesture to sing on an impromptu program. So well pleased was she with the way the song went over, that next day she repeated the performance in her vaudeville act.

"That, I would say," to quote Miss Brice, "was the beginning of Snooks in the theater."

Radio listeners first heard Miss Brice's child character, though briefly, in 1932 when the actress went on the air with George Olsen's band. She brought it back to broadcasting four years later in a series with Gus Haenschen's orchestra, an occasion made especially notable by the finding of Hanley Stafford for the role of father.

"We had forty men auditioning for the part," said Miss Brice, "Hanley was the second to be heard. I didn't need to listen any more. He was perfect."

Radio Life adds its wishes for many happy returns on Snooks' Silver Anniversary, and hopes that ensuing years may rest as lightly on her mischievous head.

their names, and you never see their faces.

They're the unsung heroes, the real backbone of radio routine. They have more fun than anybody, more charm than most people . . . and far less heralding than they deserve! They're the staff announcers. From their ranks come most of the outstanding voices on the air . . . and they're literally the "staff of life" in the business of broadcasting.

And just to make this introduction formal-like, step up and meet 'em by name: Bob Fisk, Joe Walters, Bob Moon, Roy Rowan, Ed Chandler, James Matthews, Bob Shannon, Murry Wagner, Maury Webster and Alan Botzer, plus producer-announcers Tom Hanlon, Dave Vaile and Cliff Howell.

Did You Know?

✓ You hear these voices on the air more often than any other sound during the course of a broadcast

day, and yet you, no matter how dyed-in-the-wool you may be as a radio fan, are probably not aware of that surprising fact. For instance . . . if you were to keep your radio tuned to Station KNX from five forty-five in the morning until one-five the following day, you'd hear these voices approximately seventy-five times in that stentorian and vital duty known colloquially as the "station-break." In addition to that, you'd hear them announcing local and Pacific Coast commercials, some coast-to-coast commercials and all sustaining features, 'round the clock.

Feel like clearing your throat?

Being a radio announcer is not all glamour. A staff spieler should, to keep his sanity, be endowed with the sense of humor of a Puck, the histrionic ability of a Barrymore, the vocal fortitude of a carnival barker . . . and the patience of Job!

The sense of humor is a "must"

because it's to the announce-booth that nine out of every ten "nuisance" telephone calls are referred. Particularly during "off" hours, when other offices in the building are shut tight, the announcers are called upon to answer questions, soothe ruffled nerves and head off the usual quota of "screwball" queries aimed at every radio station. During early-morning and late-evening hours, staff announcers act as supervisors in charge of station operations . . . which means that they are called upon to take over in case of any and all program-operation emergencies.

The acting ability has a two-fold purpose. It's necessary, first of all, because staff announcers are required to step to the mikes on a wide variety of programs, from news broadcasts to comedy-variety shows. And it's necessary, secondly, because

The Script President Truman Requested



George and Gracie Merit Executive Approval with Show About Washington

Thursday, 8:30 p.m.
NBC-KFI-KFSI

GEORGE BURNS and Gracie Allen, whose comedy program is consistently productive of good scripts, came through with a honey on February 21, 1946. Built around the idea of George receiving an official-looking letter asking him to come to Washington to help and signed "Harry," the broadcast was packed with clever lines and humorous situations.

President Truman and his family were listening that night and he was so pleased that he wired immediately: "We all enjoyed show immensely. There was more truth than poetry in many of the jokes. Mrs. Truman, Margaret and myself listened with a lot of pleasure. I'd like a copy of the script."

Thinking that Radio Life readers who heard the show might, like the President, want a copy of the script, and that those who didn't might like to be exposed to it (and a few laughs), we herewith reprint it.

BILL: Well, it's afternoon as we look in at the Burns Home, and we find Mr. and Mrs. Burns trying to decide how to spend the evening.

GRACIE: Would you like to go out this evening, George?

GEORGE: I don't mind, if you would.

GRACIE: I'd just as soon, if you would.

GEORGE: It's all right with me. If you'd like to.

GRACIE: Sure. Unless you'd rather stay home. Would you?

GEORGE: I don't mind, if you would.

GRACIE: I'd just as soon. Unless you'd rather go out.

GEORGE: I don't mind, if you'd like to.

GRACIE: Oh I'd like to go out, if you really want to.

GEORGE: Okay. I'll go shave. Unless you'd rather stay home.

GRACIE: Oh no. Unless you would.

GEORGE: Not me. If you want to go out.

GRACIE: All right. Would you like to see a movie?

GEORGE: I don't mind, if you would.

GRACIE: I would.

GEORGE: Okay. I'll go shave.

GRACIE: Swell.

GEORGE: Good.

GRACIE: Unless you'd rather stay home.

GEORGE: Oh no. Unless you would.

GRACIE: Oh no. I'll go get dressed. If you're sure you'd like to go out.

GEORGE: I don't mind, if you would.

GRACIE: George.

GEORGE: Yes?

GRACIE: The heck with it!

GEORGE: Yeah. The heck with it. Let's just stay home.

GRACIE: Sure.

GEORGE: Okay.

GRACIE: Swell . . . Unless you'd rather go out.

GEORGE: I don't mind, if you would.

GRACIE: I'd just as soon, if you would.

GEORGE: It's all right with me. I'll go shave.

GRACIE: And I'll go get dressed.

GEORGE: Good.

GRACIE: Fine . . . Unless you'd rather stay home.

GEORGE: Listen, this is silly. Would you like to go out or would you like to stay home. Make a definite statement.

GRACIE: All right.

GEORGE: What is it?

GRACIE: Either way suits me.

GEORGE: All right, I'll make the decision. We'll stay home.

GRACIE: No we won't—we'll go out.

GEORGE: Gracie—

SOUND: Telephone rings.

GRACIE: There's the telephone. Are you expecting a call?

GEORGE: No. Are you?

GRACIE: No.

SOUND: Telephone rings.

GRACIE: Would you like to answer it?

GEORGE: I don't mind. Unless you would.

GRACIE: I'd just as soon. Unless you would.

SOUND: Telephone rings.

GEORGE: Okay, I'll answer it. Unless you want to.

GRACIE: I don't mind, unless you'd rather.

SOUND: Telephone rings.

GRACIE: Gracie, stop being silly! Answer that phone!

GRACIE: Don't order me around. You answer it.

GEORGE: Since when do you tell me what to do. You answer it.

SOUND: Telephone rings.

GRACIE: I won't touch it.

GEORGE: Neither will I.

SOUND: Telephone rings.

GRACIE: Bridge.

BILL: Meanwhile, on the other end of that ringing telephone, we find the Burnses' friends, Blanche and Harry Morton.

SOUND: Phone receiver . . . hangs up.

George Necessary?

HARRY: Aw nuts! . . . they still don't answer.

BLANCHE: Who're you trying to call, Harry?

HARRY: George Burns. I got a job for him. I want him to go up to Seattle and help pick my apples.

BLANCHE: Oh Harry, are you still trying to get apple pickers?

HARRY: Darn right I am. I've got one of the finest orchards in the state of Washington and I'm not gonna let those apples rot.

BLANCHE: But Harry, you can't make an apple picker out of an actor.

HARRY: I know. That's why I'm taking George Burns . . . and he won't have to be up in Washington more than a couple of weeks.

BLANCHE: But the Burnses have a radio show every Thursday night.

HARRY: Why does the show need George?

BLANCHE: Why George is the one who does all the —uh—he tells tell the —uh—he . . . well don't stand there, call him back.

HARRY: They won't be home yet. I got a better idea. Here comes the Postman—I'll just write a note and have him deliver it to the Burns house.

BLANCHE: Okay, Harry.

GRACIE: Bridge.

SOUND: Door buzzer.

GEORGE: You want to see who's at the door, Gracie?

GRACIE: Sure. Unless you want to.

GEORGE: Oh let's not start that again.

GRACIE: All right—I'll go.

SOUND: Footsteps—Door opens.

POSTMAN: Good afternoon, Mrs. Burns.

GRACIE: Oh hello, Mr. Postman. How are you today?

POSTMAN: Oh Mrs. Burns, I feel gloriously alive today! I'm invigorated, stimulated, activated . . . I'm jumpin' with joy!

GRACIE: My goodness, you must tell my husband what kind of vitamins you use.

POSTMAN: It isn't vitamins that makes me so happy. I gave my wife a black eye.

GRACIE: Well! At last the worm turned!

POSTMAN: No—she was facing me.

GRACIE: I meant she's been beating you up long enough. You shouldn't stand for it.

POSTMAN: That's what I told my wife. I said, 'Bertha, I won't stand for this.'

GRACIE: Then what happened?

POSTMAN: Next thing I knew I was flat on my face . . . That's when I got mad! I leaped to my feet! The fighting blood rushed to my head!

GRACIE: Good!

POSTMAN: One klop from Bertha and it rushed out again . . . But now I was really mad! Every ounce of my virile manhood cried for revenge! The beast in me said, 'fight—fight fight!'

GRACIE: And that's when you gave her the black eye!

POSTMAN: Yes!

GRACIE: Tell me just how it happened.

POSTMAN: She tried to kick me and her shoe flew off and hit her in the eye.

GRACIE: (Laughs) Oh Mr. Postman—I thought you hit her.

POSTMAN: Me? You think I want to get killed? Well, here's your mail, Mrs. Burns. Goodbye, and remember, keep smiling.

SOUND: Door close.

GEORGE: What came in the mail, Gracie?
GRACIE: Oh the usual stuff, Bills, and a letter from . . . wait a minute! Here's a funny one—a letter addressed to you, but there's no stamp on it.

Official Business

GEORGE: I wonder what that could be?
GRACIE: It must be some sort of official government letter. They're the only ones that don't need stamps.

GEORGE: Well, let's read it.

SOUND: Envelope open. Letter unfolded.

GEORGE: (Reads) DEAR GEORGE: I NEED YOUR HELP TO HANDLE A BIG JOB IN WASHINGTON. HOPE I CAN COUNT ON YOU. HARRY. (Puzzled) Washington? Harry?

GRACIE: Oh darling, how wonderful! I'm so proud of you!

GEORGE: What do you mean?

GRACIE: Don't you see? Harry Truman needs your help in Washington!

GEORGE: The President? Wants me to help him?

GRACIE: Why not? You're one of the great minds of this country.

GEORGE: Oh go on. Am I really?

GRACIE: One of the greatest, George. It's always been a miracle to me how such high thoughts come out of such a low forehead.

GEORGE: Well true I've got a lot of brains.

GRACIE: You bet you have. If you weren't a brilliant man the Maxwell House People wouldn't have you on the air advertising their coffee.

GEORGE: Say, come to think of it, the President has been calling on advertising men to help him. Chester Bowles came from an advertising agency. So did William Benton.

GRACIE: Certainly. And look who he took from Billie Barton Durstine and Osborne.

GEORGE: Who?

GRACIE: Well out of that crowd he must have gotten somebody.

George Still Dubious

GEORGE: But I still can't imagine the President calling on me to help. There are a lot of men in radio smarter than I am.

GRACIE: Name a couple.

GEORGE: Well, there aren't that many.

GRACIE: Look at the uncanny grasp you have of international affairs. I'll never forget what you said last summer just after my mother had gone back home.

GEORGE: What did I say?

GRACIE: You said, 'Now we'll have peace.'

And the very next day Japan surrendered.

GEORGE: Yeah, I had a hunch. But gee, it's still hard to believe that President Truman wants me to help run—

SOUND: Door buzzer.

GRACIE: Come in.

SOUND: Door opens.

BILL: Hello Buruses.

GEORGE: Hi Bill.

GRACIE: Oh Bill, you're the first to hear the news.

BILL: What news, Gracie?

GRACIE: Guess who wants George to help the Democrats run the country.

BILL: The Republicans.

GEORGE: A laugh a minute, this boy. Wil-

lie the WH, they call him.

GRACIE: This is no joke, Bill. The President has sent for George to come to Wash-

ington.

BILL: What!

GRACIE: It's true. He probably listened to George on the radio and figured the government should have him in Washington.

GRACIE: Oh—yes. Yes, he did, your High-

ness.

HARRY: What?

GRACIE: He got the note, your Excellency.

HARRY: What's the idea calling me all that stuff?

GRACIE: What should I call you?

HARRY: Just call me Harry. I'm democ-

cratic.

GRACIE: Well naturally, or you wouldn't be where you are.

HARRY: You don't have to softsoap me just because I'm offering George a job. It happens to be the sort of thing a guy with his brains can handle. Will he take it?

GRACIE: Of course he will. And you'll find that he's the hardest worker in the whole United States.

HARRY: Oh yeah? Well, I'm from Mis-

soury.

GRACIE: So I've heard, your Lordship.

HARRY: Oh stop. Tell George I'll get in touch with him later and let him know when to leave for Washington. Goodbye.

GRACIE: Goodbye, your Reverence.

SOUND: Phone on hook.

GEORGE: Gosh, Gracie, was that . . . ?

GRACIE: The President himself! And he's just as friendly and pleasant as one of our neighbors.

Will Budget Fiscals

GEORGE: And he really wants me in Washington?

GRACIE: He insists on it. Oh George, isn't it thrilling! You'll be in the nation's capital budgeting the fiscals, appropriating the tariffs, filling the busters.

GEORGE: It's like a dream. Me, one of Truman's advisors.

SOUND: Door opens.

MEREDITH: Hiyah, folks.

GRACIE: Oh Meredith, have we got news for you! President Truman has sent for George to come to Washington and help him with his problems.

MEREDITH: (Unimpressed) Gol-lee George—congratulations!

GEORGE: Thanks, Meredith.

MEREDITH: But I sure am gonna miss you.

GRACIE: Well maybe you can go to Washington with us, Meredith. Maybe George can find something for you to do. George, isn't there some little government job you could give Meredith? Something like Secretary of State?

GEORGE: (Sarcastic) Oh sure—sure—I'll make him Secretary of State.

GRACIE: Good, Meredith, what state would you like to be Secretary of?

MEREDITH: Well, I think I'll take Iowa. That's my home state, George.

GEORGE: I know, I know.

MEREDITH: Born and raised in Mason City, Iowa.

GEORGE: Yes, yes.

MEREDITH: That's where the corn grows six feet tall.

GEORGE: So I see, Meredith . . . Now look, you two, there'll be no appointments. My only job is to help the President.

MEREDITH: Mr. Truman has got a big problem all right.

GEORGE: All presidents have big problems.

MEREDITH: Sure. He's fingering his bass

wrong when he plays the piano.

GEORGE: Meredith, don't you think it's possible that the President might have a couple of other problems?

MEREDITH: No, I don't think so. His pedal work and right hand are fine.

Carmen for Prez?

GEORGE: Yes yes—he plays the piano much better than Hoover did.

GEORGE: Okay. (*Sings*) WAY DOWN IN MISSOURI WHERE I HEARD THIS MEL-ODY . . .

GRACIE: Oh, that's beautiful, darling—Harry will love it.

GEORGE: Yeah, that's his favorite song. GRACIE: I hope he can play "Ain't Misbehavin'" . . . that's your best number.

GEORGE: Well, I can teach it to him. I wonder if we'll have trouble finding a place to stay in Washington.

GRACIE: Why, the President will insist on us staying at the White House, naturally.

GEORGE: He will?

GRACIE: Well, suppose he needs you in the middle of the night to solve some knotty problem. He just knocks on your door and says, "George, how do you feel about merging the O.P.A. with the N.L.R.B. so that the C.I.O. and the A.F. of L. can deal directly with the A.M.G.O.T. and the U.N.R.R.A.?"

GEORGE: What do I say?

GRACIE: You go right on packing dear, I'll see who's at the front door.

SOUND: *Door close—few footsteps—door opens.*

MEL: Mrs. Burns?

GRACIE: Yes?

MEL: It's all over town that your husband is going to see the President. I'm from the Associated Press.

GRACIE: I'm sorry, you're too late. He's already ironed all his clothes.

MEL: I'm a newspaper reporter. I'd like to ask Mr. Burns his views on questions of the day.

GRACIE: Well, he's very busy, but I can tell you anything you want to know.

MEL: All right, I'll make some notes on

this. Now first, how does your husband feel about labor?

GRACIE: Labor? Well, on the whole he'd rather not.

MEL: You don't understand. I mean, does he approve of strikes?

GRACIE: Well, some strikes he does and some strikes he doesn't. You can quote him as saying that of all the strikes he's heard about, the sit-down strike is the most comfortable.

MEL: I can quote him on that.

GRACIE: Yes.

MEL: How does he feel about Senator Pepper's bill?

GRACIE: Uh . . . hummm?

MEL: How does he feel about Senator Pepper's bill?

GRACIE: Senator or no Senator, if he owes a bill he ought to pay it.

Is Open-Minded

MEL: I can quote that, too?

GRACIE: Oh, definitely. My husband has no prejudice. He's going to Washington with an open mind.

MEL: (*To himself*) I'll say it's open—I can feel the draft . . . Now . . . how about your husband's foreign policy?

GRACIE: Oh, it's very attractive.

MEL: What does he think about Russia?

GRACIE: He thinks Russia is very large.

MEL: And England?

GRACIE: Much smaller.

MEL: What a scoop that'll make. How does he feel about the Far East?

GRACIE: The Far East?

MEL: Yes.

GRACIE: Well, he thinks New York is a nice place to visit, but no place to live.

MEL: I meant a little farther East. How about a statement from your husband on the Chinese question?

GRACIE: Well, you'll have to wait for that until he learns the language. He feels that a Chinese question deserves a Chinese answer.

MEL: He's so right, too. Tell me—what are his views on the Indonesian situation?

GRACIE: Oh, that's the question I've been waiting for. What was it again?

MEL: The Indonesian situation—Java. Isn't he worried about Java?

GRACIE: Oh, goodness, no—we get all we want from the Maxwell House people.

MEL: Mrs. Burns, I was talking about an island in the Dutch East Indies.

GRACIE: Oh—oh—well, why didn't you say so. Now I see what you're driving at.

MEL: Good. Now what's your husband's attitude toward Sumatra?

GRACIE: He likes him, but prefers Crosby.

Make Page 1?

MEL: That did it . . . The interview's over. This will be in all the morning papers.

GRACIE: Wonderful. Any other questions about my husband?

MEL: Just three. When did he get out, who let him out, and when does he go back in? . . . Goodbye.

SOUND: *Door slam.*

GRACIE: (*Chuckles to herself*) When did he get out—wouldn't he be surprised if he knew that George never went to college at all.

SOUND: *Door opens.*

GEORGE: Who was at the door?

GRACIE: Just a newspaper man. Now let's get to bed, George. We may have to leave for Washington very early in the morning.

GEORGE: Okay. Where's my night shirt?

GRACIE: Oh, I'm afraid you'll have to wear one of my gowns. I sent all your night shirts out to be dyed black.

GEORGE: Dyed black?

GRACIE: Yes, to wear in case you're made a member of the Supreme Court.

GEORGE: Let's go to bed.

GRACIE: Yes, your honor.

ORCH: *Bridge.*

SOUND: *Door buzzer.*

GEORGE: Come in.

SOUND: *Door opens.*

GRACIE: Good morning, Bill.

BILL: Good morning, Gracie. Hey, George, let me be the first to apologize! When you said you were going to Washington I thought you were talking through your hat, but it's in all the morning papers.

GRACIE: Really?

BILL: Get a load of this headline: GEORGE BURNS TO WASHINGTON TO HELP RUN COUNTRY!

GEORGE: Wow!

BILL: MEXICO AND CANADA CLOSE BORDERS TO PREVENT MASS EXODUS!

GEORGE: Where does it say that?

BILL: Well, I was just kidding about that one. But gosh, this is big stuff. It says you may stay in the White House.

GEORGE: It does?

BILL: Yeah. It says: BRILLIANT WIT OF RADIO MAY STAY IN WHITE HOUSE—WHILE HER HUSBAND ADVISES TRUMAN.

GEORGE: I see.

BILL: Gee, you two will really be in the social swim there in Washington. Parties at all the foreign legations.

GRACIE: Yes, I can see us now at the Russian Embassy—eating caviar and sipping Molotov Cocktails.

GEORGE: Gracie, a Molotov Cocktail is an explosive.

GRACIE: Really? Well, don't you dare drink more than one.

GEORGE: Oh, I'll watch myself, yes.

GRACIE: And of course there'll be big dinner parties at the British Embassy. My goodness, I won't know how to act around royalty.

BILL: Well, Gracie, I just read a very interesting book about English royalty. It's called "Forever Amber."

GRACIE: Did you get any information from it?

BILL: Nothing you could use at a dinner party, no.

GEORGE: Don't forget we'll have to do some entertaining ourselves, Gracie.

Washington Etiquette

GRACIE: Oh, that's right. How do you talk to diplomats and senators and people like that?

BILL: It's easy, Gracie. For example, a Senator must always be called Right Honorable.

GRACIE: Even if he isn't?

BILL: Sure. Now let's say an important Senator drops in. The head of one of those Congressional Blocs. What do you say?

GRACIE: I say, "Sit down, Right Honorable Bloc Head."

BILL: No no, Gracie. I see you're gonna need some advice.

GEORGE: Oh, Bill, we won't need all that fancy talk.

BILL: Yes, you will, George. Suppose a man like Lord Beaverbrook comes to this country for a conference and he drops in. What would you say to him?

GEORGE: I'd be democratic. I'd say, "Sit down, Beav, and have a cup of coffee."

BILL: (*Disgusted*) Sit down Beav and have a cup—George, he's one of the most important men in the world! You want him to think you're a dope?

GEORGE: Well, what should I say?

Famous Radio Players

responsible for more discussions and ado in the trade than any other type of broadcast. Condemned in some circles, praised to the skies in others, they have their severest critics and their deepest admirers. Les Mitchel is both.

Owner and co-founder of Universal Radio Productions, Mitchel believes that the platter program has a big future, that it has not yet developed all its possibilities, and that if properly handled, it can make for better radio programs than live broadcasts. Listeners to his "Theater of Famous Radio Players" are inclined to agree that he has a point.

Work Well Together

"The Theater of Famous Radio Players," he explains, "is a radio reversion to the old repertoire companies which are noted in theatrical circles for presenting some of the best drama ever to go on the boards. The reason is obvious—a group of actors used to working with one another can do a far better job than a cast picked up at random.

"Original idea for the series was to have a small group of actors who would play the roles for each broadcast. That idea was soon expanded. Instead of using a half-dozen actors, we now use about twenty of the top talent in radio . . . names like Lurene Tuttle, Lou Merrill, Peggy Webber, Jack Edwards, Jr., Cathy Lewis, Joe Kearns, Gloria Blondell, Marvin Miller. This gives a more flexible group from which to choose for various characterizations, and in addition, showcases radio's leading players in a single broadcast series.

"Since cutting the show can be set for any time, instead of at a specified hour as is necessary for live broadcasts, there's no such thing as a confliction keeping some actor we particularly want for a tailor-made part from taking it."

Mitchel believes that name alone is not enough to build a radio program . . . that big name screen actors who do not understand radio's own special technique cannot carry a show; neither can one actor carry it with a bad supporting cast, poor direction, and an inferior script, no matter how much he knows about radio.

"There are too many 'personality stars' on the air today who cannot play many different roles interchangeably," he says. "The result is detrimental to the players' entertainment in which they are used. The best air show is one which can increase the audience's ability to enjoy rather than decrease it."

Scope Is Broad

Mitchel's repertoire theory extends to the script as well as to the cast.

Plays in the "Theater of Famous Radio Players" are written by a variety of writers, include every conceivable type of drama . . . action, fantasy, comedy, mystery, farce, psychopathic, sentimental, old-time melodrama, tragedy, supernatural, sophisticated, horror.

"We try to select stories that are different, that are not in the same old groove, but at the same time that aren't arty. It's a hard thing to do. Scripts seem to run to two types—either conventional or so arty you can't understand them."

Mitchel, himself, knows plots as well as he knows acting and directing. He studied for two years under Thomas H. Uzzell, nationally known short-story instructor, who was recommended to him as being the one man in the country who knows more about plots than anyone else. When Mitchel can't find a script to suit him, he sits down and bats one out himself. He confers with all of his writers and goes over every script carefully for dramatic punch before airing it.

His theatrical experience started in 1919, as juvenile lead in a road company playing "Naughty Marietta" and "The Red Mill." It included work on Hollywood's motion picture lots, direction of a Civic theater in Toledo, his own road show revival of "The Drunkard," and other experience which included both acting and directing.

Worked for CBS

In 1935, he moved into radio in Detroit, where he played leads and character leads in a number of trans-continental shows. Five and a half years later, he was assistant program director and production manager for the Central Division of CBS. For the year and a half that he directed "The Romance of Helen Trent," it was the number one daytime dramatic show in the country.

Mitchel recently was selected as one of nine radio directors of the nation to tour the Pacific War Theater. He was aboard the U.S.S. Missouri for the surrender of Japan.

But he's glad now to settle down to the production of radio shows. "It's a tremendous field," he said, "and our start on 'Theater of Famous Radio Players' is just the beginning. With it, we've put together a better show. Casual handling or direction does not provide for a high level of listener interest. But on the other hand, a good play, well done, is always attention compelling. And that's what we're working hard to achieve."



WHO LOVES HIM?

Frank DeVol, who is one of Hollywood's top radio arrangers, says the first number he ever arranged was "Nobody's Sweetheart," and by the time he finished picking it out on the piano several hours later, that's just what he was!
