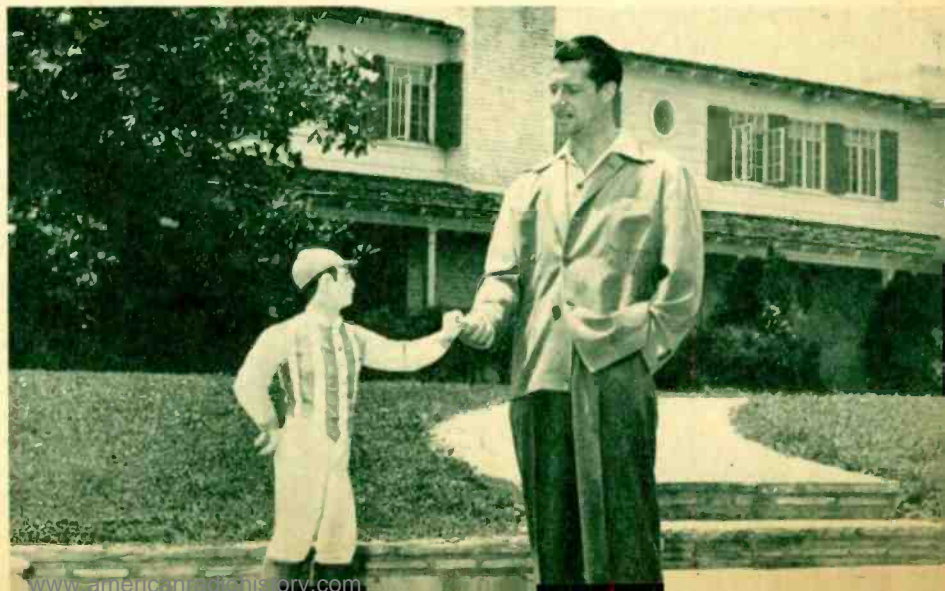

Most interesting news of the week comes from KFVB which informs us that famous disc jockey Martin Block will join the station some time in 1947 or 1948. Contrary to reports, present emcee of WB's "Hollywood Bandstand" show, Bill Anson, will remain with the station and have a show of his own.

A Salute

Radio Life had a most charming visitor the other day in the person of Mrs. Alice Ignoff, the Hollywood housewife who is dear to the hearts of so many servicemen and their families. Pretty Mrs. Ignoff became a familiar sight to Vine Streeters during the war when she spent hours of her time every day on the steps of the NBC building photographing with her small camera the servicemen from all over the world who passed by the famous corner. She charged them nothing for the pictures, and after having them printed, she sent copies to the boys' families, along with hand-written, heartfelt letters of some 150 words each, letting the relatives know that she had seen their man in uniform and how fine he looked.

Mrs. Ignoff's hobby cost her an amount close to a thousand dollars, "but," she insisted, with her warm smile, "I have been repaid many times over by the happiness I feel in my heart." A couple of moderate means, Mrs. Ignoff and her husband financed their ambitious wartime project with "our spending money". Mrs. Ignoff's camera preserved images of 11,500 boys who served in every branch of the armed services of countries all over the world.

"Many of these brave boys never came home," said Mrs. Ignoff, "but for those who have, I've recently written a song which I want so very much to be in the homes of all those men I met during the war years. The title of the song, I believe, speaks for itself. I call it 'I'm Beginning to Live Again'."

In the mid-twenties, Mrs. Ignoff broadcast in the midwest as a singer and whistler under the name of "Miss Alice". Music has always been her hobby, and she has written many songs in the past.

"But I haven't cared about having any of them published until this latest composition which I have written for 'my boys'," she explained. "I have even formed my own publishing company in order to get this song in print.

Now, my prime ambition is to hear it played on the radio, so that others will hear it, and so that those boys who are now home again will know that I am still thinking of them."

Meanest Trick

As Van Johnson fans will, the V. J. lovers were lined up in throngs at Columbia Square last week when their idol guested on "Screen Guild Players". Johnson had hurried in to rehearsal, however, and the fan had no opportunity to present them to him in person, so she requested one of CBS' personnel to take the cookies in to the star. He said he would—but instead, he opened up the box and flung the cookies into the air over the bobby-soxers' heads, while the youngster, who had patiently baked them for her favorite, burst into tears.

What about it, fella? That's anything but funny!

Whodunit?

A few minutes before broadcast time for a recent airing of CBS' "Holiday of Homicide", producer Dave Vaile found that he needed an actress for a single "line"—a piercing scream. He called his colleague, Tom Hargis, in another studio and "borrowed" pretty Helen Gerald for the role. Helen rushed in, screamed, and rushed back to her original assignment in the other studio. But her feminine curiosity was too strong to leave it at that. Later, Helen searched out Vaile and asked for a script of "Holiday"—because she just had to know what happened after that scream!

Personal Appearance

Pretty brunette Peggy Rea has her capable hands into every script that is aired on CBS' "Suspense," in her real-life role as secretary to its producer, Bill Spier.

On the August 8th airing, however, listeners heard Peggy's voice. She appeared as "Honey," the switchboard operator in the show's presentation of "Dead Ernest".

Many of you would like to see the "Breakfast Club" gang, so how about dropping us a line in care of "Mike Memos" and telling us so. We will forward the letters to Don in Chicago and try to persuade him to come to the West Coast... Another morning show, "Glamour Manor" (heard at 9 a.m.), gets a new format in September. Kenny Baker is the singing master-of-ceremonies and irresponsible owner of this mythical hostelry, with the supporting cast of Sam Hearn (you know, "Schlepperman"), Don Wilson and the pretty little Barbara Eiler. This is rather a reunion for Baker, Hearn and Wilson, as they all appeared at one time on the Jack Benny show. Eddie Dunn is currently emceeing Glamour Manor.

Jolly Tom Breneman brings you "Breakfast in Hollywood" from his famous restaurant on Vine Street at 9:30. swer" might be "yes and no!"

War Background Valuable

An added touch of realism was provided by actor Peter Beauvais on a recent broadcast of "David Harding—Counterspy." Beauvais, who recently returned to radio from service in the U. S. Counter-Intelligence Corps, was featured in a dual role in the drama, largely as a result of his wartime experience, which included interrogating the Nazi war lords.

"In my conversation with these international gangsters," Beauvais explains, "I observed and made mental notes of their gestures, mannerisms and the sound of their voices. Since I more or less specialize in portraying villains of this type over the air, the knowledge I gained during service in Army Intelligence has helped me immeasurably in creating radio characterizations."

Another reason for the yes and no "answer."

The story presented during the Wednesday, October 24, 1945, broadcast of "David Harding—Counterspy" paralleled a news story in the October 26, 1945, New York World Telegram to an amazing degree.

The fictional "Case of the Girl with the Photographic Mind" described the exploits of a young lady whose ability to commit to memory virtually unlimited volumes of material made her a valuable accomplice to a ring of international crooks.

The duplication in fact lay in the newspaper's coincidental account two days later of "a red-haired girl with a photographic memory (who) landed in an American military jail today at the end of a sensational Gestapo spy career that makes her the unchallenged Mata Hari of World War II."

Not So Imaginary

Is David Harding real and is his Counterspy organization a part of this nation's intelligence activities? Well, certainly radio's David Harding and his hard-hitting Counterspies have aided our government in telling stories of importance for the safety and protection of its citizens. That seems pretty real. Counterspies are made up of people who have lived the parts they portray. That's not exactly "play acting." And lastly, the many times the "story line" has found its counterpart in a newspaper story days later would indicate those "story lines" are not so imaginary after all.

We'll leave it with you whether or not the answer should be "yes and no!"

annual appearance of the Allen Stock Company featuring 'The Verna Felton Players.' Verna was about eight years old, too, and the prettiest little girl you ever saw. She was the star of the company and all their plays were especially written around her. Well, I was as stage-struck and as star-struck as they come. I'd hang around the company, getting in everybody's way, trying to get in with them. Finally, to get rid of me, they actually gave me a part! Two lines. I had to run across the stage, holding on to a live cat, calling back to the wings, 'Duck it! Duck it!' and start to throw the cat down a well. At this moment, heroic Verna was to match up to me, tear the poor cat from my murderous grasp, while I exited, chastised.

"During the actual performance, spellbound at being before an audience and on the same stage with my ideal, I refused to let go of the poor cat, determined to draw the scene out as long as I could. Verna finally got it out of my grasp, but not before we'd tug-o-warred over it so hard we nearly pulled it to pieces!"

Many years later, at a Jack Benny rehearsal, one of the members of the cast started to introduce Pinto to a majestic looking fellow member, "You know Verna Felton . . ." they began. "It was the first time I had seen Verna since she was eight years old," smiled Pinto. "I grabbed her by the hand and shouted, 'Do I know Verna Felton? Why, she's responsible for my being in show business!' Of course, I totally forgot that Verna didn't have the slightest idea who I was. If you're unfamiliar with the format of the show, this is the way it

operates. The letters are read to chosen members of the studio audience who must guess what the writer desires. The word "blank" is substituted for his request. If the studio participant guesses right, he is awarded a gift ranging from nylons to a Gruen watch. If he guesses wrong, his gift is automatically awarded to the next participant, and so on. "Free for All" affords both the listening and studio audience a chance to win a gift.

De Luxe Gift

In answer to the query of which request was the most difficult to fulfill, both Richards and Maypole agreed that the second honeymoon of the Papens presented the most obstacles. IF YOU are an ardent and regular follower of ABC's "David Harding—Counterspy," you have probably asked the same question that is asked time and time again: "Is David Harding, the Counterspy, a real person connected with our federal government?" The answer is "yes and no!"

Perhaps the best explanation to this seemingly contradictory "answer" will be found in a statement by Major General E. F. Witsell, Adjutant General of the U. S. Army, which was read following the "Case of the Missing Soldier"—one of the air shows broadcast following the war.

The General's statement came directly from Washington and said in part: "The meanest man in the

world is the fellow who attempts to extort money from the grief-stricken families of our deceased war heroes. I hope all of you who heard this presentation of 'David Harding—Counterspy' will be on guard against such rackets and will place implicit confidence in the information coming from official sources, disregarding all else.

"The Adjutant General's office makes every effort to supply the families of missing men with all available information. I assure you that you can rely on the reports that we give you. In no event should you place confidence in any notification or letter which does not come from the War Department."

ON June 19 of this year, "California Caravan" rolled into place on the Don Lee airwaves for its premiere performance—and at exactly that time radio broadcasting rolled into a new epoch.

Up to the advent of "Caravan," medical sponsorship on the wirelanes was the industry's biggest bugaboo. The unwritten law among doctors was . . . gentleman's honor . . . "It shall be considered unethical for medical

practitioners to promote their own personal services through the medium of advertising." Vaulting this hard and fast "thou shalt not" just wasn't considered sporting, and most advertising outlets knew better than to touch it with a ten foot pole.

But with the ending of World War II and the subsequent dust-biting of many equally-set sanctities, the California Medical Association with Science, faced a new era. The American had, up to now, been fighting for his nation, now he had a fight

How then best reach the people with the benefit commodity of Health Insurance, offered cooperatively through the Association by every doctor in the state of California? Radio was by far the most extensive medium and getting together with progressive Lockwood-Shackleford agency was the next move.

THOUGH singer Michael Douglas' twin daughters, Christine and Michele, are only thirteen months old, their musical careers are practically assured. Michael, singer on the Kay Kyser show, and his wife, Genevieve, both agree on the hope that their children are musical and are planning to do everything to aid them.

Thirteen months sounds pretty young, but Mike was but a moppet in the second grade when a rendition of "Ole Black Joe" in a kiddie show decided him on his musical future. "My kids are going to learn what it means to work for what they want, and they are going to learn right from the start," the singer says. handed the largest curve of the question mark . . . what kind of a radio show was most suitable? An audience participation jig was not in keeping with the dignity of the profession. A musical would only reach a certain audience. An educational stance sounded adaptable, but Holzer was looking for something which would be entertaining too. And new.

He came up with something which surprised even himself. A "Caravan" tour of old-time California, in search of the stories which historians have not yet touched upon. And, as for those stories, Holzer learned there was a far more amazing number than he had surmised. Although the "days of 49'ers" yarns are a dime a dozen, Holzer found that careful research revealed unlimited and colorful highlights in each city's background which were all the more worth hearing because they were true. And that expert handling of those highlights meant stories—good stories—which listeners could thoroughly enjoy.

Writer Lee Roddy has found the assignment his favorite so far. Each week he visits the public library and drags down as many books from the California research section as he can tote home. He's read every shelf from left to right, top to bottom in the Hollywood branch, and is now traveling farther afield. Before writing a story about any city, he writes ahead to the Chamber of Commerce and asks for available maps, news data or material. His mail box crams full as fast as can open it with any number of new and interesting "clues" to aid him in familiarizing himself with his territory. Then, he tries to picture it as it looked in the days of the padres and the Spanish landowners, and against that background he stands his script. "At this point," he laughs, "I sometimes wonder if I don't know more about the state than the government."

Many Stop-Overs

Starting with the first broadcast, a recollection of early San Diego, "Caravan" is on its way straight up the state to the Oregon border, bypassing none of the smaller, story-choked regions enroute.

Do the doctors like it? A group of forty notably particular medical specialists met in the Don Lee Hollywood studios recently to hear the first two episodes before final consummation of the contract. They unanimously voted approval.

Do the listeners like it? Amongst the staggering mail already received on the program, was this listener opinion which more than said it the way every show likes to hear it:

"There's only one thing wrong with 'California Caravan.' It's wonderful, but it should last a half-hour. We're too interested to want to turn off after those fascinating fifteen minutes!"

"Perhaps you never realize," remarked Maypole, "how generous people are until you find yourself playing Santa Claus. It's a good feeling being able to give and give."

One gentleman wistfully wrote in that he had never received something for nothing and could "Free for All" restore his faith in human nature by awarding him one small thing. "Free for All" gallantly sent more than enough to be remembered by—two rabbits.
