## Moore Makes the Most of It

*Whether It's a Radio Show or One of His Interesting Hobbies, Garry Moore Digs Wholeheartedly Into Everything He Does*

**G**T WAS a right-about-face for crewcut-haired Garry Moore when he stepped into the emcee shoes on NBC's "Take It or Leave It". Fresh from the team of Durante-Moore, Garry was used to letting go with the mad routines, more than half of which he also wrote.

But the zany comedian, who weighs 145 pounds with heavy skates on, brought with him to the new chore the qualities that long ago tagged Mr. Moore for success. Brains and enthusiasm.

Garry's wisdom and long knowledge of show business immediately told him just whose show this was.

"In a radio quiz show, the 'game' is the star of the show. The people who are participating in that game

are the second star, and the emcee is last. Once the emcee forgets that, or tries to 'top' the contestants, he's lost.

"A show like 'Take It or Leave It' is no time for great comedy. People don't want to just stand around while the emcee is funny. Ask them leading questions, and in the usual repartee that follows they'll just naturally come out the stars. I don't think there could possibly be a line written for laughs that is half as effective as the human, natural understatement made by the contestants. They are always so simply said, and tell so much. You've seen the reaction when some small, timid man approaches the mike and blurts out 'My wife is fat.' It kills the audience."

Garry's getting a great kick out of laughing with people on this show instead of inducing their mirth with his antics.

"It's a great thing to get that feeling of enjoyment the audience has after the new show. Not because

of anything I did . . . because we all had fun."

**Violent Hobbyist**

The very word "fun" is indicative of Garry. He wholeheartedly enjoys everything he does, and as a result, has more friends and more hobbies than just about any man on radio row. The same punishing enthusiasm that went into his work, which carried Garry from a writing job on Station WBAL in his home town of Baltimore to the big time, goes into his play. Whatever the game, Moore knows all the rules, and whatever the hobby, it becomes almost a project.

One of these hobbies has resulted in Garry's being termed quite an authority on the subject. It started when two Baltimore brothers by the name of Moore started a record col-

lection which grew in proportion to the youthful fervor that marked the collecting. When the two brothers were grown, and left home to go their separate ways, they wisely divided the really rare collection of jazz. Instead of splitting up the sets of Duke Ellington or old McKinney's Cotton Pickers discs, they drew straws for complete sets. Garry still has these choice items, plus many more. He's never lost his enthusiasm for this music that is, in reality, America's one claim to an original culture, and the record library in his home today would turn a re-issue house scout the color of lettuce. Garry calls it "half the best record collection I know of."

Never a visit to New York goes by but what those citadels of jazz in the Village, Nick and Condon's, or the

uptown spots like Brunies or Jimmy Ryan's, find Garry in rapt attendance.

In the days before recognition, while jazz was still pretty much the "prophet without honor", Garry was emcee on a network show whose purpose was to "discover" and "present" little-known bands of worth.

One night when Garry went to rehearsal, he discovered the "guest band" to be that of Jack Teagarden, long admired by Garry and legendary among jazz enthusiasts. His joy at the prospective meeting was short-lived when he read the script.

"All the lines called for me to say, 'Say, Jack, that's a good little band you have there,' or 'Mighty nice trombone you play, Jack.' His lines called me 'Mr. Moore!' And here I

*Eight Hours a Day They May Be Pages Or Secretaries, but After Work They Are Studying to Become Radio Stars*

▼ **AFTER THE PLAYING** of the transcription, Corwin gave a review of the production. Impressed with the talent and skill behind the effort, Corwin made a date to return and direct the "Players" in one of his original scripts.



SO MANY people in radio know nothing about radio! That was the startling fact that prompted Hal Hudson, western division program director of CBS, and Harry Witt, assistant to vice-president D. W. Thornburgh, to revive station-wide interest in Columbia Players, the CBS "little theater" radio group.

Maury Webster, former announcer of "My Friend Irma", "Surprise Party" and "It Couldn't Happen", and at present executive assistant to the program department, was asked to take charge of the group's reorganization. Though Maury explains that he was selected merely because he happened to be walking down the hall at the propitious time, his current interest in the activities of the young people who make up the CBS group belies his explanation.

People in the business end of radio, people who help in making

the wheels go around but with no actual knowledge of how a network show is put together and aired, were invited to attend meetings of Columbia Players in order to learn more about the actual production.

Ushers, mail room girls, transcription department workers, secretaries, members of the sales department and many others organized the Players with such enthusiasm that at present the group has expanded to include a Workshop for less experienced members.

#### Nice Set-Up

CBS gives the young talent its complete support. Recording equipment, engineers, sound effects, studio, scripts and instructors from writing and directing staffs are made available.

Among the people who have visited the meetings of Columbia Players and have lectured and taken part in their radio productions are Elliott Lewis, "Suspense" producer Bill Spier, Neil Reagan of "Doctor Christian", Bill Robson of "Escape" and Norman Corwin.

Corwin provided a special thrill for the young group when he listened to one of their original shows, asked about some of their sound effects and told them: "Workshops such as this are a very healthy thing and one of the finest ways to learn radio production." Corwin later directed a production for the Players from one of his own scripts.

Though the group is only one year old, many have found that it has prepared them for advancement in radio. Gus Bayz, who was hired to run a mimeograph machine, dove into work with the Players with such enthusiasm and learned so much that within the year he has become an assistant sound man and one of the heads of the group under Webster.

When producer Charles Vanda needed a voice choir for the big Winchell Cancer Show that he put on recently, Norman MacDonnell, assistant director and member of a former CBS talent group, remembered the Players. Nineteen of them were used on the professional show for the "Arrest Cancer—It's Wanted for Murder" plea.

The Players devote several evenings a week and Saturday mornings to their work. Once a month the group records a half-hour show, upon which the more advanced members work. Beginners work and record fifteen-minute programs. Newcomers to CBS are invited to attend meetings, gain experience in a field in which they are interested and get to know fellow employees with the same interests.

**PLAYBACK SESSIONS** reveal the professional estimate of the "Players'" efforts. In addition to Corwin, who is pictured here, Bill Robson, Elliott Lewis, Neil Reagan, Sterling Tracy, Bill Spier, and other well-known writers and directors have appeared before the "Players."



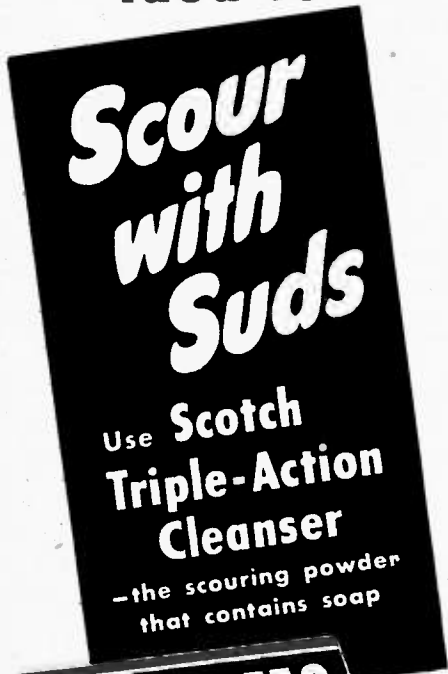

## Men of Music

No. 56 of a Series

*Fred Olson*



*Managing Columbia's Program Backgrounds, A Union Payroll, and Some 500 Musicians Is a Job! Fred Olson Is the Man for It*

**N**OTHING very exciting goes on in here, I'm afraid, but hard work," apologizes quietly humorous Fred Olson to the visitor stopping by his Columbia Square office.

And undoubtedly responsible for giving Fred such a tranquil observation of his interesting, hectic post are eighteen years of it with CBS, as violinist, concert master and music contractor.

To his desk every day come orders of every size and urgency. Can he set up orchestration for "My Friend Irma", "The Man Called X", "Lux Radio Theatre"? Will he, himself, be available to play violin for the "Sweeney and March" background? How about contacting one of the two staff organists (Dick Aurandt, Milton Charles) for that new quarter-hour sustainer in the morning? Can he get enough men fast for a hurry-up audition? ("You know what I want, Fred. Bridge that sounds big, but not too big? Fine! Leave it all up to you. Two this afternoon time enough?")

For coordinating all this hustle into an undisturbed working whole, Fred maintains a series of neatly marked bookkeeping sheets, a pocket-sized musician's directory, and a telephone. Any other equipment, he explains briefly, is in his head. Which means that from a list of 12,000 musicians he has memory of the more than 500 who play

exclusively, or on call, for radio. Furthermore he knows which of those musicians play jazz, symphonic, or both; which are too busy for further assignments; which work the most congenially with staff directors Lud Gluskin, Wilbur Hatch, Cy Feuer and Earl Towner, or with the many outside directors conducting agency and sponsored shows.

Complications? None whatsoever, in Fred's long career. With characteristic Swedishness he never gets excited. Temperament is a failing to be ignored or squelched. "Five-minute breaks" and "doubles" are extras to be counted off or added on to a meticulous payroll chart. Dissatisfactions are minor calamities to be calmly examined and set straight. Fred, of course, attends every rehearsal in its entirety, whether he's playing or conducting or contracting the job. In his pleasantly lighted office, on top of a bookcase, he keeps his violin, a Lupot which he has owned for over ten years and which he plays beautifully. He takes it down on assignment and carries it with him to rehearsals.

### Background

For the books, Fred has been a violinist for something close to thirty-five years. He began to play as a youngster—"We all do, you know, who love our music,"—and since the greater part of his childhood was spent in San Diego, he at-

Last year the Santa Claus Lane spectacle attracted over 1,500,000 persons.

Among the radio stars announced to take part in the parade are "Fibber and Molly," Red Skelton, Judy Canova, Alice Faye and Phil Harris, Jack Carson and Eve Arden, Hal "Gildersleeve" Peary, the "One Man's Family" cast and Dennis Day. Others will be announced later.

And though the network hasn't said so yet, the most important star of all will be on hand in his place of honor. We mean the guy who always steals the show—guy by the name of Santa Claus.

#### Seconds Count

On Tuesday, November 11, a portion of the Armistice Day observance ceremony, during which President Truman laid the wreath on the "Tomb of the Unknown Soldier," in Washington, D. C., was piped country-wide to listeners. The traditional "taps" was played, and a full one minute's silence was observed.

The sixty-second blank brought to mind most forcibly a fact removed from the ceremony of which it was a part.

The most casual acceptance accompanies the well-integrated, smooth-running, year-in-and-year-out, daily twelve- to twenty-four-hour schedule of radio listening, practically unmarred by undeliberate and meaningless spots of empty air time. Occasionally, three, four, or even five seconds elapse when nothing happens. At these mistakes, listeners growl, and luckless studio employees hear immediately and loudly from their superiors.

But having heard how long the relatively brief span of a single minute seems, left tremblingly empty on the air, think how chaotic radio could be without the planning, efforts and skill of numberless people behind the scenes of the stations.

Most of us have trouble running our own eighteen waking hours on a regular schedule, let alone the hair-trigger timing perfection employed about radio. Isn't that aspect of the gigantic enterprise we accept so casually, something to appreciate?

days. As an interviewer, we're afraid that Miss Munson has the edge on us as far as charm, poise and looks go, but she evinces the selfsame interest in the genus radio actor as we do in these pages.

Her informative and informal chats with the Janet Waldos, Jack Edwardses, Elliott Lewises and Hans Conrieds of radio are valuable steps toward bringing the deserving names of radio to the public's attention. It goes without saying that the radio people being interviewed respond much more gracefully and intelligently before the mike than many of the more glamorously named movie people you're apt to hear being queried on the various chatter shows.

Announcer Murry Wagner plays stooge to Ona's cordial questioning and her guests' unaffected responses, and later in the program assists Ona in precasting the CBS highlights of the week to follow.

The show is given excellent music and song support by Lud Gluskin and his orchestra with singer Joan Barton. All in all, if you want to know what's what at CBS and KNX, we can't think of a pleasanter way to find out.

### "Solitair" Time

Bobby-soxers or anyone else who enjoys the baritones should like "Solitair Time" (KFI, 11:00 p.m. Saturdays) when some of the favorite singers of America go 'round the turntable with their special sweethearts. The Solitair Make-up time is led off by George Barclay's narration of the promenade, then Bing, Perry, Dick and Dennis play host to the favorite ladies about whom they have sung.

On the air it's called "a program of records and transcriptions in an unusual singing contest." Only thing unusual about it is hearing the same tune twice or more on the same show. The tunes paraded are pleasant standards, and it is interesting to hear the different treatments as Bing sings about "The Girl of My Dreams," to be followed by Perry Como or Dick Haymes on the same ditty. Or, if Mr. Haymes should start the roundelay on "Naughty Angelina" or "Margarie," Dennis Day probably knows the girls and adds a chorus of his own.

If conversation is lagging of a Saturday p.m. at this hour, the fifteen minutes provides the opportunity to compare idols of the crooner realm among any avid fans in the crowd, insuring lively conversation for as long as five minutes.

If no avid fans are present, and conversation has died completely, the time still represents a soothingly melodious nightcap.

If it's amusement you're after, the commercials will raise a chuckle.

### "Christopher Wells"

If you haven't heard "Christopher Wells," CBS' dashing, venturesome, truth-defending news columnist who made his bow to American radio this season, you've missed a treat.

DeSoto-Plymouth sponsors this vig-

orous newcomer, portrayed by Myron McCormick, as he travels the globe each Sunday night at 7:00 over CBS, smashing black markets or doing away with subversive evils in the process of getting his stories.

More significant than even the novel excitements of plot that producer-director Edward A. Byron and writer Robert Shaw evolve around "Christopher Wells" is the fact that Wells has a past as well as a future, and reacts in all situations like a real person.

Byron and Shaw worked out Wells' history from birth to the day of his first radio adventure before writing a line of the first script, and for a very sensible reason. What a man does in a tight spot, how he thinks, how he impresses others and how they impress him depend on a man's background from the time he began to breathe. Thus Byron and Shaw are seldom at a loss to know how Wells is going to behave on the air.

The Christopher Wells biography, as conceived and written by his collaborative makers, sets forth facts concerning Wells' father, his mother, Chris' own childhood during which he had a newspaper route, worked as office boy on a local newspaper, and played high school football and baseball.

Chris presumably went to college at Amherst, supporting himself with a part-time job, plus small sums given him by an aunt. He graduated with a good scholastic average into the depressed world of 1933. Wells' creators built up a post-school period of moving slowly and painfully ahead in the newspaper world, from one little promotion to another, gathering a wealth of experience and know-how in the process, until 1938, when Chris took over a daily column, switched from gossip to news, from sensationalism to vigorous personal reporting.

Came Pearl Harbor and Wells donned a Marine Corps combat correspondent's uniform, for action, decorations, rank, wounds and finally honorable discharge into journalism and a public life so varied and energetic as not to be easily classified.

The scripters carefully lined up Wells' secretary, Stacy McGill, to man the beat-up office Wells uses as an operation base. Stacy had been a script girl in Hollywood and a model at Saks. Wells hired her for her good sense, without being prejudiced one way or the other by her good looks. That's the way Stacy wants it, being an upstanding, independent girl who judges people on their merits, and expects to be judged likewise. Stacy is clearly nuts about the boss, but she harbors no illusions about marrying him. She respects and admires Chris for his great work.

Sometimes, too, Stacy is the dupe

through whom the undesirable elements attempt to "get" Wells. Should Stacy fall prey, Chris never blames her for perfectly human frailties . . . but Stacy feels awful if she in any way unwittingly helps foil Chris. Charlotte Lawrence plays Stacy, and does an excellent job of the characterization.

Because the show is based on an air figure made real by careful planning and writing, the whole presentation takes on an authentic tone. Effort is paying off.

### "Pilgrim Hour"

One of Sunday morning's nicest and most simply dignified programs is KHJ's "Pilgrim Hour" heard at 9:00. An interdenominational program of gospel and song, the main theme of the program is re-acquainting people with stories of the Bible as they are written — without any ritual or interpretation suited to one church.

Director of this half-hour is Dr. Charles E. Fuller of the Fuller Evangelical Foundation. Dr. Fuller reads the stories, simply and well, leaving people to draw their own parables. An all-male quartet supplies the hymns, with organist George Broadbent and pianist Rudy Atwood.

Sponsored by the Gospel Board Company, the half-hour carries its completely appropriate Sunday morning home service coast to coast. Anyone who enjoys the stories from the Bible and the well-loved standard hymns will find a comforting pleasure in their re-acquaintance.

### "Red Rowe"

You've probably noticed that every juke box, country-wide, holds at least one sample of the sage and saddle. Many's the nickel that lights in the fat coffers of the operators as a result. Whiting-Mead Company, getting the idea, sponsors a Monday-through-Friday-night period of fifteen minutes at 8:15 over KMPC that well pleases the percentage who drop their nickels for the fiddlings and strummings fresh out of a red barn. "Red Rowe" calls the numbers and makes the comments.

The music is western with almost a Dixieland kick. On some of these recorded jump westerns, "Bob Wills and his Texas Playboys", "Andy Parker and the Plainsmen", and Curt Massey parade well-known ditties such as "A Lonely Heart" and "It Used to Be." All the numbers are cowboy lament. For you who like a bit of a twang, but abhor the single guitar-voice treatment, these rollicking, modernized waxings will hold the tang of an evening at a square dance.

#### Tommy Bartlett Time

What sounds like an effort to catch the spirit of the once-famed "Club Matinee" variety show is ABC's "Tommy Bartlett Time," which like its predecessor, hails from Chicago. Heard on Saturdays at 9:30 a.m., the half-

hour show is a pleasant wait between breakfast time and the football broadcasts — but nothing more.

The program seems loaded with personalities. Tommy Bartlett, Boyce Smith, Tommy Casey, Dan Morland and Ellen White are the names we caught parading by the mike, but positive identification with the voice involved is impossible, except in the case of Miss White, who sings.

Best of the musical portions of the show is supplied by the "Honeydreamers," a vocal group of indeterminate size and mixed sex. Rex Maupin and his orchestra supply the music on the program in typical variety show style. The rest of the ailer is a fast-moving conglomeration of "football salutes," "shut-in time," interviews with children in the audience and funny poetry.

The show is pleasant but undistinguished. The people involved seem spirited and enthusiastic — they shouldn't be saddled with such lines as, "We now hear 'Strange Music' from 'Song of Norway' — it's all Grieg to me." We were surprised to hear the show credited with a writer, Paul Warmer. We thought everybody was writing his own lines.

We're still waiting for the Chicago radio gang to put together another wonderful variety show — but this isn't it.

## "Raggedy Ann"

Nobody could have been more pleased than we at the news that Johnny Gruelle's famous rag doll characters, "Raggedy Ann" and "Raggedy Andy" were to come to life on KHJ at 4:45 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. We're not so far along in our dotage that we've forgotten the wonderful characters that peopled the "Raggedy Ann" books — "Beloved Belindy," "Little Neemee," "The Tired Old Horse" and "The Camel with the Wrinkled Knees."

So the blow struck all the harder when we tuned in to see how the gang was getting along under story lady Paula Stone. We knew there was something wrong when she referred to "Raggedy Ann" as sneaking out of the toy store with her brother, "Raggedy Andy." In the first place they lived in the nursery of a little girl named "Marcella" — not a toy store — and they weren't brother and sister. Our world crashed!

Instead of the adventures of things like the magic soda fountain that appeared willy-nilly in people's houses or the wonderful jumping houseboat full of pirates, what did we get? A couple of totally unrelated Victor records about Robin Hood — merely a come-on to get the moppets to buy the whole album.

And "Raggedy Ann and Andy," far from being the merry little characters that jumped from one whimsy to an-

other, were turned into a couple of bickering, querulous little naggers.

Any child who has read the "Raggedy Ann" books (and there are millions) will have nothing but hoots for this program, and what is worse, will be very, very disappointed.

We're doubly disappointed too, because we've been thinking lately that the kindly philosophy behind these stories might be a very fine thing to be teaching the young these days. Remember, the person who made "Raggedy Ann" put in her cotton breast a little candy heart that said, "I Love You" on it?

Redeeming feature of the program is Paula Stone herself. Her voice is low and melodious, her delivery natural and radio-wise. Ge Ge Pearson and Don Nessick supply the voices of the title characters with such charm we're all the sorer that they are no more than stooges to the kiddie discs.

If the record company wants to play

its products on the air, it's all right with us. They are excellent in themselves, and under different circumstances we'd be enthralled with Robin Hood — on his own program, say.

sented Governor Earl Warren, Gregory Peck and Robert Gordon Sproul, who guested and each insisted on giving him their pocketings. The transmission was made pleasantly and so quietly that it carried the full meaning of "Merry Christmas!" early or otherwise.

The advent of big-name stars on "Studio One," with John Garfield as first guest in "Let Me Do the Talking," Garfield flipped those lines out fast and well, and carried off the reality-ending with superb dramatic éclat. If succeeding stars are half so rewarding performers, in the always better-than-average "Studio One" scripts, there is no need to dread the program becoming "just another showcase for celebrities" with its new policy. We predict that celebrities might instead become a showcase for the plays.

The Bill Conrad interpretation of "Captain Bligh" on "Favorite Story's" presentation, "Mutineers of the Bounty." In this well-tailored digest version of the surging Nordhoff-Hall adventure, Conrad exceeded even his usual good-acting self and was certainly a radio match for Charles Laughton in the movie. Conrad was handsomely supported by Frank Lovejoy and Lon McAllister, (and we applaud the program for putting first things first and reading role credits in proper order of importance.)

On "What's the Name of That Song" we happened to pick up a highly unusual voice, that of contestant Dave Powell, a youngster who "just wanted to be a singer" but who had no previous public experience. Dave's phrasing ("Rose O'Day") was rhythmic, his style was unusual, and best of all he demonstrated one of those natural voices which needs no disguise in slurs and slides. We almost ached to see him get a break, and wished all over again "If only Arthur Godfrey would mosey out to the coast!"

### Pleasant Fluff

Of the great group of commercials that go in one ear and right out the other, generating either complete ennui . . . or no reaction at all . . . one will linger in our minds.

On a recent Sunday night at 9:00, K H J, Alka-Seltzer-sponsored newscast, a cheery voice that was so, so inclusive of all listeners started . . . "Friends, isn't it pleasant to have . . ." The emphasis and cadence must have had ninety per cent of the listeners thinking "Yes, isn't it pleasant . . . but what is it?" Interest was heightened by the full four-second pause that followed, while the unhappy announcer scrambled about mentally for some way to extricate himself. Finally he gave up altogether, and simply started all over again by saying . . . "I should have said, 'Friends, it isn't pleasant to let something you've eaten spoil your evening.' My evening has been spoiled beyond redemption, but yours needn't be if you take Alka-Seltzer . . . etc." We liked him for his forthrightness.

Newscaster Glenn Hardy wished his announcer "the most pleasant sort of an evening to you!" We liked him for going along on a fluff.

### Money in Radio?

Last Tuesday a girl with the unusual name of Giselle de Bechevet was sitting in the audience of Walter O'Keefe's CBS "Double or Nothing" show. Giselle had been script assistant to True Boardman on the "Rexall Theater" series, but was out of work since the summer show folded to make way for Durante and company.

Her unusual name gained her a place with the O'Keefe contestants on the program and when she was asked, "Where was the site of the first post office in the United States?", she answered, "New York City." It was the only correct answer given by the contestants. Giselle walked off with \$952 in cash. Yep, there's still money to be made in radio.

### Thanksgiving Prayer

On Thanksgiving Day, CBS' "The Guiding Light," heard over KNX at 10:45 a.m. Monday through Friday, dedicates the full time to a message and prayer commemorating this day.

Many of Dr. Matthews' listeners may want a copy of his address from this program. Unfortunately, space doesn't permit our bringing you the message in its entirety but the following introduction has been excerpted:

" . . . in 1621, in the midst of a wilderness in New England, a group of early American settlers — colonists — gathered together to give thanks to God for an abundant harvest. I guess all of us still carry in our minds a picture of that first Thanksgiving Day as we learned about it in our grammar school readers.

"But I think that was only a very small part of their Thanksgiving. Think back for just a minute to the reason that they had come to a land on a desolate, rocky shore. Their purpose was real and vital . . . an ideal, a dream, that they couldn't realize where they had been living . . . but a dream that was worthwhile enough to give up everything except that dream of freedom of thought, freedom of speech, freedom of worship. This handful of people had what so many of us have lost today . . . the courage of their convictions. That's what the first Thanksgiving Day really meant — not the turkey dinner and all its trimmings, and the gathering of the clan. They celebrated their harvest.

"Friends, there is a harvest, a great harvest, that is here to reap if you want it . . . that harvest is our belief in freedom, our belief in liberty, our belief in justice — our belief in God."

### Off Mike (Personalities)

#### "Nov Schmoz Ka Pop?"

Those bingo-bango-bongo lyrics lapsed into by Arthur Godfrey during his recent CBS rendition of the "Too Fat Polka," got us too.

Seems the words are Slovenian, and came to Godfrey via Patricia Ryan Maloney of the Minneapolis Institute of Arts (who had heard Arthur's Columbia record of the "Polka" and

recognized it as "Ja Ju Nechu Ti Ju Zani Ona Debela," a great favorite of the Slovenian iron range towns).

If you like tongue-twisters, wrap your tonsils around these:

"O-o-h (start a beat ahead on that) Ja ju nechu ti ju zani ona debela, hey! Ona debela? Hey! Ona debela . . . O-o-h . . . ja ju nechu ti ju zani ona debela . . . Debela, Debela Ona debela!"

(Just for reassurance, Godfrey's Columbia recording is in English.)

### Slightly Gargled

Ever wonder how those stupefying mistakes sneak into scripts? Try following progress of *this* little boner, which almost found its way onto NBC's "Telephone Hour."

Barbara Curham, who is producer Wally Magill's assistant on the program, turned in rough continuity for November 17, when Set Svanholm was to debut as a guest. Script writer Norman Rosten had referred to Svanholm as "the great Swedish Wagnerian tenor" but as Svanholm is not confining his Met opera roles to Wagner this season, producer Magill decided to cross out the word.

So Barbara carefully wrote "delete" above "Wagnerian" and sent the script to mimeo. Broadcast day and a rehearsal perusal of lines caught the error just in time.

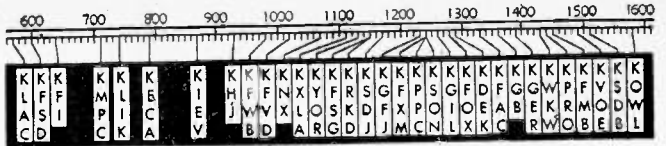

## PEGGY LEE

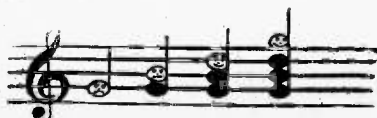

tended that city's famous Conservatory. During the run of silent movies he conducted atmosphere melody in the theater pits of San Diego's film houses, and when the talkies came he moved to Los Angeles. On the same day, both Fred and Wilbur Hatch cut an audition record which established them as Columbia "staff" and as star performers of their own "Singing Strings" program.

A semblance of title as network "music librarian" was bequeathed to Fred not long after, and on the back of an upright piano he established his first "office," a shambles of papers, jotted-down notes and records. Small amazement that he keeps up such a strict atmosphere of "system" in his contrasting operations today!

Fred had just had his tonsils out ("At least I'm old enough so they can't grow back in again") when Radio Life came for his story, and he was moving a little slowly, for his usual pace. But not much so. As the parent of three fine youngsters: Fred, Jr., who is twenty-three and attending the Woodbury Journalism-Advertising course; Arlene, thirteen, and still in high school; and Jon, three; Fred has a trained-in serenity which seldom admits necessity for haste.

Only when asked how he plans to tumble through the threatened Petrillo crack-down does he show the slightest swerve from complacency.

"That I refuse to think about," he sighs, with some apprehension.

was the one who had admired him and wanted to meet him for years. We both understood that the emcee lines invariably adopt a sort of protective, introductory coloring . . . but I felt awful. That's how I met one of the greatest guys in jazz . . . acting as though I'd just discovered this interesting music!"

Today Jack Teagarden, George Brunies, Muggsy Spanier and other top men of the jazz world number among Garry's friends. Because he knows their music, he knows their language.

But whether it be the jazz world or the concert stage, the literary or the light, Moore can contribute to the conversation. His porcupine bob covers a mind like a steel trap, and Garry remembers everything he's seen, heard or read.

When Garry was in high school he collaborated on a comedy with the late F. Scott Fitzgerald. It was never produced, but for all the ensuing

years Garry has harbored a latent tenacity about continuing a literary career. When he and Durante had their comedy show, Garry got his hands into the sophisticated rowdiness that was so chuckle-producing.

### Another Hobby

Another of Garry's less-known hobbies is his array of magnificent aquaria. The two walls of the office in his home are lined with oblong, crystal-clear houses for his fish. The arrangement of moss and stones in each looks like the work of a miniature landscape artist. Garry knows the name, habits and cycles of each tiny gem-like fish that swims in these abodes.

The room of the Moore home badly misnamed "the office" is an attractive cubicle in green and plaid, furnished with comfortable squatty couches and low coffee tables. It is so named because the transcription file, the big record player and typewriter stay in this room.

High up on the wall of this office is a small ledge on which perch two live lovebirds. Uncaged, the birds have the freedom of the room, and recognize Garry's signals and calls.

It must be interesting to see the changing faces of Garry's co-workers and fellow writers, intent on their work, when Garry, unable to resist the perfect setup, flicks his hand to bring the birds to him, swooping across the room like flying saucers close above the startled heads.

The comic Moore always muses . . . "Wonder where I could get a couple of eagles . . ."

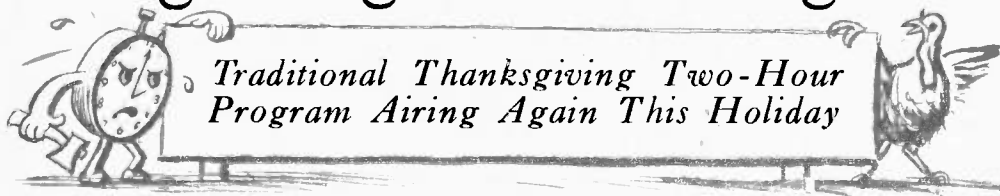

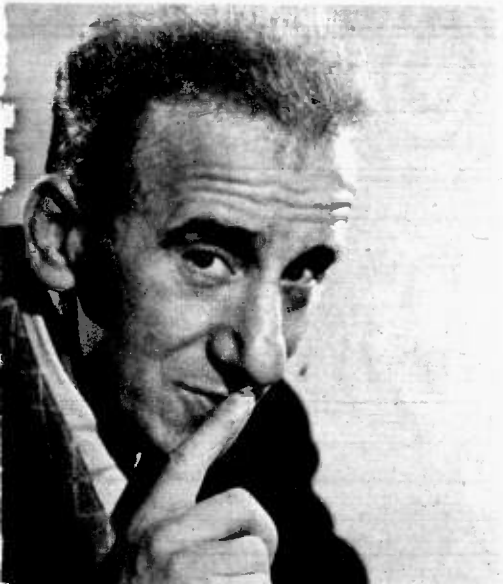

For a mild dressing, she takes three-day-old bread crumbs, runs them through the colander, allowing 1/2 cup per pound of turkey (this half-bird came to ten pounds). Added to the crumbs are one onion chopped fine and one cup chopped celery braised in four tbsp. shortening with one tsp. salt and 1/2 tsp. sage. If you want to add chestnuts or sausage, eliminate that much bread crumbs.



3. **DON'T STUFF** your bird too tightly, advises expert Young. In the case of a half-turkey, gently draw up loose ends at crop and neck and pin to body with toothpicks or metal skewers.



4. **OVER THE STUFFED FOWL** place a piece of parchment paper, securing with toothpicks or skewers. Then trim paper off even around edges of bird. Norma advises parchment because it won't tear and may be washed and used over and over again.





▲ **5. NEXT, PLACE GRILL** on top of parchment and carefully flop the bird over into the roasting pan, grill side down. This enables turkey juices to seep through dressing.



▲ **6. BEFORE ROASTING**, turkey may be embellished with fresh celery leaves, tucked into creases behind wing and leg. Leaves give both turkey and gravy an added flavor. Bird is now ready for the oven (325 degrees), three hours for a ten pound bird, 15 minutes for every pound thereafter—absolutely uncovered.

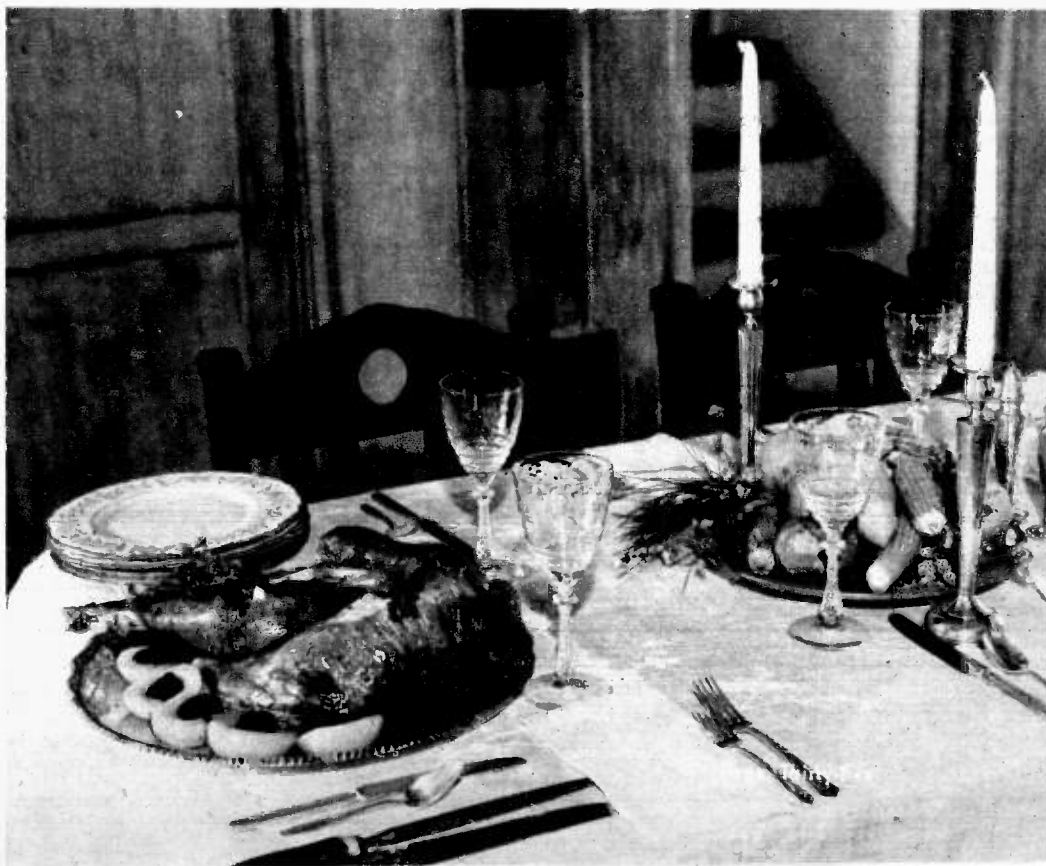

# A Little About Levant

*Pianist Extraordinary and Despot of Disparagement, Who Joins Al Jolson's "Music Hall". This Season, After Six Great Years on "Information, Please"*

**J**HETHER unamiably Oscar Levant makes a fetish of being annoyed and annoying, or is so antagonized by life that he feels that way, the fact remains that he is one of the most unusual artists of our time. And entitled, of course, to be as inhospitable and reverse as he likes.

It would seem, also, that too much undue notice has been paid to this phase of his personality. S. N. Behrman once described Levant as "A character who, if he did not exist, could not be imagined." Levant has additionally been accused of being two different people—himself, and the legends about himself. Exaggerations of Levant idiosyncrasies and insolences have accumulated to the place where Levant, in person, has been almost obscured.

Faintly resentful too, is Levant, about repetition of his more famous "bon mots." If he says something

funny, he likes to have it laughed at, spoken of briefly, then forgotten in view of what he's going to say next. This quirk of propriety might be regarded as egotistical, but justified. Levant's whipping wit snaps unpredictably into any topic, any time, and he is perhaps not too irascible in considering his observations of the moment worth more notice than his quips of the past.

As Lloyd Bacon, who is directing Levant's current picture, "The Flaming Age," remarks: "I'm always afraid to say 'cut' for fear we'll miss something, when Oscar's in front of the camera."

Formerly a "wit's wit," Levant's humor had been confined to the appreciation of a select group of friends (including S. N. Behrman, Harpo Marx and George S. Kaufman) when a delighted public picked up and read his book, "A Smattering of Ignorance," in 1939. In that same year, Levant joined the "Information, Please" panel, to hold a six-year chair as demonstrator of a

marvelous musical memory; and conducted-arranged the music for two Broadway shows, "The American Way" and "The Fabulous Invalid." Before this collective display of his talents, little had been spoken of him, except that he seemed a rather ill-tempered young fellow whose reputation as a pianist-composer was renowned in classical circles, and that he had been known to be a great friend of George Gershwin.

Preceding 1939, however, Levant had been working behind the front asbestos for years, as a musician, writer, director and actor. At the age of fifteen, he left Pittsburgh (his home town) for New York, to become a student of Sigismund Stojowki, Paderewski's favorite pupil. His serious intention was to become a concert pianist. But his classical aspirations had had to be subordinated to practical engagements at ladies' ballet classes, banquets, business luncheons and speakeasies until, in 1928, he enacted the piano player in "Burlesque," the show which made a star of Barbara Stanwyck. Levant moved to Hollywood when the movies filmed the play and called it "The Dance of Life," and, he opines, any resemblance between the two productions was pure coincidence.

## Further Activity

He was under contract to MGM then, in 1932, and later was assistant producer at the Western Avenue studios of Twentieth Century-Fox, where he wrote a section of an opera for a "Charlie Chan" picture and suffered the category of "idea man." His best idea at that time, he claims sardonically, was to collect his weekly pay check.

Levant next screen-played the 1934 film, "Orient Express," and wrote

## Rod O'Connor

*Once Replaced a Gangland Victim at a Radio Station, Left Two Towns Just Before Their Radio Demise, Yet Insists There's Nothing Interesting About His Past*

**I**N APPROACHING handsome Rod O'Connor, actor and one of Hollywood's busiest announcers, with any questions concerning Mr. O'Connor, you're apt to find out a lot about two other fellows who sound like entertaining, likeable gentlemen, but very little about Rod himself.

Under violent and pointed questioning, Rod can be forced to break into his narrative concerning these other two long enough to answer almost monosyllabically concerning himself.

"Born in Texas, yeah, that's right. Went into stock. Aulgur Brothers Stock Company, immediately upon leaving school . . . oh, about seven-

teen years ago . . . but let me tell you about Red. You know, that Skelton show is a picnic every week . . . Red's wonderful to work with . . . ever seen the show? Not only is Red a swell comedian, he's . . . what . . . Oh, radio. Well, I was in Minneapolis with the Stock Company, and read about an opening at one of the radio stations. Some newscaster had been shot by a gang of mobsters he was exposing in his daily newscast. I didn't know enough to be scared, so I went and applied for the job."

So it goes, until under urging, you finally piece together a story about a

boy who plunged straight into stock company, replaced a murdered man at a radio station, and filled the completely unknown job very well for a year and a half. Then Rod left Minneapolis for the West Coast. At that period, San Francisco was big-time radio, and the young announcer free-lanced quite happily until the wanderlust that is so much part of Rod again called. Away he went for a summer's riding and roping in Texas, radio forgotten.

"That was the first time I was lucky in getting out from under. San Francisco radio definitely wasn't there to stay, and I departed just before I would undoubtedly have been eased out. The second time was

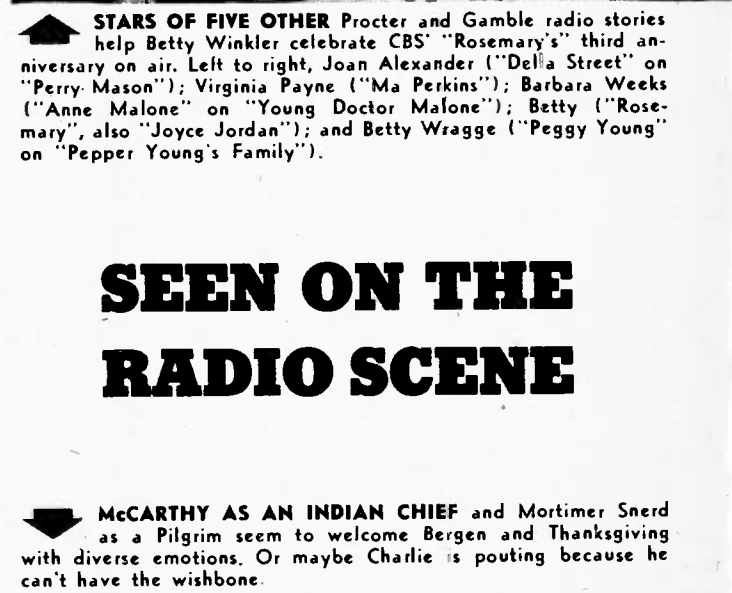

music and lyrics for the 1935 RKOer, "In Person." Through his many solo performances in Gershwin memorial concerts, he was signed to do the beautiful score for "Nothing Sacred," from which his song "Until Today" won him an ASCAP award. And he played a role with Bing Crosby in "Rhythm on the River." (Since, other Levant films have included "Kiss The Boys Goodbye", "Humoresque", and "Romance in High C.")

Admittedly not a handsome fellow, Levant says he has to talk fast when he meets people, in order to destroy that first impression. He drinks forty or fifty cups of coffee per day, which keep him thrashingly awake at night until he chews enough sleeping pills to go to sleep. He has been married for eight years to June Gale and they have three children.

It should be added that Radio Life's contact with Mr. Levant was not a direct one. Reinforced with most of the preceding data and surmises, we went over to see him on the opening day of the Jolson show. The group of press people and photographers who collected in Studio A that day had been cautioned that Levant was not to be approached in person, due to his high nerves before any broadcast.

"Heard about the time a little girl asked him for his autograph before an 'Information, Please' show?" one public relations man queried in a whisper. "Levant gave it to her, but afterwards he flew into a weeping rage, and nearly didn't go on the air at all."

Such alarming rumors were enough to make all of us keep our distances when Levant finally put in his predicted two o'clock appearance at 3:00 p.m. With pencils poised for any stray Levant remark that might make good copy, all of us in the auditorium mentally urged the same thought: "Go ahead, Oscar. If we can't talk to you, say something. Say anything."

And there must be a theory in

telepathy. Because in just a few minutes, Levant swiveled around on the piano stool and graced the crowd in the auditorium with a very blank eye.

"Awfully private in here, isn't it?" he muttered.

And smiling pleasantly at his sheet music, he returned to his playing.

Chicago. When I went back into radio I was working there. That was in 1939, to around 1944."

### Chicago Period

During those five years Rod appeared on "Breakfast Club" and "First Nighter," did free-lance acting and announcing, and had an early morning show of his own on which he simply let go. "It was a screwball thing . . . a series of dialects and mythical characters airing their problems between records and time announcements.

"When I left Chicago in 1944 it was in time to the handwriting on the wall. I might say Chicago radio is not all it used to be. Not because I left, certainly. My departure probably delayed its demise."

With the move to Hollywood came real prominence—some good movie roles and such radio shows as Rudy Vallee's, Joan Davis', "People Are Funny," Kay Kyser's "College of Musical Knowledge," "An Evening with Romberg," and Rod's admitted favorite, the Red Skelton show, which all utilized his talents in both acting and announcing.

The six-foot-two-and-a-half-inch Irishman delights in Red Skelton's nonsense, and praises loudly the Skelton fairness and loyalty to co-workers. The two men are good friends and spent this past summer making a ridiculous sixteen-millimeter movie called "The Great Wilburspoon." The story concerns a comic actor who hitchhikes across country—by way of a covered wagon. Rod and Red built the covered wagon body themselves, placing it atop an elegant big Cadillac convertible, completely hiding the car's lush lines.

Then the two took turns filming their epic from a precarious perch on the car's one uncovered fender as the vehicle jounced about the backroads of California's desert and mountain areas.

Motion pictures are one of Rod's hobbies, and the big O'Connor home in the hills above the Sunset Strip houses a complete projection outfit that provides fun and a tinkering outlet.

Rod is a married man, and the



father of two sons. The younger of these two children, Roderick George O'Connor, Jr., is the gentleman whose doings occupy another good portion of Rod's conversation.

Father O'Connor falls unwittingly into the typical patter by usually exclaiming, "I know fathers always say their children have a certain talent or skill, but you really should see this little boy of mine . . . what a natural little mimic!" But he's as wise as he is typical, for Rod adds seriously, "We never dare let the little fellow catch us laughing at him, or showing any admiration of his antics.

"One day I came home from a show and stopped in a doorway just back of 'Ricky.' He didn't hear me. He was too intent on a radio show. After each line he was repeating, in the exact tone, voice and inflection, what had just been said. Lord, it was funny! What really made it good was the show. Ricky was listening to some romance-laden soap opera, and to hear those lines being mimicked by a four-year-old boy was real comedy.

"Red is the one who'll probably be his ruin. He's taught Ricky 'Clem Kadiddlehopper' and 'Willie Lump Lump' routines from his own Skelton show, and the boy has them down pat. Then Red laughs at him and encourages him. Be just our luck to have Ricky grow up and want to be a radio actor or announcer! And I won't be able to say a thing about a choice like that."
