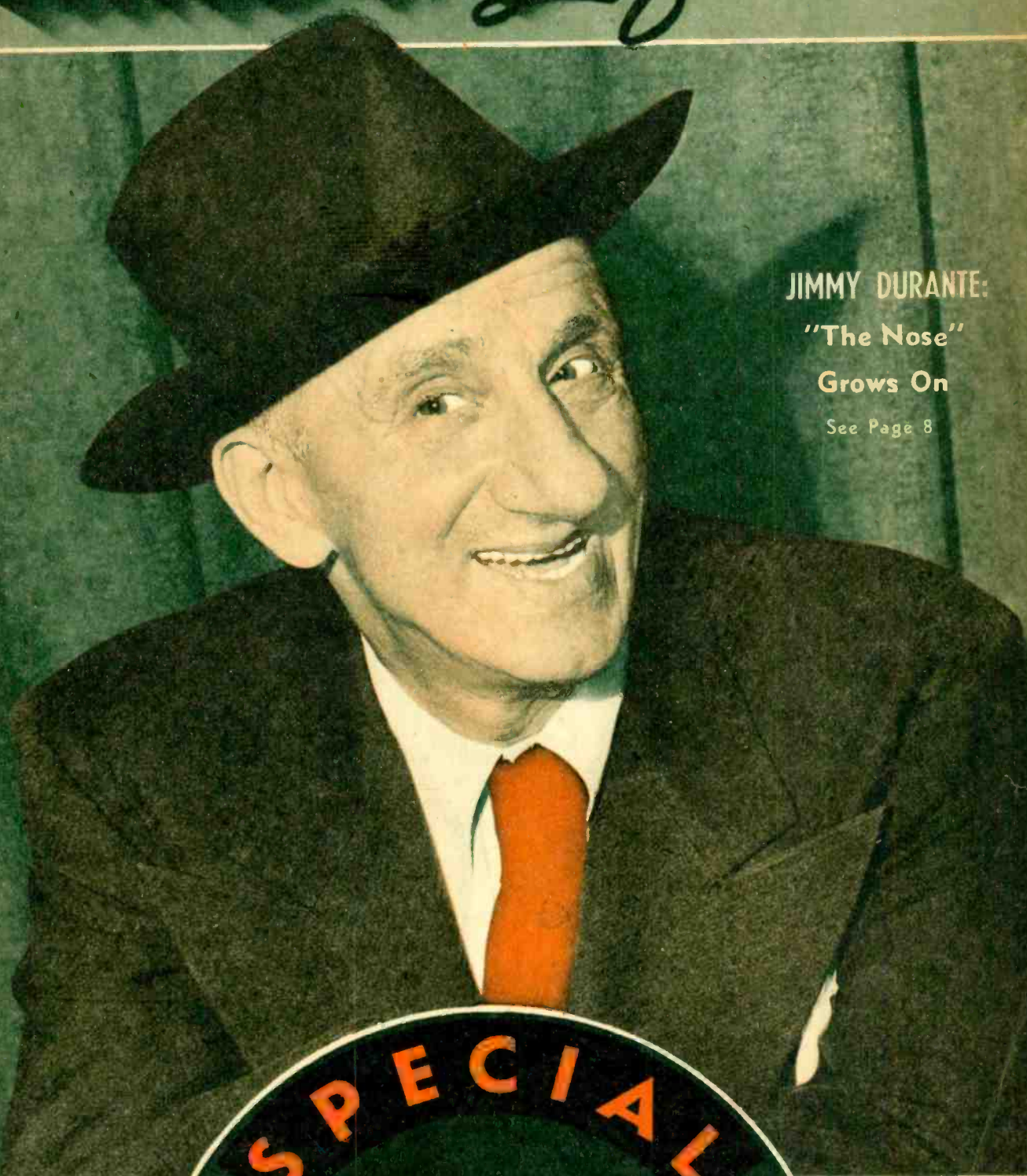

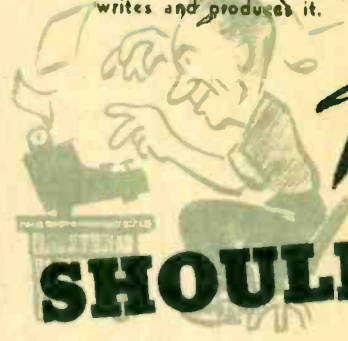

# "THE NOSE" *Grows On*

*After Thirty Years in Show Business, Jimmy Durante's Still Leading by a Schnozzola to Please Millions of Ears*

**T**HE exclusive, sedate section known as Bel-Air was in an uproar. And the whirl of activity seemed to emanate from the beautiful Bel-Air Hotel itself.

The citizens of that community, upon investigating the cause of the furor, only smiled an "oh-so-it's-you" smile and stayed to watch the fun. But having been forewarned, we knew that somewhere in the midst of those electricians, grips, juicers, extras, onlookers, and raft of M-G-M equipment was the incorrigible Jimmy Durante, engaged in making a picture.

And it was he we were seeking. We had come to bestow belated congratulations on the lovable comedian who recently celebrated his thirtieth year in show business.

"It was de most beautiful thing that's ever happened to me," Durante related in a completely un-Durante manner. "I couldn't believe that all of dose wunnerful people had gathered to honor me. It was a beautiful thing."

### Grows Nostalgic

Jimmy's sincere humility touched our heart. It was a "beautiful thing" to find a celebrity of Durante's standing who was still grateful and awed by it all. And we were delighted to find Mr. D. in a nostalgic mood.

On last June 5, some of the biggest names in the entertainment world gathered to congratulate Jimmy at the old Silver Slipper on Broadway, where he established himself as a star name in the twenties. The establishment, now a dime-and-dancery, was especially decorated with murals of Jimmy and his ex-partners, Eddie Jackson and Lou Clayton.

"It was a trill, a real trill," Durante related with a touch of his famous grin. "Everybody was sittin' dere, waitin' for us to do the act we did in the old days. I hadda admit, it was a good feelin' to be doin' it again."

In answer to queries of who was present at the big shindig, Jimmy drifted off into a far-away reverie and mumbled something which sounded like "just all me old pals." Looking over a guest list, we discovered "old pals" included Ethel Merman, Irving Berlin and a rosterful of

## RADIO: West ★ National and International

### Wednesday Boom

For the past few years, Tuesday night has been a predominantly NBC night for avid radio listeners. A solid line-up of Amos 'n' Andy, Skelton, Hope, Fibber and Molly made it difficult to twist the dial.

This season, NBC will still have its formidable Tuesday schedule, but Wednesday, too, looms as a serious contender, both on NBC and CBS. Some view the imposing line-up as a retrenchment against Bing Crosby's recorded program on ABC. The idea may be to offer such tempting fare by way of one live show after another that radio listeners will be too lazy to switch networks.

Here are the set-ups: NBC, "Duffy's Tavern," "Hollywood Theater," Frank Morgan, Kay Kyser, Supper Club, Fleetwood Lawton, "Great Gilderleeve," "Mr. and Mrs. North," "Mr. District Attorney."

CBS: Frank Sinatra, Dinah Shore, "Academy Award Theater," "Information, Please," Lowell Thomas, Jack Smith, "Dr. Christian," Jack Carson, "Ellery Queen."

ABC: "Pot o' Gold," "Lone Ranger," "Sons of the Pioneers," Lum and Abner, La Guardia, "Fishing and Hunting Club," Bing Crosby, Henry Morgan (tentative at this writing) wouldn't it be funny if the "Fishing and Hunting Club" picked up some pre-Crosby audience and whammed in with a fabulous rating?

MBS: Gabriel Heatter, Barry Wood Show, "Spotlight Bands," "Michael Shayne," "Cisco Kid," "Main Line," "It's Up to Youth," Glenn Hardy, Rex Miller, "Inside of Sports."

Both NBC and CBS have a dazzling array of talent and what's more, you'll note it's varied—music, quiz, mystery, comedy. ABC, with "Pot o' Gold" and Morgan, is in better position than ever. Though not as varied as the others, Mutual still has a good line-up. It'll be interesting to see whether dialers stick to one network or tune in and out at random to catch a favorite entertainer—say one H. Lillis Crosby.

### We Mention It

Some magazines not devoted to radio seldom miss an opportunity to take a crack AT radio when shows are

dropped for one reason or another. Maybe it's wishful thinking on their part that radio, a competitive advertising medium, is on its last legs.

Last spring radio's sad status was related—Bob Burns was being dropped by his sponsor. So were Hedda Hopper, Hildegarde, the Hour of Charm, and Dinah Shore, to name but a few. They're all back on the air this fall with NEW sponsors and to augment them are NEW shows such as Mel Blanc's, Meredith Willson's, Dennis Day's, and Don Ameche's.

It's no news when a sustaining program is cancelled for a commercial show. But when a Coast commercial is crowded out because its time has been pre-empted by a coast-to-coast commercial show and because the sponsor can find no suitable time available for airing, it's good news to radio and its fans. Last week, four of CBS' Coast commercial programs had to move over for transcontinentals: Felix Mills' Studebaker program, Guitard's "Crook's Cruise," J.I.'s "Holiday of Homicide," and Kreml's "Jack in All Trades."

We'll be surprised if any magazine but Radio Life mentions this.

### Hail the Queen

Ann Lehr, founder of the Hollywood Guild Canteen for servicemen and head of the Hollywood Guild refuge for "at liberty" actors, was voted "Queen for a Year" by a board of judges in a nation-wide contest conducted by Mutual's "Queen for a Day."

Miss Lehr was accorded the "Queen for a Year" honors from a group of five finalists including judges from all over the United States.

Judges selecting Miss Lehr as "Queen" included Gary Cooper, Hedda Hopper, Cecil B. DeMille, Mayor Fletcher Bowron, and Lt. Audey Murphy, World War II's most-decorated hero.

### Rebuttal

# Radio Lifelines

**LISTENER SPEAKS UP**—Don't know when I've enjoyed a radio program as much as the one last Sunday night. Called "SPEAK UP, LISTENER," it originated in Studio 6 at Columbia Square, but was broadcast exclusively over the CBS affiliate station in Palm Springs, KCMJ, owned by radioites DICK JOY and DON McBAIN. This was the third program of the series. Two garden variety listeners appear each week to speak their minds on a given radio subject (singing commercials, soap operas, participation shows, etc.), and two radio experts defend their profession. Joy is moderator.

Last Sunday night, to accommodate the radio specialists (OZZIE and HARRIET, working as a team, and JOHN GUEDEL) the Palm Springs listeners traveled to Columbia Square to have their say. They had gripes about comedy shows—why off-color gags? why such terrific warm-ups that audiences laugh at ANYTHING? why engineers turn up volume on meager snickers to make them sound like hilarious belly laughs?—these were just some of the questions about which the two listeners spoke up.

The program was most fun when all five participants tried to talk at once, because if you're a radio-minded person at all, you've definite opinions and you TRY to get them across to your opponents. Was surprised, at first, to hear Ozzie do most of the talking for radio, until I remembered he had studied law, in fact, I think he has a degree in it.

Some week soon, I'm accepting the invitation of KCMJ to go to Palm Springs and appear on the program in defense of radio. Hope an arrangement to broadcast the show locally by transcription is made, for "Speak Up, Listener" would intrigue any Radio Life fan. It's sort of an "Ear Inspires the Pen" of the air.

**WHATNOTS**—Dropped in to see GINNY SIMMS on her first fall show. She's never looked better in all the six years I've known her. Note to SALLY SWEETLAND: VIRGINIA MANSFIELD, who enjoyed SHIRLEY GORDON'S story about you in Radio Life, felt bad when she learned you couldn't make a decently coherent lemon pie. For two weeks, Virginia struggled with the idea of sending you her best recipe, but decided she might offend you if she did. I told her you were a swell sport and would love it. . . Understand that when SHIRLEY MITCHELL goes East to get married, she'll be written out of the "Gildersleeve" script as WIDOW RANSOM taking a trip. That'll simplify her getting back in, in case she persuades her doctor husband to settle in Hollywood. . . Sorry to see NBC's "NATIONAL HOUR" fold. It was one of the best informatory programs. . . Writer-Producer HELEN MORGAN ("This Woman's Secret") writes the latest about her pet skunk, SUMMER HOOPER. He now weighs sixteen pounds, has learned to sit up, but resents the howls of laughter greeting this feat.

One of the slickest radio guest appearances in a long while was Housing Administrator WILSON WYATT's on "Town Meeting."

**BING SINGS AGAIN!**—With BOB HOPE as guest, BING CROSBY cut the No. 1 transcription of his ABC series the other night. Hope and his "father" ad libbed so freely the show ran over fifteen minutes. Bing got lost on his closing number, "Blue Skies," shrugged his shoulders, turned to the audience and said, "We'll do it over; you weren't in any hurry to go someplace, were you?" It'll be interesting to see how the final half-hour record comes out when it's broadcast Oct. 16.

Radio Row seems half and half about the Crosby transcriptions. Have asked a lot of people—some of them think the listeners won't be as interested in the program knowing it's not live. Others say it won't matter. Personally, it doesn't make any difference to me whether a show is live or transcribed. Half the summer I heard the Frank Morgan program at night on the repeat. Due to time circumstances, we, here in Hollywood, get many of our shows on recordings. JACK HALEY, TOM BRENNEMAN, for example. I think the millions of Crosby fans will listen to Bing's show, transcribed OR live. Whether or not other radio stars, transcribed, could pull as big an audience as live performers is a question, but since Bing signed with Philco, the stars I've talked to have said wistfully, "Boy, I wish I could have a deal like that!" Other radio networkers can't be blamed for wondering whether Crosby is starting something. But time and Hooper ratings will tell.

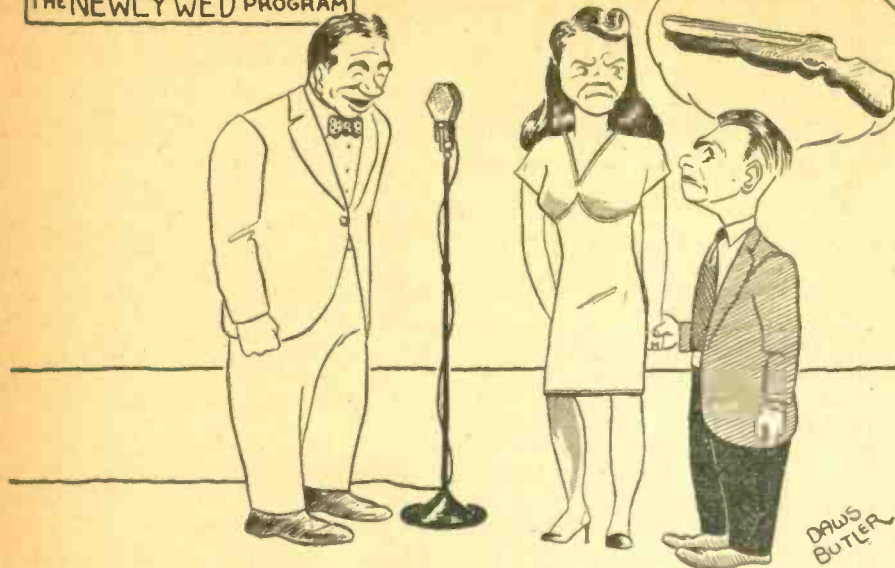

Detroit Symphony. Now that Fall has come, however, he is once more settled at "Rolling Twins Farm." "We were going to call it 'Borge and Bess,'" interpolated Victor, "but my wife's name is Elsie."

Fall has also brought Borge back to the radio dial, much to the delight of NBC audiences who weekly tune in on "The Victor Borge Show, Starring Benny Goodman."

Incidentally, for those of you (although we don't think there's any such animal) who may be unacquainted with the gentleman's talents, Borge's particular forte is piano portraiture—both serious and satirical, supplemented by his own unique brand of levity. Record-collectors can secure an all-over sample of the above in an album of discs called "A Victor Borge Program."

The pianist-comedian's forte away from his work is a novel and practical one. He selects and purchases all of his wife's clothes—very much to her satisfaction.

Having been thrown from a horse, Borge has recently developed a new interest, this time in cloud-busting (perhaps with the thought that on a horse you can't wear a parachute!) He recently purchased an Ercoupe.

### Wants to Go Back

One of his chief desires is to make a return visit sometime soon to his native Denmark. One of his most serious undertakings (and he is often serious. "It isn't always funny to be funny," he remarked.) is an educational fund for the sons of Denmark's dead patriots.

"I have placed the control of the organization in other hands than my own, however," he informed us. "One of my chief faults is that I cannot say no. I would very likely accept every application. Say, I just thought of something," his face remained serious, but we could tell that what was coming would be otherwise, "maybe I'll apply, and start all over again!"

The Borge career actually had its beginning with a similar fund, which financed his study of music in Berlin.

We hadn't talked to Ted since he'd gone overseas as a war correspondent for the American Network. Ted's delightful sense of humor didn't desert him even though he was closer to the realities of war than he'd ever dreamed of being. This he credits everyone in Europe for. "I never heard of a single person in Europe being cowardly," he told us. "You can't conceive of the bravery of ordinary people under fire. Civilized people are almost never under the obligation to rise to an occasion like that, but when they are they can do it. Anyone can. The people of Hollywood would be just as brave if they were defending their city."

"I'd always thought of myself as a sensitive person who'd be scared to death with bullets whizzing around me, but the reality is different because you just can't believe that anyone would want to kill you! For instance when I was interviewing the boys at St. Lo, shells were going overhead so close that the

concussions flattened my hand out on the paper as I tried to write. I just kept on with, "Yes, you're from Wichita, Kansas, yes . . ." But if one of those boys had winced and been afraid, I'd have shot out of there and into the first clump of bushes. When everyone around you is calm and unafraid it makes you that way, too."

Ted didn't have time for the explorations in Europe that he'd like to make, so he plans to return sometime and seek out all the places he missed. "I loved London," he said, "and lived only two blocks from Wimpole Street. One day I walked over to see what it looked like. I stopped a London cabbie coming along the street and said, 'This is the street where the Barretts lived, isn't it?' He thought for a while, and then trying to be so nice because I was an American and he wanted to be helpful, he replied, 'Well, yes they did. But I think they've moved away.'"
