In addition to this little-used talent, she has an undeniable flair for comedy, which we've observed in her stage appearances, and a sense of mimicry that she was allowed to display in only her first movie. Besides all this, Eleanor Powell was, before her screen career even began, the star of a swell New York airshow with a format similar to that now employed by the Hildegard program.

**GLENN FORD.** He is an excellent actor with a good radio voice. He is the current number-one romantic idol of young America. He is, incidentally, also the husband of the above-mentioned Eleanor Powell. Perhaps radio could co-star them successfully.

## Stafford Steps Out

*Yes, Jo Stafford Is a Happy Girl These Days. She's Fulfilled an Ambition She's Always Had—Singing Star of Her Own Show*

▲ **JO STAFFORD** never wanted to be anything but a singer. Whether a song is a hot jump tune or a tearful ballad doesn't matter from Jo's viewpoint. "They all make me happy, just because I'm singing them," she says.

**L**ONG BEACH, California is pretty proud of Miss Jo Stafford. And quite rightly so. As star of her own show, "Supper Club", and one of the top favorite recording artists, Jo's in the position of home town girl who made good in the big city.

Jo has returned from New York to California to live permanently, she hopes, except for occasional moves east with the show. When Jo stepped from the train in Pasadena recently, she stepped right onto Long Beach. Sounds impossible? You don't know what proud city fathers can do to welcome a hometown star. The Long Beach Chamber of Commerce had filled a box with soil, and when Jo reached California she put her foot down on good old Long Beach ground especially transported to Pasadena for the purpose.

We talked to the popular songstress at a rehearsal of her NBC ra-

dio show. Recalling that Jo was at one time one-third of a popular vocal trio, the Stafford Sisters, we asked what had become of the remaining two-thirds of the ensemble.

"One of my sisters is married to Galen Drake, the radio commentator. The other lives with me and helps me get things done. This is Chris, my nephew," she added, introducing a large-eyed three-year-old. Young Chris, evidently an old hand at radio rehearsals, was being held spellbound by The Satisfiers, who were singing, "That's What Uncle Remus Says". "It's his favorite song", Jo whispered.

### Is Glamour Girl

The last time we had seen Jo in person was quite a while back when she was singing with the Pied Pi-

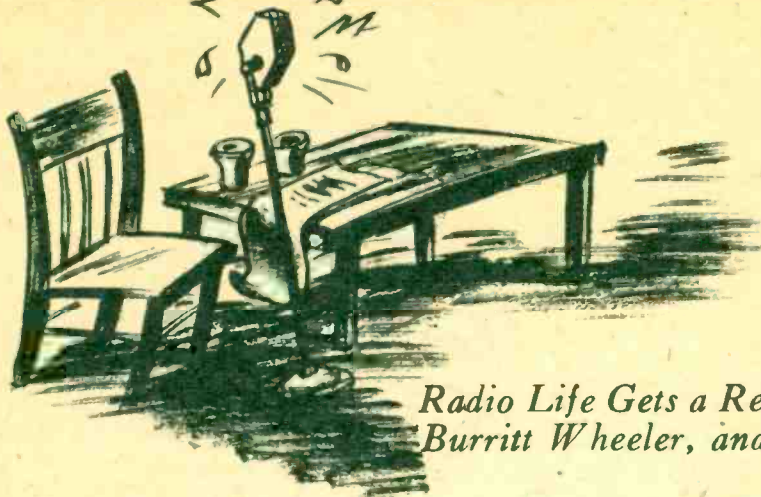
pers on the Johnny Mercer summer show when one of her main chores was the "Poor Miriam" commercial. Always an attractive girl, Jo is now a glamorous one as well. Loss of the weight which many singers develop along with a beautiful voice has slimmed Jo down to schoolgirl proportions.

Jo's attractiveness is heightened by her exquisite coloring. Her hair is a dark red, her eyes are blue and her fair complexion is brushed with the slight freckling that goes with that hair. Her freckles are so light they don't photograph, but in person they give her an entrancing little-girl look. She has a lovely smile, and when she's amused at a joke or while she's singing a gay tune her eyes sparkle. When you talk to her she's very attentive, and

# Heard *But* Not Seen



*Radio Life Gets a Reporter's-Eye-View of Mythical Burritt Wheeler, and Reports Its Findings to You*

Monday through Friday, 3:00 p.m.

**A**LMOST as much a man of mystery as "The Whistler" is CBS' Burritt Wheeler. Like you, we had never seen him—nor even laid eyes on a camera likeness of him, since none are allowed. (That ruling accounts for this photo-less feature on Mr. Wheeler.) So, of course, our curiosity had reached a peak when we arrived at CBS and found ourselves at the door of Studio 5, inside of which, we were told, Burritt Wheeler himself was seated at a microphone delivering his customary homespun whimsy, his afternoon broadcast chat.

We opened the door with cautious respect to the "On the Air" sign that was glowing warningly above it, and peered interestedly through the glass partition of the inner door. We could see the microphone, in position over a script table on which stood two paper cups, half-emptied of the water they had contained. Fifteen-minute microphone chats, such as those Burritt Wheeler regularly delivers, cause a man's throat to get dry. A swallow of water makes the words come out a lot easier.

On our arrival at Columbia Square, we had checked the broadcasting schedule and found the information "Burritt Wheeler—Studio 5." Now, in Studio 5, we took a reassuring second glance at the "On the Air" sign above the door. It was lit, which should have meant that the broadcast was in progress, but we looked again into the studio where we saw the microphone and the table, but pulled up to it, an empty chair!

Aha! Then the mythical Mr. Wheeler was a myth, after all!

No. The studio clock told us that it was three thirty-two. Contrary to the lighted sign above the door, Mr. Wheeler was off the air and had ap-

parently made a hasty exit. We headed quickly for his office, and there, we actually found him!

What does he look like? That, we suppose, is what you want to know. Is he old or young? Is he bald? Is he bearded?

Wellllll, he isn't young, exactly. In fact, he proudly informed us, he's a grandfather. But then—he isn't old exactly, either. No man who has done the things he has done will ever be old.

After World War I, when he found himself comfortably situated in the advertising business, Burritt Wheeler suddenly decided to follow the whims of his soul—those that most men harbor at some time or another during their lives, but seldom do anything about.

Burritt Wheeler did.

## His Background

He abandoned the cushioned routine of his business world to become, successively, a prospector in the Siskiyou, a gold miner in British Columbia, a trader in the Solomons, a country newspaper editor and a syndicated columnist. The material contained in his columns, "Our Home Town" and "Thinking in Print," was similar to that he now employs in his air talks.

Asked about the preparation that precedes the presentation of his broadcasts, Burritt scowled and admonished, "There isn't any." Actually, by his own admission, research men garner background material which Wheeler puts into note form. He reads directly from these notes when on the air, using no script.

In addition to his three p.m. broad-

casts, Burritt Wheeler is also heard on KNX's early-morning "Sunrise Salute," which of course means that he has to rise daily at dawn. He doesn't relish this, but accomplishes it with little difficulty, aided by one alarm clock which he promptly obeys. "Oh, sometimes," he admitted, "I have a little trouble finding the dog-gone thing to get it turned off."

Contentedly retired from his globe-circling adventures, Wheeler now resides unspectacularly with his wife

in a hilltop home overlooking Hollywood, his interest having settled from the adventurous pursuits of prospecting and pearl-trading to the raising of chrysanthemums in his own back yard.

## No Radio Fan

Because of his early-morning air chores, he is usually in bed by ten. He seldom listens to the radio, save to "Information, Please" and "Theater Guild on the Air." As an advertising man—first, last, and always—he considers radio more of a selling device than a medium of art. Nevertheless, beneath his insistently commercial exterior beats a heart that admittedly "gets a glow" whenever he receives a letter from someone stating that something Burritt has said on his broadcast has saved the listener from suicide, divorce, or some other unhappiness.

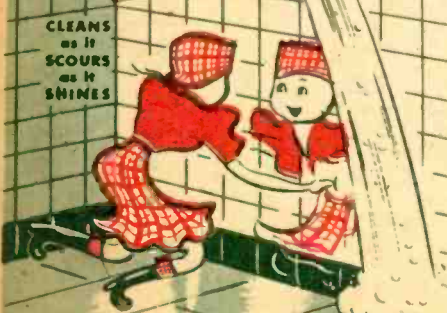
"But," Wheeler reiterated, "I get the biggest thrill when I check with my sponsor and find that my broadcasts have helped to increase the sales—because I firmly believe that the products I sell are of far more benefit to the listener than anything I have to say."

As for the ban on photographs of broadcaster Burritt, he explained that the listeners would be disillusioned if they saw a camera likeness of him. "Everybody has his own idea about what I look like. To see me would destroy the mental image each dialer has in mind as he hears me, and all of them would be disappointed. Not, mind you," he concluded with emphasis, "that I'm ashamed of my 'mug,' but Lord knows, it's nothing to be proud of, either."

As for our own mental picture of Burritt Wheeler—now that we've seen him, that is—we would say he is sixty-ish, with a wiry frame and wispy hair, large, uneven features, and a tanned, interestingly lined face that bespeaks his active mind and an interesting life.

### For Love o' Mike (General Comment)

#### Stafford Smart

We were very pleased the other evening to hear Jo Stafford include on her NBC "Supper Club" broadcast an enchanting Tennessee folk song. A native Tennessean, Jo stated that she knows many of the age-old melodies which are a boon to the history of real American music, and if her listeners express their approval with requests, she will feature them on her airshow often.

Last week, as her initial offering, Jo tackled a catchy little melody, these folksy lyrics:

He's gone away  
For to stay a little while,  
But he's coming back,  
If he's gone ten thousand miles.  
Oh, who will tie my shoe,  
And who will glove my hand,  
And who will kiss my ruby lips  
When he is gone?  
Look away, look away,  
Over yandro.

We think any singer is smart who appreciates the quality and audience appeal in folk music, and contributes to its restoration. Not only is this beneficial to the music world, but it also adds to the vocalist's appeal. The inclusion of folk songs lends variety and whimsy to an otherwise routine programming of popular music (in our estimation, the songs of today have reached a point of almost monotonous standardization).

#### Credit Where Due

The realism of last week's KFI "Favorite Story" dramatization of "Moby Dick" made us aware that a good soundman was doing a fine job. We were thinking to ourselves, "Golly, he oughta get name credit" when lo and behold, at the program's conclusion, after listing the show's cast, the announcer added, "... and sound designs were by Jack Hays."

Nice practice! We hope all airshows will soon make it a habit. Goodness knows, Radio Life has been plugging for this long and hard enough!

The adolescents of our Capitol city are as interested and fascinated by the workings of our government and the policies of our congressmen as the youth of Hollywood and vicinity are by movie studios and the peregrinations of movie stars.

"Government," on the first broadcast, was represented by Congressman John J. Moroney of Oklahoma, who answered the questions and explained the points raised by his youthful panel of experts. Congressman Moroney was an ideal choice for the voice of government, in this instance, as he sounds like a kindly, interested counselor with a belief in the abilities and intelligence of the younger generation.

You may well find, as you listen to this program, that youth is raising many a question you may have voiced yourself. Age doesn't govern the caliber of queries advanced. In fact, when we reflect that at the age of these Washington, D. C., youngsters we were worrying about nothing more weighty than how to clean our saddle shoes, we don't feel too proud of our political development.

### Venter's Pictorial

Do you delight in the human interest stories which are to be discovered in every historic event and in the lives of all famous people? Then you'll be entertained by the quarter-hour airfare that comes your way three times weekly (Monday, Wednesday, Friday, 9:15 p.m., KHJ-Mutual) under the title of "Mel Venter's Pictorial."

Venter has a good radio voice and a flair for story-spinning that makes his fifteen-minute narration not in the least monotonous. He talks rapidly and builds his tales in a manner that holds attention to the end.

Stories he has told include ones about such people in widely diverse walks of life as Andy Smith, University of California football coach; Mrs. Houdini, widow of the great magician; the long-missing Dorothy Arnall and Judge Crater; John Andrews, the man who died with the secret of a formula with which gas motors could run on either salt or fresh water.

As the above indicates, Venter often tells tales concerning people whose names are not widely known. One story he related concerned a railroad engineer who befriended a stray cat after he discovered that the animal had ridden on the brake beams of a railroad car all the way from Oakland to Sacramento. Later, Venter received a letter from the engineer's widow, telling how the cat had lapsed into a coma and died immediately after her husband's death.

Venter frequently receives mail from his listeners in response to the stories he tells. One night, he related how Columbus had written the history of his expedition, enclosed it in a bottle and thrown it into the sea. The story is, continued Venter, that the

Its ingredients should be a warm family atmosphere, homey humor, tender young love, and songs.

**CASS DALEY.** Let's bring this raucous comedienne back to the microphone with only one stipulation in mind—let Cass be Cass.

**MARY MARTIN.** A warm, miki-wise personality with a swell singing style is Miss Martin, who was a perfect foil for Crosby on the old Kraft show—remember?

**ORSON WELLES.** One either likes Welles, or one doesn't. We do, and we don't think it can be denied that whatever he is doing—acting, narrating, directing, commentating, whether singly or all at once—the result is colorful ether entertainment and interesting listening for dialers.

**RUTH ETTING.** Hail to Rudy Vallee for returning this beloved personality to the spotlight with a guest appearance on his airshow. But give us an inch, and we want Etting on a show of her own!

**GALE PAGE, BARBARA LUDDY.** Veteran air actresses are these two. They shouldn't be inactive.

**JEAN ARTHUR, CLAIRE TREVOR, MARTHA SCOTT.** Three extremely fine actresses, three interestingly distinctive personalities, three terrific voices for radio.

**REX HARRISON.** A fascinating gentleman with irrepressible charm. Radio should give this ex-King of Siam a royal welcome.

**PATRICE MUNSEL.** A delightful young miss with an amazing Metropolitan Opera voice and femceeing talents. She shouldn't have been removed from "Family Hour."

**LEE SWEETLAND.** His gifted voice was once selected to substitute for John Charles Thomas during the latter's summer absence from his airshow. Recently Lee has been heard doing guest shots on New York broadcasts.

These voices, we think, would add much to our listening pleasure. Whose voices do you wish to hear?

Jo recalled that her two big breaks toward singing stardom were, first, when with the Pied Pipers she was signed with the Tommy Dorsey band, and next when Johnny Mercer signed her to her Capitol recording contract. Always a favorite on the West Coast, Jo names her record of "Long Ago and Far Away" as the one that brought her national attention.

Most of her requests are to sing those songs she has recorded. "I'll Be Seeing You", "Yesterdays", and "Someone to Love", among the first songs she waxed, are still being requested.

Jo claims she enjoys singing any type of song, but thinks she does ballads better than hot numbers. She says it's tough to pick her own favorite of the records she's done, but she admits she kind of likes "Day by Day".

Two new Capitol releases to watch for are Jo's "Give Me Something to Dream About" backed by "That's Where I Came In". Also on tap for Stafford is a movie role. (Please, boys, make it technicolor!)

### Breath Control

If you really want to be impressed by the Stafford tones—beyond the capacity of the usual listener—try holding your breath while she sings a ballad phrase and don't breathe until she does. You'll probably explode—we almost did. In fact, we gave up half way through. Jo's early classical training is put to good use in her career as a popular singer.


She still loves classical music and collects records avidly — mostly classical. Tschaiakowsky and Rachmaninoff have the widest representation in her collection. "I don't really have enough time for hobbies," she added. "My only time for hobbies I spend in reading."

She prefers casual clothes—"but, unfortunately," she smiled, "I don't get much of a chance to wear them." For her rehearsal Jo was wearing low heels and a simple sweater and skirt combination. Jo admits that she enjoys her rehearsals and air show as much as she appears to. And indeed, the rehearsal for "Supper Club" is so relaxed and pleasant that the program reflects its happy mood. 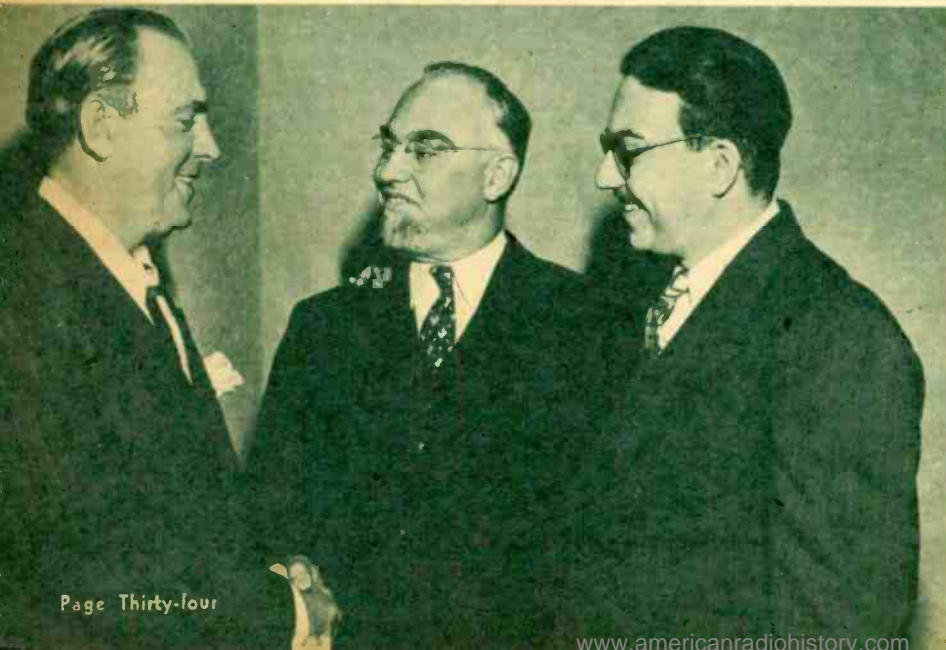
## Mutual Program Delves into Scientific Realms of Interest to Plain Joe Doaks

Sunday, 6 p.m.  
MBS—KHJ-KGB-RFXM-KVOE

**E**XPLORING the Unknown" is a unique series of dramatized shows which enterprisingly probes the listener's stake in up-to-the-minute scientific data and problems.

Sherman Dryer, the show's enterprising producer-director, has introduced a new treatment of scientific matter to radio. Gadgets, inventions and services continually being turned up and proffered by scientists in medicine and mechanics have served as the basis of many of these exciting dramatizations. A far cry from academic "ivory tower" research, the program concentrates on the dramatic knowledge that would be intelligible and interesting to the average listening audience.

Brian Donlevy, Basil Rathbone, Adolphe Menjou, Miriam Hopkins, Orson Welles, Kay Francis, Sir Cedric Hardwicke and Pat O'Brien have recently starred in the dramatizations, many of which have dealt with ex-

tremely controversial problems. To wit: a recent program dealing with the experiments and research in connection with "Psychosomatic Medicine," a form of therapy used in the care and treatment of individuals suffering from physical disorders, mentally induced; or the famous show, "Can We Communicate with the Dead?," produced in association with Science Illustrated Magazine.

#### Timely Broadcast

Last June when the gigantic mushroom-like cloud from the atomic bomb explosion was still rising over Bikini Atoll, "Exploring the Unknown" presented timely dramatization on the history of the bomb, describing the years of experiment and research which brought forth that awesome weapon of war. Clifton

Fadiman, who was heard as narrator, held his opening remarks in abeyance right up to the time of the actual broadcast, pending the receipt of last minute reports from MBS observers at Bikini.

In a slightly lighter, though no less scientific vein, Adolphe Menjou starred in "Shall I Marry the Girl?," a special dramatization based on the latest attempts by science to correlate accurately the various personality traits and emotional factors in marriage. All of the aforementioned are given as factual examples of Sherman Dryer's guiding principle—"There is no reason an educational program should be dull." Dramatizing scientific data in a way designed to entertain as it instructs, has been the key of this series. Honesty and re-

spect for the listener's intelligence have distinguished these shows. Though abstract scientific subjects may be of great interest to professional scientists, the average radio listener has more interest in migraine headaches, the atom bomb, or prospects for sending a rocket to the moon.

The writers of these shows must, of course, have thorough knowledge of their subject. As many as four or five researchers are used on each story, to assure a well-rounded supply of information. The entertainment package develops as a fictional piece with the principal characters prototypes of people who have a legitimate stake in the resolution of the scientific problem being dramatized.

# Diary of a Decade

*We Retrospect with the Ole Professor, Who, Finishing a Decade in Radio, Looks Back on Enviously Busy Record*

**J**AMES Caesar Petrillo, head of the musicians' union, literally, although unintentionally, forced James King Kern Kyser to start his NBC "College of Musical Knowledge" program!

The story begins ten years ago with Kyser's engagement at Chi-

AT SAN DIEGO MARINE BASE, February 1941, Kay and his "College" did first full hour radio broadcast from a service camp. Songstress Ginny Simms left the aggregation about six months after this to start her own air show.



FOR FIVE YEARS, Kyser didn't do one single broadcast from the NBC studios in Hollywood. Each week he played a different camp or war plant. Chicago's Blackhawk Restaurant. In 1936, the Blackhawk was the only night spot in Chicago open on Mondays. In order to attract a crowd on that usually slow night, the management had a program called "The Midnight Flyers" over a local radio station. The show called for free guest appearances by the top-name talent currently appearing at other Chicago clubs. Kay Kyser emceed the two-hour sustaining show.

However, before Kay returned to the Blackhawk the following year, Petrillo had issued an edict forbidding free guest appearances by members of his union. Kay was faced with the necessity of finding a substitute for the program which at times had utilized as much as \$500,000 worth of talent for one perform-

ance. The audience participation idea was a natural and Kyser's first show was a combination community sing and amateur night.

The radio audience was asked to answer five questions and if their correct answers were in the mail by midnight of the following week, they were sent mock diplomas. The Blackhawk patrons were selected from table numbers and put on the air answering musical questions and occasionally singing portions of a song.

# Men of MUSIC---

No. 23 of a Series

*Robert Emmett Dolan*

By Jane Pelgram

**N**O MATTER how inconsequential a bit of music on a show may seem to be, someone is listening to that music . . . and they should be pleased!" The sincerity behind these words is reflected in the music of young Robert Emmett Dolan, who rose in a little more than ten years from playing a piano for his meals in a New York cafe to waving the stick on Dinah Shore's nationwide radio program, supervising a staff of arrangers and composers, and leading the Paramount Studio recording orchestra. And he's regarded as tops in his trade.

Although he's been referred to as the "young music maker from Montreal," Robert Dolan was born in Hartford, Connecticut. The family with its six daughters and six sons, of whom Robert is the oldest, moved to Montreal when young Master Dolan was four. But when "Bobby", as he is known to his contemporaries, was only three, his mother, a former piano teacher, introduced him to the world of music.

"I was so slow," he lamented.

"Took two weeks to learn 'Chopsticks'."

Bobby belied any slowness at learning anything by sailing through his schooling at St. Michaels and Catholic High, and matriculating at Loyola College by the time he was fourteen years old. He had entered college presumably to study pre-law, but in less than a year had joined Loyola's music department, teaching piano. During his summers he attended the keyboard for a band aboard a steamer plying between Montreal and Quebec. When he was sixteen the lure of a musical career and the bright lights of Manhattan won over the appeal of a legal future, and this country again claimed the young musician.

In New York, Robert Dolan did everything from plugging songs and playing luncheon music in a cafe to playing in the pit bands of the

Broadway musical shows. While there Bobby heard and played with some of the men who are top names in music today, in both the jazz idiom and in musical comedies. While playing with "Follow Through" he met Walter O'Keefe, and the two of them set out for Hollywood. The "talkies" had arrived, so the duo collaborated on a series of themes, some of which are still popular today. "Little By Little" was one of their first.

### Meets Crosby

It was about 1938 that Bing Crosby and Dolan were first teamed. Today he's still supervising much of Crosby's music. He composed the background music and conducted the entire score for Bing's Academy Award winner, "Going My Way." When RKO did "Bells of St. Mary's" Dolan was again the man behind the

The way the idea clicked was phenomenal. Within four weeks, the mail was averaging 5,000 letters per week. It was this fan mail that interested George Washington Hill in sponsoring the show over the entire NBC network for Lucky Strike cigarettes. That was on March 30, 1938.

Sully Mason (one of the original members of the band who remained with it until 1944) said, "Why not call the program 'Kay Kyser's College of Musical Knowledge?'" The suggestion was snapped up.

### Show Takes Shape

Down through the years other suggestions were made and the college grew into one of NBC's most popular shows. Kay Kyser became "the ole professor," the cast of the show became "the faculty," a different college was saluted by the show each week and college songs were worked into the program as often as possible. A degree of Phi Beta Kyser was conferred upon the winning contestant and guest stars were given honorary "degrees." Ginny Simms, Harry Babbitt and Sully Mason handled the vocals with Ish Kabibble on hand for the comedy routines with Kyser.

Starting February 26, 1941, when Kay Kyser broadcast his entire program from the U. S. Marine Corps Naval Operating Base at San Diego, California, the history of the college became closely allied with the history of World War II. A recording of this broadcast is preserved in the National Archives of the U. S. Government in Washington, D. C.

Kay and his band were on deck in 1942 for the gala opening of the Hollywood Canteen, and three years later, November 21, 1945, he and his gang, with Bette Davis as guest, broadcast his "College" from the canteen on closing night.

By February, 1943, Kyser had played more than 250 posts from ocean to ocean and border to border. Once he had provided twenty-eight camps with 1000 shows in twenty-one days! At Oak Knoll and Mare Island, Kyser and his troupers turned in thirty-two shows in one day! 1943 provided Kyser with two more "firsts." He was the first civilian ever authorized by the U. S. Navy to play a series of benefits to raise funds to equip Navy hospitals with swimming pools. Kyser and his band were also the first civilian entertainers ever to appear on a Man of War in full commission, the USS Nevada.

On May 22, 1944, Harry Babbitt received a "greeting" from the President and he entered the U. S. Navy. That summer, Kay Kyser took his first vacation in six years and "celebrated" by going overseas to entertain the boys in the Pacific.

The following year, Kay did his first broadcast from an armed forces hospital. Record-breaking hospital

tours followed, with eighteen hospitals visited per month. Kyser travelled over 6,000 miles on this tour. Soon Ish Kabibble was inducted into the army, probably the only soldier in the country who was forbidden by his commanding officers to get a haircut. His bangs were part of his act and they had to stay put!

When Kyser spent his summer overseas entertaining troops in Manila, Zamboanga, Cebu, Leyte, Batangas, Okinawa and Guam, he met Ish Kabibble and the two went on the air from Manila.

Now a lively half-hour show sponsored by Colgate, the College has reclaimed both Ish and Harry Babbitt. And Georgia is very busy now with Kimberly Ann Kyser (one year old next June 3).

Probably no other college has so many satisfied alumni as Kay's. Nor such a deliberately naive ole professor!

music. Moreover, the Dolans' one son, Bobby, Jr., did such a fine job in the school nativity play sequence that it evoked the praise of being one of the finest film sequences ever screened. The familiar music from such favorites as "Holiday Inn", "Lady in the Dark", and "Blue Skies" is due to the Dolan skill. He's now hard at work on some as-yet-unreleased pictures, including Crosby's "Welcome, Stranger", and Bob Hope's "My Favorite Brunette". His latest popular composition, done in collaboration with Johnny Mercer, is "And So to Bed", being currently aired by Dinah Shore.

Dolan thinks music must be given some encouragement, and does his most strenuous work in his lovely Pacific Palisades home. He tries to compose during the day, rather than at night. His evenings are devoted to rehearsals or radio shows, and to "just being a father" to Bobby, Jr. Robert, Sr., rarely sleeps more than six hours a night, feels he simply can't waste more time in slumber. But he attributes his well-being to the gallon of milk he consumes daily. And for complete relaxation . . . he took up golf!

### Prefers Conducting

As anyone who has seen him behind the baton knows, Dolan is a perfectionist, and works as hard at conducting as he does at composing, which is his major interest.

"But I never want to become 'typed'. I don't want people to hear my music and immediately identify it as Bobby Dolan's orchestra. That sort of typing make a man's musical life too short . . . and I just can't conceive of not being in music!"

He enjoys listening to records, old and new, and speaks with real enthusiasm of "the blues".

Some of his own words add in-

sight to the reason behind this young man's acclaim as one of the outstanding composer-conductor-arrangers of the day.

"Gee, you just can't leave the air show, get into your car, and be happy . . . unless you know you've done the very best job you could!"
