and his wife, Eloise, have four boys and a girl, and recently adopted a little Belgian girl overseas.

When they descend on a community, they are like a small whirlwind trying to pick up the essence of its life, the secret formula that makes it tick, for their purpose is to present this community's personality in an understandable way to the rest of the United States.

We had never imagined the "Vox Poppers" put such beaver-like activity into their operations. But when they came as near to us as Palm Springs a few weeks ago, Radio Life snapped at the chance to investigate. Almost a week before airtime, the Johnsons, Hull, and the program's two production managers, Buzz Willis and Roger Brackett, arrived at the desert resort. The first few days they concentrated on formulating

their idea of a representative group of show participants. They thought they should have a desert rat, a dude ranch operator, an old-timer who remembered Palm Springs when it was a health resort for people with lung trouble, and maybe a couple more "natives" who could bring color to the mike.

Dick Joy, over whose CBS affiliated station, KCMJ, the program was fed to the entire coast-to-coast network, told us that 150 people had been "interviewed" as prospective show guests. Willis and Brackett had gone in search of some of the prospects, Warren had driven fifty miles to the Salton Sea covering date and guest ranches, Parks had covered the town. Many of the prospects hadn't known they were being engaged in conver-

sation as potential network performers. But from the friendly contacts, the "Vox Poppers" knit together a show which, on the air, presented a dude ranch owner, a desert rat, a hotel operator, a business man, and a painter-prospect. Quite a slice of desert life!

# Sold... American!

*Two Farmers Made Big Time in Radio When the Chant of the Tobacco Auctioneer Was Brought From the Warehouse Floor onto the Airways*

**T**HROUGH reference to it by comedians, or those pranksters in crowds who shout "Sold... American!" after some luckless speaker's well-meant spiel, the chant of the tobacco auctioneer is kept before us beyond its radio appearances. And it poses another question in the mind of "Hit Parade"-listening John Q. Public, who wonders regularly what will prove to be the top tunes of the week. What does that chant really say? What are these men who deliver it like?

L. A. "Speed" Riggs, and F. E. Boone, who seems to be rapidly becoming one of Fred Allen's favorite references, are real tobacco auctioneers, Southern-born and raised, and chosen by representatives of the American Tobacco Company from the floors of the warehouses where they intoned their chant.

Although they had not known one another until that lucky day, if we may pun, when they met on the "Hit Parade," there is a close parallel in the lives of the two now-close friends. Both Mr. Riggs, born in Goldsborough, North Carolina, and Mr. Boone, born in Winchester, Kentucky, come from a long line of Southerners who since pioneer days have made tobacco growing their business. The father of each was an auctioneer, and the two, when boys, attended the warehouse floor sales, listening and learning, and acquiring the desire to emulate their parents.

No easy road to follow was this choice. Mr. Boone recalled some of the aspects of his work. "First you have to know your tobacco crop; then you have to sell it, and fast. A sales schedule takes in four hundred baskets of tobacco every hour. As each farmer's crop is sold, the warehouseman gives the opening bid and another farmer's crop is auctioned." The selling so casually

referred to by him means that an auctioneer also has to watch all companies and independent bidders on the fast-moving commodity for their signal, "A signal may be a wink, a glance... any barely noticeable movement. Each signal is individual to the bidder, and must be seen and interpreted by the auctioneer so he will realize that particular lot of tobacco has been bid on and can relay this in his fast-running price commentary known as our 'chant'."

#### Chant Dissected

Both men laugh at the suggestion that the chant's rapidity renders it almost unintelligible to the untrained ear. "It's no secret... while Mr. Boone might say 'forty-eight, forty-eight, bid, bid it now, forty-nine, forty-nine, round it out, fifty... sold!' I would be saying practically the same thing. Of course, the words we use between our overlapping of bids quoted are as individual to each auctioneer as the words that you use in your own conversation might be from someone else's... but it all means the same thing." Mr. Boone added to his companion's explanation, "Each man's chant differs in the same fashion that each singer's style might... pitch, phrasing, and his voice."

The duo make certain that, even after ten years of radio intoning, theirs is an authentic delivery. Home yearly to North Carolina goes "Speed" Riggs, to keep his hand in by actual participation in the selling of the crop his own farm still furnishes to the very floors of the warehouses at which he works. Probably an added inducement to this young sportsman are those cherished horses of his that always find their place in his conversation. But whether in his beloved South, or with the Jack Benny Show or the "Hit Parade" in the east or west, you can be sure that when he approaches the micro-

phone to deliver his chant, he holds an unlighted Lucky Strike cigarette between his fingers for good luck. This is his one concession to superstition. And you can also be sure he enjoys himself. Basis of this is following his own sound philosophy concerning his occupation. "A man can stay happy, and successful, I believe, if he is thoroughly and completely content in the work he is doing. And I am. I would rather be a tobacco auctioneer than anything else I can think of."

The Valley is the locale where neighbors hear the weekly practice chant of the other auctioneer, F. E. Boone. This quiet man, who looks like a banker or a judge, made his permanent home here some years ago. But he, too, still owns and operates farms—one a tobacco farm in Kentucky where he also raises white-faced Hereford cows and sheep, and allows time out to hunt and fish. Probably his childhood hunting of rabbits and quail accounts for the skilled marksmanship that brought him, among other awards, the Kentucky State Trap Shooting Championship of 1935. The Florida farm he operates produces peanuts, melons and corn. Like Mr. Riggs he is still active in the tobacco industry, raising, auctioneering, studying prices and trends of the market.

Fortunately Mr. Riggs and Mr. Boone like traveling, and their wives accompany them about the country to and from their farms or on their Benny Show and "Hit Parade" jaunts. It was Mr. Boone who, with

May Like)

### "Greatest Story Ever Told"

One of the most important services that radio can render is to bring religion into the home. When it is done with the dignity and spirit of ABC's dramatizations from the Bible, "The Greatest Story Ever Told", it is fulfilling a very great need in many homes.

Every lesson that the world needs to learn is contained in the Bible and to hear men speaking those words in the form of dramatization gives "The Greatest Story" a present-day reality.

The acting and music that combine to give voice to this program, convey the proper spirit of reverence and dedication. The actors are not credited on the air, nor are any commercials given. The writing is under the supervision of Fulton Oursler and the orchestra and chorus is directed by William Stoess.

During the Lenten season an Easter trilogy is being presented. On Easter Sunday "The Resurrection", the third episode in the trilogy, will be broadcast.

The program is under the sponsorship of the Goodyear Rubber Company, and in lieu of commercials the sponsor's name is merely mentioned at the opening and close of the program. (KECA, 3:30 p.m. Sunday).

### "Are These Our Children?"

If a program like "Are These Our Children?" reaches the ears of those for whom it is intended it performs a very great service indeed. However, we always have a disturbing feeling that those at whom a lesson is aimed either aren't interested or are unable to identify themselves with the characters involved. Are the only people who are convinced the very ones who were convinced to begin with?

We're afraid they are or else there would be no need to drag out the problem of juvenile delinquency periodically. We started thinking of this tack when the program credited RKO Pictures for the use of the title "Are These Our Children?" We recalled that when we were quite a young child we saw the film of that title—a film about juvenile delinquency. It scared us, but evidently it didn't scare enough people.

There was a delinquency problem during and after the first World War. There was one with the "Flaming Youth" during the prosperity of the twenties; with the depression kids of the thirties; with the "doorkey children" of the war workers during the days of World War II, and now the

juvenile criminals of the post-war period.

Maybe a few radio programs won't amount to much in combating this gigantic problem. Maybe they will if people listen and heed the message contained in such stories as those presented on "Are These Our Children?", for the fault is with the audience, not with the program. The case histories of young criminals are taken from the court file records and are enacted realistically with the help of a dramatic musical background. Writer-producer Gilbert Thomas can take a bow for the seriousness with which he puts over his subject and also for the important single points he emphasizes in his scripts. A recent example was a conversation between a criminal and a youthful admirer. They were looking for accounts of Al Capone's funeral in some newspapers. They discarded one paper that merely mentioned the burial of the gang leader and pounced with glee on another that carried pictures of the crime czar at his height and the story of his life with the words, "Now this newspaper really knows how to write a story!"

We were grateful to San Francisco for sending us "Pat Novak" and in the opposite vein we're grateful for its presentation of "Are These Our Children?" (KECA, 1:00 p.m. Sunday).

### "Moon Dreams"

"Moon Dreams" (KGFJ, Monday through Friday, 9:45 p.m.) is a good answer to a lot of listeners' requests for quiet, relaxing microphone material. Our radio dials being otherwise crowded with noises—in one form or another (ladies' laughter, comical guffaws, trumpets' blasts)—a skillful blending of soft sounds is a welcome ointment for harassed mikesiders.

"Moon Dreams" (commercialized in a soft manner, too, by advertisers John F. Whitehead and Associates) gently offers for listeners' late-evening pleasure the deep voice of Marvin Miller reading inspiring bits of inspired verse against a dreamy mood set by music director Del Castillo at the organ and Ivan Epinoff on violin. Love songs, old and new, are woven into this pleasing pattern by tenor Warren White, and the entire quarter-hour offering is directed and announced by John Holbrook, and correlated by Ken Krippene.

With such a preponderance of masculine talents, how could a show miss with the ladies? If only the announcer, when he signed off, wouldn't say "this program is produced in HOLLY-wood!" But we especially do

like the complete listing of titles and authors of verses used at the program's conclusion.

### "Hit Parade" Hypoed

"Your Hit Parade" (CBS-KNX, Saturday, 9:00 p.m.) received a healthy shot in the arm last week (March 22nd) when the Andrews Sisters stepped into the guest-star slot for a four-week stint. For many seasons a stilted show with stuffy content of pat, personality-less presentations, the "Parade" has been gradually picking up its pace and with the lucky (no pun, son) combine of its regular star, Andy Russell, promising English import Beryl Davis, and the sprightly Andrews trio, it truly swung into its liveliest, happiest stride.

Backed by Mark Warnow's rhythmic orchestrations and the "Hit Paraders" choristing, Andy supplies smooth balladeering and an easy friendliness, pretty Miss Davis bids fair to be a strong contender in the songbird circle once American fans become familiar with her name and voice, and the song-selling showmanship of the Andrews Sisters is aptly spotlighted on this showcase of the nation's most popular music. It is only a shame—and the listeners' loss—that the show's compact programming does not allow Patty, Maxene and LaVerne to embellish their harmonies with the comedy that they customarily include in their act.

However, "Hit Parade's" lucky (oops—again!) studio audiences are not overlooked, and for them, the girls don striking white suits adorned with flashing gold shoulder-braid and Patty mugs a la Jolson, come time for those corpore-voiced commercials.

This big fancy well-oiled airshow, though, is still stained (for home dialers) by the irritating squeals of Andy's devoted "Russell Sprouts". We think it only right that they should be on hand to applaud their favorite, but their presence would be far more appreciated if they didn't make it known so noisily.

### Playbacks (Critical Comment)

#### "Thin Man" Thinnest

We'll give this show a much-needed break and pass over its minor faults (its "Thank ya, Sanka" and "Sanka Sam" commercial, just for instance), and concentrate on its major annoyances.

To begin with, it is rightly scheduled after Junior's bedtime hour (9:30 p.m., Friday, CBS-KNX), but at an hour still too reasonable to suit us. We should be in bed yet!

We're over twenty-one and not exactly on the prudish side, but we find this show embarrassing. If its name, "The Thin Man", didn't still bring to mind many a happy hour spent at

our local movie house watching Myrna Loy and Bill Powell portray the sleuthing twosome with real charm and humor, we wouldn't mind so much. But having seen what this idea *could* be, we are aware of the waste in its present inane radio form.

Thirty minutes of perfectly good air time are taken up with the childish mutterings, whinings and 'wolfish' utterances of the underworld populace, with whom "Nick" and "Nora" (Les Damon and Claudia Morgan) either singly or together cavort. When their gay cavorting is being done separately, the dialogue reverts to a series of unsavory sounds — juicy "Mmmms" and "Oooooohs" from the female underworld gentry whom "Nicky" is luring into a trap with his irresistible masculine charms, and squeaky kisses being lavishly bestowed by his devoted spouse in the pursuit of male culprits. The program always ends happily, however, with the criminals safely tucked away in either morgue or jail, and "Nick and Nora" snugly tucked in each other's arms, exchanging those throaty "Mmmms" and prolonged lip-smackings between themselves.

Maybe we should laugh it all off, but to us, "The Thin Man" offers about the thinnest thirty minutes of radio fare we've dialed.

### Pleasure Parade

Not at all in the spectacular class but simply a half-hour of pleasant listening is "Pleasure Parade" (KFI, Tuesdays, 9:30 p.m.) Its thirty minutes of current-day melodies are presented in a pleasing fashion by a handful of talented people—songsters Bob Kennedy, Kay Lorraine, Paula Kelly and the Modernaires, conductor Irving Miller and his orchestra, and familiar-voiced announcer Jimmy Wallington. Interspersed between their musical offerings is banter between this congenial assemblage, most of which equips the listener with tidbits of information about the performing artists.

Our only criticism of this show is that it somehow smacks of being a "canned" package, which it is. It is a

pretty satisfying slice of radio entertainment, but slightly too smooth to suit us.

For any transcribed air offering to maintain the appeal that a live show has, its personnel should keep in mind that listeners welcoming performers into their living rooms are attracted, not by the mechanized perfection which can result from careful waxing, but by the humanness of the people.

Live or waxed, Bing stays human—and successful. See what we mean?

### On Mike (About Studio Happenings)

#### Shirley Back

The Wednesday, April 16th, broadcast of NBC's "Great Gildersleeve" will highlight the Spring return of "the widow, Leila Ransome" to the show's script. "The widow" returns in the person of her creator, air actress Shirley Mitchell, who'll be back in Hollywood for the first time since her marriage to an East Coast doctor. Giddy's beloved "Leila" will be at his side till the show's summer sign-off June 4th.

#### New Approach

When we heard that an audition record was cut the other evening for a new show idea called "The Life of Houdini" (co-starring Chester Morris and Cathy Lewis) we did a quick jig of joy over the thought that maybe somebody was cooking up a really fresh format (no "private eyes", that is).

But then it was brought to our attention that, besides being a whiz of a prestidigitator, Houdini was kept busy in odd moments as a "ghost-breaker". Our bet is that, on the air-planes, he'll end up sleuthing.

Nevertheless, a new show always presents something of a white hope—and this one may fulfill our wildest expectations. Who knows?

#### Lost and Found

When Chet Huntley makes an announcement on his "Ten o'Clock Wire" broadcast, things happen! After only two mentions on the program more than \$1,500 has been contributed to a special fund for purchase of a rare streptomycin drug for the Los Angeles Children's Hospital. One "March of Dimes" appeal yielded \$610.

Recently Chet made an appeal to listeners for the return of a lost dog to a little boy who had called the program. The next day the little dog was found on the other side of town and returned to the boy.

Morton Marcus, the grateful dog owner, started the "Chet Huntley Boy's Club" in appreciation of Chet's assistance and enrolled thirty members. Each member pays fifty cents a month dues and at the first of each month they turn the money over to Huntley for any charity he selects. In addition, the club helps youngsters of poor parents to get bicycles. When funds are low they manage to put together stray parts and construct one.

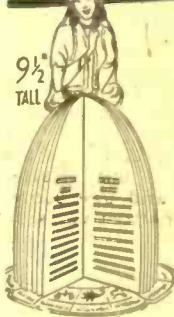

## RAY MCKINLEY ORCH.

On the novelty side, pardner, Ray tells the lusty tale of the gal with "Red Silk Stockings and Green Perfume"—and on the reverse is a McKinley original instrumental "Jiminy Crickets" . . . the combination had no trouble making the 2-note niche. (Majestic).

## TOMMY DORSEY ORCH.

With a Stuart Foster vocal, TD is quite calm with "Spring Isn't Everything" . . . but put the needle in the groove on "Bingo, Bango, Boffo" and you've not only got the old Dorsey touch, but Mansfield's reasons for thinking this one's a 3-noter. (RCA-Victor).

# Radio's Kindest Show

You who heard this particular program or any other of the "Vox Pop" broadcasts don't need to be told how smoothly Johnson and Hull conduct their interviews. Their guests are never embarrassed — a healthy tip which many other participation shows could take with benefit.

## Pioneer

Of course, fifteen years of "Vox Pop" should endow Johnson with the maximum of know-how. His list of "firsts" makes you blink: he claims the first audience participation show; the first show to present gifts to participants; the first to broadcast out of this country during World War II; the first to broadcast from Army camps; the first to visit Mexico on a good will tour. Ever since that day in Texas when he threw a mike cord from the studio to the street below and asked the man on the curb some question like what he thought about flagpole sitters, Parks Johnson has been an ether blazer. His present aide, Warren Hull, is younger but endowed with the same sincere, friendly qualities. His background in radio, pictures, and the musical comedy stage made it possible for him to step in with less than two hours' notice and give emergency assistance to Parks about two years ago. He's been Johnson's co-miker ever since.

You can sense the "Vox Poppers'" inherent love of people and places the minute you meet them. The Johnsons are used to bumping around on the road and living from suitcases, but Louise Johnson's face suggests a trace of homesickness as she mentions that the show will play Texas in a few weeks. You see, the Johnson ranch is near Austin. They also maintain an apartment in New York. Both places are loaded with evidences of the couple's chief hobby, antiques.

"They're so expensive here on the West Coast," she shuddered.

She finds pawn shops and little out-of-the-way establishments wonderful gold mines of shopping treasures. During the war, when the program was coming from camps, Mrs. Johnson's shopping list was narrowed to things the boys wanted and could take with them wherever they were sent—which meant "mostly wrist watches and little radios". Sometimes she was lucky enough to locate floor samples of hard-to-get items. Once a nylon manufacturer with a tremendous store of hose volunteered all the stockings "Vox Pop" needed and the Johnsons started out bravely by gifting six wardrobe-depleted British war brides with half a dozen pairs each.

"That was the one and only time we gave away nylons," said Mrs. Johnson sadly. "The letters we got from women in America resenting British war brides receiving those stockings! And you should have seen some of those girls — their

clothes patched and mended — their rationing was so severe they were practically threadbare.

"Of course, that's the trouble with the world today," she went on. "Selfishness starts with the individual, fans into community greed, then national."

## Possibilities

We suggested to Parks that if his program could do so much to bring understanding to people in this country, a "Vox Pop" of the world might have invaluable influence in engendering international understanding. He agreed, with a touch of regret that made us wonder if being a commercial program was hindering his constructive ideas in some manner. We could only guess, but this we did know—that he was the first radio personality to have written in his contract a privilege of cancelling at his own insistence and that he had initiated the dissolution of his sponsorship by Bromo Seltzer.

It intrigued us to know whether her extravagant shopping for the program had made Mrs. Johnson a personal spendthrift.

She laughed outright. "I hate to shop for myself. Parks and the children have to drive me into the store to buy clothes."

We wanted to know whether, in scouting the "Vox Pop" gifts, she often saw things she wished she had.

"Not often," she smiled. "We are simple people and our two places are loaded with antiques. I guess about the only thing I wanted and got was from a girl who was a guest on the show. She received a Kentucky ham, but as she lived quite a way from where we were broadcasting, she didn't know what to do with it.

"I bought it," announced Mrs. Johnson triumphantly.

*Radio's Globe-Circling Hughes Isn't Howard — He's Gordon, Producer of "Hope Chest". The World Comes to Him — and It Wants to Get Married*

LEAVE US FACE IT—everybody wants to get married. Or at least, so it seems to Gordon Hughes, producer of the show that helps boy get girl, "Your Hope Chest". Of the many couples who contact the show each week, Hughes looks for those who have a "different" story to tell. "Every week is an extra effort," he

admitted, "because we try not to do the ordinary." For the "Around the World" spot on the show a search is instituted for couples who belong to the exotic lands across the seas—they fall in love and get married, too!

Hughes is enthusiastic about the work of his helpers, Maury Cohen, Stan Marsden and Liz Taylor. "If I say, 'Let's try and get an Eskimo on the show next week'—they do it!" he exclaimed. Preliminary interviewing is done by Hughes' trio of assistants. About fifty couples a week apply for their chance on the program. Of these the interviewers select about twelve couples and pass them on to Gordon, who selects the four two-somes who appear on the program each week.

hornswoggled by two bright young people who purport to be engaged merely to collect the loot? Never, claims Gordon. More than that, he swears he can detect a trumped-up tale fabricated by an engaged couple who think it aids their chances of getting on the program. Gordon seldom calls their bluff—he prefers just to forget them.

Hughes' interest in the show goes beyond the mere entertainment val-

ues. He's genuinely anxious that his young couples be happy and well adjusted. A few times he has dissuaded couples from marriage when it seemed to him they were not compatible. And he's been right—the people involved have always thanked him later for setting them on the right track, claiming that advice from a disinterested party has clarified their thinking and corrected their outlook.

In their search for unusual romances, the "Hope Chest" people often present a couple who represent the spirit of the season. "At Hallo-we'en we had a couple who became engaged in a graveyard," Gordon laughed. An Eskimo at Christmas-time and Indians at Thanksgiving are the other examples. Youngest bride-to-be presented was just sixteen—oldest was eighty-three.

# Men of Music

*Charles ("Bud") Dant*

*Schoolteacher or Musician? That Was the Question Faced by Charles "Bud" Dant at the Start of His Profession. Between Them, Duke Ellington and the Board of Education Settled Everything*

**C**HARLES "BUD" DANT points to Duke Ellington as the man responsible for giving him the push that decided his future in the music business.

Indiana State graduate Dant was ready in 1932 to jump into the teaching profession as an instructor in high school music. Enthusiastic, in fact. Then the questionnaire from the Board of Education was sent to him. Do you drink—do you smoke—are you married—does your wife

drink or smoke, etc.? "Well," Bud told us, "I wasn't married and I didn't drink or smoke, but I didn't like those personal questions."

At this time, Bud was leading a college band at a lake resort spot. "It was on a percentage basis," he smiled, "and one week, after the board and room was taken out, our poor bass player made a profit of five cents!" The great Duke Ellington band played an engagement at the resort and Bud and his boys filled in as the intermission band. The Duke liked them, and after hours the bands held a jam session. Duke sent his manager down to hear them, and after that they were on their way. An application for a teaching position for Bloomington High School lay on Bud's desk, unanswered. "I would have enjoyed it, too," Bud admits.

Bud came to California with Ted Weems to play an engagement at Catalina back in 1937 and he's been here ever since. A native of Indiana, he was in the university at the same time as Hoagy Carmichael. In fact, he went to that particular university because Hoagy wanted a good cornet player in the college band. After graduation in 1932 came the break brought about by Duke Ellington. Before that Bud and his college band

had played in a chop suey joint. "We took out thirty per cent of our salary in food, and I've never been so sick of anything in my life as I was of that chop suey!" he recalled.

#### Discourages Songwriters

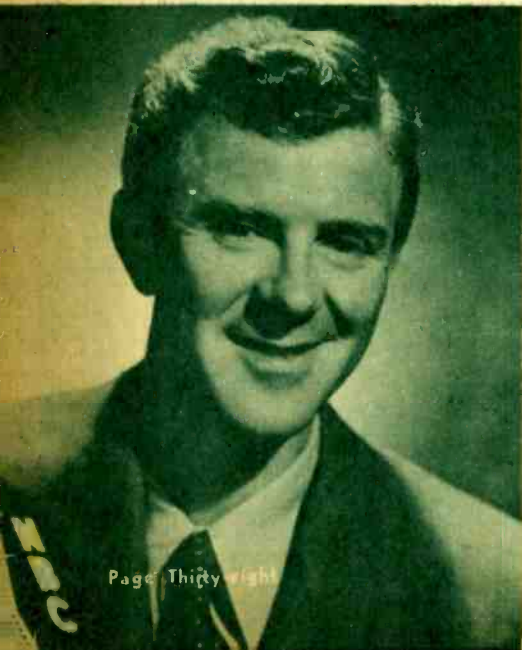
Getting down to the present, Bud is now heard every week on the Judy Canova and Dennis Day shows and on "Let George Do It". He, too, is besieged by amateur song writers. "Fifty per cent of the population think they can write a hit tune," he said wearily. He admits that he thinks some of the tunes have merit, though. It's the marketing that's difficult. Bud's main entry in the hit song field was a ballad, "The Moon Peeps Over the Hill", released, unfortunately, at the time of the big recording tie-up. "It's a highly specialized field, which most people don't realize. And it takes too much time and work," he added.

Asked about the influence of other composers, Dant expressed the opinion that all composers are so steeped in the classics that they can't put down an idea that isn't influenced by the composers who came before them. "That's why many pop tunes are unconscious steals," he said. "It can be done without realization. Of course no composer consciously copies another, unless for a specific occasion."

Bud's hobby is far removed from his profession—and also his home. Though the Dants, wife Nell, Susan, eight, and Christopher, four, live in

It's a happy program for everyone concerned, he thinks. We asked him what made it so. "I guess everyone on our show just likes people!" he smiled.
