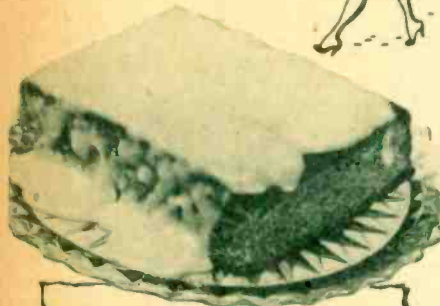

# SURPRISE PARTY!

## R.S.V.P.

*Sometimes the Most Surprised Party on This Novel Participation Show Is Apt to Be Emcee Stu Wilson or Interviewers Maurie Webster and Bob Shannon!*

▼ **CBS ENGINEER WILBER MILLER AND INTERVIEWER BOB SHANNON** clear the way for Mrs. Caroline Williams as they take off for the broadcast. The boys take along beautiful corsages to be worn by the lucky ladies who answer the door.

▼ **HERE'S THE SHORTWAYNE TRUCK THAT MAKES IT POSSIBLE** for studio and listening audiences to follow the progress of Webster and Shannon in their search for contestants. This is Maurie as he describes the neighborhood to listeners.



**IF YOU SEE THIS CAR** in this neighborhood, you'll know that a happy time is on its way to someone, and it may be you! One lady, on seeing the car pull up and the interviewer approach her door laden with equipment, thought he had come to spray the trees!

The young man tries again. He goes to another house. He knocks. A little girl comes to the door.

Little girl: "Hello."

Young man: "Hello, is your mother at home?"

Little girl: "Yes."

Young man: "May I speak to her?"

Little girl: "No. She can't come to the door."

Young man: "Why can't she?"

Little girl: "Because she's in the bathroom."

That's just a sample of what can happen when emcee Stu Wilson dispatches Bob Shannon and Maurie Webster out into the neighborhood areas to bring people down to the audience participation show, "Surprise Party."

In case you haven't caught up with this novel show, here's how it works, and also how it spells mix-up for Shannon and Webster and merriment for the listening audience. Down at CBS, Stu Wilson is all equipped with the ingredients of an audience participation show—he has his audience, his mike, his prizes and contestants. Bob and Maurie go out on the streets of the town, each in a car wired with radio sending and receiving equipment. At each door at which they knock, they try to induce the person answering their rap to come down and join the studio audience and compete for the prize given for the question of the day. Sometimes the person is eager to come, often she (or he) won't come for love or money. All this, of course, is heard by the listening audience.

#### Incongruous Party

Getting the boys together one day, we started them talking about their experiences on the show. Bob averred that one of his most embarrassing moments occurred when, as a door opened, he said, "Good morning, madam," and a tough, masculine voice answered, "Whad-d'ya want?" It was a large man wearing an apron, and from the looks of him, he didn't particularly relish being called "madam." However, when the show was explained to him and he was asked to join the audience at CBS, the man not only came as he was, with broom

and apron—he let Bob pin a corsage on his shoulder. The effect of his appearance in the studio was heightened by the fact that he chewed a big black cigar!

Maurie, who's been the target for more slammed doors and more "NO's" than anyone in the business, has become involved in practically everything you can imagine. A motorcycle cop stopped his car and wanted to give him a ticket because the antenna on the radio equipment was too tall and bound to get tangled in the palm trees. Yes, between

# NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH

A STRAIGHT line is the shortest distance between two points. That simple, but often difficult-to-maintain truth can be applied to Sam Balter's way of looking at things. His sportscasting, his political beliefs, his news commentary are all expressive of Sam's directness of approach.

We looked up Balter to quiz him

on his return to strict sportscasting.

"I'm in the unusual position," he told us, "of plagiarizing myself!" Sam was the first coast-to-coast sports announcer to use a format and human interest appeal. That was back in the thirties, and since that time Balter's original program, "Inside of Sports", has been roundly copied with few variations.

Sam turned to news analysis and commentary for many years, and now that he's back as Director of Sports at KLAC and with his program, "Sportsbook", he's not at all sure that people don't suspect him of not being too original. We aim to fix that—Sam was the first, and for our money, still the best. From a girl who spent five years on her tennis service and thought that squash was a drink made with lemons, that's praise indeed. What we mean to say is, that listening to Balter on sports is enough to turn you from a spectator to a participant.

Balter went from being "big man

on the campus" at UCLA to teaching high school at El Segundo at the age of twenty. "I was breaking the law," he recalled. "You're supposed to be twenty-one to teach school. I was under age for one month. Some of the girls in my classes were nineteen and twenty!"

"Umm—popular classes?" we wondered.

"Why yes," said Sam. "Why?" We sighed and thought of our own high school days, far from El Segundo.

High school teacher Balter got into broadcasting by following one of those straight lines we mentioned at the beginning of this story.

He recalls that he was listening to the late Alexander Woolcott one night, just one of Woolcott's spell-bound audience. "Then," said Sam, "a sports program came on—the dull-est, most uninteresting thing you've ever heard. The contrast between Woolcott's wonderful style and the sports talk was so evident that I knew I could do better than that.

So I sat down and wrote six scripts for a sports program."

Not only that, "direct approach" Balter, who knew nothing about radio, got himself a sponsor and went down to station KEHE with his idea. "I walked into the station with my programs under my arm, holding my sponsor by the hand, and asked if they were interested. Were they interested? How naive can you be? And I thought I had to be good!"

But there was more to Sam's career than his sponsor. Sam was good, and in a short time he was on a coast-to-coast network. Everything was fine until the sponsor and the agency decided that Sam should be broadcasting from the East and Sam decided that he liked California too well to do that. After seasons of wrangling, Sam said it was California or nothing. It was California—and no show.

#### Surprised Sponsor

# One Producer Confesses

**I**N THIS day of genius radio producers, here's one who admits that the actors are almost the whole show.

After seventeen years in radio, Paul Pierce, calm but energy-goaded producer on Don Lee's "Adventures of Red Ryder" series, has acquired a wide perspective on the art of producing and writing an air show—as almost completely slanted to the people before the microphone.

Paul, who has been straight up the line as an announcer, actor, writer, then director, thinks that radio's hard-working stars are the best in the world. "They handle as many as fourteen shows a week, where a producer usually only does one or two. So, let's face it. Who's telling who?"

The success of any show, Paul expounds, depends on hiring the best talent you can get. "Even with a hopeless script, you're saved if your characters can read lines."

By hiring capable talent, Pierce claims, you can put your limited time into doing something else equally pertinent to the success of your program, including locating the right sound effects and selecting atmospheric musical background for the action of the moment.

## Fast Answer

Sometimes your characters come through with things you've had a little trouble figuring out yourself, Paul comments. Illustrating, he recalls the time he was directing Ed MacDonald in a part which included a characterization of Hitler with a sore throat. Frankly stopped, Paul turned it over with a shrug and asked "What would you do with it?"

"This," responded Ed with alacrity, going through a vocal loop-the-loop which would have made a piker out of Barrymore.

Then, there was the time Jane Wyman had done all the rehearsals for "Stars Over Hollywood" and went out celebrating with Ronnie the night before the broadcast. A lobster dinner left her speechless, and early Saturday morning Paul found himself without his "Star" performer. Paul's call got Lurene Tuttle out of bed, she walked into the studio three minutes before air-time and without a single script perusal, left the radio audience with a performance to remember.



**A LOS ANGELES "BOY"**, Pierce began his radio career as a hill-billy announcer from one to four a. m. on the now defunct KELW. Later he served on staff at KRKD and KFWB, then became assistant director of special events for CBS. Paul is married to his school-day sweetheart, they have three children, live in San Fernando Valley.

On his new post on the "Red Ryder" series, Paul is equally acclimated. A versatile writer, he knows exactly how a radio western should be handled. In addition, with "Red Ryder" scripter Albert Van Antwerp, he has been thoroughly through the part of Northern California which forms background country for the series, with special visits to the tribe of Indians which today still lives there. Most of the towns which bear such fascinating labels as "Last Stop Gulch" and "Dead Man's Run" are patterned after real life places in the area.

"What radio thinks of a western badman usually consists of a dashing, daring, devil-may-care Billy The Kid or Jesse James," explains Paul. "Actually, the old-time desperados were the mangiest lot of flea-ridden, miserable characters that ever hopped a pinto. The truth hurts, but we tell it."

Paul also likes to stick to his period, which the script sets between 1870 and '90, meaning out with .44 caliber guns "when we know they carried .45's." Through checking he has found that "O.K." was as familiar a colloquialism then as it is now, and that "criminy" was the abject expression of complete "regust" instead of the popularly believed "jiminy."

Paul's only radio phobia is getting his shows off and on the air on time. The first program he ever produced ran horrifically over its thirty minutes, had to be lopped off so the announcer could get in his system cue; and Paul still dreams about it nights. He got the scare of his career when some of the studio wags found out about his one madness, and

### For Love o' Mike (General Comment)

#### Guessing Game

As something of a slave for those hard-to-take electrically-transcribed one-minute commercials that are spotted throughout otherwise enjoyable programs of melodic offerings, we play a guessing game. Unavoidably caught by the spot's novel attention-getting device—such as an ambulance siren or a man sneezing or a woman screaming, we try to guess what the transcription is plugging before the name of the product is divulged. Gradually, we've become pretty much of a master at this. The trick, you see, is to choose the product which you *logically* deduce as the one *least* likely to have any connection with a siren or a sneeze or a scream!

For instance, we heard one this morning that opened with a sour-voiced man shouting, "There goes old moneybags!" We played a guessing game . . . A credit dentist? A used car mogul? A loan-shark? A Clark Gable movie?

No-oooo-ooo! We lost. It was a plug for the stock-market page of a morning newspaper!

Oh, well—we weren't discouraged. The game wasn't over. In another sixty seconds, we had the chance to play it again. From the loudspeaker of our radio, a woman chirped cheerfully, "Jane, why don't you and Charlie come over for bridge tonight!"

"Ah-ha-hi!", we beamed happily to ourselves, a full three seconds ahead of the commercial's plot. "Charlie can't come. Nagging back-ache. It's Whos-it's Little Pills for you, Charlie!"

Hooray—we won that time. Bring on the next one!

If you're looking for a morning show to start you off with a song instead of a bang, you shouldn't miss Jack Berch at 8:30 a.m., Monday through Friday on KFI, KFSD. (Who wants to start out with a bang at 8:30 in the morning, anyway?)—Jack sings his songs in a pleasant baritone voice—no phony southern accent in his popular numbers, no pretense, no tricks. We didn't realize how long it had been since we'd listened to a singer who wasn't bent on searing your soul with his deathless words until we heard Jack's simple and melodic delivery.

Jack handles the announcing and introductions in the same manner—he knows he isn't delivering the Gettys-

burg Address when he reads a letter from a listener or tells you what the next song will be. And you won't quarrel with his selection of melodies, either. Anything from "Skip-to-My-Lou" to "South America Take It Away" falls easily on the ears done in the Berch manner.

His musical accompaniment is in the same easy-to-listen-to manner, thanks to the Charlie Magnante trio, Magnante, accordion, Tony Mottola, guitar, and George Wright, organist. It's an unusual instrumental combination with a delivery that is at once calm, precise and swingly. Not only that, it sounds mighty pretty, too!

#### Human (?) Relations

John J. Anthony is still at it. Worried minds are still expressing themselves on the air on his "Court of Human Relations". Listeners are still being regaled in the middle of the day by additional human tragedy. We say *still* because it's hard to believe that in this day and age of popular psychiatry that anyone without the title "Dr." preceding his name *feels* qualified to advise people who are emotionally unstable.

A recent March of Time pointed out the dangers of anyone following the guidance of radio "advisors", of which Mr. Anthony is the leading exponent. Granted that there are pitiful people, at a loss for advice, who grasp at the opportunity to get their muddle resolved the Anthony way. Is it entertainment? Wouldn't Mr. Anthony be doing his people a greater service by dispensing his heart balm in private? Isn't there a danger that an unwary (and distressingly simple) listener might apply Anthony advice to his

personal problems with disastrous results? No two problems in human relationship are exactly alike or else the millions of dollars spent on psychiatry have brought nothing.

Listeners with a touch of morbidity in their make-up may enjoy the tearful wretches who broadcast their sorrows, but the invasion of the human right of personal privacy makes us shudder with embarrassment for all concerned.

John J. Anthony is admirably equipped for his air portrayal. His voice has a soothing, almost incantatory quality. He is in turn kindly, stern, sympathetic and dramatic. He gives a very good performance. But is it dramatics that qualifies a man for the job of human counselor, or is it a life time of training in medicine and psychiatry?

#### Glamour Manor

Most variety show producers worry about putting on one good program a week—the folks over at "Glamour Manor" manage to produce *three* of 'em every week. And at 9:00 in the morning, too!

Star Kenny Baker's whimsicalities and tenorizing fall easily on the ears even in the a. m. Also, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, Kenny makes an ingratiating emcee of the audience participation show held in the "Elbow Room". His supporting cast is made up of the best in radio talent, three members of which are formerly fellow players on the Jack Benny program, Don Wilson, Elvia Allman and Sam Hearn. Elvia portrays another man-huntress on this show, but her "Elvia Biddle" seems to be a more sympathetic character than "Cobina" and her counterparts. Elvia's wonderful timing on comedy lines should be required listening for all budding comediennes. Speaking of sympathetic characters, Sam "Schlepperman" Hearn's brand of humor is a blend of frustration, comedy and pathos. Sam takes full advantage of his well written comedy script — the audience laughs at his every line. Don Wilson works the commercials in with his usual aplomb and aids the comedy situations with his hearty personality. Barbara Eller, as Kenny's girl, is not heard on every program, but she's a pleasant ingenue. Ingenues being what they are, she's overshadowed by the comic characters on the show.

One of the important ingredients that goes into making "Glamour Manor" good entertainment, is the orchestration of the program by Harry Lubin and his musicians. The music acts as a witty comment on the comedy interludes and sets the mood for the whole show.

audience is much better behaved than many of the audiences attending the night-time shows. They rarely intrude upon the performances.

### Maisie

Point one in favor of CBS' "Maisie" airshow (Friday, 7:30 p.m.) is the star's long-time identification with the character she portrays. In the several years before the radio series' inception, Ann Sothern had become so familiar to movie-goers as the brash, lovable, "Maisie Revere" that people seeing her on the street were often apt to greet her with an affectionate "Hiya, Maisie". So, when Miss Sothern brought "Maisie" to the microphone, the folks on the listening end already had her in their hearts and turned their dials to hear her as willingly as they would open their door to an old friend.

By the same token, however, "Maisie" had a previous reputation to live up to. She had to give listeners the same laughs and the same tugs on the heartstrings that she had been giving screen audiences. Our opinion is that "Maisie" is doing just about that. The show has had its scriptural ups-and-downs, but has managed to emerge a fairly consistent piece of entertainment.

Miss Sothern is to be credited for her devotion to this delightful little generous-hearted heroine. It isn't anything that is likely ever to win her acting honors, but it is something that gives millions of people pleasure—and, we should imagine that, in itself, makes the role a satisfying one. Credit is also due to Artie Phillips who scripts the broadcasts, Cal Kuhl who directs them, Al Sack who handles the music and Ken Niles who does some pleasing splicing for sponsor, Eversharp.

Things we particularly like about the show are its opening, and its clever, unobjectionable inclusion of "plugs" for the sponsor in the script. We cringe a little, however, when old puns (funny as they once were) suddenly appear in the midst of what had been, up to that point, amusing enough dialogue.

Elliott Lewis is just right as Maisie's harrassed boyfriend, "Bill", although it sometimes seems as though he's working too hard at it and could be just as effective if he would relax a little more. Sidney Miller, as "Terry", uses a voice that takes a bit of getting-used-to, but he contributes notably to the show's laugh appeal, as does Sheldon Leonard as "Lochinvar".

On a couple of occasions in past episodes, "Maisie" has done some singing on the show, which we hope will be a treat that is repeated now and then. In fact, some time ago, we remember rumors to the effect that Miss Sothern would soon offer her songs as a regular part of the program. We couldn't help but wish then

for an experimental period in this direction to see if the addition of vocal spots could be worked harmoniously into the program's already successfully-established situation comedy pattern. It seems a shame that Ann Sothern's musical talents are not being put to use, for she is a much more distinctive vocalist than many who are singing the ditties of today. However, we doubt that the actress' well-trained singing voice would sound congruous emanating from "Maisie".

Besides, for our money, "Maisie" doesn't have to be able to sing!

## Playbacks (Critical Comment)

### Treat or Treatment?

We don't doubt for a minute that Frank Sinatra is the best there is at what he does—but how good is that? In our list of life's memorable moments, Sinatra's rendition of a ballad ranks slightly higher than a Fitzpatrick Traveltalk and a little below a good game of Chinese Checkers. We bring this up because, like most people who start out to talk about Frankie, we wind up still wondering about his fans, the redoubtable bobby-soxers. Warned that their enthusiasm must be controlled, the kids have evidently made a valiant effort to do so, with the result that their acclaim, far from sounding controlled, sounds repressed. A noise like that which escapes from a steam pressure gauge comes at the end of Sinatra's songs. It's the kind of noise that normal people might be excused for making when they see their only child swept from the path of an oncoming truck or hear that they've inherited a million dollars.

After last night's (6) Sinatra show, we think we've found the answer. We don't think, like many who've tried to analyze the phenomenon, that the kids are emotionally starved. We think they're merely entertainment-starved. Maybe they're the kids who always got left at home while Papa and Mama snuck off to the opera, ballet, theater or the latest Clark Gable movie. Suddenly Frankie came along with his kids-this-is-for-you-style, sang a song and the poor things went a little mad at the great new world that had suddenly opened for them.

It was particularly illuminating to hear an old trouper like Jimmy Durante go to work on Sinatra's audience on this show. Durante was as wonderful as ever, but he had the kids screaming at some of the oldest gags on record. The older the gag, the more they laughed. It seemed to us that if lack of experience makes an enthusiastic audience, why stop with bobby-soxers? The below-twelve group would probably be even more receptive.

The show also proved something

else to us—Sinatra will never be the singer Durante is!

### The Real Star

Cathy McLeod may be a nice girl, a beautiful girl. We don't know, we've never seen her. But these two attributes, delightful as they may be, didn't qualify her for the starring role in the "Lux Radio Theater" production of "I've Always Loved You". We expected an actress when we listened to Lux, radio's number one dramatic show, and at this stage in her development, it appeared that's just what Miss McLeod isn't.

"Aw", you may say, "she's a newcomer—give the girl a chance . . ." Fine. We're all for newcomers getting their chance. But we think newcomers who are so new that they've overlooked a little matter of dramatic training don't belong on the star roster of Lux.

The real star of the show was concert pianist Ignace Hilsberg who played excerpts of some of the most difficult music ever written for piano. Mr. Hilsberg, who is a member of a profession which cannot substitute personal beauty and good intentions for talent and years of training, saved the show. His piano portrayed the

moods and emotions of the heroine and supplied the climax of the story.

And what was Mr. Hilsberg's reward for his minor effort? "A vote of thanks" from Producer Keighley which came at the end of the show just before the commercials. Louis Silver's orchestra, augmented for the performance with additional musicians, did its part in bringing the musical story to life, with no "vote of thanks".

Miss McLeod's co-stars were Joe Cotten, who sounded as if he was sorry he'd gotten mixed up in the story at all, and Otto Kruger, who pulled out all stops in putting over his character of great conductor and treated the audience to a display of acting technique which, we believe, they'll never get from the Miss McLeods of the profession.

were silly. The third said she'd listened a couple of years ago when her husband was stationed in a forlorn army camp in Arizona and she was so lonesome mornings she turned on the radio for company. All three ladies felt that the "little plays" were hokum and that only morons would listen to them.

OUTSIDE OF COMMERCIALS, there's probably no other radio subject eliciting more spirited opinions from listeners than soap operas. Those who write them claim they *are* true to life. Many of those who listen (about one fourth of the dialers) are college women. A good percentage have high school educations. Of those with less education many women apparently feel that serials offer a pattern of behavior. One important fact brought out by CBS' research was that there was no great difference between soap opera and non-soap opera listeners. Surveys went so far as to take listeners' happiness index into consideration and no appreciable difference was found. This would contradict the opinion that serials breed discontent and distrust.

For those women who do not like serials, some networks and stations offer a different type of programming. But it is apparent to those listening that audience participation shows (especially daytime) are often just as boring and distasteful as soap operas. This would seem to indicate a need for still more good musical programs. And better written and better produced informative programs at a time when more people can hear them.

Radio seems to be missing a bet in this respect—missing a bet but not missing a barrage of criticism. We think radio can get itself off the spot and next week, if there's room, we'll talk it over with you.

**T**HAT old axiom about "Be yourself!" is wise advice.

But if Mel Blanc ever took it seriously, he'd probably starve to death!

Because even when he's being Mel Blanc (on the CBS "Mel Blanc Show" every Tuesday evening), he's being somebody else, too. That is... we mean...

Oh, you know about Mel Blanc if you've ever listened to a radio. You know about his Bugs Bunny voice, his Porky Pig voice; his Happy Postman voice, his train-caller voice, his Private Snafu voice, his Pedro voice, his Scottie Brown voice and all the rest. You know that he does some ninety per cent of the cartoon character vocalizing out at Warner Brothers, too.

*"Break the Bank" Requires More Knowledge Than Luck to Make a Winner on This High-Stake Show*

**W**HEN H. V. Kaltenborn originated the first quiz show over a decade ago, little did he dream that his idea would be mothered, pampered, and developed into the extravaganza that it is today.

Now with quiz shows and audience participation programs crowding the networks, it becomes the responsibility of producers and directors to make their alrers stand out, to shine with originality.

Among all the "do-you-know" broadcasts on the air, don't overlook

"Break the Bank." Gone are the easy questions, the emcee's gentle hints that scream the answers, the fanning of scripts that enables contestants to read entire answers, or the prize questions that are virtually given servicemen and veterans because it's "good-human-interest-policy."

"Break the Bank" is an educational feature that pays off in large monetary rewards. It's not luck so much as actual knowledge that is required to produce a winner.

The questions are not little unknown facts that make you want to shout into your radio, "So what!" but are based on information that

furnishes delightful party patter and makes a high school student sound like a college graduate.

Joseph Nathan Kane, a slim, Harry Truman-looking-type who is the author of "Famous First Facts" thinks up the questions. It's no easy task, since he cannot exploit his own knowledge at the expense of a contestant.

Kane, who has spent twenty years investigating facts and visiting almost every library in the United States, is now spending the greater part of his time stopping the average man on the street and asking him "What cathedral is the largest in the world?" or "What is the symbol of the 1939 World's Fair?"

#### Questions Sealed

The results of his personal survey prove to him whether or not his questions are too specialized. When he has finally compiled his list he groups them according to subject matter with ten questions in each category. Then he painfully types out little cards, places them in separate envelopes, seals them and brings them to the Ritz Theater where "Break the Bank" is staged. There they remain unopened until airtime.

Kane's work is done, but emcee Bert Parks and host-announcer Bud Collyer are just beginning a hard evening. Collyer selects the contestants from the audience. It is up to him to weed out the "professionals" and select people who present an overall sectional and occupational picture.

Parks takes over and tries to warm up the quizees, to help them overcome mike fright and enable them to walk off the stage with as much money as possible. Some of the contestants are more at ease before the mike than Parks ever was.

The prize money on the program is naturally of prime interest to all. The first correct answer nets \$10, the next \$20, then \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$300, \$500 and \$1000 or whatever the bank happens to be at the time.

Whenever a contestant misses he has a second chance. For example, if all answers were correct up to \$100 and the contestant makes an error he drops back to \$50 and goes on.

#### Bank Grows

If he misses again, however, he collects the money he has attained, and the sponsors put an equal amount in the bank. That makes the bank of one thousand dollars grow and grow . . . and grow!

Because "Break the Bank" is so lucrative, the job of filling up the studio is no problem. In fact, the line outside the Ritz Theater begins to form at six and a substantial crowd is waiting by seven thirty.

When the doors open at eight the hopefuls surge forth like an uncontrolled sea. Pushing and shoving, being pushed and shoved in turn, they race madly for aisle seats and the front rows. The "professionals", garishly dressed, stand out in their bright reds and greens, screwy hats and jingling bracelets.

Some "professionals" have sectional accents down so pat that they could give up their careers of going from one quiz show to another and become radio actors. The only trouble is, in their excitement they often get their accents mixed and a Southern lassie may end up with a Western drawl or her own inimitable Brooklynese.

Collyer knows them all, since he has worked on almost every quiz show in existence at one time or another. They never give up hope though and each week finds them in their "choice seats."

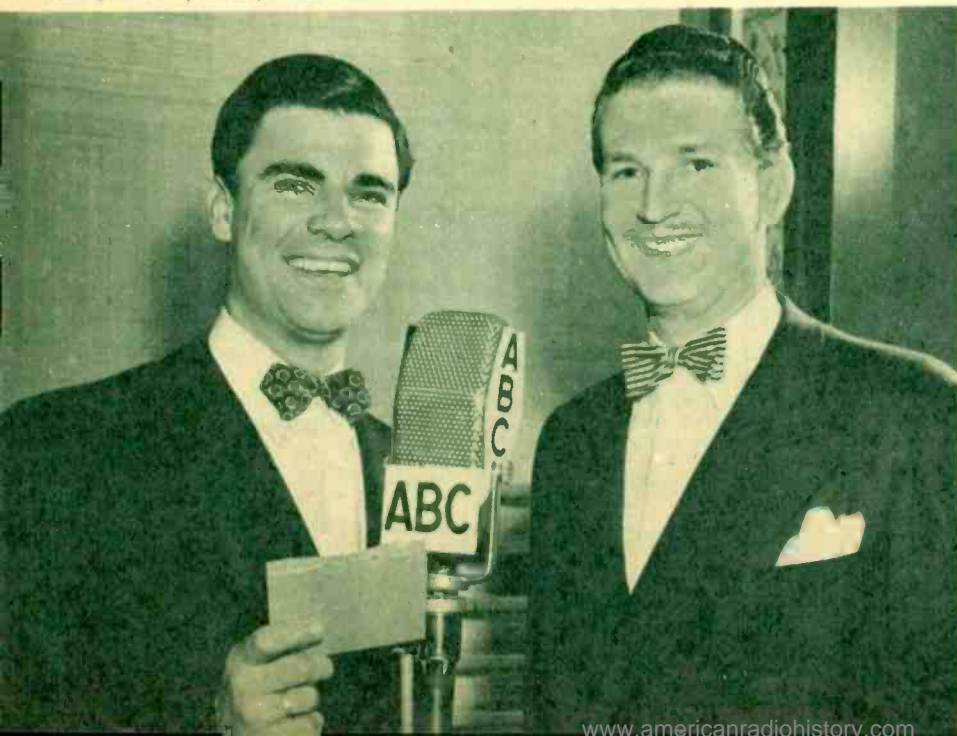

▲ IT MAY BE EARLY, but already Eddie can be found up and about the day's task of sorting mail and preparing scripts.

**W**E had originally planned on visiting Eddie Cantor in his lovely Beverly Hills home but, alas, we soon learned this would entail waiting until 1947. Eddie is that busy—and, well, we do have a deadline to meet.

For years, we have watched the famed comedian bustling to and from NBC, have admired his many crusades and campaigns, have been a faithful listener to his radio show,

an avid movie-goer to his flickers—and we always wondered how he managed so many activities so successfully. Now we know. The word "inactivity" doesn't exist in his vocabulary—because Eddie never stops.

When we walked into his bungalow on the RKO lot, last week, we found him talking to Al Jolson on the telephone. Cantor, who likes to kid, was ribbing Jolson. "Say, aren't you celebrating an anniversary in show business pretty soon? What will this be, your tenth? After all, you'll only be nineteen next month."

"Great boy," he concluded. "Hope he'll be able to guest on the airshow soon."

Luncheon with Eddie is always a jolly affair—even if it is interrupted periodically by the greetings of passersby. But because he's enthu-

siastic about anything of which he speaks, he isn't easily side-tracked.

### Very Cozy

Since we had come to talk about the house, we inquired about the number of Cantors residing in it at present. "Oh," Eddie enumerated on his fingers, "there's Ida, three of my daughters, one grandchild, and five servants. A cozy little family."

The Cantor house (at least from the outside) appears as a large, red-brick, English-style home. The family has lived in it for ten years, having moved in the first summer that Eddie made California his permanent residence.

"We aren't home very often to make much use of it," he summed up, "but it's a nice house."

When one chats with Cantor, he soon learns that Eddie's busy mind darts from one subject to another—and without much warning. While we were deep in the thought of the Cantor household, Eddie had already introduced another topic into the conversation. There is nothing in which he isn't interested.

He was just as excited about his new air series as the picture he's producing. The latter will be another co-starrer with Joan Davis.

About the air show, Eddie raves over the singing voice of new vocalist Margaret Whiting. "Funny thing," he reminisced, "but before his death, I was very close to her dad Dick, and when Margaret was born, Dick sent me a telegram saying he had just brought another singer into the world. And here she is today, on my show."

"Will the radio program conflict with your picture making?" we inquired.

But Eddie assured us that it wouldn't, for Thursday, ether day, is

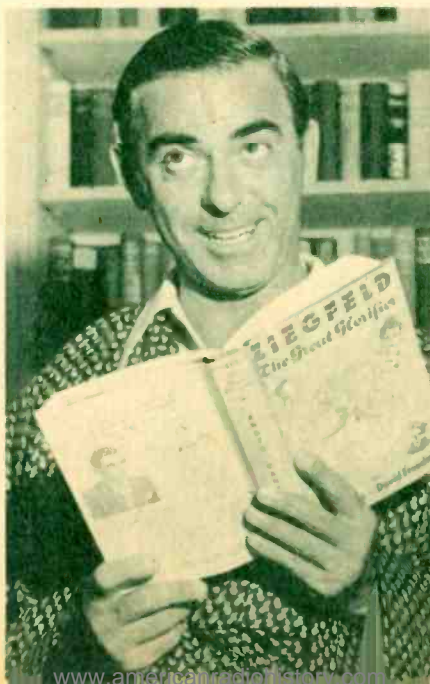
set aside solely for that purpose.

with his sponsor and agency he had argued politics with them in such a, what they termed, "provocative manner", that when they decided to replace another commentator on the network with a news analyst, they prevailed upon Sam to take the job. In spite of the fact that Sam had had no ambitions toward this sort of commentary, he found himself on one hundred stations, coast-to-coast, with a news broadcast. With a caustic typewriter and a satirical tongue, Sam started calling them as he saw them. "I guess I surprised my sponsor—he and I were poles apart in political thinking, but he was big enough to let me say what I thought."

Sam has been in and out of hot water ever since. Intent on being a fair man and following that straight line, Sam has done just that, no matter what the consequences were to himself. He says he lost his network program because he called a newspaper owner "seditious." He has lost other commentary programs locally when a more discreet man would have been silent and retained them. "And I was completely miscast in the role in which I found myself," Sam told us. "I'm no intellectual—no specialist in political dialectics. I was never a student of labor politics. People think I am—I'm just honest."

Back as a sportscaster—Balter is far from miscast. He spends four or five hours a week in athletic activity—swimming, tennis, basketball, softball, or squash. (Squash, for our information, turned out to be a game played on a five-wall court with racquets—sort of a combination of handball and tennis.) Sam is number one squash player at the Hollywood Athletic club, a distinction he'll probably hold for some time as it's such a strenuous game that few people can keep up with it. Balter avers he loses five pounds every time he plays! Former star member of the basketball team that represented the United States in the Olympics, runner-up and finalist in All-Coast competition in tennis, All-Coast star in basketball, All-American in basketball and also star of baseball and track—Balter can take it.

mosphere, Mel also included in the new show a couple of voices that are favorites of his... Zooky and Doctor Crabbe, for instance. Zooky

is the stuttering, stumbling vocalist who is Mel's "helper" in the shop (on the air, that is), and Doctor Crabbe is the dog doctor (consulting veterinarian, if you don't mind) with a slight Dobermann-Pinscher in his throat.

Where does he dream up all these voices? That's a question Mel is called upon to answer a hundred times a week. The answer is imagination, plus vocal gymnastics. Mel creates a character in his own imagination, and then experiments until he finds a voice that fits it.

"My main difficulty is finding a place to rehearse," he says. "After all, a guy can't bark and stutter and giggle and burble in public without causing some slight disturbance!" The answer to that dilemma is his car. Mel just gets in his automobile, drives to some deserted spot, rolls up the windows... and lets go with the voice tricks.

But that's the top-of-the-ladder Mel Blanc. There was another... a very subdued character actor who tried to talk Hollywood into appreciating his talents a number of years ago, without results. Aside from the fact that he began entertaining his grammar school pals with vaudeville shows at the age of seven, learned to play the concert violin and the tuba when he was still in his teens and became the youngest pit orchestra conductor in the country when he led a theater band at the age of twenty-two... still Hollywood was unimpressed. So Mel went back to Portland, Oregon, where he wrote, produced and starred in his own radio shows after making his original mike debut in San Francisco. After a few seasons as literally a one-man show, he came back to Hollywood and auditioned for a host of comedy-show producers. "Why," was their unanimous lament, "haven't you been around before?" Well, of course, the only answer to that one, if you're a guy like Mel, is a Mona Lisa smile and a slight, a very slight, grinding of the teeth!

Mel's first network radio appearance was with the Al Pearce gang, and since that time he's gained undisputed title to the reputation of being the busiest funnyman in town.

And possibly for the first time in history, radio is mighty glad it drew a Blanc!

signed the show on the air (supposedly) five minutes before the hour. Thinking the studio clocks were wrong, Paul went completely to pieces, and the announcer threw his script up into the air, yelling "I knew I couldn't make it every day!"

Although Paul has an enviable reputation for his calm, easy-going attitude toward anything and everything "radio," he admits confidentially that "It's all bottled up inside. In fact, nobody but the little woman even knows about those programs where I lost as much as five pounds before sign-off time!"

Paul claims that he has yet to meet an actor or actress possessing the famous Hollywood "temperament," and he's worked with practically every big name in the film city. They're all usually very nervous, he reports, and just as afraid of a mike as most radio stars would be of a camera.

A great deal of the success of the show depends upon the persuasive powers of roving interviewers Shannon and Webster and emcee Stu Wilson—and that's a lot of persuasion! Stu is a comparative rarity in his field—he's so nice to his contestants. He doesn't want to poke fun at them—he's out to see they have a good time. And of course those wonderful prizes help!

"Gee," Stu says wistfully, "I'd love to have some of them. I could sure use them, too. Is this what they call 'starving in the midst of plenty'?"
